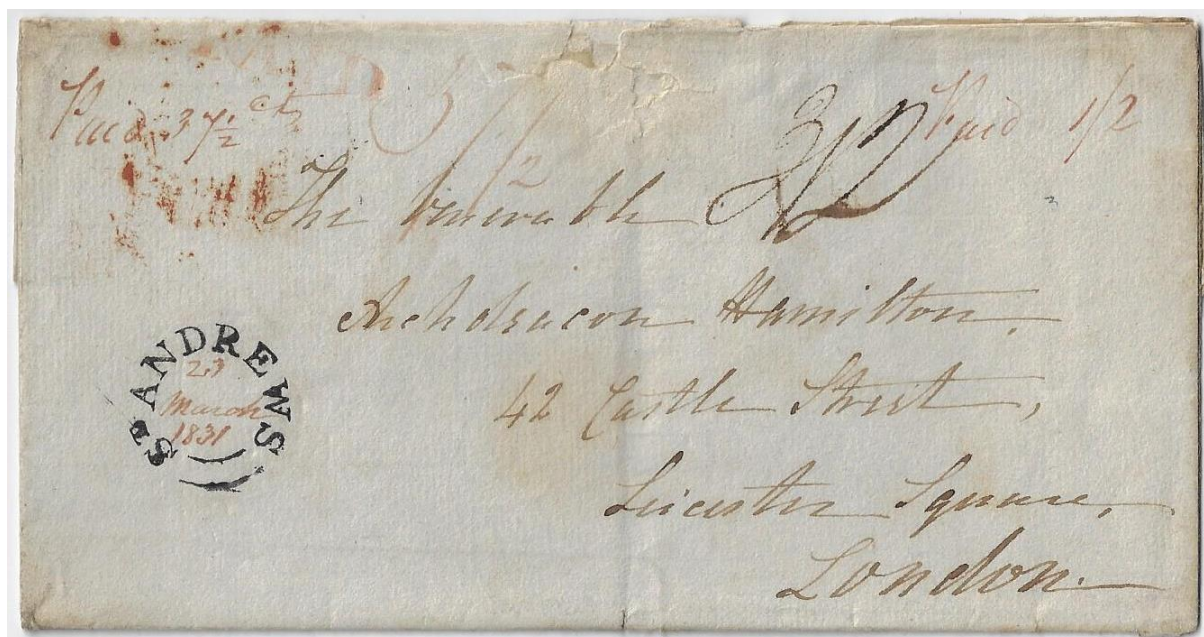

Item 579-01 – **St. Andrews LC to England (Argenteuil County)** – 1831, folded cover from St. Andrews LC (*Argenteuil County, early and exhibit strike struck in black – ms date in red*) to London England. Fully prepaid to New York with double 7d (1/2) and double 18¼¢ (37½¢). Carried by private trader from New York to Liverpool with Ship Letter Liverpool (b/s) and cds 29 AP 31 (b/s). Then, rated 3/2 Stg collect as a double letter with double 8d Stg ship letter fee plus double 11d Stg inland postage to London. Exhibit quality. \$400.00



Item 579-02 – Quebec to Varennes by Steamboat – 1856, stampless cover from Quebec CE (Ruggles indicia D dated 17 JUN 56) paid 3 to Varennes. Endorsed "Via Montreal Steamboat", Montreal (b/s). Previously referred to as Changeling postmarks, the Ruggles were manufactured by the U.S. company Boston Hand Stamp Co., founded by Stephen Ruggles. A very unusual St. Lawrence steamboat endorsement and out of the ordinary south shore destination. \$250.00 **SOLD**



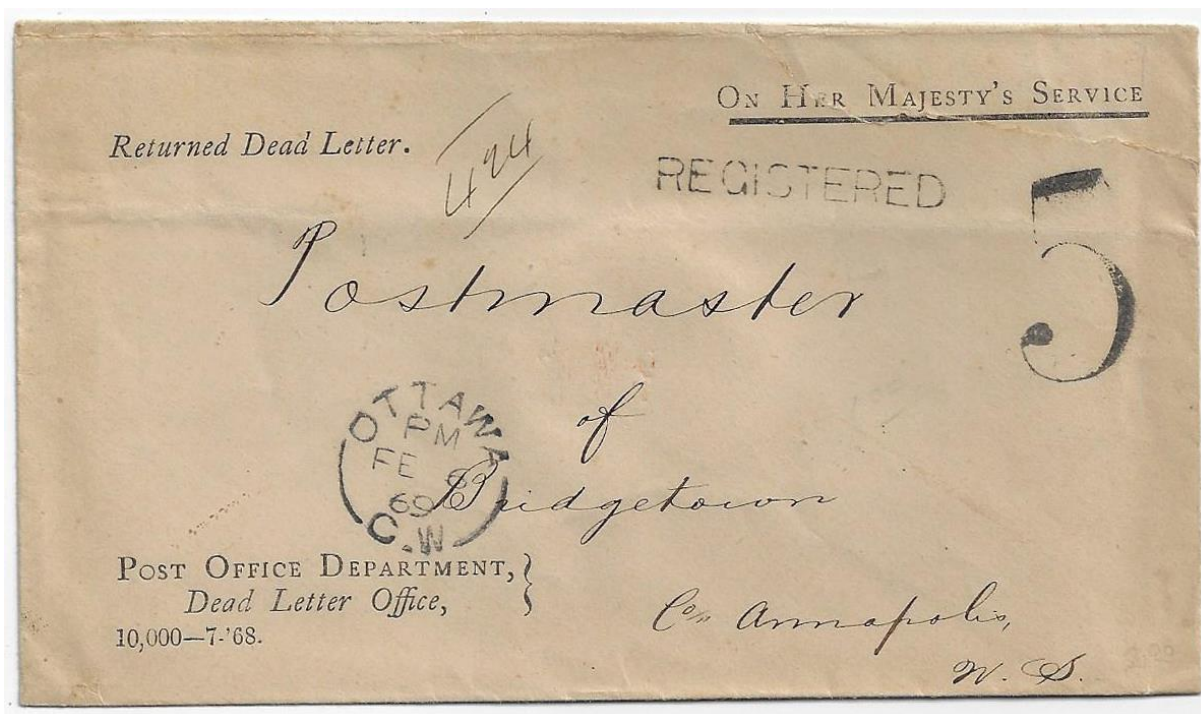
Item 579-03 – Lake Ontario Steamboat – 1840, folded letter from Cobourg rated 9d collect to Kingston. Carried by Lake Ontario steamboat with "STEAM BOAT" straight-line type 1 with variety. Placed and picked up directly aboard. Exhibit quality. \$400.00



