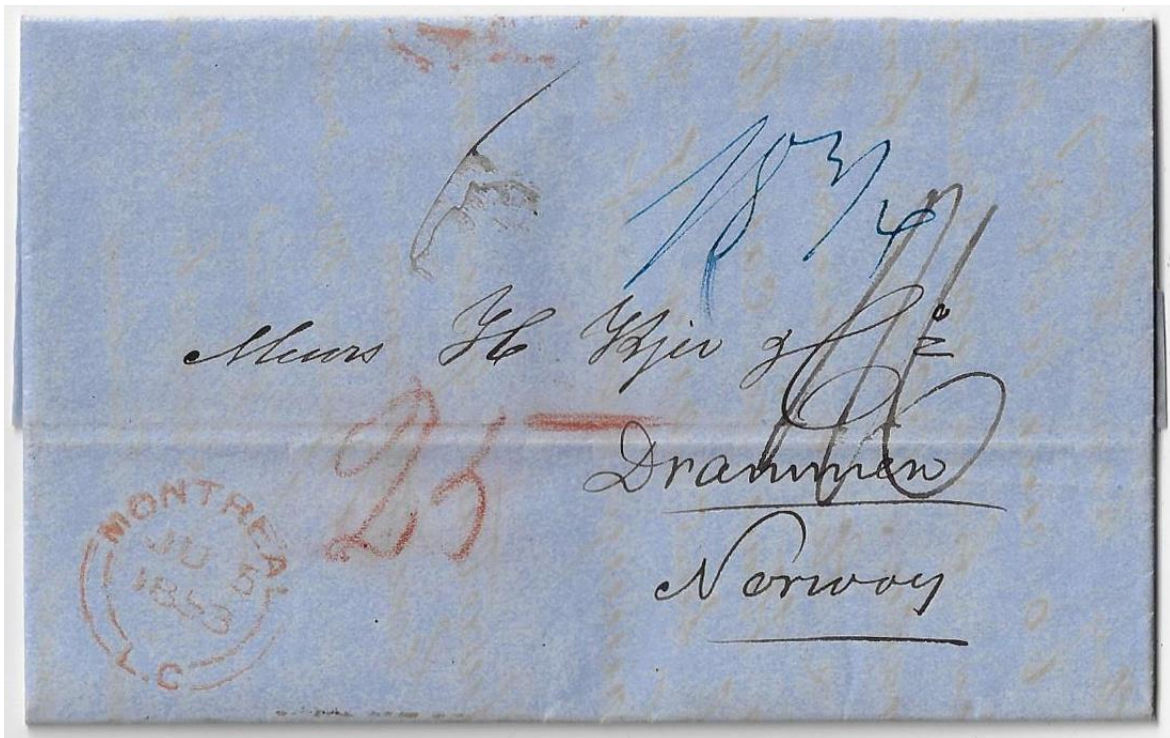
Item 546-01 – **Quebec 1d soldier's concession rate** – 1847, family folded letter from Quebec LC with Paid at Quebec crown 1d paying 1d soldiers concession letter rate to Paisley North Britain (b/s). Properly countersigned at left by commanding officer. The letter is from Cpl John Strong, 1st Battery Royal Artillery in garrison at Quebec. Carried by Cunard Cambria 12th voyage via Halifax. Soldier's letters were not prepaid the U.S. transit rate via Boston and were therefore routed overland via Halifax. Some separations and aging. \$650.00



Item 546-02 – **Montreal 1d soldier's concession rate** – 1840, folded letter from Montreal rated P1 indicating prepaid 1d paying 1d soldiers concession rate to Kingston UC. The letter is from Sergeant J. Wallace, 66th Regiment, countersigned by Lt Colonel M. Johnson the Commanding Officer. The letter relates to a mortgage being transferred to Wallace through the British North America Bank. Concession rate letters from Montreal are exceedingly rare. \$750.00



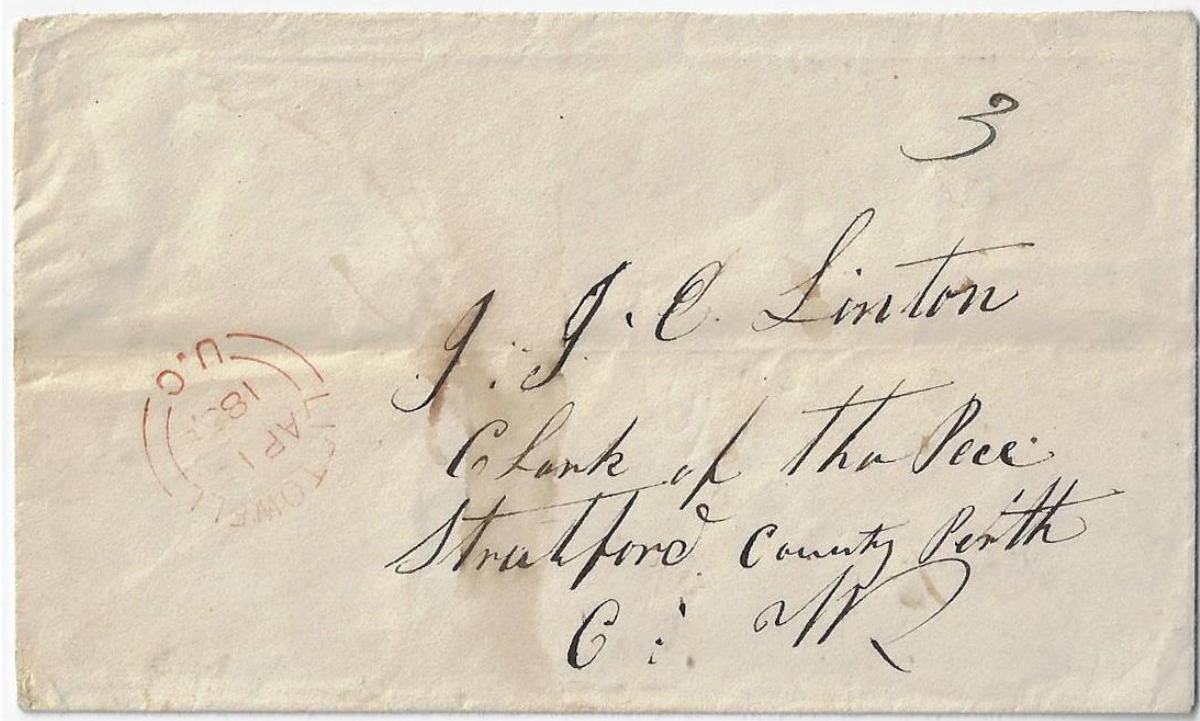
Item 546-03 - **Arched Toronto steamboat** – 1846, lower part of folded letter possibly from Belleville or Cobourg or Kingston rated 11½d collect to Guelph via Toronto and Hamilton. Carried on board steamer to Toronto where datestamped (NO 24 46) with Toronto arched "STEAM BOAT" handstamp. A lovely example of a pre-conductor steamboat marking, on the Lake Ontario Toronto Kingston route, before Post Office conductors were put on-board permanently in Sept 1847. Portion of letter off however with outer sheet intact. A very elusive arched steamboat marking. \$450.00



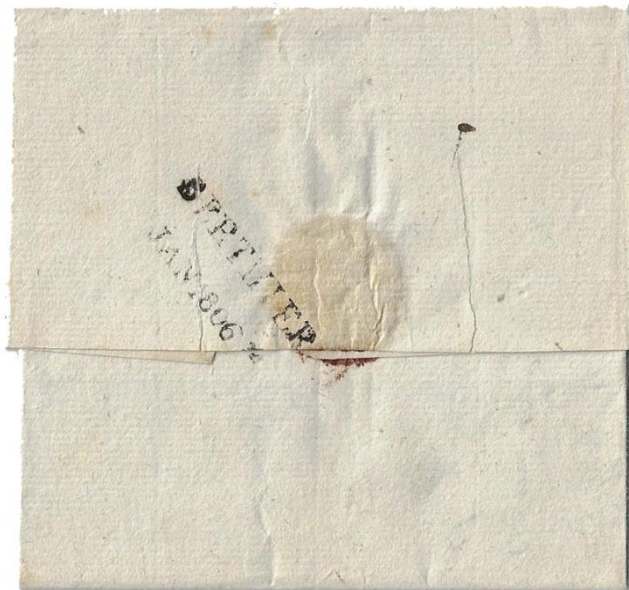
Item 546-04 – **Quebec to Drammen, Norway** - 1853, business folded letter from Quebec to Norway. Entered the mail at Montreal JU 5 53. Carried by Cunard Europa 36th voyage from Boston to Liverpool. Mailed unpaid rated 1/6 including 2d US transit fee. Sent to London and Forwarded to Hamburg through France and to Germany rated 18¾. Carried by a private steamship company from Hamburg to Drammen on the Skagerrak, Oslofjord and Drammensfjord rated 25 Skilling due. Reverse with ms "70" and Hamburg (b/s). A very pretty 3-page business letter listing vessels and rates through Belfast, Falmouth and Liverpool. An exceedingly rare Pence era stampless. \$3,000.00



Item 546-05 – **Rome Italy to Boucherville CE** - 1864, folded letter signed De Lery from Rome Italy to Boucherville CE (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). The letter is written in French on mourning paper and relates to photography, money and banking. Rated 1/, 1/5 and 37¢ collect with Anglo French accountancy marking FR 3F 76c. VDL fig 1290. Pretty and a rare Decimal issue letter incoming to Canada. A very scarce Boucherville postal history item! \$750.00



Item 546-06 – **Two Ruggles Stratford and Allansville CW** – 1858, stampless cover from Listowell UC (22mm hammer which is the earliest recorded date) rated 3d collect to Stratford via Allansville and Berlin (b/s). An interesting cover with two Ruggles postmarks Allansville APR 16 1858 and Stratford APR 19 1858. \$100.00

