Montreal AMF (b/s). Censored on arrival and tape well-tied. Presumably censored due to the Egyptian Revolution of 1952 also known as the 1952 Coup d'état. \$150.00



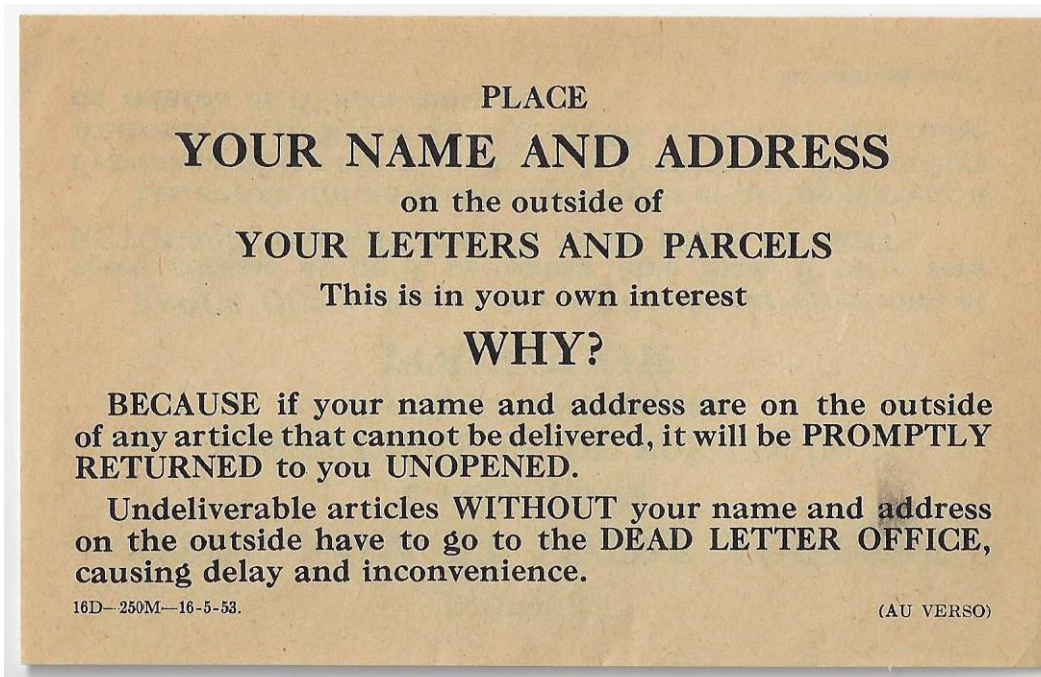

Item 536-34 – **1d circular rate to Montreal** – 1878, 1d red (plate 174 KC) tied by Liverpool Exchange duplex cancel on leather and hides prices current folded circular paying 1d circular rate to Montreal (*Blacke & Locke Leather Merchants*). \$150.00



Item 536-35 – **23¢ postage due in Montreal** – 1868, 1d red (plate 78 BI) tied by London duplex cancel on folded cover from London attempting to pay the circular rate. Small red cross in circle indicates either delayed or inspected. Not a late fee cover. Caught, insufficiently prepaid on which the British Post Office claimed 5d deficient postage plus 3d the half fine. Carried by Canadian packet and charged 23¢ in Montreal. A pretty cover showing a fine and a huge sum due. \$300.00

