




Item 530-01 – <u>King George IV (George Rex)</u> – 1828, letter and cover dated Jan 31 1828, endorsed "private", initialed in the lower left G.R. (George Rex) by the King George IV. Being King of GB also meant being King of the British Colonies including British North America, hence King of Canada. The letter in the hand of the King is addressed to Sir William Knighton. George IV writes "I think it would be as well that Admiral Milne should stay at Bermuda for five or six weeks beyond the usual time". Admiral Sir David Milne (1763-1845) was a Scottish Royal Navy admiral. Sir William Knighton, 1st Baronet, GCH (1776-1836) was Private Secretary to the Sovereign under George IV (1822–1830). \$2,000.00




Item 530-02 – <u>Gaspe Peninsula separatist, Robert Christie</u> – 1853, Legislative Assembly cover paid 6 from Quebec to Haldimand Gaspé via Douglastown. Signed by Robert Christie, an independent. Christie attempted to start a movement in Gaspé to separate from Lower Canada and join the province of New Brunswick. This alienated the voters of the region and he was not re-elected. In died in 1856. Rare. \$250.00





Item 530-03 – Merrickville UC – fire insurance policy – 1854, legal size fire insurance policy partly printed partly written mailed from Merrickville UC, 3d collect to Prescott (b/s). Routed via Kemptville (b/s). Out of the ordinary. \$125.00



Item 530-04 – <u>Dead Letter Office memo (form 1,000)</u> – 1883, printed Post Office Dept DLO memo form D.62 1,000 21-12-81, initially to the attention of a writer, relates to regulations concerning valuables, gold, silver and money sent through the mail. Dead Letter Office broken circle NO 1 1883. A very spectacular Dead Letter Office paper concerning valuables. \$350.00



Item 530-05 – Money Order Toronto P.O. datestamp – 1873, Toronto Post Office Money Order receipt with Money Order Toronto P.O. datestamp JU 4 1873 and Postmaster signed Joseph Seplie. \$200.00



Item 530-06 – <u>Strathroy UC - 1¢, 2¢ Large Queen</u> – 1869, 1¢, 2¢ Large Queen (*on the edge*) tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Strathroy UC paying 3¢ letter rate to Sarnia (b/s). A very pretty Middlesex cover!. \$300.00





Item 530-07 – 10¢ pre-UPU to France – Insufficiently Paid – 1875, 5¢ Large Queen (pair, perforated 11½x12, most perfs intact, tiny fault being on the edge) tied by Chambly Canton Que broken circle on cover, 6 NO 75, paying 10¢ pre-UPU letter rate for ½ oz to France. Insufficiently Paid handstamp, perhaps a double weight 16¢ pre-UPU, however with PD (paid to destination), no due or claim markings. Carried by Allan Line Moravian with Montreal and London transits. Vendome receiver (b/s). An important pre-UPU Large Queen cover. \$5,500.00



Item 530-08 – 10¢ dull rose lilac – to Jamaica, West Indies – 1885, 10¢ SQ (dull rose lilac) tied by Toronto duplex cancel, 16 DE 85, paying 10¢ double weight letter rate cover to Jamaica, West Indies. New York transit (b/s) and with Kingston and Falmouth (b/s). Very scarce. \$1,000.00



Item 530-09 – <u>Waterloo Ont advertising registered</u> – 1892, 3¢ SQ tied by Waterloo Ont cds, 5¢ RLS with registration number on Ontario Mutual Life Insurance Company advertising cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto. \$200.00 SOLD



Item 530-10 – 10¢ deep lilac rose - 20¢ quadruple weight – 1887, 10¢ SQ (deep lilac rose) tied by Halifax duplex cancel on BNA Bank cover paying 20¢ quadruple weight UPU letter rate to Liverpool, England. Paid Liverpool Col Packet 20 AU 87. A bit rough opening at back. Very pretty!. \$1,250.00



