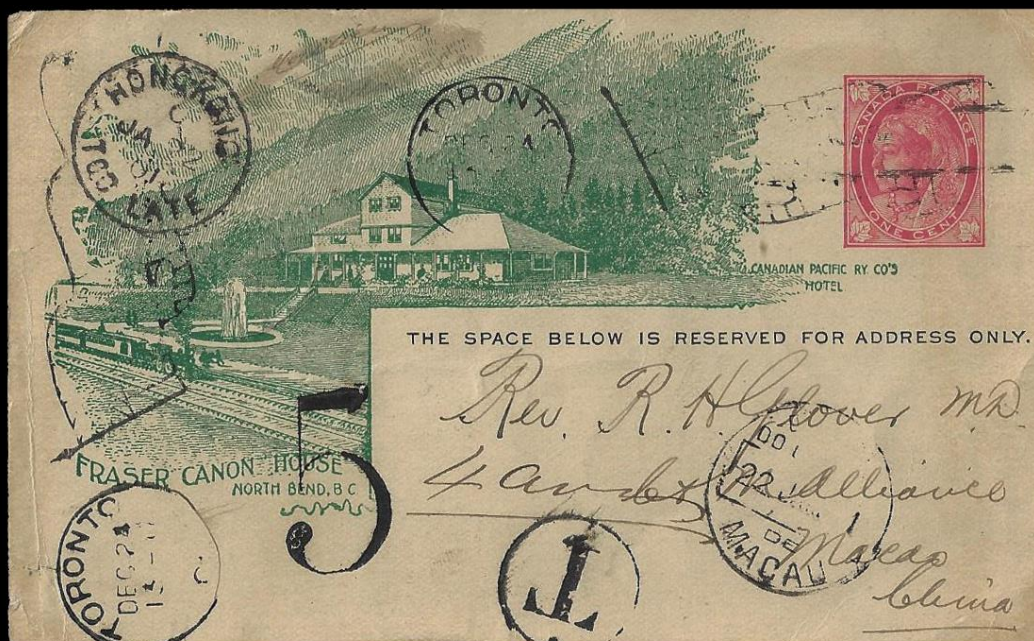

Item 533-01 – **St. John's registered to U.S.** – 1897, 10¢ Cabot's Ship Matthew tied by St. John's NFLD cds on cover, St. John's barred circle 25 OC 97, paying 10¢ registered letter rate to NYC (b/s) via Boston b/s). \$150.00



Item 533-02 – **St. John's registered to London Ont** – 1910, 1¢, 2¢ (3) John Guy Issue tied by oval registered cancel struck in purple on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to London Ont (b/s). Montreal Keyhole precursor, oval registration branch St. John's, Montreal dotted cds (b/s). \$150.00



Item 533-03 – **18¢ registered to Germany** – 1913, 4¢, 6¢, 8¢ Discovery of Newfoundland tied by St. John's cds on cover paying 18¢ registered letter rate to Germany (b/s) via London England (b/s). \$200.00

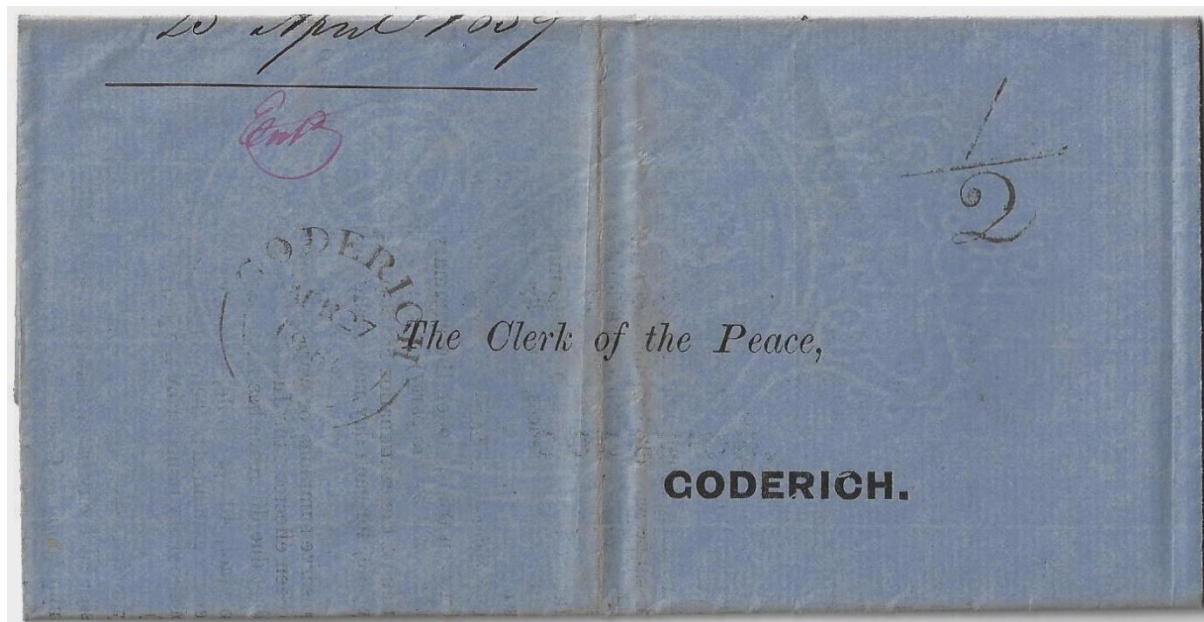


Item 533-04 – **CAPO No.5 parcel airmail registered (W Force)** – 1942, NFLD 10¢ (193) 48¢ (199), 3¢ (246) tied by CAPO No.5 MOTO handstamp on parcel piece, endorsed "Fragile / Glasses" from W Force servicemen paying 51¢ airmail registered parcel rate to Toronto via Moncton, censored, Toronto Customs handstamp. A spectacular CAPO No.5 item! \$125.00 **SOLD**

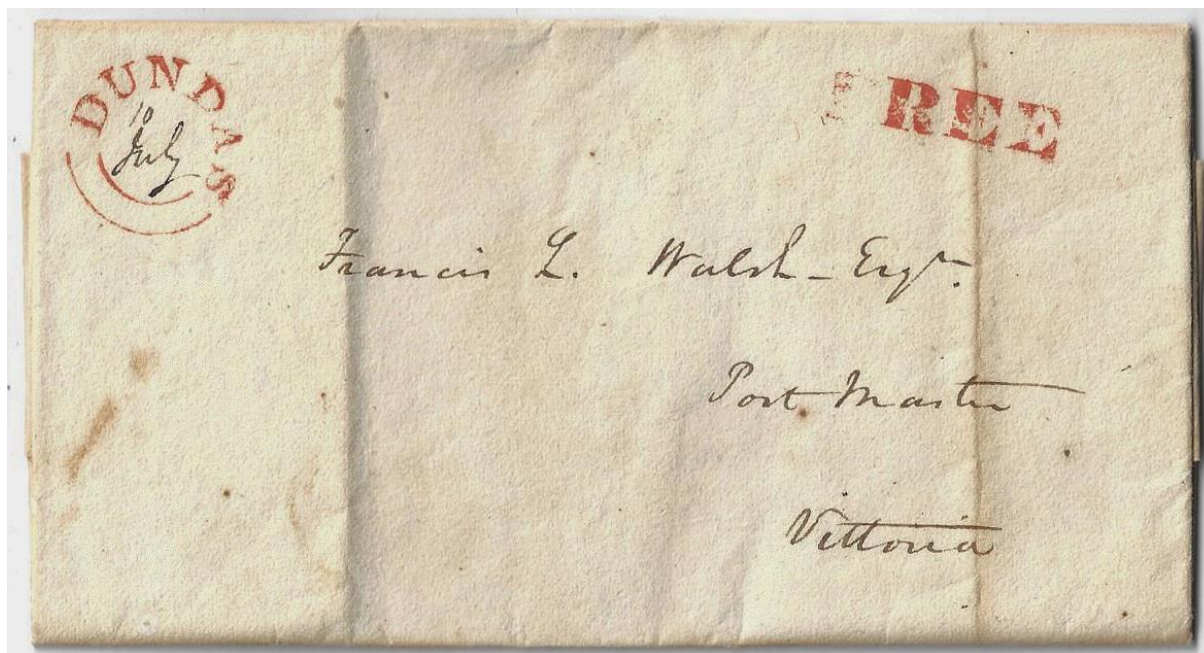


Item 533-05 – **A lovely group of Bulova advertising stationery cards** – Late 1930's, lot of 14 Bulova advertising stationery cards, most unused, two with householder printed message, three are 2¢, two are ½¢, all others 1¢. \$400.00

Jewellers: John Webb Windsor Ont, Gordon Christman London Ont, Gordon Christman London East Ont, Robert Howard Liverpool N.S., J.E. Schmid Rodney Ont (2), Derwyn Vaughan Co. Toronto, Sole Brothers Kitchener (a tough one, seldom seen), Morin Bros Gravelbourg, Chahley's Grand Folks BC (rare), Irving Kline Edmonton Alta, Angus McFee Belleville Ont, Gabus Windsor Ont and John Webb Windsor both with Santa Claus illustrated.

