Item 532-01 – <u>The earliest recorded Dead Letter Office letter</u> – 1829, folded letter from Alniham England to Montreal redirected to Ste. Rose Isle of Jesus (today Laval), carried privately to Quebec where posted. Fleuron in red dated AU 22 29, rated 9d and forwarded. Not called for in black and sent to Quebec. Manuscript *"Dead Letter Office Quebec 15 Octr 1829"*. This is the earliest recorded DLO item in existence. The previous earliest was 1833 with previous authors including Arfken stating the DLO was established in about 1830. This new date represents the single most important DLO cover and the starting point to any complete DLO exhibit or collection. A great discovery. \$4,000.00 SOLD

Item 532-03 – <u>Manitowaning Lake Huron</u> – 1865, stampless cover with letter dated January 1865 from Manitowaning Lake Huron paid 5 to Clifford Ont via Penetanguishene and Elora (b/s). The letter is from Rev. J. W. Sims who was in charge of the Anglican Indigenous people mission at Sheguiandah, northwestern shore of Manitoulin Island, addressed to Reverend Smithhurst. Transit marks and enclosure show evidence that the letter is dated JA 25 65, the Manitowaning Lake Huron July datestamp is a dating error. This letter would have been carried over the ice to Penetanguishene. \$500.00



In the present depressed markets several issues are on the bargain counter. As an outstanding example we so regard *KOOTENAY FLORENCE*. During the boring of a three-quarter mile tunnel at lake level, many obstacles had to be overcome, but it eventually encountered the expected orebodies, similar in size and value to those from which \$1,000,000 gross was recovered at higher levels. Large reserves have since been opened up.

The directorate has been advised by its engineers that in four months' time, with the mill changes completed and the mine in production, milling 150 tons per day, the average net profit will be not less than \$750 per day. This means an annual profit of approximately \$250,000. Allowing liberally for contingencies, it is reasonably safe to figure upon net profit equal to 33% upon valuation reflected by present market quotations. Upon the prevailing system of valuation, the stock under such production conditions should represent a mine value of \$2,500,000, equal to two and a half times par value of 20 cents per share. In other words, the current levels around 15 cents should be more than trebled.





Martha Lipton (1913-2006) was an American mezzo-soprano born in New York City. She was active during the 1950s as a recording artist for Columbia Records and other opera productions. She became a professor of voice and later professor emeritus.