Item 530-11 – <u>Portage La Prairie Man</u> – 1895, 1¢ (3), 5¢ SQ tied by Portage La Prairie Man cds on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to U.S. Winnipeg and St. Paul transit (b/s). Great strikes! \$75.00 **SOLD**





Item 530-12 – Montreal hammer 1 - 10¢ UPU registered to Argentina – 1894, ½¢ SQ (18) tied by oval Montreal Que parcel cancel on 1¢ stationery envelope, Montreal barred circle hammer 1 dated JY 10 94, paying 10¢ UPU registered letter rate to Argentina (b/s) via New York (b/s). Some overall tropical foxing, still an attractive Montreal hammer 1 and rate cover! \$750.00






Item 530-13 – 10¢ double weight UPU to Germany – 1893, ½¢ (pair), 1¢, 2¢, 6¢ SQ tied by Montreal duplex cancel on Windosr Hotel advertising cover paying 10¢ double weight UPU letter rate to Berlin, Germany (b/s). London transit (b/s). Redirected with Grosstabarz (b/s). A gorgeous four-colour franking cover. \$750.00





Item 530-14 – **5¢ UPU to Costa Rica via New Orleans** – 1896, 1¢ (2), 3¢ SQ tied by Copetown Ont broken circle on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Costa Rica (*San Jose receiver on front, struck in blue*) via Hamilton Ont (b/s) and New Orleans (b/s). Stamps affixed closely to edge and trimmed at right. Still an nice Wentworth cover! \$500.00





Item 530-15 – The earliest recorded private postcard – 1877, 1¢ SQ tied by Meaford broken circle on James Trout bicoloured illustrated private postcard (*Fire and Life Insurance / Land and Loan Agent*) to Toronto (b/s). The 1¢ postcard rate was disallowed for use from July 1877 to December 1894. This card pre-dates the ban and is one of a mere handful known. The card has surface fault at left.. ***Illustrated and discussed in *The Postal History of the Post Card 1871-1911 by Allan Steinhart, p.10.* Described by Steinhart as the earliest recorded private postcard. A rarity Ex Steinhart and Lindemann. \$1,000.00 SOLD




Item 530-16 – <u>3 different Quebec Treasury Dept covers</u> – 1887-1888-1891, 3¢ SQ tied by Quebec duplex cancel on three Treasury Department Quebec covers (to New York, Sherbrooke and Montreal). \$50.00



Item 530-17 – <u>Indo Ceylon Tea Company</u> – 1898, 3¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Monsoon Indo Ceylon Tea Co. advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Little Current. 3¢ Numeral advertising covers are very scarce. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 530-18 – <u>Fort Frances baker and confectioner</u> – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on W.G. Breckkon Baker and Confectioner c/c cover from Fort Frances Ont paying 2¢ letter rate to Winnipeg (b/s) via Wabigoon(b/s). \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 530-19 –<u>Little Britain Ont (Victoria)</u> – 1902, ½¢ Numeral strip of 4 tied by grid cancel on Peterborough Hotel National advertising cover, mailed from Little Britain, paying 2¢ letter rate to London Ont. Lengthy letter accompanies. \$100.00



Item 530-20 – Krugersdorp registered to a Kingston tobacconist – 1901, Transvaal VRI 2d, ERI 1d (3) tied by Krugersdorp cds on registered cover to Kingston Ontario (b/s). Routed via Johannesburg and London England (b/s). At the time of mailing, the South African Constabulary Contingent A, B and F squadrons were stationed in Krugersdorp. \$500.00



Item 530-21 – <u>Canadian Contingent South Africa</u> – 1900, GB 1d tied by British Army Field Post Office S-A cds on Canadian Contingent South Africa cover, 1st Contingent, to Charlottetown PEI (partial b/s). Tear UL. \$200.00





