








Item 556-05 – <u>Senator Pierre Baillargeon MD (Quebec)</u> – 1874, Senate free franked cover from Senator Pierre Baillargeon to Henry Morgan. The letter signed P Baillargeon relates to questions/answers for The Canadian parliamentary companion published by Morgan. Pierre Baillargeon (1812-1891) was a physician and political figure in Quebec. He sat for Stadacona division in the Senate of Canada from 1874 to 1891. He was born in Île-aux-Grues, LC. Baillargeon received an MD from Harvard University. He was a member of the Boston Medical Society. His brother Charles-François Baillargeon was archbishop of Quebec. A great piece for a Quebec political figure collection. \$150.00




Item 556-40 – **8¢ Arch single usage** – 1933, 8¢ Arch tied by Wetaskiwin Alta cds on cover paying 8¢ airmail letter rate to California, USA. The 8¢ airmail rate to the U.S. is scarce and was effective from AU 1 32 to JY 1 34. Postage paid with an 8¢ Arch single is exceedingly rare as I observe that most airmail covers were with C1, C2 stamps etc. Interestingly, the 8¢ Arch was ordered for the double weight UPU surface rate requirements. Roughly opened and small tear at top. \$200.00





Item 556-41 – Rivers Inlet BC to China – 1935, 1¢ Medallion (2), 3¢ Silver Jubilee tied by grid cancel on cover from Rivers Inlet BC paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to China. Redirected within (numerous b/s). Odd franking!!! RF C and office closed in 1942. \$125.00







Item 556-44 – Reported Missing – 1945, 4¢ War booklet stamp tied by Summerside MPO 625 PEI cds on cover to F/O Jack McElhone, "Reported Missing", returned to sender with PMG notice via MPO 304 Ottawa and Ottawa DLO. \$150.00





The cover is addressed to Royal Canadian Corps of Signals Lcol J.W. Ellinthorpe MM, for bravery in battle. 3<sup>rd</sup> CA Div Signals RCCS. \$125.00



Item 556-46 – <u>Jeanne Mance Camp Montreal</u> – 1941, 2¢ Mufti tied by Buy Victory Bond in French machine cancel on Jeanne Mance Camp MD4 cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. The military camp was located near Park Avenue and Esplanade. Philatelic origin but this is the only way to have one example. They are all philatelic covers. \$75.00




Item 556-47 – **Not Interned in Canada** – 1944, Italian Red Cross postcard from Rome (Roma Ferrovial RPO) to an Italian prisoner of war in Great Britain. passed by British censor with crown in red. Then apparently redirected to Canada with two-line h/s "Not Interned in Canada". No other Canadian marking or receiver. Written in Italian. \$150.00




Item 556-48 – Rejected by censor – 1944, German prisoner of war folded letter form IO17 mailed from Lethbridge Alberta POW Camp, with the very scarce Air Mail 30¢ POW 133 meter machine #48007, paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Germany. Rejected by censor. The letter is from a German sailor mechanical technician to his mother. No reason is given by the censor for the rejection. This POW was apparently permitted to work alongside Canadians as one of his comments is on the negative attitudes of some Canadians towards the war. It is quite possible that this comment could be constructed as giving succor to the enemy and was reason for the letter's rejection. A very scarce meter and a rare rejected handstamp. \$350.00 SOLD


Item 556-49 – Canadian Red Cross parcel acknowledgment card – 1943, Red Cross printed acknowledgement card sent to its Canadian affiliate by a "possibly" Canadian soldier serving with the U.S. Army and captured by the Italian Forces. Edward R. Herman 39080331 U.S. Army. The card was sent free as indicated. The weak double circle is an Italian censor's hand stamp "Militaro Censura Posta Estera (Foreign mail). The International Red Cross Society was appointed intermediary between combatants under the Geneva Convention. The Society's mandate to aid in the care and welfare of POWs which included care of wounded, exchange of mails etc. A seldom seen parcel card and is highly desirable because it relates to Canadians, Italians and Americans. Obvious creases and folds. \$100.00



Item 556-50 – Censor's deletion – Canadian Officer POW – 1945, 10¢ War tied by Ottawa machine cancel on prescribed prisoner of war folded form from Mrs Cecil Burn to Lt John Cecil Burn, a Canadian office held at Stalag Luft 1 POW camp in Germany. Mailed a month before the war ended. The letter was censored with deletion, carried over and then returned with "addressee returned to Canada" handstamp. Ottawa MPO 304 (b/s). \$200.00



Item 556-51 – <u>Port Colborne Ont – Canadian Officer POW</u> – 1944, Canada prescribed prisoner of war post folded form from Port Colborne Ontario, from Mrs G.S. Macdonald to Lt G.S. Macdonald, a Canadian officer serving with the British Forces, held in Oflag 79 POW camp in Germany. No stamp despite the advice of the requirement of 10¢ postage. No gum or stamp residue, slipped through as free. Censored by DB 453 and German censor Oflag 76 Gepruft 8. A very scarce letter to a Canadian. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 556-52 – German POW – Farnham Que POW 40 – 1943, 10¢, 20¢ War tied by POW 40 cds on prisoner of war mail postcard, censored DB 687, German censor Ab (Berlin), paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Germany. The card is from a German sailor. \$75.00





Item 556-59 – An interesting Cameo Centennial item – 1967, 2¢ Cameo tied by Port Alberni BC cds on appliance warranty card underpaying 3¢ printed matter rate to Fergus. The printed matter rate applicable to these partly printed partly written card, not at postcard rate, 2¢ double double deficiency postage due paid with 2¢ Centennial regular stamp.
