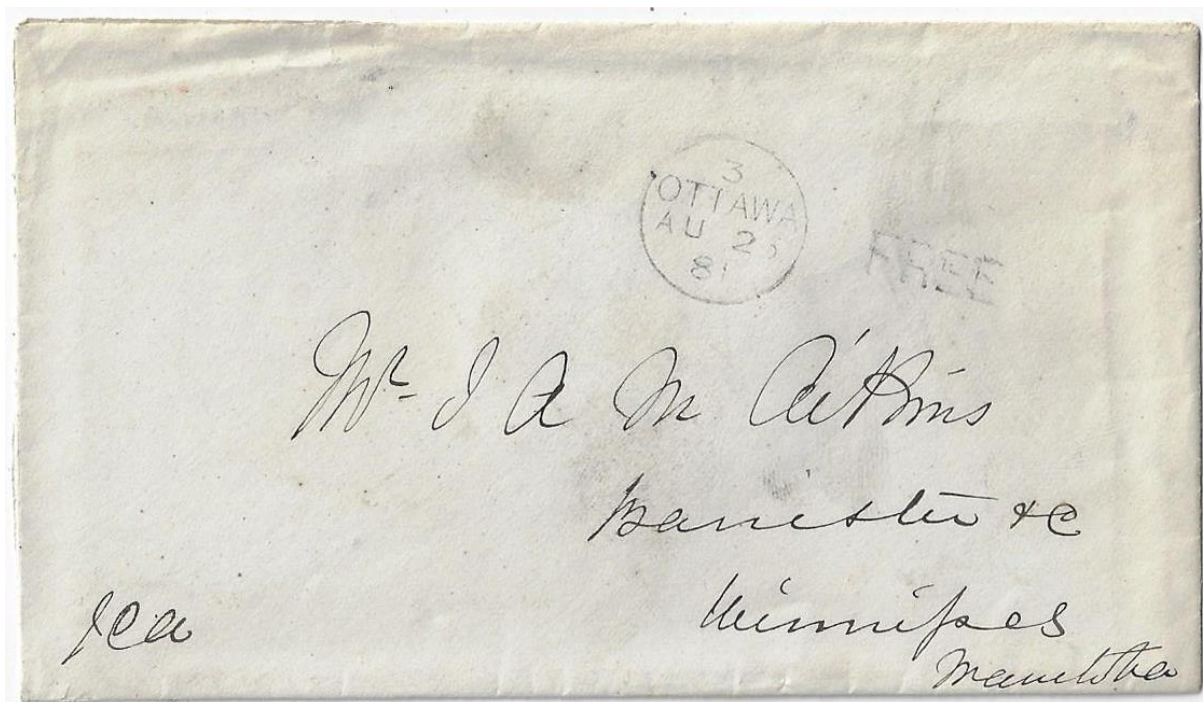

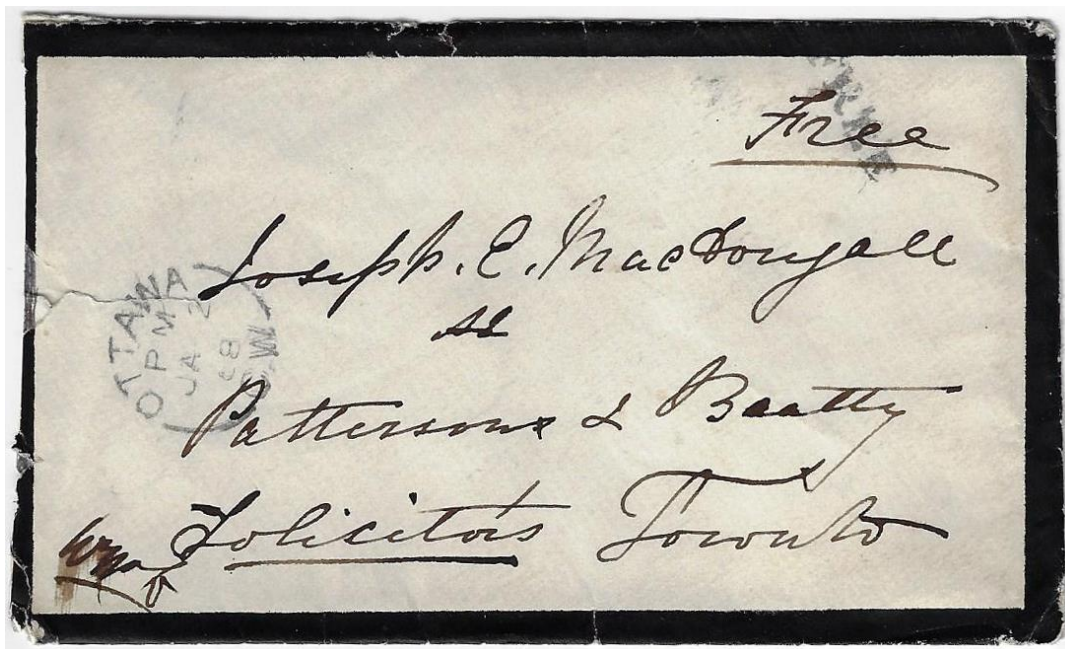
Item 540-01 – **Newfoundland 6¢ QV 35 to England** – 1873, NFLD 6¢ Queen Victoria (35) tied by circular device on cover from St. John's paying 6¢ letter rate to England (York b/s). Paid Liverpool British Packet 30 MY 73. \$200.00



