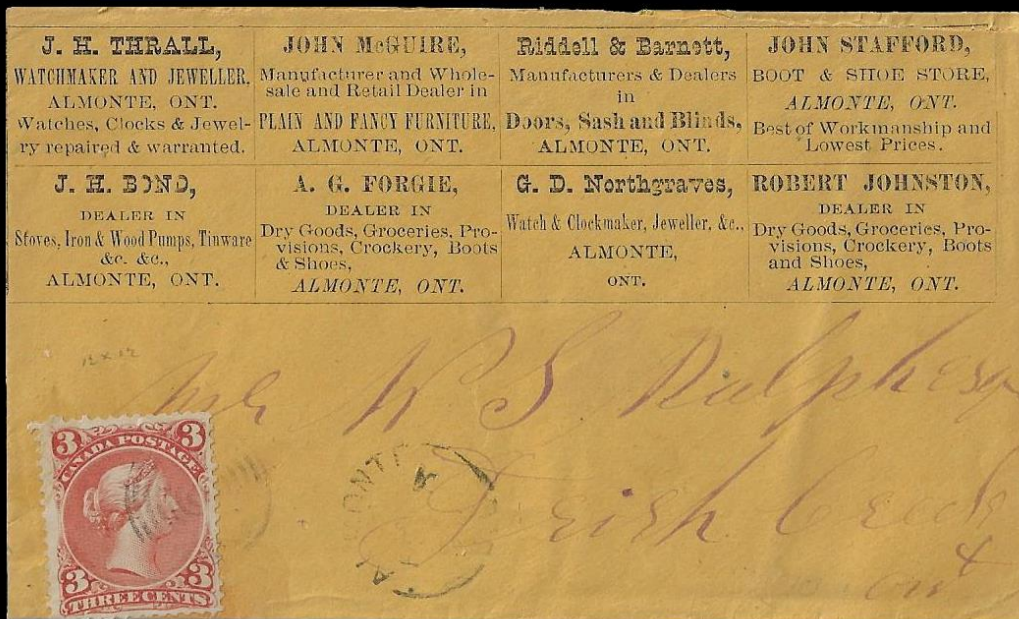

Buffalo N.Y. May 1839

My Dear Lady

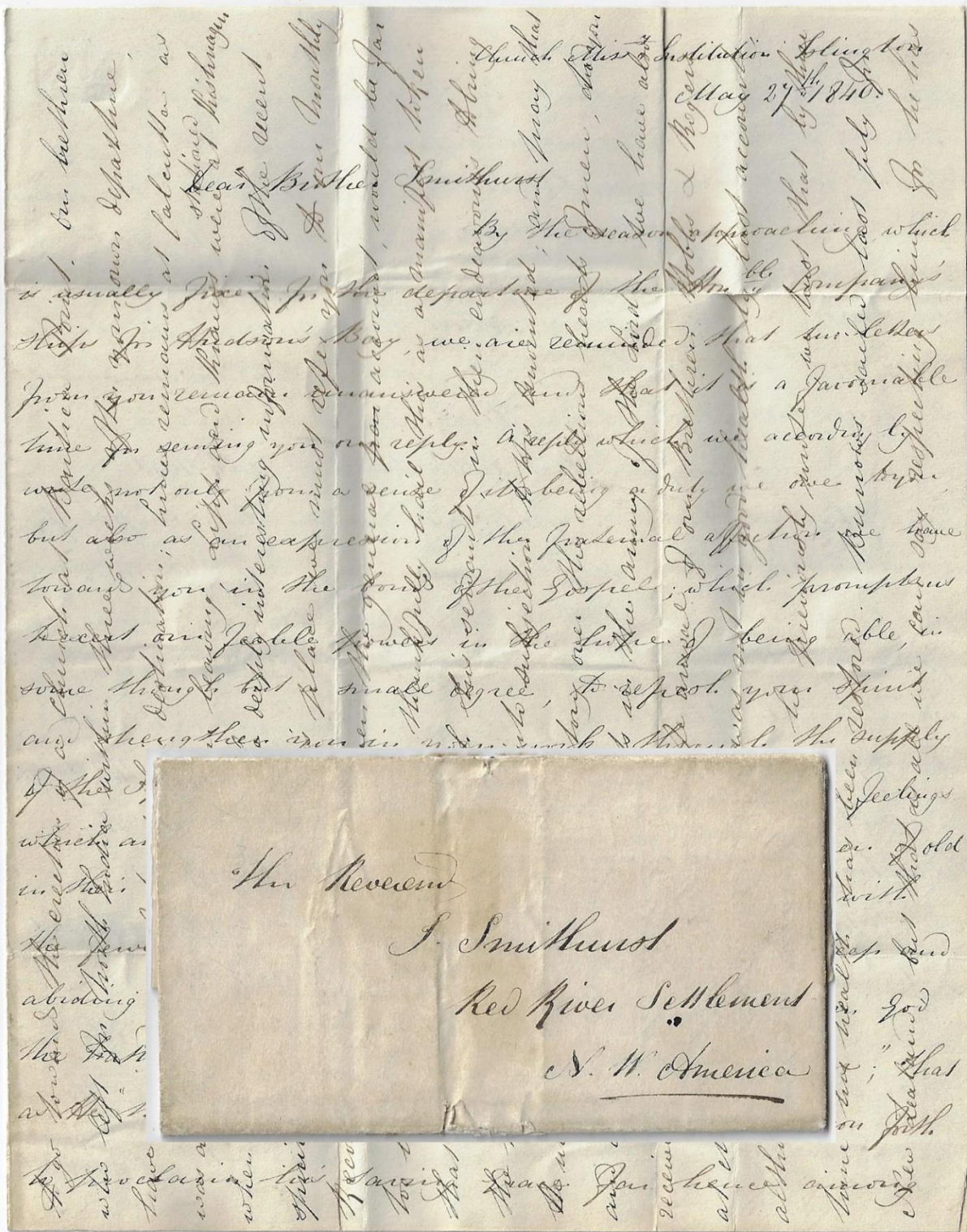
Item 539-01 – **Buffalo to Niagara via Youngstown** – 1839, lengthy folded letter from Buffalo NY to Niagara via Youngston exchange office. A very scarce 10¢ collect via Youngstown (36 miles) as Queenston and Lewiston (25 miles) are more frequently seen and cheaper. While the official ferriage fees were discontinued in 1837, some exchange points still charged an adjacent border town fee similar to the later line rate. Rate converted to 6d plus 2d total 8d collect. \$350.00



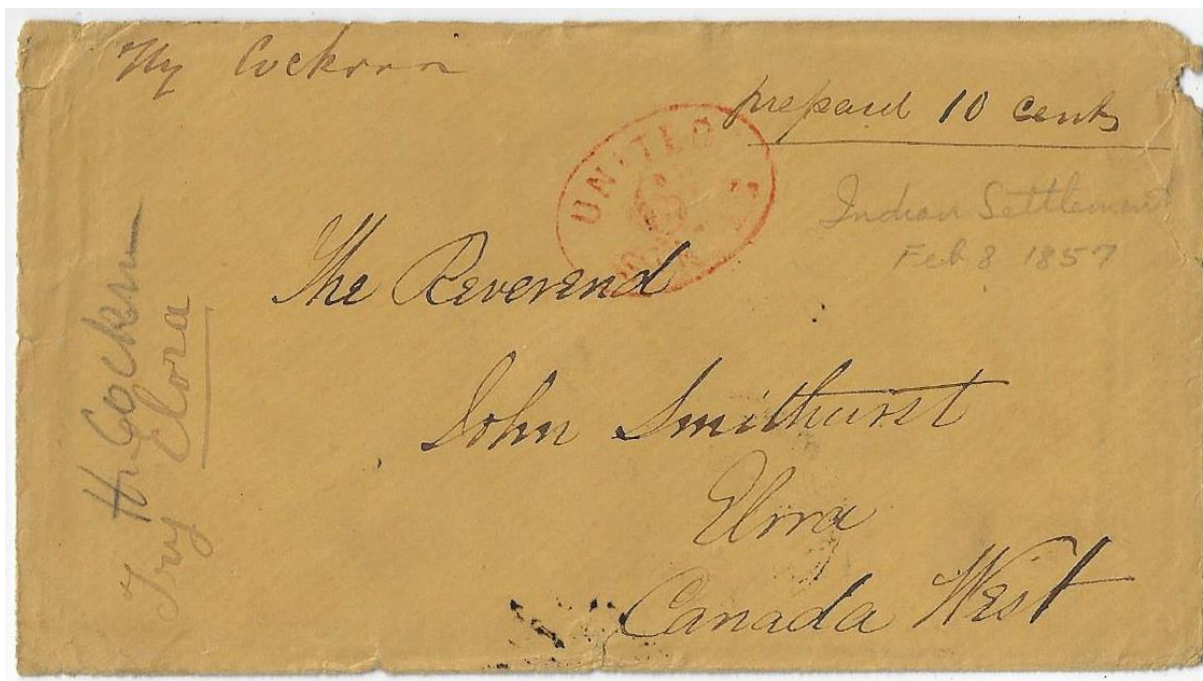
Item 539-02 – **Montreal straightline (type 13)** – 1805, folded cover from Montreal with Montreal 20 MAY 1805 straightline type XIII rated 9d collect to Quebec. \$125.00



Item 539-03 – **Three Rivers straightline (type 6)** – 1822, folded cover from Three Rivers with THREE RIVERS 27 AUG 22 straightline (*manuscript 2's*) rated 7d collect to Quebec. The docketing notes indicate that the letter is from Thomas Coffin (seigneur, politician, militia officer etc). \$125.00



Item 539-04 – **England to Red River Settlement** – 1840, folded letter from Islington England to Red River Settlement, datelined Church Missy Institution Islington May 27 1840. The letter is addressed to Rev. Smithurst Red River N.W. America. Carried by the Hudson’s Bay to York Factory (primarily in the spring in the navigation season), Transferred to canoe brigade to Lake Winnipeg and then by York boats to Red River Colony. An interesting 6-page cross-written letter and very early as Smithurst arrived there in September 1839. The route through Pembina at the border of Minnesota Territory was opened in 1850. \$1,250.00

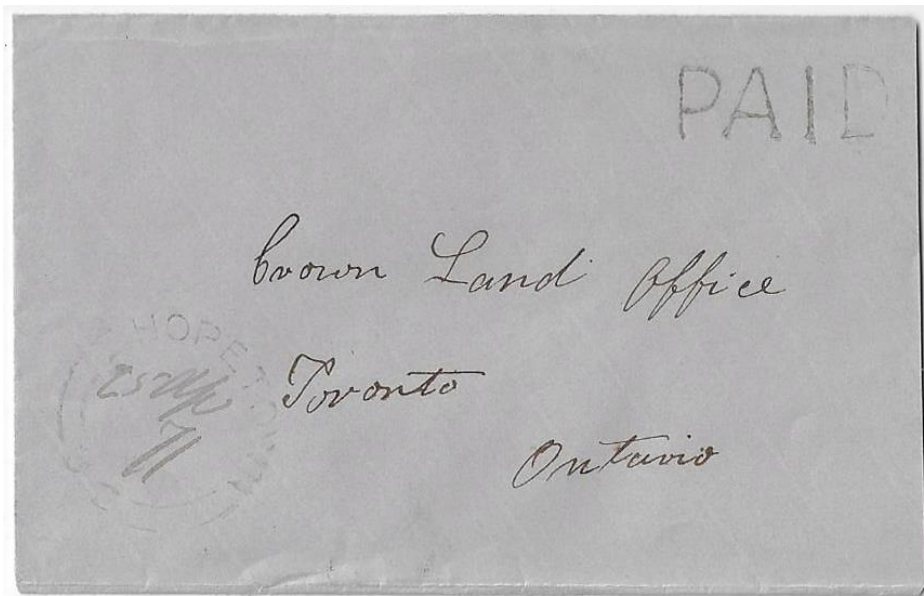


Item 539-05 – Red River Settlement to Ontario via US – 1857, stampless cover from Red River Settlement to Elma CW, then to Elora CW. Manuscript prepaid 10 cents and red United-States 6d oval cross border handstamp of Pembina. First sent to Elma with manuscript "Try Elora", Windsor, Elma and Guelph transit and Elora arrival backstamps. Cover with minor edge wear. Ex Sanderson, Richardson, Wood. \$1,750.00

