

Item 531-01 – <u>Quebec LC landscape engraved letterhead</u> – 1845, folded letter from Quebec LC, dated St. George Day, with spectacular engraved letterhead, paid at Quebec crown and rated 9d to Montreal. The letter is written in English and signed R.R. Poitras, St. Michael's Cove, Quebec. Engraving by Robert Weir and published in Glasgow, Scotland. A very pretty and rare Quebec landscape and marine work of art. \$1,000.00

Item 531-02 – **Bytown Money Letter** – 1843, business folded letter from Bytown UC, money letter, rated 2/3 collect to Montreal (triple 9d). The letter is addressed to Robertson Masson Company (the *trading company, importers, steamship owner*). \$125.00 **SOLD**

Item 531-05 – <u>Paisley UC (22mm Berri – Bruce County)</u> – 1859, stampless cover from Paisley UC (22mm Berri hammer) paid 3d to Toronto. Routed via Walkerton, Guelph and Bentick (b/s). The 20 to 22mm hammers are from the D.G. Berri order of 1857. \$100.00

Carried by private trader to New York. The letter is addressed to Andrew Murison from his brother. Murison was a Quebec lawyer, businessman and land owner. \$200.00 SOLD