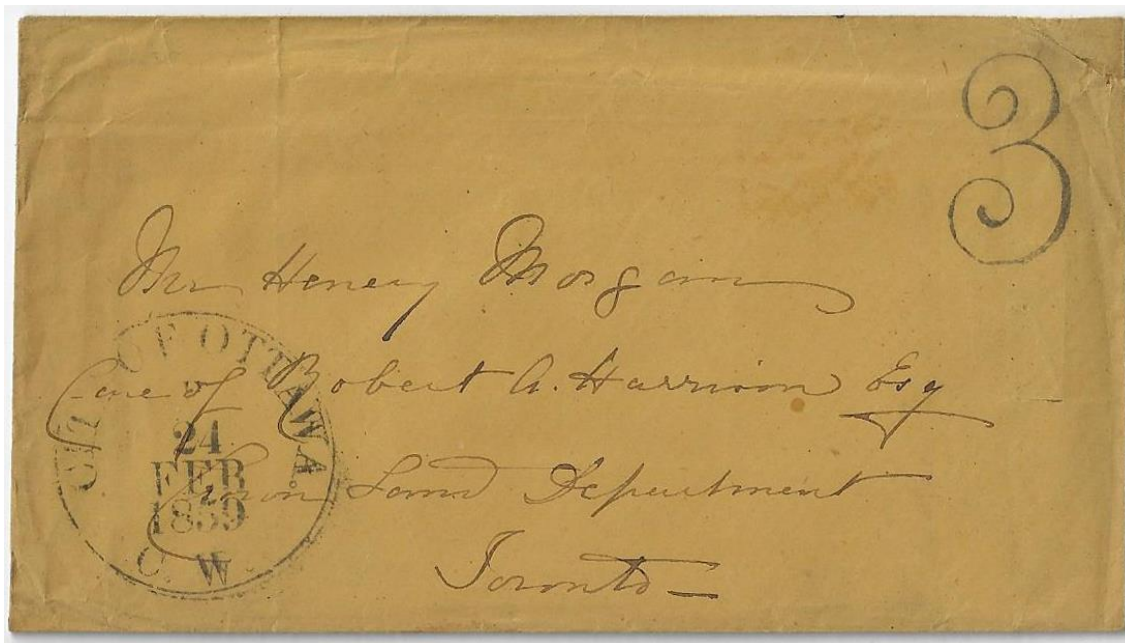


Item 546-07 – **Berthier LC straight-lines type I, II, III** – 1798 folded letter, 1806 folded letter and 1819 folded cover paid 4½d or 9d to Montreal with Berthier LC straight-line type I, II and III. Exhibit quality. \$2,000.00

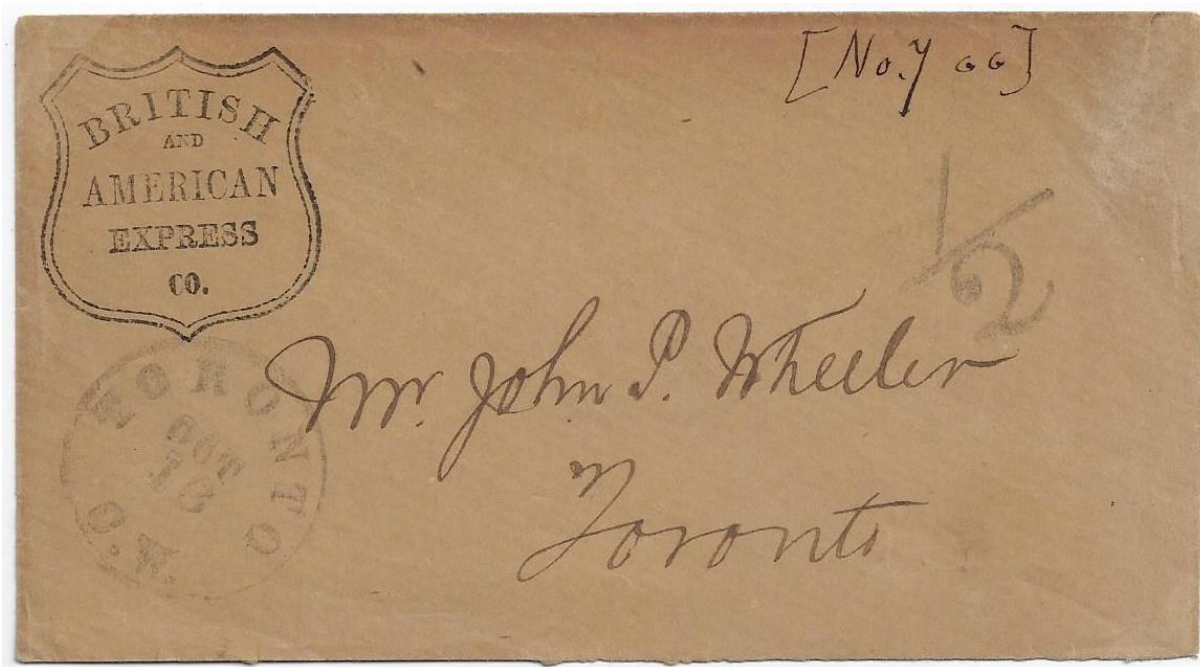



Item 546-08 – **City of Ottawa CW Ruggles** – 1859, stampless cover with letter from Ottawa CW rated 3d collect to Toronto. The letter is addressed to Henry Morgan and relates to land at £10 an acre. \$60.00 **SOLD**



Item 546-09 – **Toronto CW - British and American Express Co.** – c1858, British and American Express Company cover, carried by express to Toronto, by railroad not by stage coach driver, then by agent to Post Office. Entered the mail as drop, rated ½d collect paying the drop letter rate. The B&A Express Co. was one of the private carriers competing with the Post Office Department for the safe transportation of bank papers, money and valuable packages. Interestingly, the letter went through a Post Office. \$250.00 **SOLD**

Item 546-10 – **Customs House – Port of Belleville UC** – 1830, Customs folded letter from Belleville UC with 1829 type in black, ms date in red, rated 9d collect to York. \$125.00



Item 546-11 – **M.5.8 1/10 dually rated Montreal Pennyweight** – 1770, folded cover from Montreal to Quebec, M5.8 Montreal 5dwt 8gr (5 Pennyweights and 8 grains) representing the double 2.16dwt domestic letter rate. The letter is dually rated 1/10 Currency as from 1771 to 1775, letters were dually rated with currency equivalent. Lovely Troy and Currency letter. \$2,500.00



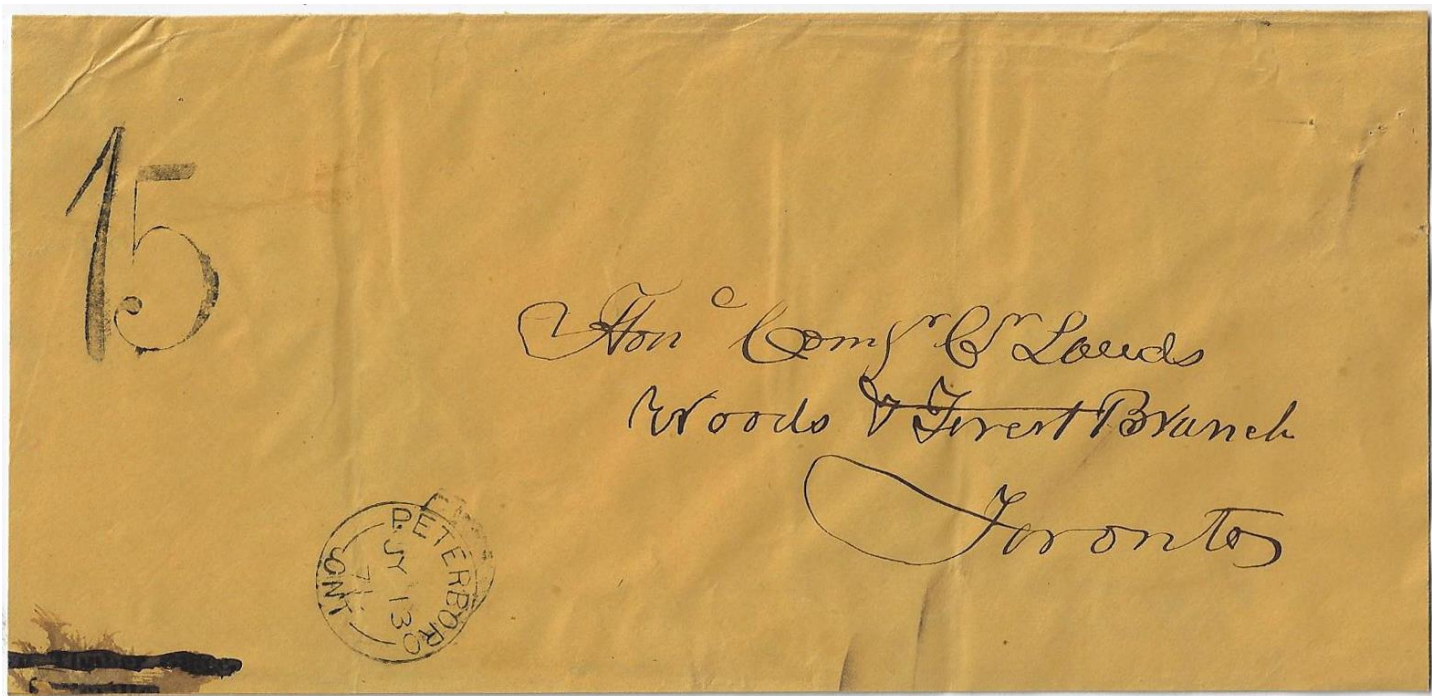
Item 546-12 – **Quebec Steamboat conductor No.8** – 1853, stampless cover from Quebec rated 3d collect to Montreal (b/s). Carried by steamboat on the St. Lawrence River with Steam-Boat-Letter Quebec conductor No.8. Rare \$250.00



