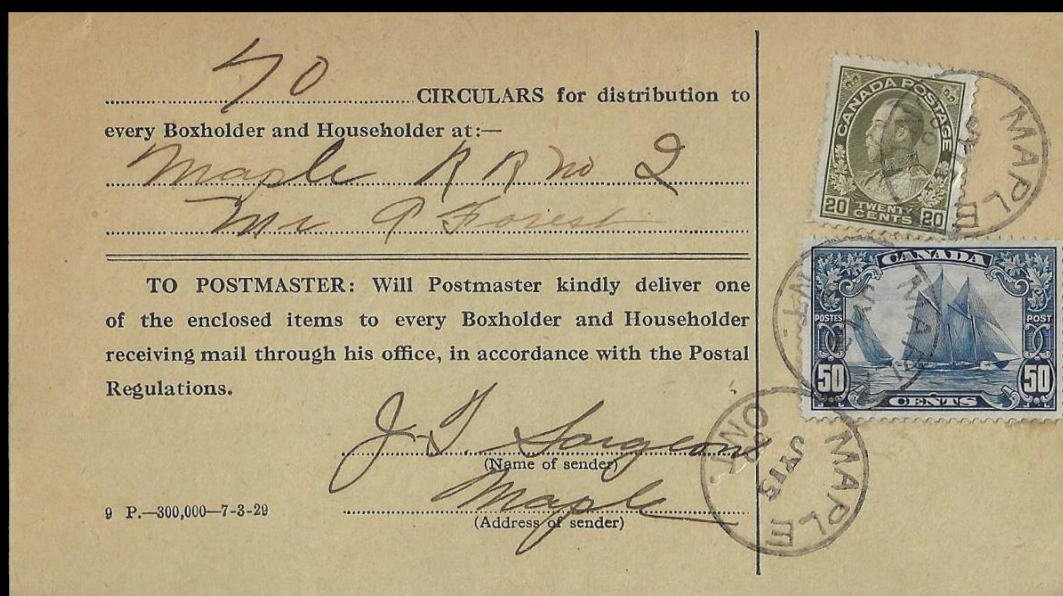

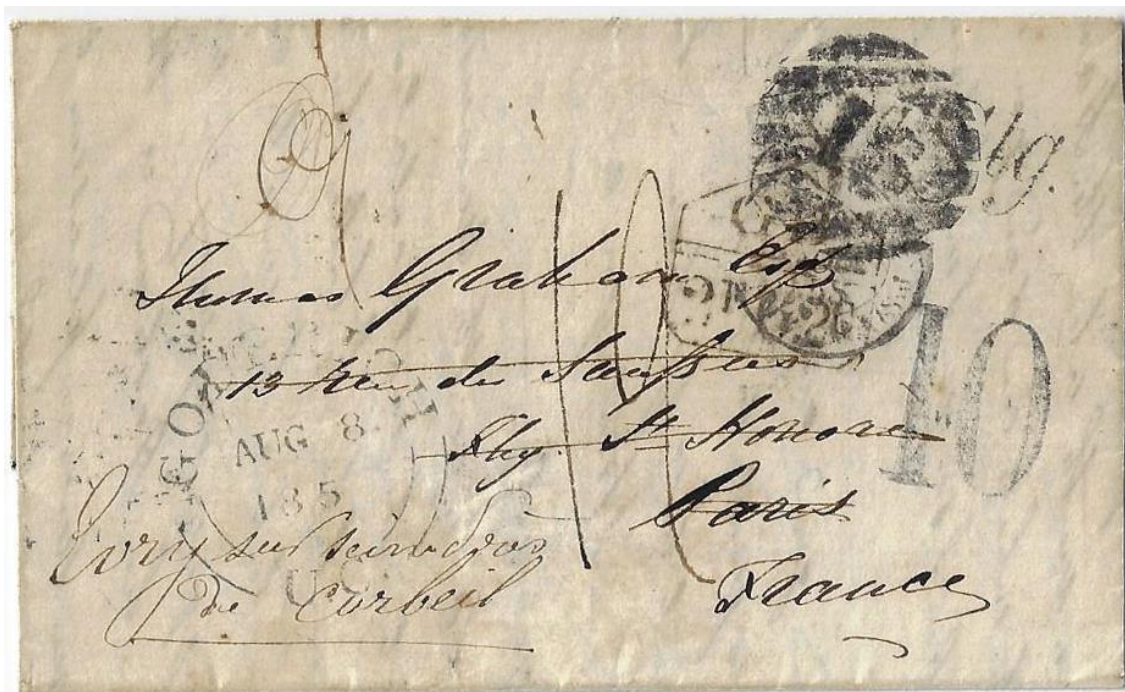


Item 554-01 – **2½% exchange surcharge** – 1843, business folded letter from Hamilton dated DE 28 43 to New York. Rated 4½d and 25¢ US postage converted to 1/3 plus ½d exchange premium total 1/8 prepaid. The fluctuation in the rates exchange in 1842 obliged the Canadian Post Office to introduce an exchange surcharge. This temporary 2½% surcharge on U.S. postage was collected in Canada. The change was effective May 17 1842 to Dec 27 1843. The letter is dated the day before DPMG Stayner sent the circular about the end of the surcharge. Ex Palmer p.245-6, Steinhart. \$500.00



