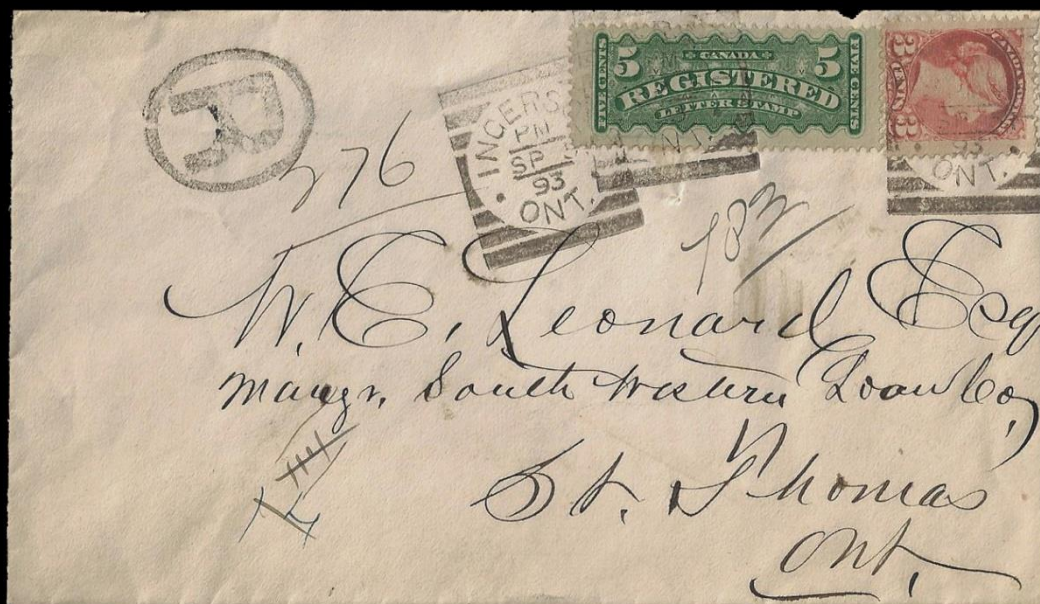

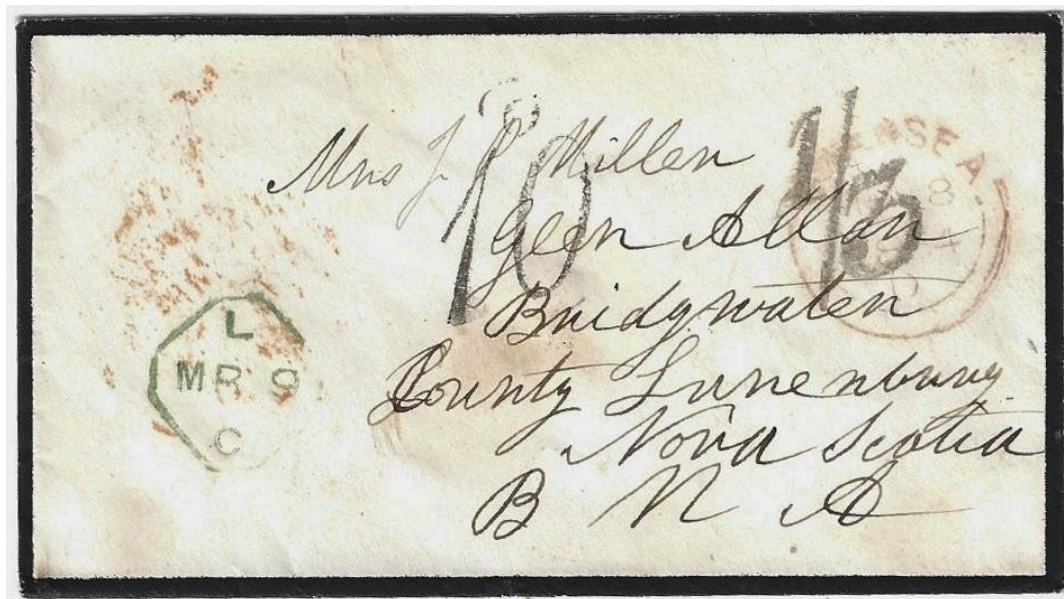

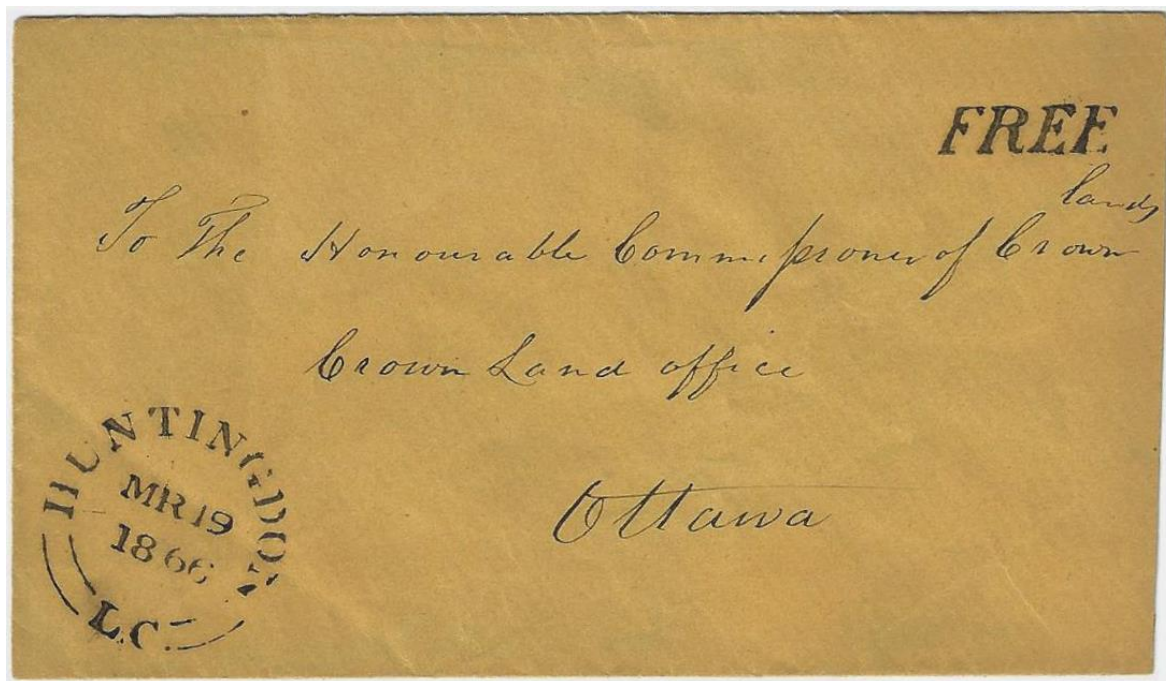

Item 528-01 – **New Brunswick 1d Claim** – 1855, business folded letter from St. John NB (b/s) mailed unpaid to Glasgow (b/s). Pkt Letter Liverpool tombstone in green. 6d Sterling collect with 1d New Brunswick claimed from the British Post Office. The letter was sent to Halifax in a closed bag via Sackville exchange and carried by Cunard America to Liverpool. When in 1854 the charge for a half ounce letter from BNA by British packet via Halifax or by Canadian packet was reduced to 6d Stg, a distinctive h/s was sent to the Liverpool exchange office to mark the charge on inbound letters. N.B. offices were able to claim a penny for inland postage on unpaid eastbound letters. \$450.00