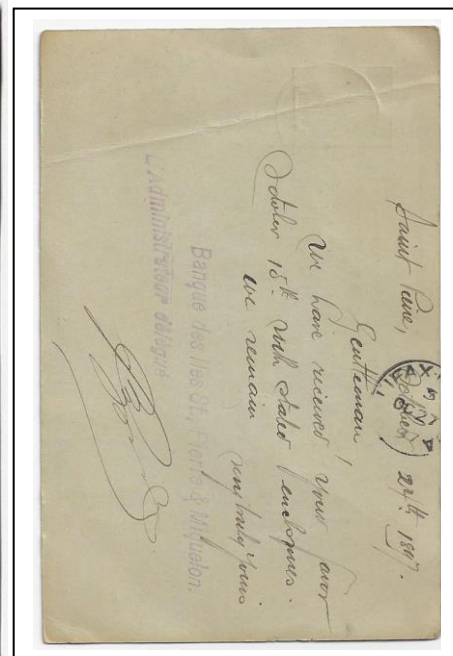
Item 546-13 – **Quebec Steamboat** – 1852, stampless cover from Quebec rated 3d collect to Montreal (b/s). Carried by steamboat on the St. Lawrence River with Steam-Boat-Letter Quebec JU 21 52. \$75.00



Item 546-14 – **Montreal - Militia Department Canada Free** – 1865, free franked cover from the Militia Department in Montreal, dated DE 1 65, free struck in red, to Toronto (b/s). The Militia Dept was created in 1861. This marking is well known on covers from Quebec and Ottawa but rarely seen on cover from Montreal. Major tears and small repairs. \$200.00 **SOLD**




Item 546-15 – **15¢ triple weight unpaid, "1" "5"** – 1871, stampless cover from Peterboro Ont (cds with inner arc JY 13 71) rated 15¢ triple weight letter rate collect. Two devices 1 and 5. Reduced both sides. \$75.00



Item 546-16 – **Saint-Pierre et Miquelon to Nova Scotia** – 1897, SPM 10 centimes stationery card from the Banque des Iles St. Pierre et Miquelon to Lunenburg via Halifax (b/s). Crease. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 546-17 – Newfoundland 15¢ triple weight to Australia – 1889, 5¢ Harp Seal (Sc 54 dark blue, two copies remaining from a strip of 3, faults) tied by grid cancel and tied by "stamp lost in transit" handstamp on cover from St. John's Newfoundland paying 15¢ triple weight letter rate to Melbourne, Australia (b/s) via San Francisco (b/s). Red "Paid All" marking. Once in Melbourne, several attempts were made to deliver the letter, annotations, letter carrier markings, "Unclaimed At / Melbourne" and opened/resealed, back with ms "Opened by Mrs. Strachan but not for her and sent to the Melbourne Dead Letter Office. Somewhere in transit a large part of the middle stamp got removed with remaining stamps tied by "Stamp Lost / In Transit" handstamp. A specular Newfoundland delayed and damaged in transit cover. Expertization VGG #G29351 (see next page). \$750.00 **SOLD**

Item 546-18 – **St. John's NFLD Postmaster registered to US** – 1898, Newfoundland #66, #81 tied by grid cancel on GPO St. John's NFLD cover paying 10¢ registered letter rate to Buffalo (b/s) via Boston (b/s). Postmaster partly printed partly written memo about a stamp order accompanies (See above). \$200.00



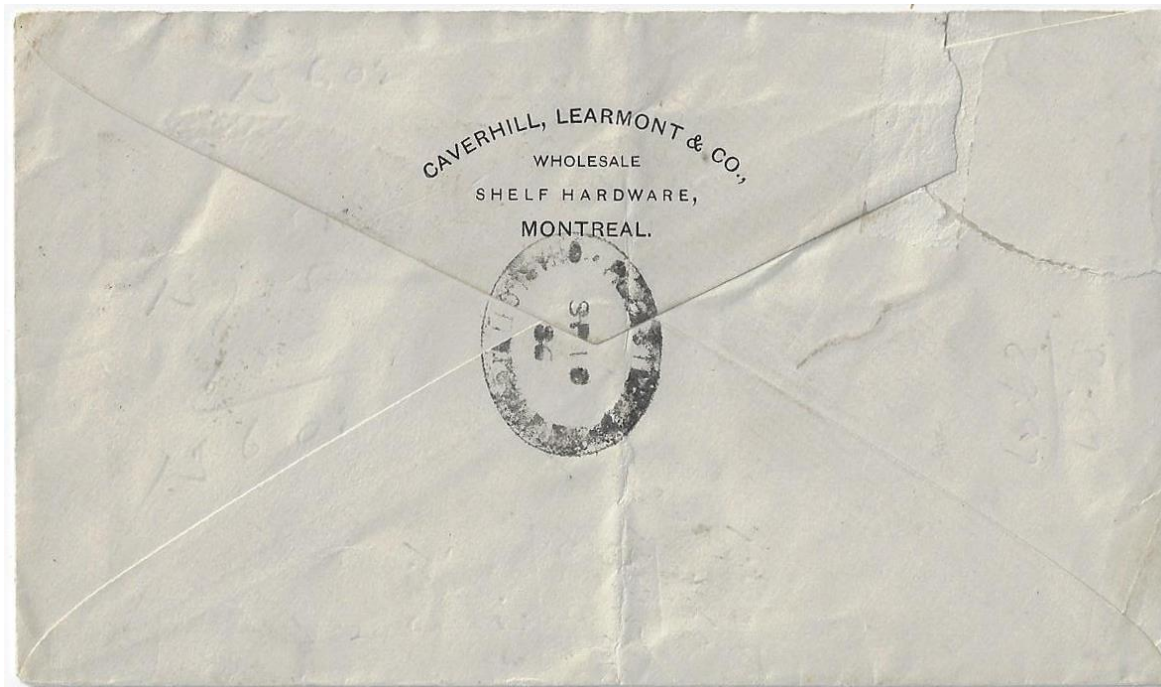
Item 546-19 – **2c Empire postcard rate to Antigua, BWI** – 1903, NFDL 1c Victoria on 1c stationery card from St. Jacques Fortune Bay to Millars Estate, St. Johns Antigua, British West Indies. The message relates to new year wishes. Aging and staining with a crack in the middle of *Millars House*, no tear to edge. \$500.00



Item 546-20 – **Vittoria CW (Berri hammer, NFK)** – 1862, 5¢ Beaver tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Vittoria CW, Berri hammer OC 16 62, paying 5¢ letter rate to London (b/s) via Simcoe and Paris DPO (b/s). Norfolk County. \$50.00

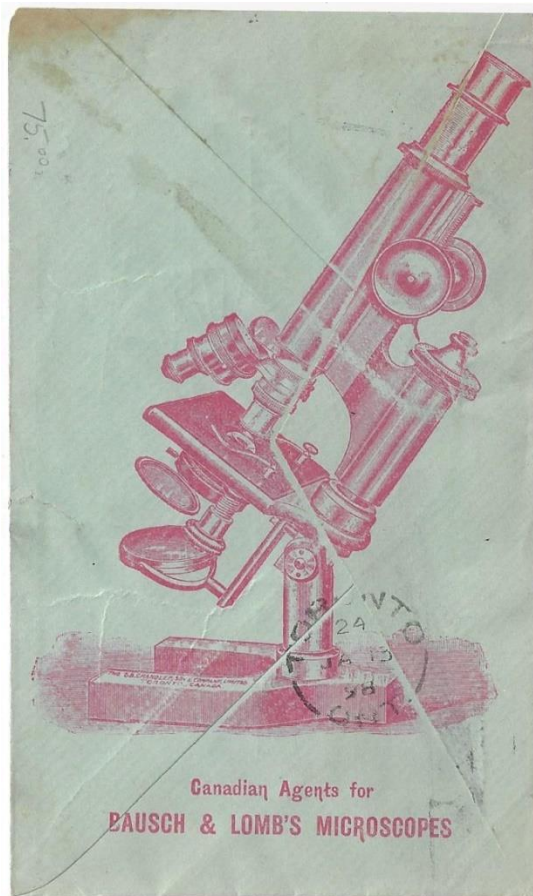


Item 546-21 – By steamer and railroad via the U.S. – 1870, 3¢ SQ (copper, sulfurized, perf 11.85, small fault, staining, dated SP 26 70) tied by oval grid cancel on cover from Sherbrooke St. Mary's Nova Scotia paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Halifax transit (b/s), endorsed via St. John and Portland (by steamer), then by GTR from Portland to Montreal direct (b/s). Filing fold. \$125.00