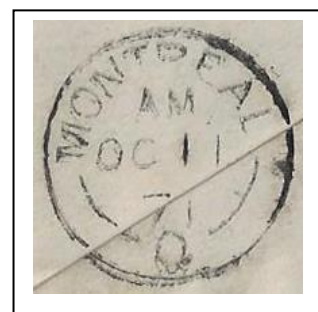
Item 539-06 – **Edwardsburg UC (GRN, closed in 1880)** – 1849, folded cover from Edwardsburg UC paid 4½ to Prescott (b/s). This is the 1839 type 29mm struck in red with ms date. A scarce Grenville county office, closed in 1880. \$175.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-07 – **Hopetown UC (Lanark, closed in 1927)** – 1871, stampless cover from Hopetown UC prepaid to Toronto (b/s). Light reduction at right. This is the 25mm hammer with ms date which was in use from 1864 to 1873. Lanark County. \$40.00 **SOLD**



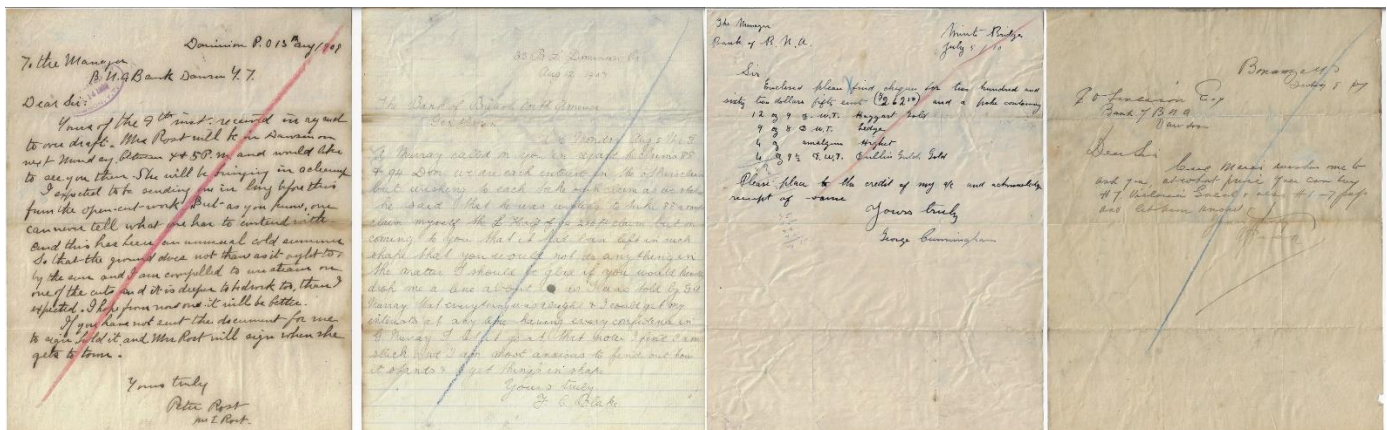
Item 539-08 – **England to Kingston UC mailed unpaid** – 1852, business folded letter from London England to Kingston UC. The letter relates to an outstanding account by a client. Rated 1/ Stg (accountancy mark, to be credited to British GPO) 1/4 Currency collect, the Canadian equivalent including the BNA postage. Carried to Liverpool, by the Cunard Europe 26th voyage to Boston and overland to Kingston. An interesting unpaid letter to Kingston. \$50.00



Item 539-09 – **Advertised in Montreal** – 1871, stampless free franked cover from Ottawa, initialed and official handstamp, to Montreal. ADV that shows an ad was placed in the Post Office or newspaper. Light stain at right. \$150.00

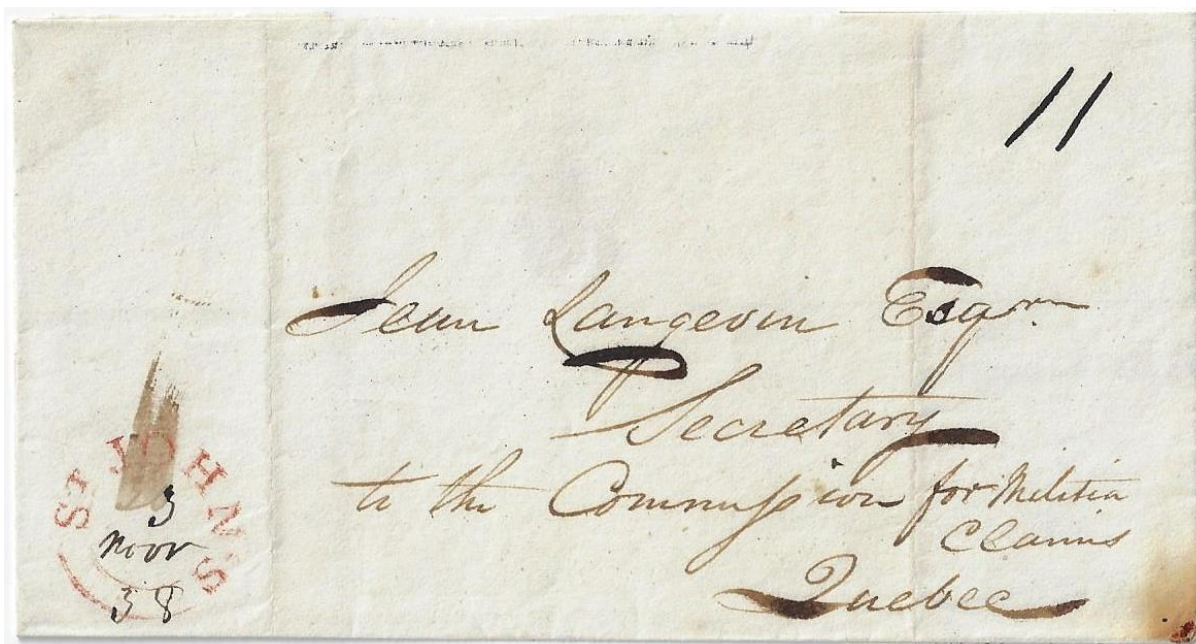


Item 539-10 – **Yukon gold dust banking ephemera** – 1907-1910, eight gold dust papers from various post-Klondike Gold Rush locations (Bonanza 1907, Dawson 1907, Minto Bridge 1910, Dominion 1909 (2), Dominion 1907 and 1910, Granville 1908 and Minto Bridge 1910), to the BNA Bank in Dawson, the first banking institution established in Dawson in May 1898. 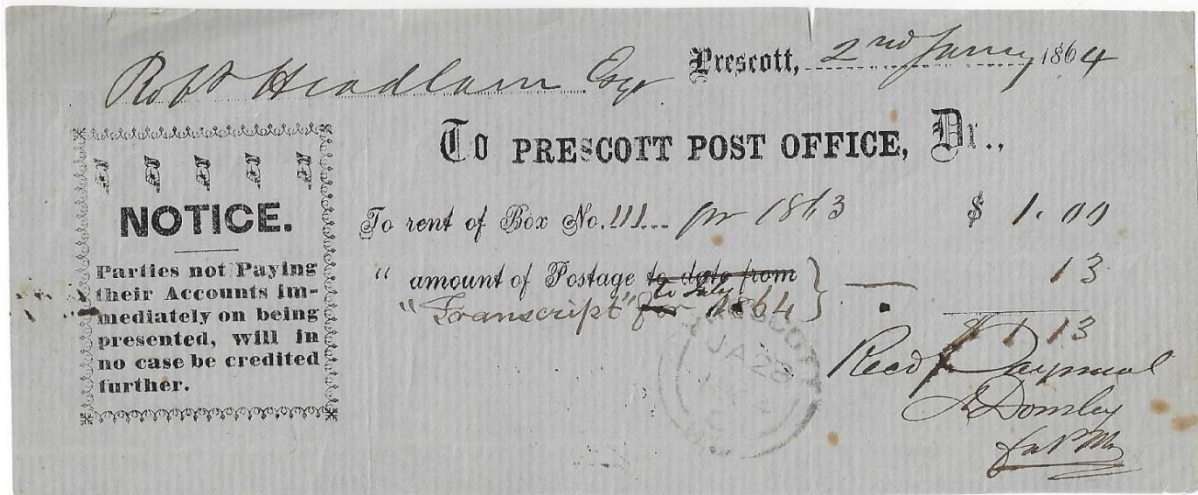




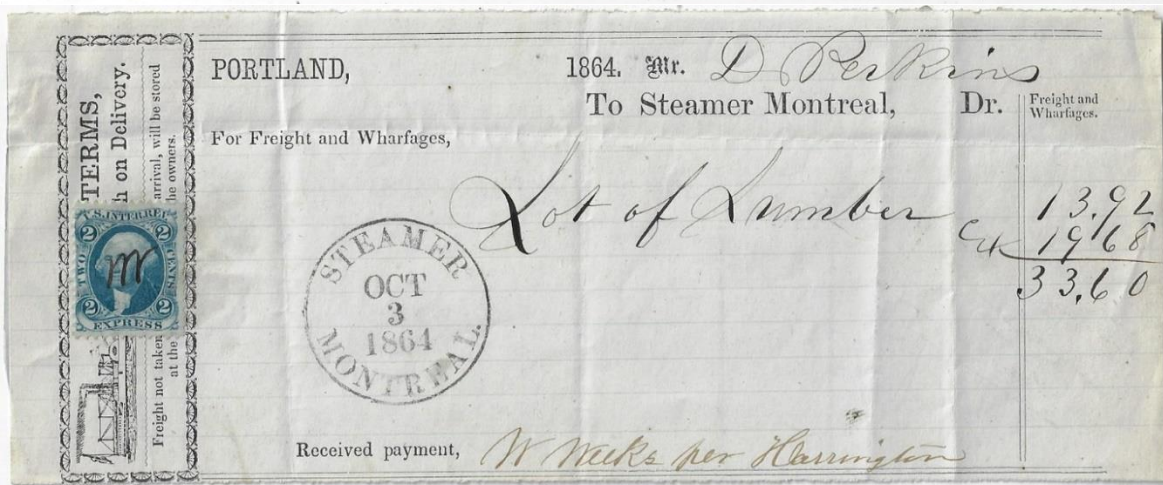
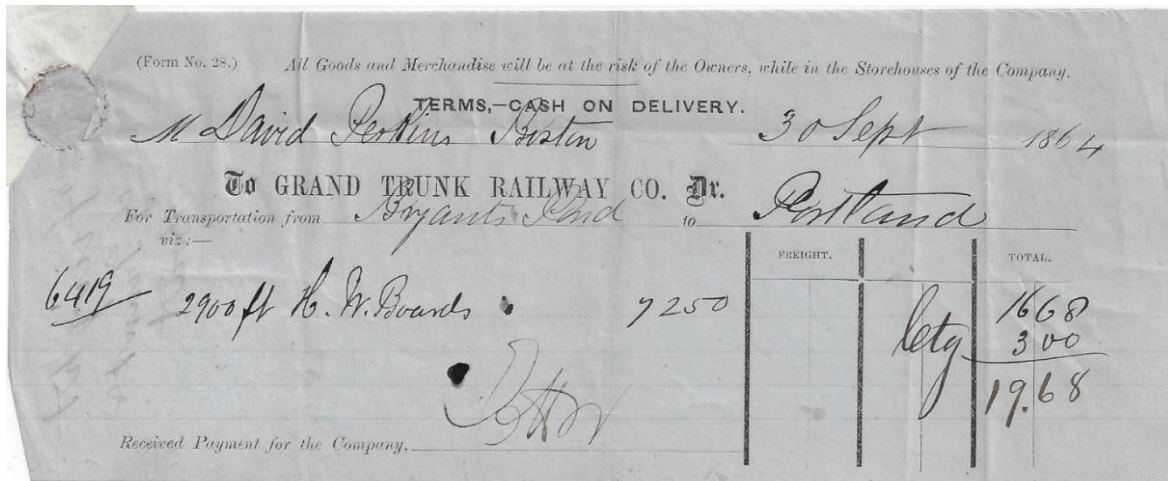
Item 539-11 – Prescott to Uxbridge UC – 1838, folded letter from Prescott UC rated 11d collect to Uxbridge. Double circle struck in black. Grenville county. \$75.00 **SOLD**



