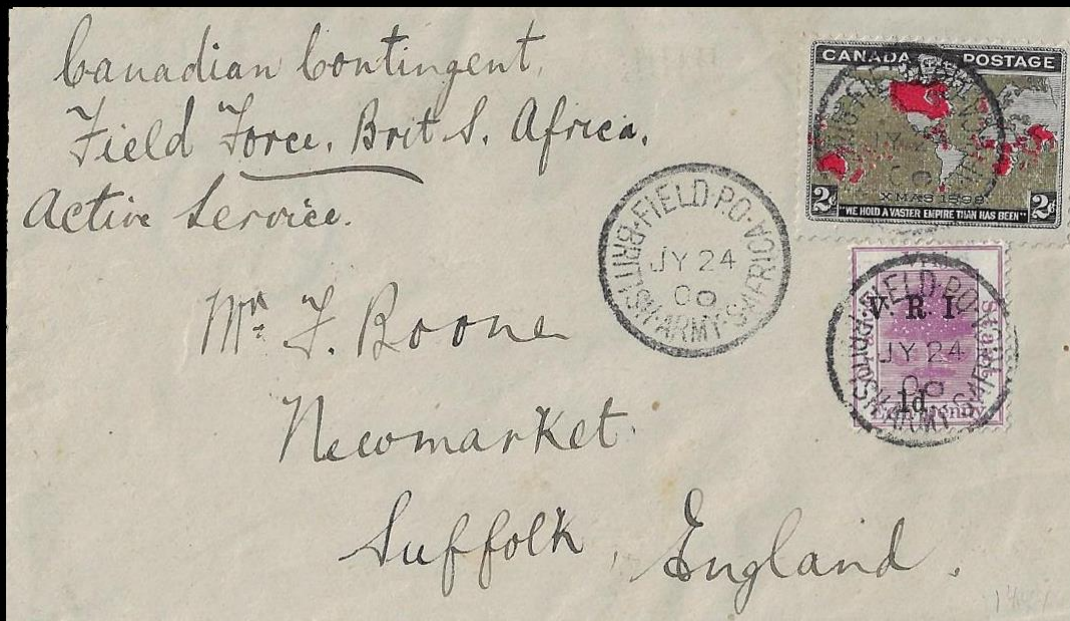

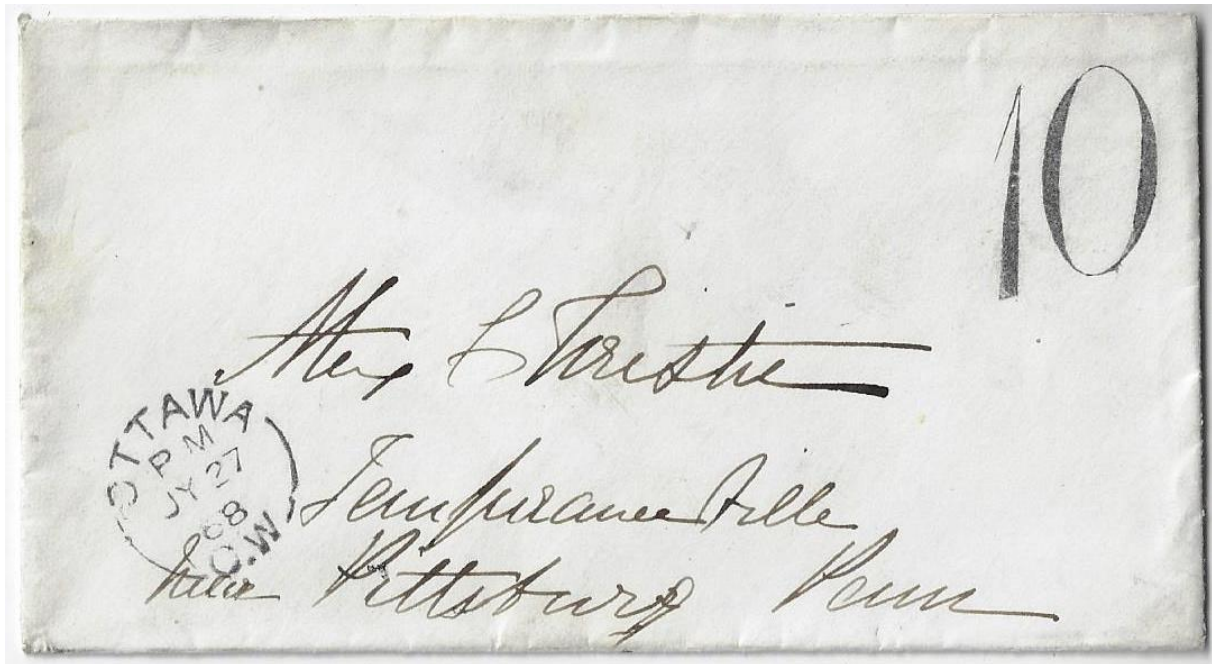

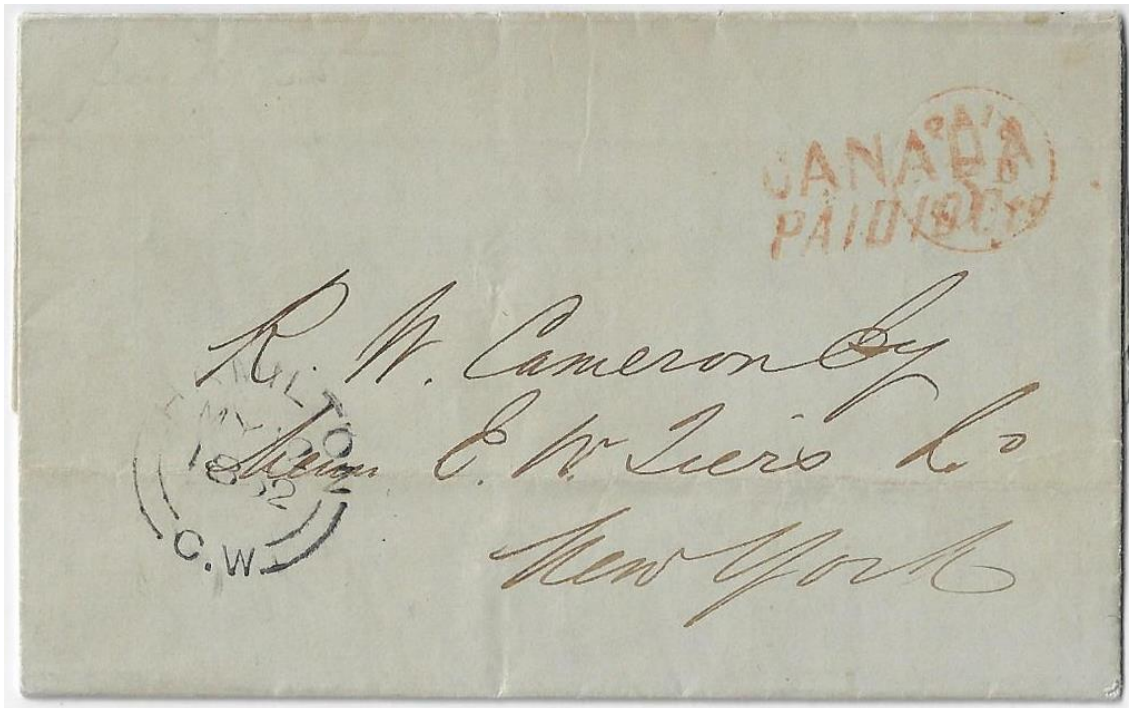

Item 545-01 – **Ottawa mailed unpaid to U.S.** – 1868, stampless cover from Ottawa CW, JY 27 68, rated 10¢ collect to Pittsburgh. Complete prepayment was required on all mail to U.S.. Unpaid or partially paid letters were ignored and charged 10¢ due to the addressee. Exhibit quality. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 545-02 – **Cobourg to U.S. 1/6 to charge box account** – 1850, Bank of Montreal folded letter from Cobourg to New York. Paid 1/6 (double 9d) to the lines, charged to box account. Exchanged in Queenston (b/s) and Lewiston and then rated 20¢ US collect in New York., \$75.00