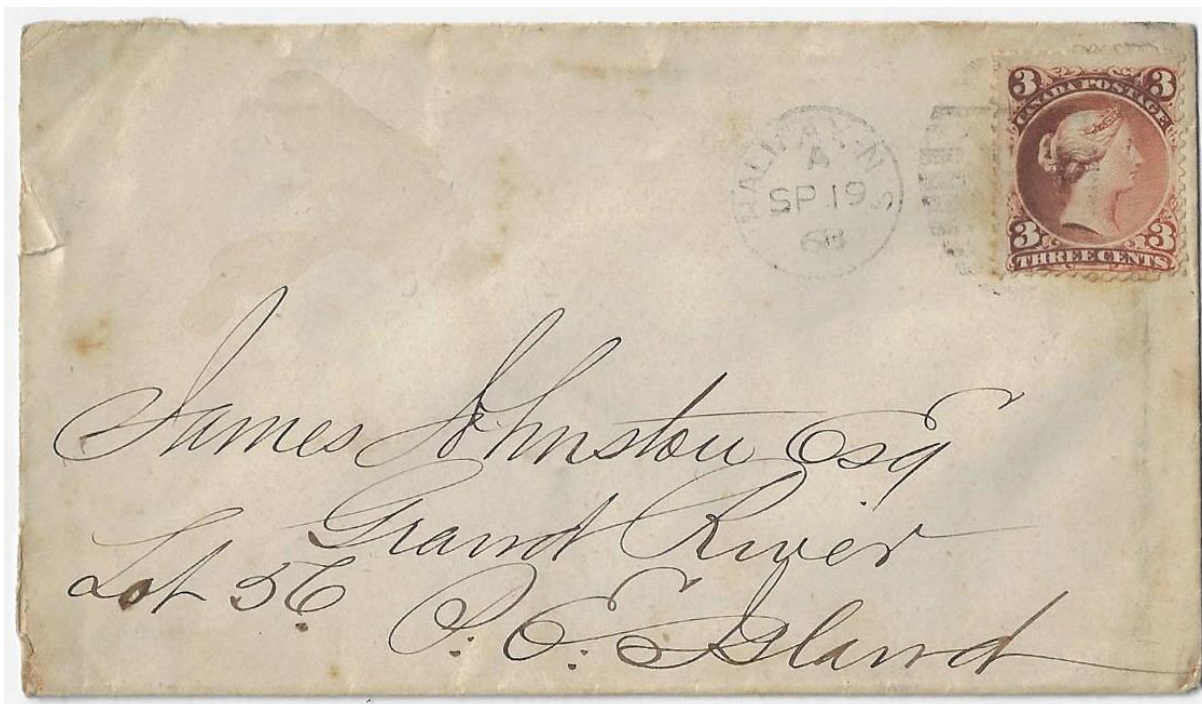


Item 546-22 – **Oval "Registered Charlottetown PEI"** – 1885, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS (pre-affixing fault) tied by target cancel on cover, tear on flap and paper lost, from Montreal paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Summerside PEI. Reverse with oval "Registered Charlottetown PEI" dated SP 10 86. Horace Harrison, p.377, recorded 1 cover and 2 backstamps between JY 6 86 and SP 9 86. According to this data, this Charlottetown postmark would be the fourth recorded strike and the new latest recorded date by 1 day. A key cover for PEI. \$300.00

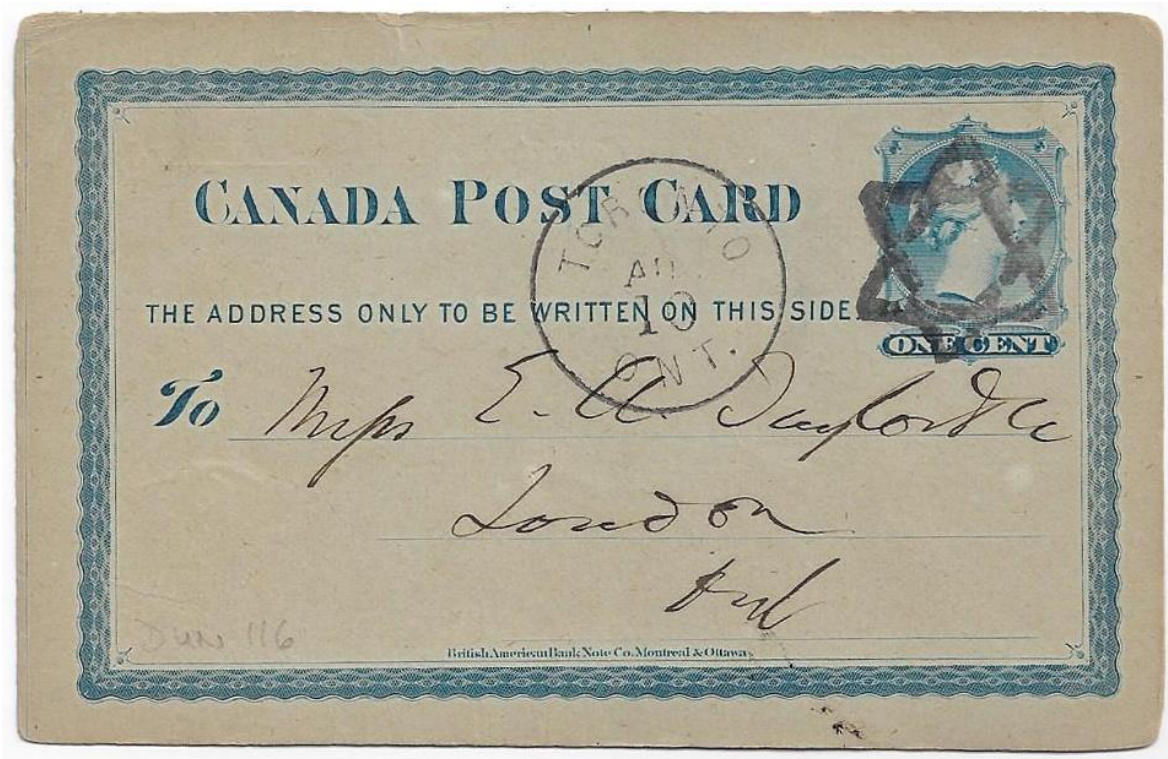
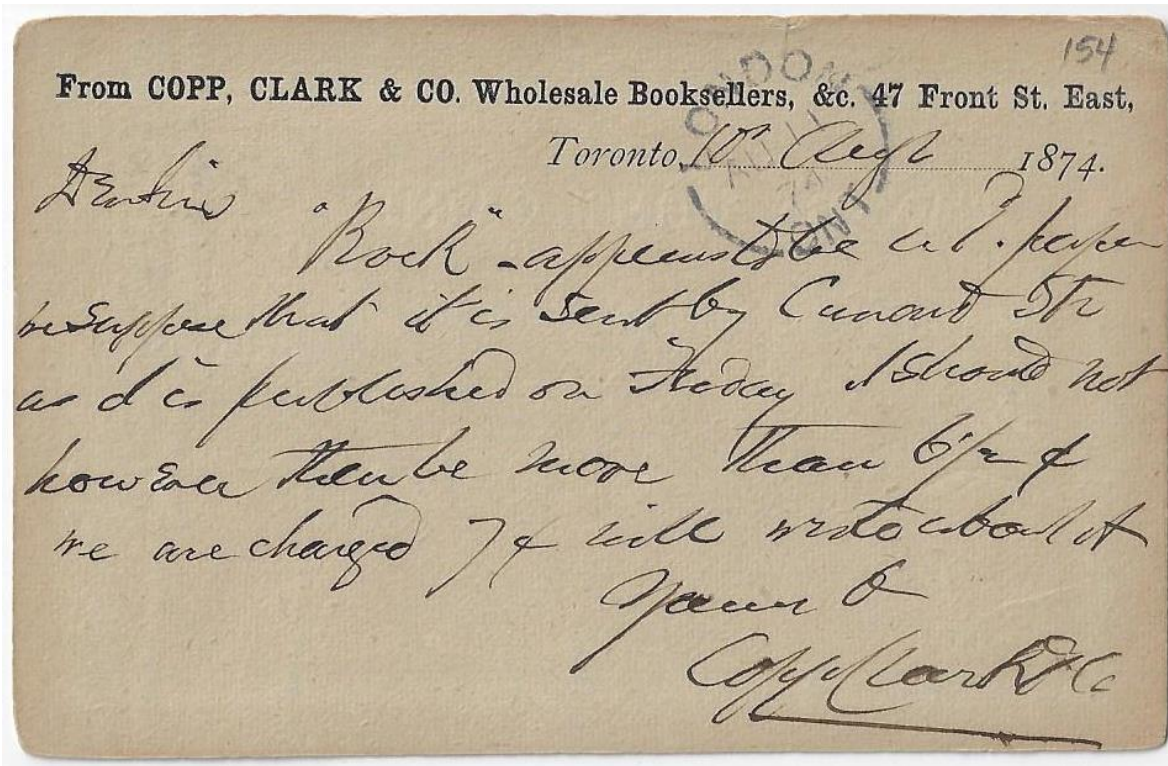

Item 546-27 – **2¢ U.S. PSE mailed in Canada** – 1887, US 2¢ postal stationery envelope mailed somewhere in Canada to Montreal, returned for deficient postage via the Dead Letter Office (b/s). Postage paid with a 3¢ Small Queen dull red tied by DLO SP 22 87 cds and then forwarded to destination. \$300.00



Item 546-28 – **Barnard's Express** – 1879, US 3¢ green stationery printed Wells, Fargo & Co. cover, originally sent from San Francisco (AU 14 79 – violet datestamp b/s) to New Westminster BC. Transferred to Barnard's Express where a 3¢ SQ orange red was added to pay postage and tied by oval Barnard's Express handstamp. Additional levy of 10¢ oval collect, being charged on delivery, letter was marked manuscript "refused" and returned to sender. Light cover edge age-stains. An exceedingly rare cover and a showpiece. Ex Redford (1953). \$3,000.00