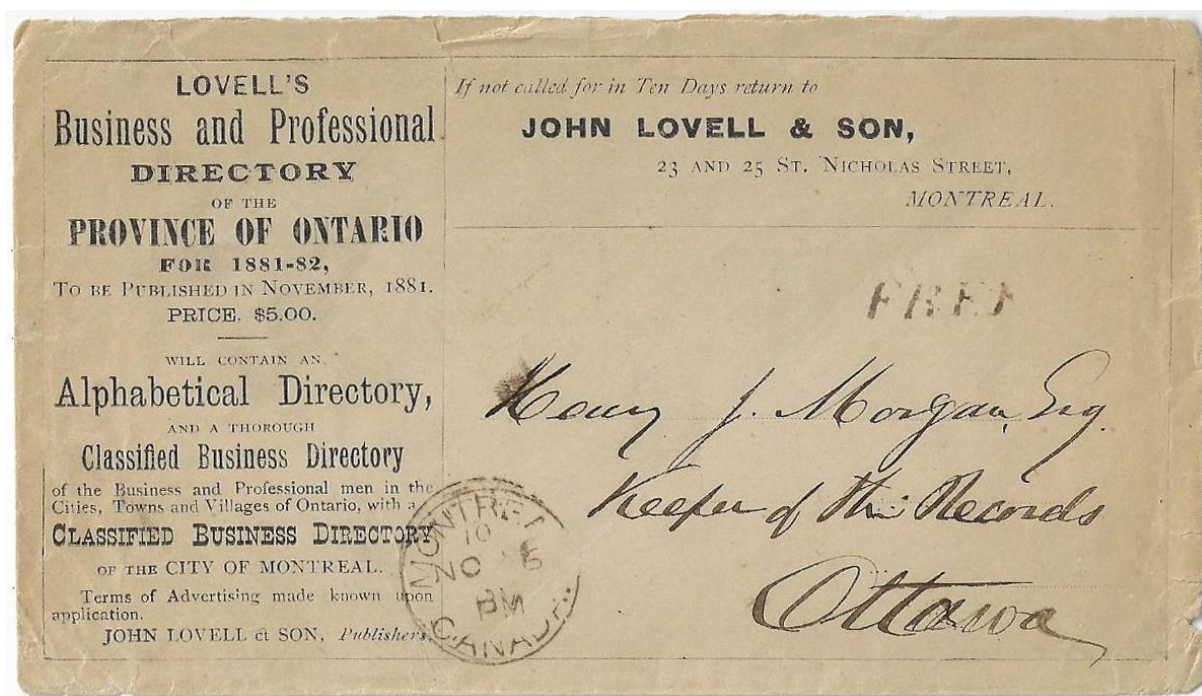
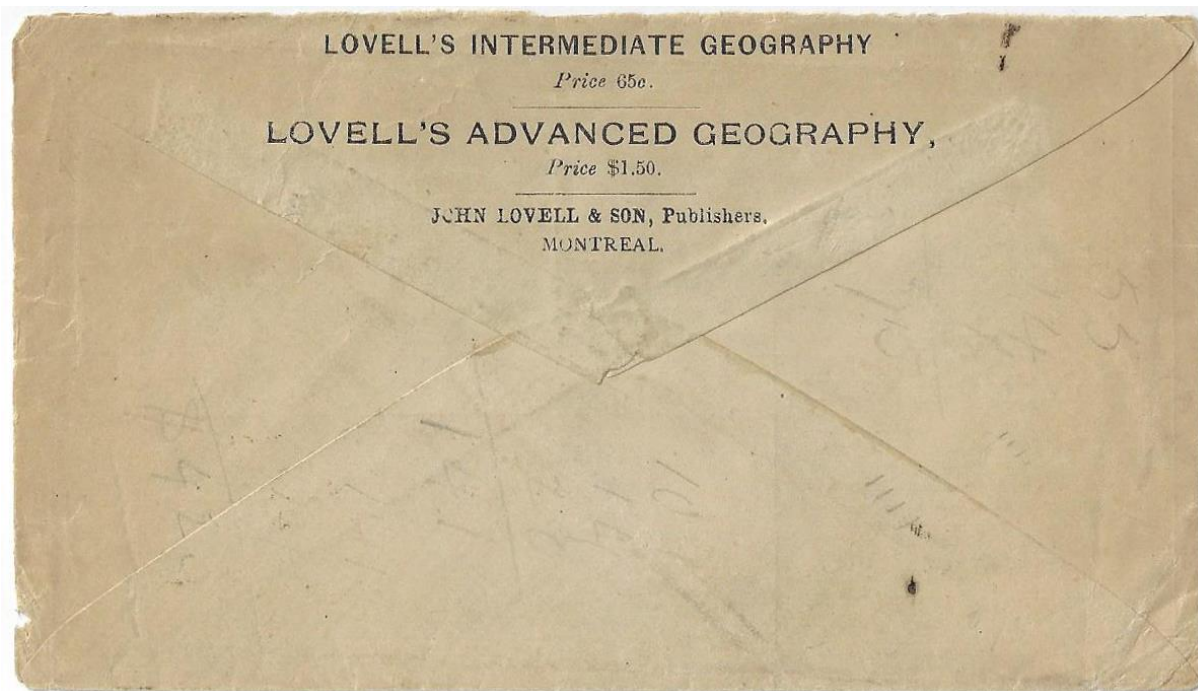
Item 579-04 – **Revival period of the Steamboat Q** – 1850, Edmunston Allan Co. folded letter from Quebec rated 9d collect to Montreal (JU 18 50). Carried by St. Lawrence steamboat with oval Steamboat Letter Q during the revival period May to July 1850. Very scarce. Ex Graham. \$400.00



Item 579-05 – **Immaculate Niagara Crown Steamboat** – 1840, folded letter from Montreal to Niagara. Carried privately to Toronto where it was placed on board the Toronto-Niagara steamboat service, likely the steamer "Transit". Upon reaching Niagara, the letter was datestamped in red JU 26 40 and received an immaculate strike of the rare *Steam Boat* crown handstamp. Subsequently rated 4½d collect for the cross-lake postage rate. Although the recorded period of use is between 1840 to 1843, there are only 4 recorded examples. Ex Parsons. \$3,250.00