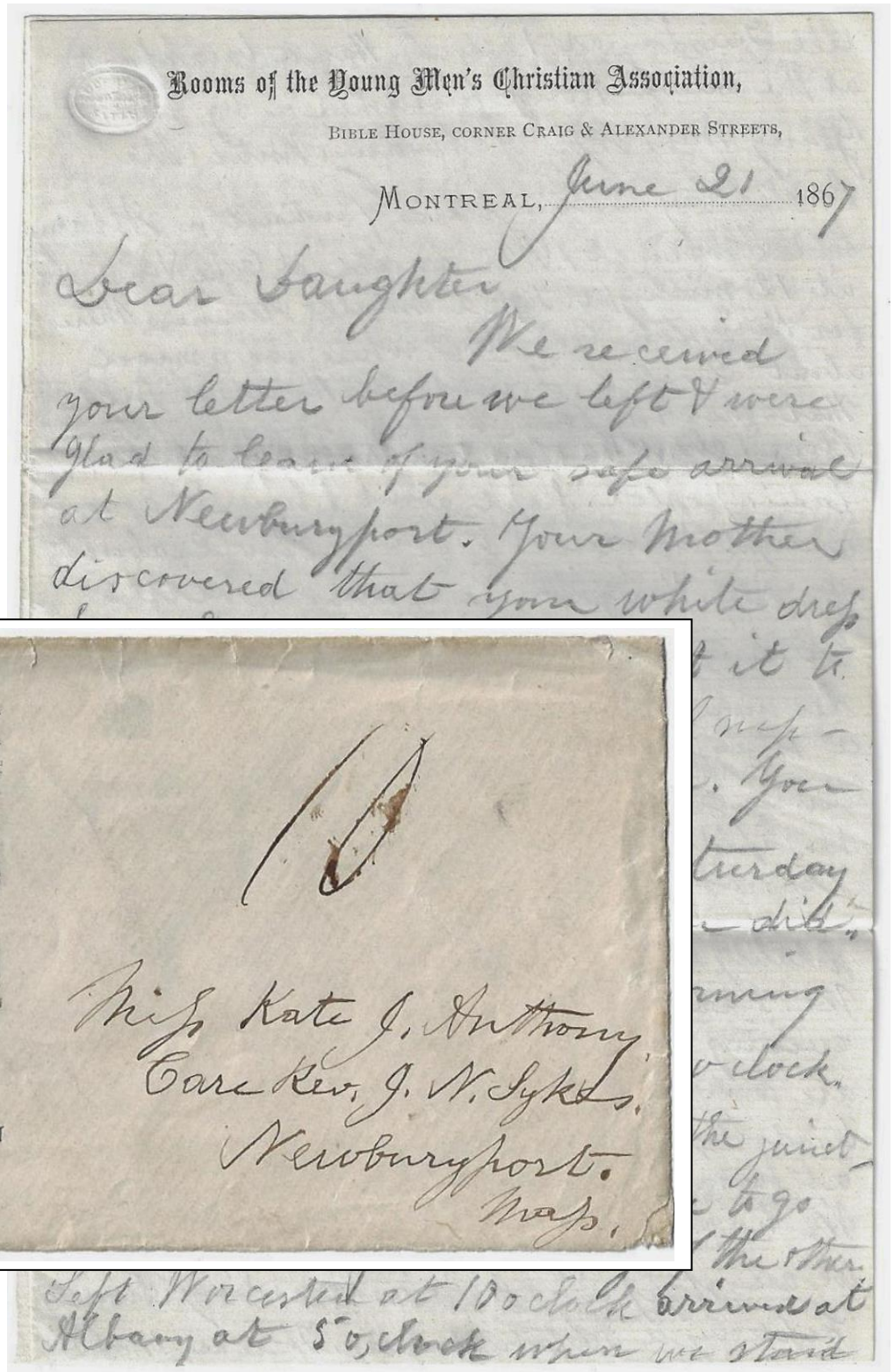
Item 528-02 – **Rate not reduced for Nova Scotia** – 1854, mourning cover from Swansea Wales to Bridgewater, Nova Scotia. The cover is dated March 8 and received March 31. On March 23, 1854, the transatlantic rate between GB and any point in the Canadas and PEI via Halifax was reduced to 6d Stg. This did NOT apply to NB, NS and NFLD whose mail was still charge the 1/0 Stg rate. This strange anomaly that was not corrected for almost 5 months until August 1, 1854. The cover is rated 10d Stg which is the British claim and postage converted to 1/3 Currency collect. \$250.00



