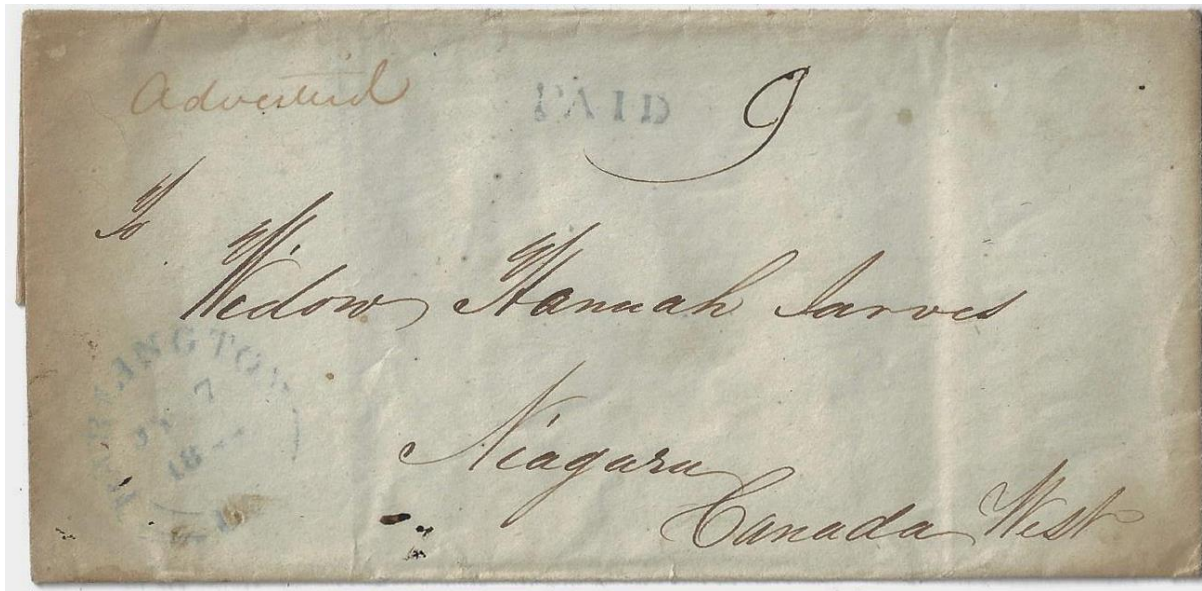
Item 532-01 – **The earliest recorded Dead Letter Office letter** – 1829, folded letter from Alnham England to Montreal redirected to Ste. Rose Isle of Jesus (today Laval), carried privately to Quebec where posted. Fleuron in red dated AU 22 29, rated 9d and forwarded. Not called for in black and sent to Quebec. Manuscript "Dead Letter Office Quebec 15 Oct 1829". This is the earliest recorded DLO item in existence. The previous earliest was 1833 with previous authors including Arfken stating the DLO was established in about 1830. This new date represents the single most important DLO cover and the starting point to any complete DLO exhibit or collection. A great discovery. \$4,000.00 **SOLD**



