Thomas Marks immigrated to Upper Canada with his family in the 1840s, settling near Bytown and later moving to the Algoma district. By 1857 he had acquired enough business training and capital to establish a general store at Bruce Mines in partnership with his elder brother, George.

Thomas Marks and Brother opened a branch in 1868 at the Landing, which soon became Prince Arthur's Landing and then Port Arthur (finally Thunder Bay), Thomas Marks and Company was founded in 1881 upon the dissolution of the partnership. By this time Thomas had become a driving force behind the development of Prince Arthur's Landing as a port and a trans-shipment point.