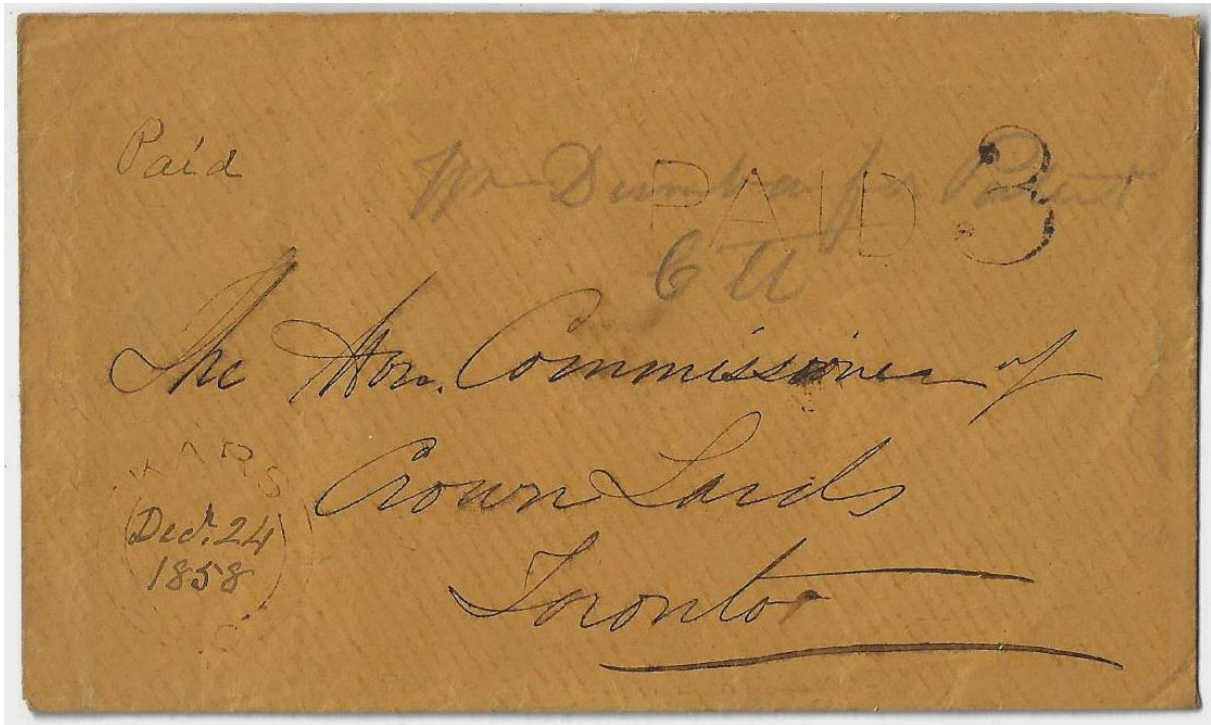


Item 533-06 – **Goderich half penny drop letter rate** – 1859, printed certificat of Magistrate and Oath returned to clerk from Goderich rated half penny collect paying the drop letter rate. Signed by James Kag of Kincardine. A very scarce use of the Goderich ½d handstamp. \$150.00

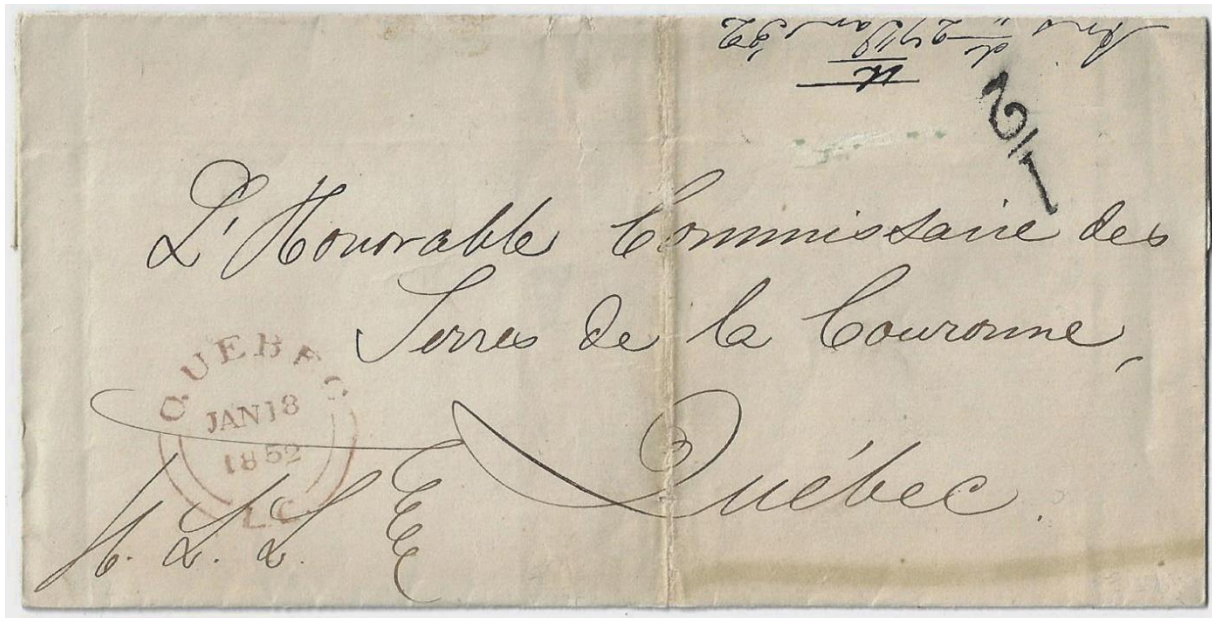


Item 533-07 – **Dundas – signed by James Crooks** – 1833, autograph letter signed by James Crooks, datelined West Flamborough 10 July 1833, entered the mail in Dundas with 1829 type struck in red, Postmaster free to Francis Walsh, Vittoria. \$250.00

Item 533-08 – **The only recorded Kars UC double broken circle (Carleton)** – 1858, stampless cover from Kars UC paid 3d to Toronto. Carried by Ottawa & Prescott Railway (Gray ON-412, 1857-1866, RF E) and routed via Prescott and Orono (b/s). As of today, this is the only recorded example. \$300.00



Item 533-09 – **Father of Confederation – ½d drop** - 1852, folded cover from Quebec rated ½d collect paying the drop letter rate. The letter is signed by Hector L. Langevin H.L.L., one of the Fathers of Confederation. Filing fold etc. \$200.00