Item 554-02 – **2½% exchange surcharge** – 1844, business folded letter from Hamilton dated JA 13 44 to New York. Rated 4½d and 25¢ US postage converted to 1/3 plus ½d exchange premium total 1/8 prepaid. As the previous letter, due to fluctuation in the rates exchange, the Canadian Post Office introduced an exchange surcharge. The end of the temporary 2½% surcharge on U.S. postage was announced after a circular of Deputy Postmaster General dated DE 28 43. According to this letter, the Hamilton Post Office did not know about the lifting of this regulation at the time of mailing. The premium was effective May 17 1842 to Dec 27 1843. Ex Palmer p.245-6, Steinhart. \$500.00





Item 554-03 – **Goderich to France - Hamilton "16"** – 1858, folded letter from Goderich UC dated AU 8 58 to Paris, France via Hamilton. Rated 10d Cy and 8d Stg in black collect with sterling rate struck out by Hamilton grid 16. Carried by Cunard Europa which collided with the Arabia and returned to Newfoundland. The letter was transferred to the "Persia", via England, then France. Anglo-French accountancy handstamp "2F62c". Reverse with black mourning stripe. Multiple French backstamps and London (b/s). Red boxed "2e31" and black boxed "2/c" (b/s). While the accountancy handstamp is rare, this is presumably only the second example of the Hamilton grid "16" on cover. A showpiece! \$1,000.00



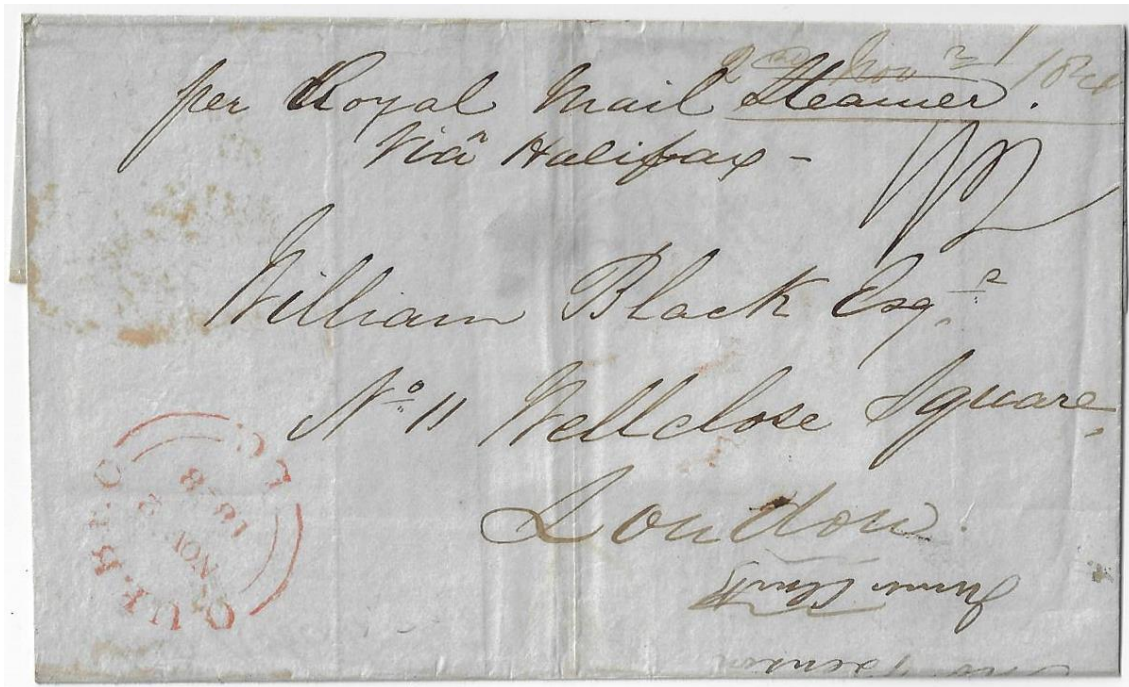


Item 554-04 – **Wood Brothers - Jewellers** – 1842, lengthy family letter from Montreal, dated JA 22 42, prepaid to London. Endorsed “Paid by way of Halifax”. Carried by the Cunard Britannia 9<sup>th</sup> voyage, Halifax to Liverpool. The 4-page letter relates to Silver, Gold, clocks, watches, account, monies and general merchandise. The writer mentions some worries about the merchandise potentially being robbed by sailors. A very usual routing by the overland winter route to Halifax. \$100.00

