Endorsed <u>via New York and by California</u>. 5¢ collect. Carried by Great Western Railway (b/s) and via Montreal (b/s). Then travelled overland from New York to San Francisco and then by steamer. Crayon 5 denoting charge for letter into colony. Docketing notes indicate rec'd 9 Jan 61. A journey of 63 days. A very scarce double cross border cover! \$650.00 **SOLD** 



Item 541-02 – **Quebec to New Westminster – British Columbia Colony** – 1860, stampless mourning cover from Quebec LC paid 15¢ to New Westminster B.C. Endorsed via New York / California. Faint 5¢ collect. Carried by Great Western Railway (b/s) and via Montreal (b/s). Then by Grand Trunk Railway with Mon. & Kings GD. TRK. R.W. Post Office A No.2 (Gray QC-190). Overland from New York to San Francisco and then by steamer to B.C. Docketing notes indicate rec'd 22 Nov 60. A journey of 47 days. A lovely mate to the above cover. Ex Jack Wallace (2014). \$750.00

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



Item 541-29 – **Buffalo to Niagara with 2d ferriage** – 1839, 2-page legal size family folded letter from Buffalo to Niagara Upper Canada. Rated US 10¢ converted to 6d plus 2d total 8. On 6 March 1837, the rates for ferriage between Canadian and American border transfer offices ended. However, cross border mail directed to one of these exchange offices or close to border, but not further, was assessed an amount equal to the former ferriage rate. A very unusual cross border letter. \$350.00

Item 541-30 – <u>4<sup>1</sup>/2d across the lake rate to U.S.</u> – 1849 (July 19), stampless cover from Toronto to Cambridge Massachusetts paid 4<sup>1</sup>/2d to border and 10¢ US collect to destination. The cover was carried by Lake Ontario steamboat and exchanged at Queenston and Lewiston. The mail between Toronto and Queenston around the lake was 93 miles and 7d, during the summer months, the mail could be carried by steamboat across the lake and the distance was considered less than 60 miles and 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d , actually 47 miles. The cover is endorsed "Pressé" (urgent), annotated Clarence Wells, addressed to Harvard to Arnold Guyot care of Professor Agassiz. The Swiss biolosts, geographers, geologists who developed the Glacial Theory and early pioneers of past global climate and sea level change. Ex Earl Palmer. \$400.00 **SOLD** 

Jean Louis Rodolphe Agassiz (1807-1873) was a Swiss-born American biologist and geologist who is recognized as a scholar of Earth's natural history. He emigrated to the United States in 1847 after visiting Harvard University. He went on to become professor of zoology and geology at Harvard, to head its Lawrence Scientific School, and to found its Museum of Comparative Zoology. He is particularly known for his contributions to ichthyological classification, including of extinct species such as megalodon, and to the study of historical geology, including the founding of glaciology. **Arnold Henry Guyot (1807-1884)** was a Swiss-American geologist and geographer. In 1848, he settled in Cambridge, Massachusetts and worked at the Lowell Institute. For several years the Massachusetts Board of Education retained his services as a lecturer on geography and methods of instruction to the normal schools and teachers' institutes. As professor of physical geography and geology at Princeton University. He is the namesake of several geographical features, including Guyot Glacier in Alaska, The Guyot Crater, Mount Guyot on the North Carolina and Tennessee border, a Mount Guyot in New Hampshire, a Mount Guyot on the Rocky Mountain Continental Divide in Colorado, as well as a Mount Guyot just southwest of Mt. Whitney, in California. The building housing the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and the Department of Geosciences at Princeton is named Guyot Hall in his honor. (*source Wiki*)

Per ardua ad astra is a Latin phrase meaning "through adversity to the stars or through struggle to the stars that is the official motto of the Royal Air Force and other Commonwealth air forces such as the Royal Australian Air Force and Royal New Zealand Air Force, as well as the Royal Indian Air Force until 1947. The Royal Canadian Air Force used it until 1968, when it adopted the motto sic itur ad astra, a similar phrase meaning "such is the pathway to the stars". It dates from 1912, when it was adopted by the newly formed Royal Flying Corps.