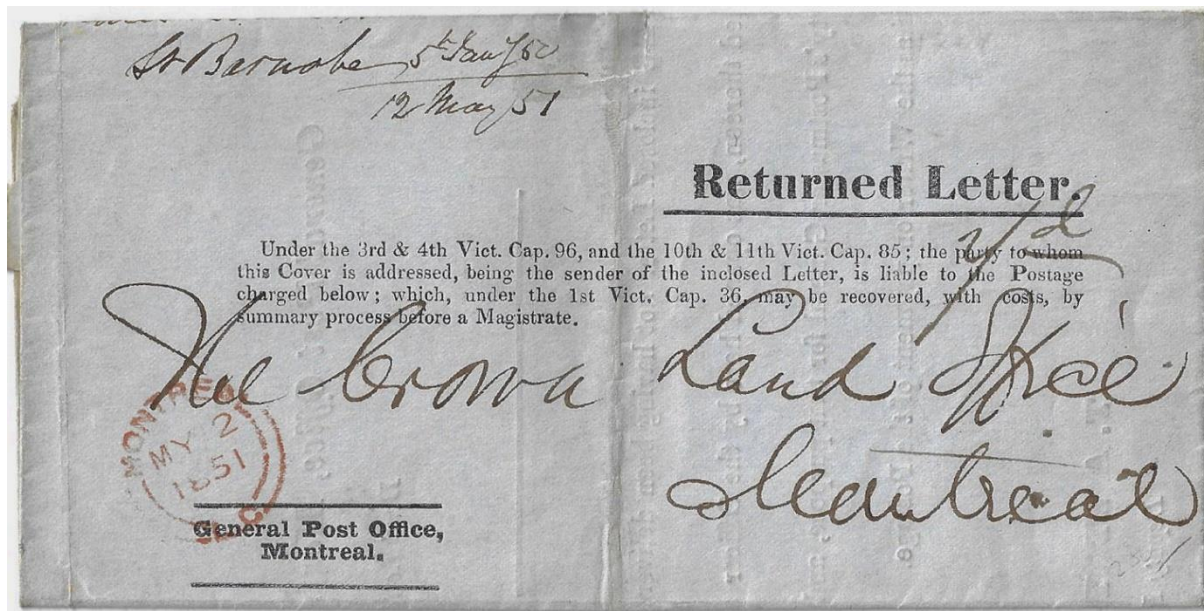
Item 533-10 – **Ship Letter Liverpool (Quebec to Greenock)** – 1801, folded letter from Lymburner & Crawford, owner of the Labrador Company and extensive business in BNA in furs and fish, dominating sealing along the Labrador–Gulf of St Lawrence coast, to John Parker in Greenock (*Care of Hugh Mathie*). The letter is dated 16 December 1801, carried by private trader *The Bosson* from Boston to Liverpool with Ship Letter Crown Liverpool. 1/2 Stg collect in Greenock. \$325.00



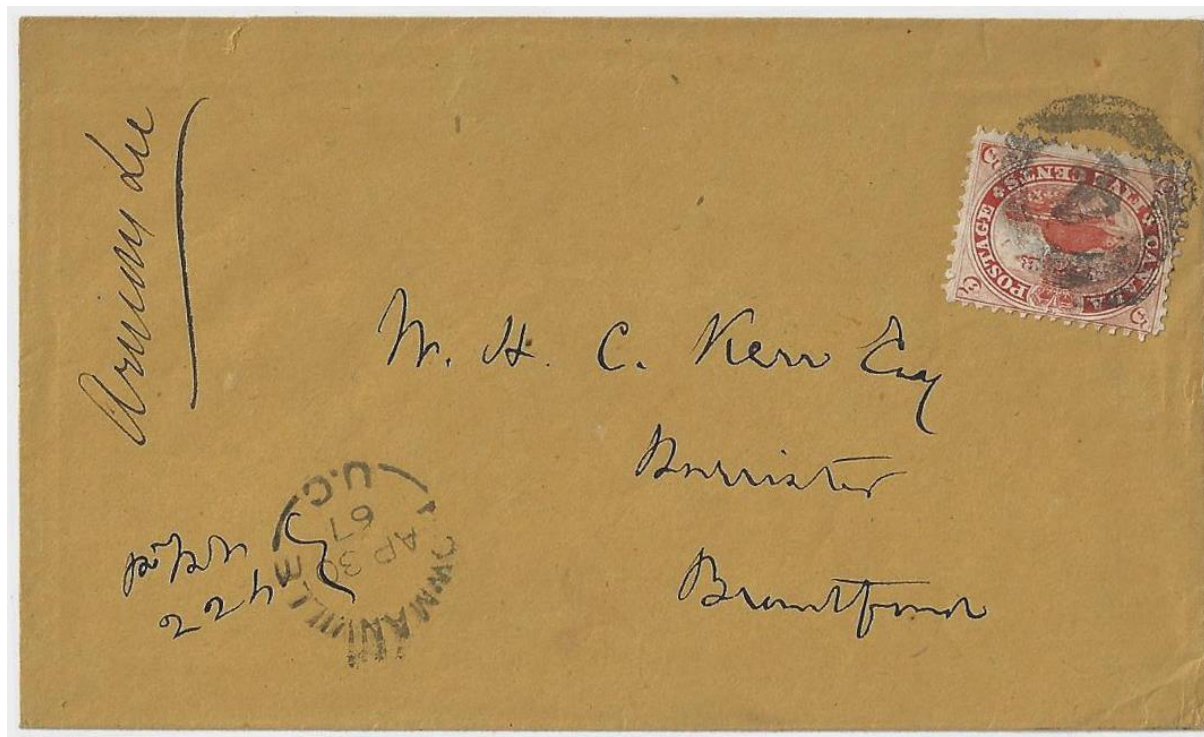
Item 533-11 – **Sandwich UC to France** – 1854, stampless cover from Sandwich to France. Carried by Cunard Canada and routed via London, rated 2/10 Stg, Canada & Art 12 Anglo-French Postal Agreement, entered in Calais and rated 17 decimes collect. French routing (b/s). \$350.00



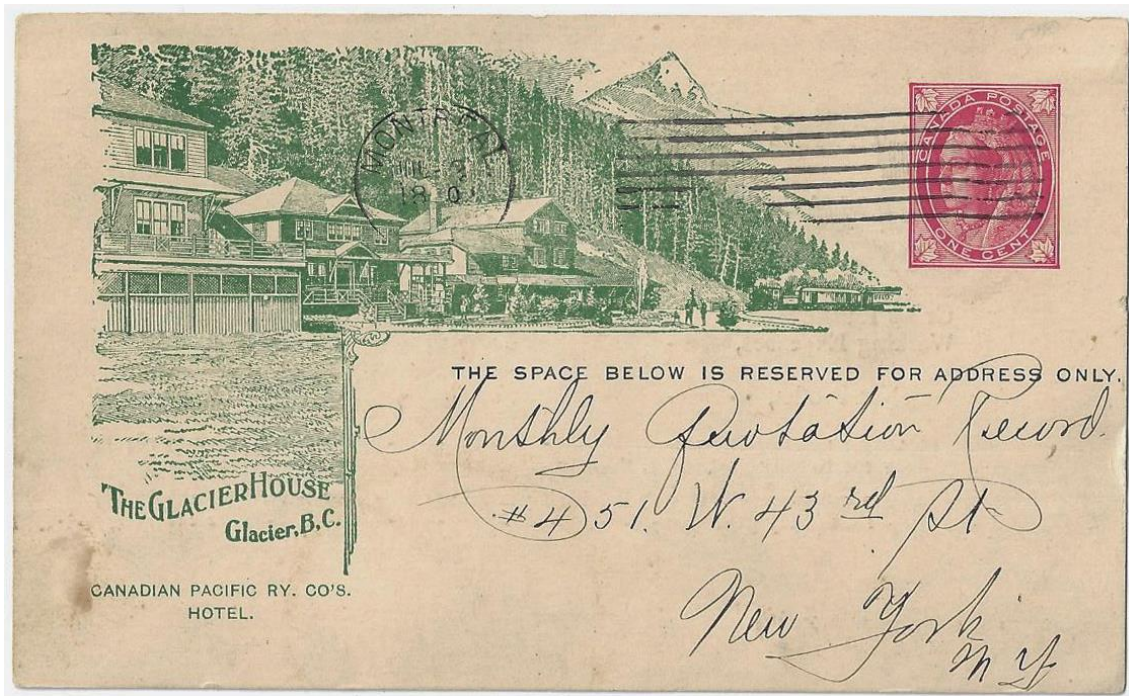
Item 533-12 – **Pasbebiac - New Carlisle LC to France** – 1846, family folded letter signed by Jacques Lamy from Pasbebiac LC to France. Entered the mail in New Carlisle and routed via Dorchester New Brunswick. Entered in Calais France to Granville (b/s). Pasbebiac Post Office not opened until July 6 1852 and New Carlisle the closest Post Office. Carried by Cunard Britannia 29th voyage via Halifax. An very scarce example of mail from Gaspé Peninsula region of Eastern Quebec sent via New Brunswick and Halifax and not back to Quebec via Boston to UK. Paid 2/5 Stg and 5 decimes as per Anglo-French postal agreement. 2/0 plus 5d French rate per ¼ ounce total 2/5 Stg or 2/8 ½d Currency for ¼ ounce. \$450.00



