



Item 564-01 – <u>Cross border Postmaster business</u> – 1832, Postmaster free franked letter from Youngstown NY, signed R.H. Boughton P.M., to Postmaster at Queenston UC. The letter relates to a misdirected letter and a fine to pay. It reads: *Sir, then is one John Gallagher in this place who I presume is the person to whom the letter you refer to is directed. The wishes it sent to this office. John Porter Asst P.M.* A scarce cross border Postmaster business letter. \$175.00




Item 564-02 – <u>Guelph manuscript postmark</u> – 1841, business folded letter from Guelph UC, manuscript postmark (1832-1842), paid 7d to Toronto. The letter relates to pieces of land, signed by Gavin Caldwell. \$125.00 **SOLD**




Item $564-04 - \underline{\text{Cash Letter at Perth}} - 1829$, folded cash letter from Perth UC, dated December 1829, rated double 11d collect to York. Reverse with Perth 1829 type in black with ms date in red. In the 1820's the Perth handstamps appeared on the back of the missive. By the 1830's they began to appear on front. A very early and primitive Money Letter. Filing fold. \$250.00



The content is a list of township officials with wardens, collectors etc. This Rainham UC marking is the current earliest recorded date JA 3 45. \$150.00




Item 564-11 – <u>Shannonville UC (Hastings)</u> – 1848, folded cover from Shannonville UC paid 4½d to Kingston (b/s). Addressed to the Kingston prison warden. Recorded from 1842 to 1848 but no other data available. \$125.00



Item 564-12 – <u>Port Burwell UC Money Letter</u> – 1846, OHMS Customs House folded letter, money letter, from Port Burwell UC rated 3/ collect to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Simcoe (b/s) and Brantford (b/s). \$150.00

Carried by steamer to Spanish River and then back to Manitoulin Island. A neat cover. \$200.00 SOLD

This missive was among mail carried on the ship Eros which was torpedoed by the German U-Boat U-48. Salved from the sea, On service / returned to sender from UK to the Dead Letter Office in Ottawa and then stamped "Mail Service Suspended" in French. \$350.00 <u>SOLD</u>







Routed via Edmonton and Lethbridge (b/s). The Office of the District Director and Superintendent Examinations Centre used the DLO Superintendent handstamp as FECB device. Opened at left. 

Item 564-43 - Naval cover entered at NPO 1117 - 1944, Naval cover received from ship, examined by DB/N 73 (Vancouver) franked with 7¢ War tied by NPO 1117 paying 7¢ airmail letter rate to Halifax. DB/N censor tape blank, probably from HMCS Uganda operating in the Pacific. A very unusual cover. \$75.00



Item 564-47 – <u>Calgary FECB Form B submitted registered</u> – 1945, 4¢, 10¢ War tied by Calgary Sub No.5 cds on registered FECB cover paying 14¢ registered letter rate to U.S. (b/s). Examined, passed for export failed and scratched out with orange crayon, probably due to a permit application issue, ms Form B submitted, registered from Calgary Main P.O., FECB passed and forwarded to destination.