Item 540-02 – **Brand Bank NFLD registered to U.S.** – 1897, NFLD 2¢ Codfish (2, slightly sulfurized), 6¢ Logging tied by oval grid cancel on cover from Brand Bank Newfoundland paying 10¢ registered letter rate to U.S. Coastal TPO, Boston and Utica (b/s). 48 (2), 66. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 540-03 – **James Cox Aikins (Manitoba)** – 1881, free franked cover from Ottawa (*duplex cancel FREE*) signed by James Cox Aikins to his son in Winnipeg. Waxseal. James Cox Aikins (1823-1904) was a Canadian politician for Peel County, served as a cabinet minister in the government of John A. Macdonald, Secretary of State, Senator and was the 4th Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba and Keewatin. His son, Sir James Albert Manning Aikins, represented Brandon in the House and later was also appointed Lt-Gov of Manitoba. \$200.00



Item 540-04 – **William McDougall (Father of Confederation)** – 1868, free franked mourning cover from Ottawa signed by William McDougall MP, Father of Confederation, to a relative in Toronto. Initialed WmCD. McDougall was one of the founding members, along with George Brown of the Clear Grit Party. He participated in the Charlottetown Conference of 1864. Later he parted ways with Brown and joined John A. Macdonald's first cabinet as Minister of Public Works. After negotiating the acquisition of Rupert's Land from the Hudson's Bay Company, he accepted the appointment of Lt-Gov of Rupert's Land and the NW Territories. His tenure began disastrously as he was refused entry into the territory of Louis Riel at Pembina. His handling of this fiasco and the subsequent Red River Rebellion ruined his political career. \$350.00



Item 540-05 – **Gideon Ouimet (Beauharnois)** – 1867, 5c Beaver cancelled by grid cancel on Attorney General / Procureur General Prov of Quebec cover paying 5c letter rate to Ottawa. Signed by Gideon Ouimet initialed Atty GI G.O., riding Beauharnois and soon the Premier of Quebec 1873-1874. Ouimet represented Beauharnois in the Legislative Assembly 1857-1861 and then Two Mountains 1867-1875. He was Attorney-General in the Chauveau Administration 1867-1873 and then he became Premier. \$300.00



