Item 529-01 – <u>Guelph manuscript postmark</u> – 1840, folded letter from Guelph UC with manuscript postmark paid 7d to Toronto. The letter relates to an estate and autograph signed Thomas Shortreed. The Guelph manuscript postmark is recorded from 1832 to 1842. Filing fold. \$125.00

Item 529-02 – <u>Yorkville UC in blue</u> – 1866, 12½¢ Decimal tied by Yorkville UC broken circle <u>struck in blue</u> on cover paying 12½¢ Allan Line letter rate to London (b/s). Carried by the Peruvian from Quebec. Huge dot under CA. A very pretty cover! \$300.00

Item 529-04 – <u>15¢ letter rate to New South Wales</u> – 1881, 3¢ orange red (*strip of three and two singles, slightly sulfurized*) tied by fancy cancel on mourning cover from Chatham N.B. paying 15¢ letter rate to Stockton, New South Wales, Australia (Sydney and Stockton b/s). Routed via Windsor Ont and San Francisco (b/s). Trivial ¼ partially missing backflap, otherwise a choice and very fine cover. \$1,500.00

This primitive card meets the minimum dimensions for a private card but the material should have been card board not thicker than the ones issued by the Post Office Dept. This card should have been letter rated, allows as printed matter may be. First elected President of the Transvaal Republic in 1883, Paul Kruger was a leader of Boer resistance against the British during the war. Affectionately known as 'Uncle Paul' (Oom Paul in Afrikaans), he went on to win the subsequent elections of 1888, 1893 and 1898. Small edge fault. A very rare Jubilee cover. \$500.00

Item 529-26 – <u>Deseronto – Royal Flying Corps (ARF WING)</u> – 1918, 2¢+1¢ Wartax tied by Deseronto Ont cds on RFC cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Attercliffe Station Ont (b/s). There were two Royal Flying Corps camps set up in Deseronto, Camp Mohawk and Camp Rathbun. This envelope is certainly an early example showing the erroneously printed and distributed ARF wing. These wings were very quickly recalled on official orders and replaced with wings clearly marked RAF. Light reduction and tiny tear at foot. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 529-27 – <u>WW2 Canadian Prisoner of War</u> – 1943-1944, George S. Sadoquis from Goderich Ontario, 4 POW cards double censored, interned at M-Stammlager 344 Prisoners of War Camp, Germany. 