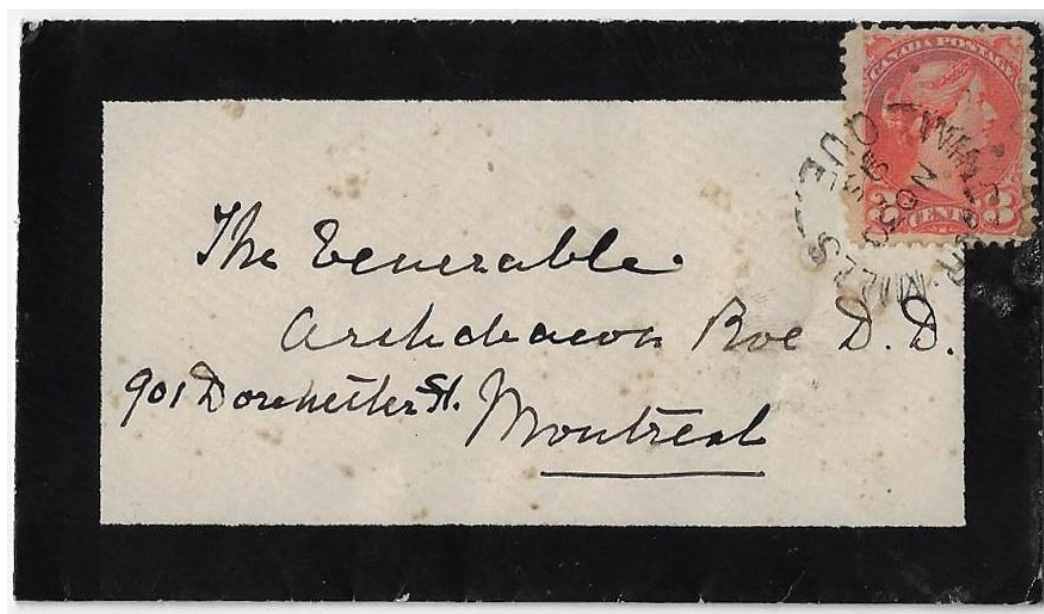
Item 579-06 – **Large Queen era registered returned dead letter** – 1869, registered returned dead letter ambulance cover from Ottawa, rated 5¢ collect, to Bridgetown Nova Scotia via St. John NB (b/s). OHMS form 10,000 7-68. Opening tear and pretty waxseal. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 579-07 – **John Lovell & Son printers** – 1881, free franked advertising cover from Montreal to Ottawa with John Lovell & Son all over. Lovell was printer and publisher. He arrived in Canada in 1820 and began his career as a printer in Montreal in 1835, concentrating on periodicals and newspapers. Lovell's company, known variously as Lovell & Gibson, John Lovell, Lovell Publishing and Printing, John Lovell & Son and then Lovell Litho & Publications Inc. He was known for its schoolbooks, gazetteers and city directories. \$150.00 **SOLD**



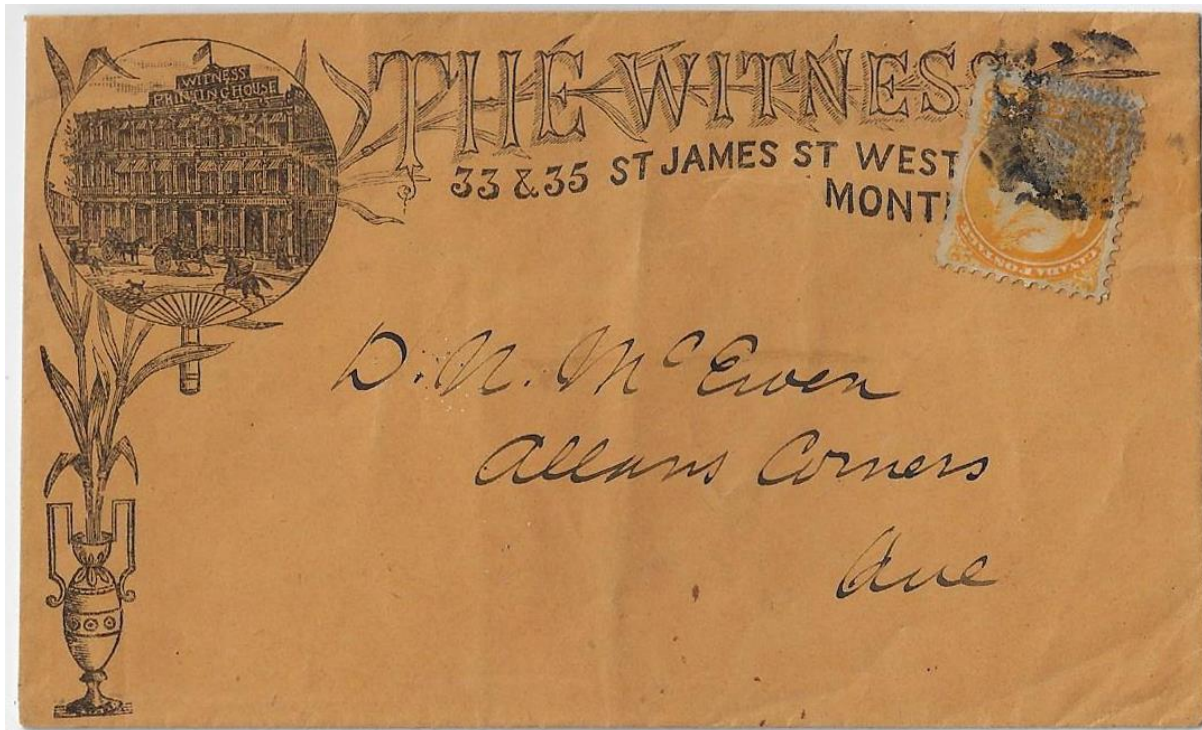

Item 579-09 – **Windsor Mills Que (Richmond)** – 1895, 3c SQ tied by Windsor Mills Que broken circle on tiny mourning cover paying 3c letter rate to Montreal (b/s + carrier). \$50.00



Item 579-10 – **Oshawa Masson Manufacturing Co.** – 1883, 3¢ SQ tied by Oshawa Ont cds on Oshawa Masson Manufacturing Co. advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Armadale. Masson was a farm implement company. The illustrated building on the cover became the new home of Schofield Woolen Mills in 1892. Slightly reduced at right. \$75.00 **SOLD**