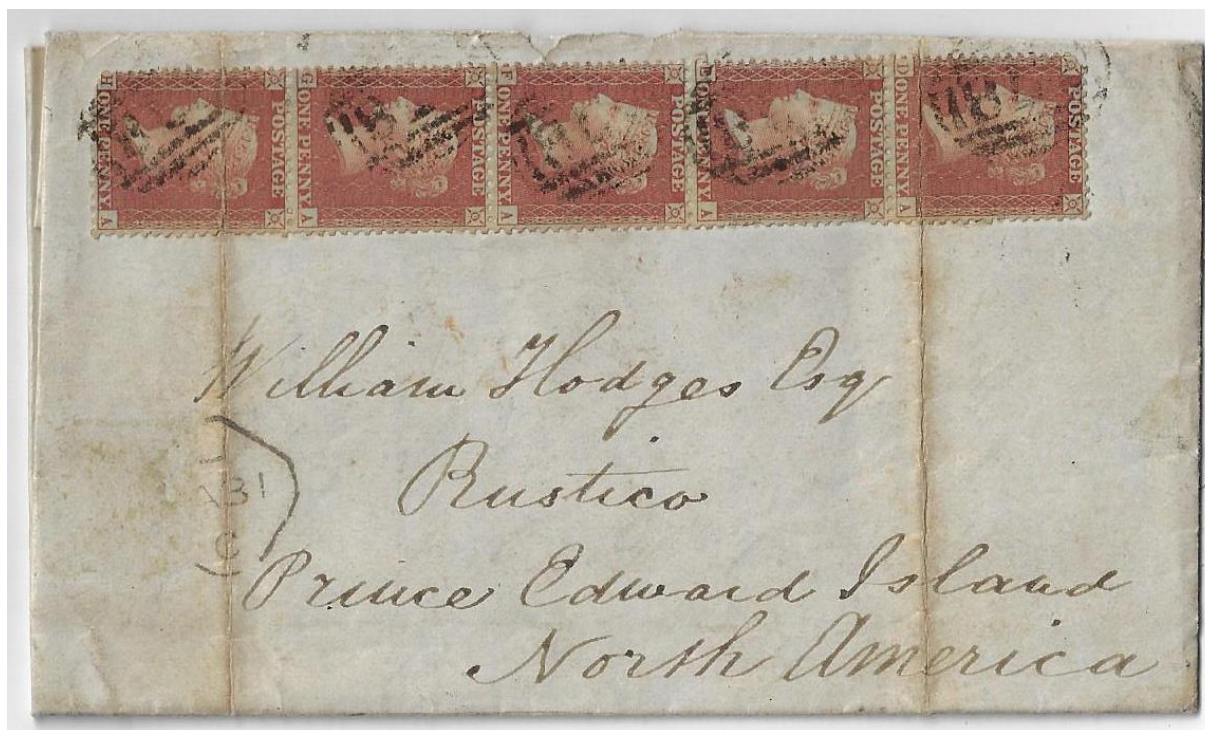




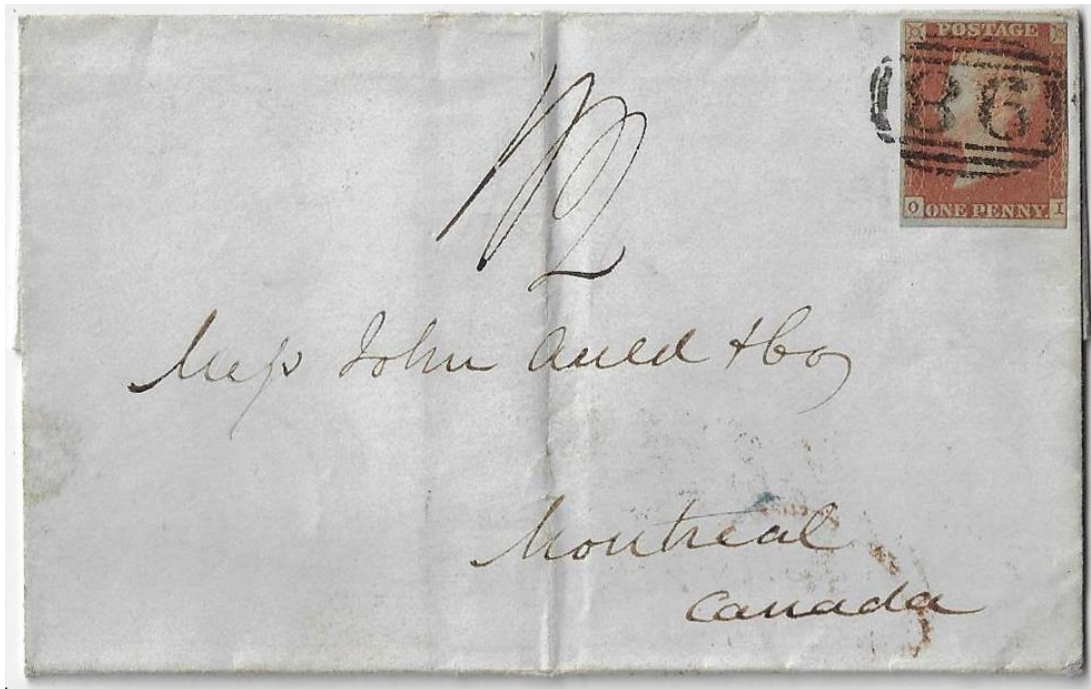
Item 536-36 – **1d Late Fee – to Montreal** – 1871, 1d red (plate 122 HF) tied by smudge cancel on folded letter from London with Lombard Street London "PAID" handstamp, rated 1/ paying the letter rate to Montreal. A penny late fee was paid at Lombardy Street office, by stamp, too late for the Allan Line Sarmatian. 1d for 5.50 to 6.30 pm on Colonial mail if postage paid in cash and late fee in stamps. Montreal receiver SP 13 71. \$400.00



Item 536-37 – **1d Late Fee – to Montreal** – 1854, 1d red (QF, clipped perfs) tied by grid 458 cancel on folded cover from Manchester to Montreal paying 1d late fee. 1d red applied in Liverpool. Then rated 10d Currency collect in Montreal with 7d British claim accountancy marking. Carried by Cunard Arabia 12<sup>th</sup> voyage to New York and overland to Montreal. \$400.00



Item 536-38 – **England to Prince Edward Island** – 1857, 1d red vertical strip of 5 (DA to HA both ends pre-affixing fault and affected by filing folds), tied by grid cancel on folded letter from Newport (written at Trelleck) to Rustico Prince Edward Island. Carried by Cunard Europa 49<sup>th</sup> voyage from Liverpool to Halifax and Boston (Feb 16 1857). Received in Prince Edward Island May 3 1857. Probably carried initially to Quebec and then by a smaller steamboat like The Admiral or The Lady Head running between small ports up to PEI (via Gaspé, Paspébiac, Dalhousie, Bathurst and then connecting to Shediac with Pictou and Prince Edward Island). \$400.00



Item 536-39 – **1d Late Fee – to Montreal** – 1847, 1d red imperforated (OI) tied by grid 86 cancel on folded cover from Over Darwen to Montreal paying 1d late fee. 1d red applied in Liverpool. Routed via Blackburn to Liverpool. Then rated 1/2 Sterling (1/4 Currency) collect in Montreal. Carried by Cunard Hibernia 24<sup>th</sup> voyage to Boston. \$300.00



Item 536-40 – **1d Late Fee – to Nova Scotia** – 1853, 1d red imperforated (LG) tied by grid 122 cancel on lawyer folded letter from London to Liverpool Nova Scotia paying 1d late fee. 1d red applied in Liverpool. Then rated 1/3 Currency collect with 10d British claim accountancy marking. Carried by Cunard Europa 36<sup>th</sup> voyage from Liverpool (MY 4 53) to Halifax (MY 24 53). \$400.00