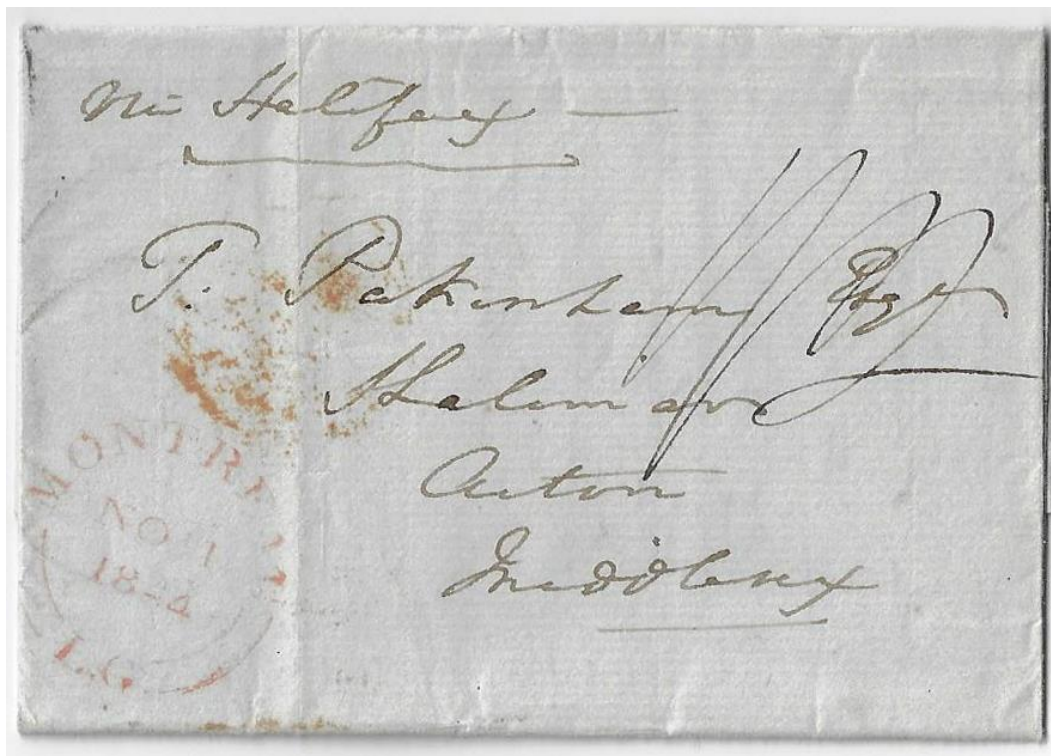


Item 554-05 – **Toronto – family letter to London via Halifax** – 1848, lengthy family letter dated JA 9 48 on black mourning stripe paper, cross written, from Toronto to London England. Endorsed via Halifax. Carried by Cunard Acadia 28<sup>th</sup> voyage from Halifax to Liverpool. A scarce letter from Ontario routed by the winter overland route to Halifax. \$100.00

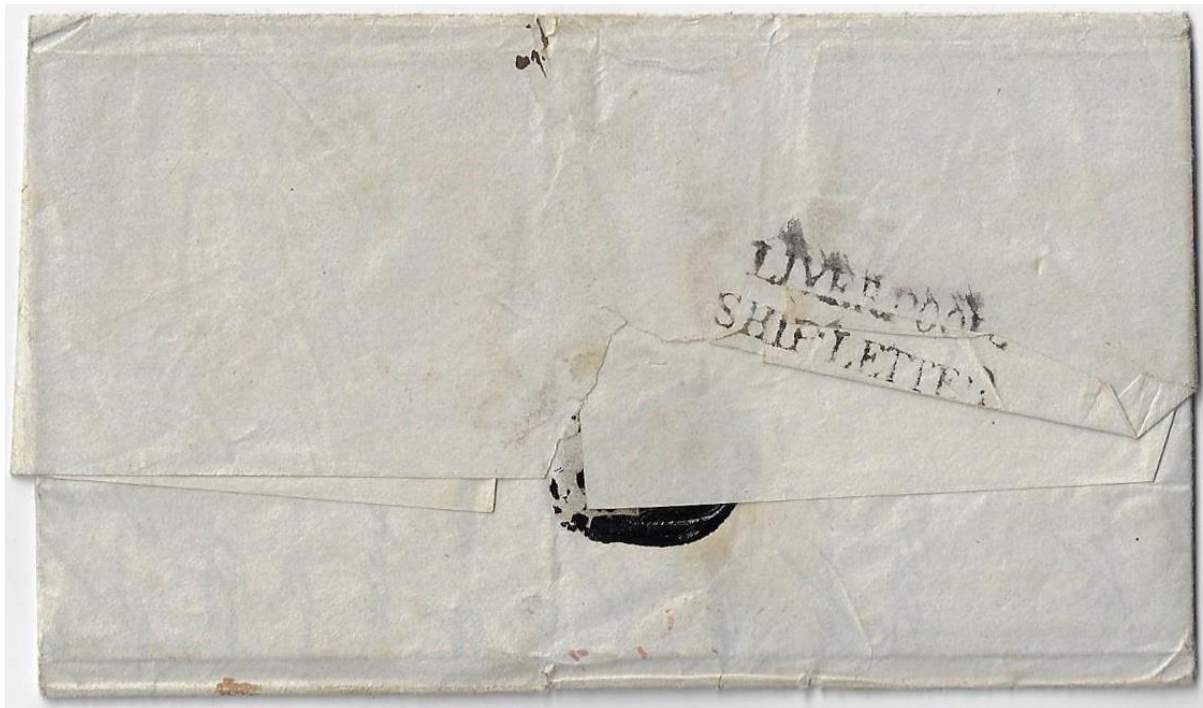




Item 554-06 – **Quebec to London England via Halifax** – 1848, stampless folded cover from Quebec rated 1/2 Sterling paying the Cunard rate to London. Carried by Cunard Europa 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage from Halifax to Liverpool. \$50.00