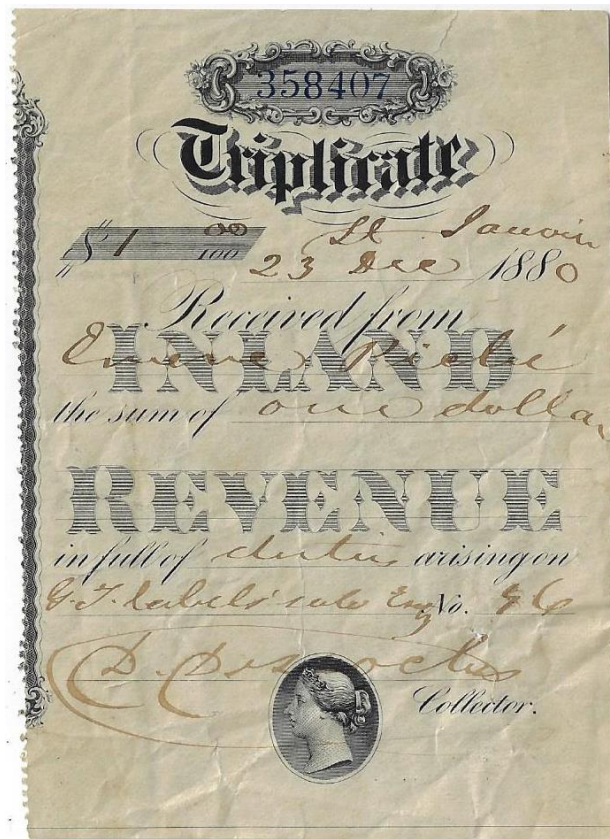
Item 539-13 – St. John's (LC) on Gerald Wellburn original page – 1838, folded cover from St. John's LC dated 3 nov 38 rated 11d collect to Quebec. Addressed to the secretary of the Commission for Militia Claims. Mounted on original Gerald Wellburn album page. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-14 – **Prescott CW Post Office box receipt** – 1864, \$1.13 Prescott CW Post Office boxholder receipt for the 1864 rental period datelined 2nd January 1864. Signed by A. Domley, most likely the Assistant Postmaster to William Brouse. An interesting collateral. \$100.00



Item 539-15 – **GTR to Portland and then by steamer Montreal** – 1864, Grand Trunk Railway freight waybill from Bryant Pond to Portland and with a Portland Steam Packet Co. freight Steamer Montreal waybill attached. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-16 – **Tax collector receipt with Queen Victoria vignette** – 1880, Inland Revenue triplicate receipt No.358407 for the sum of 1 dollar for duties paid by Eugene Piché. Nice BABNC Queen Victoria portrait vignette. \$45.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-17 – **One Half Penny on newspaper wrapper, 11** – c1859, ½d tied by four-ring 37 on newspaper wrapper from Quebec LC paying ½d circular rate to the Postmaster of Cote des Neiges. Historically, the original settlement, the Village of Côte-des-Neiges, was founded in 1862 and annexed by Montreal in 1908. The Cote des Neiges P.O. opened in 1854. \$2,000.00



Item 539-18 – **3d Beaver - Rawdon, Wright, Hatch and Edson** – 1853, 3d Beaver showing large portion and nearly complete plate imprint Rawd(on, Wright, Hatch and Edson of New York), position 3 or 7 in top sheet margin tied by pen cancel on cover from Bath UC paying 3d letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Addressed to Grand Trunk Railway. Small tear on flap. An appealing pence cover! \$750.00



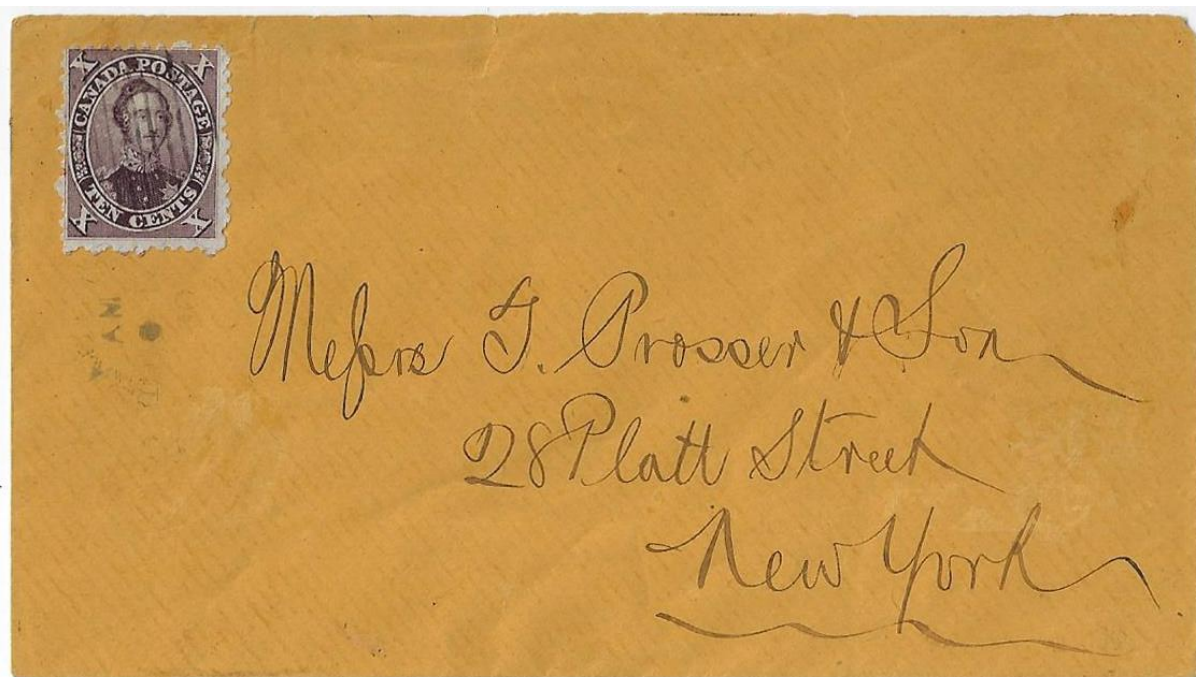
Item 539-19 – Glass Works Sinclair Jack & Co. – 1866, 5¢ Beaver tied by Montreal CE duplex cancel on Sinclair Jack & Co. Montreal Glass Works c/c cover paying 5¢ letter rate to Irish Creek (Jasper CW b/s). \$150.00



Item 539-20 – Oil Springs UC (ERD and recorded for 9 days) – 1861, 10¢ Consort (dark rich purple brown, printing order 5B) with pen cancel on cover from Oil Springs UC paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to New York. Wyoming CW transit and GWR Sarnia Branch RPO (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date for this hammer. The latest being Nov 6 1861 making a record of 9 days. The Oil Springs CW hammer is ERD Dec 4 1861. A rare Lambton county postmark and a lovely Consort printing. Just wow! Ex Kutz. \$750.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-21 – **10¢ Consort printing order 8A brownish sepia** – 1861, 10¢ Consort (*printing order 8A brownish sepia*) tied by Diamond grid cancel on a neat cover from Toronto paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Massachusetts. \$200.00




Item 539-22 – **10¢ Consort printing order 4B reddish agate** – 1860, 10¢ Consort (*printing order 4B reddish agate, perf 11.7*) tied by a faint Brantford CW Berri duplex cancel on cover paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to New York. A choice subsequent 17e on cover. Ex Highlands. \$500.00



Item 539-23 – **Almonte Ont Billboard advertising** – 1870, 3¢ Large Queen tied by concentric ring cancel on Almonte Ont Billboard advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Irish Creek (Jasper CW b/s). The cover is date FE 3 70. Rare. \$400.00



Item 539-24 – **Minnewawa Man (RF E – 1886-1892)** – 1890, 3¢ SQ (2) cancelled by fancy cancel on cover from Minnewawa Man paying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Berlin Ont (b/s). Brandon and Winnipeg transit (b/s). A rarity. \$300.00



