Item 549-01 – <u>Halifax Ship Letter Crown</u> - 1821, folded letter from Liverpool to Truro Nova Scotia. Endorsed and carried by the Anucha, Capt Flockhart. Entered in Halifax as ship letter with Crown and Fleuron. Rated 6d collect representing 1d ship letter fee and 5d inland postage to Truro. The letter is dually written by Capt Christie and Marsh & Tasker and addressed to the Truro ship owner Alexander Kent. It relates to shipowner business stating that Capt Christie just returned from Rio de Janeiro and he is heading to Valparaiso, Chile. \$400.00



Item 549-02 – <u>Dundas Postmaster free franked</u> – 1833, autograph letter signed by James Crooks datelined West Flamborough, entered the mail in Dundas UC with 1829 type struck in red, Postmaster free franked to Vittoria. \$250.00





Item 549-03 – <u>Chippawa 1829 used for registered letter number</u> – 1861, registered folded letter from Thomas Street datelined Niagara Falls Chippawa paid 5 to Sandwich (b/s) via Clifton, GWR and Windsor (b/s). Chippawa UC Berri hammer DE 27 61. Registry fee paid in cash. An incredible reintroduction of the Chippawa 1829 type postmark for registered number (No.793) and presumably the latest recorded date. \$250.00



Item 549-04 – <u>Boston ship letter to Halifax</u> – 1830, business folded letter from Robert & Tyson & Co. in Boston to Halifax. Endorsed "Per Brig Janus Capt Wales". Entered in Halifax and rated 2½d Nova Scotia ship letter fee. \$200.00



Item 549-05 – Montreal Money Letter and Too Late to U.S. – 1850, banking money letter from La Banque du People in Montreal, boxed Money Letter is red, mailed too late after cut off time, paid 4½d to the lines and 10¢ US collect in New York. The letter is a listing of drafts from clients. \$200.00



Item 549-06 – <u>Peterboro UC double circle – italic lettering</u> – 1831, Clerk of Peace folded letter from Peterboro UC, double circle in black dated 17 Feb 31, paid 4½d to Port Hope. It relates to affidavit. A very early Peterboro postmark. \$300.00



Item 549-07 – <u>Dereham UC (1841-1868)</u> – 1865, stampless cover from Dereham UC paid 5 to Quebec (b/s). This South-West Oxford office opened in 1841 and closed in 1868. Reverse with small paper lost. \$150.00






Item 549-08 – <u>Missent to Hamilton CW</u> – 1862, GB 1 Shilling tied by 12 in grid cancel on folded letter from London England paying the double weight 6d letter rate to Montreal. Endorsed via Londonderry and then missent to Hamilton (b/s). Redirected to Montreal and received 2 days later. There is two recorded examples of this 1860's missent to Hamilton. Ex Cloutier. \$200.00



Item 549-09 – Nova Scotia DPMG – A. Woodgate – 1854, GPO Halifax wrapper signed by the Deputy Postmaster General of Nova Scotia A. Woodgate. Mailed free frank to West River with Post Office Business Free double broken circle in black. Staining. \$150.00



Item 549-10 – <u>Tring CE Registered</u> – 1861, registered stampless cover from Tring CE paid 5¢ paying the letter rate to St. Joseph with registry fee paid in cash. St. Francois de Beauce (b/s). \$75.00



Item 549-11 – <u>Walkerton UC Registered</u> – 1865, registered stampless cover from Walkerton UC <u>rated free</u> to Quebec (b/s) via Toronto (b/s) with registry fee paid in cash. Bruce County. \$75.00




Item 549-12 – <u>Windsor UC Registered</u> – 1865, registered stampless cover from Windsor UC paid 5¢ to Ottawa (b/s) via Toronto (b/s) with registry fee paid in cash. GWR JA 1 66 (b/s). Half back flap off. \$50.00




Item 549-13 – <u>Kincardine UC Registered</u> – 1863, registered stampless cover from Kincardine UC mailed unpaid with 7¢ collect to Goderich (b/s) with registry fee paid in cash. Bruce County. \$75.00