Item 554-07 – **Montreal to London England via Halifax** – 1844, folded business letter from Montreal rated 1/2 Sterling paying the Cunard rate to Aston England. Carried by Cunard Hibernia from Halifax to Liverpool. \$50.00

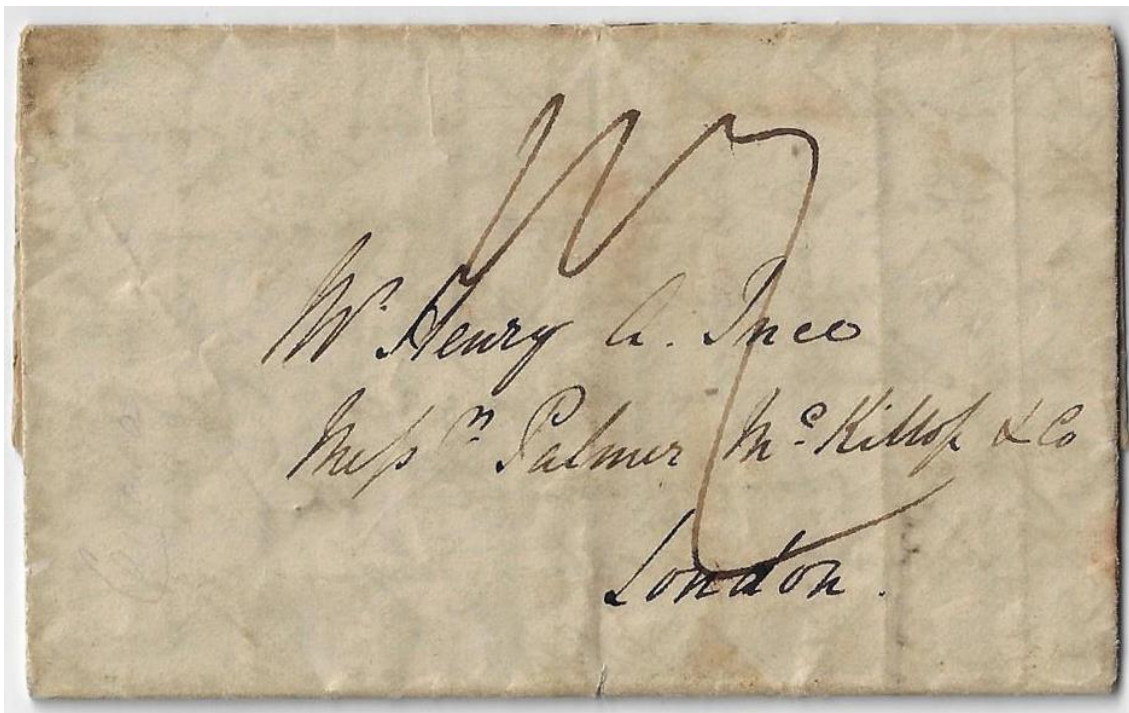
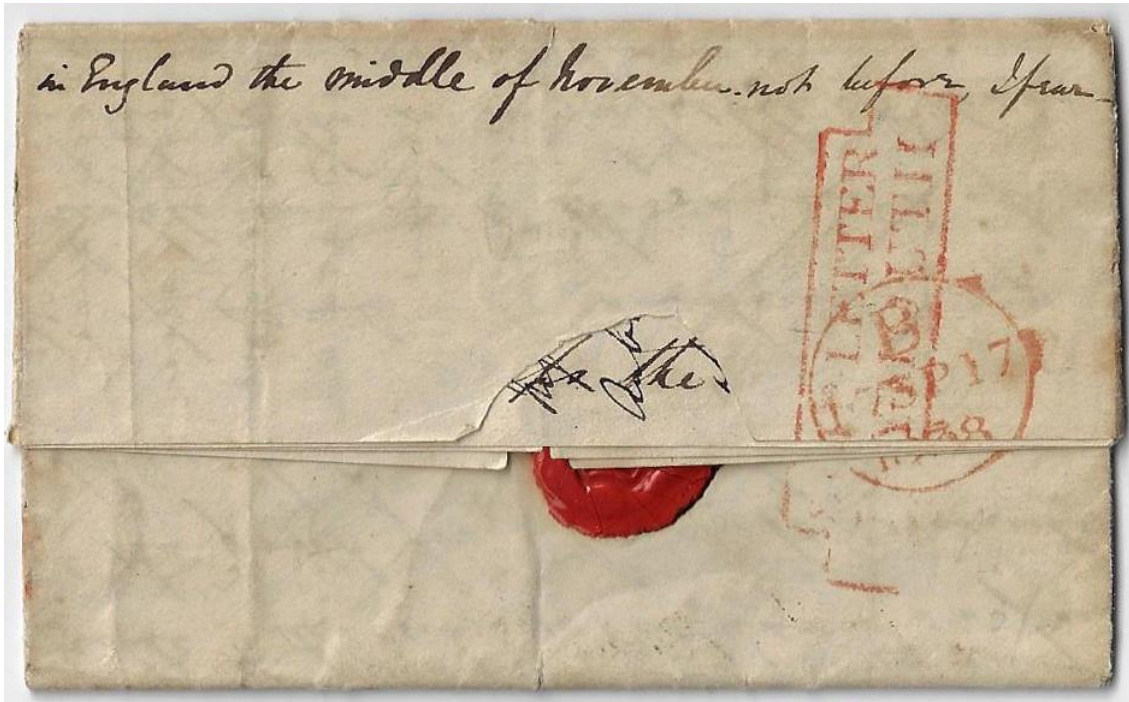


