Item 559-01 – <u>Chatham LC (1829-1841)</u> – 1840, McLachlan family letter from Chatham LC rated 7d collect to Bytown Mills. This postmark is the Chatham LC first period 1829-1841 before the Post Office being renamed Carillon. The letter relates to flour and potatoes. A very scarce Argenteuil County postmark and exhibit quality. \$200.00



Item 559-02 – <u>Frampton LC (Dorchester County)</u> – 1843, folded cover from Frampton LC rated 1/4 collect to Kingston. This postmark is recorded from 1839 to 1862, seldom seen and exhibit quality. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 559-03 – <u>Chambly LC (Richelieu River)</u> – 1850, folded cover from Chambly LC rated 4½d collect to Montreal (b/s). This is probably the nicest Chambly 1839 order postmark that I have seen. Exhibit quality! \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 559-04 – <u>Dunham LC (Missisquoi)</u> – 1844, folded cover from Dunham LC, <u>struck in green</u>, rated 4½d collect to Montreal (b/s). A very pretty example of this scarce Missisquoi County office. \$150.00



Item 559-05 – <u>Wroxeter Accountant c/c</u> – 1868, stampless cover with William Lawrie Accountant and Conveyancer c/c mailed from Wroxeter UC paid 3 (in green) paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s) redirected to Toronto (b/s). \$125.00 SOLD



Item 559-06 – Nottawasaga UC (1841-1857 – Simcoe) – 1850, folded cover from Nottawasaga UC rated 1/1½d collect to Barrie (b/s). This postmark is the current earliest recorded date, AU 13 50. A very scarce Simcoe County office which was in operation from 1841 to 1857 only. A great strike. Small back repair. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 559-07 – <u>Warsaw UC (Peterborough)</u> – 1871, stampless cover from Warsaw UC (basal 0) paid 3 paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A perfect strike. Light reduction at right. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item $559-08 - \underline{\text{Crowland UC (Welland)}} - 1846$, partial folded letter from Crowland UC paid $4\frac{1}{2}$ d to Chippawa (b/s in blue). This is an early example of this postmark, a great strike. \$125.00



Item 559-09 – <u>Moore UC (Lambton)</u> – 1841, folded letter from Moore UC (*struck in bleu, hammer recorded from 1839 to 1842*) datelined Moore River St. Clair MY 7 41 rated 11d collect to the Falls of Niagara. Forwarded from Queenston with 4½d total 1/3½ collect. The letter from William Keating to Samuel Street. \$200.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 559-10 – Colonel Philip VanKoughnet (Cornwall UC) – 1845, OHMS folded letter from Colonel Philip VanKoughnet, in his capacity of inspector, Cornwall UC rated 7d collect to Montreal (b/s). The letter relates to licenses. VanKoughnet was born in New Johnstown (Cornwall). He fought at the Battle of Crysler's Farm during the War of 1812. Later, he was elected to the 7th Parliament of Upper Canada representing Stormont & Russell. In 1833, he was involved in the establishment of a canal at Cornwall to improve transportation along the St.Lawrence River. VanKoughnet Island, off the canal, was named for him. In 1836, VanKoughnet was appointed to the Legislative Council of U.C. by Lieutenant Governor Sir Francis Bond Head. In 1838, he commanded the 2nd Stormont Regiment at the Battle of the Windmill. \$200.00 SOLD





Item 559-11 -Vittoria UC manuscript postmark - 1847, business letter from Ancaster UC paid 4%d to Vittoria (b/s). Manuscript postmark as receiver marking. This ms postmark has been simultaneously used with other devices during a 25 years period. The letter is of legal nature and relates to the West half of lot No.2 in the 2^{nd} Concession of the Twp of Houghton. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 559-12 – Amiens UC (the only known example) – 1849, folded letter from Amiens UC, dated May 10 1849, paid 1/6 to Montreal (b/s) via London (b/s). The letter is addressed to the Montreal merchant John Auld and endorsed "relative to an emigrant – box for ship Cachemire". The letter relates to a box to be shipped to an agent in London England but the sender is not aware of its content and value. He then suggests that the content be valued by the Custom House and bill of charges be forwarded for remittance to the Collector of Customs at Port Stanley. Somewhat interesting. (Amiens UC proofed in 1839 – Amiens CW hammer earliest recorded date AU 3 1849). A rare Middlesex County office and the only recorded example. \$350.00 SOLD