Item 528-03 – **Huntingdon LC Free** – 1866, free franked stampless cover from Huntingdon LC to Ottawa via Montreal (b/s). Light reduction, great strikes! \$50.00



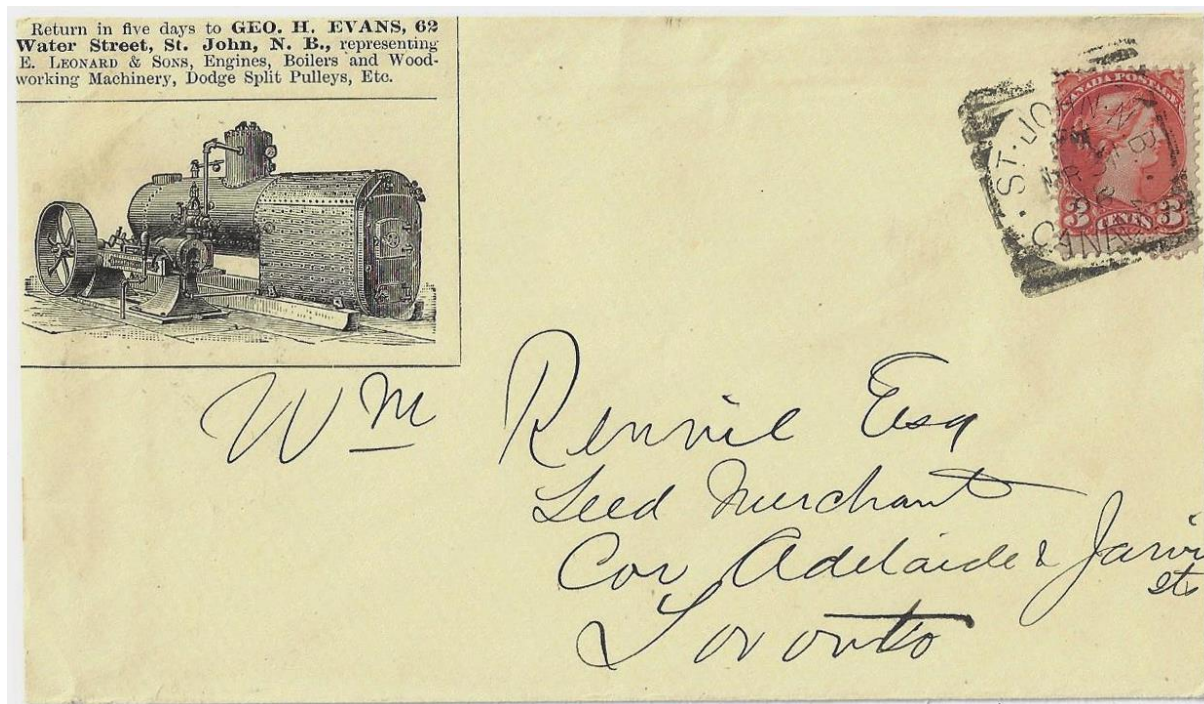
Item 528-04 – **10c Consort printed order 3B** – 1860, 10c Consort purple brown printed order 3B (showing characteristics of thicker paper, perforation discs still attached) tied by two concentric ring cancels on folded cover from Montreal paying 10c double weight letter rate to Sherbrooke. This double weight domestic franking is much scarcer than the single 10c rate to United-States, the ratio of known covers is at least 1 to 20. \$275.00



