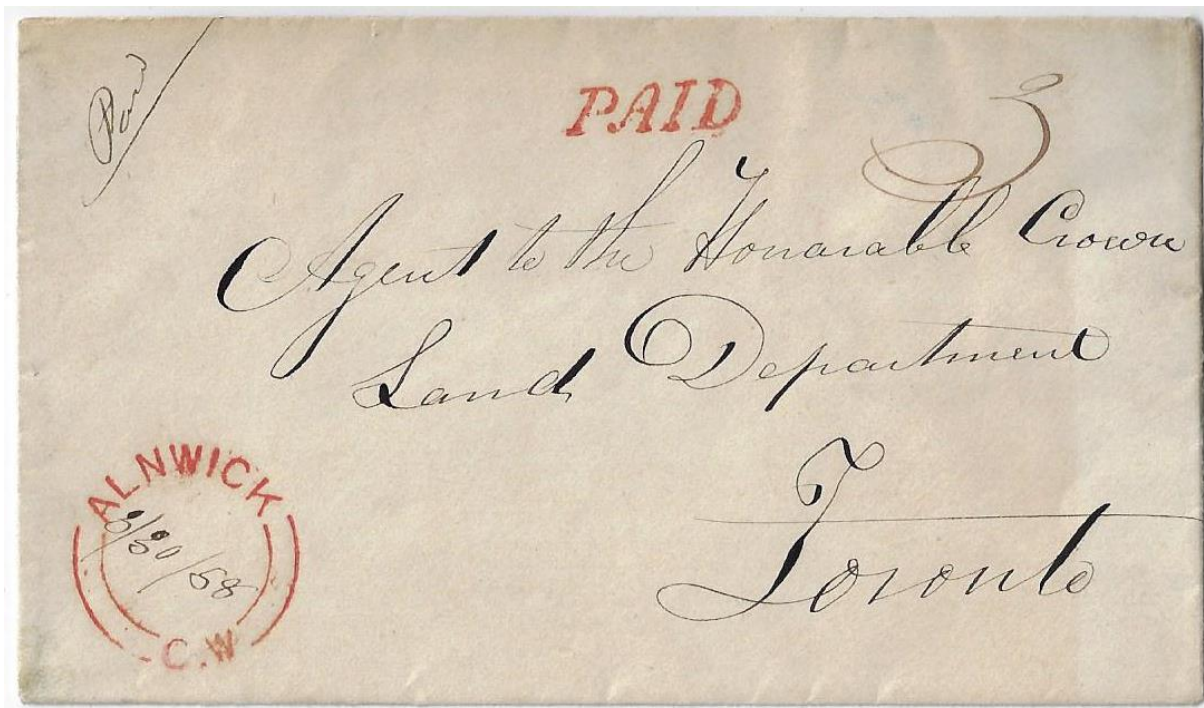

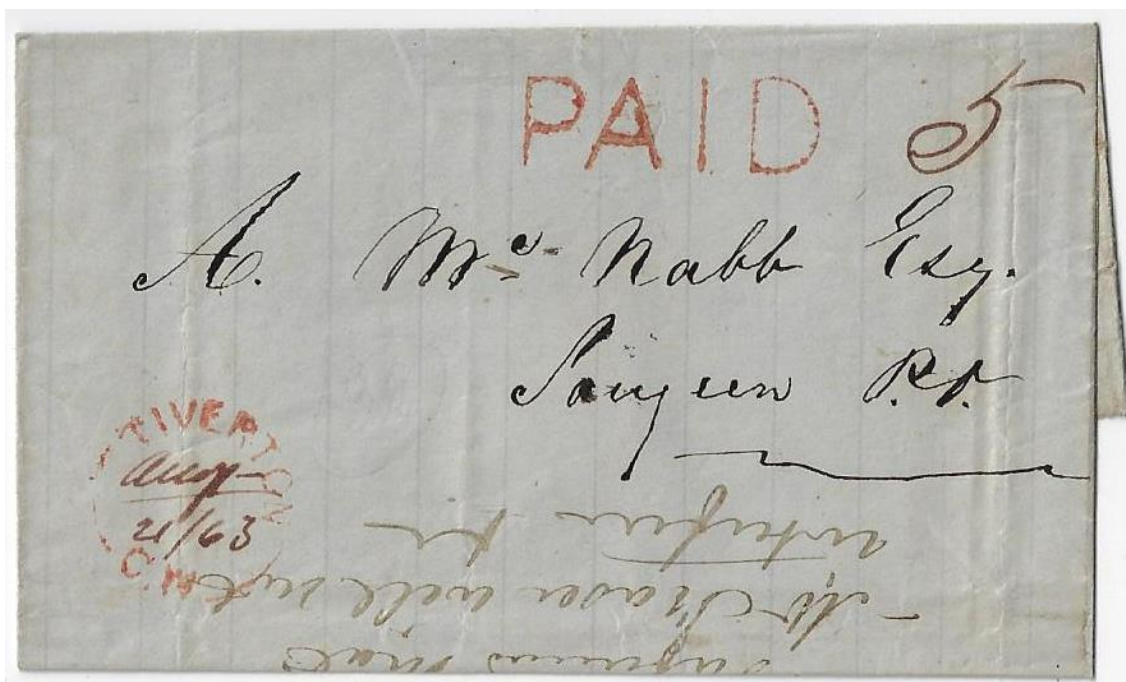

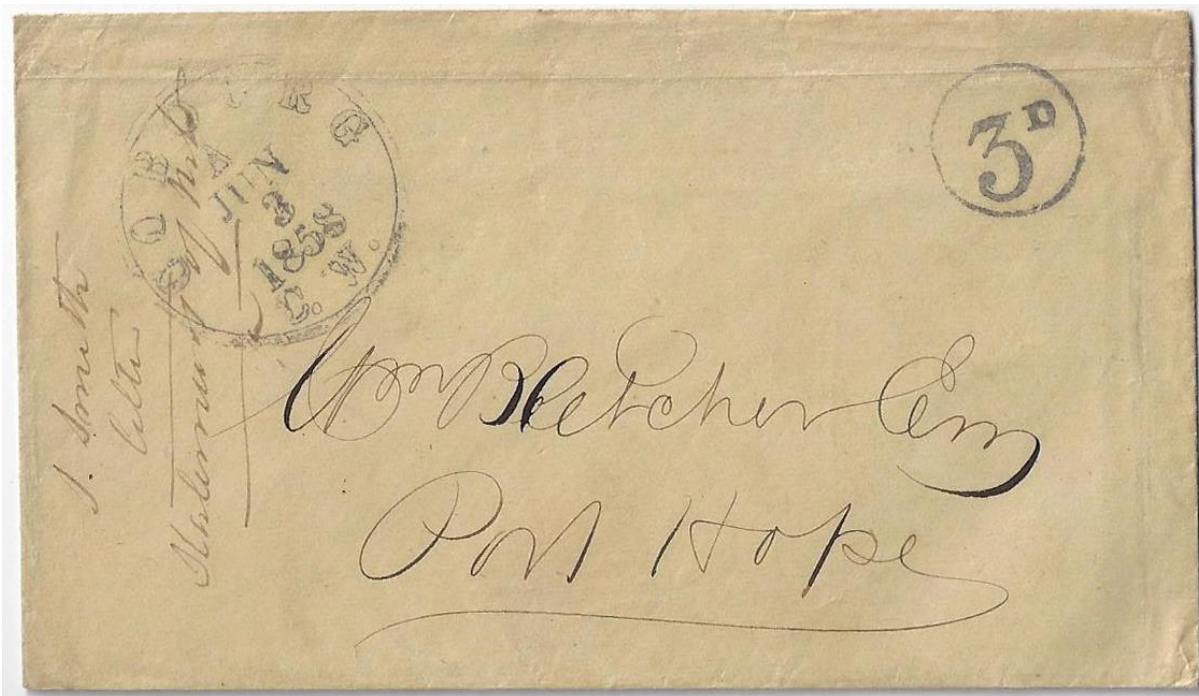
Item 563-01 – York to Rice Lake family letter – 1838, folded letter from York UC to Rice Lake, endorsed to the care of M. Perry, Cobourg. Addressed to Rev Daniel McMullen (Methodist Episcopal) and carried by favour. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 563-02 – **Alnwick CW (Northumberland, 1846-1859)** – 1858, stampless cover from Alnwick CW paid 3d to Toronto via Cobourg (both Ruggles b/s). This is