Item 559-13 – <u>Fingal CW (2nd hammer – Elgin County)</u> – 1853, partial folded letter datelined Aldborough 17 AU 53, mailed from Fingal CW, paid 3d to Quebec (b/s) via St. Thomas (b/s). This is the 2nd hammer for Fingal with dater, proofed in 1850. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 559-14 – <u>To L'Original - Montreal & Kingston GTR Way P.O. No.3 D Down</u> – 1861, 5¢ Beaver (scuff LR) tied by concentric ring cancel on mourning lady cover from Carleton Place CW paying 5¢ letter rate to L'Orignal. Carried by the Grand Trunk Railway via Lancaster with Montreal & Kingston GTR Way P.O. No.3 D Down JUL 6 1861, QC-188 RF F. The cover is addressed to Master John Bell and his lady. A great strike! \$250.00 SOLD



Item 559-15 – <u>Two-ring 30 Pictou N.S.</u> – 1873, 6¢ SQ tied by Two-ring 30 cancel on cover from Pictou N.S. paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to Boston. RF 5. Light stain and reduction. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 559-16 – <u>Blyth Ont fancy grid cancel</u> – 1880, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by fancy grid cancel on cover from Blyth Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Clinton (b/s). Oxidized blue cancels. A nice Huron County cover. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 559-17 – <u>The earliest Benmiller UC (Huron)</u> – 1873, 6¢ SQ cancelled by pen cancel, matching brownish ink, on cover from Benmiller UC paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to New York State. Routed via Goderich (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date of all Benmiller cancels and hammers. Closed in 1918. \$175.00 SOLD



Item 559-18 – Auburn fancy cancel – 1881, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Auburn Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Clinton (b/s). Breathtaking! \$150.00 SOLD



Item 559-19 – <u>Undertakers' Supplies</u> – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Hamilton Orb cancel on Semmens & Evel Undertakers' Supplies c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Amherst N.S. Light fold. \$40.00



Item 559-20 – 1¢ Jubilee stationery card - first day JU 19 97 – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee stationery card P16 mailed at Parkdale Toronto dated JU 19 97 to local. It is a commercial use from R. Powell to Gurney Foundry and relates to statement and account. \$750.00



Item 559-21 – **5¢ UPU to NSW, Australia** – 1901, ½¢ Jubilee, ½¢ Numeral, 2¢ Provisional (2) tied by Lunenburg NS broken circle on St. John's Church illustrated cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to New South Wales (b/s) via Vancouver (b/s). Ex Hogg, Cantor. \$300.00



Item 559-22 – <u>8¢ registered to Alabama</u>, <u>US</u> – 1898, 1¢ (2), 5¢ Jubilee tied by Collingwood Ont cds on 1¢ PSE paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Alabama, U.S. (receiver on front). Routed via Toronto and Windsor (b/s). \$275.00





Item 559-23 – **8¢ Maple Leaf – Foxmead Ont (Simcoe)** – 1898, 8¢ Leaf tied by a stunning grid cancel on cover from Foxmead Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Orono via Newcastle (b/s). Numerous RPOs backstamped: Port Hope & Midland No.2, Tor & Mont GTR, Tor & Lorne MC. \$100.00




Item 559-24 – <u>Surprise Soap multicolored</u> – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Henry Wright & Co. c/c and Surprise Soap advertising paying 2¢ letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). \$200.00



Item 559-25 – <u>Truro Frost & Wood Co.</u> – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by Truro NS duplex cancel on Frost & Wood Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Arichat (b/s) via Sydney (b/s) \$50.00






Item 559-26 – <u>Avonmore Ont (Stormont)</u> – 1899, 5¢ Leaf, 2¢ Numeral tied by Avonmore Ont broken circle on Rennie Seeds cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Ottawa (b/s) and Canada Atlantic Railway (RY-14). \$50.00





Item 559-27 – Bank of Montreal – London to Halifax – 1899, 1¢, 2¢ (3) Numeral (perfs gum toned) tied by London Canada cds on Bank of Montreal back embossed c/c cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Halifax (b/s). Montreal & St. John M.C. QC-253 (1896-1913). \$25.00 SOLD





Item 559-28 – Minett Ont (Muskoka) – 1899, 1¢, 3¢ (2) Numeral tied by Minnet Ont broken circle on Rennie Seeds cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Port Carling transit (b/s) and carried by Toronto & North Bay MC GTR No.3 (ON-737). A scarce use of the 3¢ Numeral stamp. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 559-29 – 6¢ Numeral use – 1899, ½¢ (2), 6¢ Numeral tied by Halifax cds on Emily King c/c cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Ohio, U.States (b/s) via St. John NB and New York (b/s). \$125.00



Item 559-30 – <u>Hamilton Royal Distillery</u> – 1898, 3¢ Numeral tied by Hamilton Bickerdike machine cancel, DEC 7 98, on Royal Distillery advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Amherstburg (b/s) via Windsor (b/s). Reduced at right. A scarce and late 3¢ rate advertising cover. \$40.00





