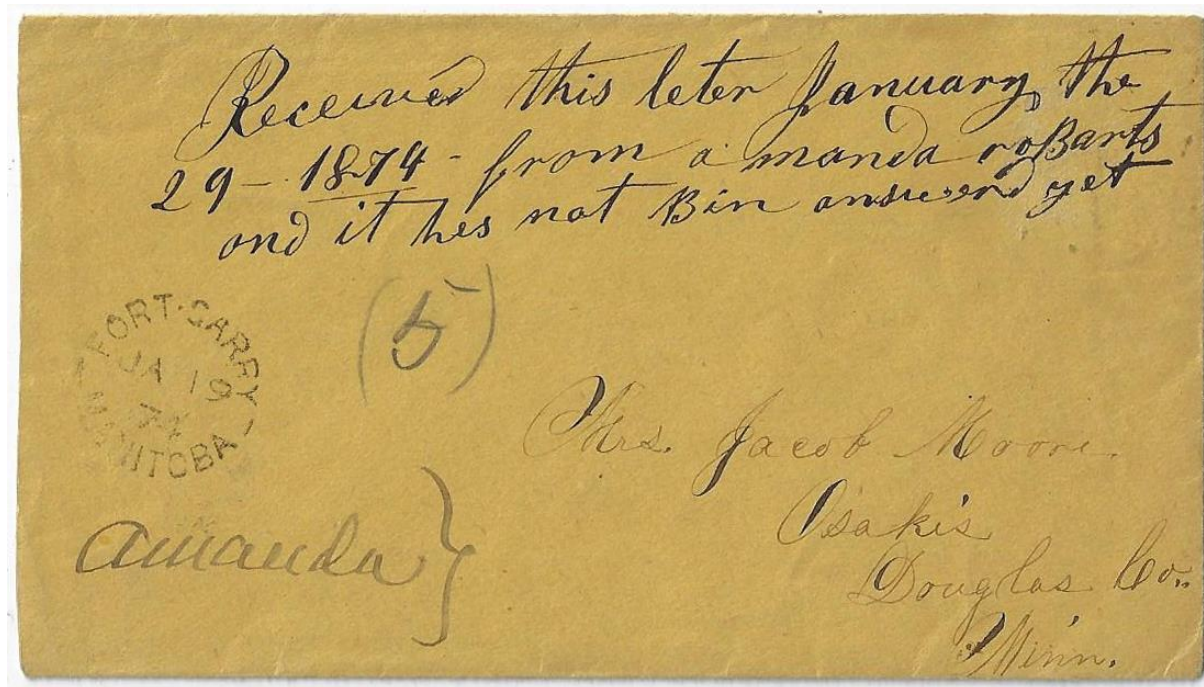

Indian Settlement

Item 570-01 – **Hudson's Bay Company** – 1850, folded letter from Lower Fort Garry dated OC 25 50 to "Indian Settlement" (Red River). The letter is addressed to John Smithurst and is from William Lane, who worked for the Hudson's Bay Company, informing Smithurst that supplies were now available for him and that he paid "Cameron" (the Indian runner) 9/6 for the letters he delivered to him. An interesting letter about courier fee. \$1,000.00 **SOLD**



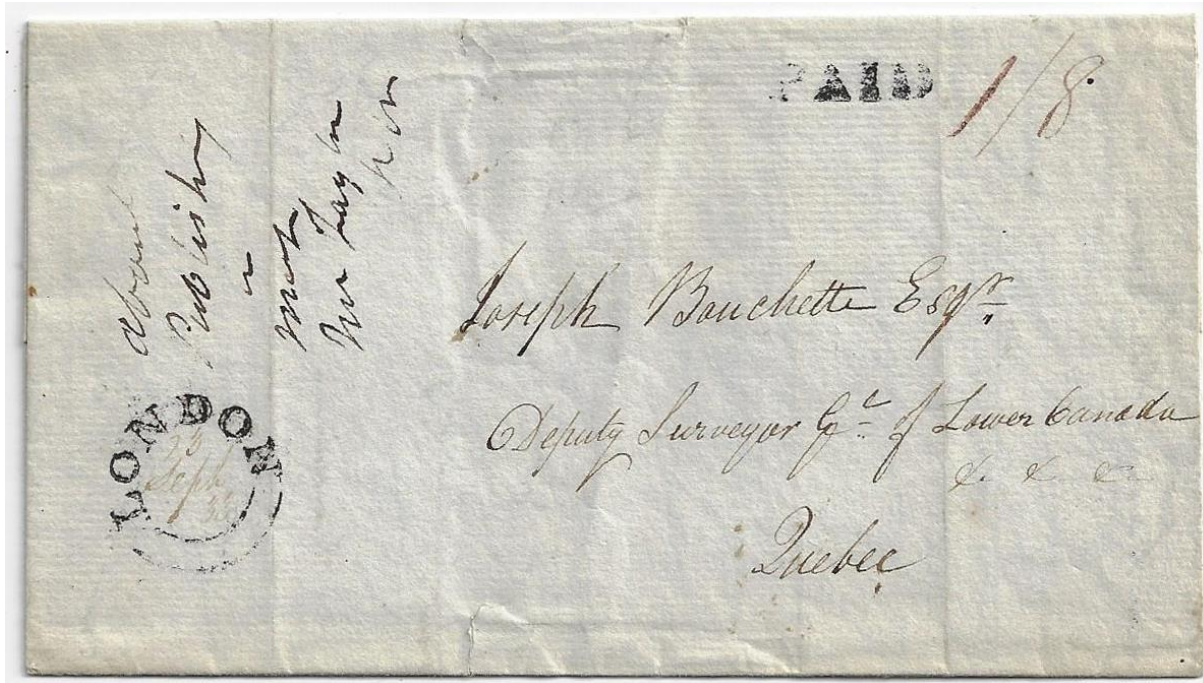
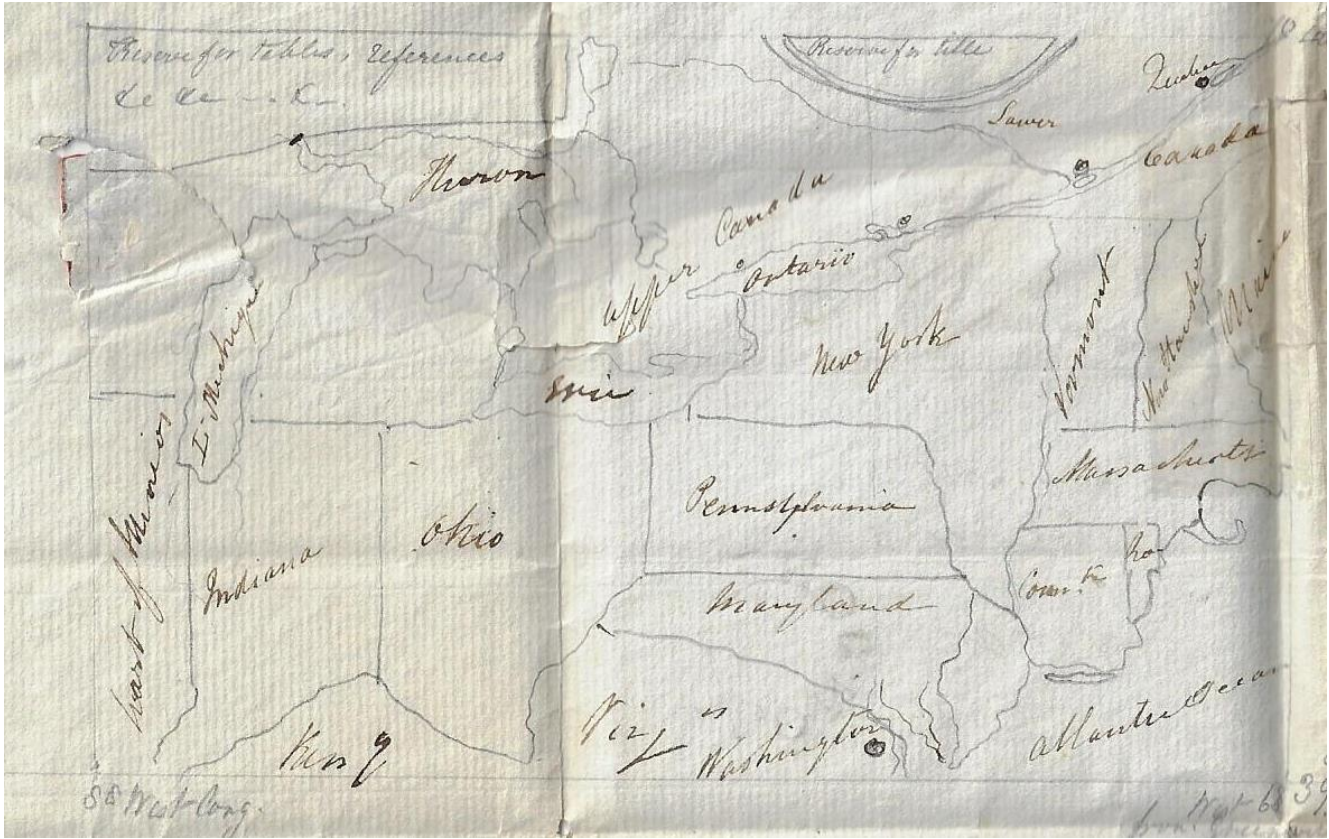
Item 570-02 – **Cross border, Fort Garry Manitoba** – 1874, stampless cover from Fort Garry Manitoba to Osakis Minnesota, no receiver however with docketing notes showing January 29. Rated 5 while the rate was 6 and before stamp pre-payment was required in 1875. A rare and early Manitoba cover. Illustrated and discussed in BNA Topics in 1966. \$750.00