a postmark rarity from Northumberland County, in operation from 1846 to 1859, changed to Alderville in 1859. \$400.00



Item 563-03 – **Tiverton CW (Bruce, ERD hammer 1)** – 1863, folded cover from Tiverton CW paid 5¢ to Saugeen (b/s). This is the current earliest recorded date of all Tiverton postmarks - AU 21 63. \$150.00



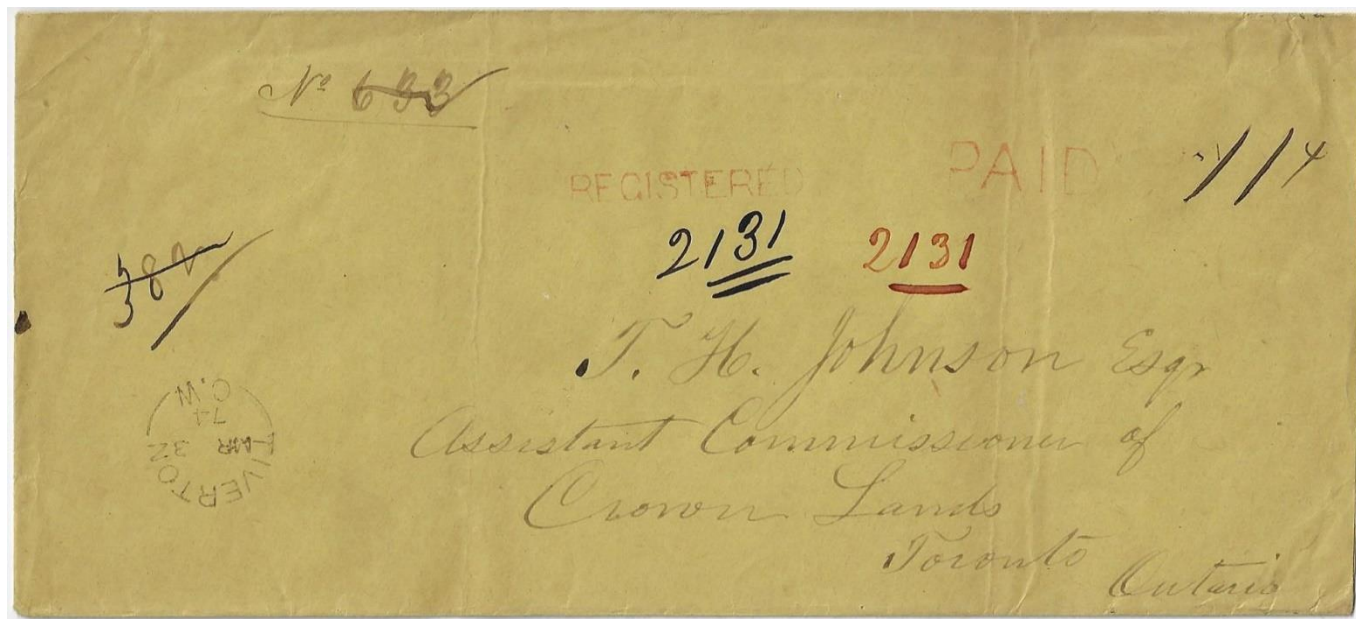
Item 563-04 – **Cobourg CW (Ruggles)** – 1858, stampless cover from Cobourg rated 3d to Port Hope (b/s). A very pretty strike of the Cobourg Ruggles handstamp. \$150.00



