Item 547-01 – Parliament in Montreal - 1847, money letter folded cover from Montreal paid 1/1½ to Toronto. The letter was not sent free but is signed by Edmund Murney, MPP while the Canadian Parliament was in Montreal. Murney was a lawyer and political figure in UC. He represented Hastings in the LA of the Province of Canada from 1842 to 1848. He was from Kingston, studied law and set up practice in Belleville. He served as a major in the militia and was a clerk of the peace for the Victoria District. He was defeated by Robert Baldwin in 1841 and defeated Baldwin in 1842. Letters from the Parliament while in Montreal are very scarce. Ex Ewens. \$200.00

Item 547-03 – Montreal to France via New York forwarding agent – 1850, business folded letter from Montreal mailed unpaid to France via New York. Forwarded by a NY forwarding agent company and carried by private trader to England. Then entered France in Calais, exchanged under Anglo French Postal Agreement Article 13 amendment (Colonies Art 13.), effective in 1846 until 1855: 3/4 Sterling due Great Britain from France per ounce or 30 grams on unpaid letters making 10 decimes British debit to France and French 5 decimes internal postage total 15 collect. \$300.00



Item 547-04 – <u>Perth UC registered</u> – 1858, folded registered cover from Perth UC paid 3 to Toronto with registry fee paid in cash. Manuscript boxed Paid Registered. Brockville transit (b/s) and Toronto Ruggles (b/s). \$75.00



Item 547-05 – England to St. Catharines, 2½d collect – 1846, family folded letter from Longport England (*Stoke-on-Trent*) to St. Catharines CW. via Newcastle-under-Lyme in Staffordshire (b/s). Paid 1/, carried by Cunard Cambria 7th voyage, more to pay 2d converted to 2½d Currency with Arnell B3 handstamp recorded by Arnell from 1848 to 1850 or 1854. \$200.00 SOLD

Item 547-07 – <u>Signed by Lord Elgin, Governor General</u> – 1848, stampless cover from Montreal, Montreal Tombstone Paid JY 13 48, while the seat of government located in Montreal, signed by Lord Elgin Governor General of the Province of Canada, to Scotland (b/s). \$400.00





Item 547-08 – Two Chippawa letters 9d prepaid and 9d collect – 1839, folded letter from Chippawa UC paid 9d to London and 1842 folded letter 9d collect to London. Both addressed to James Hamilton Sheriff London District. Both CHIPPAVVA (corrected state segment added to correct IV to W, looking VV). A nice pair and exhibit quality. \$200.00



Item 547-09 – <u>Ship Letter Crown Quebec – Textile trade related</u> – 1835, business letter from Liverpool to Quebec. Carried by the private trader and endorsed per Soliway, entered at Quebec as ship letter with matching single-ring oval Ship Letter Quebec Crown in red, rated 2½d as inbound ship letter for local delivery. The letter is somewhat interesting, it relates to textile trade, bleached canvas and cloth for sailors and sailmakers. It discusses coker canvas, Bell & Co. canvas, stock availability and price fluctuation etc. Addressee erased then enhanced by pencil. \$500.00



Item 547-10 – <u>Signed by Alexander Fraser (Glengarry)</u> – 1843, autographed folded letter signed by Alexander Fraser L.C. (*Legislative Councillor*), from Kingston UC paid 1/6 to Martintown, Glengarry U.C. The letter is from Alexander Fraser, member of the Assembly of Upper Canada for Glengarry County, 1828-1834 and Commanding Officer of the First Regiment of Glengarry Militia 1822-1838. 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Item 506-11 – <u>Prince Rupert's Land, Norway House, Lake Winnipeg</u> – 1848 (June 23), stampless folded letter from Prince Rupert's Land, Norway House, Lake Winnipeg to England via Montreal. The letter is from Charles Beardmore to his wife living in London. Carried privately to Montreal, from where it made its way to London. A very detailed three-page letter describing Beardmore's journey to Norway House, conditions there, his plans (*a 4 month trip to the mountains of Columbia*), requests for supplies and clothing, and a list of all the articles he is sending by York Boat back to England.

Beardmore starts by mentioning a Northern Brigade of canoes that preceded him consisting of forty-nine men (probably voyageurs) travelling in four canoes. He describes their itinerary as having travelled up the River Mattawa into Lake Mississauga, thence down the French River into Lake Huron. From there the brigade made its way to Lake Superior and then to Fort William (a North West Company fort). From there they canoed down through Lac La Pluise, Lac de Bois, Lake Winnipeg to Norway House" One aspect of this letter may hold a unique position in out-going fur trade correspondence from the period for its very detailed list "curiosities" -- the type of Indigeous made articles and material culture prevalent at the time of writing, all of which were on their way as gifts to Beardmore's wife. For example, he writes to her that he is sending: "... in return of Moose and York Factory ships you will receive parcels... A box containing an Indian Fishing net made of cedar bark. In the water they will last near 100 years... [some] Maple sugar, a Cariboo skin dressed in the country which is for a pair of trousers for Nathaniel [his son? Or a relative?], a Watch Pocket worked in beads, an Indian Whip made by the Dog Rib Tribe & belonging to the late Tom [Thomas] Simpson, the Discoverer, a skunk skin, an Indian scalp, an owl stuffed, a few ducks. Also a lot of beadwork.... And a lot of curiosities from the Esquimaux, too numerous to mention. Also a live Esquimaux Dog for Papa or Nath. It is (if you get it) a valuable animal and must be kept up as it never saw cattle and may mistake them for wolves. A deer, Also 3 canoes, one made by the Esquimaux and two Indian bark canoes...."The list continues with many more gifts...

Beardmore then discusses financial matters including the making of a beaver coat. He finalizes with mentioning friends and personal matters of concern. Charles Beardmore was an employee of the HBC and after crossing the "mountains of Columbia" became a clerk at Fort Rupert, where he discovered seams of coal. Beardmore later served as witness in a court case that involved Indigenous groups storming the Fort. The event is written up in the British Columbia Historical News, Vol. 36, No. 1 2002. Fully prepaid to New York with matching Peterboro Paid 1/8½d paying postage to the lines (presumably representing 1/6 double 9d plus 2½d commission to Postmaster being outside the route, extra mileage in township outside Peterboro). Exchanged via Kingston with matching Paid 18¾c from the lines to New York. Carried by private trader to Liverpool with ship letter (b/s). Rated 1/7 collect representing the ship letter rate and inland postage to Scotland. ½d road tax added and finally redirected to London. The writer had huge debt and got help from his uncle. He writes that his farm will produce more potatoes in the spring and a few lines on the Rebellion, Indians etc. A very scarce Peterboro county letter and interesting rate structure. \$375.00 SOLD