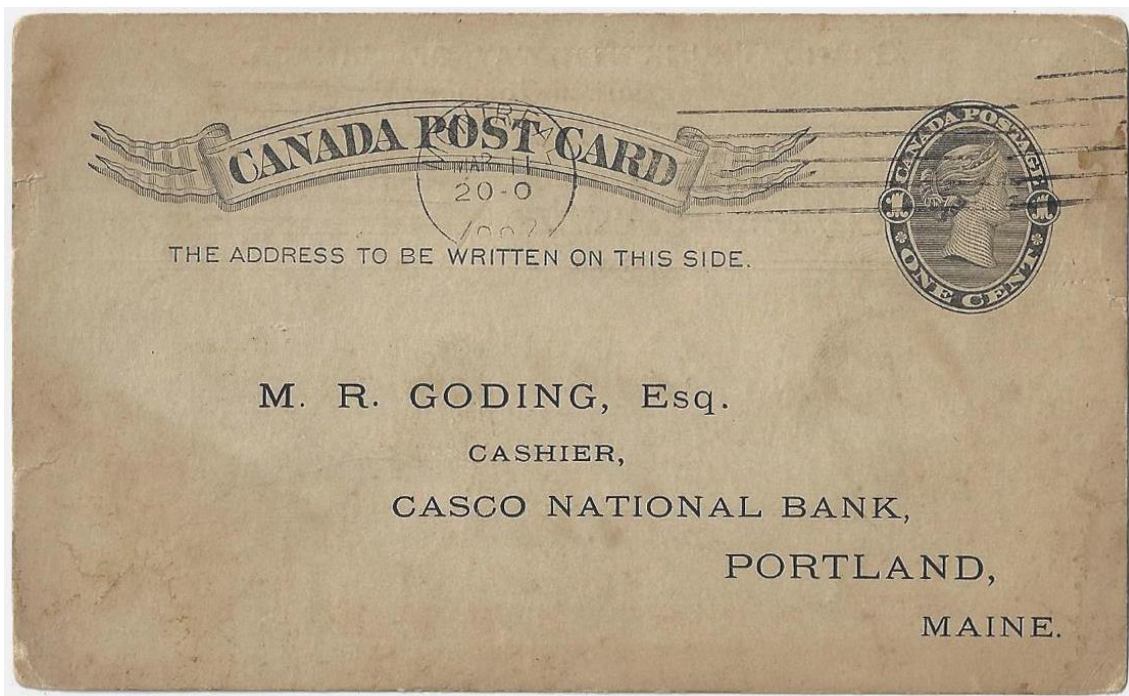
Item 533-13 – **Montreal GPO Dead Letter Dept** – 1851, GPO Montreal Returned Letter with printed “The enclosed letter not having been delivered for the reason assigned thereon, was opened here by the Officer appointed by Her Majesty’s Postmaster-General for that purpose and is now returned to you as the writer on payment of the postage – T.A. Stayner, DPMG”. Rated 7d for 61--100 miles on the original letter. File fold. A scarce and early Dead Letter Department printed letter. Interestingly, only a few days after the management of the Post Office is formally transferred to the Province of Canada and the issue of the first postage stamp. \$250.00 **SOLD**



Item 533-14 – **Four-ring “4” state 2** – 1867, 5¢ Beaver tied by Four-ring “4” handstamp on cover from Bowmanville UC paying 5¢ letter rate to Brantford (Brantford CW b/s). RF 6. State 2 and presumably the latest recorded date with a Decimal stamp. \$200.00



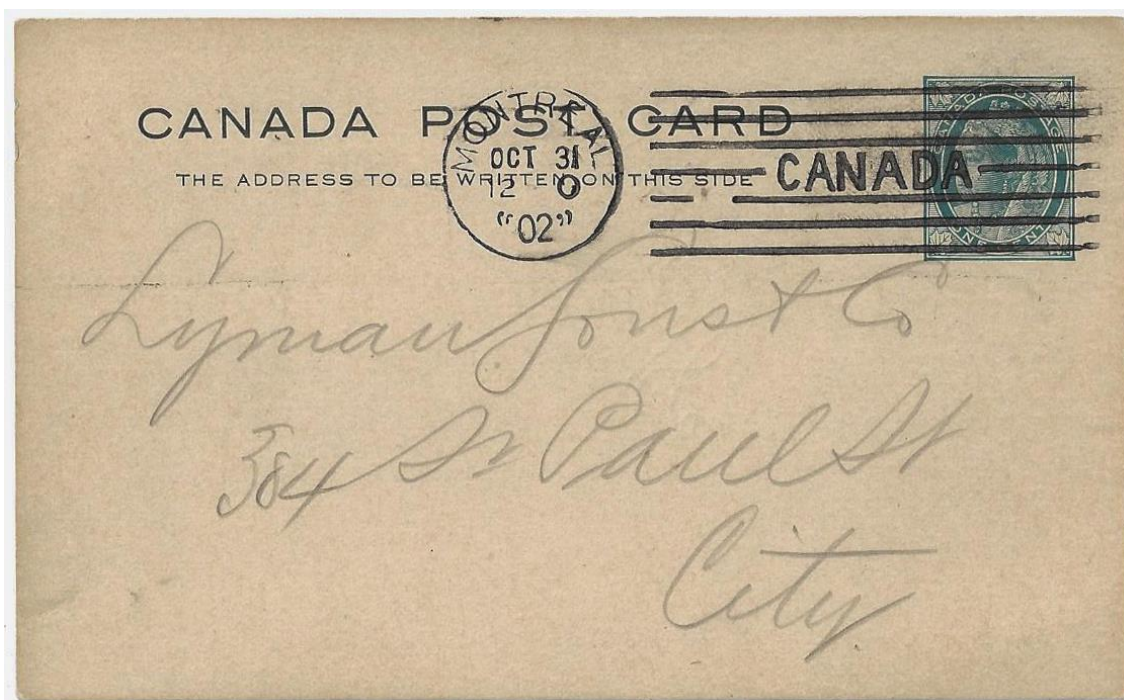
Item 533-15 – **Montreal experimental machine** – 1902, Montreal experimental machine cancel, JUL 3 02, on 1¢ CPR Glacier House BC stationery card to New York. Reverse with CPR statement of earnings and expenses. \$125.00



Item 533-16 – **Montreal experimental machine** – 1902, Montreal experimental machine cancel, MAR 11 02, on 1¢ stationery card reverse with Grand Trunk Railway Treasurer's Office message to Portland Maine. \$100.00 **SOLD**



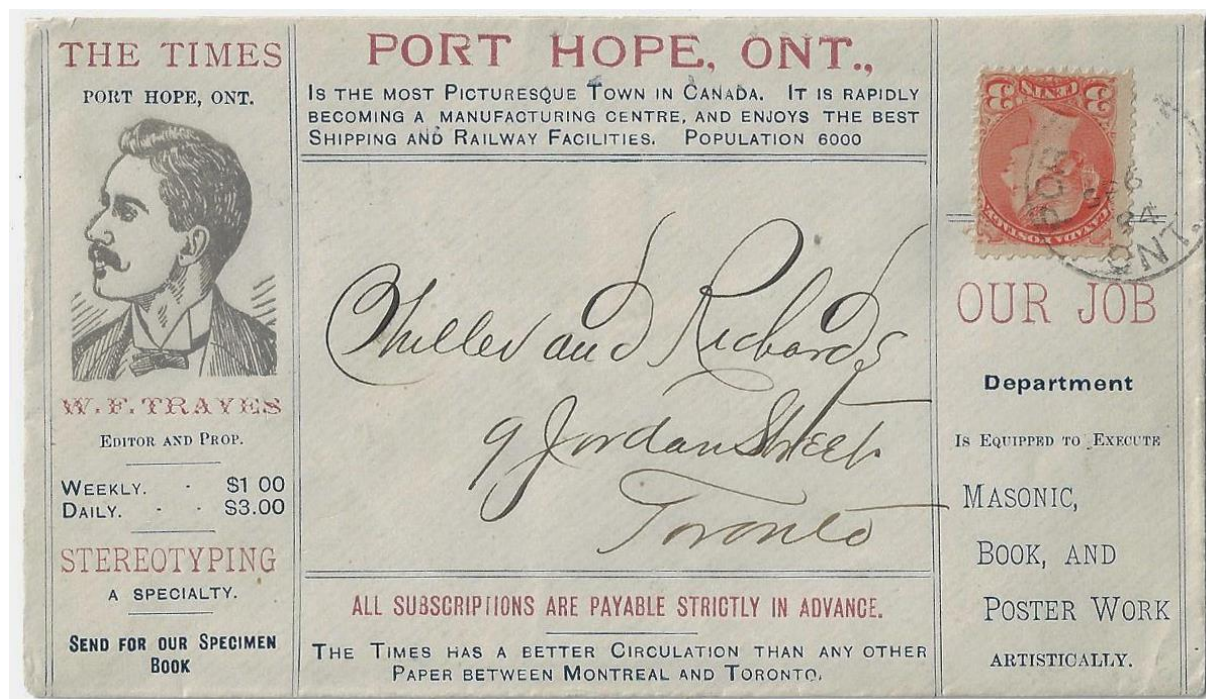
Item 533-17 – **Montreal Bickerdike inverted obliterator** – 1900, 1¢ CPR Hotel Vancouver stationery card mailed from Montreal with Bickerdike machine cancel MAR 2 00 / 24-0 with inverted obliterator. As such human errors were quickly noticed and corrected, surviving examples are not often seen. \$400.00