Item 570-03 – **Montreal to France via New York** – 1833, folded letter from Montreal to La Rochelle France. Fully prepaid to New York with annotation "No other means to prepay beyond New York". Forwarded from New York to La Rochelle via Le Havre. Boxed Pays d'outremer par Le Havre. The letter is written in French, nice readable calligraphy and relates to the Roy and Dufour families immigrating to Canada in 1752 near Riviere de Chambly. 4-page letter with family tree etc. \$500.00



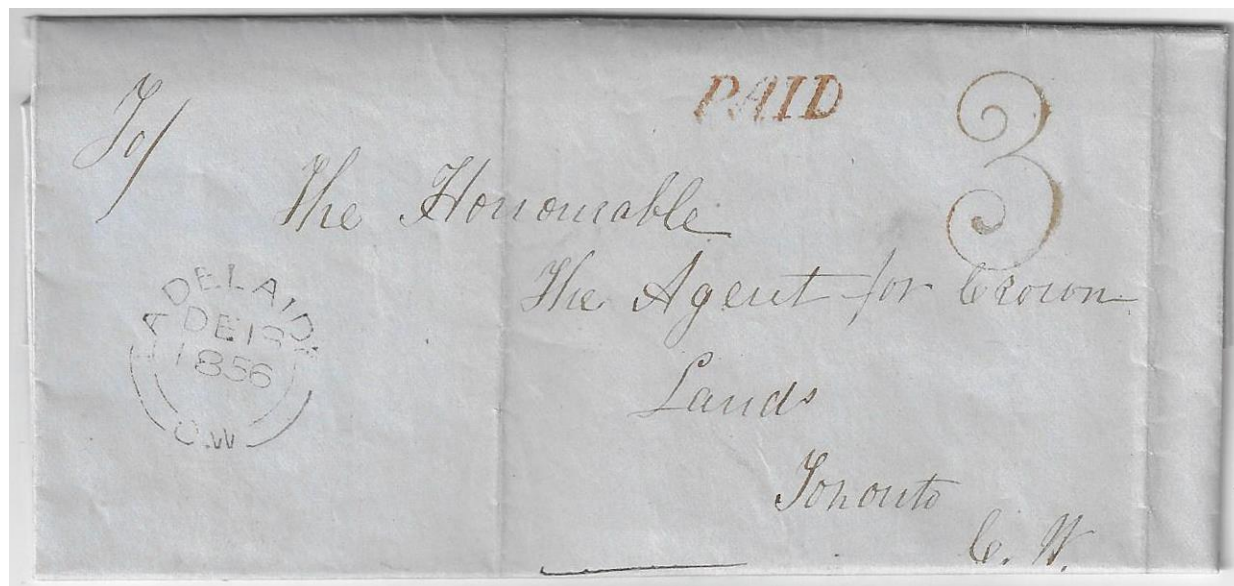
Item 570-04 – **Orillia UC to France via Quebec (in Winter)** – 1844, bilingual partial letter from Orillia UC to France. Orillia UC double circle struck in blue with manuscript date. The letter is fully prepaid to destination with “Paid” and PD. Rated 2/5 Sterling converted to 2/8½d Currency (which includes the British charge). Surprisingly carried overland to Quebec (*in January*), then to Boston and carried by the Cunard Britannia on the 18th voyage to Liverpool. Interestingly, the letter relates to politics and reads in part: *Political feeling runs very high in that country at present, the Executive Government lately quarrelled with the Governor General and resigned. The whole country is in a state of the highest excitement, another Rebellion (?).../ possibly rent my property and visit France etc.* \$400.00



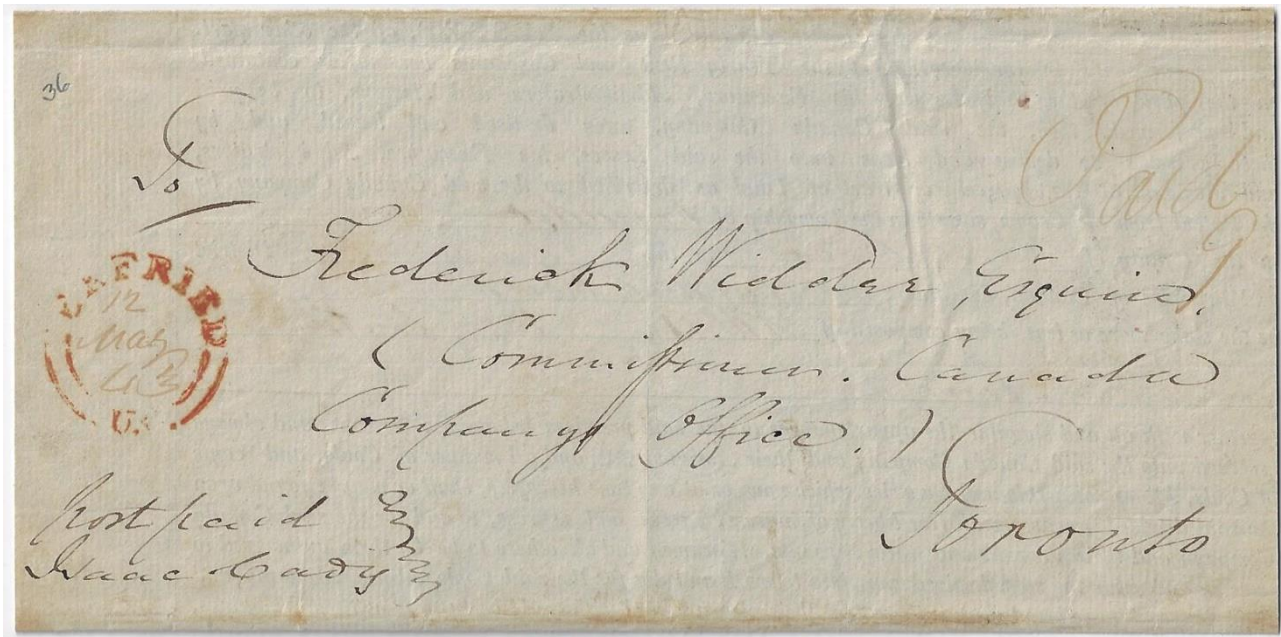
Item 570-05 – **London 1829 type in black** – 1833, partial folded letter from London UC paid 1/8 to Quebec. Interestingly, a Canadas/U.S. map has been illustrated, drawn by David Taylor with text: *no mountains on it but showing the boundary lines and the principal roads only*. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 570-06 – **The latest recorded London 1829 type** – 1839, business folded letter from London UC rated 9d collect to Port Colborne. This is the latest recorded date for this postmark, SE 25 39. The London 1839 type ERD is OC 18 39. The letter relates to cord of woods, distillery, grain and other goods. Exhibit quality. \$200.00