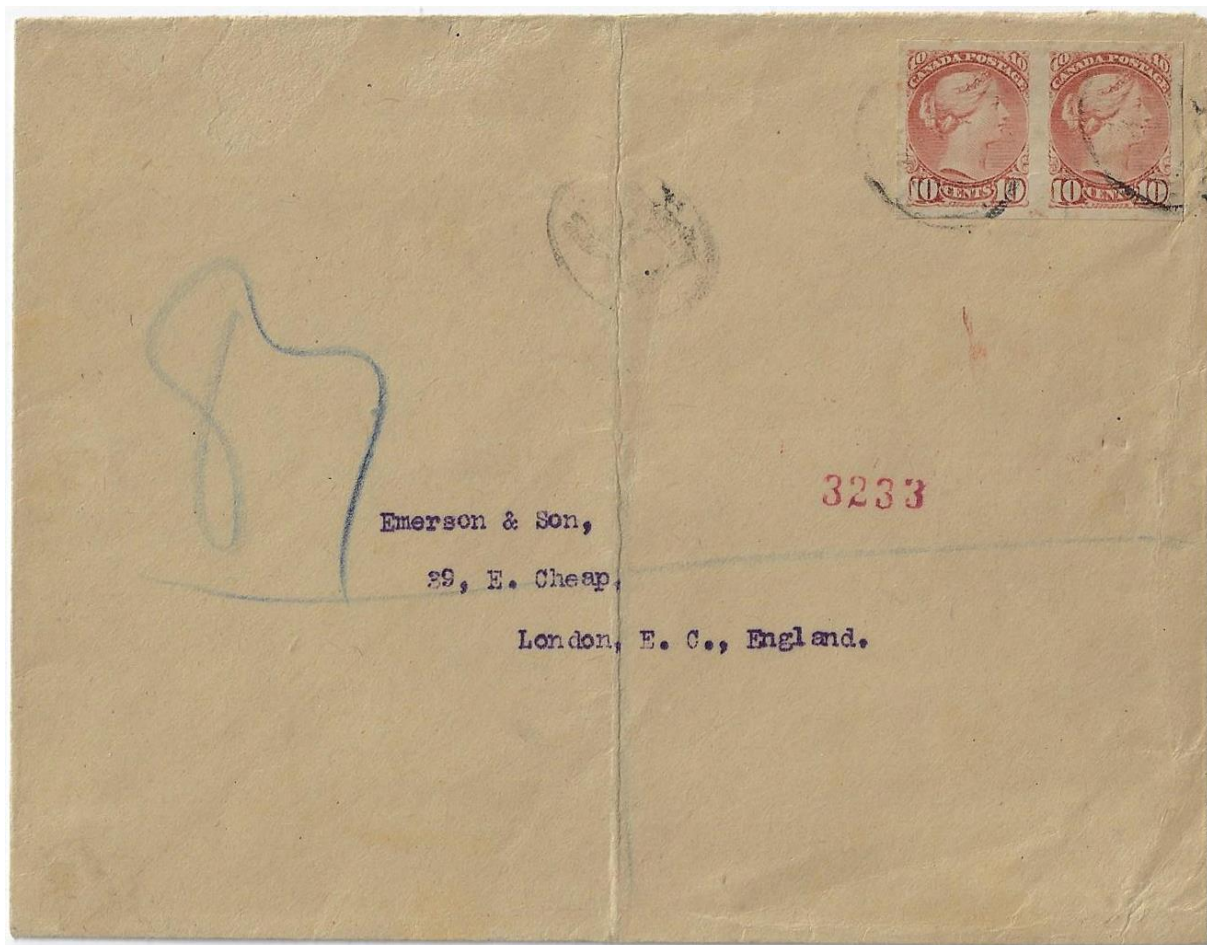

Item 539-25 – **The Fort Garry Winter Star** – 1872, 3¢ SQ rose-carmine tied by the Fort Garry Star (Lacelle No.994) on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Owen Sound (b/s). Routed through the United-States by closed mail winter service (*Pembina, St. Paul, Chicago, Windsor Ont*) and possibly carried by dog team mail, entered in Canada at Windsor. VGG certificate No. G29255. Rare. \$500.00

The summer eastbound journey was overland and by canoe brigade to Fort William and by steamer to Collingwood.



Item 539-26 – **10¢ SQ imperforate pair** – 1900, 10¢ rose carmine imperforate pair (1891 printing, 45i, very large margins) tied by oval registered cancels on cover from Montreal (reverse - AU 21 inverted and error 06) paying 20¢ triple weight registered letter rate to London England (30 AU 00). Vertical filing fold at centre, still a very fine, rare and properly used in-period imperforate rate cover. Ex Bowen. \$2,000.00 **SOLD**

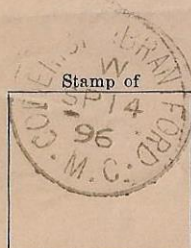


Item 539-27 – **Lundar Manitoba registered** – 1903, 1c, 2c (3) Numeral tied by grid cancel on cover from Lundar Man paying 7c registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). Reaburn, Clarkleigh transit (b/s) and carried by Winnipeg & Moose Jaw RPO, Ottawa & Fort William RPO (b/s). \$75.00



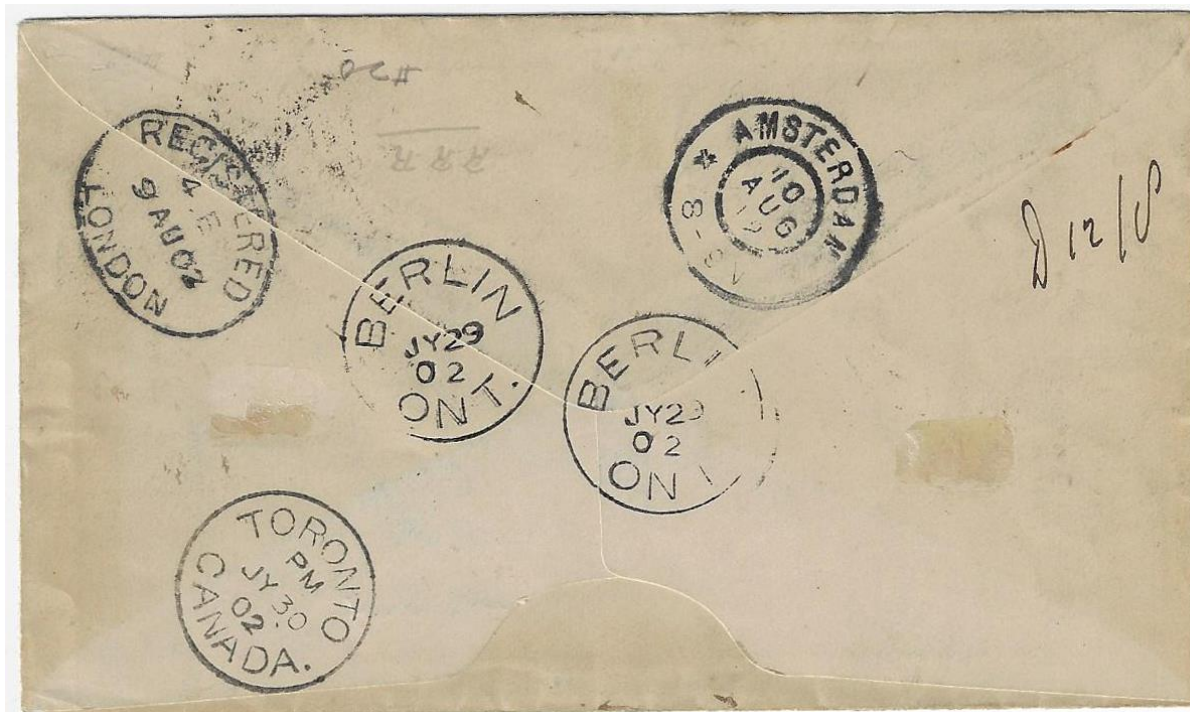

Item 539-29 – **Lon & Niag Falls Express** – 1896, Railway Post Office letter bill mailed on London & Niagara Falls RYPO with 2-line straight line Lon & Niag Falls Express (Gray ON-249, RF F) to Paris Station. Aging, crackling and fragile. \$75.00



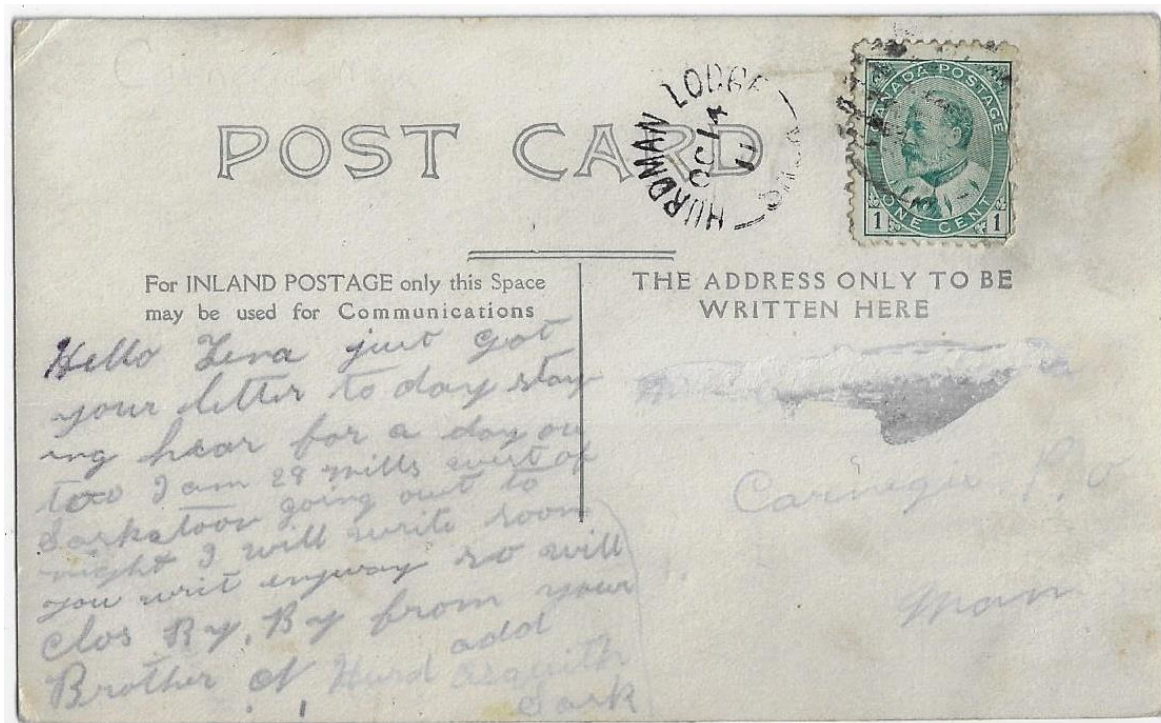
Item 539-30 – **6c UPU printed matter registered to The Netherlands** – 1902, 2c Map (2) tied by Berlin Ont cds on 2c unsealed PSE paying 6c UPU printed matter registered rate to The Netherlands (b/s). Routed via Toronto and London England (b/s). Unsealed for inspection. A very elusive rate to a foreign destination. \$500.00



Item 539-31 – Received in damaged condition in Warsaw Poland – 1911, 1¢ Edward (5) tied by Toronto International machine cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Finland. Routed via Poland while this country was part of the Russian Empire with Finland. Received in Warsaw Poland in damaged condition and signed by a post and telegraph official. Travelled by sea to Trieste, Austro-Hungary, then north by land to Warsaw and then to Nikolaistad and to Wasa. \$300.00



Item 539-32 – Elgin Manitoba townview RPPC – 1908, 2¢ Edward tied by Elgin Man cds on Elgin townview real photo postcard to Beaverton Ontario. \$40.00 **SOLD**