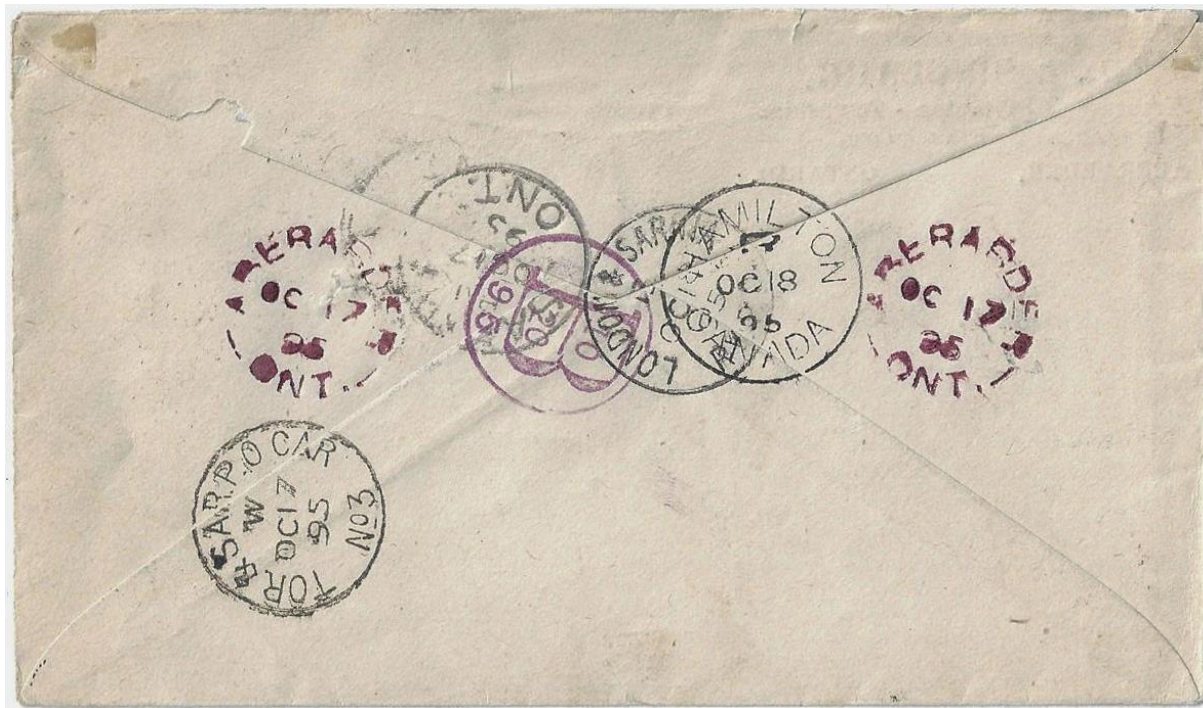
Item 528-05 – **YMCA advertising with letter** – 1867, YMCA advertising stampless cover rated 10¢ to Newburyport, Massachusetts. This is a family letter and reads in part: took the steamer for Montreal and had a magnificent sail down the St. Lawrence through the 1000 isles, down the rapids – we had a splendid concert, 3000 presents and now go to Quebec. I find it difficult to understand, people are half French and half English. Stopping at Saratoga, sailing down Lake Champlain and Lake George etc. A very pretty Decimal cover and interestingly one week before Confederation!. \$200.00