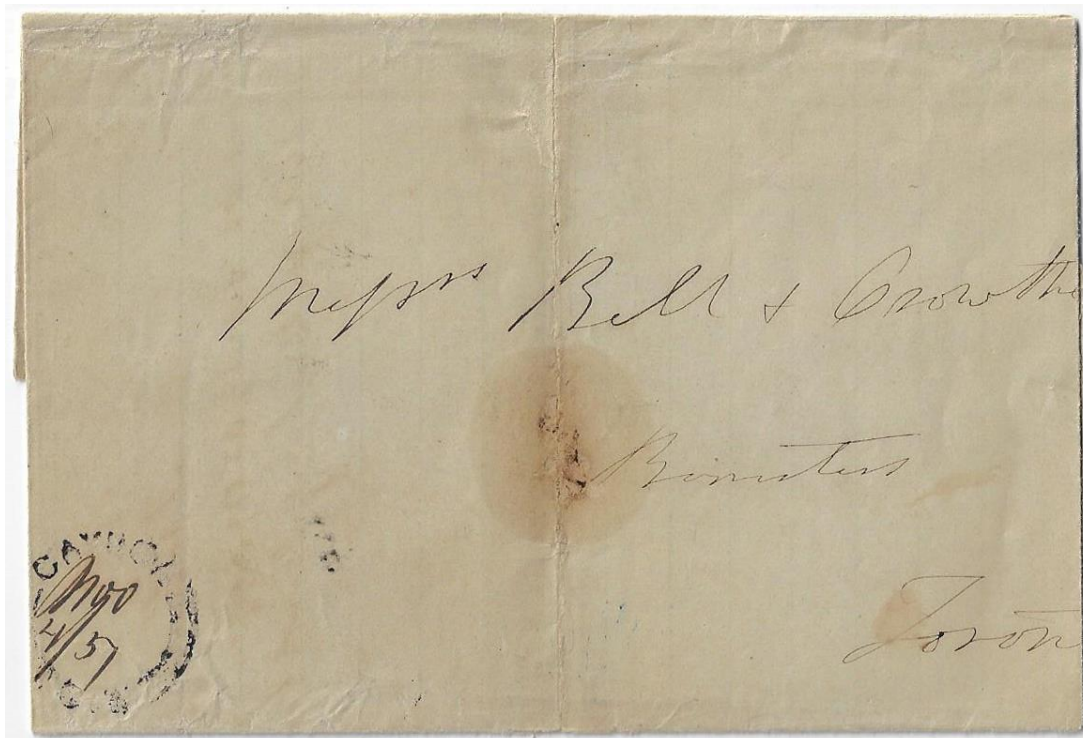
Item 570-07 – **Adelaide CW (Middlesex)** – 1856, folded letter from Adelaide CW paid 3d to Toronto via London (b/s). The letter is a petition from Amelia Heake about 8 acres of land between Adelaide and Lobo. A scarce Middlesex office, closed down in 1914. \$100.00



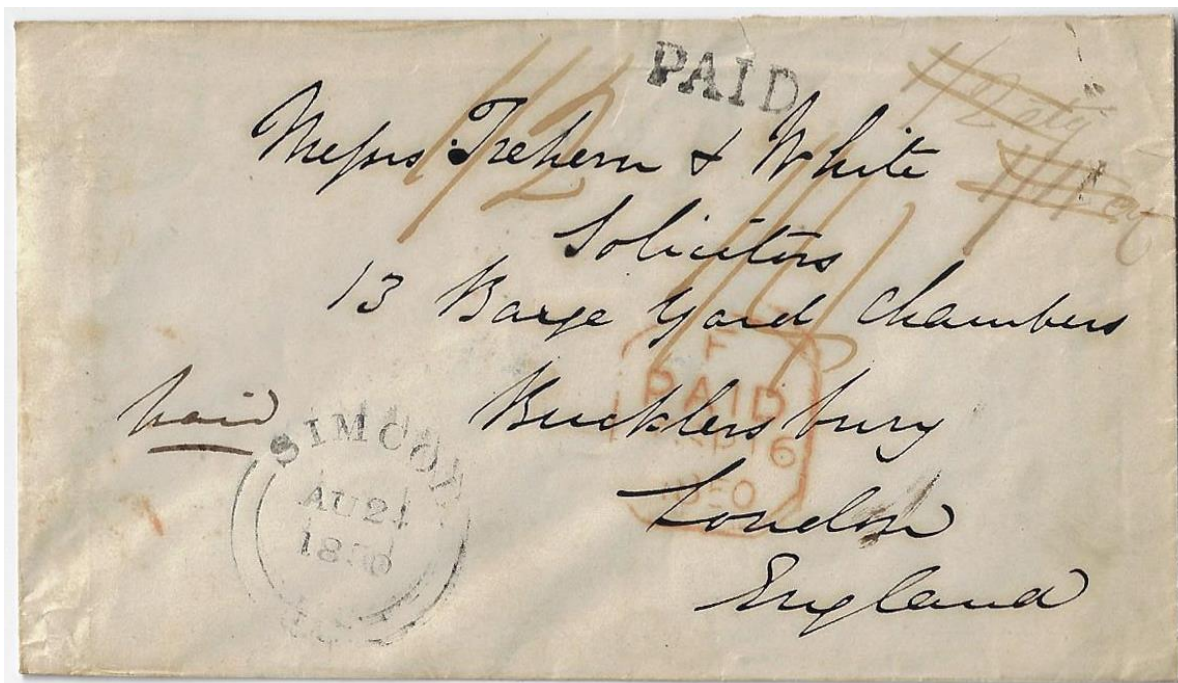
Item 570-08 – **The earliest recorded Ekfried UC (Middlesex)** – 1843, partial folded indenture from Ekfried UC (note, spelling error Ekfried for Ekfrid) paid 9d to Toronto. This is the earliest recorded Ekfried postmark MY 12 43, hammer 1. Named after the Northumbrian King Ekfrid (Egfrid) this was one of the original twps in the Talbot Settlement. By 1851, Ekfrid Village was the business centre of the twp. The Exchange Hotel was kept by William Jones, a dry good store by Jonathan Miller, while a wagon-maker and blacksmith, with two snowmakers, completed the business district. Closed in 1867, re-open later in 1907. Very scarce! \$250.00



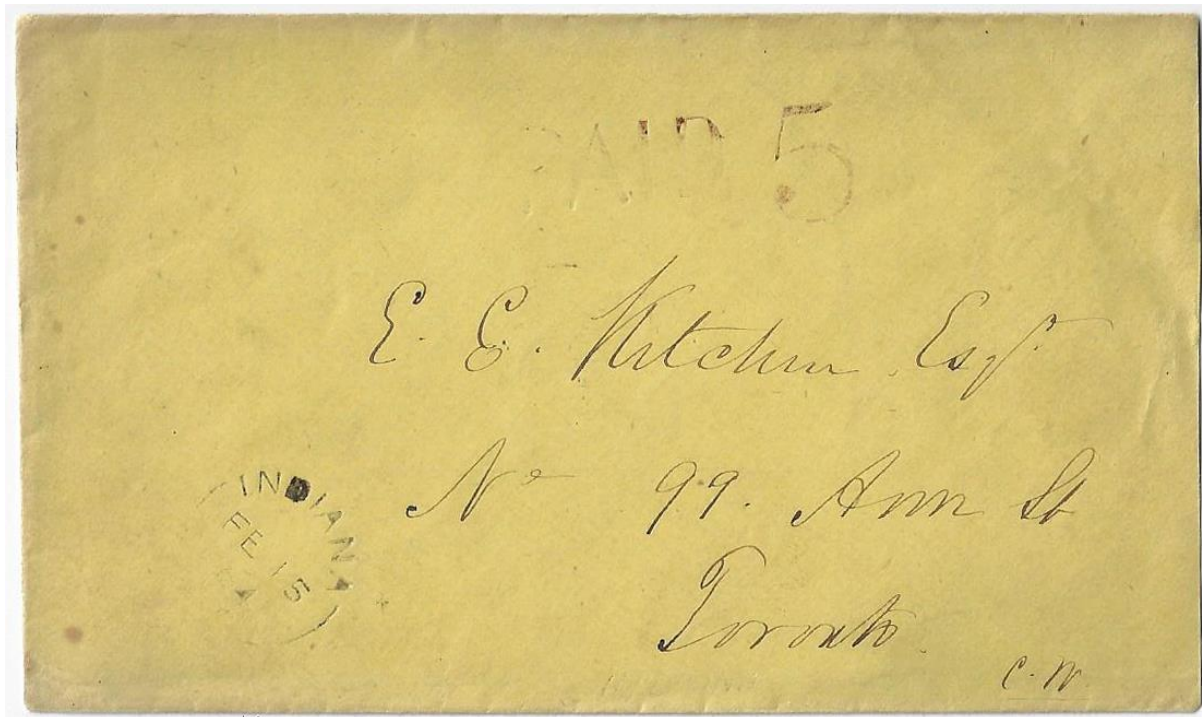
Item 570-09 – **Waterford UC (Norfolk)** – 1853, stampless cover from Waterford UC rated 3d collect to Simcoe. (b/s). 1839 type with manuscript date JY 27 53. \$75.00