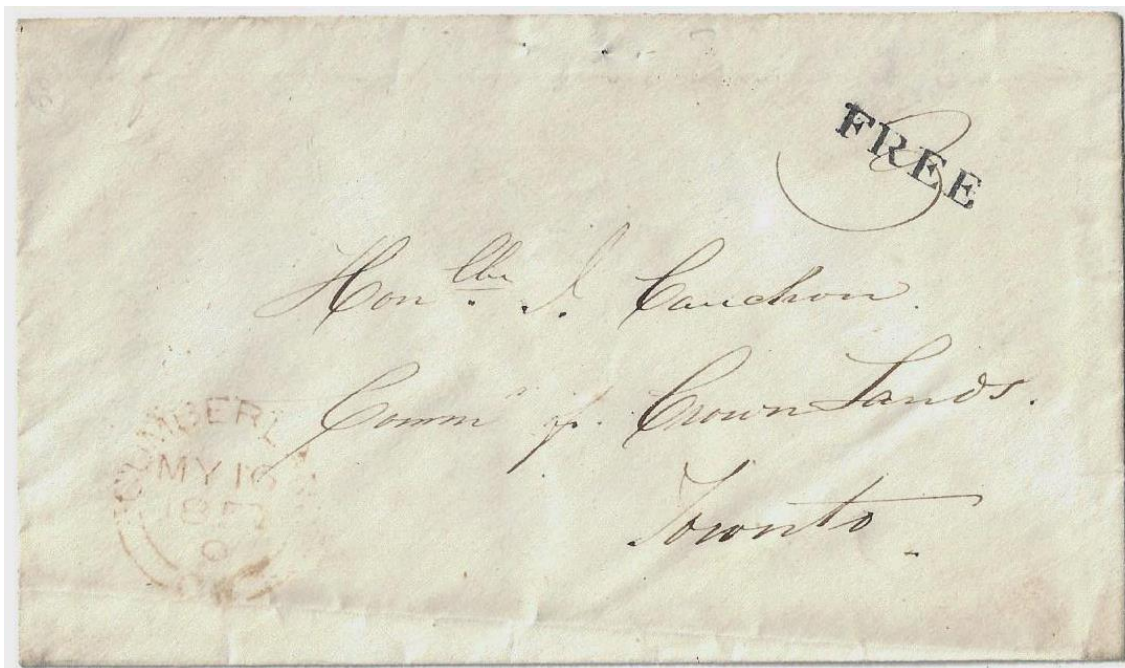
Item 532-02 – **Trio of Canada Gazette papers – mailed** - c1870, trio of Canada Gazette papers mailed from Ottawa to New Brunswick: January 1870 (with wrapper and postmark), April 1870 (with wrapper), August 1874 (with wrapper, struck by the rare commuted postage prepaid by publisher handstamp) and in bonus, a Royal Gazette Fredericton Jan 1874. Overall good condition, staining, etc. \$500.00 **RED**



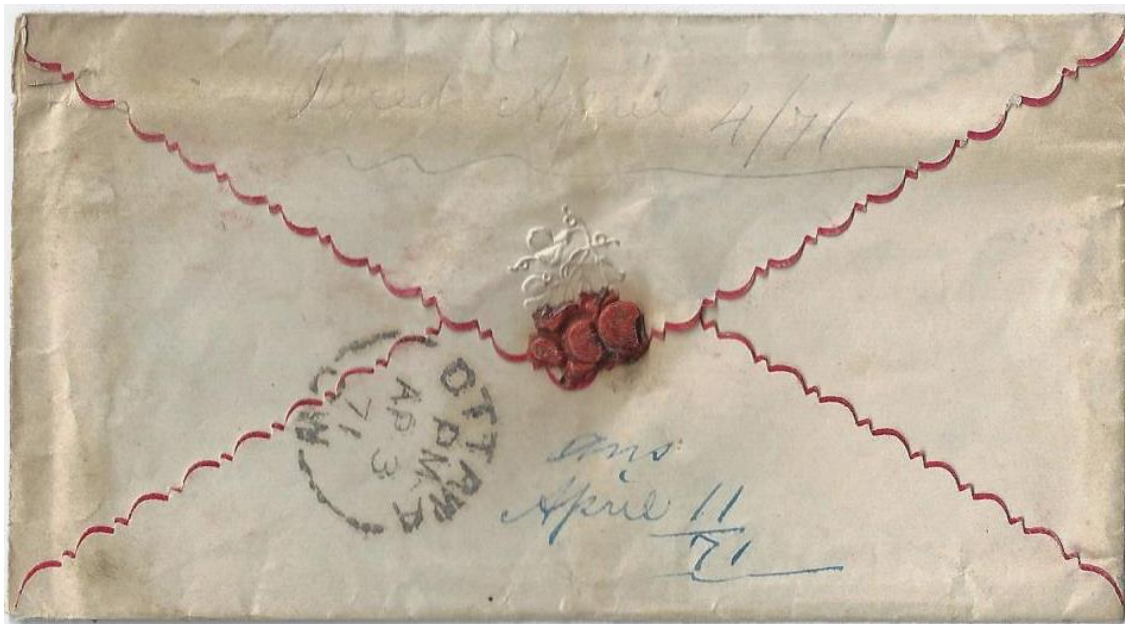
Item 532-03 – **Manitowaning Lake Huron** – 1865, stampless cover with letter dated January 1865 from Manitowaning Lake Huron paid 5 to Clifford Ont via Penetanguishene and Elora (b/s). The letter is from Rev. J. W. Sims who was in charge of the Anglican Indigenous people mission at Sheguiandah, northwestern shore of Manitoulin Island, addressed to Reverend Smithhurst. Transit marks and enclosure show evidence that the letter is dated JA 25 65, the Manitowaning Lake Huron July datestamp is a dating error. This letter would have been carried over the ice to Penetanguishene. \$500.00



