



Item 535-01 – <u>Albert Edward – Prince of Wales</u> – c1864-7, mourning cover initialed A.E. (Albert Edward) undated but circa 1864-7 addressed to the Dean of Westminster. At the time of writing, Edward held the title of Prince of Wales as heir to the throne. The unnamed recipient was probably Arthur Penrhyn Stanley, Dean of Westminster from 1864-1881. Small repaired tear. A great cover for any Edward VII collection. \$1,500.00



Item 535-02 – <u>Darlington UC to Adjalo via Etobicoke</u> – 1848, folded cover from Darlington UC rated 7d collect to Adjalo via Etobicoke (b/s). Interestingly, special instructions to Postmaster written on front and complaint written into internal flap. A bit fragile with separations at fold but an interesting Durham County cover. Name changed to Bowmanville in 1854. \$200.00

Item 535-03 – <u>Darlington Postmaster free frank</u> – 1834, Postmaster free franked folded cover from Darlington UC, signed *Robert Fairbairn P.M.*, to Port Hope. Darlington 1829 struck in black (1831-42). Rare. \$300.00

Item 535-04 – <u>Darlington Collector of Customs letter</u> – 1843, Collector of Customs folded letter from Darlington UC rated 9d collect to Kingston. The letter is signed Henry Peca. Waxseal. \$150.00

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Item 535-05 – <u>Darlington UC (routed via Mono Mills)</u> – 1852, folded cover from Darlington UC paid 3d to Proton via Mono Mills (b/s). This is the <u>second recorded example</u> of the Mono Mills 1839 type with ms date (*Peel County*) / the latest recorded date of the two. Exhibit quality. \$300.00

Item 535-06 – <u>Rochester NY way letter to Peterboro</u> – 1843, folded letter datelined July 26 1843 Rochester NY presumably carried by the Lake Ontario Royal Mail Line operated by Donald Bethune (*without formal contract with the Canadian Post Office*). The steamer operated between Hamilton, Toronto and Rochester with points of call at Port hope and Cobourg. Carried under cover across the lake, no US marking, entered as "Way Letter". Rated 4 ½ d paying postage from the dock to Peterboro. An interesting Lake Ontario steamboat letter. \$300.00 SOLD



Item 535-07 – January 5, 1870 – 1870, stampless cover from Peterboro Ont, Canadian Land & Emigration Company c/c, rated free and then corrected to unpaid 5¢ to Toronto (b/s). An early SQ era cover. \$500.00





A spectacular wrapper that lost its content. \$400.00



The cover is addressed to the Postmaster at New Providence. A self-addressed reply cover accompanies, bearing Bahamas 1d stamp, used to mailed the Map cover back to Latchford in Ottawa. The reply envelope is smaller and explained the two folds on the Map cover. The Bahamas is one of the countries that complied with Latchford's request that both envelopes be returned to him with the self-addressed envelope. Great rarity with only eleven pairs recorded. \$2,000.00



Recovered by divers from the wreck of SS Empress of Ireland, an exhibit quality marking and one of the best strike that I have ever seen, struck in emerald on front, reverse with paper lost and DLO (b/s). The original Ambulance cover accompanies with family annotations, OHMS Coulter and Dead Letter Office form 5 D.L. 20,000 16-9-14. After actual processing, it was placed in this Ambulance cover to the writer in Victoria and placed in the mail on Dec 24 1914. The sender of this cover was from Victoria to his daughter, Miss P. Less in Narborough England, was identified. The mail bag containing it was opened at a Rimouski hanger near by where the Post Office had the staff temporary located and stamped Dead Letter Office October 27 1914. Rare. \$1,250.00 SOLD