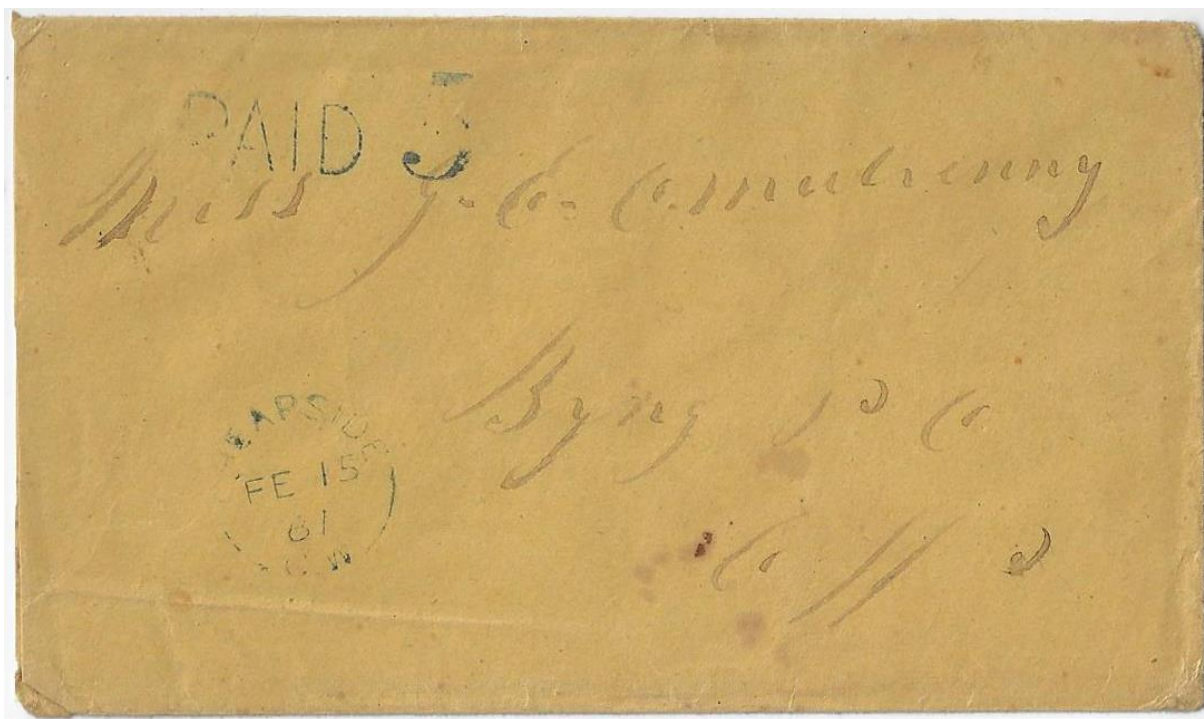
Item 570-10 – **Cayuga CW (Haldimand)** – 1851, folded cover from Cayuga CW rated 6d collect to Toronto (b/s) via Hamilton (b/s). This postmark with manuscript date is the latest recorded date and is rare, recorded for a few weeks only from SP 23 51 to NO 4 51. Refolded with internal archivist tape repair. \$150.00



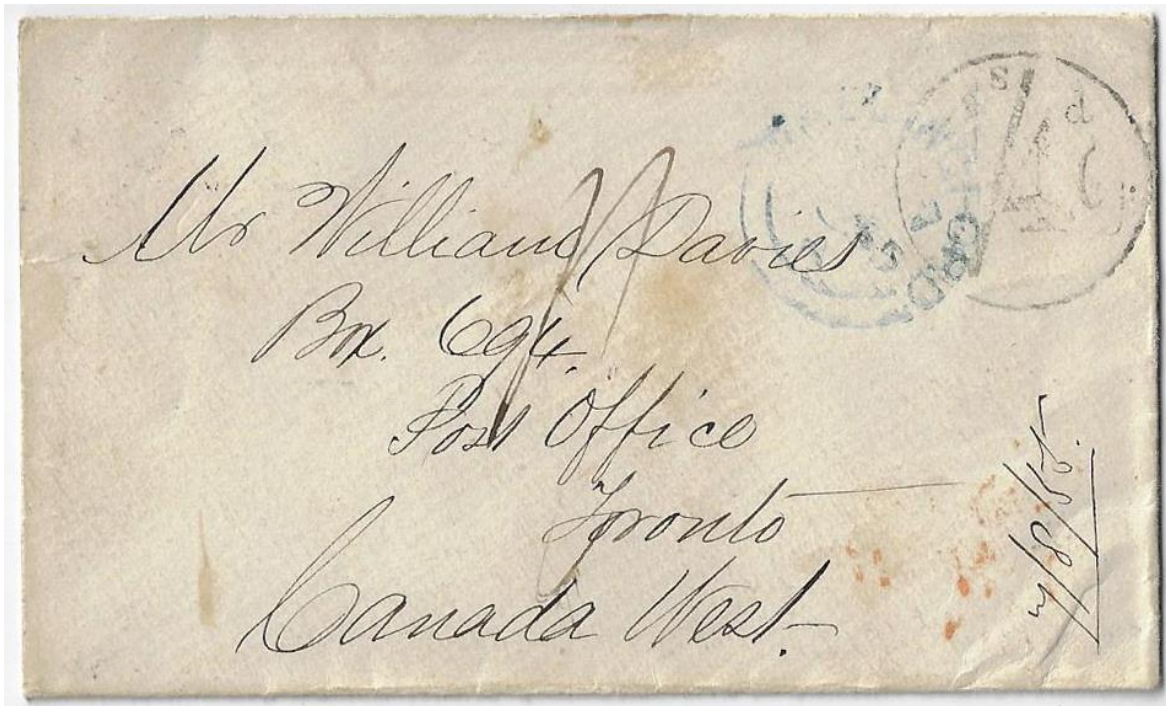
Item 570-11 – **Simcoe UC transatlantic via Montreal** – 1850, stampless cover from Simcoe UC paid 1/2 Stg 1/4 Currency to London England. Routed via Brantford and Montreal (b/s). Then sent to Boston and carried to Liverpool on the 16th voyage of the Cunard Europa. \$75.00 **SOLD**



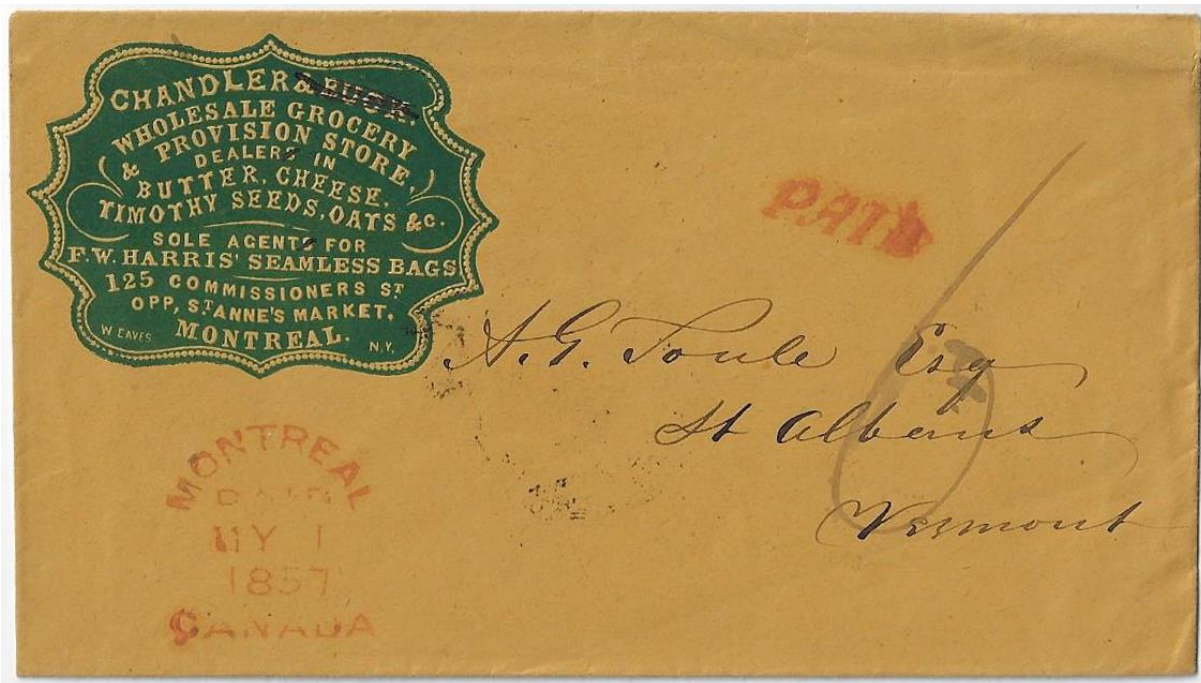
Item 570-12 – **Indiana UC (1841-1876, Haldimand)** – 1864, stampless cover from Indiana UC paid 5 to Toronto (b/s) via Seneca and Hamilton (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date of two known examples. \$100.00