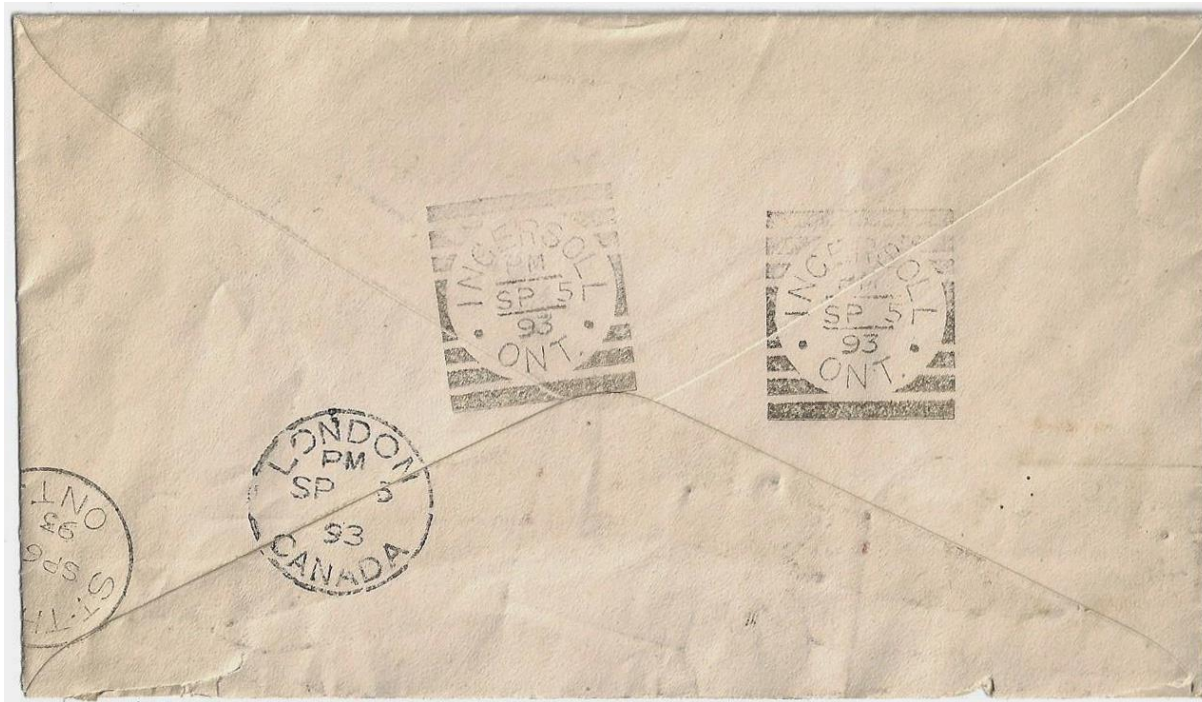
Item 528-06 – **Baby's Point UC (Lambton 1852-1890)** – 1861, 5¢ Beaver tied by concentric ring cancel on mourning cover from Baby's Point UC paying 5¢ letter rate to Toronto via Sarnia (b/s). A very scarce office, closed in 1890. \$175.00