Item 533-18 – **Montreal experimental M5 machine without die** – 1902, 1¢ stationery card with Montreal experimental M5 machine cancel, a trial service, without B in the obliterator to local address. Heasmen described this as a mystery machine phase III. The obliterator resembled but was not identical to those of the Bickerdike machines. \$350.00



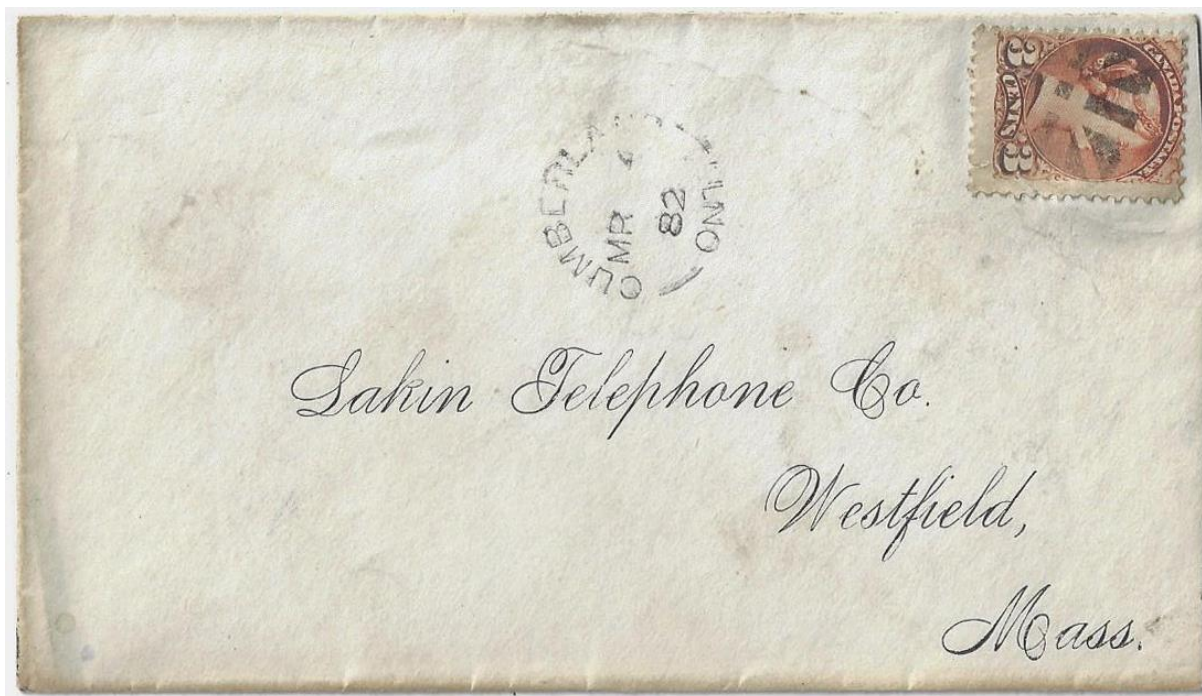
Item 533-19 – **Bowmanville – Upper Canada Furniture Co.** – 1882, 3¢ SQ tied by target cancel on Upper Canada Furniture Company advertising cover from Bowmanville Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Kingston (b/s). Letter carrier marking “D” (b/s). \$150.00



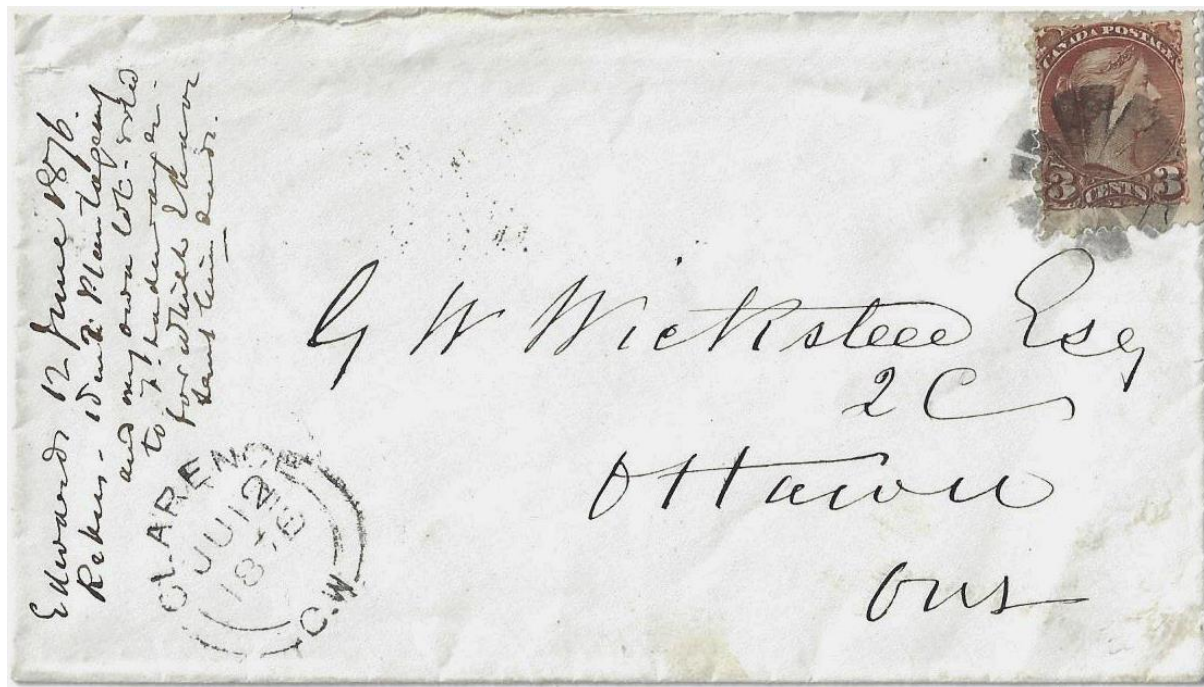
Item 533-20 – **Port Hope Times** – 1894, 3¢ SQ tied by Port Hope Ont cds on Port Hope Times advertising cover, W.E. Traves Editor and Prop illustrated, paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Rare. \$200.00



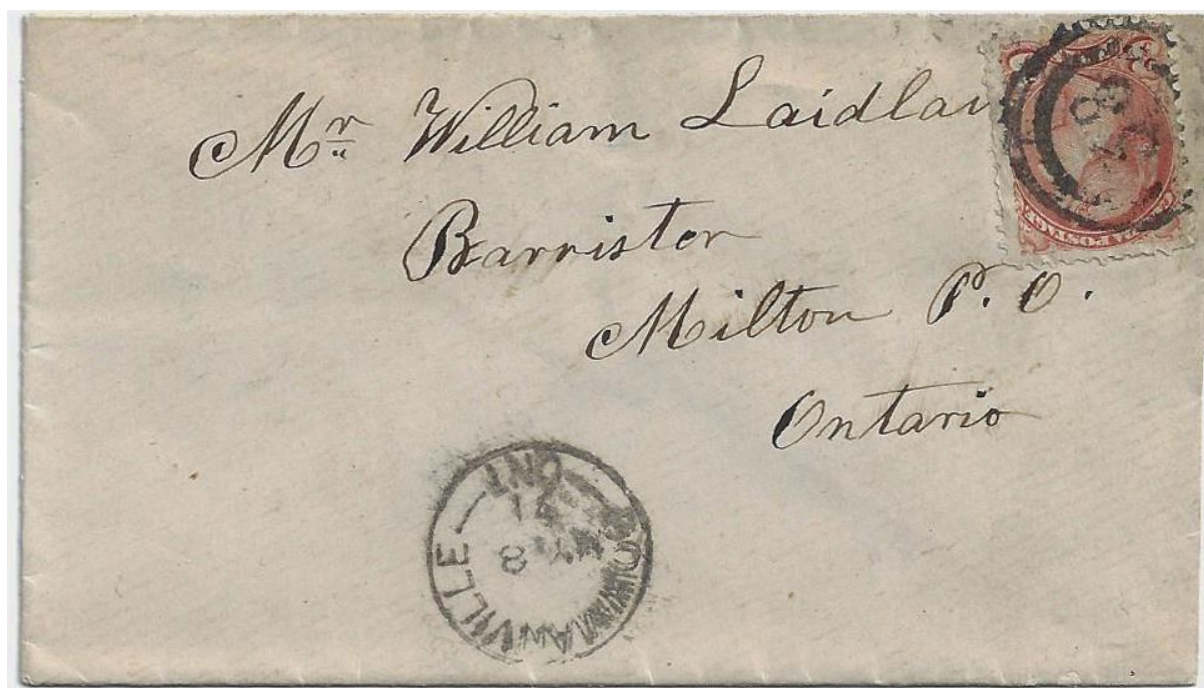
Item 533-21 – **Clarence Ont fancy cancel (Russell)** – 1886, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Clarence Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). \$75.00