Item 545-03 – **The tiny Hamilton Paid 3d** – 1852, lengthy folded letter from Hamilton with the tiny Paid 3 (*the earliest recorded date*), mistakenly applied to cross border letter then struck out by a Canada Paid 10 Cts handstamp, paying the cross letter rate to New York. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 545-04 – **St. Thomas to New York** – 1850, folded cover from St. Thomas to New York paid 9d to the line and rated 10¢ US collect in New York. Routed via London and Hamilton (b/s) and exchange in Queenston (b/s) and Lewiston. \$50.00



Item 545-05 – **Buffalo to Toronto** – 1851, stampless cover from Buffalo NY paid 10¢ paying the letter rate to Toronto (b/s SP 10 1851) with oval Buffalo, Paid, Ud.States in arc exchange marking and 10 Cents in black. \$100.00



Item 545-06 – **Bytown to New Hampshire via Ogdensburg** – 1854, tiny lady cover from Bytown UC paid 6d paying the letter rate to New Hampshire. Routed via Prescott (b/s) and exchanged in Ogdensburg with Canada 10. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 545-07 – **Brooklyn NY to Guelph redirected to Goderich** – 1852, folded cover from Brooklyn NY rated 10¢ to Guelph (b/s), Exchanged in Lewiston and Queenston (b/s) with Ud States arc and 6d. Once in Guelph, forwarded to Goderich (b/s). \$100.00 **SOLD**

MONTREAL, JULY 5, 1837.

WE have nothing new to notice in regard to any branch of trade. The operations of the last week have been limited in most articles, to mere retail, and lower prices for imports would be generally submitted to, if, by doing so, sales to any extent could be effected. The quantity of Produce which has arrived from Upper Canada is light. The Banks are discounting pretty freely, and money continues tolerably plenty, upon unexceptionable paper.  
ASHEA.—Until yesterday, sales were made without difficulty, at last week's quotations; both sorts are, however, now very dull. Small bills of Pots were procurable yesterday at 26s 3d, and shipping parcels might have been had at 26s 6d @ 26s 9d, cash. In Pearls, there is very little doing, at our quotations. The following is a comparative statement of the stocks here, on the 30th June of the present and last years:—

WHEAT AND FLOUR.—There is not the slightest alteration in Flour since last week. U. C. Fine is almost unsaleable, still holders of good brands are firm in demanding 42s 6d 4/4 barrel. There has been some enquiry for re-shipment to Upper Canada, but we have not heard of any business being done. Country unpacked Flour (*farine entiere*) is selling at 30s, and City Mills at 21s 6d 4/4 quintal. There have been several further arrivals of Foreign Wheat since our last, and a brisk demand has existed for almost all qualities. The country people are taking considerable parcels of the inferior kinds, at 3s 3d @ 6s 6d 4/4 minot, and good fresh Dantzic has commanded 7s 4d, cash, @ 7s 6d, 9d lays. The sales of the week are about 12,000 bushels. Oats are dearer—for ordinary Canadian 3s is demanded on the market, and Dantzic, weighing 42 lbs 4/4 minot, which were sold last week at 2s 10d, are now held at 3s 3d 4/4 minot. Sales of Foreign Barley have been made at 5s 4/4 minot.

WEST INDIA PRODUCE.—We have not heard of a single wholesale transaction worthy of notice during the last week. To effect sales either of Rum or Sugar, of any magnitude, a reduction upon our quotations would have to be made.

PROVISIONS.—In consequence of the improvement in the New York market, and the scanty supplies that are coming in, holders of Pork have shown more firmness during the past week, and higher prices are generally demanded, but no advance upon our quotations, on the usual terms, has hitherto been realised. Beef is very heavy of sale, and our subjoined quotations may be regarded as the extreme rates. U. C. Butter (new) is offered at 7 1/2d, in kegs.