Item 549-14 – <u>Paid at Montreal "1"</u> – 1854, Forester, Moir & Co. General Commission Merchants printed prices current circular (*wools, teas, tobaccos, coffees, sugars, scotch, earthenware*) from Montreal with the scarce Paid at Montreal 1 paying 1¢ circular rate to Stanstead (b/s) via Compton (b/s). \$200.00




Item 549-15 – <u>Shelburne NS registered letter wrapper</u> – 1863, green official form from Postmaster in Jordan River to Postmaster at Shelburne, Shelburne and Yarmouth postmark inside form in appropriate places and then signed and mailed. An interesting piece showing one of the more obscure aspects of the treatment of registered letters. These special registered wrappers were in shade of green for easy recognition. Very scarce \$400.00



Item 549-16 – <u>Trinidad and Tobago to Montreal</u> – 1870, stampless folded letter from Campbell & Co in Trinidad to the Griffin Brothers in Montreal. Endorsed per mail via Portland (Maine). Campbell was known for trading sugar, associated products of molasses and rum. The letter relates to molasses. \$200.00 **SOLD**





Item 549-17 – **2¢ Soldier rate – Northwest Expeditionary Force** – 1885, 1¢ SQ (2, both edge fault) tied by Hamilton duplex cancel on cover paying 2¢ Soldier letter rate to Battleford NWT. Addressed to Lt H.W. Mickie, K Commanding Office, Queens Own Rifles, Northwest Expeditionary Force, with Colonel Otter, Battleford via Qu'Appelle NWT. 1 of 4 recorded examples with 1¢ SQ, see Arfken page 88, cover #7 and illustrated in BNA Topics vol 44 p.17. \$2,500.00





Item 549-18 – <u>Pictou to U.S. advertising and unclaimed</u> – 1877, 3¢ SQ (perfs gum toned, foxing all-over) tied by two-ring cancel on cover from Pictou N.S. paying 3¢ letter rate to Boston U.S. Advertised, unclaimed and returned via the U.S. and Canadian DLO (b/s). DLO 1 Maltese Cross in circle (b/s). \$100.00





Item 549-19 – Queens Valley Manitoba with two 2¢ RLS – 1891, 1¢, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS (2) tied by grid cancel on John Pearce Seeds reply cover from Queens Valley Manitoba paying 8¢ registered letter rate to London (b/s). Via Winnipeg and Ottawa (b/s). \$200.00 SOLD








Item 549-21 – **12¢ double weight cross border rate** – 1872, 6¢ SQ pair tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel on cover paying 12¢ double weight cross border letter rate to New York. \$125.00



Item 549-22 – **5¢ UPU to Denmark** – 1893, ½¢ SQ (10, many jumbo, perfs gum toned) tied by Yorkville Ont duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Denmark (b/s) via London England (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 549-23 - 2¢ SQ on 1¢ domestic stationery card - 1892, 2¢ SQ tied by St. John NB Barred Circle on 1¢ stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Liverpool. Paid Liverpool US Packet. 2¢ SQ added to ensure 2¢ UPU PC rate accepted in use with domestic postcard. Fault at right. \$100.00



Item 549-24 – Ste Marie de Monnoir Que – 1894, 1¢ SQ cancelled by matching cork cancel on 1¢ stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to France. \$50.00 SOLD





Item 549-25 – <u>Hamilton registered oval</u> – 1879, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by oval Registered Hamilton Ont OC 8 79 cancel on cover paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Niagara (b/s) via Clifton (b/s). \$75.00




Item 549-26 – <u>Elora Ont registered to Legislative Assembly</u> – 1897, 2¢ SQ strip of 4 (small corner fault LR) tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Elora Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto. Returned to Elora (b/s). \$50.00 SOLD