Item 570-13 – **Cheapside CW (1862-1914, Haldimand)** – 1867, stampless cover from Cheapside CW paid 5 to Byng (b/s). Two scarce Berri hammers. \$75.00



Item 570-14 – **By American Line – GB to Toronto** – 1855, stampless cover from Wellington GB rated 1/ to Toronto (b/s) with 1/4 Currency collect, applied in Montreal (b/s). At first glance, we would think this cover was carried by Collins Line. It is a puzzle due to the delay having missed the Baltic sailing on SEP 8. The Pacific sailed from Liverpool on SEP 22 for New York. The Cunard America sailed SEP 15 for Boston arriving on the 28th. The America would match the Montreal backstamp OC 1. After discussion, we think this cover was carried by Ocean Liner “Washington” out of Southampton on SE 12 for New York arriving SE 27. An interesting non-Cunard non-Collins era cover. A very interesting cover related to Toronto. \$175.00



Item 570-15 – **Montreal – Butter & Cheese – Wholesale Grocery** – 1857, stampless cover from Montreal with Chandler Wholesale Grocery cameo embossed advertising cover, paid 6d paying the cross border rate to Vermont via Rouse's Point (b/s). Provision store, dealers in butter, cheese, timothy seeds, pats etc. St. Anne Market. \$500.00



Item 570-16 – **Paid G.W.R. – Hamilton CW to Buffalo** – 1857, stampless cover from Hamilton CW, Canada Paid 10 cents, paying the cross border letter rate to Buffalo. Oval Paid G.W.R. accountancy marking, Gray RY-66, RF F, 1856/1858, which was used and indicate payment to account of the Great Western Railway. \$300.00

TORONTO MARKET REPORT.

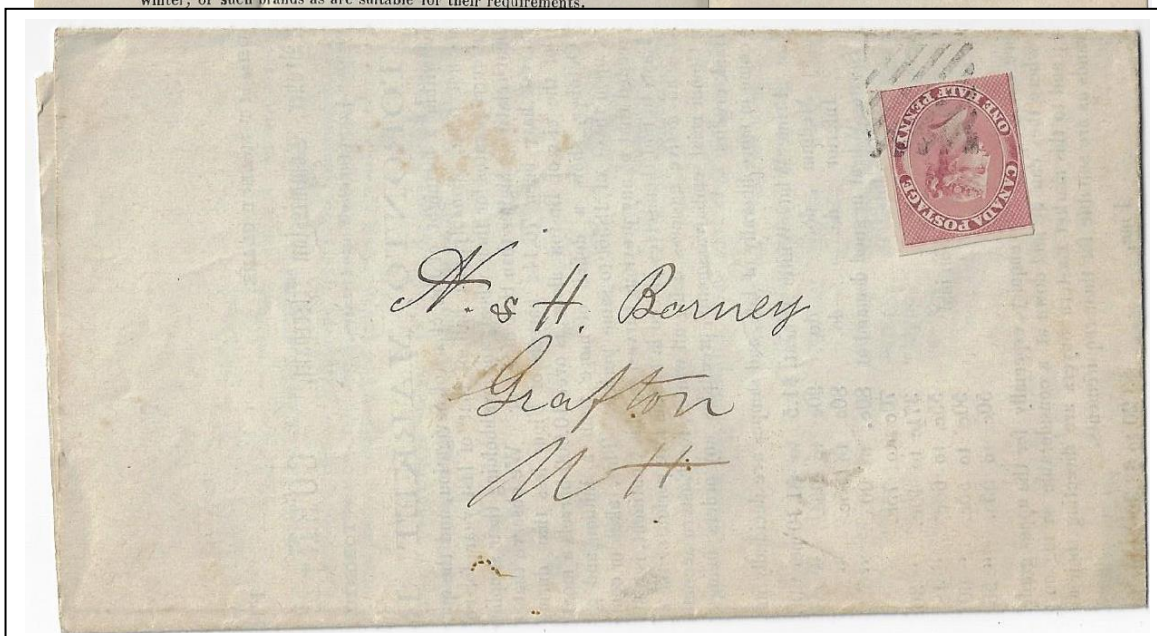
We are now within a fortnight of the close of navigation, and the quantity of Produce brought to market since harvest, has not been, probably, one half of that of last year for corresponding period. Farmers most reluctantly accept current rates for their wheat; and, withholding their supplies, have succeeded thus far in keeping the price of Wheat relatively higher than that of Flour. We observe that the receipts at Boston, by Rail and Water, since harvest, have been 76,142 barrels of Flour less than during the corresponding period of 1856. The consumption of the city of Boston alone, is over 10,000 barrels a month. The receipts at Albany, also, up to the end of October, show a deficit of more than a million and a quarter barrels of Flour (reducing Wheat to Flour), upon those of 1856, to same period. This, taken in connection with the fact that the production of 1857, exceeded that of any previous harvest on this Continent, is a startling position for the large consuming cities of the East, to find themselves placed in at this late period of the season.

There will be an active business doing all winter, for Eastern account, only limited by the capacity of our Railroads. The Commercial embarrassments, precludes any orders being filled for the States, but such as are accompanied by Bank credits.

WHEAT has come in more liberally of late, and samples are decidedly improving in value.