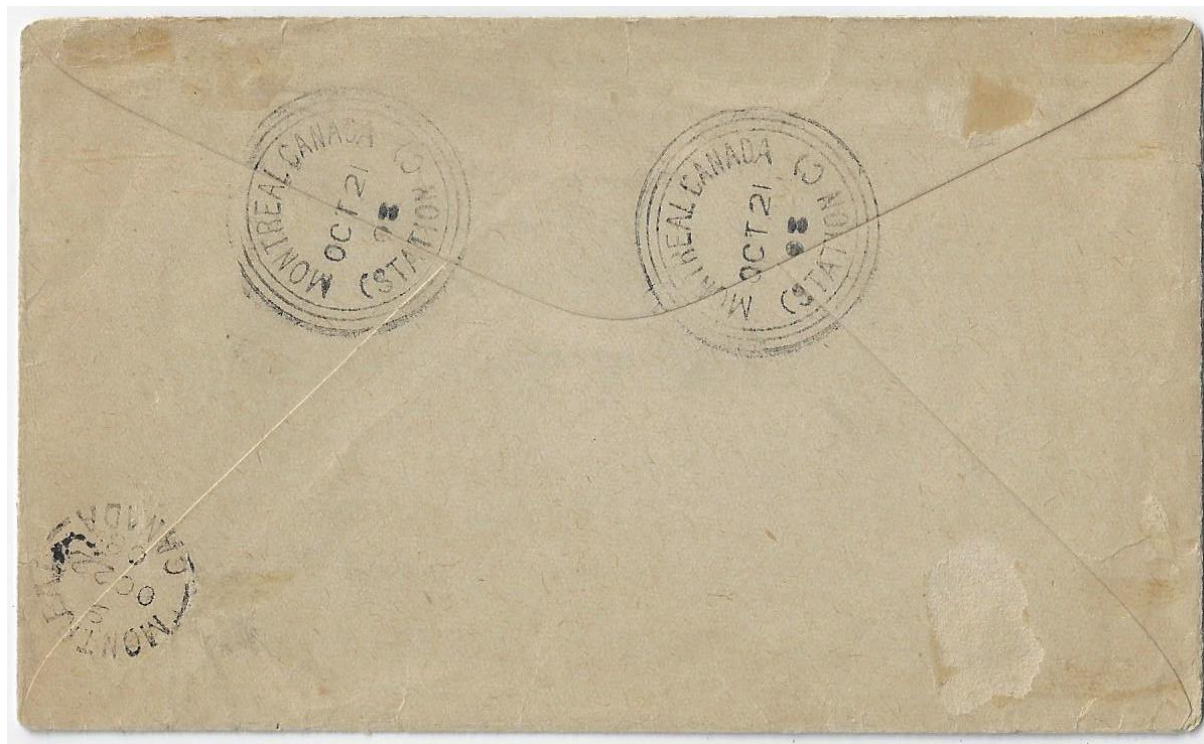
Item 539-33 – CNR Bridge Saskatoon Sask – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on CNR Bridge Saskatoon real photo postcard, mailed from Hurdman Lodge Sask to Carnegie Manitoba. Men posing with their carriage, one on the bridge and two underneath. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-34 – **Tercentenary - 6¢ drop registered** – 1908, ½¢ (2), 5¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by Montreal Sub P.O. Ste. Cunegonde cds on cover paying 6¢ drop registered letter rate. Montreal (b/s). The 6¢ drop registered rate was effective AU 8 08. Small tear at right. \$350.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-35 – **Tercentenary - 6¢ drop registered** – 1908, 1¢, 5¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Montreal paying 6¢ drop registered letter rate. Montreal (OC 17 08 b/s). The 6¢ drop registered rate was effective AU 8 08. \$300.00 **SOLD**



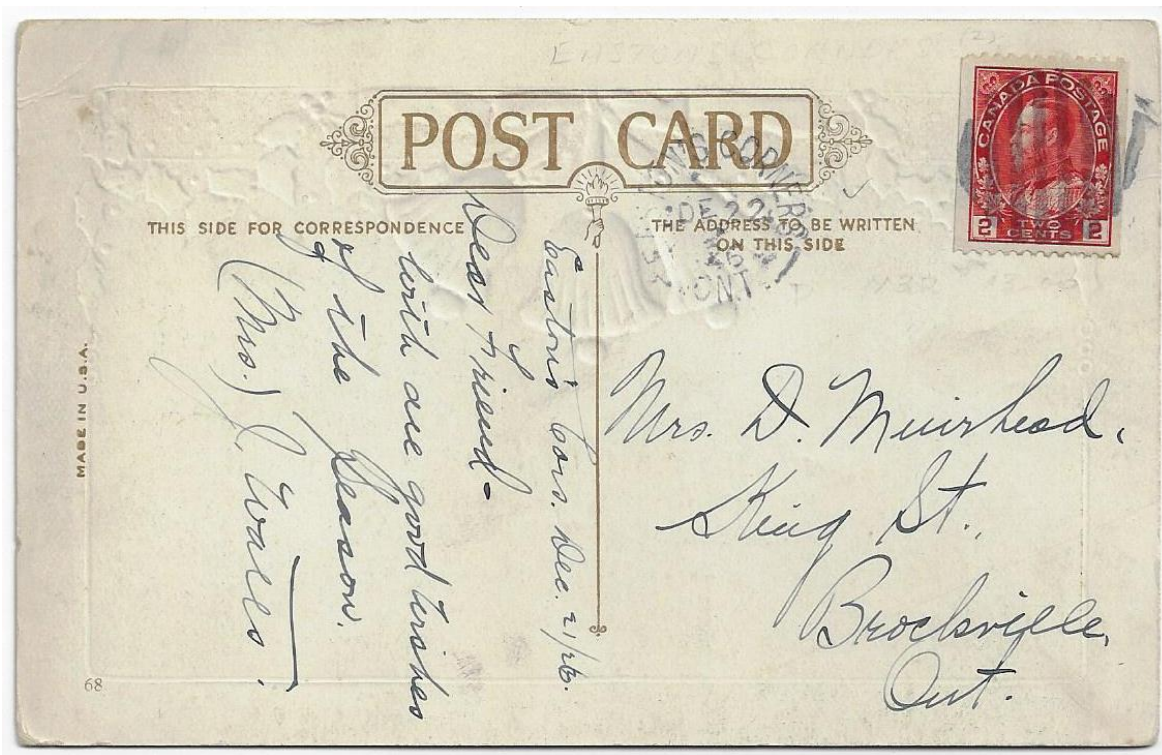
Item 539-36 – **Montreal Station C Orb cancel (4 recorded covers)** – 1908, 2¢, 5¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by Montreal Station C Orb cancel on cover paying 7¢ double weight drop registered letter rate. Montreal and two neat Montreal Canada Station C datestamps (b/s). Only 4 covers are recorded. An exceedingly rare postmark and exhibit quality. \$1,000.00



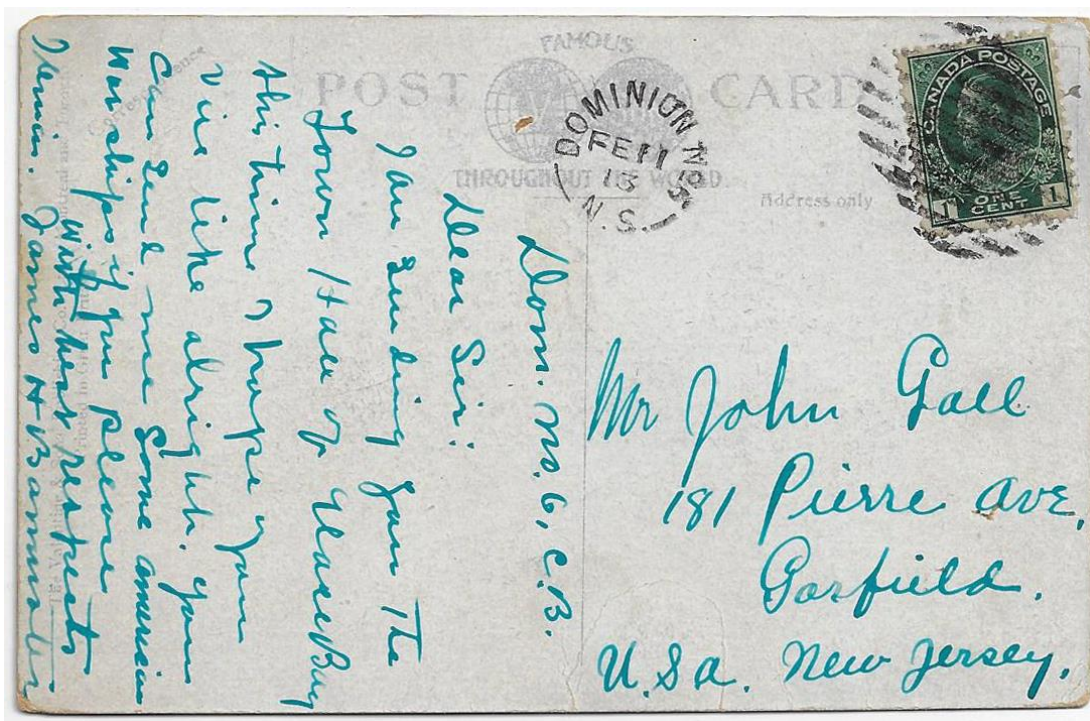
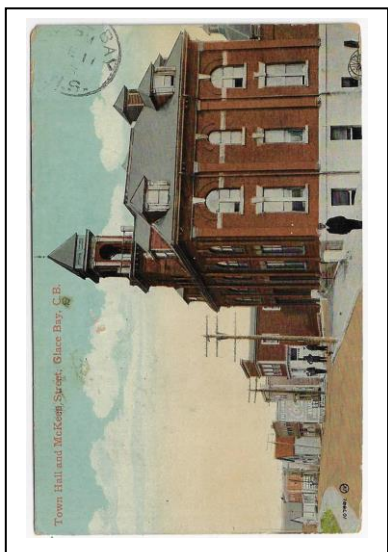
Item 539-37 – **Tercentenary - 7¢ double weight drop registered** – 1908, 7¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by Montreal Station A cds on cover paying 7¢ double weight drop registered letter rate. Montreal and Montreal Station B (b/s). The 7¢ double weight drop registered rate was effective AU 8 08. \$250.00 **SOLD**



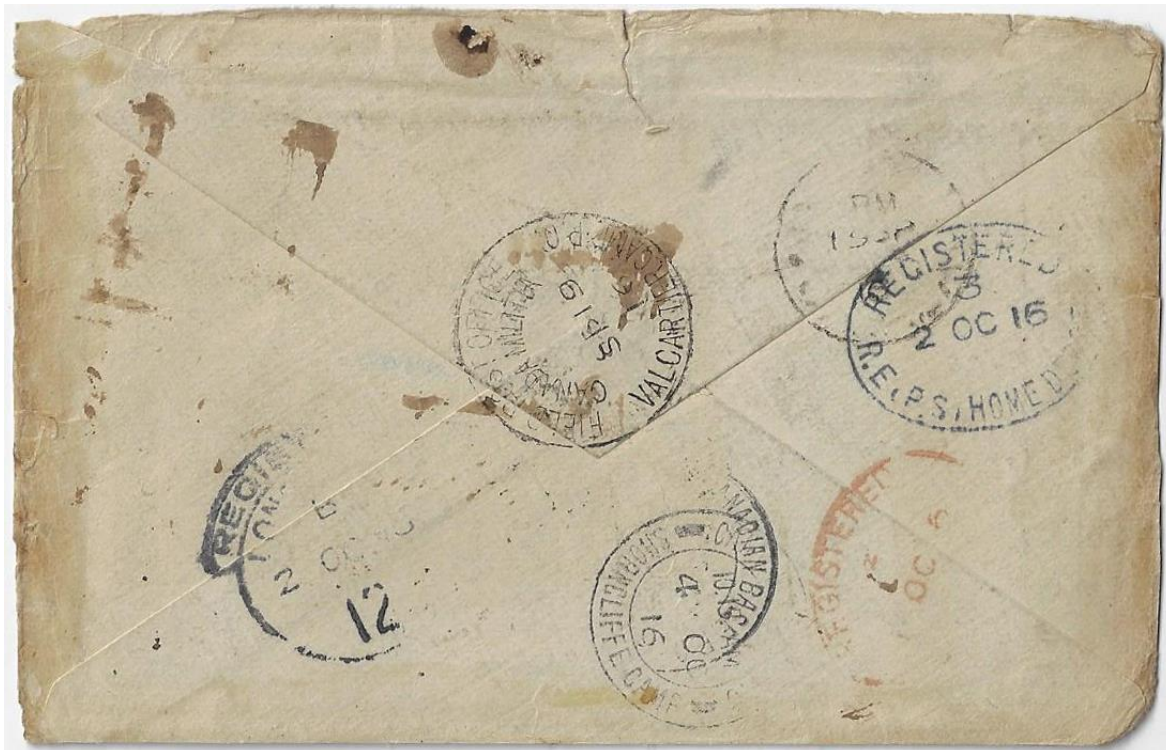
Item 539-38 – **Cromer Station Manitoba (RF E, 1911-1915)** – 1914, 1¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Christmas postcard from Cromer Station Man (RF E, 1911-1915) to Portage La Prairie. A very elusive office. \$150.00