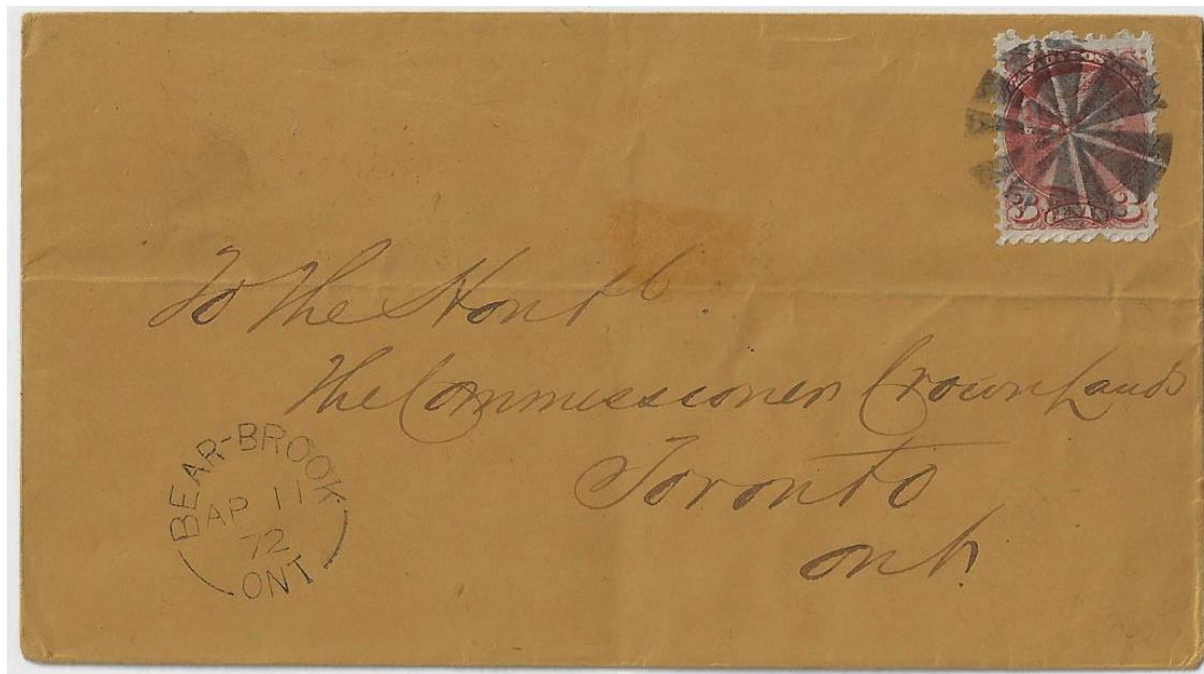
Item 533-22 – **Cumberland Ont fancy cancel (Russell)** – 1882, 3¢ SQ cancelled by fancy cancel (intersection design) on cover from Cumberland Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. Ottawa transit (b/s). \$50.00



Item 533-23 – **Clarence Ont fancy cancel (Russell)** – 1876, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel (Lacelle 1511) on cover from Clarence CW paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). \$75.00



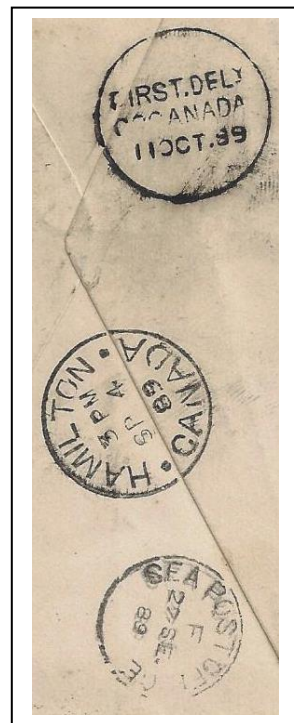
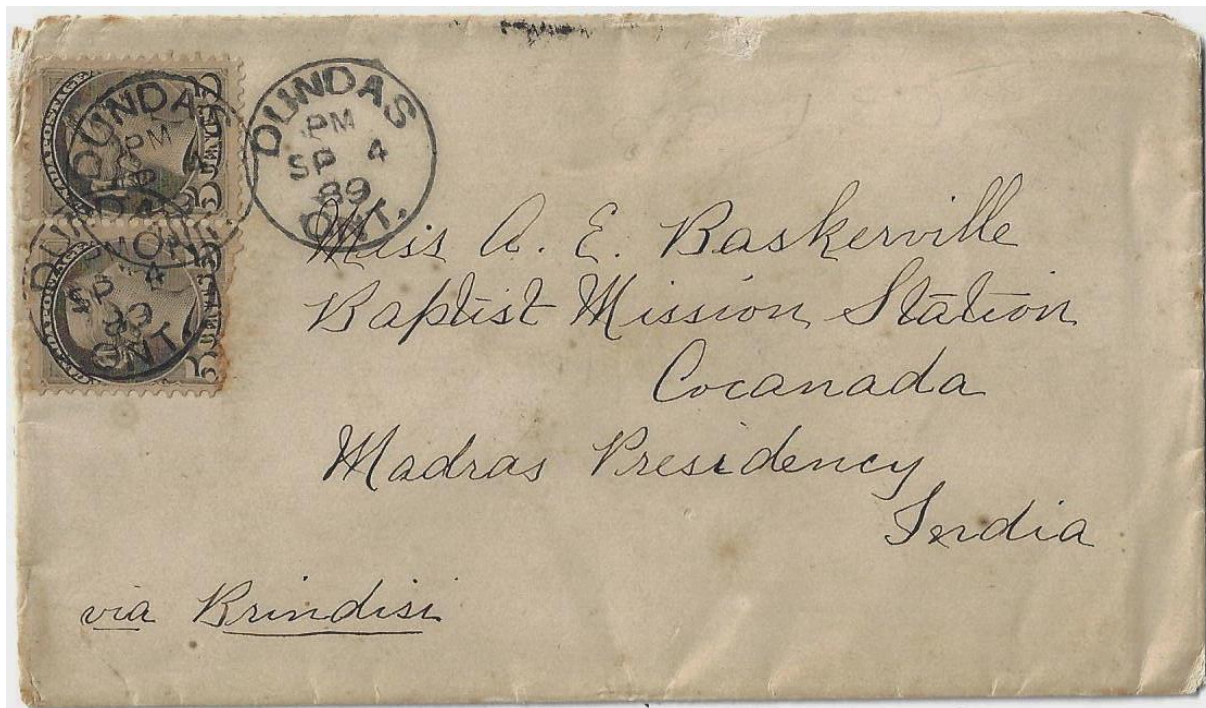
Item 533-24 – **Bowmanville Two-ring "38"** – 1871, 3¢ SQ rose carmine tied by Two-ring 38 cancel on cover from Bowmanville Ont, MY 8 71, paying 3¢ letter rate to Milton (b/s). \$125.00



Item 533-25 – **Bear Brook Ont fancy cancel (Russell)** – 1872, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Bear Brook Ont (the earliest recorded date for this broken circle, previous date: AU 24 72) paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s) via Russell and Ottawa (b/s). Lacelle 1540 \$150.00



Item 533-26 – **Clarence Ont registered and fancy** – 1892, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Clarence Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to US (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). Reverse with Thomas Wilson with Maple Leaves waxseal. Russell County. \$75.00



