Item 573-01 – <u>Hamilton UC (Barton - Dundurn Castle)</u> – 1831, business folded letter from Hamilton, datelined Barton OC 10 31, rated 11d collect to Kingston. The letter is signed by Richard Beasley, relates to £4000 debt. \$250.00



Item 573-02 – <u>Dundas UC (Wentworth)</u> – 1831, business folded letter from Dundas UC rated 1/4 collect to Montreal. The letter is from John Ross and relates to lots of land in Walpole. \$200.00



Item 573-03 – <u>Coldsteam UC (Middlesex)</u> – 1859, stampless cover from Coldsteam UC mailed unpaid with "Due 10" to U.S. Routed via Lobo and London (b/s). The Lobo postmark which is struck on front is the only recorded strike for this hammer. \$150.00



Item 573-04 – Westminster UC (Albino postmark) – 1850, folded letter datelined Delaware UC JU 18 50, written in German, mailed from Westminster UC to London England. Rated 1/2 Stg collect, carried by Cunard Europa trip 15. This Westminster postmark is the latest recorded date, hammer 1. A very unusual impressed postmark due to lack of ink and a very scarce Middlesex County office, closed in 1857. \$200.00





Item 573-05 – Ohio to London UC to Westminster UC – 1847, business folded letter datelined Saint Albans (Ohio), entered in Alexandria, rated 5¢ collect to London UC. Routed via Windsor, 5¢ converted to 3d plus 9d BNA postage total 1/ to London. Forwarded from London to Westminster with 4½d total 1/4 ½d collect. Westminster 1840-1857. \$250.00

Item 573-06 – <u>Scotland to Westminster UC (MDX, closed in 1857)</u> – 1847, stampless cover from Kirkmichael Scotland to Westminster UC. 1/2 Stg prepaid. Liverpool transit and carried by the Cunard Hibernia 27th voyage via Halifax. Westminster UC 1840-1857. \$150.00



Item 573-07 – Johnston's Mills UC (Huron, the earliest known) – 1861, stampless cover from Johnston's Mills UC with italic "Paid" 5 Cts paying 5¢ letter rate to Berlin (b/s) via Stratford (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date of all Johnston's Mills postmarks. Closed in 1897 \$125.00 SOLD




Item 573-08 – <u>Clinton UC (Huron)</u> – 1855, stampless folded cover from Clinton UC paid 3d to Goderich (b/s). An early postmark. \$50.00



Item 573-09 – **5¢ Nesbitt registered – Nairn UC** – 1863, 5¢ Nesbitt (EN1, 1860 flap knife S-1) mailed registered from Nairn UC paying 5¢ letter rate to Canada Company in Toronto (b/s) via London (b/s). 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. This is the latest recorded, hammer 1, of this Middlesex County office. A real wow cover!. \$500.00 **SOLD**



Item 573-10 – Gladstone CW (the only recorded example) – 1864, 5¢ Beaver with fancy pen cancel on cover from Gladstone CW, manuscript postmark July 13 1864, paying 5¢ letter rate to Milton (b/s). This is the only recorded example. \$400.00





Item 573-11 – <u>Brechin Ont registered by Toronto & Nipissing Railway</u> – 1881, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLC tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Brechin ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Victoria Road. Carried by Toronto & Nipissing Railway with Tor & Nip R. No.2 North (b/s) RY-188.02 RF E (1875-1883). \$125.00





Item 573-12 – Orillia Ont registered to Craighurst – 1887, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS (well centered) tied by large grid cancel on cover from Orillia paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Craighurst (b/s) via Barrie (b/s in blue). \$75.00



Item 573-13 – <u>Algoma Mills Ont registered (Algoma)</u> – 1890, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by target cancel on cover from Algoma Mills Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). RPO (b/s). \$125.00 SOLD



Item 573-14 – Seeley's Bay Ont registered (Leeds) – 1891, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by grid cancel on cover from Seeley's Bay Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to London (b/s, plus carrier marking) via Kingston (b/s). This is only the 2nd recorded example of the Seeley's Bay hammer III, the earliest date of the two. \$150.00




Item 573-15 – Quebec CE registered to England – 1881, 5¢ SQ (green), 5¢ RLS tied by Two-ring 3 cancel on cover from Quebec CE paying 10¢ UPU registered letter rate to England (neat Northampton b/s). \$400.00



Item 573-16 – <u>Argyle Ont registered (Ontario)</u> – 1896, 1¢ (2), 3¢ (2) SQ tied by Argyle Ont broken circle on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Carried by Tor & Lorne MC. This is Argyle hammer III recorded from 1895 to 1898. \$75.00



Item 573-17 – <u>Varna Ont registered (Huron)</u> – 1896, 8¢ SQ tied by Varna Ont broken circle on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s) via London (b/s) and London & Wingham MC T1S (b/s). This hammer is the latest reported date (1892-1896). \$50.00