Item 532-04 – **Darlington UC (Durham – 1824-1854)** – 1844, folded cover from Darlington UC (struck in blue) paid 9d to Niagara (b/s). “Advertised” and presumably found. A nice Darlington cover from the first period. 1824-1854. \$200.00



Item 532-05 – **Cumberland CW (Russell)** – 1857, stampless cover from Cumberland CW (basal O) rated 3d and then re-rated free to Toronto (b/s) via Ottawa (b/s). This hammer 1852-1858. \$75.00



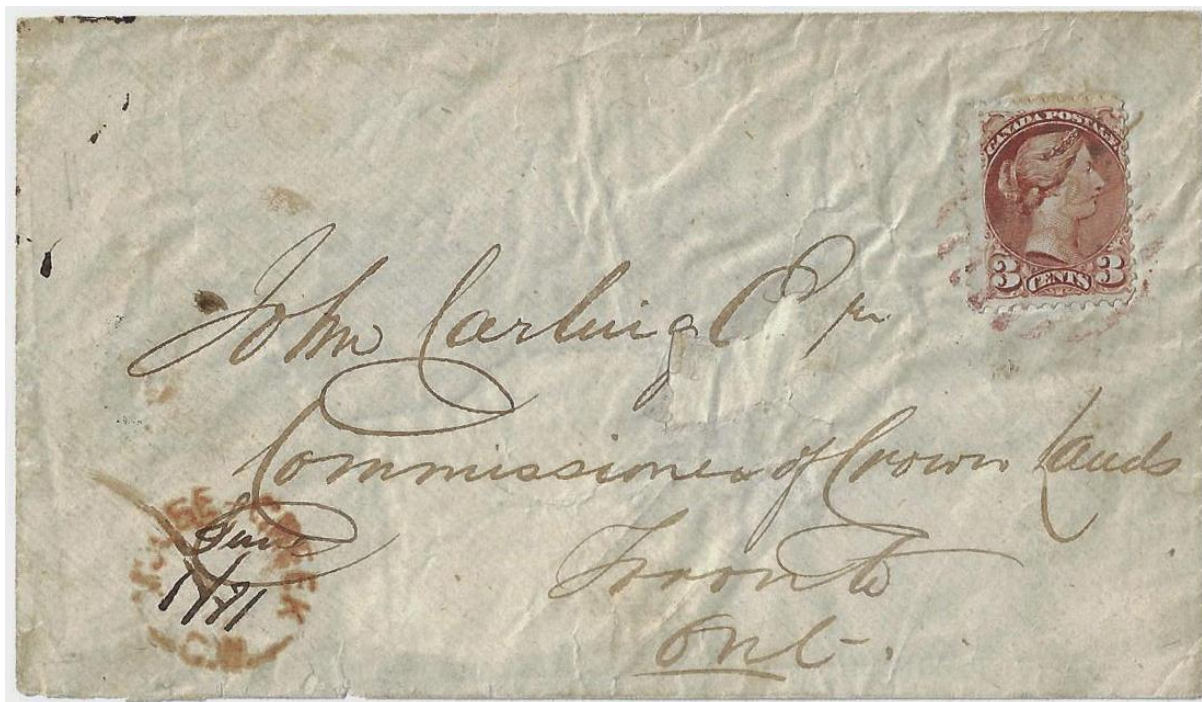
Item 532-06 – **Russell UC (Russell)** – 1871, stampless lady cover from Russell UC (dater corrected AP 1) paid 3 to Osnabruck Centre via Ottawa (b/s). \$30.00



