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





The letter is dated 16 December 1801, carried by private trader *The Bosson* from Boston to Liverpool with Ship Letter Crown Liverpool. 1/2 Stg collect in Greenock. \$325.00

Item 533-12 – **Pasbebiac - New Carlisle LC to France** – 1846, family folded letter signed by Jacques Lamy from Pasbebiac LC to France. Pasbebiac Post Office not opened until July 6 1852 and New Carlisle the closest Post Office. Carried by Cunard Britannia 29th voyage <u>via Halifax</u>. An very scarce example of mail from Gaspé Peninsula region of Eastern Quebec sent via New Brunswick and Halifax and not back to Quebec via Boston to UK. Paid 2/5 Stg and 5 decimes as per Anglo-French postal agreement. 2/0 plus 5d French rate per ¼ ounce total 2/5 Stg or 2/8 ½d Currency for ¼ ounce. \$450.00