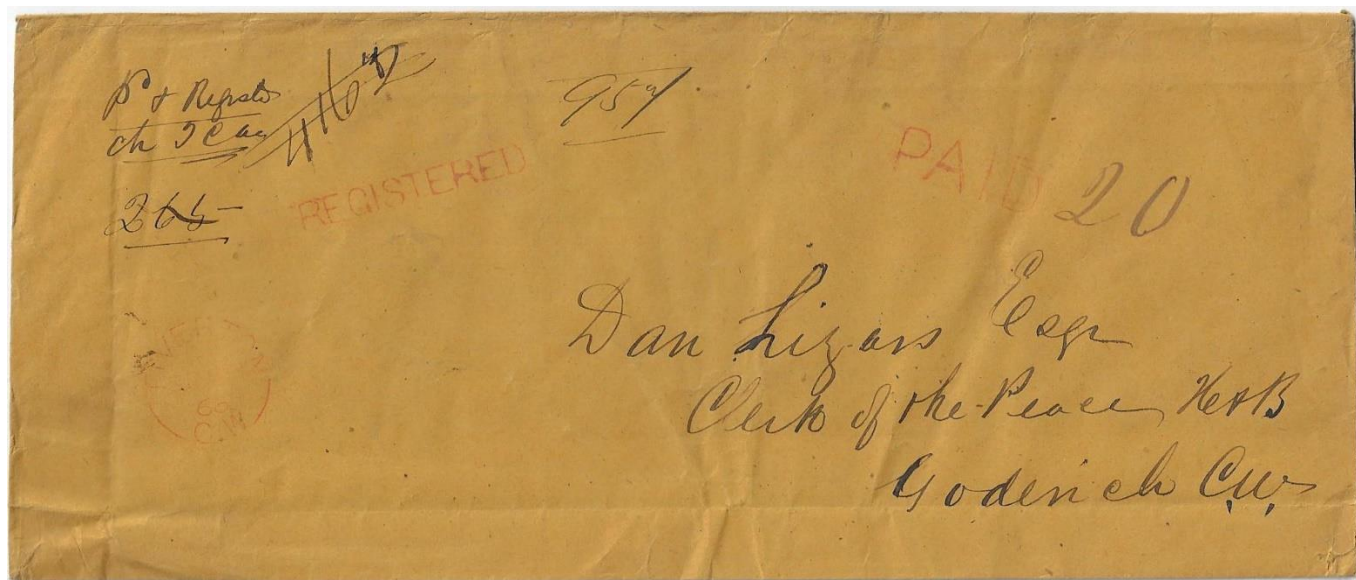
Item 563-05 – **Haldimand UC (1832-1858)** – 1843, family letter datelined Grafton MY 14 43 mailed from Haldimand UC rated 1/4 Currency collect to Annan, Scotland (b/s). The Grafton office opened in 1858. The Haldimand office was in operations from 1832 to 1858. Very scarce! \$350.00 **SOLD**



Item 563-06 – **Tiverton to Hamilton to Britannia (Peel)** – 1873, stampless cover from Tiverton paid 3 to Hamilton (b/s) via Kincardine (b/s). Redirected to Britannia (b/s) which is only the 2nd recorded strike and the earliest of the two. A real wow Peel County postmark. \$125.00 **SOLD**