Item 554-08 – **Boots and shoes business** – 1839, business folded letter from Montreal to Denton England fully prepaid to New York. Rated 4½d to the lines and 18¾¢ US postage to New York. Carried by American Packet private trader, entered as Ship Letter in Liverpool (b/s). Rated 1/3 collect representing ship fee and British inland postage to Denton. The letter is from James Rhodes Jr. and relates to footwear business. Boots for ladies, policemen, children etc. In 1839, Samuel Cunard was awarded the first British transatlantic steamship mail contract, and the true reign started the next year in 1840. A late private trader carrier. \$100.00



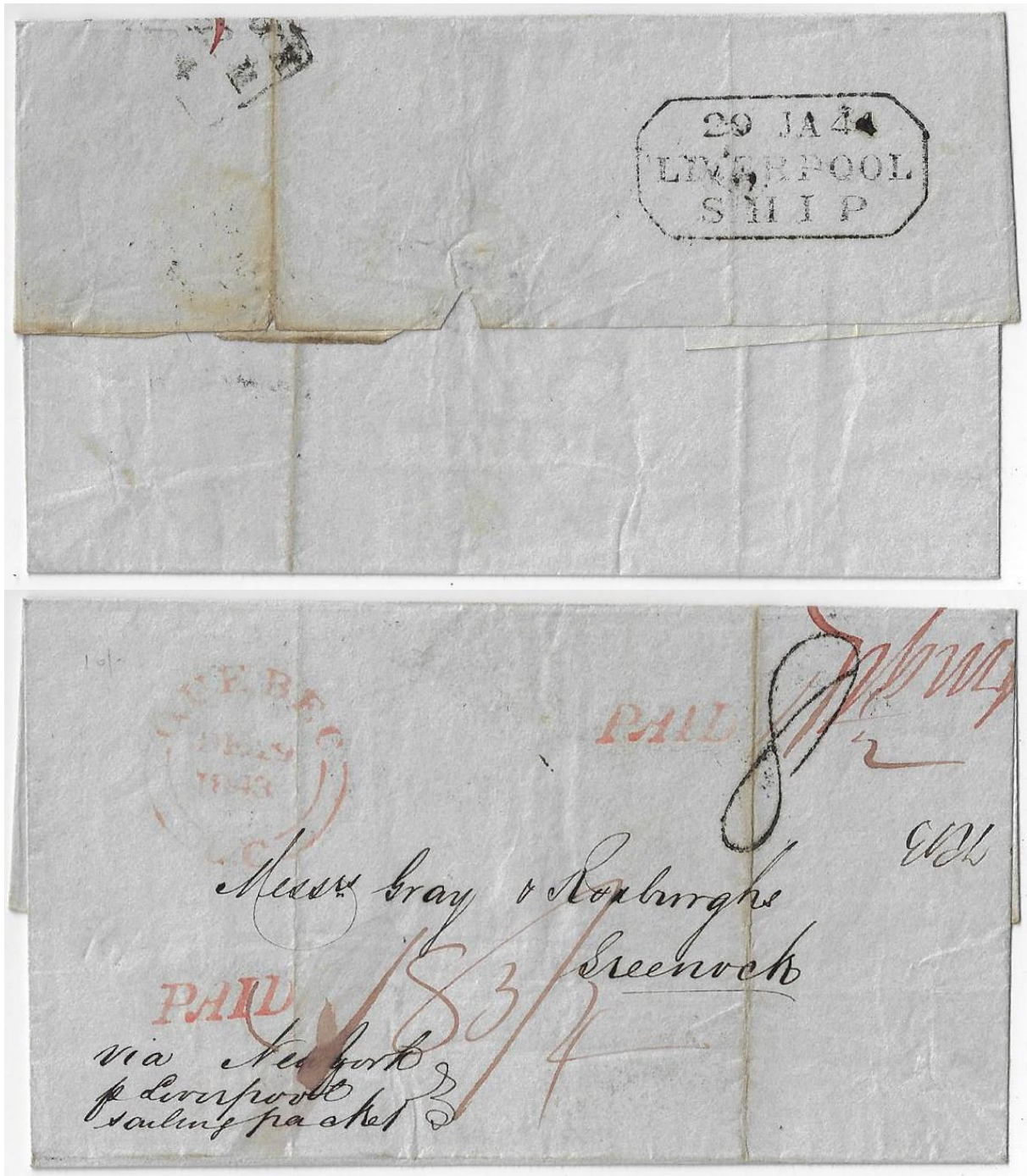


Item 554-09 – **Quebec City major rockfalls** – 1841, partial folded letter from Quebec rated 1/2 Sterling to Tyttenhanger Park, Hertfordshire, England. Carried by Cunard Caledonia 6<sup>th</sup> voyage from Boston to Liverpool. The letter is from Earl of Caledon to Countess of Caledon (family seal in black). The letter relates to the major rockfalls that occurred to the Lower Town of Quebec City on 17 May 1841. The boulders from Cap Diamant demolished eight houses and killed 32 people. It reads in part: *buried a number of the inhabitant I believe 37 bodies were dug out but the mass of rocks was so large that some of the bodies and part of the houses are still covered.....* An historical letter, too bad it is only partial. \$100.00



Item 554-10 – **Montreal family letter – Liverpool Ship Letter in red** – 1838 family letter (heavily cross written) from Montreal to London England. Carried by a New York private trader ship company. Entered in Liverpool as Ship Letter (b/s, struck in red), rated 1/7 representing ship letter fee and inland postage to London. \$100.00