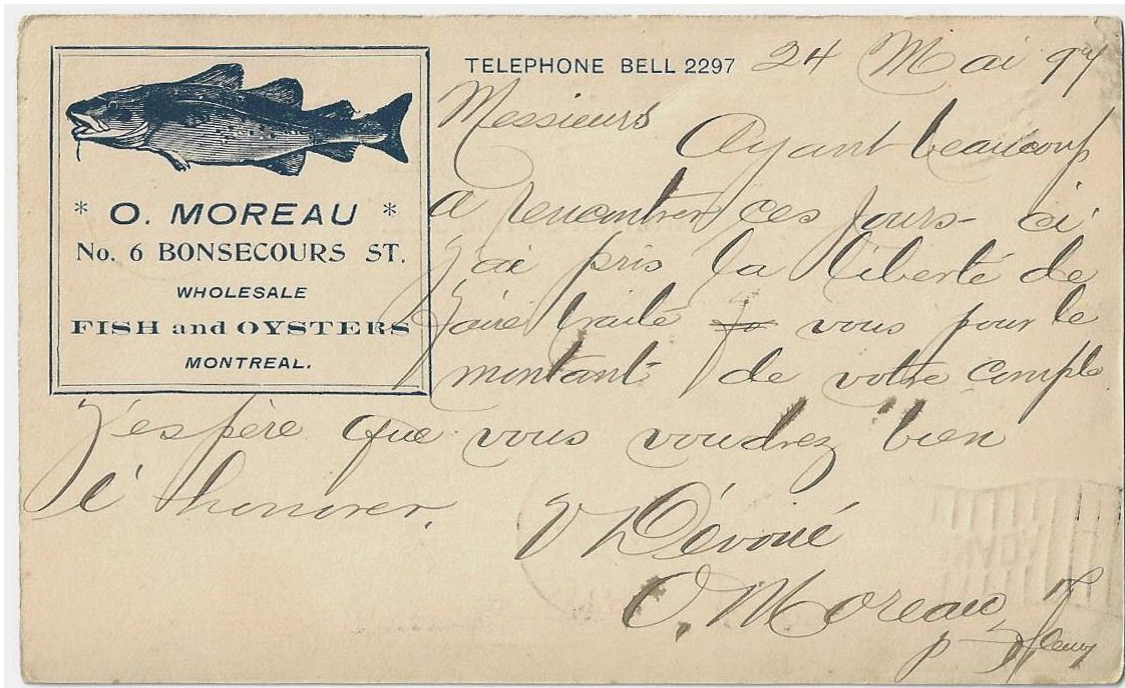
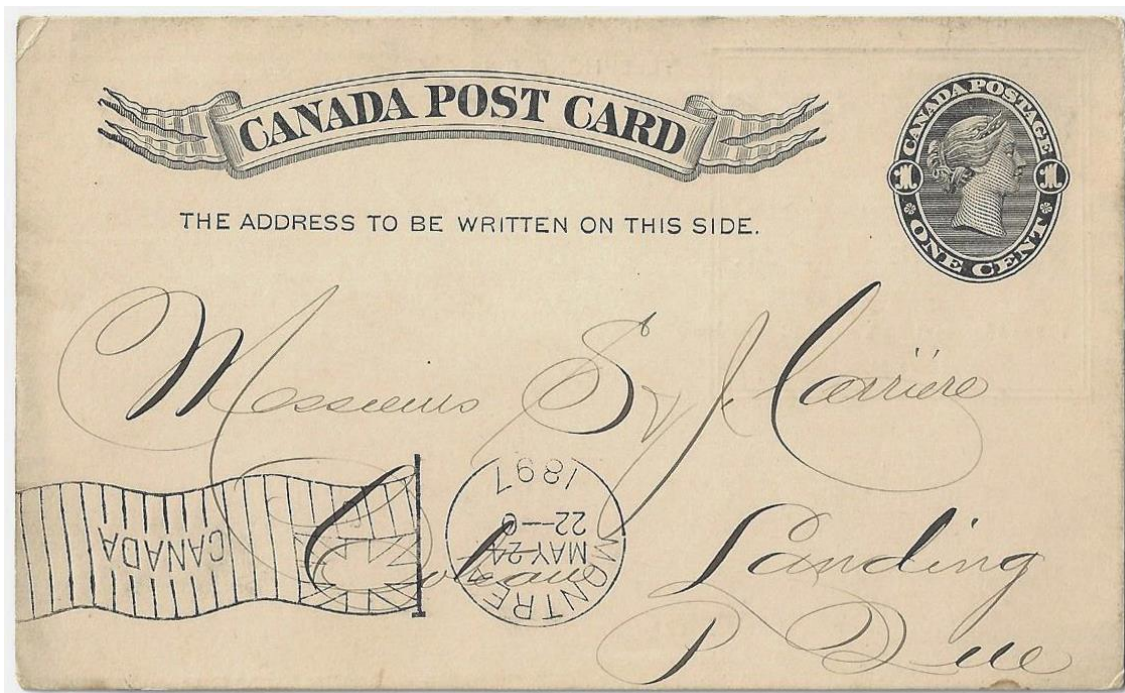
Item 528-07 – **G.H. Evans Engines and Machinery** – 1896, 3¢ SQ tied by St. John NB squared circle on George H. Evans Engines and Machinery advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$150.00



Item 528-08 – **Aberarder Ont, only 2 known examples** – 1895, 8¢ SQ tied by oval registered cancel, struck in dark red- purplish color (burgundy ink), on D.N. Sinclair Twp Treasurer c/c cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to U.S. (b/s). Sarnia (b/s), Hamilton (b/s). Tor & Sar P.O. Car No.3 W (b/s), London & Sarnia RyPO (b/s). Aberarder 21mm, the LRD of only 2 recorded examples. A spectacular Lambton cover! \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 528-09 – **Ingersoll squares on registered cover** – 1893, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by Ingersoll Ont squared circle (a very early example, PM SP 5 93, on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to St. Thomas (b/s) via London (b/s). \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 528-10 – **Montreal fish and oysters** – 1897, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Montreal to Coteau Landing, Montreal Imperial machine cancel, reverse with Moreau Wholesale Fish and Oysters advertising and signed. \$75.00 **SOLD**