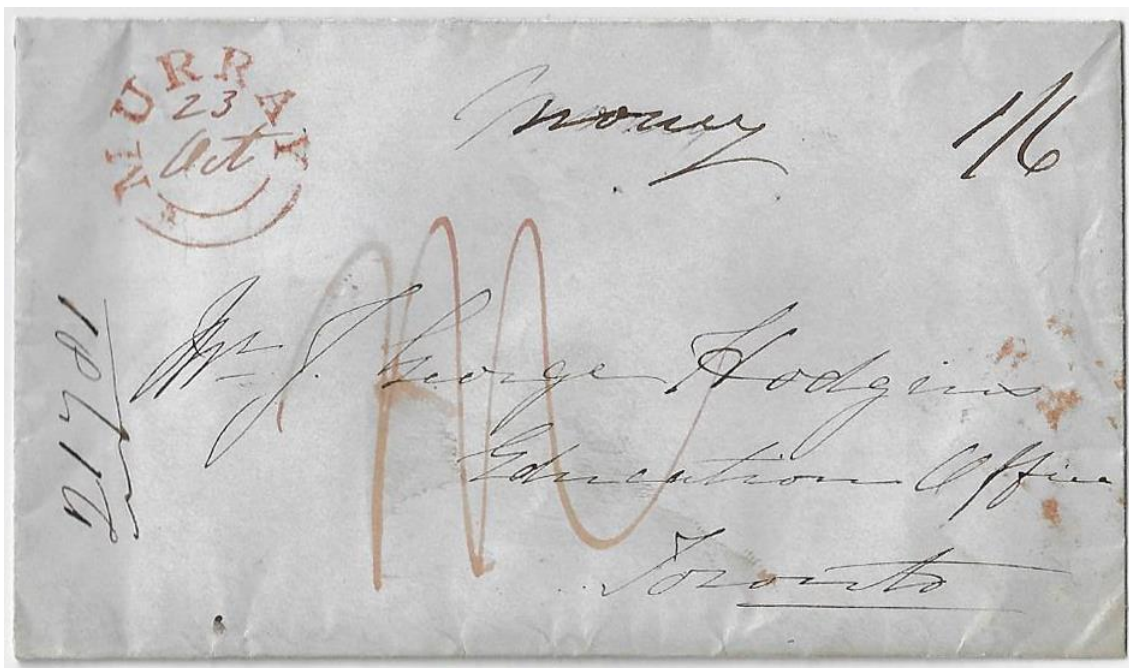
Item 563-07 – **Tiverton 11¢ triple wgt registered** – 1871, stampless cover from Tiverton CW paid 11¢ paying the triple weight 3¢ letter rate plus 2¢ registration to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Kincardine (b/s). \$50.00



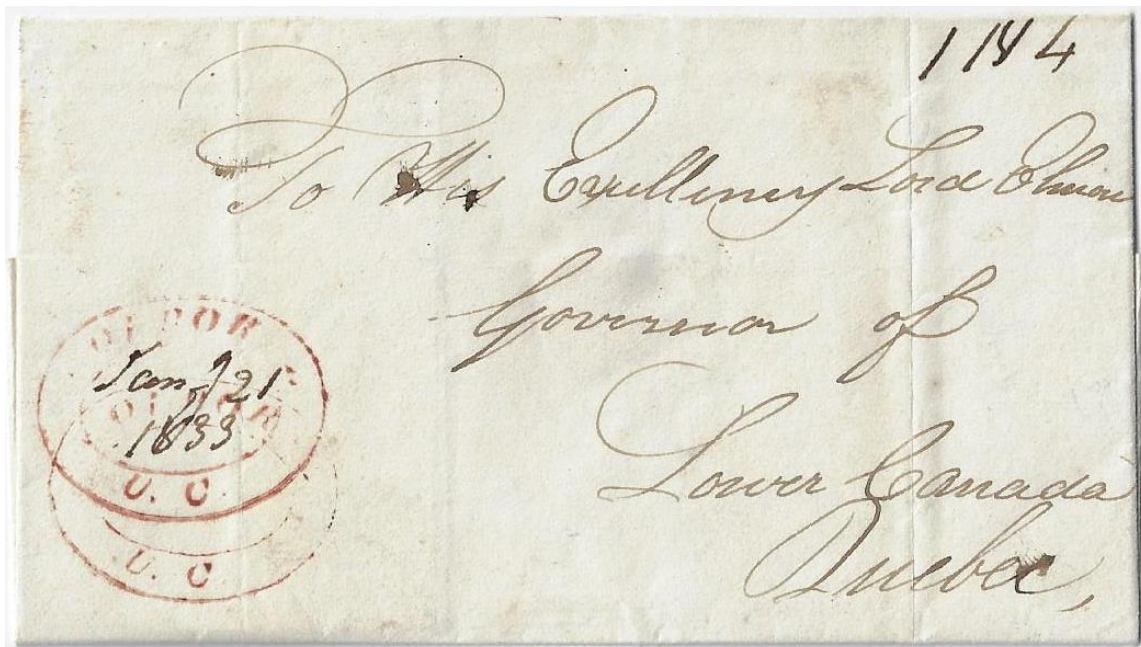
Item 563-08 – **Tiverton 20¢ quadruple wgt registered** – 1866, stampless cover from Tiverton CW paid 20¢ paying the quadruple weight 5¢ letter rate plus 2¢ registration paid in cash to Goderich (b/s). Routed via Kincardine (b/s). \$50.00



Item 563-09 – **Murray UC (1829 type in black)** – 1837, Postmaster free franked money letter from Murray UC, 1829 type struck in black with ms in red, rated free to the Postmaster in Queenston. The message relates to U.S. postage collect in Murray. \$200.00 **SOLD**