Item 554-11 – Quebec to Scotland by private ship Elizabeth - wrecked – 1843, folded cover from Quebec to Greenock fully prepaid to New York. Rated 4½d to the lines, 18¼¢ to New York. Carried by the private ship Elizabeth that wrecked in October 1844. Entered in Liverpool as ship letter, rated 8d Stg collect in Greenock. An interesting short-lived carrier. \$175.00

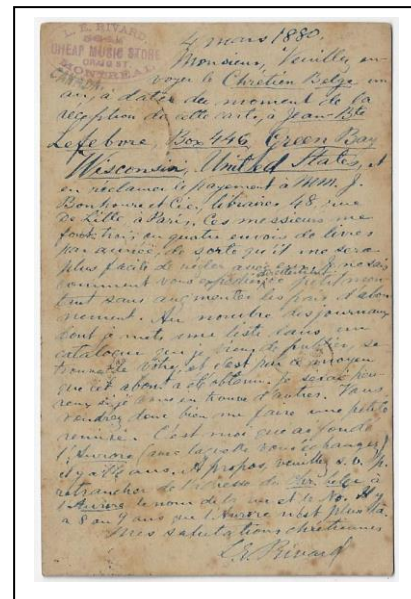


Item 554-12 – 7¢ registered fully prepaid by stamps – 1865, 1¢ Decimal (2, deep rose), 5¢ Beaver (sulfurized) tied by diamond grid cancel on cover from Toronto paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Guelph (b/s). Registered straight-line struck in red. \$400.00



Item 554-13 – 17¢ Cunard rate via the U.S. – Canada 92<sup>nd</sup> voyage – 1862, 17¢ Cartier (light gum toned perfs, plate flaw dash in oval between O and S of postage) tied by Hamilton UC datestamp, mutilated device with UC excised, on lady cover paying 17¢ Cunard rate via the U.S. to Sunderland, England (b/s). Carried by the Cunard Canada 92<sup>nd</sup> voyage. The Cunarder Canada has 106 voyages recorded. \$500.00






Item 554-14 – **UK card to Belgium** – 1880, 2¢ UK card Webb P3 from Montreal paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Belgium (b/s) via London (b/s). The card is from L.E. Rivard Book Cheap Music Store. Ex Murphy. \$175.00



Item 554-15 – **UK card to Hungary** – 1882, 2¢ UK card Webb P3 from Whitby Ont paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Budapest, Hungary via London (b/s). Part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. The card is from Rob Campbell and relates to stamps. \$175.00





Item 554-16 – **The Fort Garry Star (Lacelle 994)** – 1872, 3¢ SQ rose-carmine tied by a Fort Garry Star (Lacelle 994) on cover, dated FE 12 72, paying 3¢ letter rate to Owen Sound (b/s). Routed via the U.S. by the winter route (Pembina, St. Paul, Chicago, Windsor) and possibly transported by dog team mail. The summer eastbound journey was overland and by canoe brigade to Fort William and by steamer to Collingwood. Greene cert 2022 No. G29255. Ex Kenyon, Richardson. \$500.00



