










Item 542-01 – Newfoundland 1¢ hand drawn postcard – c1873, 1¢ hand drawn postcard in greenish ink on thich card reverse with notation reading "copy of the design of the NFLD postcard, without the groundwork, by W.G. McMillan, London, 104 Jermyn St. London S.W". Undated. A seldom encountered item, contemporary and maybe a unique collateral. For sure a great item for the advanced Newfoundland collector and for an exhibit title page. \$500.00





Item 542-02 – Newfoundland stationery L1 complete reply letter card – c1913, Newfoundland reply letter card, unused, printed by De la Rue & Co. on thick bluish-grey paper, 2¢ carmine and 2¢ carmine attached. \$200.00 SOLD





Simcoe County. A very scarce and appealing mixed Jubilee Leaf usage!!! \$350.00



Item 542-28 – <u>Shortpaid to The Netherlands, dues refused</u> – 1911, 2¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on cover from Sackville NB shortpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to The Netherlands (b/s 1 10 11). T30 and charged 15 in Rotterdam. Refused and returned to Sackville (b/s OC 12 11). \$250.00





Item 542-29 – **20¢ Quebec Tercentenary** – 1908, 20¢ Quebec tied by St. John NB International machine cancel on The Royal Hotel embossed advertising cover, reduced at foot and backflap off, to Glenside Pennsylvania (b/s). \$850.00 **SOLD**




Item 542-30 – <u>Levis Camp Que</u> – 1914, 1¢ Admiral tied by three undated FPO Militia Levis Camp strikes on postcard paying 1¢ PC rate to Canterbury (b/s JU 15 14). \$350.00



Item 542-31 – Farnham Camp Que – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by FPO Militia Farnham Camp cds, AM JUN 22 11, on postcard paying 1¢ PC rate to Mansonville. The sender was probably serving with one of the Cavalry unit "...I have got a good horse to ride". The camp opened on April 4 1910, this hammer was proofed in early June 1911. \$350.00




Item 542-32 – <u>The earliest recorded Sussex Camp NB</u> – 1911, 1¢ Edward (pre-affixing fault) tied by FPO Militia Sussex Camp on postcard paying 1¢ PC rate to Wakefield Centre N.B. This is the <u>earliest recorded date</u> according to Campbell. JUN 22 11 \$200.00



Item 542-33 – <u>Vernon Camp BC</u> – 1915, 2¢ Admiral booklet stamp, gum toned perfs, tied by FPO Militia Vernon Camp cds on Kalamalka Lake BC real photo postcard paying 2¢ PC rate to Victoria. \$100.00







Item 542-36 – The rare - first Camp Borden International machine – 1916, 2¢ Admiral tied by Camp Borden Ont International machine cancel (*time mark omitted*) on RPPC to Vigo Ont. Corner fault. This is a very early Camp Borden postmark, only a few days after the opening. This postmark is recorded for 16 days only from 1916-07-18 to 1916-08-03. Universal replacement machine first recorded use is 1916-08-06. A great item for the specialist. \$150.00

Brockville & Ottawa RPO and Tor & Mont GTR (b/s). The letter is from Pte Arthur Willianson, 536062, Field Ambulance Depot, Canadian Army Medical Corps, Military District No.3. He writes to his mother because he had no news and is wondering if she is still ill of his enlistment, he sends money for aunt surgery and has a Freemason meeting later in the month. He tried to convince his mother that he will not be killed. \$375.00






Item 542-47 – <u>Henryville LC – Henryville Volunteers</u> – 1842, On Her Majesty Service folded cover with letter from Henryville LC rated 1/4 collect to Hamilton. The letter is from John E.V. Grojan, Company Commander of the 1st Boot Regiment in the Henryville Volunteers (1837-1843). The letter is addressed to Lieutenant Colonel William Gourlay commanding the 4th Regiment of the Gore Militia (*in command after MacNab's retirement in 1841*). It relates to the challenge of enlisting non-commissioned officers etc. \$375.00



Item 542-48 – <u>St. John's LC</u> – 1832, lawyer folded letter from St. John's LC paid 4½d to Montreal. 1829 type struck in red with ma date March 20 1832. The letter is signed by William Towner, addressed to Thomas Nye and relates to a bailiff and court order. An exhibit piece! \$250.00



Item $542-49 - \underline{\text{Nicolet LC}} - 1841$, folded letter from Nicolet LC rated 3/9 collect paying the quintuple weight rate to Montreal (5x9d). The letter is signed by G.L. Master and relates to a report and return to chief agent for emigration (report no longer present). Slight separation and a great Nicolet strike. \$125.00



Item 542-50 -Phillipsburg LC – 1833, lawyer folded letter from Phillipsburg LC rated $4\frac{1}{2}$ d collect to Montreal. The letter is from E. Gerrish to Thomas Nye and relates to a summons and a land dispute. \$125.00



Item 542-51 – <u>River du Loup LC (Maskinongé County)</u> – 1844, folded cover from River du Loup LC rated 7d collect to Montreal. 1829 type struck in black with ms OC 6 44. Choice! \$200.00



Item 542-52 – <u>Isle aux Noix LC</u> – 1842, folded letter from Isle aux Noix LC to Quebec with 1829 type struck in red and manuscript date 5 DE 42. The letter is from Edward Roden to James Hastings Kerr and is an appointment of attorney giving the authority to act and make decisions on his behalf. Internal archivist tape, otherwise, a very pretty cover. \$250.00