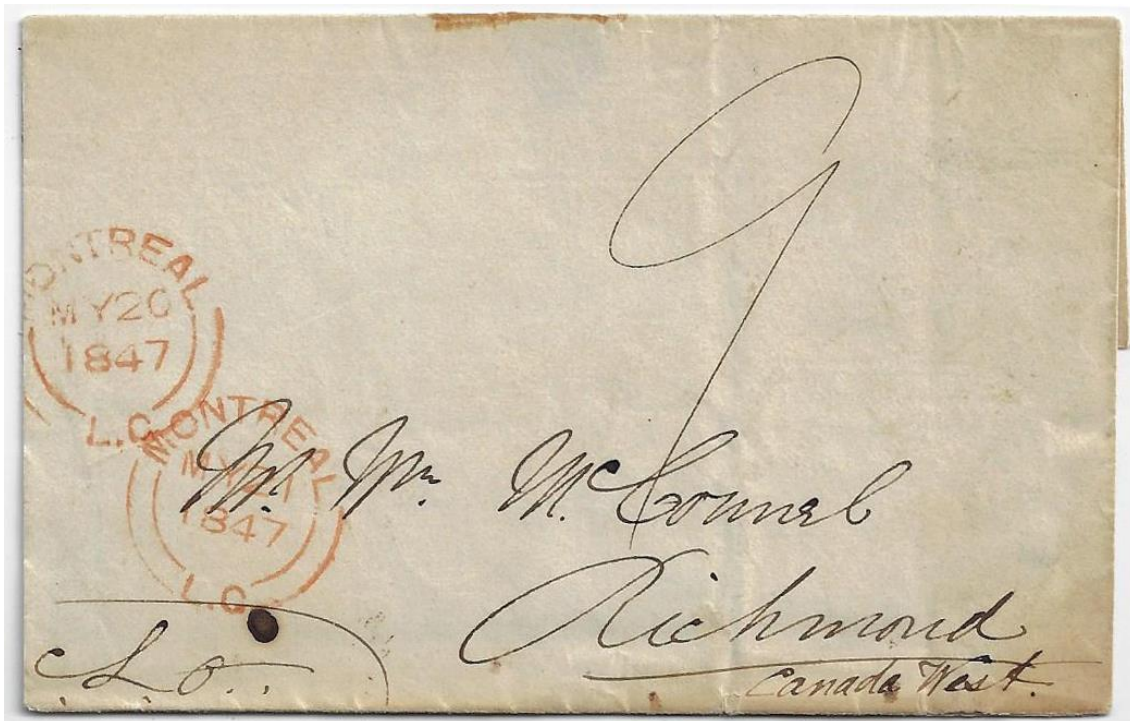
Item 563-10 – **Murray UC (1829 type in red)** – 1847, money letter cover from Murray UC, huge "M" for money, 1829 type struck in red with ms in red, rated 1/6 collect to Toronto (b/s) via Brighton (b/s). \$150.00 **SOLD**



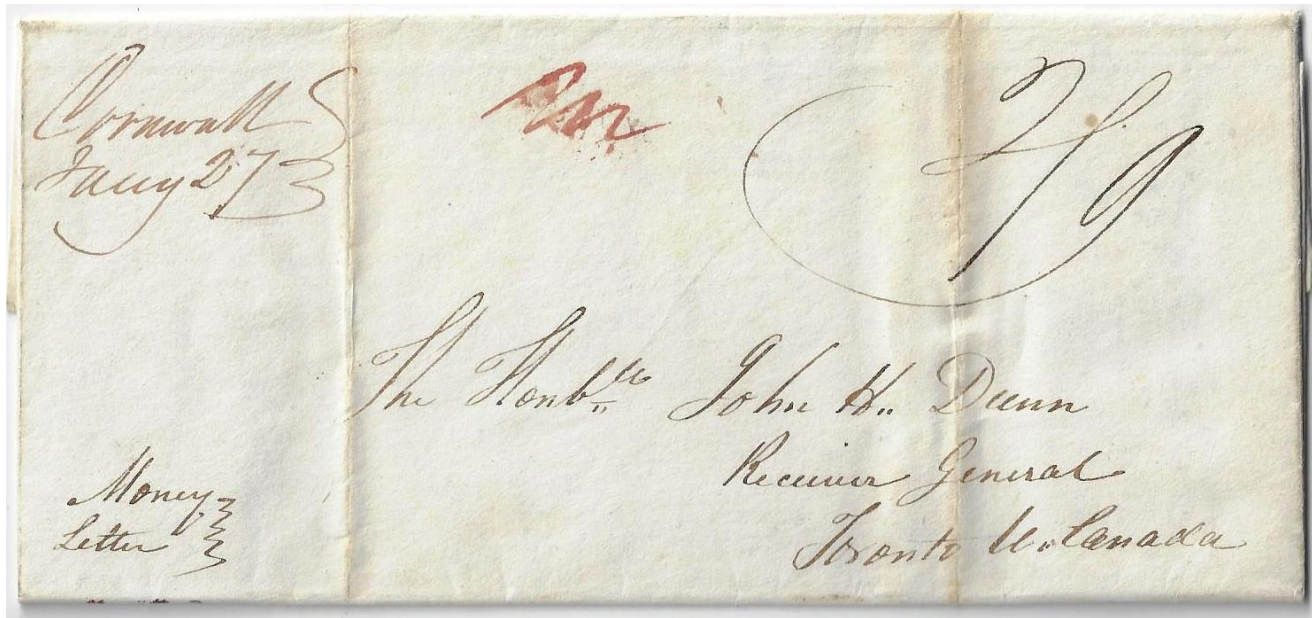
Item 563-11 – **Colborne UC double-oval (Northumberland)** – 1833, folded cover from Colborne UC, double strike of the oval Colborne UC with ms date JA 21 1833, recorded from 18 MY 32 to 18 FE 33. Rated 1/4 collect to Quebec. Addressed to His Excellency the Governor of Lower Canada at Quebec. A postmark rarity. I recorded 5. \$1,500.00