Mills of Valleyfield and St. Louis Mile-End illustrated. Reverse with prices current, printed in French. Very scarce! \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 528-15 – **Canada Biscuit Company** – 1905, 1¢ Edward tied by Toronto machine cancel on Cream Sodas and Canada Biscuit Company advertising private card to James Bay Junction. Light crease. \$75.00




Item 528-16 – Owl Japan Teas – 1908, 1¢ Edward tied by St. Pie Que broken circle on Chaput, Fils & Cie postcard, reverse with “Try our Japan Teas – Famous Brand – Owl Chop”, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Napierville. \$45.00



Item 528-17 – Illegal fancy collar on private postcard – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by Antigonish NS duplex cancel on MacKinnon Men's Furnishing private postcard, illegal fancy collar with ornaments, paying 1¢ postcard rate to South Side River Dennis. \$45.00 **SOLD**

Item 528-25 – **Reported Missing** – 1943, Armed Forces air letter from Montreal, stamp fallen off, to RCAF Sgt Joe Healey, stationed with RAF in Tempsford. A Royal Air Force station located northeast of Sandy, Bedfordshire. "Reported Missing" and returned to Canada via Ottawa MPO 304. \$150.00



Item 528-26 – Anchorage Alaska to servicemen in Gimli – 1944, US airmail registered cover from Anchorage Alaska to a servicemen stationed in Gimli Manitoba. FECB in Vancouver and routed via Winnipeg. Then, redirected to a military training school in P.E.I. and to another training school in Maitland Nova Scotia. Montreal and Moncton AMF, RPO etc. 21 backstamps total. A fun cover! \$100.00



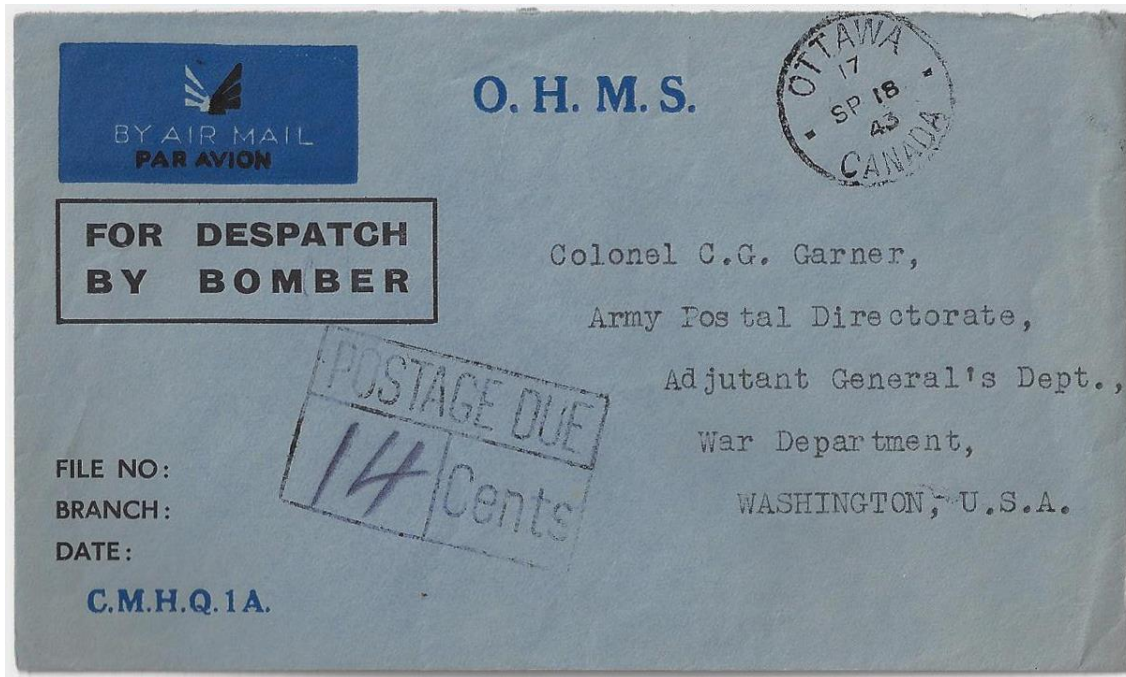