Item 549-27 – Montreal Barred Circle hammer II – 1900, 2¢ UPU stationery card mailed from Montreal with Barred Circle hammer II paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Holland. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 549-28 – Quebec City 1¢ drop – 1889, 1¢ SQ tied by Quebec duplex cancel on lady cover paying 1¢ drop letter rate. The cover is addressed to Mrs Amyot, the spouse of Colonel J.B. Amyot (Quebec Rifles / Northwest Rebellion). 1¢ drop for Quebec City covers are very scarce. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 549-29 – <u>Halifax printed circular</u> – 1874, 1¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on Murray & Co. printed circular paying 1¢ circular rate to Shelburne N.S. Sugar, molasses, soaps etc. \$75.00



Item 549-30 – **5¢ UPU to England redirected to India** – 1888, 1¢ (2) 3¢ SQ (interesting shades) tied by Petrolea Ont duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to England (b/s) via Hamilton Ont (b/s). Redirected to India. \$75.00



Item 549-31 – <u>Trenton Ont registered</u> – 1873, 2¢ (11½x12) 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Trenton ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Toronto. Trenton cds with inner arc hammer. Light stain \$50.00



Item 549-32 – Montreal Barred Circle hammer I – 1900, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Toronto paying 7¢ registered to U.S. (b/s) via Montreal. Montreal Barred Circle hammer I (b/s). Very scarce hammer. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 549-34 – Montreal Barred Circle hammer IV – 1900, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Montreal with Barred Circle hammer IV paying 7¢ registered letter rate to U.S. (b/s). \$100.00




Item 549-35 – Montreal Barred Circle hammer II – 1894, 8¢ SQ tied by oval registered cancel on Le Monde Newspaper advertising cover from Montreal, Barred Circle hammer II NO 1 9P4 94, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$100.00



Item 549-36 – <u>Montreal Barred Circle hammer V</u> – 1903, certificate of Post Office registration numbered 5919 for mail to Quebec with Montreal Barred Circle hammer V. \$100.00



Item 549-37 – Montreal Barred Circle hammer II – 1894, 2¢, 3¢ (2) SQ tied by oval registered cancel on John Barry & Sons c/c cover from Montreal, Barred Circle hammer II, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Hemmingford (b/s). Redirected to Frontier (Huntingdon County) via Corbin (b/s). \$75.00






Item 549-38 – <u>5¢ UPU letter rate to Turkey</u> – 1894, 1¢ (2), 3¢ SQ tied by Galt Ont squared circle on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Turkey (in Asia). Routed via Hamilton and Constantinople receiver (b/s). The cover is addressed to Tarsus, Mersin, Namroon in the mountains in southeastern Turkey. \$1,000.00






Item 549-39 – <u>Canadian Pkt East</u> – 1877, 3¢ SQ pair tied by grid cancel on Intercolonial Railway cover paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to England (b/s). This cover has been handled on board the ship with the very rare Canadian Pkt E dated 14 JY 1877 applied by the sorting postal clerk accompanying the mail and in charge of the ocean mail service. This cover was probably part of supplementary or too late mail. \$1,000.00





Item 549-40 – <u>5¢ UPU rate to Newfoundland May 5, 1879</u> – 1879, 5¢ SQ cancelled by grid cancel on cover from Amherst N.S. paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to St. John's Newfoundland (b/s) via Halifax (b/s). This is a key very early UPU cover to Newfoundland, perhaps the earliest recorded use. \$500.00





Item 549-41 – <u>Boer War - to Williamstown Ont (GGY)</u> – 1900, GB 1d letter card from British Army Field P.O. S.A. (Boer War) from J.A.B. Mclennan (*stationed at Belmont Camp and moving to Modder River*), to Williamstown Ont (Squared circle RF 30) via Lancaster. Family letter to his brother. Ex Wannerton. \$300.00



Item 549-42 – <u>Boer War – Rossland Rifle Company (Rossland BC)</u> – 1900, stampless cover from British Army P.O. S.A., endorsed *Soldier Letter / No Stamp Obtainable*, to Rossland B.C. (b/s) via London. Initially taxed and struck out. The letter is certainly from a soldier serving with the Rossland Rifle Company, 1st Contingent. Perhaps W.H. McHarg, from the A Company. \$350.00 **SOLD**