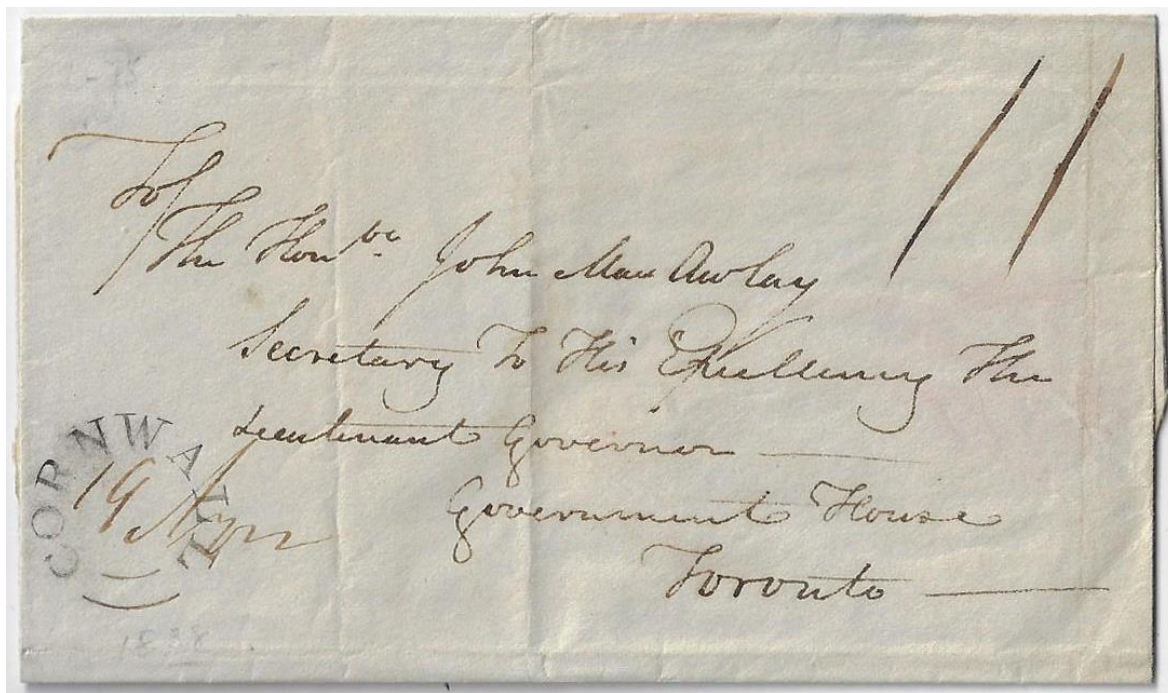
Item 563-12 – **Rylstone CW (the only known example)** – 1866, stampless cover from Rylstone CW paid 5 to Cobourg and redirected to Port Hope and then Ottawa. This is the one recorded example. Reverse with some paper lost always found on Crown Department cover. Northumberland County. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 563-13 – **Montreal to Richmond UC delayed** – 1847, stampless cover from Montreal, probably mailed too late MY 20 and MY 21, rated 9d collect to Richmond UC (b/s). Advertised and not called for, dispatch return 15 SE 47. \$100.00



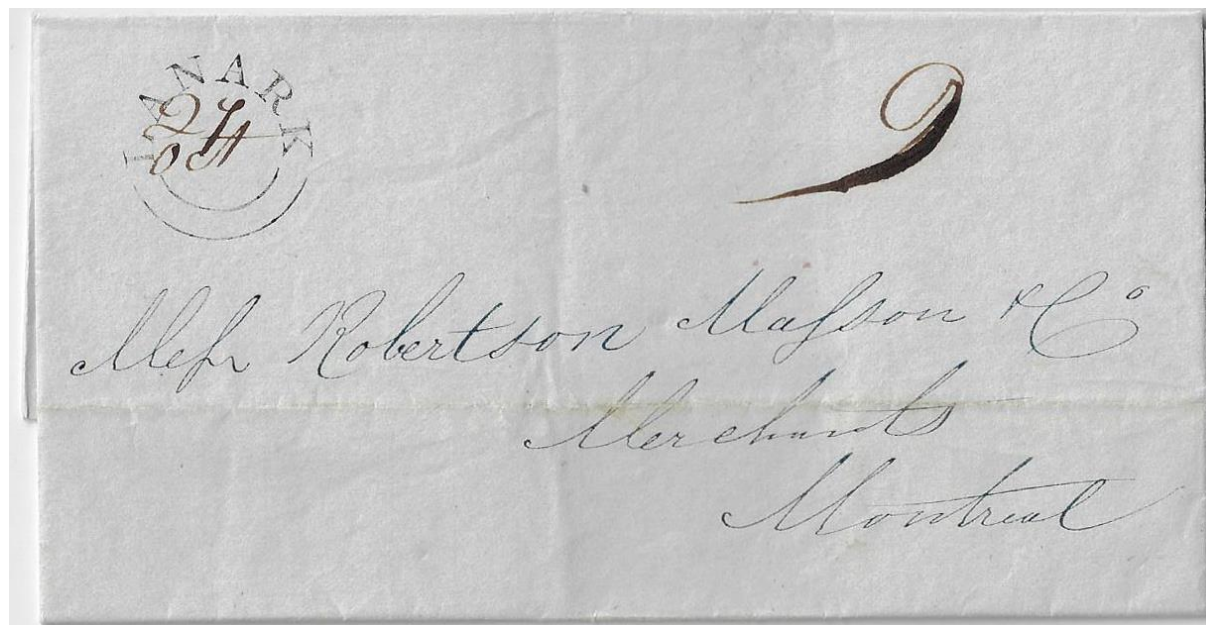
Item 563-14 – **Cornwall manuscript postmark** – 1836, customs folded money letter from Cornwall UC, manuscript postmark JA 27 (1836), rated 2/9 collect to Toronto. The triple 11d rate for 201-300 miles. The letter relates to money from John Cameron, Collector of Customs at Riviere aux Raisin. This is the current latest recorded date of this Cornwall ms postmark. \$250.00