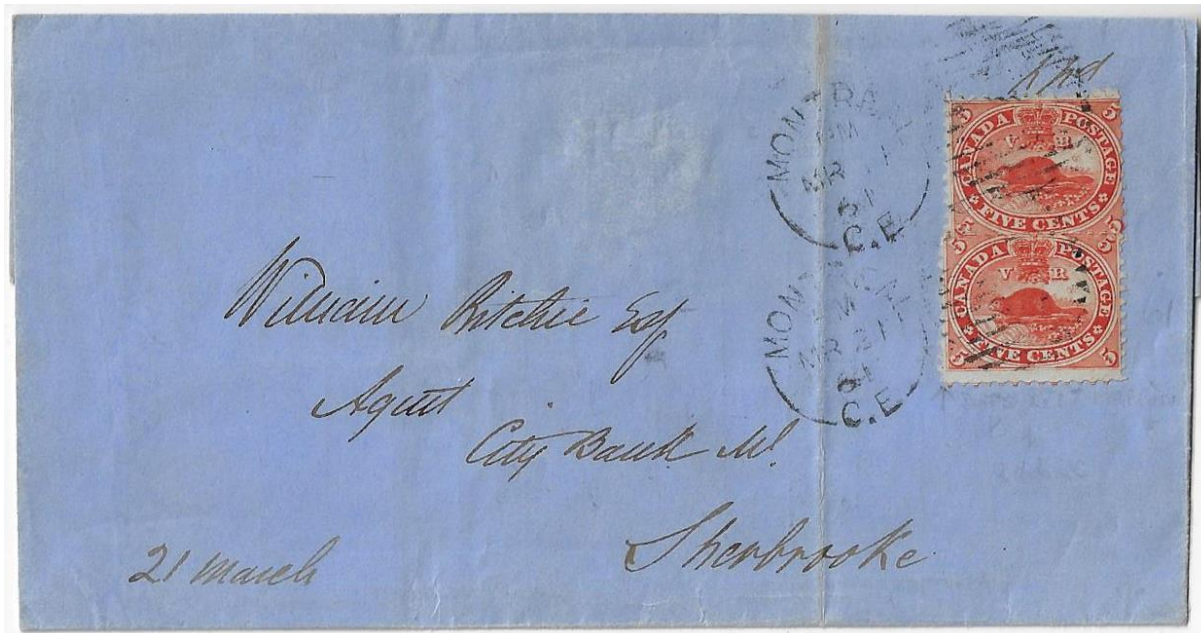

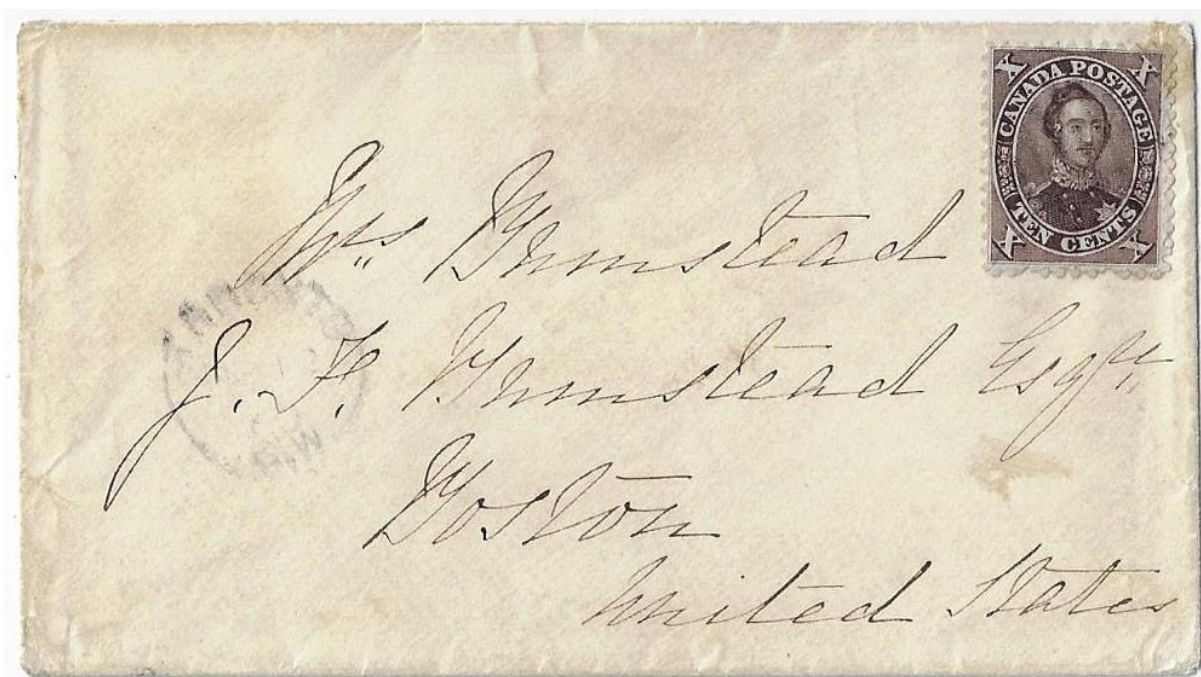

Item 570-17 – **Toronto market ½d circular to U.S.** – 1857, ½d deep rose (two large margins, touching at left, into at foot) tied by diamond grid cancel on Toronto Market Report (produce broker and commission merchant) circular paying ½d circular rate to New Hampshire U.States. A scarce circular to U.S. \$850.00



Item 570-18 – **10¢ double weight domestic rate** – 1861, 5¢ Beaver (2) tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel on folded cover paying 10¢ double weight letter rate to Sherbrooke. \$125.00 **SOLD**



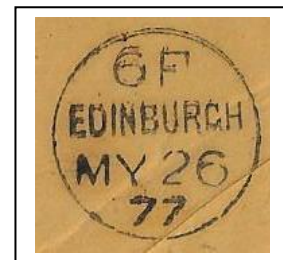
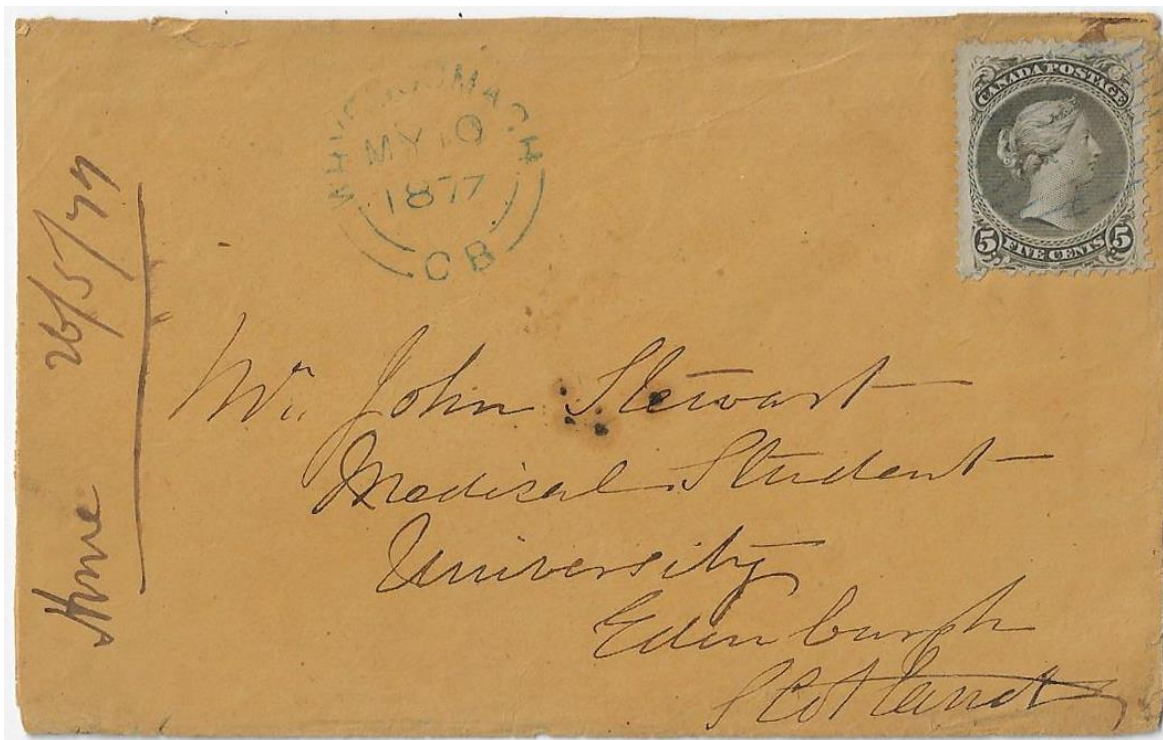
Item 570-19 – **17e - 10¢ Consort dark brown purple** – 1860, 10¢ Consort (dark brown purple, printing order 3A, 17e subsequent printing) cancelled by faint grid cancel on cover from Toronto (12 NO 60) paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Boston. \$500.00



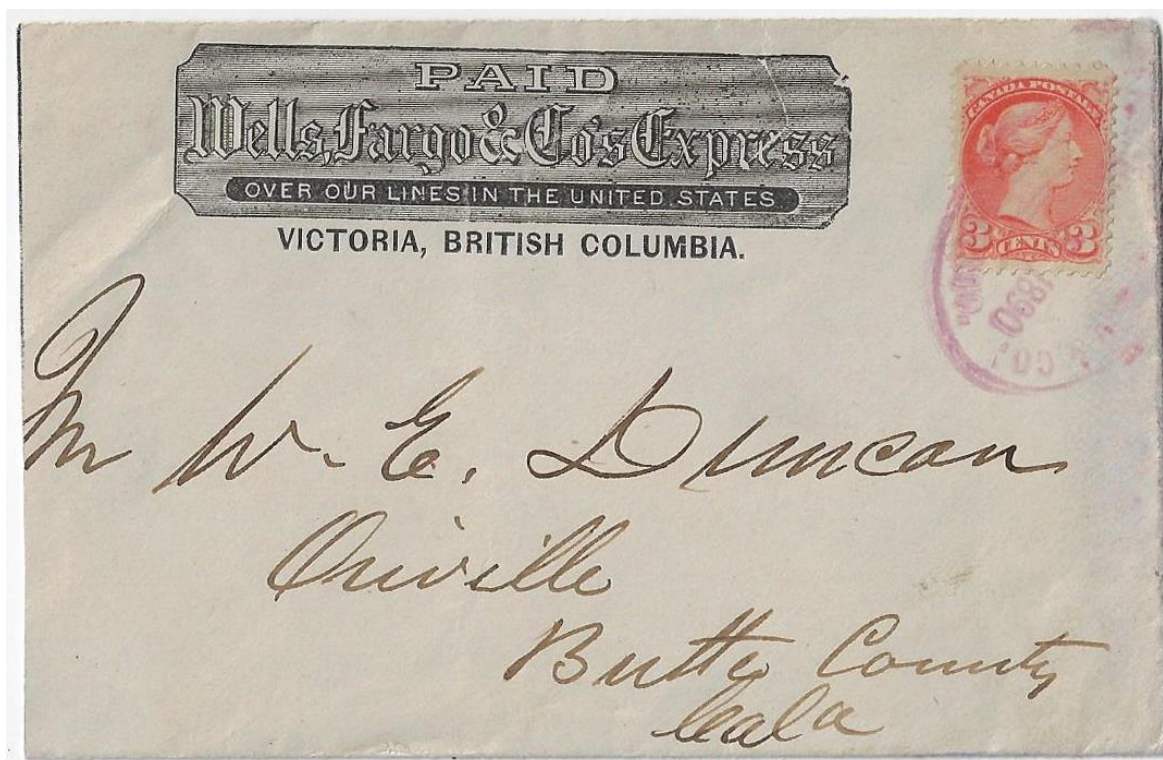
Item 570-20 – **1¢ Large Queen on medical advertising** – c1869, 1¢ LQ tied by grid cancel on H.L. Spencer General Agent for the Dominion for Ayer, Fowle, Burnett etc advertising cover paying 1¢ circular rate to Butternut Ridge NB. Spencer was dealing with remedies, cures and operated a medical warehouse. A wee bit ugly. \$200.00