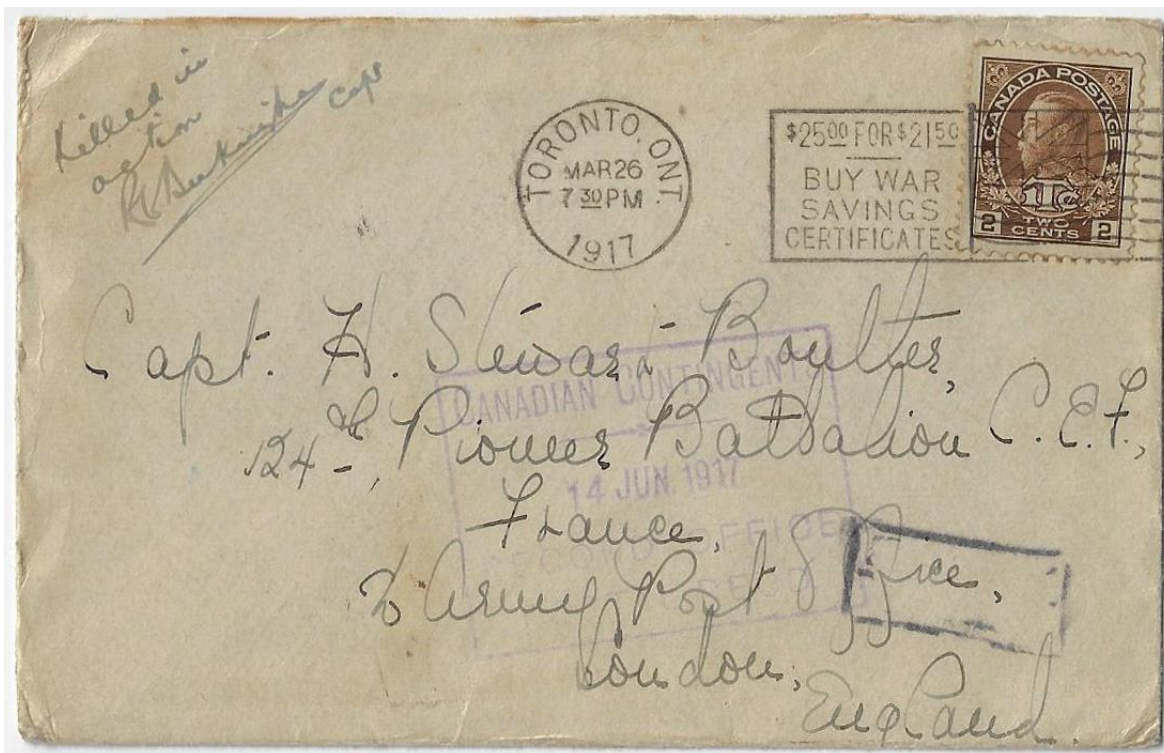
Item 539-39 – **2¢ Admiral coil, perf 12 horizontal** – 1926, 2¢ Admiral, Unitrade 132, tied by grid cancel on postcard from Easton's Corner Ont paying 2¢ PC rate to Brockville. A scarce coil usage and grossly undercatalogued. Grenville county. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-40 – **Dominion No. 6 N.S. (Cape Breton)** – 1913, 1¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Glace Bay townview Valentine postcard mailed at Dominion No. 6 N.S. paying 1¢ PR rate to U.S. (1906-1940). \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-41 – Valcartier Camp registered (148th Battn) – 1916, 2¢ Admiral 2¢+1¢ Wartax MR3 (2) tied by Valcartier Camp PQ cds (SP 19 16) on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to England (b/s). Addressed to Lcpl Robinson 841093, 148th Overseas Battalion CEF. (The 148th Battalion was a short-lived unit based in Montreal, Quebec). Redirected with final destination to Bramshott Camp OC 15 16. \$400.00



Item 539-42 – **Capt H.S. Boulter – Killed in Action** – 1917, 2¢+1¢ Wartax tied by Toronto flag cancel on cover addressed to Capt H. Stewart Boulter, 124th Pioneer Battalion CEF, France. Returned KIA signed R.G. Buckingham Capt, FPO D62 4th Div (b/s). Dead Letter Office Ottawa (b/s). \$250.00 **SOLD**

The 124th Battn (Governor General's Body Guard) was a unit based in Toronto, later redesignated the 124th Pioneer Battalion, CEF. The battalion is perpetuated by The Royal Regiment of Canada.

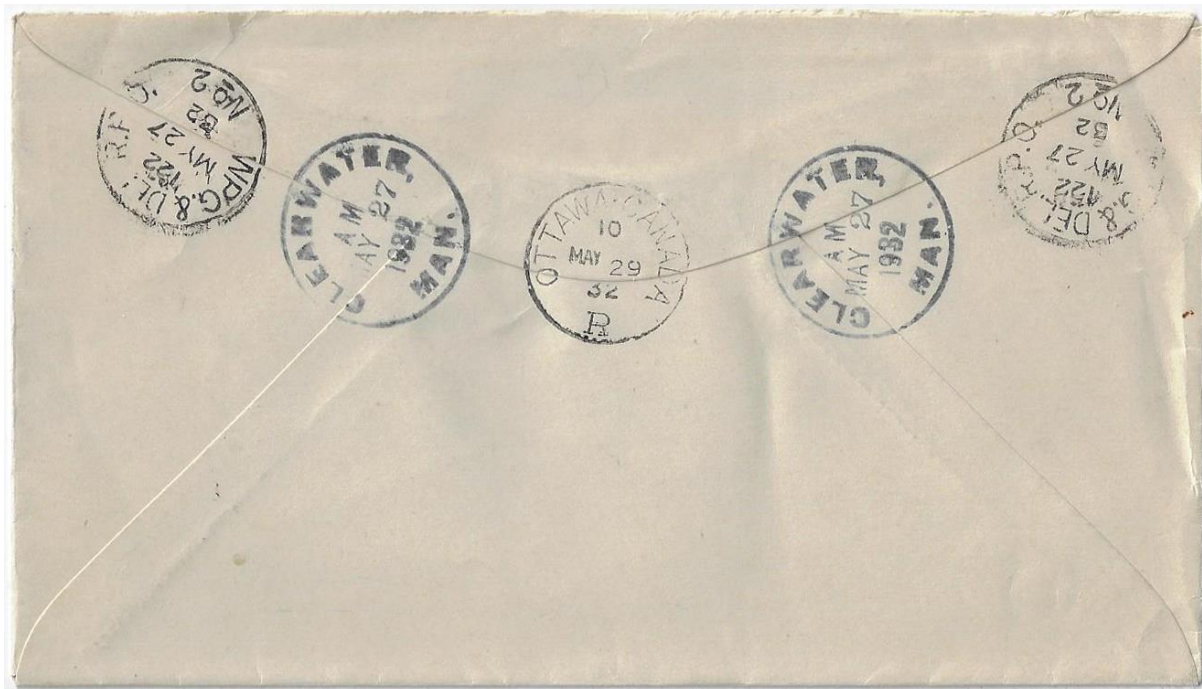


Item 539-43 – **Margaretsville N.S. to Sgt Down** – 1915, 1¢ Admiral (2), 1¢ Wartax MR1 tied by Margaretsville N.S. cds (NO 2 15) on cover to Sgt James Frederick Down, 68061, B Company, 25th Nova Scotia Rifles Battalion (Second Contingent). Sgt Down had been sent to hospital in England, various markings including some very scarce Canadian: Canadian section G.H.Q, 3rd Echelon, transferred to England boxed, Canadian Contingent Record Office, Shorncliffe. Sgt Down has been enlisted in Dec 1914. The unit embarked for GB on 20 May 1915 and served in France from 16 September 1915 until the end of the war. \$150.00 **SOLD**

Of the 1000 Nova Scotians that started with the battalion, after the first year of fighting, 100 were left in the battalion, while 900 men were killed, taken prisoner, missing or injured. The 25th Battalion Nova Scotia Rifles was also known as the "MacKenzie Battalion", the "Master Raiders" or the "Raiding Battalion".

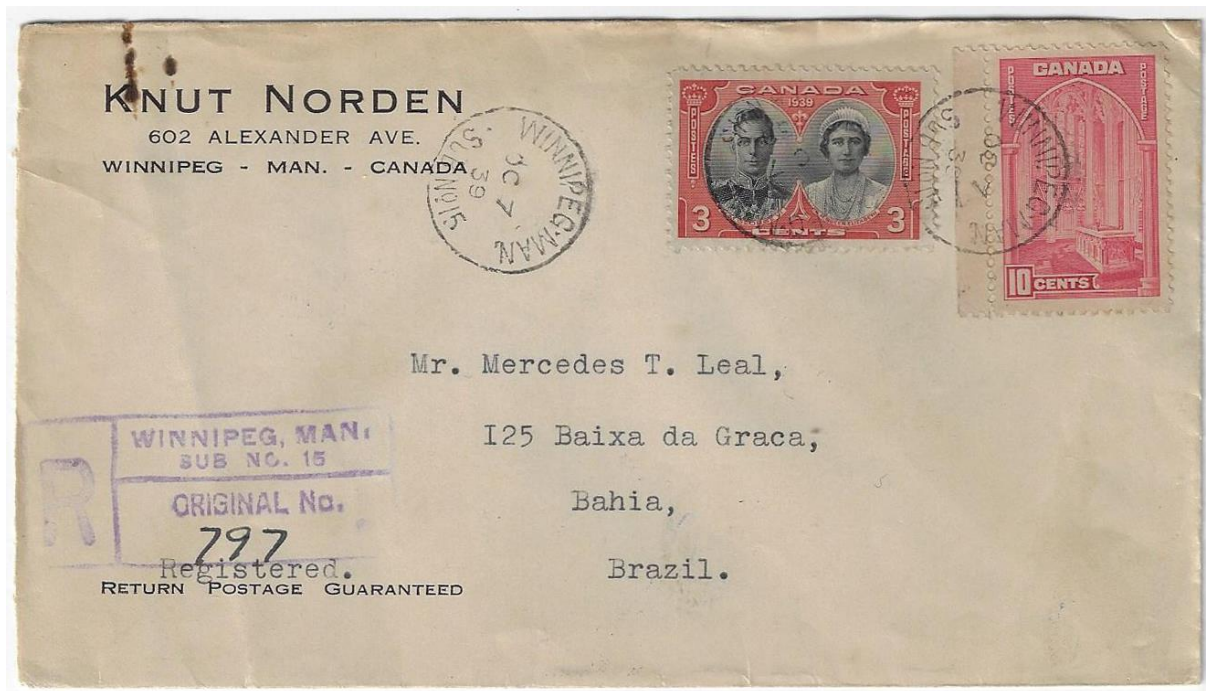


Item 539-44 – Lequille N.S. to Pte Harnish – 1916, 2c+1c Wartax tied by Salisbury datestamp on cover from Lequille N.S. to Pte Guy Prescott Harnish, 67772, B Company, 25th Nova Scotia Rifles Battalion (Second Contingent). Pte Harnish had been sent to hospital in England, then served with 40th Battalion and finally back to 25 Battalion (ms rejoined unit). The letter never made it to him and sent to the Ottawa Dead Letter Office (b/s). Bulford Camp, Salisbury SK and Canadian Record Office Postal Despatched (b/s). \$150.00