Item 533-27 – **10¢ UPU to India** – 1889, 5¢ SQ pair (pre-affixing fault, toned) tied by great strikes of the Dundas Ont cds on cover paying 5¢ UPU with 5¢ surtax letter rate to India (Sea Post Office and Cocanada b/s). \$100.00



Item 533-28 – **Triple 6¢ per 4oz parcel post rate** – 1887, 6¢ SQ block of 3 tied by Quebec duplex cancel on House of Commons cover paying 18¢ triple weight parcel post rate to St. Joseph. Endorsed by book post. Signed by François Béchard MPP. Horizontal filing fold. Postal guide 1887 page xiii. \$300.00



Item 533-29 – **39ii 6¢ SQ – major re-entry position 67** – 1872, 6¢ SQ with major re-entry (*position 67, heavy line through Canada Postage and line below design*) tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Fitzroy Harbour CW (Carleton County) paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. (redirected from Connecticut to Brooklyn). Routed via Belleville and Montreal. A very scarce 39ii on cover. \$750.00 **SOLD**



Item 533-30 – **30¢ double weight to New Zealand** – 1885, 5¢ SQ slate green (2), 10¢ magenta (2) tied by fancy cancel on cover from Guelph Ont paying 30¢ double weight for 1 oz letter rate to Auckland, New Zealand. Via San Francisco (b/s 30 Sept and 24 Oct). Slight reduction at left but still a most attractive and desirable multiple rate cover to NZ. \$1,500.00



Item 533-31 – **10¢ pre-UPU to France** – 1874, 2¢ (2), 6¢ SQ tied by Montreal duplex cancel on cover paying 10¢ pre-UPU letter rate to France (b/s). Carried by Allan Line Caspian via Portland, 3d British claim and London transit paid on front. Very pretty! \$1,000.00



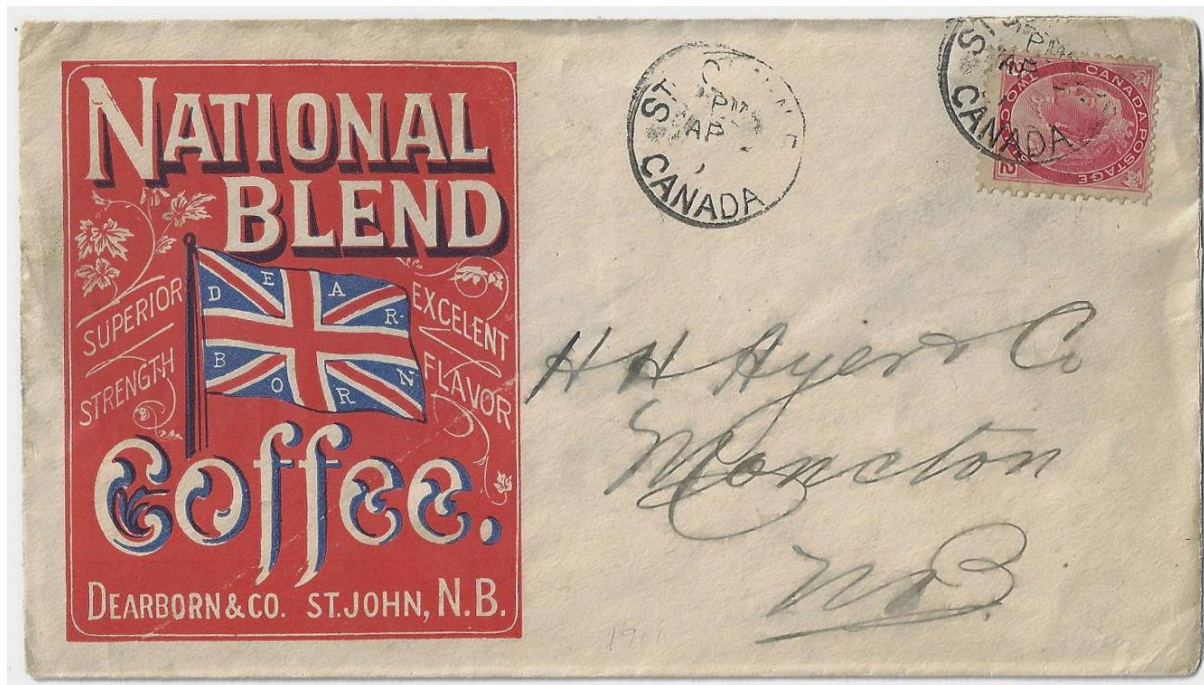
Item 533-32 – **Chatham advertising registered** – 1895, 3¢, 5¢ (grey black) tied by Chatham Ont cds on Manson Campbell Canning Mill Manufacturers advertising cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to US. Hamilton transit (b/s) and London & Windsor Ry PO RPO (b/s). \$125.00



Item 533-33 – **Massey Harris advertising** – 1899, 1¢, 2¢ (3) Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on Massey Harris advertising cover, McLean & Mason, from Bowmanville Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Brantford (b/s) via Toronto (b/s). \$125.00



Item 533-34 – **Carriage tire and rooster** – 1901, 1¢ Numeral pair (gum toned) tied by Bowmanville Ont cds on Durham Rubber Co. advertising cover, carriage tire illustrated, paying 2¢ letter rate to Halifax (b/s). \$75.00



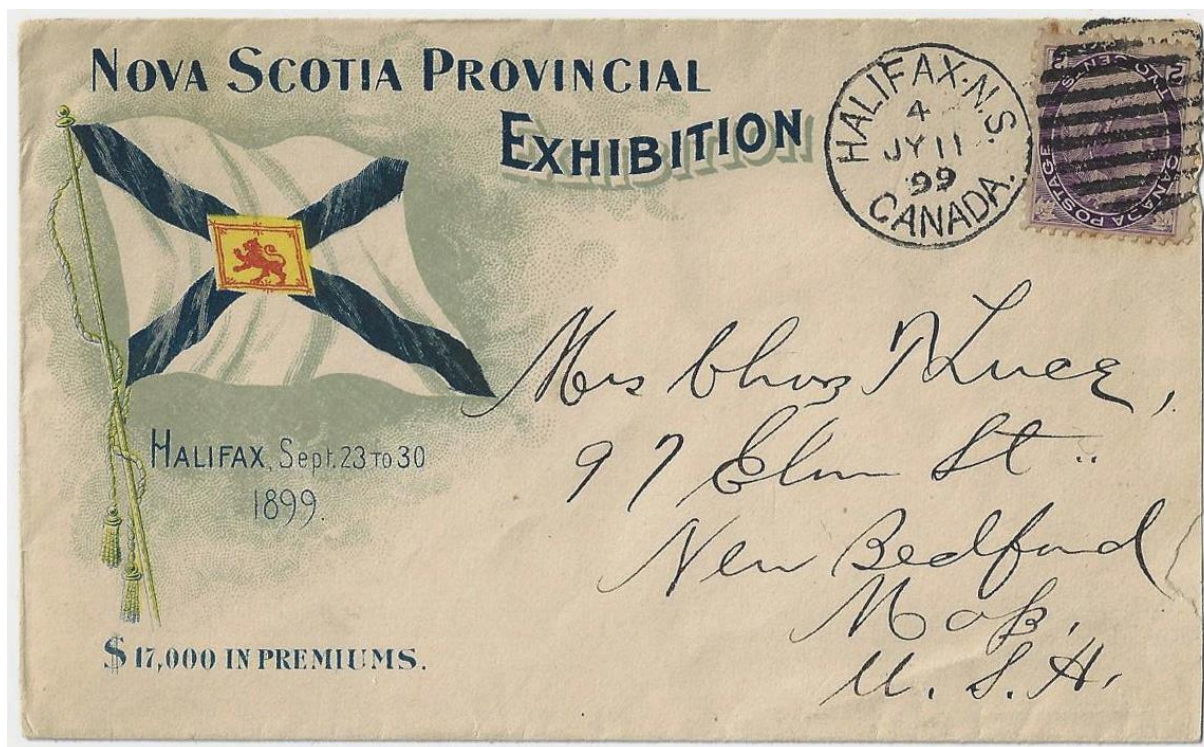
Item 533-35 – **Dearborn & Co. Coffee** – 1900, 2¢ Numeral tied by St. John NB cds on Dearbon & Co. and National Blend Coffee patriotic cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Moncton (b/s). \$125.00



Item 533-36 – **Nordheimer Piano and Music** – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Nordheimer Piano and Music advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Niagara-on-the-Lake (b/s). Redirected from Niagara to Buffalo (b/s). \$50.00