Item 570-21 – **2¢ Large Queen very fine centering** – 1871, 2¢ Large Queen blue green, 1¢ SQ deep orange tied by London duplex "6" cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. A very pretty cover of the highest quality. \$500.00



Item 570-22 – **5¢ Large Queen cover to Scotland** – 1877, 5¢ Large Queen olive green tied by oval grid cancel on cover from Whycomagh C.B. paying 5¢ preferred letter rate to Scotland (b/s) via Cow Bay (b/s). Carried by Allan Line Peruvian. Addressed to a medical student at the University of Edinburgh. \$500.00



Item 570-23 – **Wells Fargo & Co. Express** – 1890, 3¢ SQ tied by oval Wells Fargo & Co. Express on cover, black Victoria BC company frank at top, slightly reduced at left, to California. \$150.00



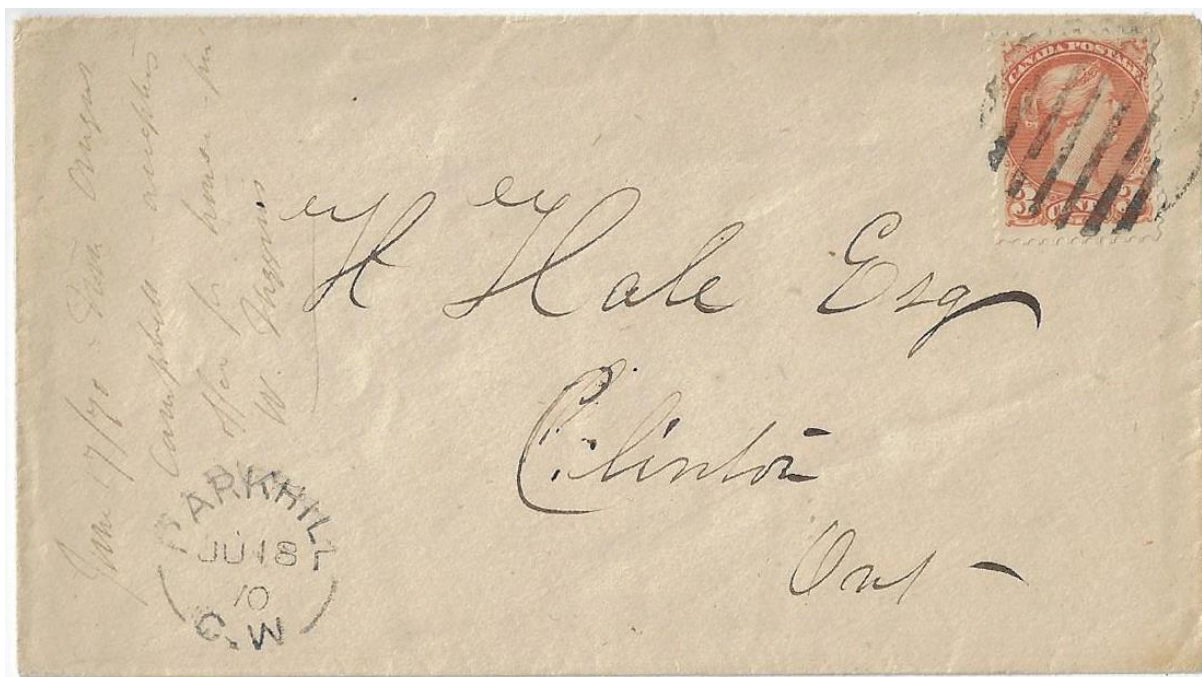

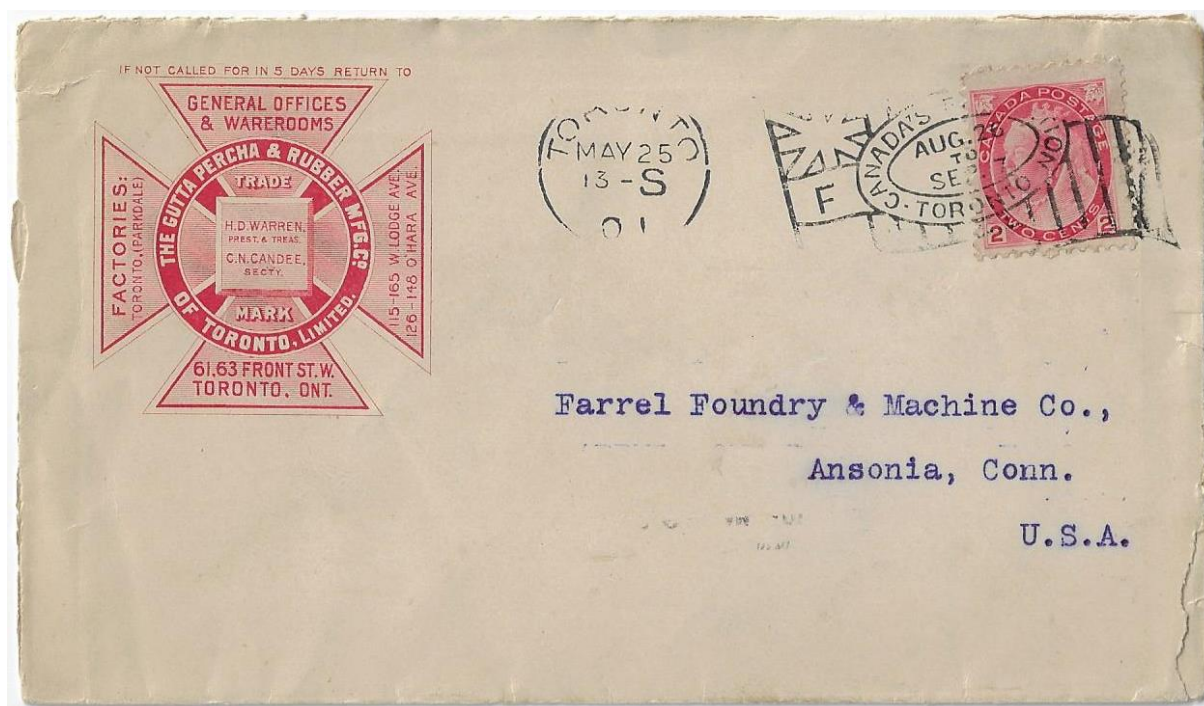
Item 570-45 – **Montreal type 5 Jubilee flag cancel, LRD** – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by Montreal Bickerdike machine cancel on 1¢ Jubilee stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany. Originally cancelled with the Montreal Jubilee flag, however, one more pass required with another machine due to misfeeding error (*both have same time mark 24-0*). This Jubilee flag type 5 was in use for only 7 days only, this one is the latest recorded date JUL 17 24-0 1897. Message written in Germany. \$600.00 **SOLD**



Item 570-46 – **8¢ Leaf on glass factory advertising cover** – 1898, 8¢ Maple Leaf tied by oval registered cancel on Pilkington Brothers Glass Factory advertising cover from Montreal paying 8¢ registered to Summerside PEI (b/s). Montreal Barred Circle hammer. Registered advertising covers with Leaf issue are all very scarce. \$175.00 **SOLD**