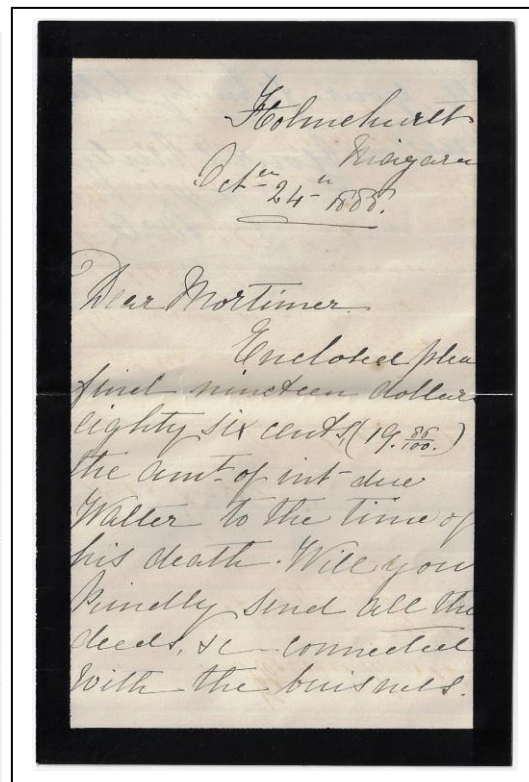
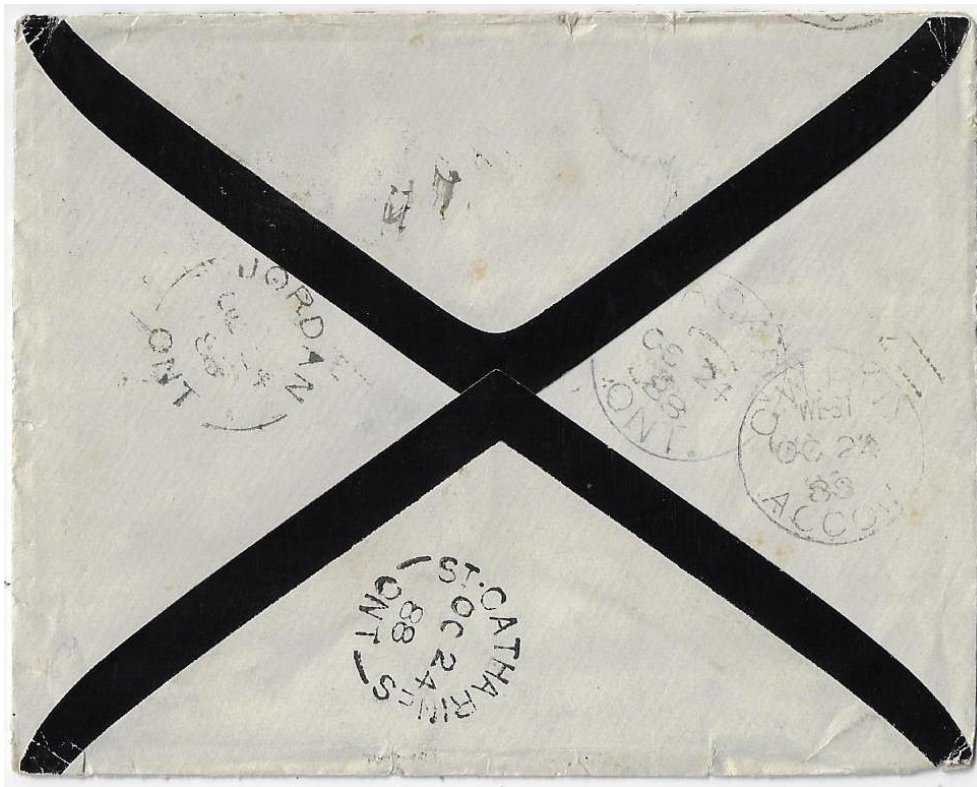
Item 579-11 – **The Witness Newspaper** – 1881, 1¢ SQ tied by fancy cork cancel on The Witness newspaper advertising cover from Montreal paying 1¢ circular rate to Allans Corners (b/s). Unsealed. \$125.00



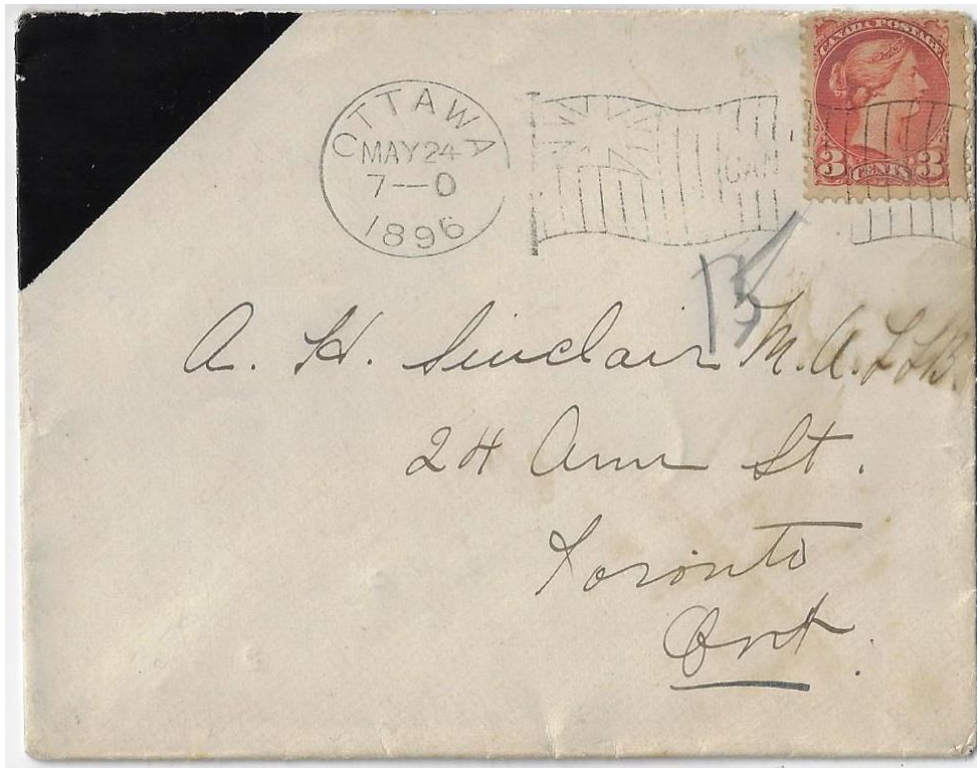
Item 579-12 – **Halifax circular mailed unpaid** – 1883, unsealed cover from Halifax posted unpaid to Moncton. Caught and returned for postage. Half cent SQ added (*slate black, perf 11.9*), cancelled by Halifax duplex cancel (AU 27 83). The circular was intended for Moncton by passed through Toronto (AU 29 83). An early example and a seldom seen ½¢ SQ usage. \$250.00 **SOLD**



