



The cover is addressed to the Dean of the Medical Faculty in Toronto. A rare postmark and certainly one of the finest. \$250.00 **SOLD** 





Item 548-02 – <u>Lady cover from Farmersville UC (Leeds)</u> – 1855, stampless blue ornamented leaves and flowers decorative lady cover from Farmersville dated JU 2 1855 paid 3 all in red paying 3d letter rate to Toronto (b/s) via Beverley (b/s). Spectacular and rare. \$400.00 **SOLD**

Item 548-04 – <u>Lake Ontario Steamboat</u> – 1843, stampless folded cover from Toronto rated 1/6 collect paying the double 9d rate to Kingston. Carried by Lake Ontario steamboat with *STEAM BOAT* straight-line in red. The letter was taken direct to Royal Mail Line steamboat vessel. In 1841, a formal contract for 6 years was arranged by the Post Office to carry mails between Toronto and Kingston. \$350.00 SOLD



Item 548-05 – <u>Erin UC (Wellington)</u> – 1856, stampless cover from Erin UC paid 3d to Guelph (b/s) via Georgetown (b/s). This postmark has typeset dater separated. This is the earliest recorded date of this interesting duo. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>

Item 548-19 – Antoine Audet Member of Parliament and Postmaster (Shefford) - 1887–1891, autograph letter signed by Antoine Audet on Secretary of State Canada stationery, dated March 28. A. Audet 1846-1915 was politician and farmer. He was elected to the House of Commons in 1887 as a Member of the Conservative Party riding of Shefford. He was the postmaster of the North Stukely Post Office. \$150.00



Item 548-20 – <u>Father of Confederation - James Cockburn</u> – 1862, 5¢ Beaver (pre-affixing fault) tied by a nice example of the scarce Cobourg CW Berri duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ letter rate to Quebec. The letter is from James Cockburn, Barrister at Law and one of the Fathers of Confederation. Cockburn represented West Northumberland in the Legislative Assembly 1861-7, in the House of Commons 1867-74. He served as Solicitor General and was a member of the Canada West delegation to the Quebec Conference. In 1867, he became the first Speaker of the House. \$200.00






Routed via San Francisco. Once in Australia, redirected to Melbourne with 2d more to pay. \$1,250.00

During the seven-day period from Dec 25 to Dec 31 1898, the Imperial Postage rate was reduced to 2¢. It was cheaper to send a letter to England than within Canada.