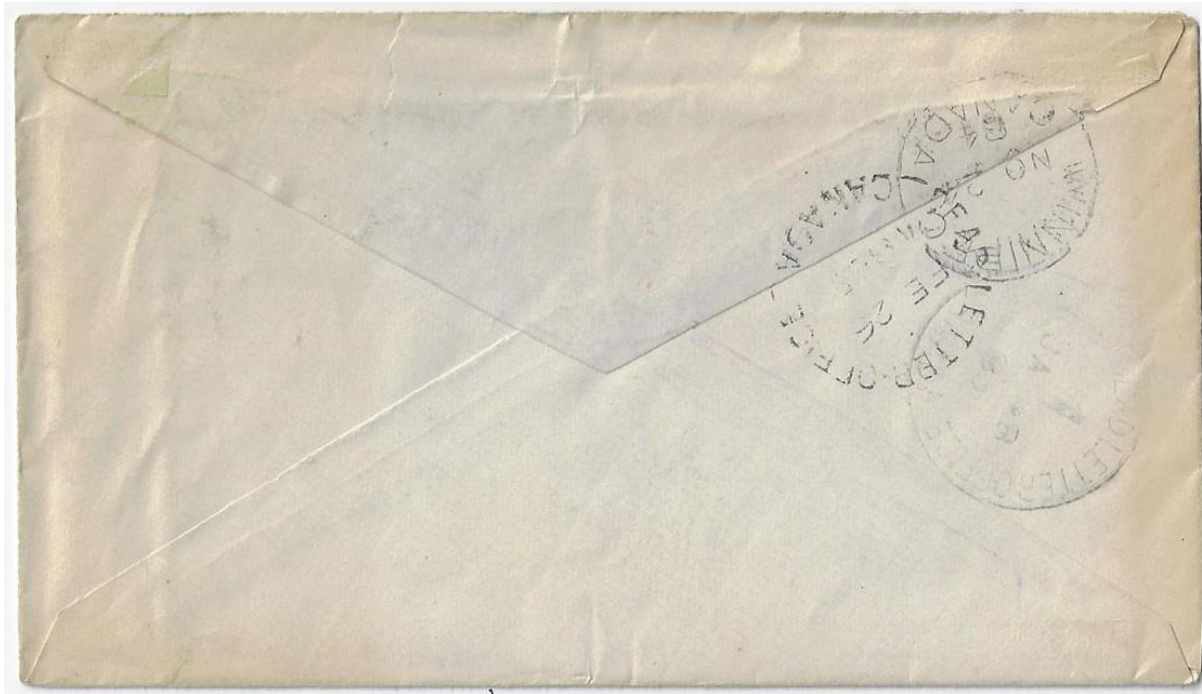


Item 554-17 – **Registered No. Hamilton type 1** – 1874, 2¢, 6¢ SQ tied by Hamilton duplex “5” cancel on GWR cover with oval Registered No. 257 Hamilton type 1 cancel, broken circle free strike, paying 8¢ double weight registered letter rate to Waterloo. Very rare. Ex Harrison, Cloutier, Lemke. \$300.00



Item 554-18 – **Registered Hamilton type 2** – 1877, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by oval Registered Hamilton type 2 cancel, on cover paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Toronto. Scarce. Ex Harrison, Averbeck, Lemke. \$200.00

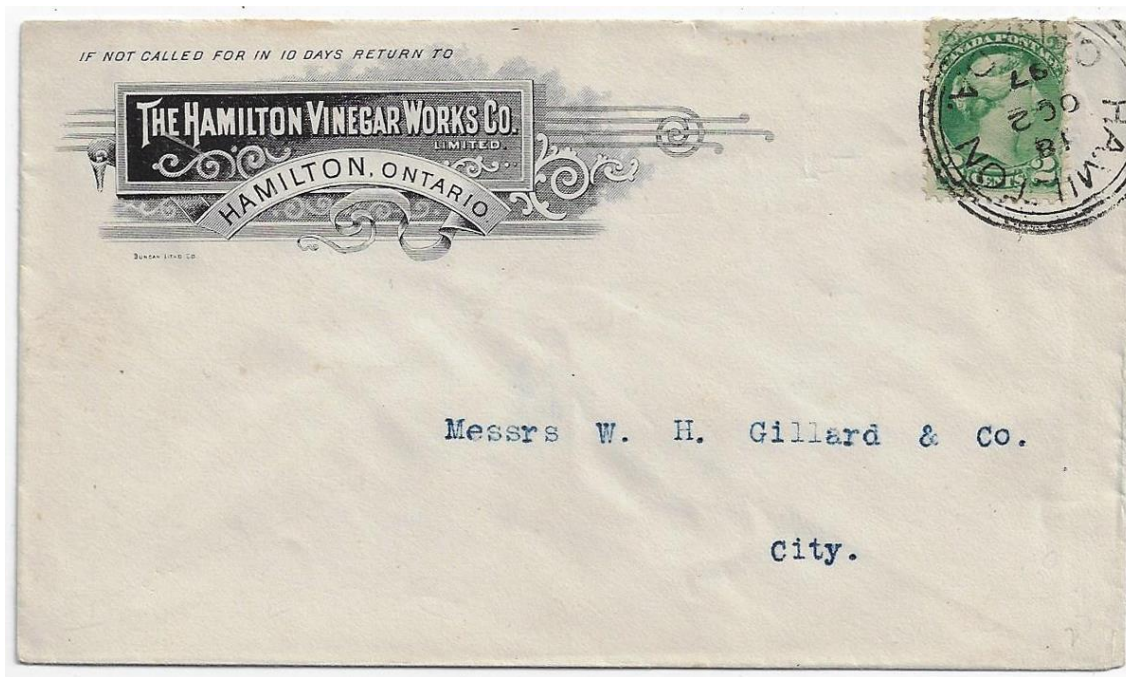

Redirected to Winnipeg (b/s NO 24 84), not called for and sent to the Dead Letter Office JA 8 85. Returned with DLO FE 26 85. Ex Averbeck. \$250.00