Item 532-07 – **St. Hyacinthe CE (Ruggles in red)** – 1857, large four margined 3d Beaver (showing adjacent at top) tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from St. Hyacinthe CE (*Ruggles handstamp B in red*) paying 3d letter rate to Drummondville (b/s) via Melbourne (b/s). Plate flaw near “Postage” and dot into “O”. The cover has a paper crease not affecting the stamp. \$350.00



Item 532-08 – **Hampton UC (Durham) ERD** – 1864, 5¢ Beaver tied by pen cancel on cover from Hampton UC paying 5¢ letter rate to Cavan (b/s) via Bowmanville (b/s). This is the current earliest recorded date for this Hampton JA 13 64. \$75.00

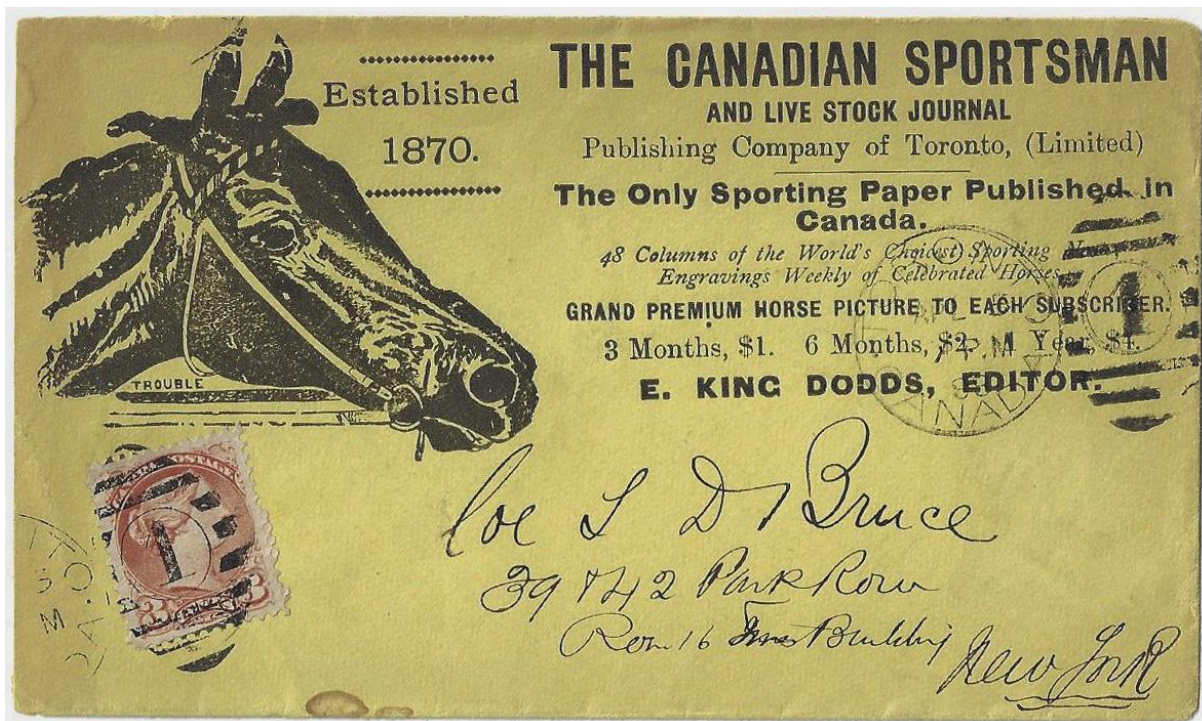