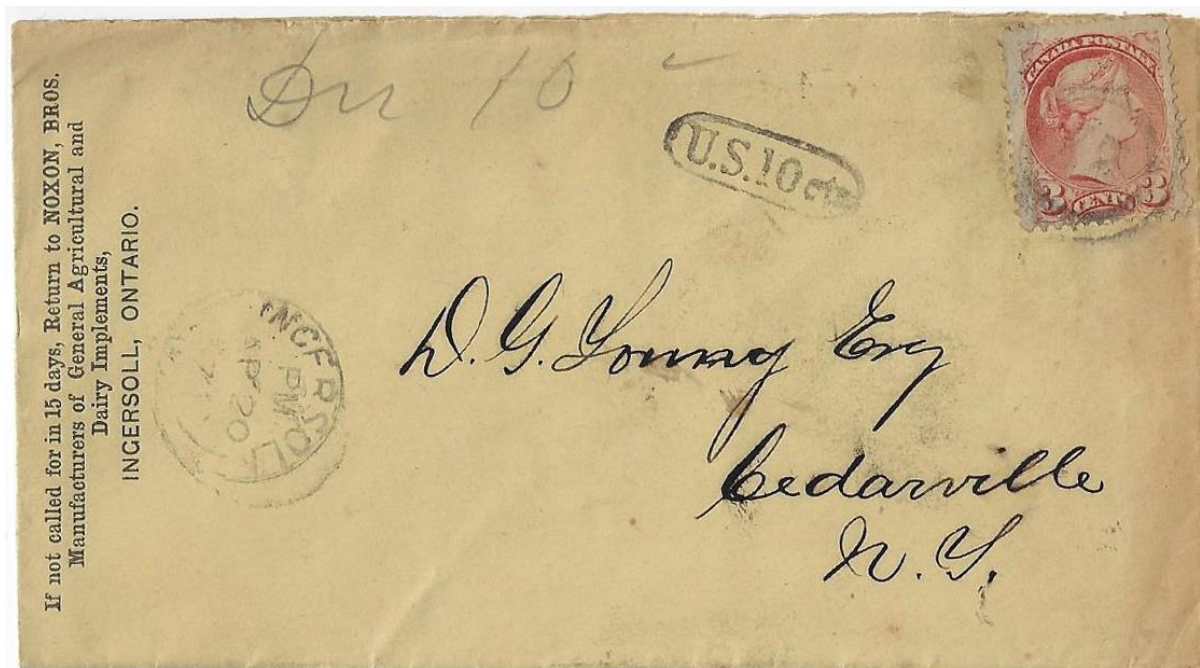

The letter is from John James Fraser (*initialed J.F. at left*) to his father John A. Fraser. Justice John J. Fraser was MLA for York New Brunswick and later 5th Premier of New Brunswick and 9th Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick. The letter relates to politics, national dept, opposition in the Dominion etc. \$125.00 **SOLD**



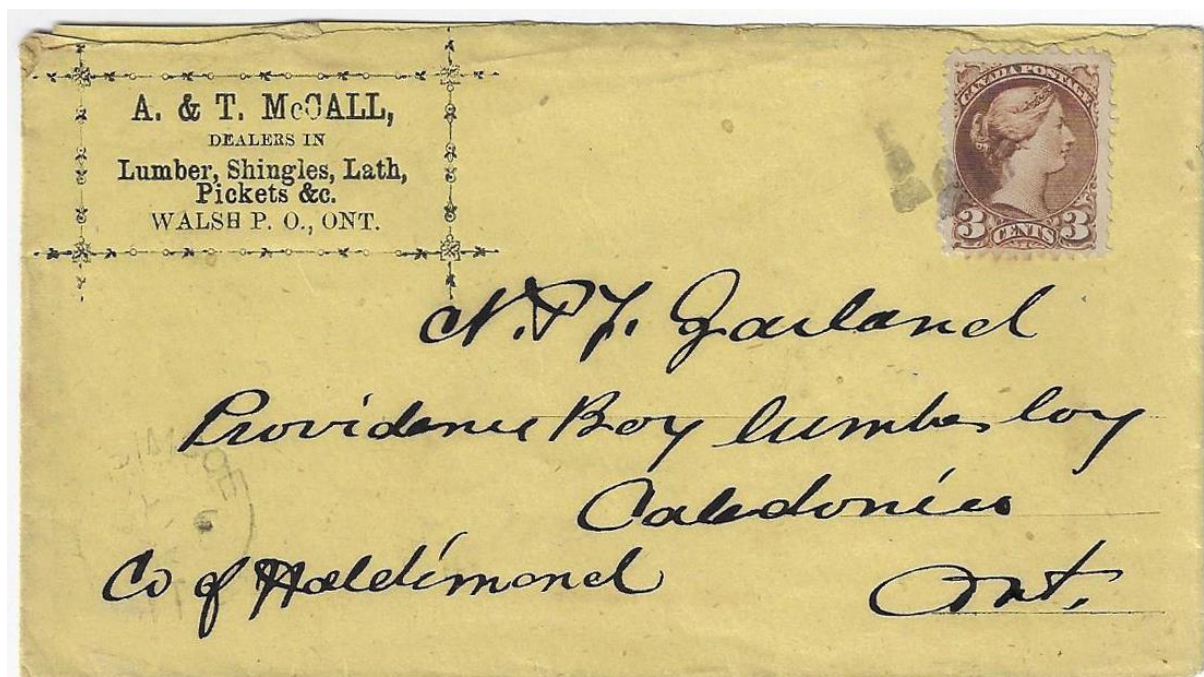
Item 546-31 – **Partly prepaid to U.S. charged 10¢** - 1871, 3¢ SQ rose tied by Two-ring 27 cancel on Noxon cover from Ingersoll Ont underpaying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. 3¢ shortpaid and charged 10¢ collect as per the regulation that unpaid or partly prepaid letters or cards to U.S. were charged 10¢ with no credit given on partial payment. Ex Simpson. \$250.00



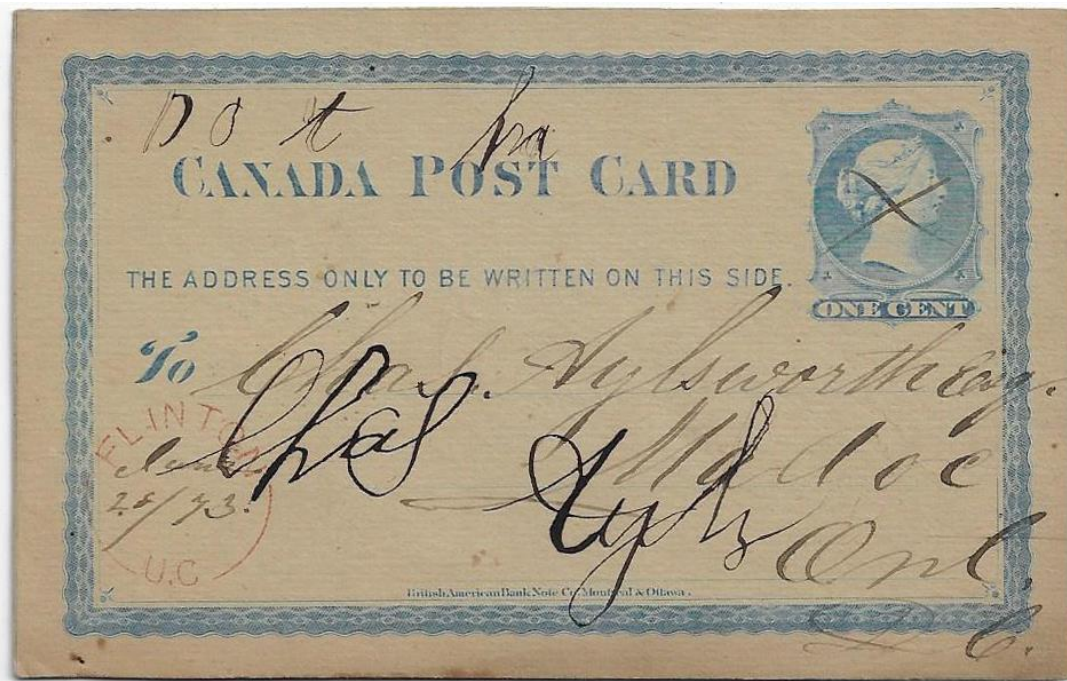

Item 546-40 – **Cannington to Manitoulin Island** – 1877, 3¢ SQ (2) tied by fancy grid cancel, 2¢ RLS tied by registered S/L on cover from Cannington Ont paying 8¢ double weight registered letter rate to Manitowaning, Manitoulin Island. Routed via Toronto (b/s) and by steamer from Collingwood (b/s). Phipps Land Agent correspondence. Ontario County. \$200.00