Item 554-20 – **10¢ SQ salmon pink – to France and Italy** – 1896, 10¢ SQ salmon pink (bright and fresh) tied by Montreal Imperial machine cancel on cover dated DE 4 96 paying 10¢ double weight UPU letter rate to France (b/s). Carried by Steamship La Bretagne via New York. Once in France, redirected to Florence Italy (b/s). Ex Bowen. \$750.00

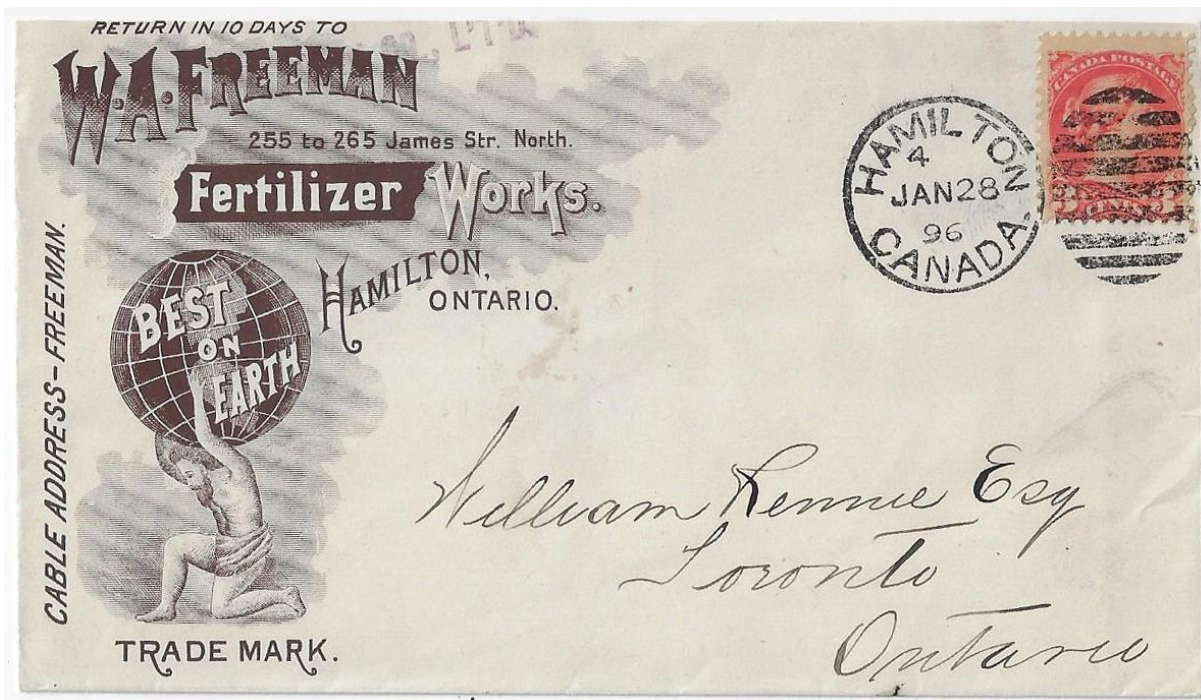

GENTLEMEN,—

We have much pleasure in recommending our Vitrified Salt Glazed Sewer Pipe for Culverts across common Roads in place of plank bridges and box culverts, which are constantly getting out of repair, and last but a few years at most, whereas a Salt Glazed Stoneware Pipe will last for ages without any repairs whatever, and will prove cheapest in the long run as well as best, especially as lumber is becoming more expensive every year. The construction of a Pipe Culvert is a very simple matter. The ditch when brought to grade should be made of uniform inclination, commencing at the outlet or lower side of the road. The pipes should be laid with the sockets facing *up grade*. If the top of the pipe when laid is less than two feet below the surface of the road bed, first cover the pipes with earth to the depth of a few inches, level it off, then place a few poles or fence rails over the pipe lengthwise, and throw on more earth, and grade up to the level of the road bed. The rails or poles will serve to equalize the pressure on the pipes when the wheels of heavy wagons pass over them, but if the earth is two feet deep or more, no protection is necessary. The ends of the Culvert should be protected by small abutments of stone or plank as shown in cut above, otherwise the end pipes might be undermined by the action of the water. In many cases no abutment is made, but a few stones placed around the pipe is better. The size of Pipe required in each particular case depends of course on the amount of water to be provided for. We have them from 8 to 18 inches for Road Culverts, Street Crossings and Railroad Culverts.

The Highway Commissioners' Convention held at Springfield, Illinois, April 22, 1884, unanimously passed the following resolution:—

RESOLVED: That we, the Highway Commissioners of the State of Illinois are satisfied (from practical experience) that Pipe Culverts are a decided success, and we would recommend their use, wherever practicable as a substitute for board culvert.