TOBACCO.—We have had some arrivals of Upper Canada Leaf—a few small sales of *new* have been made at 41d, and for *old* 41d per lb, is demanded.

TEA.—Although the market is far from being overstocked, a languid demand is experienced for every description—Twankay moves off slowly at 2s 4d @ 2s 5d. The principal holders anticipate an improvement in prices in the fall, as the high rate of Exchange will increase very materially the cost of future importations.

SALT.—For a cargo of Lisbon, 1s 10d per minot (float) has been accepted; the same article is retailing in store at 2s 2d @ 2s 3d. For Liverpool, there is a good demand, and, at auction, 1s 7d per minot has been obtained.

EXCHANGE.—Bills on England are not so scarce as last week, but whatever good paper is offered, is eagerly taken, and the rate has advanced to 20 201, at which a good many negotiations have been made. Sovereigns are selling at 27s 2d @ 27s 3d, and American Half Dollars at 8 @ 9 prem. Bank Drafts on New York 3, and Private 3 per cent premium, 3 days sight.

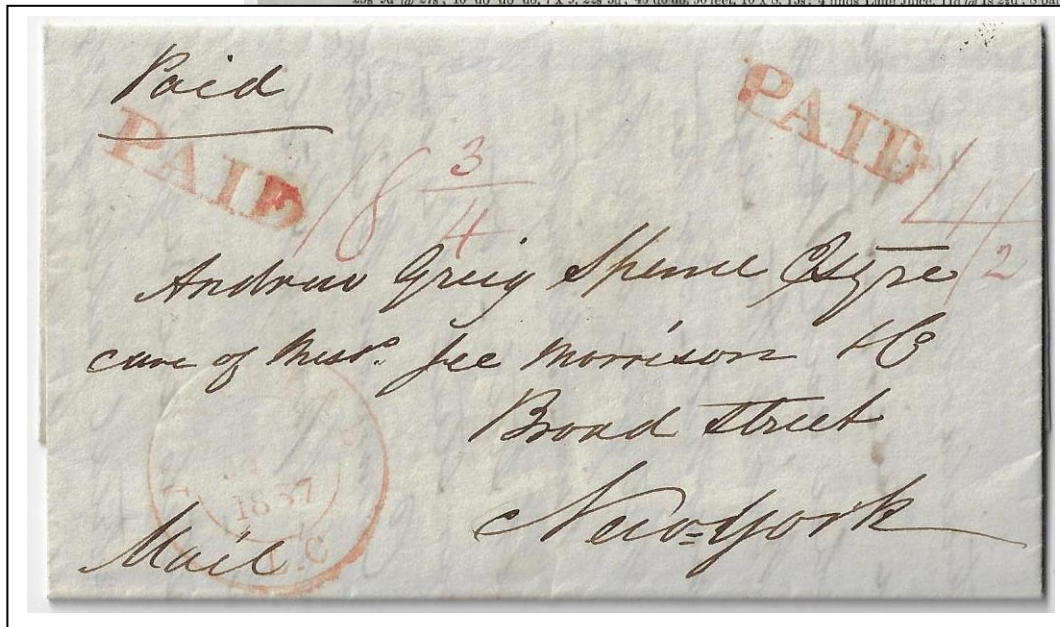

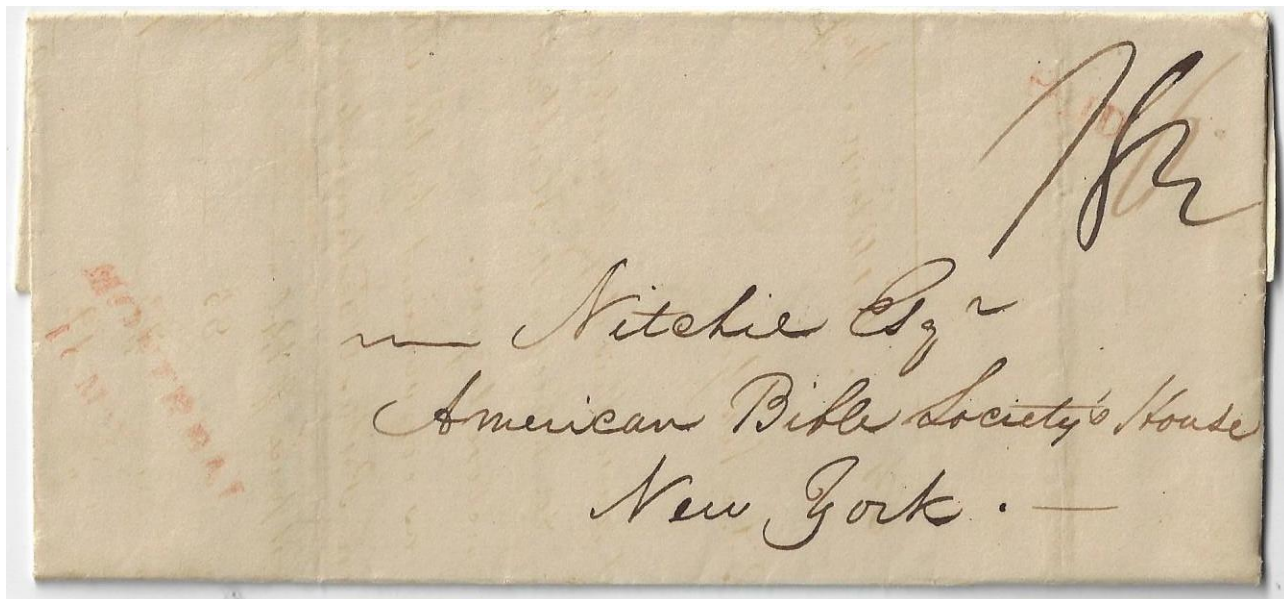

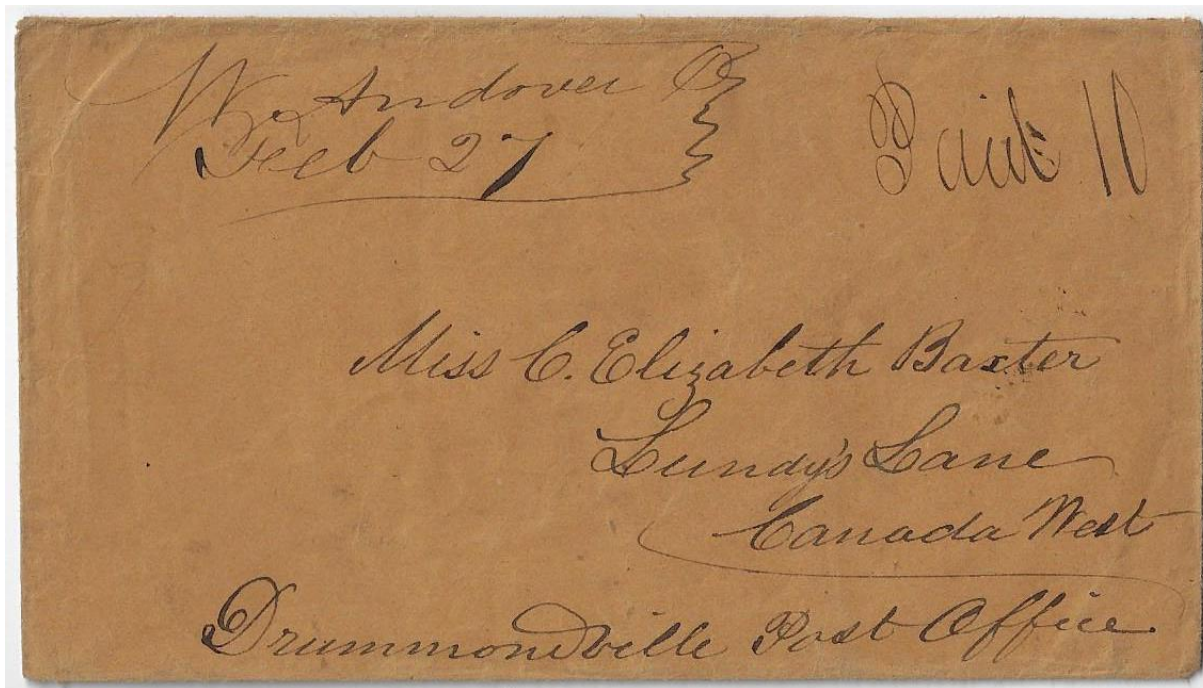
Item 545-08 – **Montreal - Dunscomb merchants prices current** – 1837, partly printed partly written letter from Montreal fully prepaid to New York. Paid 4 1/2d and Paid 18 3/4c. The letter is from W. Dunscomb, merchant and political figure in Lower Canada. John William Dunscomb (1804-1891) was a Newfoundlander, moved to Lower Canada and served in the Legislative Assembly. He was the author of Provincial laws of the Customs and Canadian Custom House Guide published in 1844. \$300.00