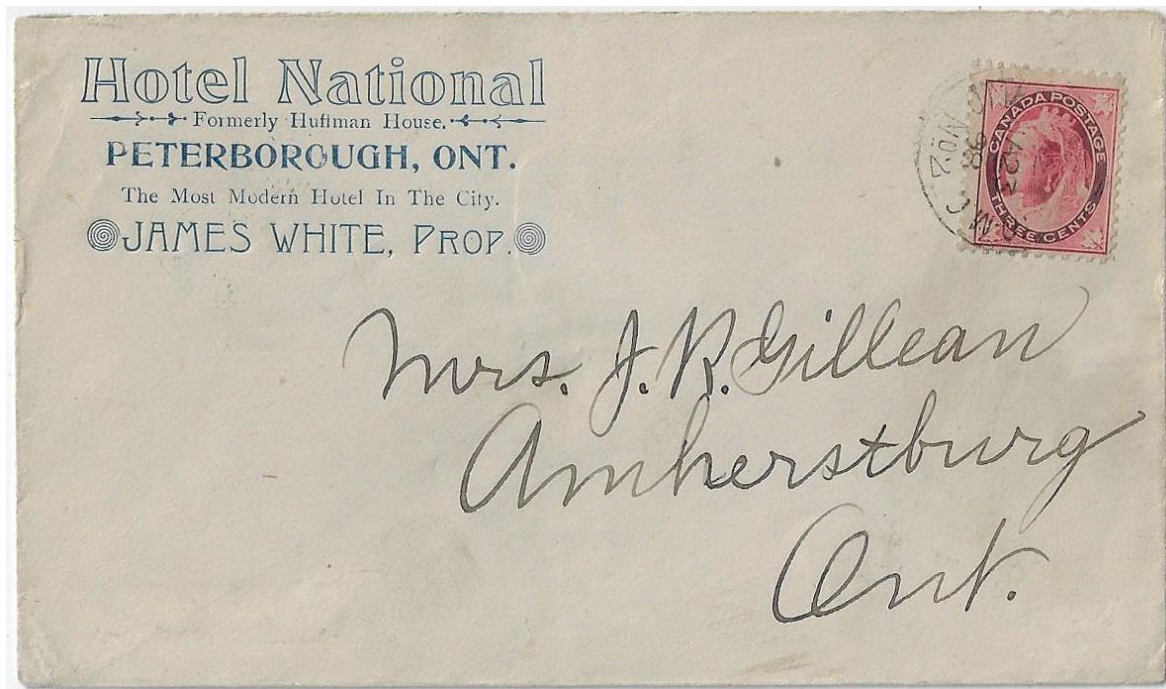

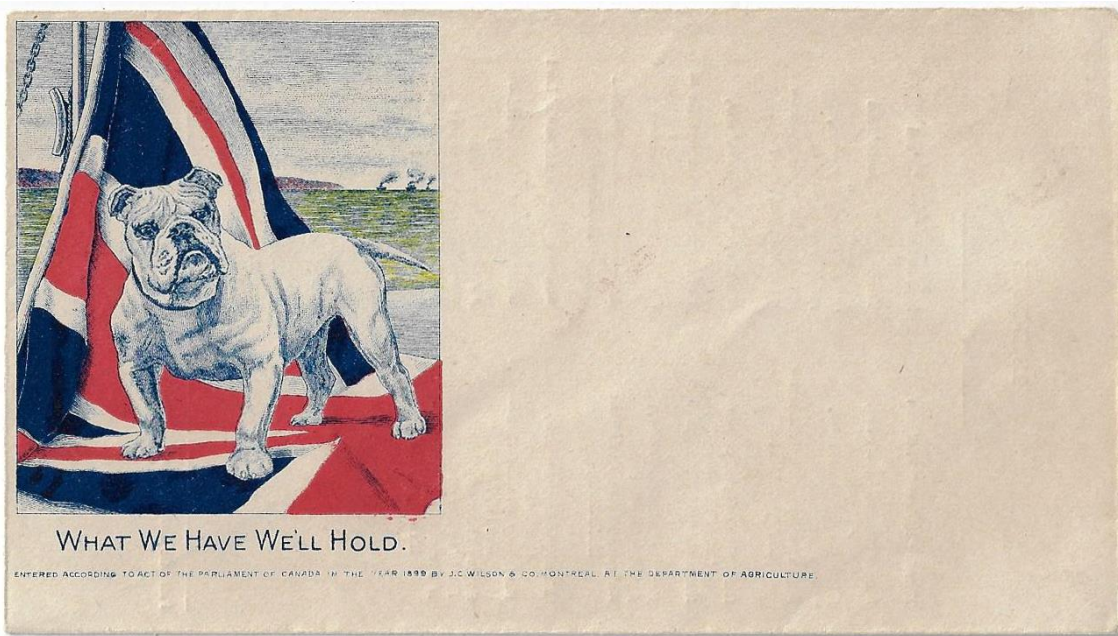
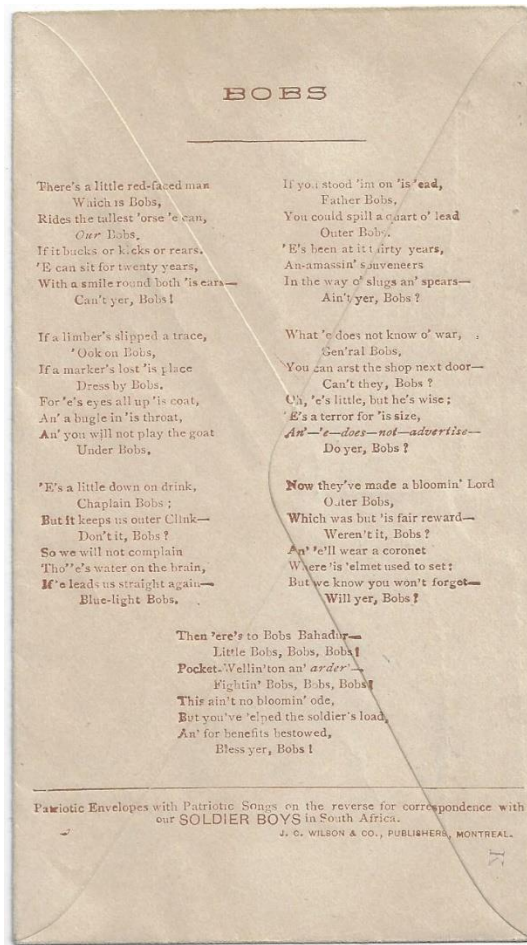
Item 546-43 – ½¢ Numeral single on PC to Algeria - 1909, ½¢ Numeral tied by Ottawa Orb cancel on Quebec 1908 postcard to Algeria. Mailed as unwritten printed matter rate item. Accepted or tolerated with no evidence the card actually went through the mail. \$100.00



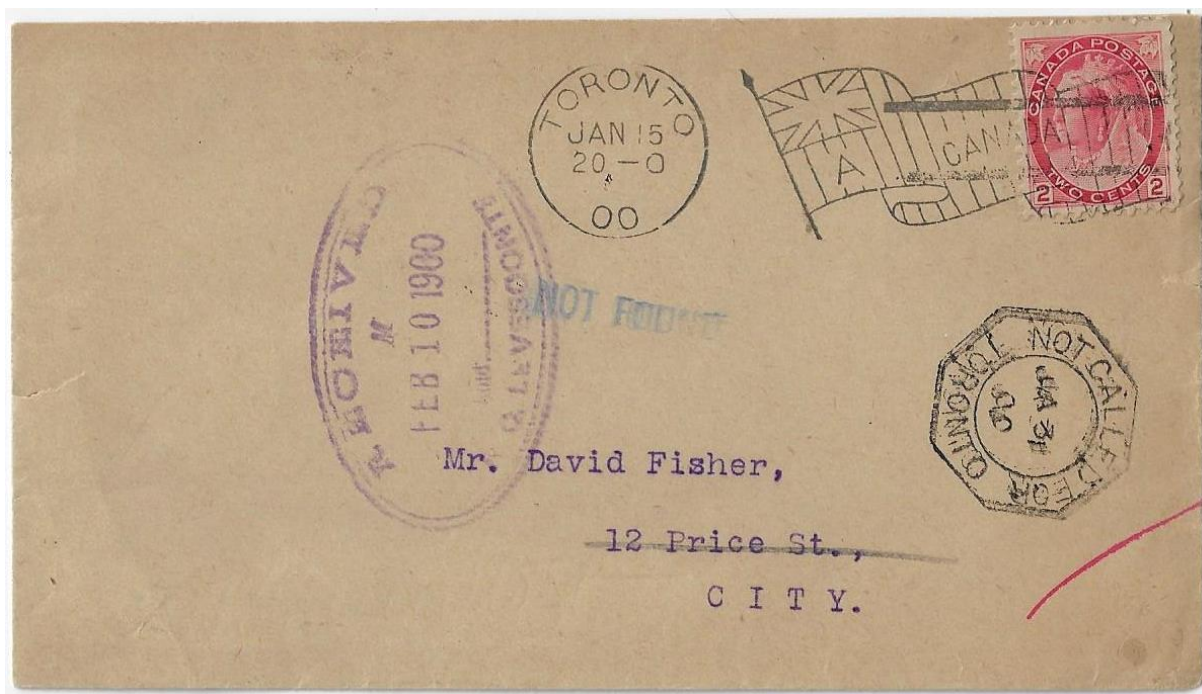
Item 546-44 – **Hotel National Peterborough** – 1898, 3¢ Maple Leaf (slightly sulfurized) tied by Ottawa & Toronto M.C. cds on Hotel National advertising cover from Peterborough paying 3¢ letter rate to Amherstburg (b/s). \$50.00



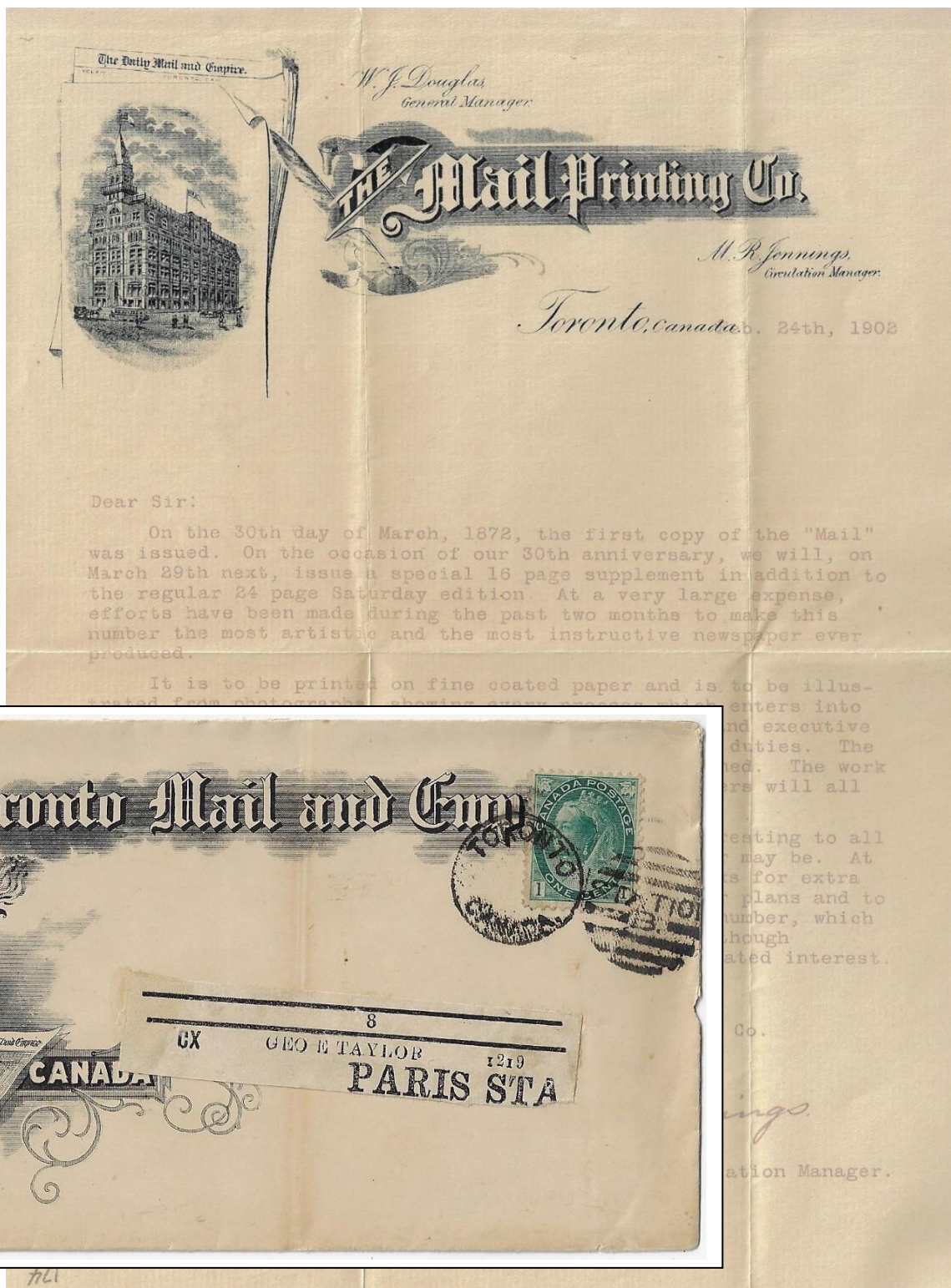
Item 546-45 – **Duke and Duchess of York review cover** – 1901, 2¢ Numeral tied by "Royal Review / Exhibition Park Camp / Oct 11 1901 / Toronto / Army Post Office" handstamps on cover to Toronto. Assistant Postmaster Toronto Oct 22 handstamp. Held 11 days. This is an example of the 1901 Duke and Duchess of York review cover at the occasion of the Royal Review at Exhibition Park for the Boer War Troops. While in Canada on tour, the Duke presented newly minted South Africa War medals to veterans of the Boer War. \$200.00 **SOLD**