Item 559-31 – <u>St. Genevieve de Bastican 8¢ Numeral use</u> – 1898, 8¢ Numeral tied by St. Genevieve de Bastican Que broken circle on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Rock Island Que. Via Montreal (3x b/s). Some staining. A very scarce Quebec cover! \$100.00











Item 559-37 – <u>Hamilton Dowswell washing machines</u> – 1909, 2¢ Edward tied by Hamilton International machine cancel on Dowswell Manufacturing Company advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Smithville. (b/s). The Dowswell brothers were all electric washing machine makers. Monthly statement accompanies. \$75.00





Item 559-38 – **5¢ Quebec on PSE to Switzerland** – 1908, 5¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by Sault Ste. Marie Ont International machine cancel on 2¢ postal stationery envelope overpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Switzerland (b/s). The double weight UPU letter rate was 8¢ at the time. Return address Box 683 Sault Ste. Marie Ont. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 559-39 – 10¢ double wgt UPU to France – 1922, ½¢ (2), 1¢, 2¢ Quebec, 2¢ Admiral (3) tied by Quebec duplex cancel on cover paying 10¢ double weight UPU letter rate to France (b/s). Light fold at left. \$100.00






Item 559-40 - 5c UPU to Germany (officially sealed) -1908, 5c Quebec cancelled by grid cancel on cover from St. Germain de Grantham Que paying 5c UPU letter rate to Baden, Germany (b/s). Opened and officially sealed with kaiserliches postamt tape (imperial post office tape). \$350.00 SOLD



Item 559-41 – <u>Unknown in Switzerland</u> – 1918, 5¢ Admiral tied by Hamilton International machine cancel on censored cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Switzerland (receiver on front). Canadian censor C.219. Received at the correct address, ms "Inconnu" unknown and presumably returned with no other markings. For once, a Great War era 5¢ UPU rate to Switzerland correctly prepaid. \$75.00



Item 559-42 – <u>Granby Que - 20¢ UPU registered to Belgium</u> – 1926, 20¢ Admiral tied by Granby Que roller cancel on cover paying 20¢ UPU registered letter rate to Belgium via Montreal (b/s). Redirected within Belgium. Granby Q Keyhole registration handstamp. \$300.00




Item 559-43 – <u>A dozen of Empress of Ireland postcards</u> – 1906-1913, lot of 12 Empress of Ireland postcards, six are postally used: Oxton 1906, Southampton 1912, written on board ship 1907 stamp off mailed in St. John NB etc. One Montrose related about Hawley Crippen capture. Condition varies drastically with stamp off, crease, foxing. etc. Publishers: Hugo Lang & Co., Art Publishing Glasgow, J.W.B. London, from Stanley collection, C.W. Hunt & Co. Item 559-44 – Valid 5¢ Admiral Wartax MR2B use – 1915 (June 22), 2¢ Admiral, 2¢ MR2, 5¢ MR2B (overprinted War Tax) tied by St. John NB cds on large cover reduced to letter-size, contemporary sealing tape, paying 9¢ quintuple weight printed matter registered to Toronto. The overprinted War Tax MR2B stamps were ordered by the Inland Revenue to pay war tax on wines and liquors. The tax came into effect on Feb 12, 1915. Because the word postage appeared on the stamps, the public believed that these overprinted stamps were valid for postage. In a memo sent to all PMs dated March 5 1915, instructions were given that these stamps were not to be used for postage. Later, this instruction has been reversed and on April 16 1915, the Post Offices were advised that these stamps could be used. They became invalid again on December 30 1915 making a validity period as postage of 8 months, 14 days. Rare. \$350.00 SOLD








Item 559-49 – **50¢ double weight airmail to Australia** – 1949, 5¢ War, 20¢ Peace tied by Vancouver machine cancel on cover underpaying 50¢ double weight airmail letter rate to Australia. T150 postage due representing the double deficiency converted in UPU centimes. (50¢ x 3 centimes = 150 centimes) \$100.00



Item 559-54 – **25¢ airmail to Egypt – censored** – 1949, 5¢ War, 20¢ Peace tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover paying 25¢ airmail letter rate to Egypt (b/s). Addressed to S.S. Imperial Charlottetown property of the Cory Bros Company (a shipping company). Censored by Egyptian authorities during conflict with Israel before the armistice, Egypt withdrawal of all its forces from the former area of Mandate Palestine and hostilities near by Majdal–Hebron road. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 559-56 – <u>45¢ triple wgt airmail to Holland</u> – 1951, 5¢ Postes Postage, 10¢ Fur tied by Simcoe machine cancel on cover underpaying 45¢ triple weight airmail letter rate to Holland. 15¢ per ½oz. 15¢ shortpaid and rated 1.20 guilder due, Dutch dues tied. Numerous filing folds. \$75.00