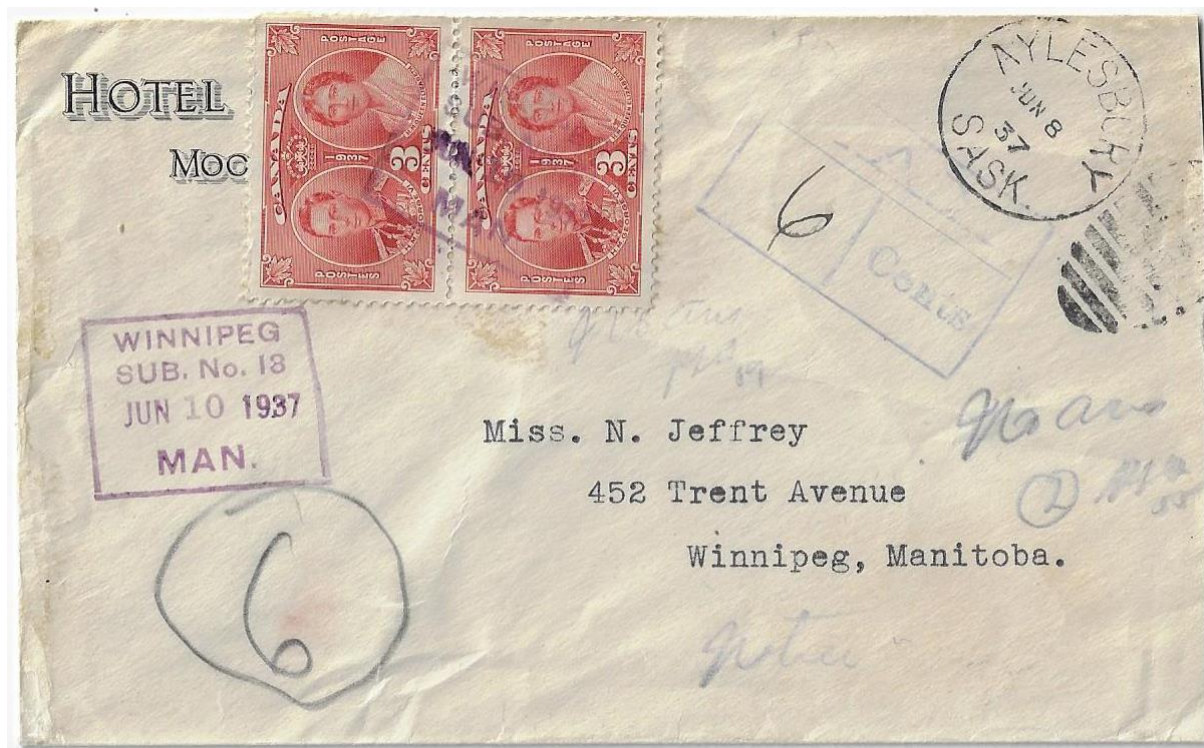


Item 539-45 – **Clearwater Manitoba MOOD cancel** – 1932, 10¢ Cartier tied by Clearwater Man MOOD cancel (Money Order Office Datestamp) on 3¢ PSE paying 13¢ registered letter rate to the Postmaster General in Ottawa (b/s). Wpg & Del RPO No.2 train 122. \$45.00 **SOLD**

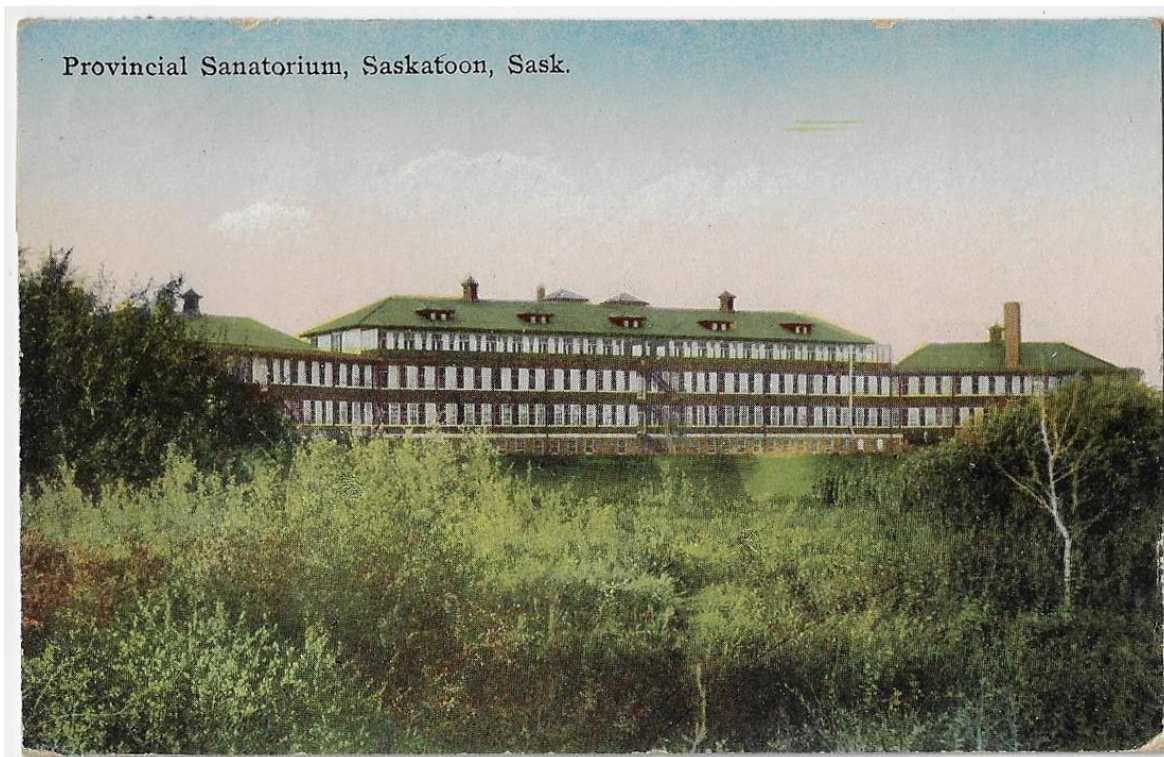
This type of handstamp was for administrative and money order operation purposes.



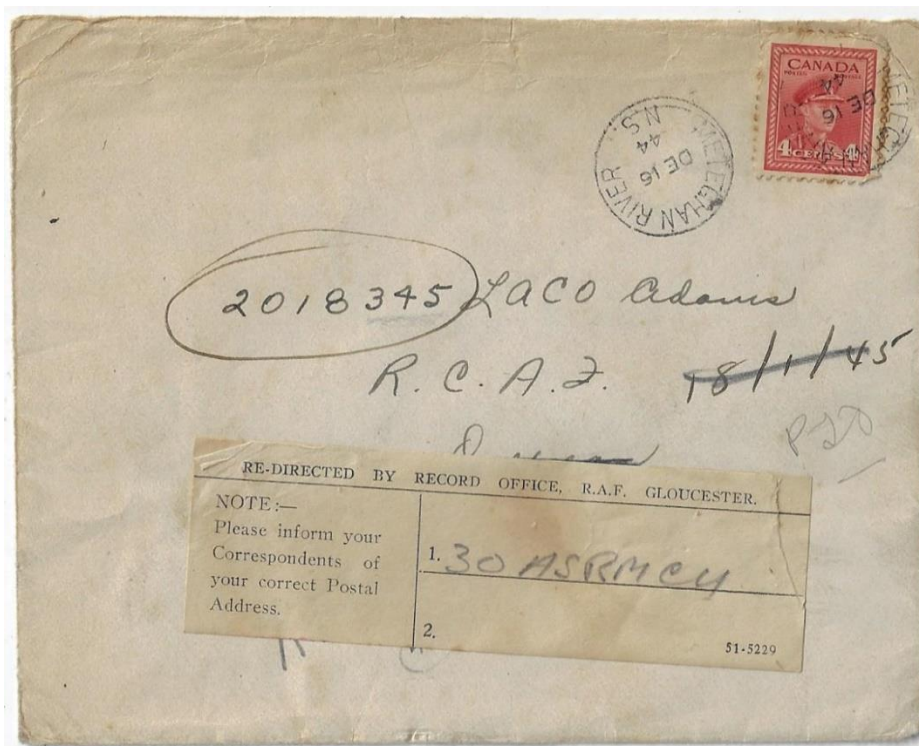
Item 539-46 – **Winnipeg Sub No.15 registered to Brazil** – 1939, 3¢ Royal Visit, 10¢ Pictorial tied by Winnipeg Man Sub no.15 cds on cover paying 13¢ preferred registered letter rate to Brazil (b/s). Montreal B&F (b/s). \$60.00



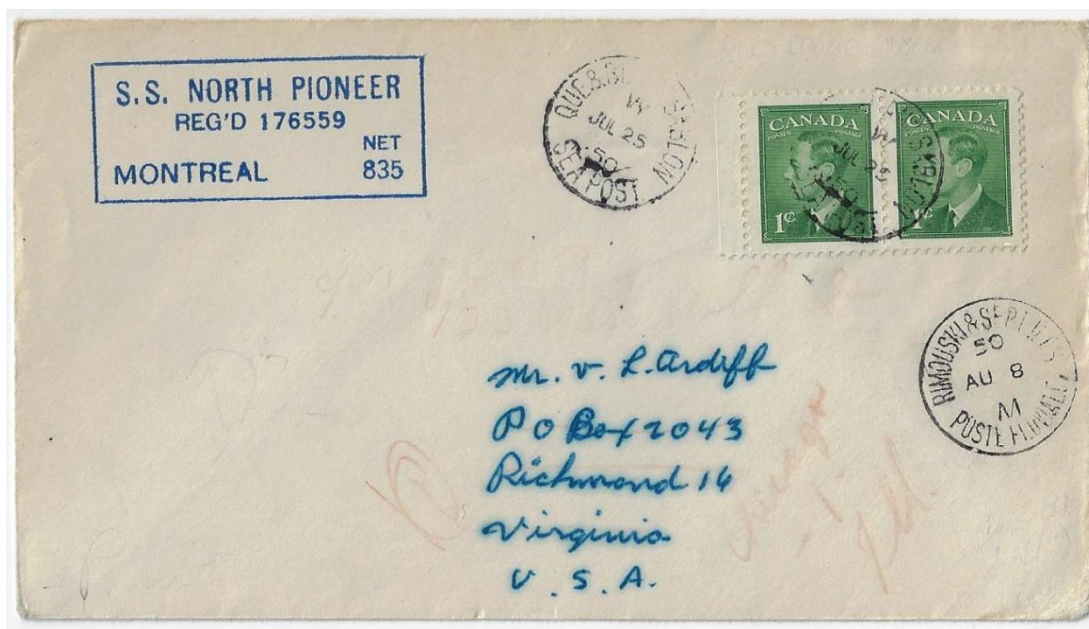
Item 539-47 – **3¢ Coronation pair used as postage due stamps** – 1937, unpaid cover from Aylesbury Sask to Winnipeg, charged 6¢ the double deficiency and dues paid with two 3¢ Coronation stamps. Winnipeg Sub No.13 MOTO handstamp and appears “not found” and with “notice left”. Highly unusual Coronation franked cover. Reduced at right. \$100.00