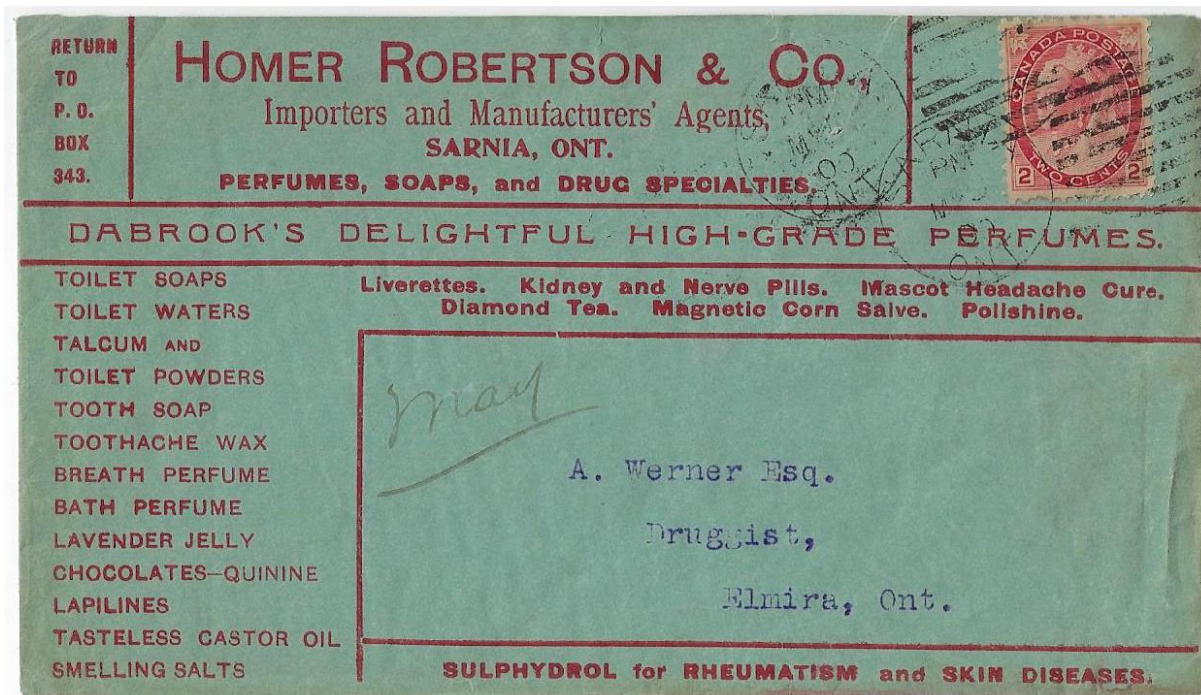

Routed to Y Depot (b/s), not found after delivery attempts, octagonal Not Called For after 2 weeks and sent to the Dead Letter Office in Toronto. Presumably delivery with business receiver on front. A spectacular Toronto delayed cover. \$250.00



Item 546-48 – **Toronto Station B 3rd class duplex use** – 1902, 1c Numeral tied by Toronto Station B 3rd class duplex cancel (DON-1735B, only 4 examples recorded, 1901-1902) on Toronto Mail and Empire advertising unsealed cover with letter paying 1c printed matter rate to Paris Station Ont. Interestingly, by using pasted subscriber address label. The letter is announcing 30th anniversary supp containing photographs and how newspapers are produced etc etc... A great strike and rare. \$300.00 **SOLD**

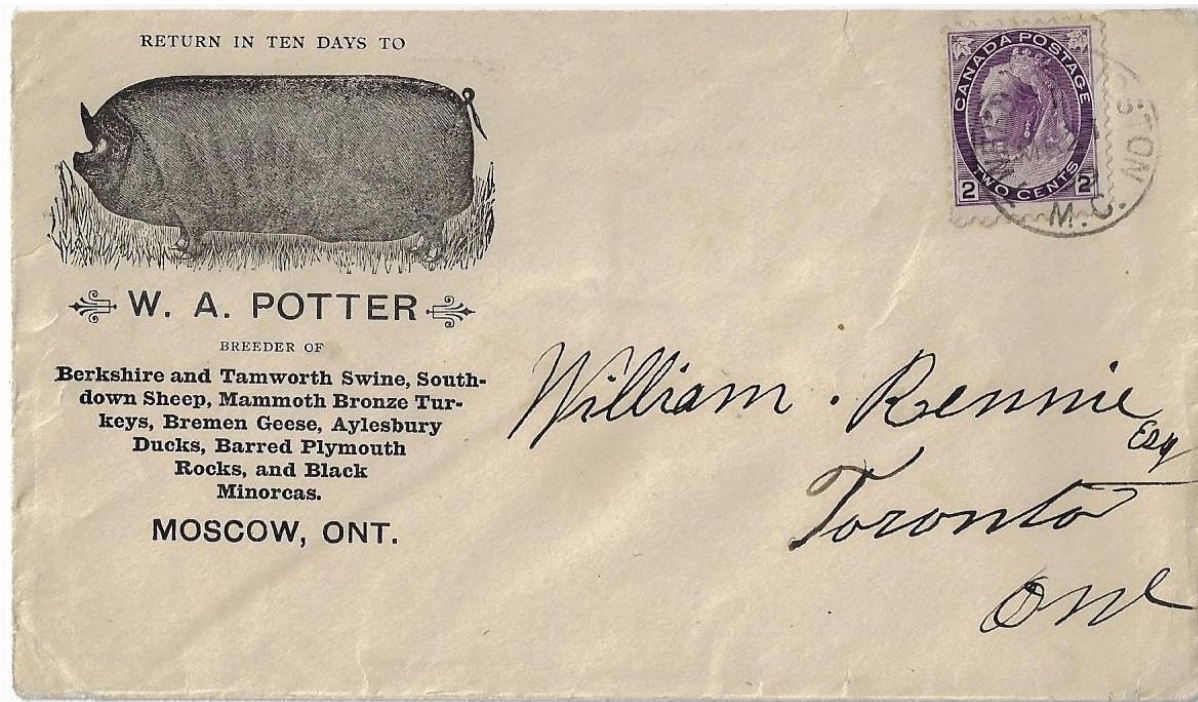
An Act to Prevent the Spread of Noxious Weeds.

CHAPTER 279. REVISED STATUTES OF ONTARIO, 1897 (SECTION 8).—It shall be the duty of the Overseers of Highways in any Municipality to see that the provisions of this Act, relating to Noxious Weeds, are carried out within their respective Highway Divisions, by cutting down or destroying, or causing to be cut down or destroyed at the proper times, to prevent the ripening of their seed, all the *Noxious Weeds growing on the Highways or Road Allowances within their respective Divisions, such works to be performed as part of the ordinary Statute Labor, or to be paid for at a reasonable rate by the Treasurer of the Municipality, as the Council of the Municipality may direct.