Item 533-37 – **Granby Quebec Empire Tobacco Co.** – 1899, 2¢ Numeral (die II) tied by grid cancel on Empire Tobacco Co. advertising cover from Granby paying 2¢ letter rate to Arichat (b/s). Snoeshoes illustrated LL. \$100.00



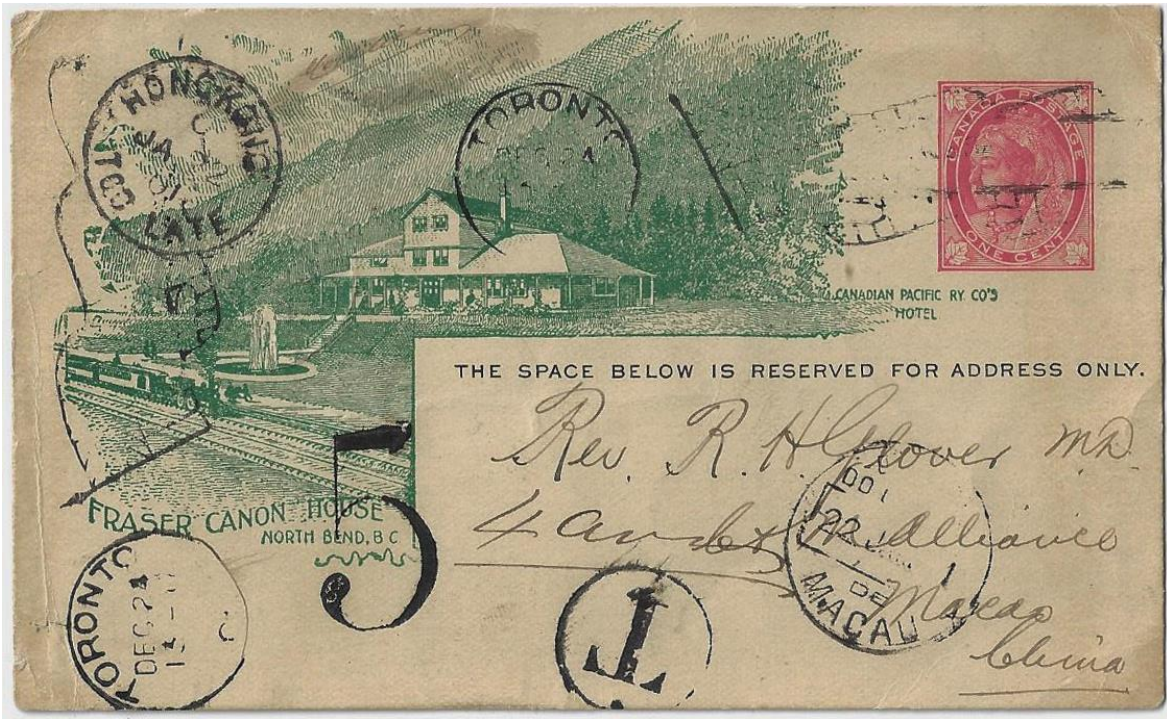

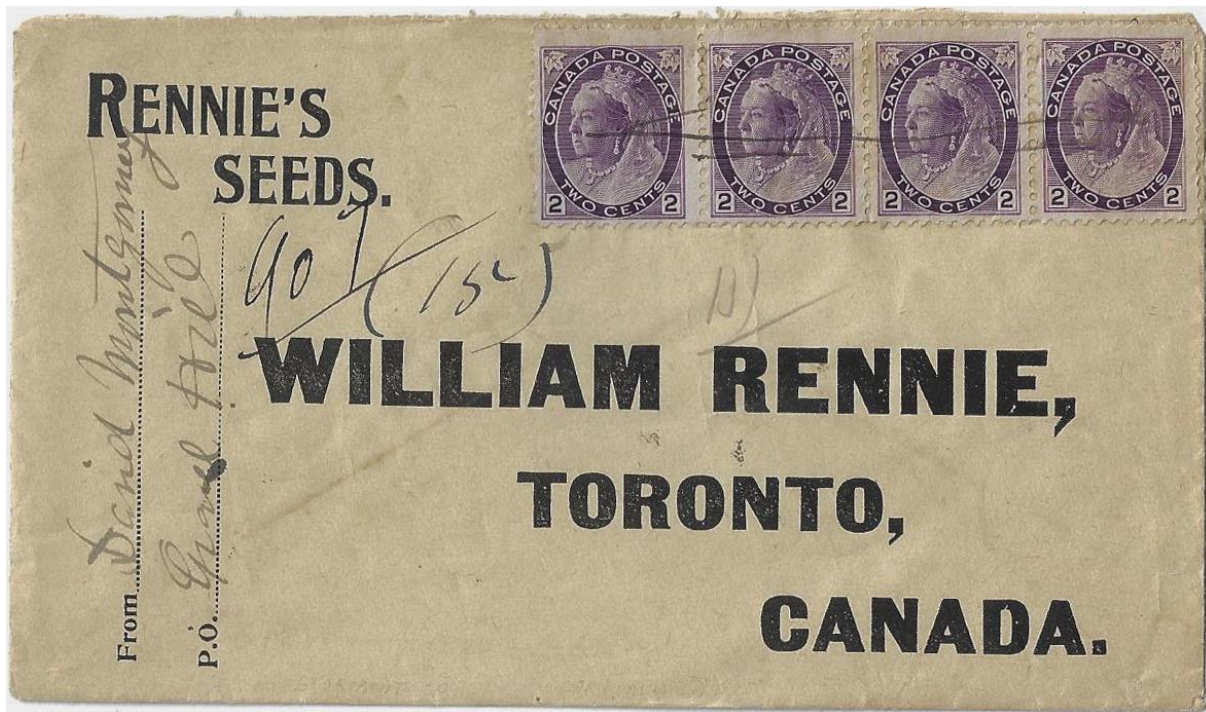

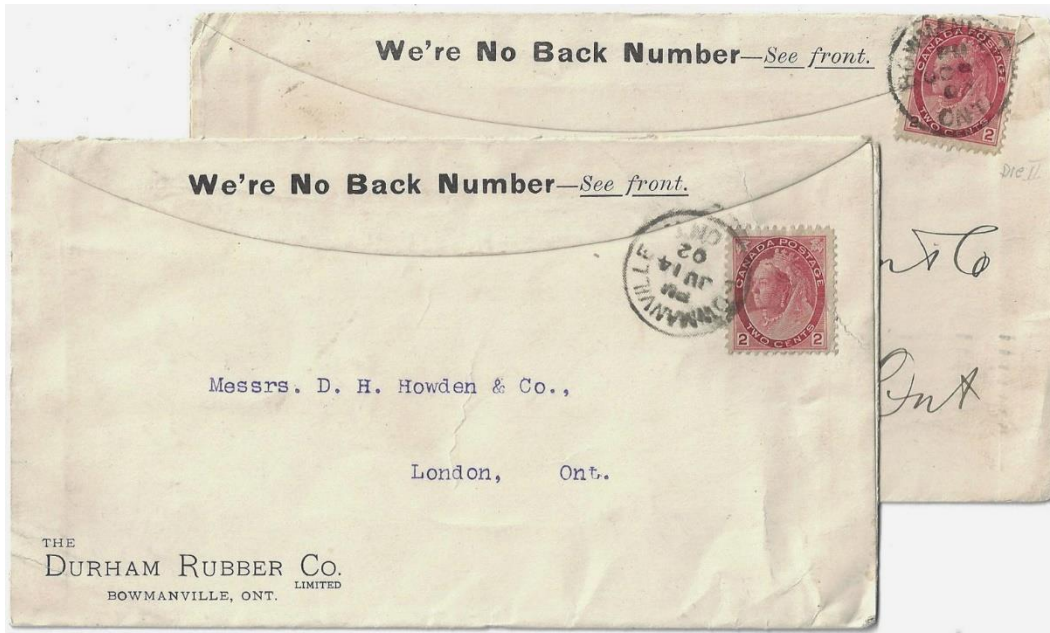

Item 533-41 – Gravel Hill Ont (Stormont) – 1899, 2¢ Numeral strip of 4 tied by pen cancel on Rennie cover from Gravel Hill Ont overpaying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto. Cornwall transit (squared circle). \$40.00 **SOLD**




Item 533-42 – 9¢ double weight registered – Sandford Ont – 1899, 1¢, 2¢ (4) tied by grid cancel on cover from Sandford Ont paying 9¢ double weight registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s) via Uxbridge (b/s). Ontario County. \$100.00