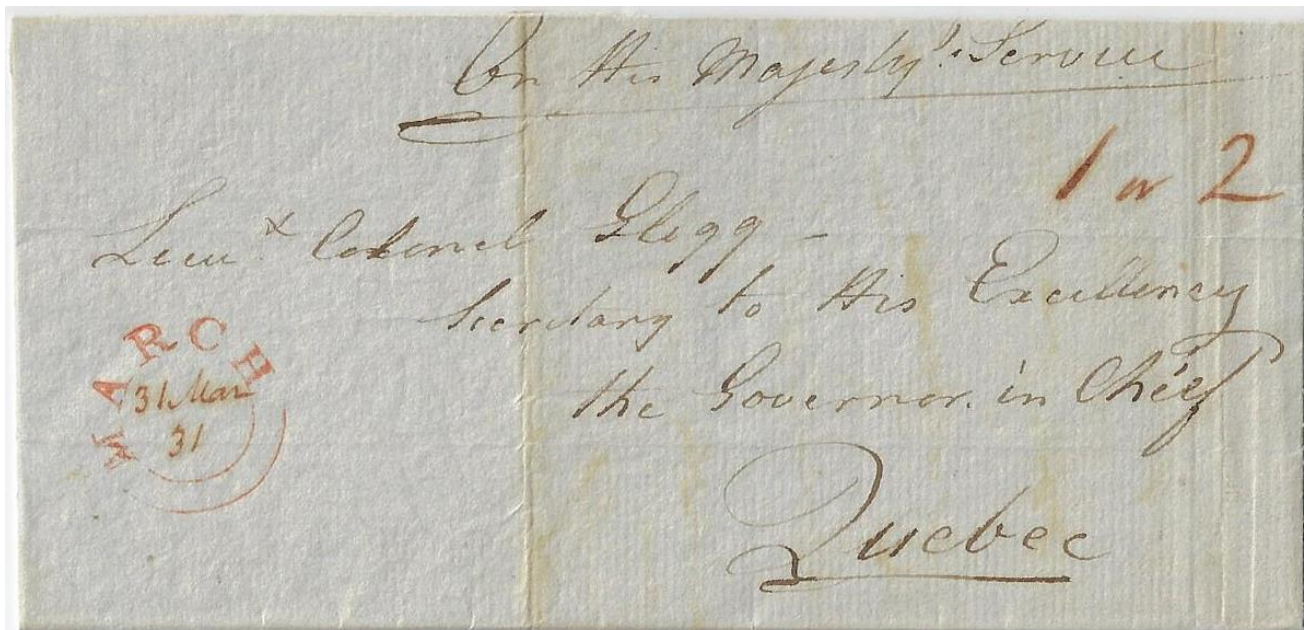
Item 563-15 – **Cornwall 1829 type in black** – 1838, folded cover from Cornwall UC, 1829 type struck in black, rated 11d collect to Toronto. \$150.00



Item 563-16 – **Richmond UC money letter (Carleton)** – 1846, business folded money letter datelined Becket's Landing Twp of Oxford mailed from Richmond UC rated 9d collect to Montreal (b/s). The letter is signed Alexander Becket. \$200.00



Item 563-17 – **Lanark UC 1829 type in black** – 1843, business letter from Lanark UC rated 9d collect to Montreal (b/s) via Perth (b/s). The letter is signed by James Mair. Exhibit quality. \$200.00



Item 563-18 – **March UC OHMS (Carleton)** – 1831, OHMS folded cover from March UC, 1829 type struck in orange, rated 1/2 collect to Quebec. Exhibit quality. \$250.00



Item 563-19 – **Perth UC (U.S. postage money lost)** – 1836, Post Office folded letter from Perth UC, signed by Josiah Taylor (Postmaster), sent free under PM's privilege to PM at Queenston. It reads: *By a memorandum in your letter bill of the 21st instant, it appears that the U.States postage for the past quarter amounting to \$1,22 remitted in my letter of the 18th Feb has not been received. All I can say is that I am prepared to make oath if necessary that it was sent on that day and is regularly booked as such. It was the only letter for yr. office and was accompanied by a letter bill, noticing it as a Money Letter. In such a case who is to be the sufferer, yours Truly, signed Josias Taylor.* A real wow Post Office business letter. \$275.00