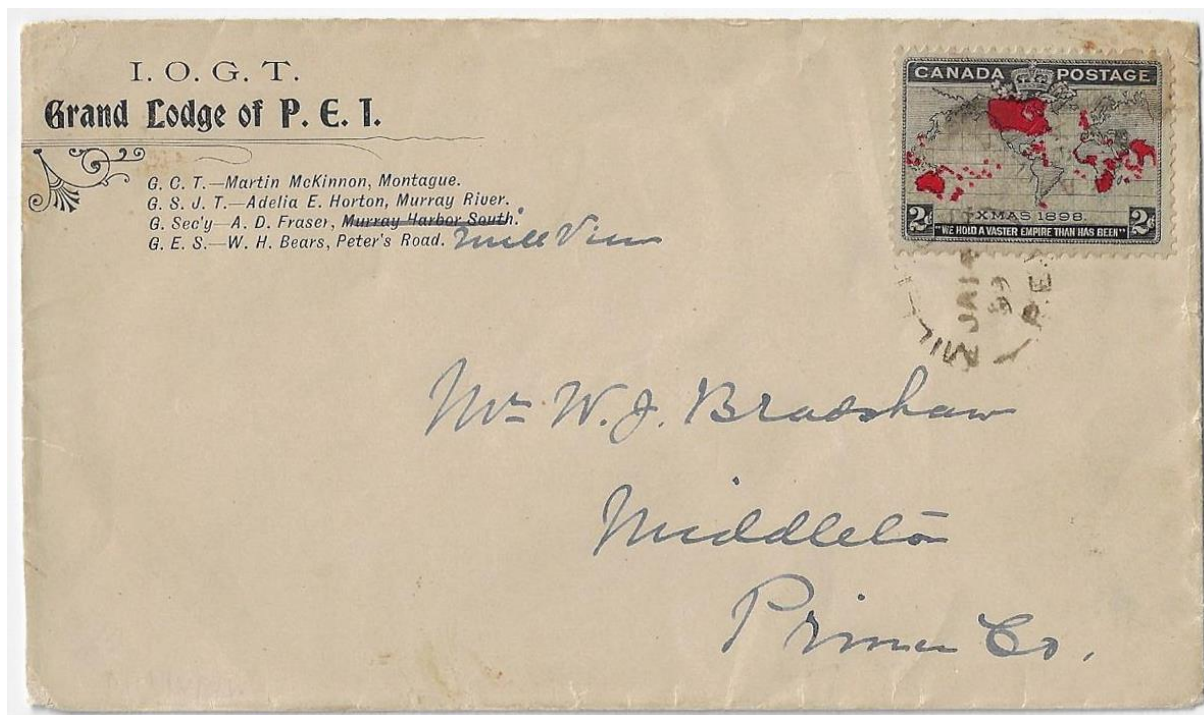
(SECTION 9, SUBSECTION 3).—Every Overseer of Highways who refuses or neglects to discharge the duties imposed upon him by this Act, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$20.

*Noxious Weeds include Canada Thistles, Oxeyedaisy, Wild Oats, Ragweed and Burdock.

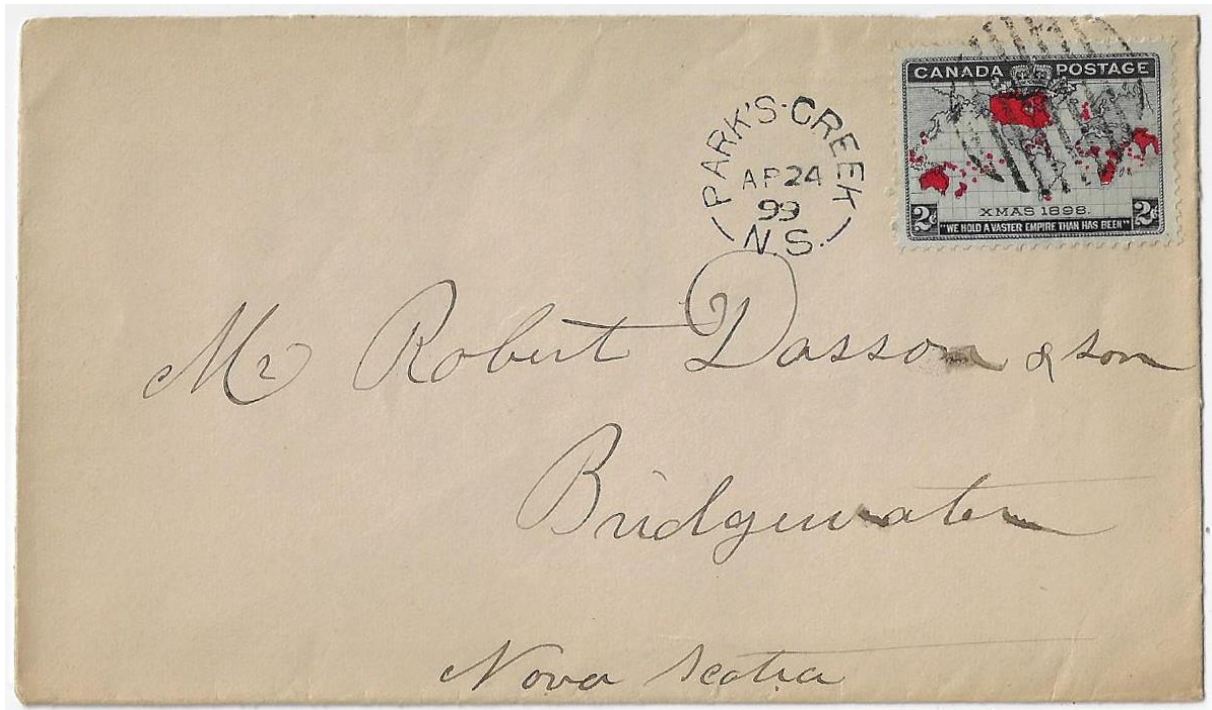

Vocabularies of the Tlingit, Haida and Tsimshian Languages.

By Dr. Franz Boas.

(Read before the American Philosophical Society, October 2, 1891.)

The following vocabularies were collected by the author when studying the Indian tribes of British Columbia, under an appointment of the Committee of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, appointed for the purpose of investigating and publishing reports on the physical characters, languages, and industrial and social conditions of the Northwestern tribes of the Dominion of Canada. It was decided that in the report of the Committee a brief comparative vocabulary only should be printed. As, however, the languages of the North Pacific Coast of America are little known, the vocabularies may be found to possess some value.

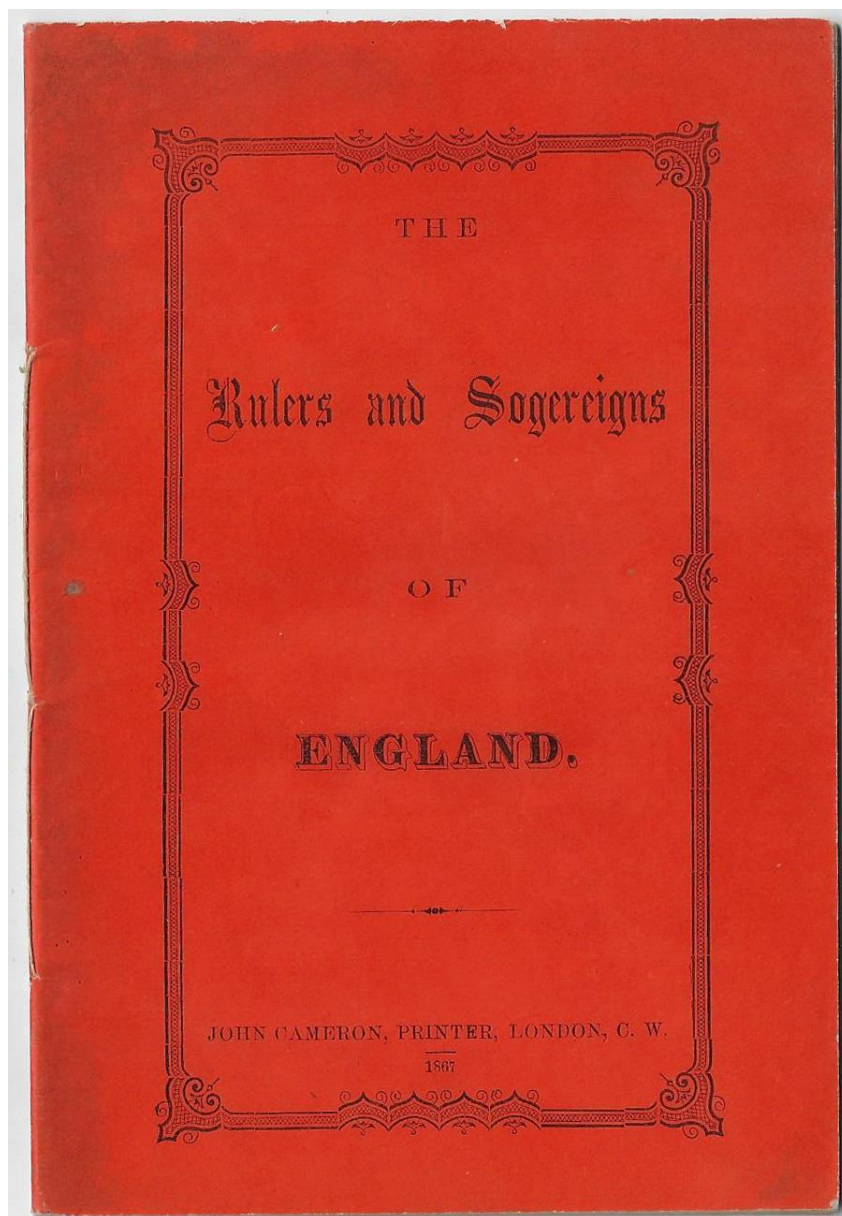
The following alphabet has been used :

The vowels have their continental sounds, namely : *a* as in *father* ; *e* like *a* in *mate* ; *i* as in *machine* ; *o* as in *note* ; *u* as in *rule*. In addition the following have been used : *ä*, *ö* as in German ; *â* = *aw* in *law* ; *ɛ* = *e* in *flower*.

Among the consonants the following additional letters have been used : *g*, a very guttural *g*, similar to *gr* ; *k*, a very guttural *k*, similar to *kr* ; *q*, the German *ch* in *Bach* ; *h*, the German *ch* in *ich* ; *q*, between *q* and *h* ; *c* = *sh* in *shore* ; *ç* = *th* in *thin* ; *tl* an explosive, dorso-apical *l* ; *dl* a palatal, dorsal *l*. ' following a consonant designates the *u* position of the organs of articulation.