Item 530-22 – Mono Road Station Ont (Peel) – 1904, 7¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on cover from Mono Road Station Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Berlin (b/s). Toronto (b/s) with Tor & Owen Sound M.C.9 (b/s). A scarce cover from Peel. \$75.00






Item 530-23 – ½¢ major re-entry, 1¢ hairlines – 1908, ½¢ Quebec (8, second right stamp with major re-entry, horizontal line in Canada and bottom frame, 96i, position 44), 1¢ (hairlines in all margins, strong at left) tied by Kaslo BC cds on cover underpaying 8¢ double weight UPU letter rate to Germany (b/s). Postage due 6¢ the double deficiency. Aging and all gum toned perfs otherwize a lovely re-entry hairlines cover. \$300.00




Item 530-24 – **2¢ Quebec on censored cover** – <u>1916</u>, 2¢ Quebec tied by grid cancel on cover from Berlin Ont (AP 13 16 paying 2¢ letter rate to U.S. Censored and resealed with civil censorship tape type 1. Out of date for the 2¢ Quebec but still an interesting use. \$75.00






Item 530-25 – Red Rose Tea – 1915, 1¢, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on T.H. Estabrooks Co. c/c cover with Red Rose Tea colourul back advertising paying 3¢ letter rate to Kingston. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 530-26 – Buy Made in Canada patriotic – 1915, 1¢ Admiral strip of 3 tied by Winnipeg International machine cancel on R.S. Bickle Company c/c and Buy Canadian patriotic cover paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. Light gum toned perfs. \$200.00



Item 530-27 – <u>Woodstock N.B. Exhibition</u> – 1925, 1¢ Admiral strip of 3 tied by Woodstock NB cds on Woodstock Exhibition advertising cover, horse illustrated, paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. Agricultural display, racing, amusement etc. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 530-28 — <u>Brighton orchards</u> — 1912, 1¢ Admiral pair tied by Mont & Tor GTRY 9 cds on Brighton Rex Orchards advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to U.S. A scarce orchard advertising. \$60.00



Item 530-29 – <u>Horse illustrated – B.F. Ackerman Son & Co.</u> – 1915, 2¢ Admiral, 1¢ Wartax MR1 tied by Peterboro machine cancel on B.F. Ackerman Son & Co. advertising cover, <u>horse illustrated and embossed</u>, paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. \$75.00



Item 530-30 – 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Sweden – 1923, 2¢, 4¢ Admiral tied by Vancouver machine cancel on UPU Japanese scene postcard paying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Sweden. The card written onboard the Empress of Australia 11 days earlier. \$100.00





Item 530-31 – <u>Leamington Ont roller No.2</u> – 1927, 2¢ Confederation tied by a neat Leamington Ont roller No.2 cancel on cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Pelee Island (b/s). The cover was carried on flight Leamington Pelee Island operated by Floyd Banghart of London Air Transport. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 530-32 – <u>8¢ Mufti pair usage – World's Fair cinderella</u> – 1939, 1¢ Silver Jubilee, <u>8¢ Mufti pair</u> tied by Armstrong BC cds on cover paying 17¢ triple weight registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Cal & Van RPO (b/s). Reverse with New York World's Fair cinderella (well tied). \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 530-33 – <u>Indian Motorcycle illustrated – special delivery</u> – 1932, 3¢ Arch, 20¢ Special Delivery E4 (in period) tied by Toronto machine cancel (no obliterator) on Duke Cycle & Motor Co., Indian Motorcycle illustrated, paying 23¢ special delivery letter rate to Elmvale. \$125.00



Return address 204 Sqn, RAF, via APO 606 Miami, Florida. This is the HQ West Africa Service Command, USAAF, ACCRA Gold Coast. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 530-35 – RPO QC-96 (RF G) – c1919-1920, 3¢ Admiral tied by Train No. / Levis Richmond RPO (30mm), Gray QC-96 RF G on Iron Merchant c/c cover from Victoriaville paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. A rare Quebec RPO. \$350.00