Item 545-09 – **Montreal straight line type XIV in red** – 1828, folded letter from Montreal to New York, paid 6d to the lines and 18¾¢ collect in New York. The letter is from the Montreal Bible Society forwarding a resolution of thanks to the American Bible Society for the liberal donation of 500 testaments. A very scarce Montreal S/L type 14, dated 16 MAY 1828, struck in red and on front. \$175.00

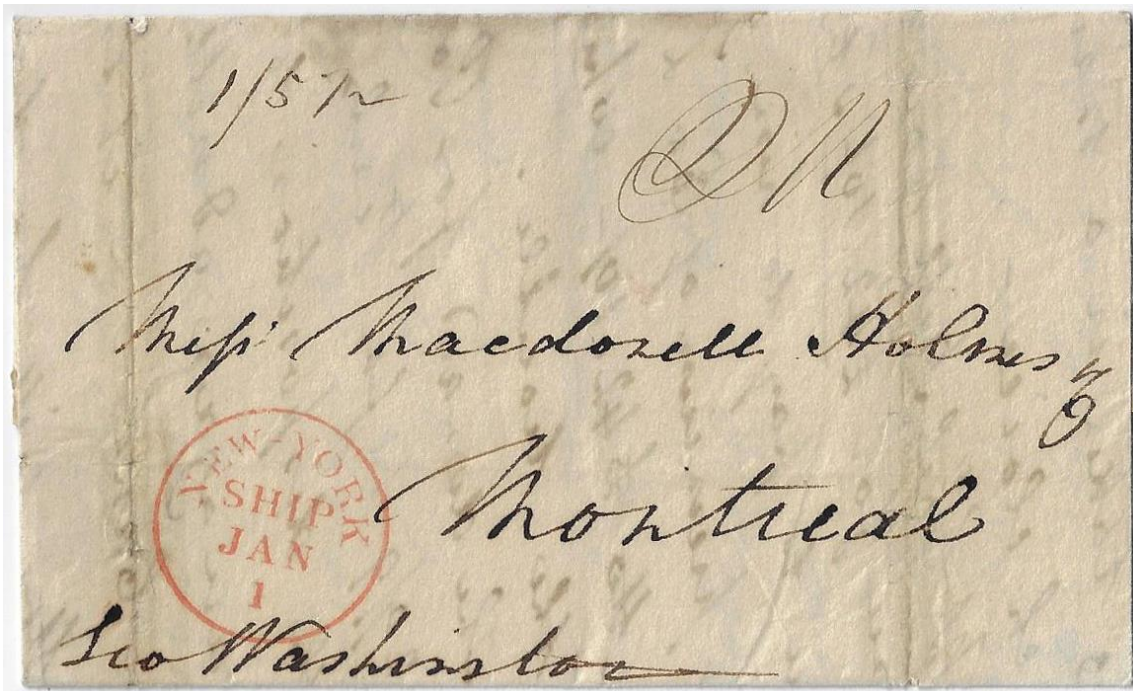