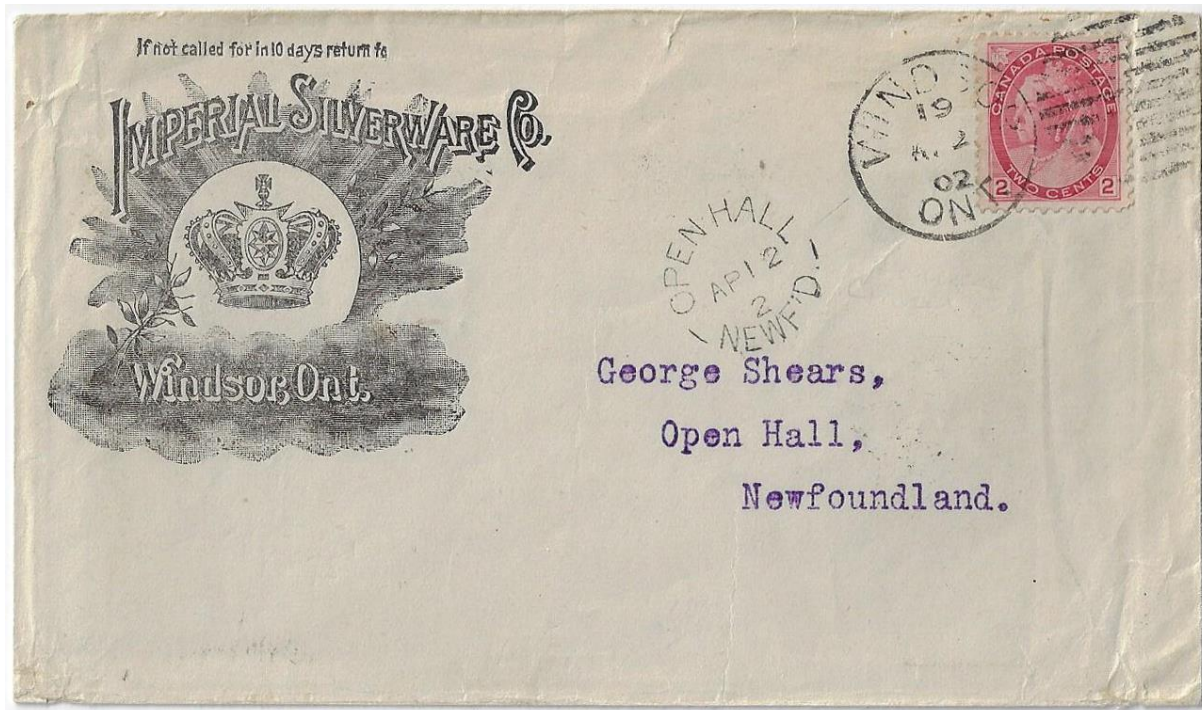

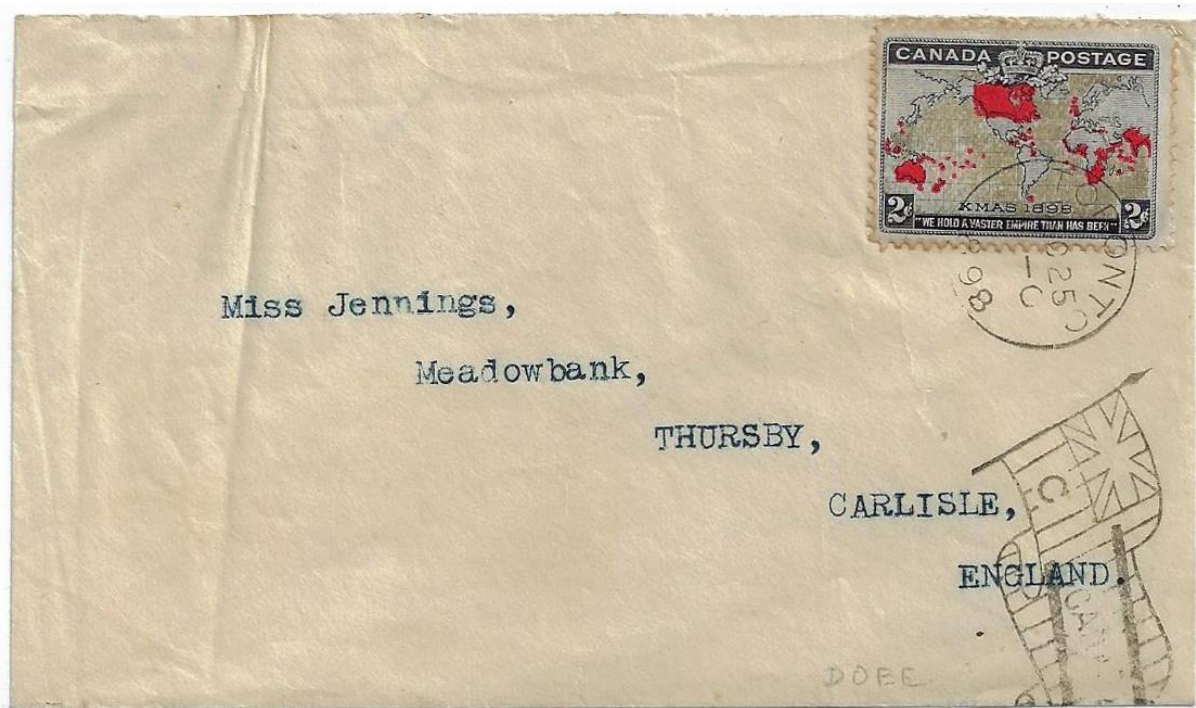

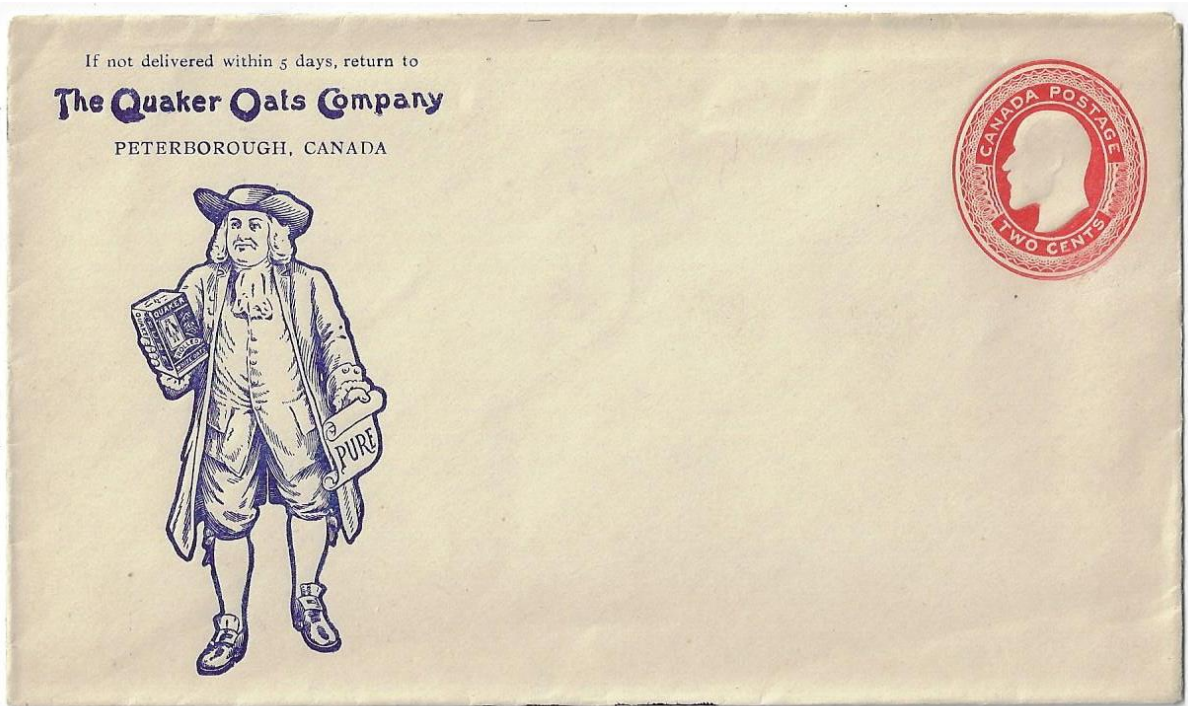

Item 570-55 – **Gutta Percha & Rubber Co. perfin** – 1924, 2¢ Admiral with Maltese Cross perfin on Gutta Percha & Rubber private postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Blind River. \$125.00



Item 570-56 – **2¢ postal stationery with misprint advertising** – 1905, 2¢ Edward PSE with Quaker Oats Co. misprint advertising with one normal. \$75.00



Item 570-57 – **World's Grain 20¢ on mailing tag** – 1933, 50¢ Grand Pre, 1¢ Medallion, 20¢ World's Grain Exhibition (3) tied by Toronto roller cancel on unaddressed mailing tag paying \$1.01 parcel rate to an unknown destination. According to the 1933 postal guide, a 9 pounds parcel from Ontario to Alberta was \$1.02. Tears between 50¢ and 1¢ stamps. An exceedingly rare use of the 20¢ World's Grain stamp in period. A real wow thing! \$350.00 **SOLD**



Item 570-58 – **\$1.15 parcel rate** – 1934, 20¢, 50¢ Arch, 3¢ (2), 13¢ Medallion (3) tied by Toronto roller cancel on unaddressed mailing tag paying \$1.15 parcel rate to an unknown destination. The 1934 postal guide states two options, a 10lbs to 15lbs parcel to Saskatchewan or to the Maritimes provinces. A pretty 50¢ Grand Pre use. \$200.00





Packet for 101 ounces (first ounce 17¢ including registration plus 5¢ per oz). A beauty! \$200.00