Item 579-13 – **Kincardine registered** – 1877, 2¢, 3¢ SQ cancelled by cork cancel on cover from Kincardine UC paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A late use of this Kincardine UC hammer. \$40.00



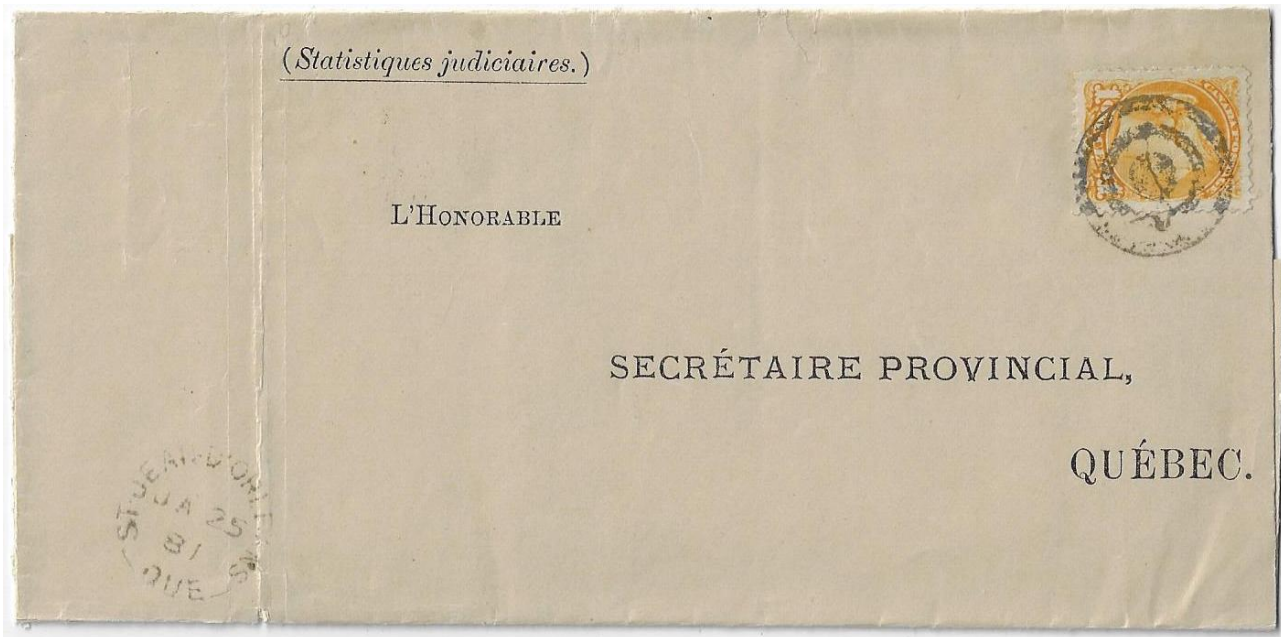

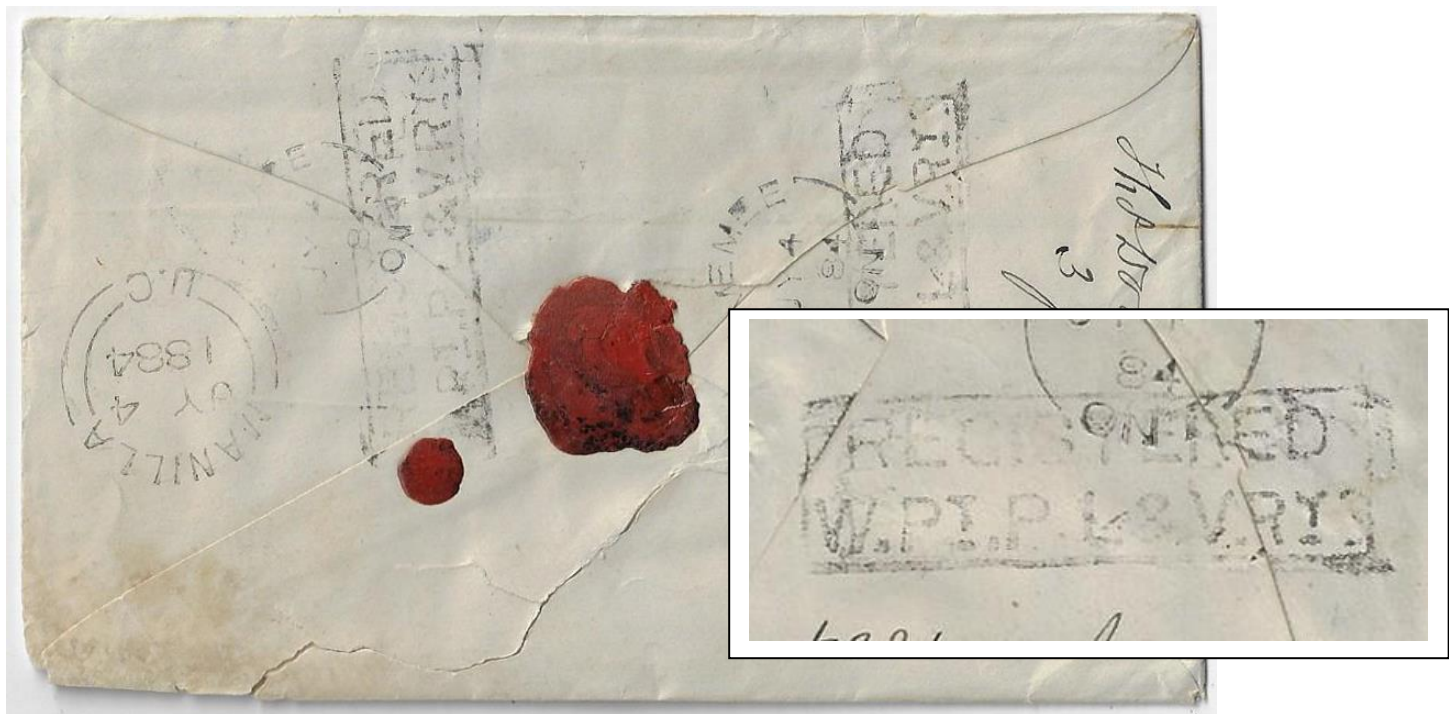
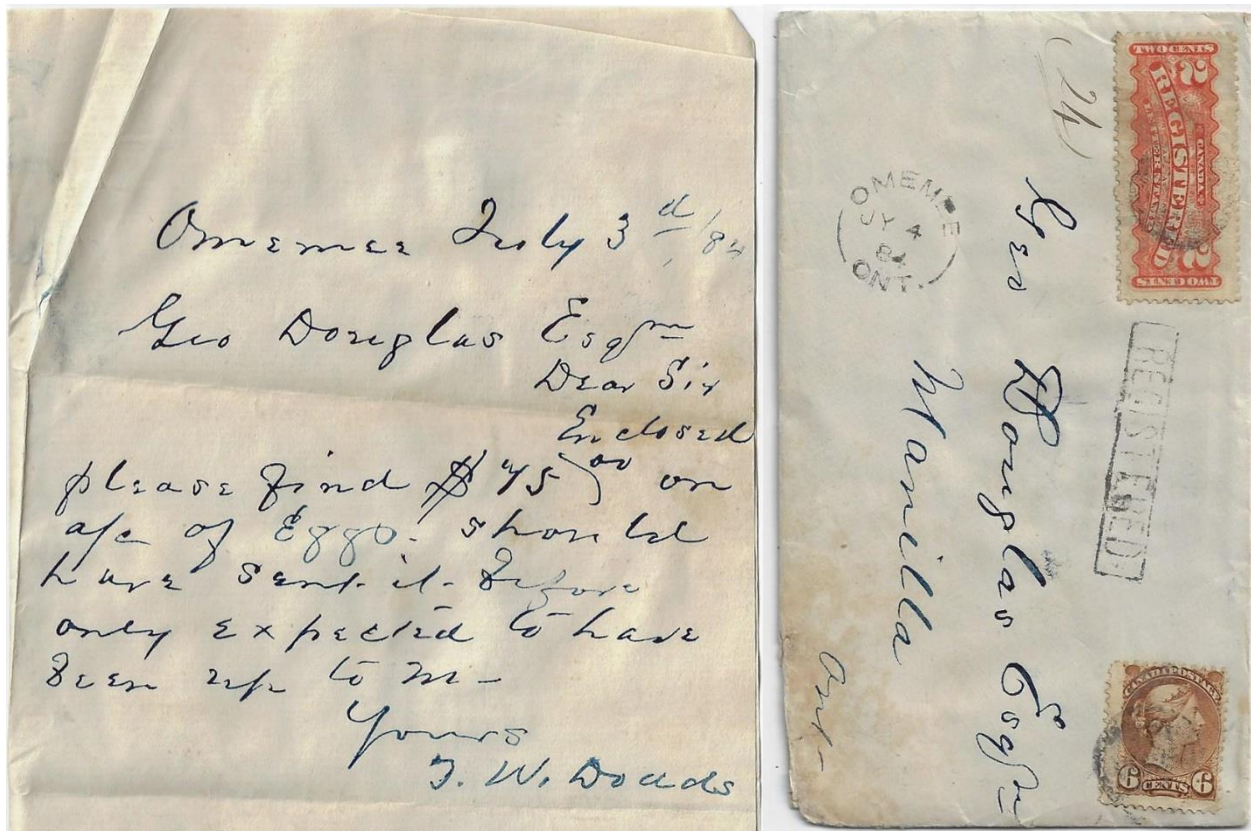
Item 579-17 – **St. Jean d'Orleans Que** – 1881, 1¢ SQ tied by target cancel on folded pre-printed statistical returns cover from St. Jean d'Orleans Que paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Quebec. A scarce Island of Orleans 1880's postmark. \$100.00 **SOLD**



