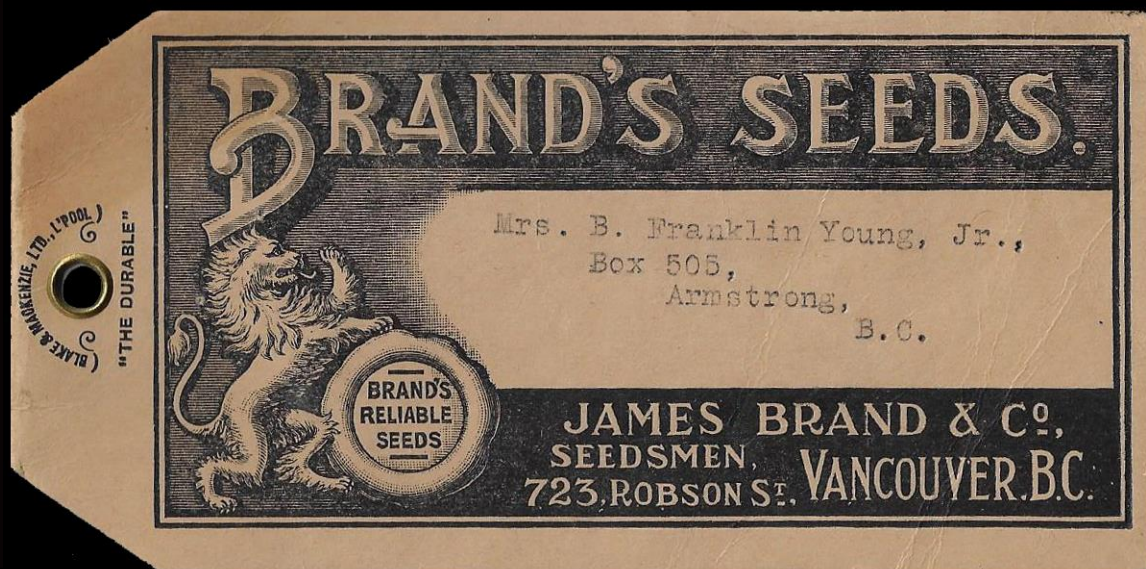

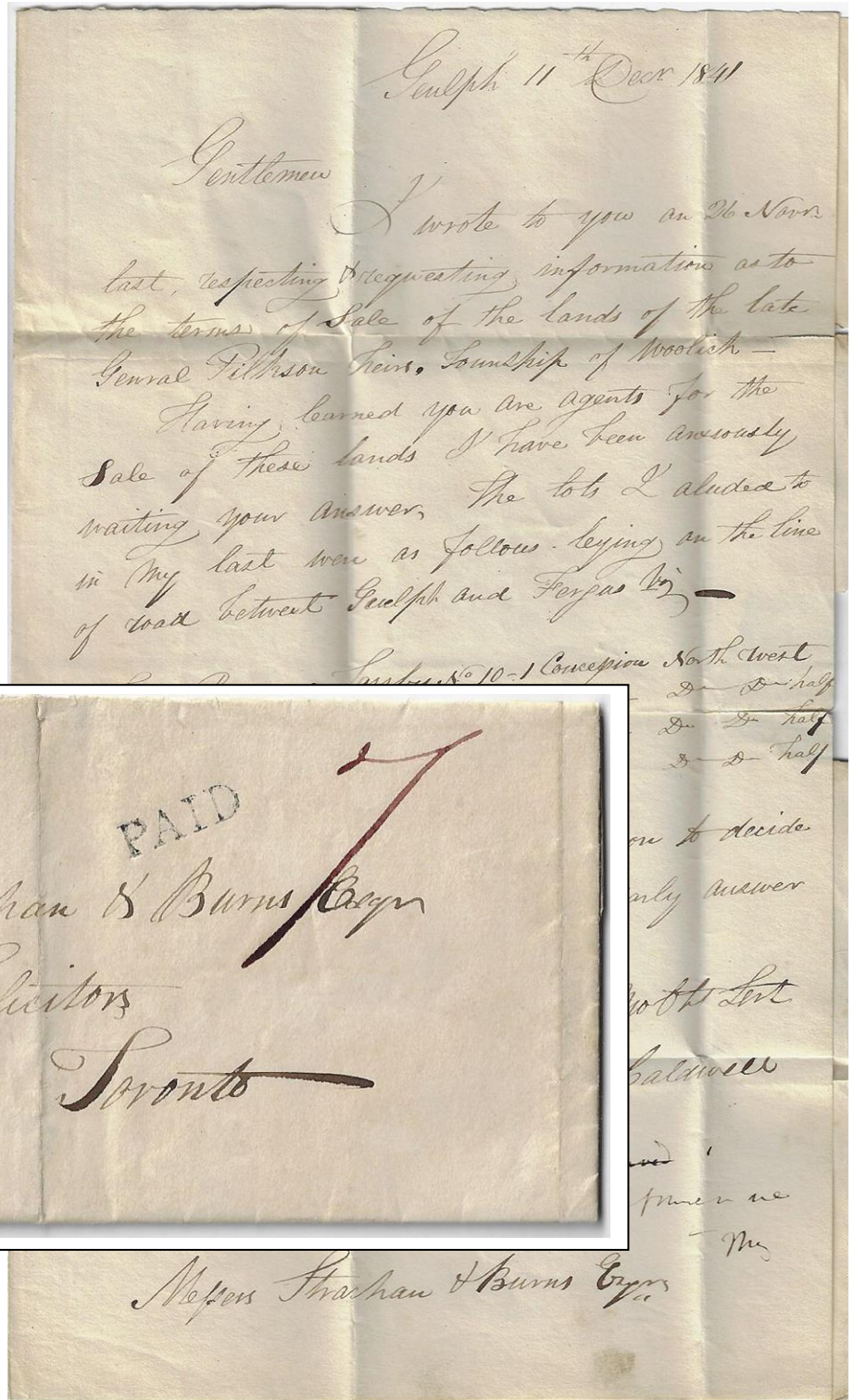

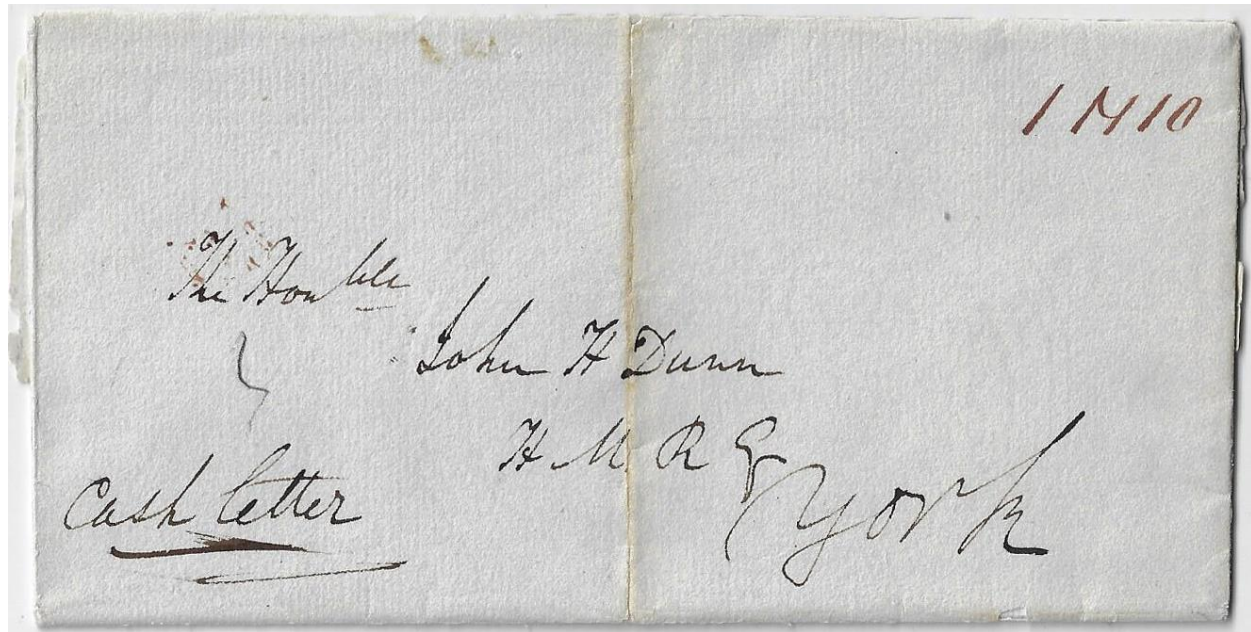
Item 564-01 – **Cross border Postmaster business** – 1832, Postmaster free franked letter from Youngstown NY, signed R.H. Boughton P.M., to Postmaster at Queenston UC. The letter relates to a misdirected letter and a fine to pay. It reads: *Sir, then is one John Gallagher in this place who I presume is the person to whom the letter you refer to is directed. The wishes it sent to this office. John Porter Asst P.M.* A scarce cross border Postmaster business letter. \$175.00



Item 564-02 – **Guelph manuscript postmark** – 1841, business folded letter from Guelph UC, manuscript postmark (1832-1842), paid 7d to Toronto. The letter relates to pieces of land, signed by Gavin Caldwell. \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 564-03 – **Kingston straight line** – 1821, folded business letter signed John McDonald, from Kingston rated 2N collect to Montreal. Reverse with a faint Kingston straight line 1 JAN 21. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 564-04 – **Cash Letter at Perth** – 1829, folded cash letter from Perth UC, dated December 1829, rated double 11d collect to York. Reverse with Perth 1829 type in black with ms date in red. In the 1820's the Perth handstamps appeared on the back of the missive. By the 1830's they began to appear on front. A very early and primitive Money Letter. Filing fold. \$250.00

is getting white already i heard from
Barford last friday they were all
well but susan I suppose she was
not expected to live with a disease
of the heart and a stroke of palsy
I have not been to barford since
I was there with you last spring
you wished to hear from mary hess
she is well and Jacob is married
and doing well
My dear friends i hope you will
forget to answer this letter soon
I remain your friend