Item 563-20 – **Brockville to Ramsayville (opened in 1837)** – 1833, H. Billings & Co. prints, partly printed partly written, from Brockville UC rated 4½d collect to Ramsay. On the way via Perth, struck “Forwarded” and charged additional 2½d now 7d collect for 61-100 miles. A post office opened at Ramsay in 1837. The letter relates to a 30£ note for the Bank of Upper Canada. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 563-21 – **10d Jacques-Cartier on military cover** – 1858, three large margined 10d Cartier (*boardwalk at base showing adjacent stamp, into design at right*) tied by Four-ring 18 cancel on military cover from Kingston CW paying 10d letter rate to Manchester England. Carried by Cunard through New York on the Africa 59th voyage. Red Paid Liverpool BR Packet, handstamped “Missent to Manchester”, address crossed out and forwarded, to Captain Terry, 9th Regiment, Aldershot (b/s) via London (b/s). Bold '1' rate handstamp applied on top, some edge creasing and fine. \$2,500.00



Item 563-22 – **Orangeville registered** – 1866, 5¢ Beaver (position 95, scratch in G, dot below A) tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Orangeville CW (Dufferin County, 21 mm Berri hammer, recorded from JY 4 1864 to AP 2 68) paying 5¢ letter rate to Toronto with 2¢ registry paid in cash. \$200.00 **SOLD**

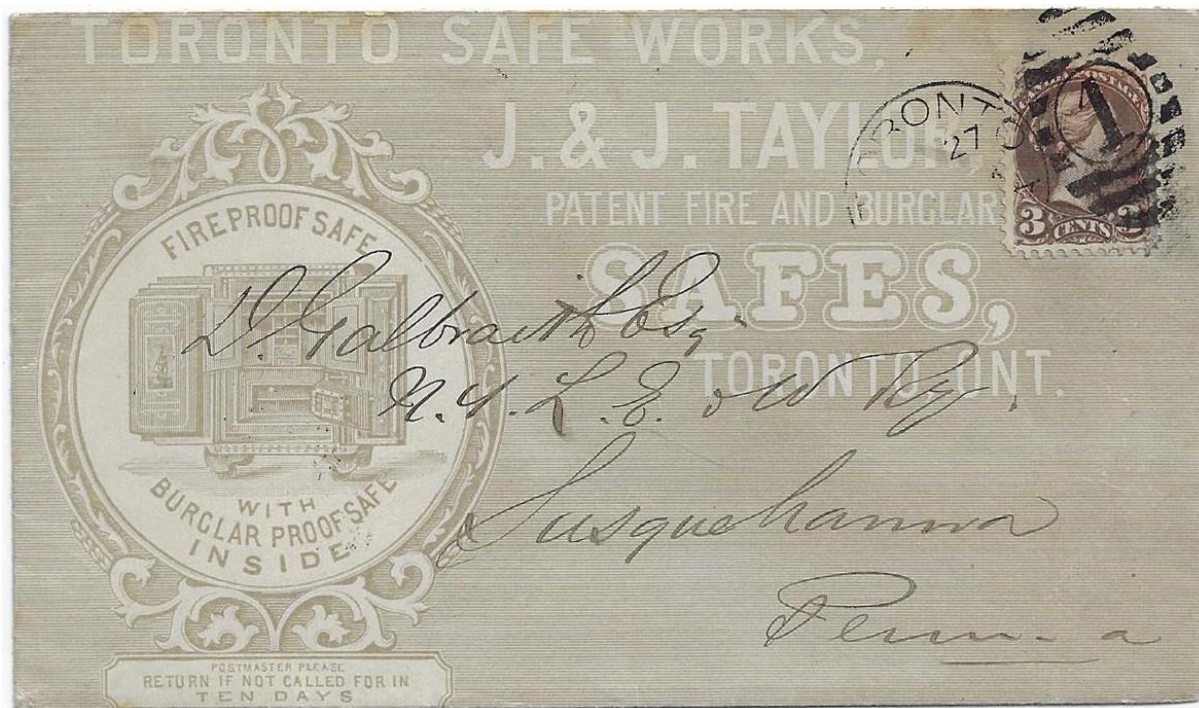


Item 563-23 – **1859 Beaver cover** – 1859, 5¢ Beaver pair tied by Four-ring 21 on City Bank folded letter paying 10¢ double weight letter rate to Sherbrooke (b/s). A very pretty and scarce early printing. \$175.00



Item 563-24 – **5th class sample - delivered by carrier** – 1897, 3¢ SQ tied by smudge cancel on Canadian Typograph Co. mailing tag, endorsed “*sample*”, underpaying 11¢ (10-11 oz) 5th class rate to Hamilton (b/s). Delivered by letter carrier H/MY/29/3 (b/s). According to the 1897 postal guide, “*the law permits the forwarding of letters on which a portion of only of the proper postage has been prepaid, but such letters are taxed with double the amount of the deficiency to be collected on delivery*”. A rare dated sample rate item and a lovely 3¢ SQ single franked item. \$400.00