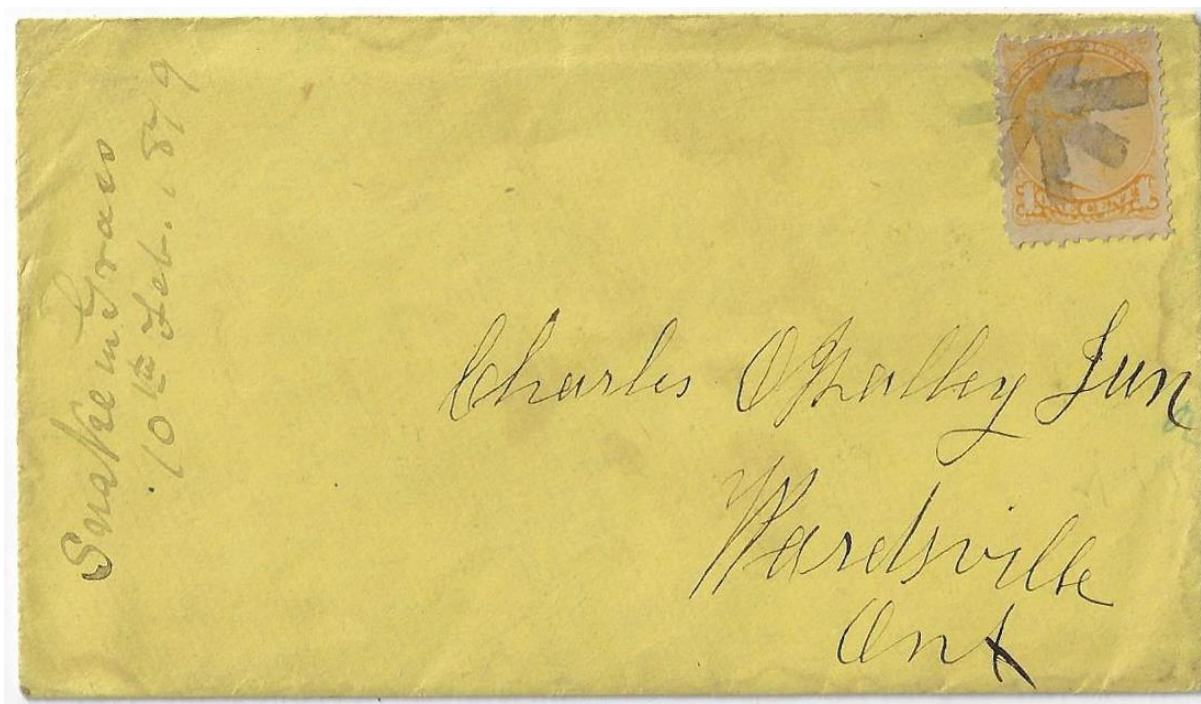

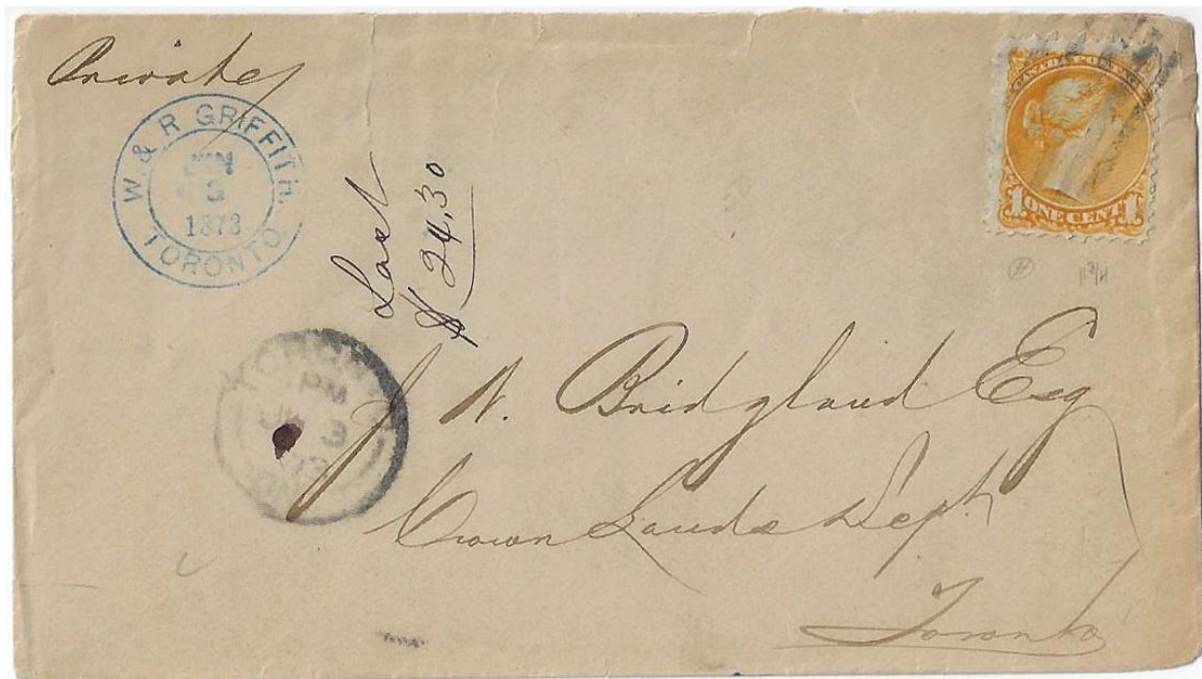
Item 540-07 – **10¢ Vittoria CW to Illinois**– 1862, 5¢ Beaver (2 singles, Whitworth plate flat No.25a, dots and scratch) tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Vittoria CW paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Illinois. Simcoe and Paris D.P.O. transit (b/s). Light stain UL. \$125.00



