




Item 537-01 – <u>Kingsville Ont LQ cover</u> – 1869, 1¢, 2¢ Large Queen (*both stamps very fine centering*) tied by grid cancel on cover from Kingsville UC (Essex County) paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Small tear at top. \$300.00



Item 537-02 – <u>Carleton Place Central Canadian Newspaper</u> – 1891, 1¢ SQ strip of 3 tied by Carleton Place Ont cds on The Central Canadian Newspaper advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Perth (b/s). This newspaper was established as a weekly paper in 1876 and followed the Liberal-Conservative party line. Ex Greene. \$125.00

This reply card is actually on a thin paper, contrary to regulations. The Postal Guide says: the material is to be cardboard not appreciably thicker than that used for the official cards, or paper of such consistency as not to hinder manipulations. Cards bearing written communications and NOT conforming to the regulations will be treated and taxed as letters. A great item for an Admiral rate collection or exhibit. \$150.00 SOLD











Thomas Marks immigrated to Upper Canada with his family in the 1840s, settling near Bytown and later moving to the Algoma district. By 1857 he had acquired enough business training and capital to establish a general store at Bruce Mines in partnership with his elder brother, George.

Thomas Marks and Brother opened a branch in 1868 at the Landing, which soon became Prince Arthur's Landing and then Port Arthur (finally Thunder Bay), Thomas Marks and Company was founded in 1881 upon the dissolution of the partnership. By this time Thomas had become a driving force behind the development of Prince Arthur's Landing as a port and a trans-shipment point.




Item 537-48 – <u>Beaulieu Yellowknife Mines share certificate</u> – 1947 and 1950, two engraved Beaulieu Yellowknife Mines share certificates (1947) with two letters one from a worried shareholder and one from the company (1950). The Beaulieu Mine was a post-WW2 gold mining operation near Yellowknife NT. It entered production in Oct 1947 but by the end of November, only 7 troy ounces of rough gold were recovered. Additional gold was recovered during 1948 but the mine recovered only 30 troy ounces of fine gold. The operation folded in chaos and bankruptcy. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 537-49 – 12½¢ Allan Line rate – mourning cover – 1860, 12½¢ Decimal tied by Diamond grid cancel on mourning cover from Toronto paying 12½¢ Allan Line letter rate to Glasgow (b/s). Item 537-50 – Allan Line "Canadian" with 1d late fee – 1861, cover mailed unpaid from Liverpool franked with GB 1d red NB tied by Liverpool duplex 166 paying by stamp the 1d late fee. Rated 1/ letter rate to Maine, not shown, 3¢ British claim as treaty of 1848. Carried by the Allan Line Canadian II with Portland Maine American Packet datestamp. A scarce Portland marking. Ex White, Hazelton, Allen. \$200.00




Item 537-51 – Autograph letter signed by Hugh Allan – 1857, autograph letter signed by Hugh Allan, founder of the Allan Line, carried by Atlantic & St. Lawrence Railway to Montreal (b/s). Rated 10¢ and 6d with exchange marking and routed via Island Pond. Although leased in 1853 to the GTR, covers from 1851 to 1857 may be found with the circular datestamp of the Atlantic & St. Lawrence R.R. The letter reads in part: (transcript accompanies) *The North American went to sea at noon – in all 4234 barrels of butter, 1308 bags of pease – the harbour here is entirely frozen over except a channel about the width of a ship open by running two tow boats up and down at all time - ... \$300.00 SOLD*

November 19 1910, from Vice President and GM Edward Chamberlin in Winnipeg (who would become the President of GTR mother company 4 years later) to Rev. Hanford Edson, advertising to him and encouraging him to buy some property in GTP's newly formed development. Edson. GTP had been granted sizable land grants for settlements by the government but nothing like those to CPR. Edson was over 100 miles west of Edmonton and GTP used CPR's lines for the development. \$100.00 SOLD