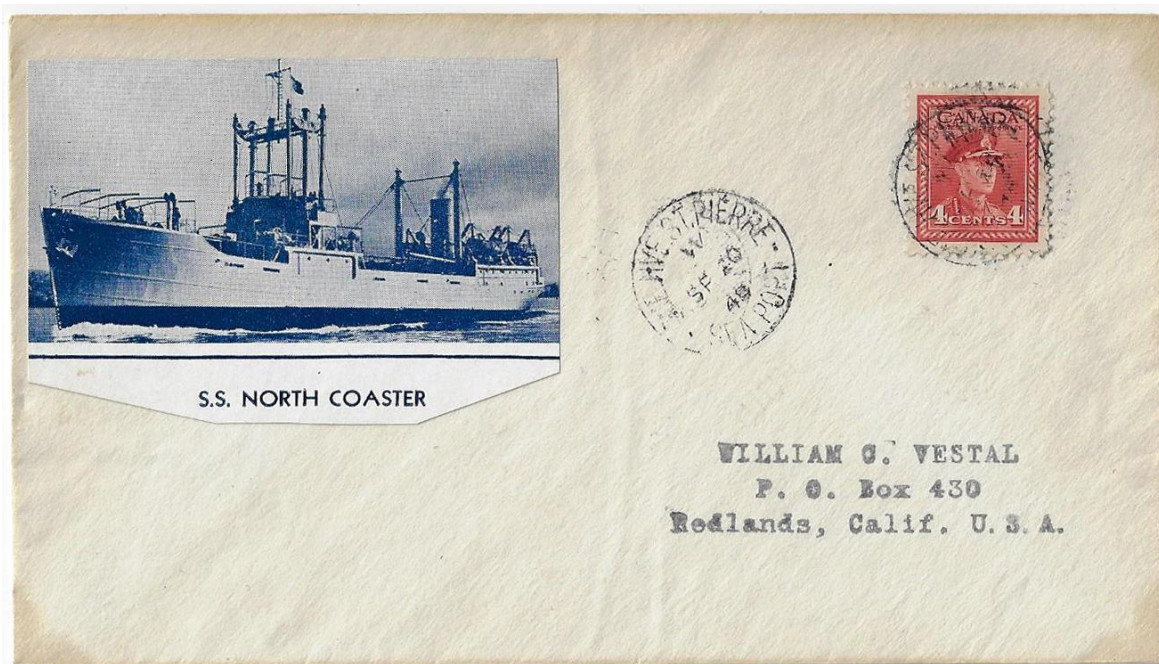
Item 539-48 – **July 1939 Petawawa Camp** – 1939, 2c Royal Visit tied by FPO Canada Militia Petawawa Camp cds on Saskatoon Sanatorium postcard paying 2c PC rate to Halifax. A few days before the ultimate mobilization, Petawawa was operational and ready. \$75.00



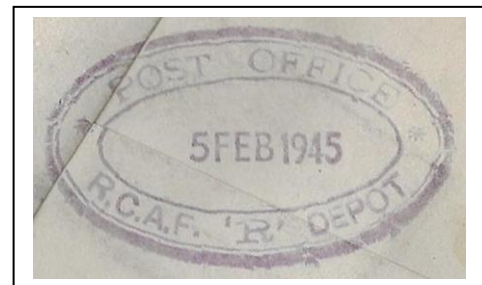
Item 539-49 – **Meteghan River N.S. to RCAF** – 1944, 4¢ War tied by Meteghan River N.S. cds on cover to RCAF servicemen stationed with the RAF. Redirected by the RAF Record Office in Gloucester to 30 ASRMCU in Isle of Wight (Air Sea Rescue Marine Craft Unit). Appropriate backstamps. \$40.00 **SOLD**



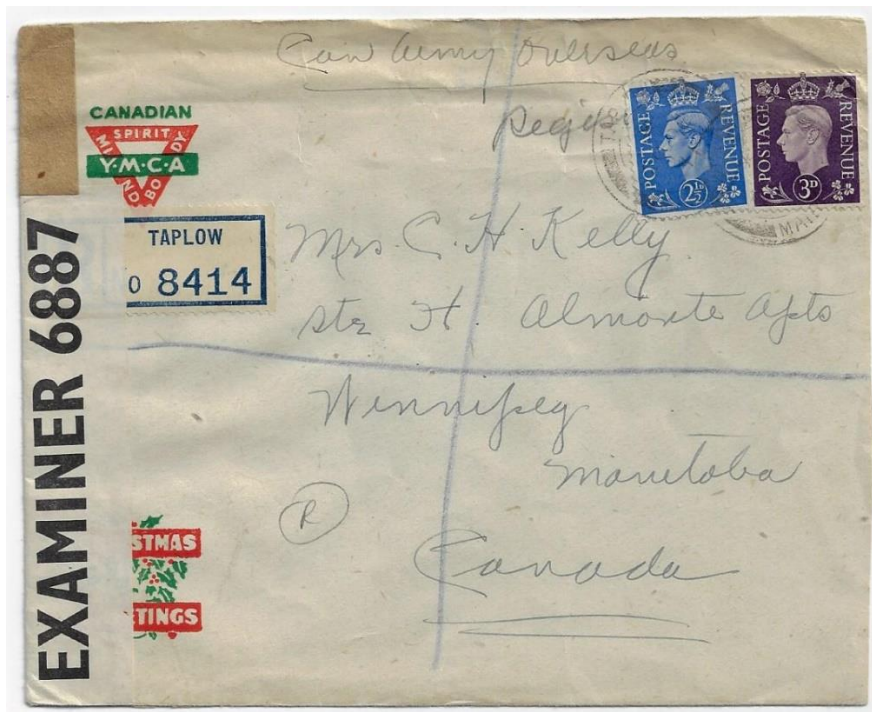
Item 539-50 – **St. Lawrence River Sea Post markings** – 1950, 1¢ Postes Postage (2) tied by Que & Blanc Sablon Sea Post cds (*Gray QC-602, RF B, 1934-1961*) on S.S. North Pioneer philatelic cover paying 2¢ unsealed printed matter rate to U.S. Rimouski & Sept Ile Poste Fluviale transit marking (*Gray QC-611 RF C, 1940-1961*). This cover was prepared and sent through the St. Lawrence sea post mail system for the purpose of creating a collectible. However, such philatelic covers are almost the only way to have them. \$75.00



Item 539-51 – **St. Lawrence River Sea Post marking** – 1948, 4¢ War tied by Que. Hve. St. Pierre Sea Post cds (*Sea Port error for “Post”, Gray QC-606, RFF, 1946-1948*) on S.S. North Coaster philatelic cover paying 4¢ letter rate to U.S. As the above mate, this cover was prepared and sent through the St. Lawrence sea post mail system for the purpose of creating a collectible, but such created covers are almost the only way to have them. \$100.00



Item 539-52 – **RCAF Sergeant repatriated** – 1944, 4¢ War tied by Montreal machine cancel on cover to Flight Sgt Sahli RCAF. Redirected to R Depot (Post Office RCAF R. Depot b/s), found repatriated, addressed returned to Canada h/s, sent to Kitchener Ontario (MPO 304 b/s). \$45.00



Item 539-53 – **Canadian hospital in Taplow** – 1941, GB 2½d, 3d tied by Taplow Maiden Head datestamp (20 DE 41) on YMCA Christmas registered and censored cover to Winnipeg (b/s). 5th Canadian General Hospital RCAMC, Taplow, Bucks, UK (1940-1943). \$50.00



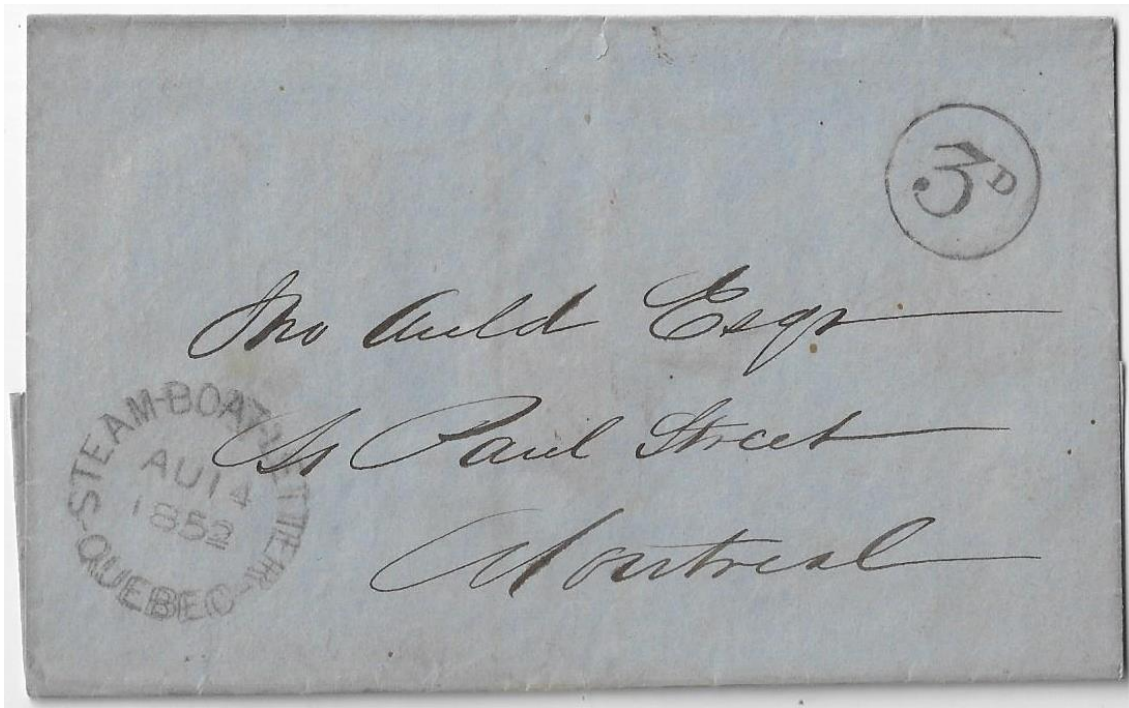
Item 539-54 – **Canadian Postal Corps No.6 - Emergency Hammer** – 1946, cover from Vienna Austria dated 25 Feb 46 to POW Camp 132 Medicine Hat Alta. Censored and then redirected to POW Camp 23 Monteith Ontario. Routed via C.P.C. in Ottawa with Canadian Postal Corps No.6 emergency hammer MR 27 46 (Sayles F155). A World War II era rarity. \$500.00



Item 539-55 – **Guelph Ont MPO 105 registered** – 1943, 5¢, 6¢, 7¢ Airmail stamps tied by Guelph MPO 105 MOTO handstamp on cover paying 18¢ triple weight registered letter rate to Peterborough (b/s). Tor. Strat & Goderich RPO and Ott & Toronto RPO (b/s). Scotch tape stain but scarce postmarks. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-56 – **Royal Canadian Navy mail (34)** – 1960, 5¢ Wilding tied by FMO Halifax NS cds on RCN cover to Victoria BC. Navy mail 34 is the HMCS Gatineau. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 539-57 – **Steamboat Letter Quebec** – 1852, folded cover from Quebec rated 3d collect to Montreal. Carried on the St. Lawrence with Steamboat Letter Quebec AU 14 52. \$50.00 **SOLD**