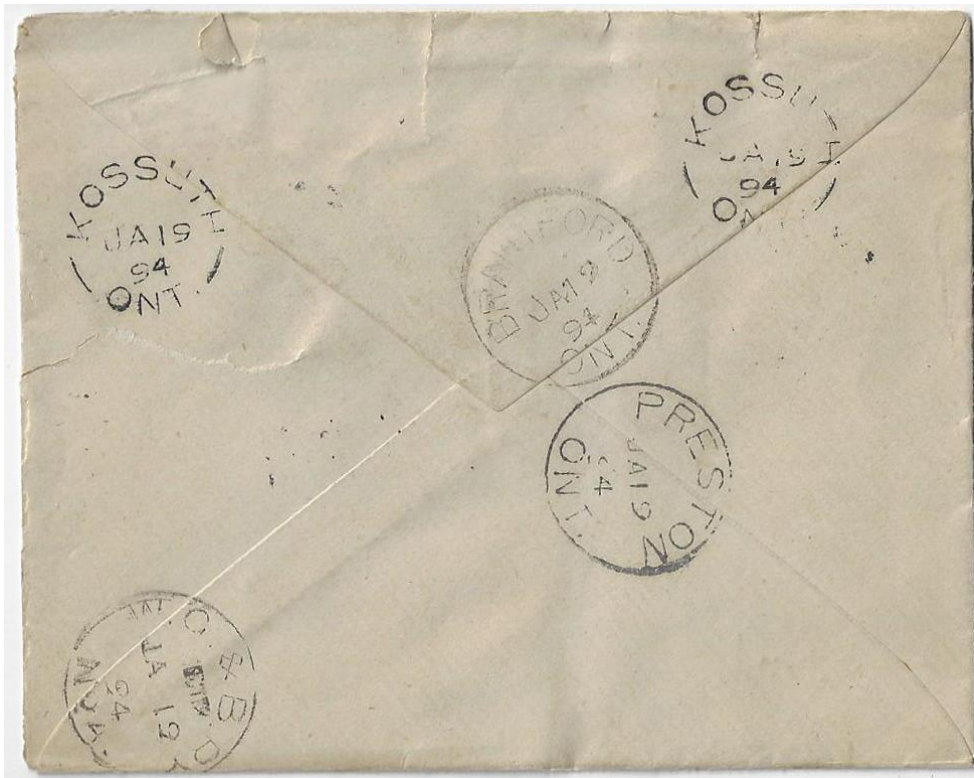
Item 579-18 – **Drummondville Que** – **2nd Premier of Quebec** – 1874, 2¢, 3¢ SQ tied by smudge cancel on folded pre-printed statistical returns cover from Drummondville Que, FE 24 74, paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Quebec. All marking struck in blue. The cover is addressed to Gédéon Ouimet the second Premier of Quebec (IN OFFICE). He served from February 26, 1873 to September 22, 1874. \$150.00