Item 532-09 – **3¢ SQ dark rose - Moose Creek CW (Stormont)** – 1871, 3¢ SQ (dark rose, perf 11.85x11.85, almost brownish carmine, typical centering for this printing) tied by large grid cancel in red on cover from Moose Creek CW (ms date) paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. The cover is addressed to Crown Lands and has the usual back fault. \$125.00

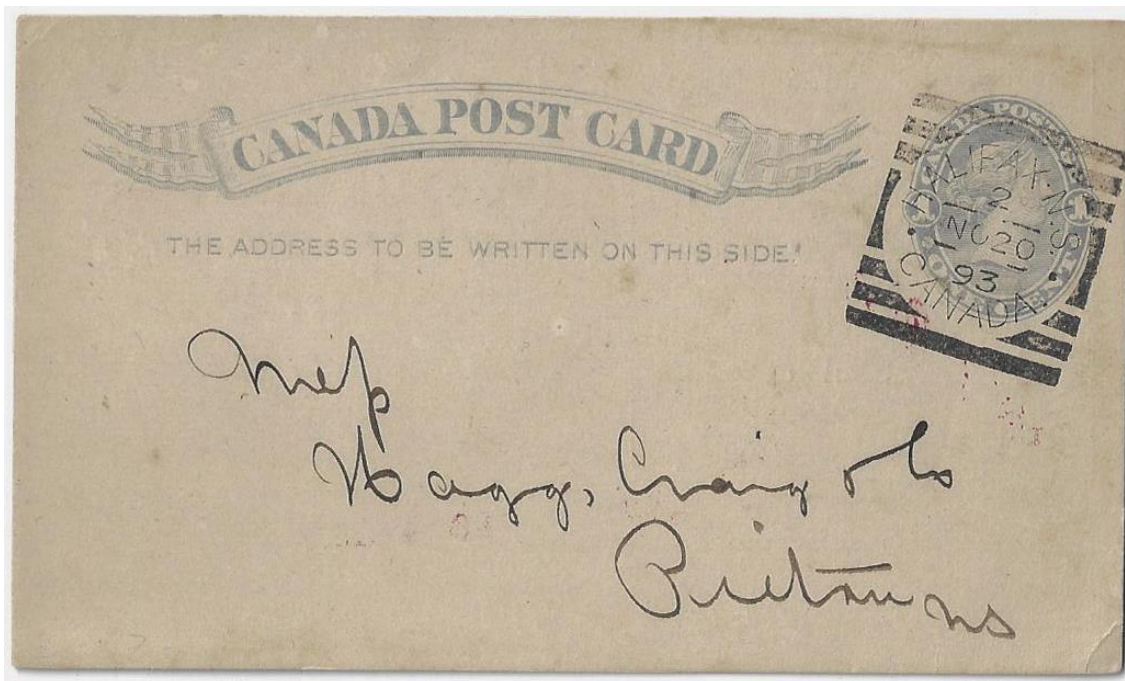

Item 532-11 – **Canadian Sportsman, Horse illustrated** – 1888, 3¢ SQ (brownish orange, perf 12.1x12.1) tied by Toronto duplex cancel on Canadian Sportsman and Livestock Journal advertising cover, horse illustrated, paying 3¢ letter rate to US. A very pretty cover and a key shade and date. \$250.00