Item 542-53 – <u>St. Charles LC (St. Hyacinthe County)</u> – 1832, folded cover from St. Charles LC paid 4½d to Montreal. Endorsed "*Très Pressé*" and blurred "Paid" upper right. An outstanding St. Charles 1829 type in red, manuscript date 22 NO 32. A showpiece. \$350.00



Item 542-54 - April 3 1868 - Franktown CW hammer B - 1868, stampless cover from Franktown CW (Lanark County) 5¢ collect to Ottawa (b/s). This is the latest recorded date for the hammer B (the 3^{rd} Franktown hammer) and a very early April 3 68 Large Queen era cover with letter rate down to 3¢ and unpaid letter down to 5¢. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 542-55 – Thornhill UC – Niagara Paid to New York belt-buckle – 1830, lengthy folded letter from Thornhill UC (York County) dated 28 Aug 1830 to Bristol England where redirected Bridgewater and then to Wells. Paid 11d Currency to the lines, including ferriage, paid 1/3 converted 25¢ US postage prepaid as indicated by Niagara Paid to New York belt-buckle. On arrival in Liverpool, Ship Letter Liverpool b/s, charged 8d ship letter fee plus 11d Stg inland postage total 1/7. This is the 2nd recorded example of this Thornhill UC double circle and the LRD (the next record is 14 years later). The Niagara Paid to New York belt-buckle is recorded for 1829 and 1830 only. The Niagara double circle with outer circle doubled with type set is the hammer VII. A rarity! Ex Montgomery and Rixon. \$1,500.00



Item 542-56 – <u>Tyrconnel UC (recorded for 1 year, Elgin)</u> – 1847, folded letter from Tyrconnel UC (*Elgin County, first hammer one L, 1847-1848 and the earliest recorded date*) paid 7d, mailed too late to Dawn Mills (b/s) via London (b/s). Very scarce. \$250.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 542-57 – <u>Wallacetown UC (Elgin County)</u> – 1855, folded letter datelined Dunwich (the township) 5 Feb 1855, mailed in Wallacetown UC paid 3d to St. Thomas. The letter is from Duncan McTavish to Henry Black the Treasurer of Elgin County. Very pretty. \$125.00





Item 542-58 – <u>Iona UC Money Letter</u> – 1854, folded money letter from Iona UC (Elgin County, datelined Southwold Iona SE 23 54) paid 3 to Toronto (b/s). Routed via St. Thomas and London (b/s). The letter is from Charles Treble to the Chief Superintendent of Crown Lands. It relates to an order of maps of Upper and Lower Canada and the request to send them by express train to London. Enclosed was 1 pound 5 shillings. A late Money Letter a few months before the inception of the registry system (May 1, 1855). Ex Graham, Rixon. \$150.00 SOLD





Item 542-59 - London to Port Stanley - 1847, folded letter from London UC rated 4%d collect to Port Stanley (b/s, manuscript date). The letter is from Mac Lellan & Co. and relates to insurance on properties. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 542-60 – <u>Burwell brothers – Port Burwell UC</u> – 1851, business folded letter between two Burwell brothers, sons of the surveyor, militia officer and politician Mahlon Burwell, from Port Burwell UC paid 3d to Brantford (b/s). This is the Port Burwell UC 2nd handstamp 28.5mm. Italic "Paid". The letter discuss business with a Rochester NY company. Ex Graham. \$85.00 SOLD



Item 542-61 – <u>Straffordville UC (Elgin)</u> – 1867, stampless cover from Straffordville UC 7¢ collect to Dereham (b/s 1841-1848). Ex Lussey. \$85.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 542-62 – <u>St. Mary's Blanchard CW</u> – 1849, certificate of Magistrate swearing in John Haw of Blanshard Twp, in the Huron District, by John Sparling, from St. Mary's Blanchard CW rated 4½d to Goderich (b/s) via Stratford (b/s). Note misspelling of Blanshard which continues on the next handstamp. This hammer is recorded from 1849 to 1852. Very scarce. Ex Rixon. \$125.00



Item 542-63 -St. Mary's Blanchard CW -1854, stampless cover from St. Mary's Blanchard UC 3d collect to Stratford (b/s). Interestingly, the CW hammer was in use first and the UC hammer 2^{nd} . Filing fold. \$125.00 SOLD



Item 542-64 – <u>St. Mary's Blanchard registered</u> – 1859, folded registered cover from St. Mary's Blanchard UC paid 3d Stratford (faint Ruggles b/s) with 1d registry fee paid in cash. Letter relates to money. An exhibit quality cover! \$200.00 SOLD



Item 542-65 – <u>St. Mary's CW (January 4 1870)</u> – 1870, Court of Perth County stampless cover from St. Mary's CW 5¢ collect to Milton . A key date Small Queen era cover! \$250.00

The letter is from William Hall and William Silk to Fowler Budd about the 20 settlers in the surveyed and unsurveyed concessions of the township, a roll for future election with 20 settler families is listed. Peel County. \$250.00



Item 542-69 – <u>Streetsville UC Postmaster free</u> – 1841, Postmaster free franked folded letter from Streetsville UC, double circle and free handstamp struck in blue, signed by W.H. Paterson P.M., to Toronto. This postmark is the latest recorded date and is known from 1840 to 1841 only. Peel County. \$350.00



Item 542-70 – <u>Albion UC double circle (The only recorded copy)</u> – 1845, folded cover from Albion UC, double circle in blackm oily, ms date in red ink, paid 7d to Newmarket (b/s). This is the only recorded examples. A scarce Peel County office, closed in 1893. \$275.00
