
Item 551-11 – J.S. Macdonald 1st Premier of Ontario – 1870, stampless cover from Toronto paid 3 paying 3¢ letter rate to Berlin (b/s). The cover is signed by J. Sandfield Macdonald, the Premier "In Office" of the new Province of Ontario. Macdonald was Premier of Ontario and held the portfolio of Attorney-General (A.G.). He had a long political career beginning in Glengarry in 1841. He opposed Confederation but reconciled with it upon its completion and in 1867 was persuaded by John A. Macdonald to accept the office of Premier in the new Province of Ontario. \$300.00