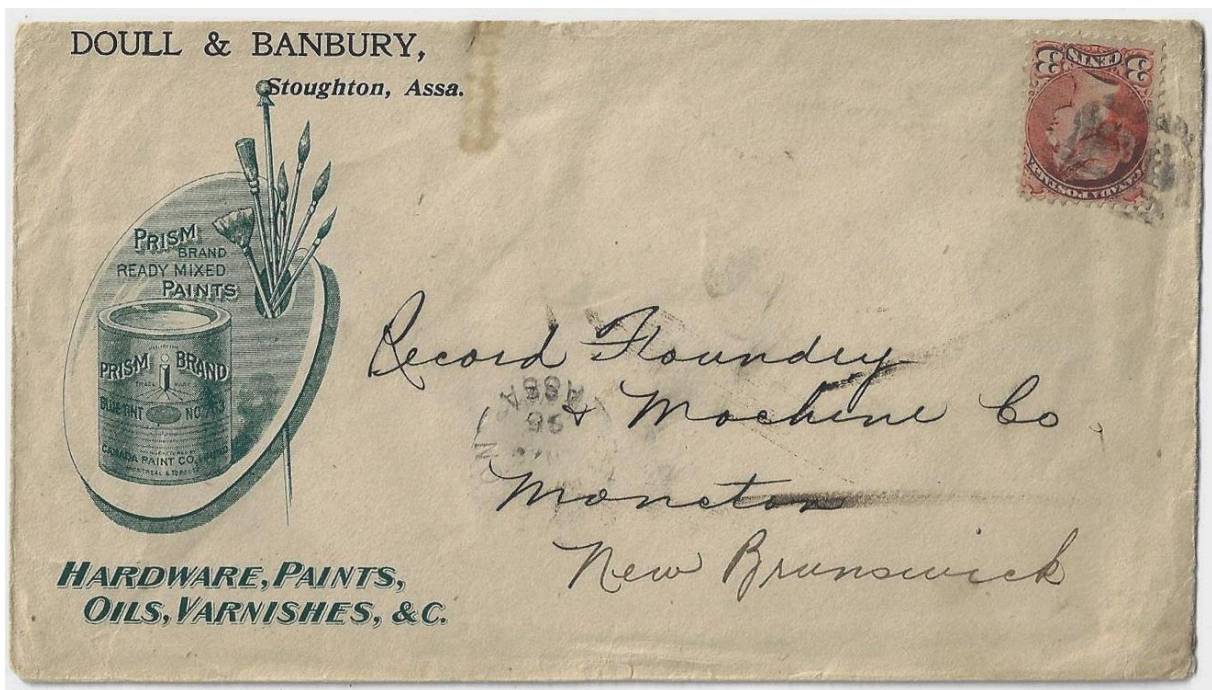
Item 532-18 – **Bear Brook Ont (Russell)** – 1895, 3¢ SQ pair (left stamp jumbo) tied by large grid cancel on cover from Bear Brook Ont paying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Moncton (b/s) via Ottawa (b/s). Reduced at left and small tear. \$40.00 **SOLD**



Item 532-19 – **20¢ firch class matter from wholesale druggists** – c1897, 5¢ SQ block of 4 (perf 12x12.2, grey black shade) tied by roller cancel on homemade mailing tag (perhaps a wrapping piece) from Halifax to Cape Breton paying 1¢ per ounce rate. 5<sup>th</sup> class matter includes merchandize of all descriptions not entitled to pass at a lower rate with respect to objectionable matter. Liquid, glass bottle, metal case or tube are all items possibly mailed by a wholesale druggist. A great piece for any SQ rate collection. \$250.00

Four military postal stations have been authorized, one each, as follows: Quartier Presse et Milico, Carré de Salaberry, Parc Savard, and Camp Lévis, and a branch post office will be in operation at Ville des Tentés. These stations will be in charge of trained post office men, and the exchange of mails will be as frequent as the service demands.