Item 579-19 – **Whitby Port Perry Lindsay & Victoria Railway** – 1881, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel, 2¢ RLS with registration number on cover from Woodville Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Manilla (b/s) via Whitby (b/s). Carried by Whitby, Port Perry, Lindsay & Victoria Railway with boxed Registered W.Pt PL& VRys (RY-220, 1879-1884, RF F). Opening tear. \$200.00 **SOLD**



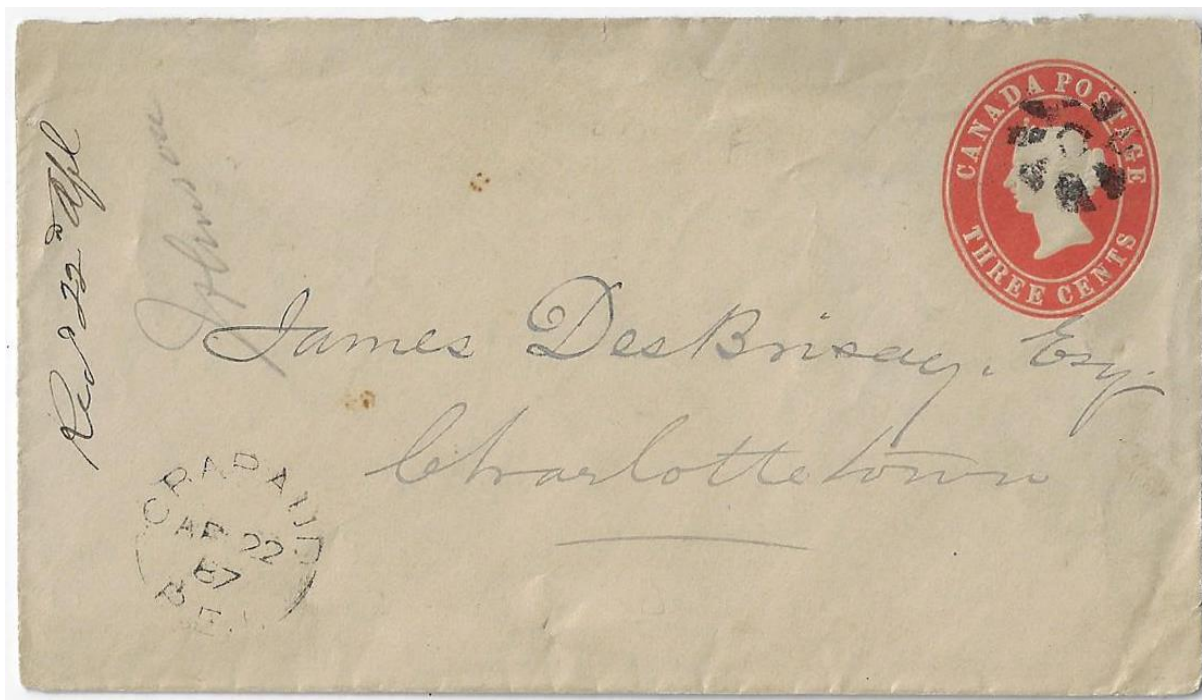
Item 579-20 – Whitby Port Perry Lindsay & Victoria Railway – 1884, 6¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by cork cancel cover from Omemece Ont paying 8¢ double weight registered letter rate to Manilla. Carried by Whitby, Port Perry, Lindsay & Victoria Railway with boxed Registered W.Pt PL& VRys (RY-220, 1879-1884, RF F). Opening tear, staining, letter accompanies. \$200.00



Item 579-21 – Kossuth Ont registered (Waterloo) – 1894, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by cork cancel on cover from Kossuth Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Brantford (b/s). Prescott transit (b/s) and carried by W.G. & B Ry No.4 (RY-214.04, RF D, Wellington Grey & Bruce Railway). This is the Kossuth broken circle with period after ONT, recorded 1893-1903. 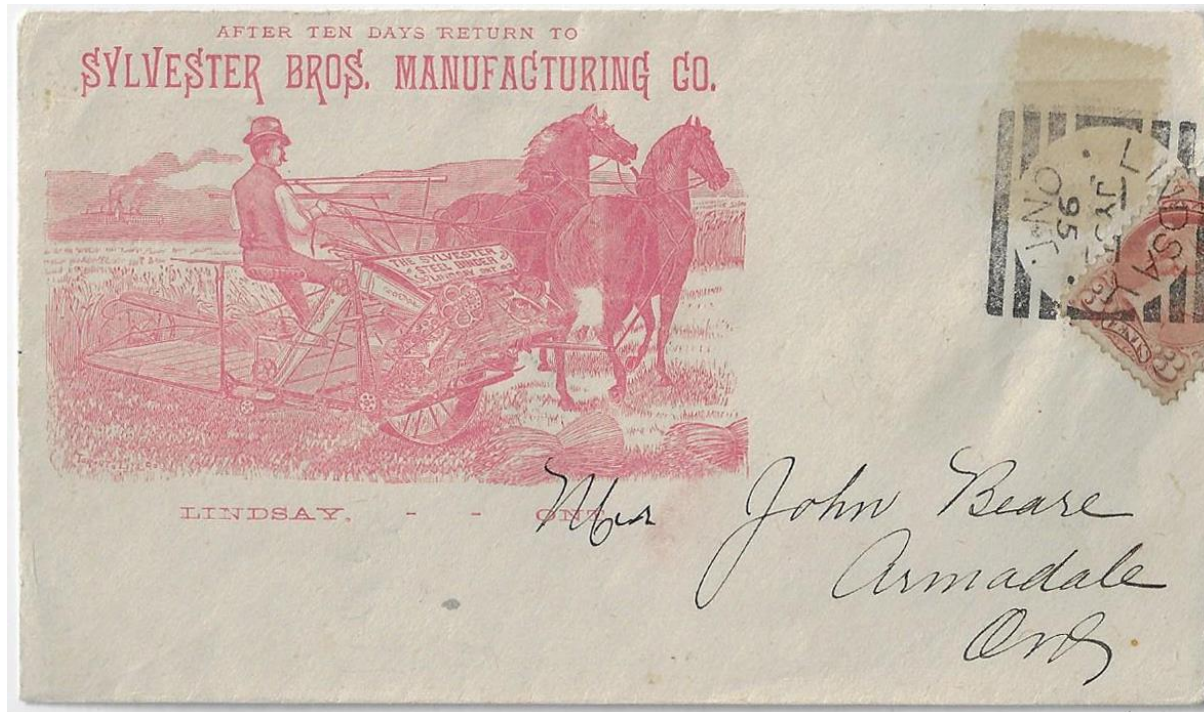