Item 573-18 – Walkerton hotel advertising and registered to U.S. - 1872, 2¢, 3¢, 6¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on Waterson's Hotel all-over advertising cover from Walkerton UC paying 11¢ registered letter rate to US. Carried by GWR with boxed "Registered GWR" front and back with GWR split ring accompanies. Choice! Ex Harrison. \$750.00



Item 573-19 – <u>Kirkton Ont registered (Huron)</u> – 1898, 8¢ SQ tied by Registered straight line on cover from Kirkton Ont paying 8¢ registered to Toronto (b/s). Via St. Mary's and by Tor & Sar M.C. No.6 (ON-811.06). \$50.00



Item 573-20 – <u>Flinton Ont registered (L&A)</u> – 1874, 2¢, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Flinton Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate Toronto (b/s) via Napanee (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date of the hammer II. All struck in red. \$150.00



Item 573-21 – Michipicoten River Ont (Algoma) – 1882, 3¢ SQ tied by large grid cancel on cover from Michipicoten River ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Collingwood (b/s) via Sault Ste. Marie (b/s). \$200.00



Item 573-22 – <u>Peterson CW (Haliburton)</u> – 1876, 1¢ SQ (3) tied by grid and matching pen cancel on cover from Peterson CW paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto via Minden (b/s). Peterson was in operation from 1862 to 1877. This cover with Berri hammer C.W. is the latest recorded date of two reported examples. A rare office!. \$250.00



Item 573-23 – Smirleville Ont, the only recorded example (Dundas) – 1874, 3¢ SQ tied by Smirleville Ont broken circle on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Niagara (b/s) via Prescott and Kemptville (b/s). This Dundas County office was in operations from 1872 to 1879, then closed permanently. Reduced at left. This is one of the toughest Eastern Ontario postmarks, the only known example. \$500.00



Item 573-24 – Manitowaning Ont (Manitoulin) – 1881, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Manitowaning Ont to local addressee. I think this cover is a way letter, that the Manitowaning broken circle is a receiver. Most likely mailed on board the steamer on the run Collingwood or Tobermory to Manitowaning. \$75.00



Item 573-25 – <u>Manitowaning Lake Huron (Manitoulin)</u> – 1872, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Manitowaning Lake Huron to Seneca (b/s) via Hamilton (b/s). A very pretty despatch example. \$150.00



Item 573-26 – Michael's Bay Ont (Manitoulin) – 1879, 3¢ SQ (2) tied by target cancel on cover from Michael's Bay Ont paying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Toronto. This is the earliest recorded date of the first Michael's Bay hammer (1879-1882). \$250.00 SOLD







Item 573-31 – New Novel Tempest-Torn advertising – 1895, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto squared circle (PM JA 3 95) on New Novel Tempest-Torn by Haggard advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Halifax (b/s). William Bryce was wholesale book publisher and stationer. \$50.00



Item 573-32 – <u>Blyth Ontario (Huron)</u> – 1893, 3¢ SQ tied by Blyth Ont cds on William Campbell Clerk Court of Huron and Insurance, money to loan etc c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Clinton (b/s). \$25.00





Item 573-33 – 16¢ double weight pre-UPU treated as totally unpaid – 1874, 2¢ SQ green (2), 6¢ SQ deep yellow brown (Montreal perf 11½x12) initially paying 10¢ pre-UPU letter rate to France. Manuscript "Ins(ufficiently) Prepaid, over 1/3 oz, GB 2F accountancy marking, rated 24 French decimes representing 48¢ showing that no credit was given for the partial payment of 10¢. Treated as totally unpaid. Carried by the Allan Line Prussian from Quebec. Slightly reduced both sides from opening. A spectacular cover and great example of the confusing weight scale differential between Canada and France. \$2,000.00



Item 573-73 – <u>Vancouver airmail to Egypt, OAT</u> – 1944, 10¢ War tied by Vancouver blackout machine cancel on cover paying 10¢ airmail letter rate to Egypt. Canadian censor DB/67. The OAT marking was used solely on the top letter of the bundles of letters carried on international flights and in transit to other destinations. Very scarce on Canadian mail to Egypt. \$100.00



Item 573-74 – <u>8¢ War pair - 16¢ double wgt registered</u> – 1945, 8¢ War pair tied by London cds on cover paying 16¢ double weight registered letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). \$35.00



Item 573-75 – <u>Veillardville Sask shortpaid to France</u> – 1950, 20¢ Peace, 1¢ Postes Postage tied by Veillardville Sask cds on 4¢ PSE underpaying 30¢ double weight airmail letter rate to France. 5¢ short x2 x3 centimes total T30, converted to 26 Fr. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 573-76 – **55¢ airmail registered shortpaid to Belgium** – 1950, 20¢ Peace (2), 5¢ Postes Postage tied by Montreal Sub No.7 MOTO handstamp on FECB cover underpaying 55¢ triple weight registered letter rate to Belgium. Registration unpaid. 10¢ short x3 total T30. Passed for export with initials. Endorsed "Cigar Bands / No Value". \$100.00