During the boring of a three-quarter mile tunnel at lake level, many obstacles had to be overcome, but it eventually encountered the expected orebodies, similar in size and value to those from which \$1,000,000 gross was recovered at higher levels. Large reserves have since been opened up.

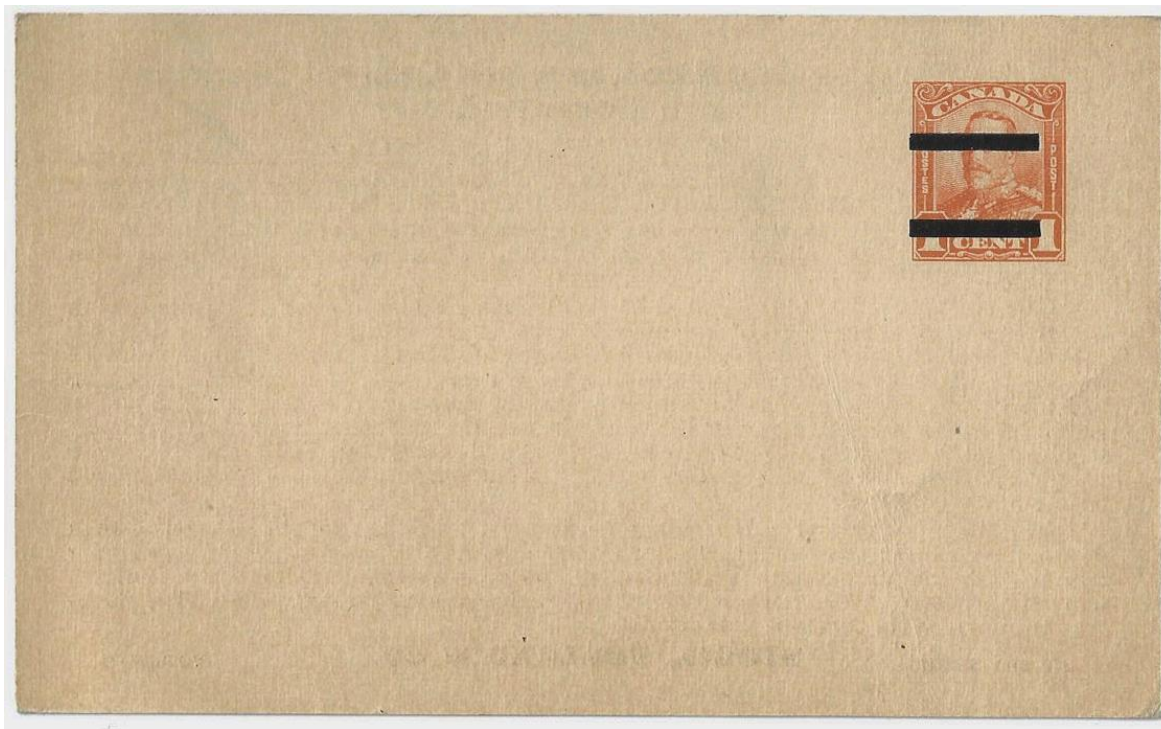
The directorate has been advised by its engineers that in four months' time, with the mill changes completed and the mine in production, milling 150 tons per day, the average net profit will be not less than \$750 per day. This means an annual profit of approximately \$250,000. Allowing liberally for contingencies, it is reasonably safe to figure upon net profit equal to 33% upon valuation reflected by present market quotations. Upon the prevailing system of valuation, the stock under such production conditions should represent a mine value of \$2,500,000, equal to two and a half times par value of 20 cents per share. In other words, the current levels around 15 cents should be more than trebled.

In view of this situation we do not see how the stock can fail to sell at less than double the present price before the end of the year, with possibilities of far higher figures when milling capacity is increased to 300 tons, as engineers believe will eventually be necessary. The stock is undoubtedly a bargain at present prices. We therefore recommend its purchase without delay.