My dear Sir

Mr Kingstone has come to London I expect him up this evening to Warwick so that I hope with Gods blessing to go down to Sandwich next week, and settle up with you - words cannot express the gratitude I feel for your kindness to me in delaying the execution which you might have issued against me and my sisters - may the Lord reward you for it - and I hope on my part I shall not deceive you - I would have written to you last week but was expecting Mr Kingstone up to Warwick every day, he came to London on the 12th and I was expecting him up every day since - I hope this will not appear like another put off - you may rest assured I do not mean to deceive you but trust to have all settled in the Month of August firmly bound

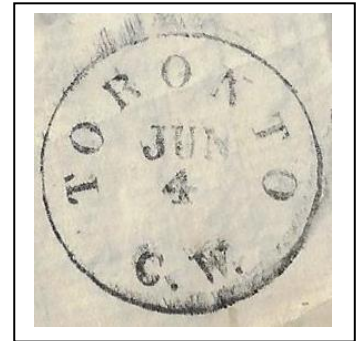

delay may expose me to & I hope you will use your
best endeavours to put me in possession of the deed
at an early date - Please write me immediately
and say what is hindering
with due respect yours George Edwards

Item 564-10 – **Rainham UC ERD (Haldimand)** – 1845, Town Clerk return from Rainham UC paid 4½d to Niagara (b/s with typeset) via Queenston. Paid handstamp crossed out and rerated 4½d collect. The content is a list of township officials with wardens, collectors etc. This Rainham UC marking is the current earliest recorded date JA 3 45. \$150.00



Item 564-11 – **Shannonville UC (Hastings)** – 1848, folded cover from Shannonville UC paid 4½d to Kingston (b/s). Addressed to the Kingston prison warden. Recorded from 1842 to 1848 but no other data available. \$125.00

Salved from the sea, On service / returned to sender from UK to the Dead Letter Office in Ottawa and then stamped "Mail Service Suspended" in French. \$350.00 **SOLD**



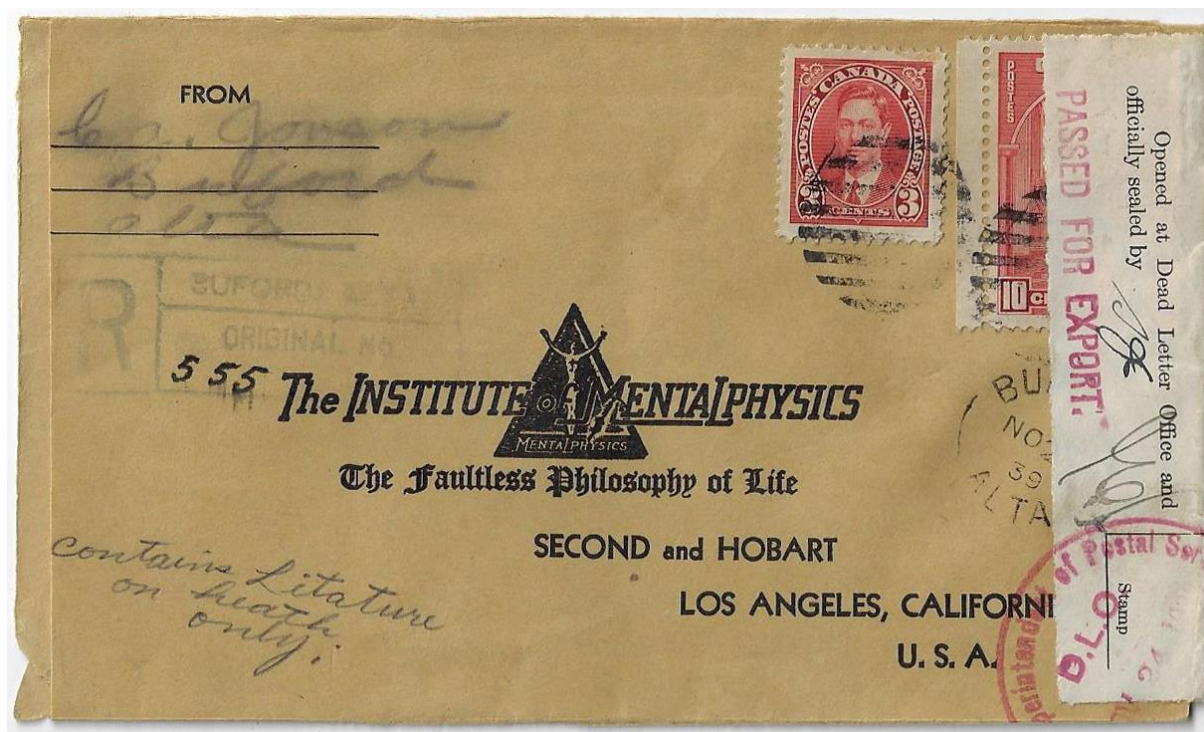