Item 540-08 – **2¢ Large Queen, 3¢ SQ indian red** – 1871, 2¢ LQ, 3¢ SQ indian red (*a spectacular shade*) tied by Two-ring 54 cancel on cover, dated 27 DE 1871, from Truro N.S. paying 5¢ registered letter to Acadia Coal Mines, Picton (faint Stellarton b/s). Registered Letter No. ___ handstamp in red. Very rounded cover corner lower right but still a fine and attractive mixed Large Queen Small Queen cover. Ex Session and Ex Jansen. \$400.00



Item 540-09 – **Flower or radial fancy cancel** – 1879, 1¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Wardsville (b/s). Perhaps from Woodstock or Petrolea. \$75.00



Item 540-10 – 1¢ SQ yellow orange perf 11.85 – 1873, 1¢ SQ (yellow orange, perf 11.85) tied by large barred device cancel on cover from Toronto, W & R Griffith c/c, paying 1¢ drop letter rate. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 540-11 – 1¢ SQ deep orange, fancy cancel – 1871, 1¢ SQ (deep orange, perf 11.9) tied by fancy cancel on cover from Toronto paying 1¢ printed matter rate to local. Redirected to Milton (b/s). Reduced at left. \$75.00

The market has been inactive with small offerings and rather weak prices.

STOCKS IN STORE, AUG. 26.

Flour, 3,850 barrels; fall wheat 10,269 bushels; spring wheat 13,842; oats, 14,910; barley, 63,617; peas, nil; rye nil; corn, 400.

GRAIN IN SIGHT, AUGUST 17.

Wheat, 7,740,000 bushels, and barley 1,105,000 against 2,997,000 of wheat, and 246,000 of barley in 1877.

ENGLISH ADVICES.

Cable advices report supplies for the week ending on the 17th inst., to have been about 50,000 quarters below the average consumption, and the quantity of wheat and flour afloat for the United Kingdom on the 22nd inst. 1,059,000

WHEAT.—Has been inactive by reason of scarcity. No. 2 fall sold last week at \$1 04 f.o.c. No. 3 brought \$1 on Tuesday. Spring has been inactive and offering lower; a single car of No. 2 sold yesterday at \$1 03 f.o.c. On street fall sold at 90 to \$1 03, and spring at 95 to \$1 03.

OATS.—Seem easier; new Canadian on track have sold at 30 and 30½c, and American to arrive have been offered at 30c. Street prices 34 to 35c.

BARLEY.—There were sales of old No. 1 in carlots at \$1 to \$1 04 f.o.c. last week and on Monday; of old No. 2 at 85c. on Saturday, and of No. 3 at 65c. on Thursday, f.o.c. Of late the market has been inactive, the only sale reported being two cars of No. 1 on Tuesday at \$1 02 f.o.c. The value of this grade seemed unchanged yesterday; and No. 2 was offered as low as 85c. Nothing doing in new. Street prices yesterday 62 to 79c.

PEAS.—Have sold on the street at 60c. for old and 64c. for new; but no cars or round lots offering.

The letter relates to a parcel of cigarettes that was not delivered because the addressee was reported a casualty. Sgt Wright F.H.R. R-79316. An officer has been assigned to the distribution to other members. This letter shows another aspect of the wartime tobacco and cigarette support and would make a great addition to any cigarette thank you card collection. \$150.00 **SOLD**