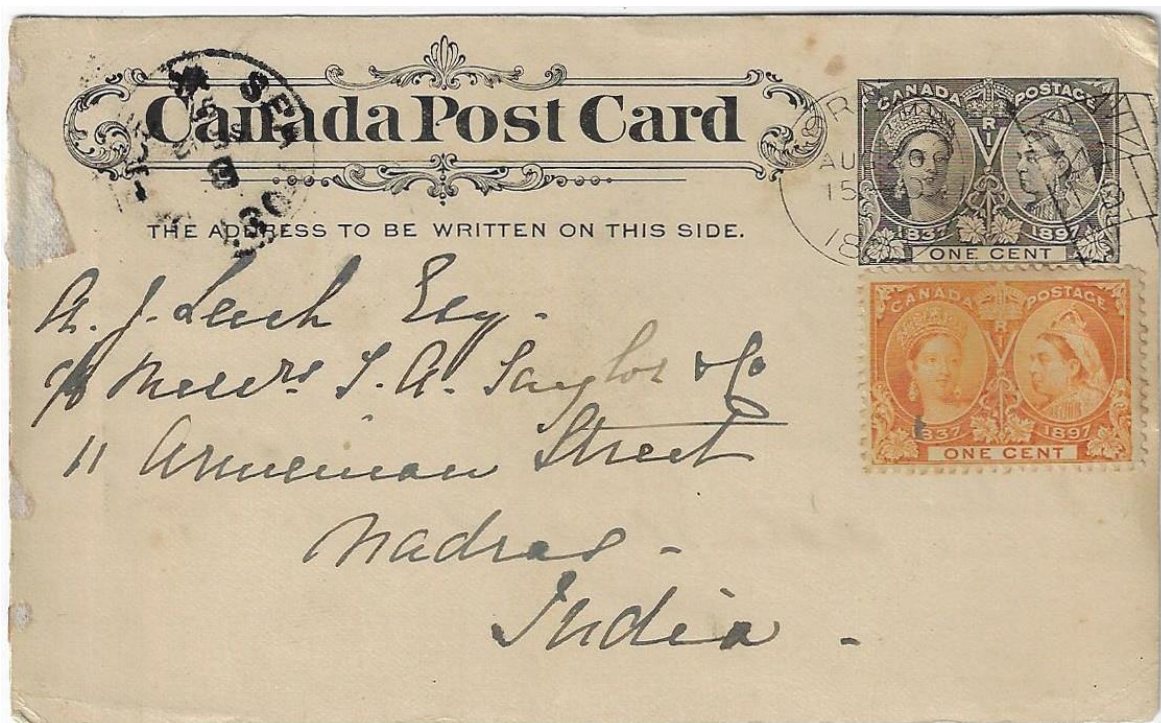

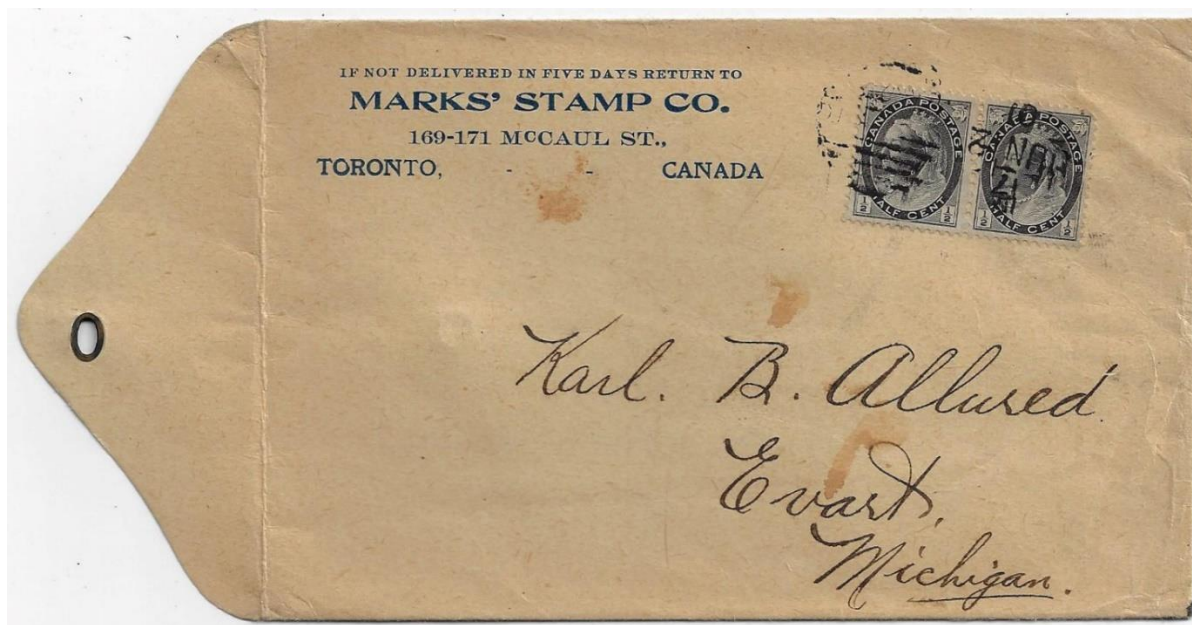
Item 579-24 – **Keewatin Mills Ont the only recorded example** – 1887, 3¢ stationery envelope mailed from Keewatin Mills Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. Fancy cancel. This postmark is the only recorded example. A rare Kenora office opened in 1880 and closed in 1888. \$400.00 **SOLD**



Item 579-25 – **Lindsay Sylvester Bros Mfg Co.** – 1895, 3¢ SQ (affixed over the edge and trimmed) tied by Lindsay Ont squared circle on Sylvester Bros Manufacturing Co. advertising cover paying 3¢ letter ate to Armadale. Stamp staining prior to franking and mailing. Tiny reduction. \$125.00 **SOLD**



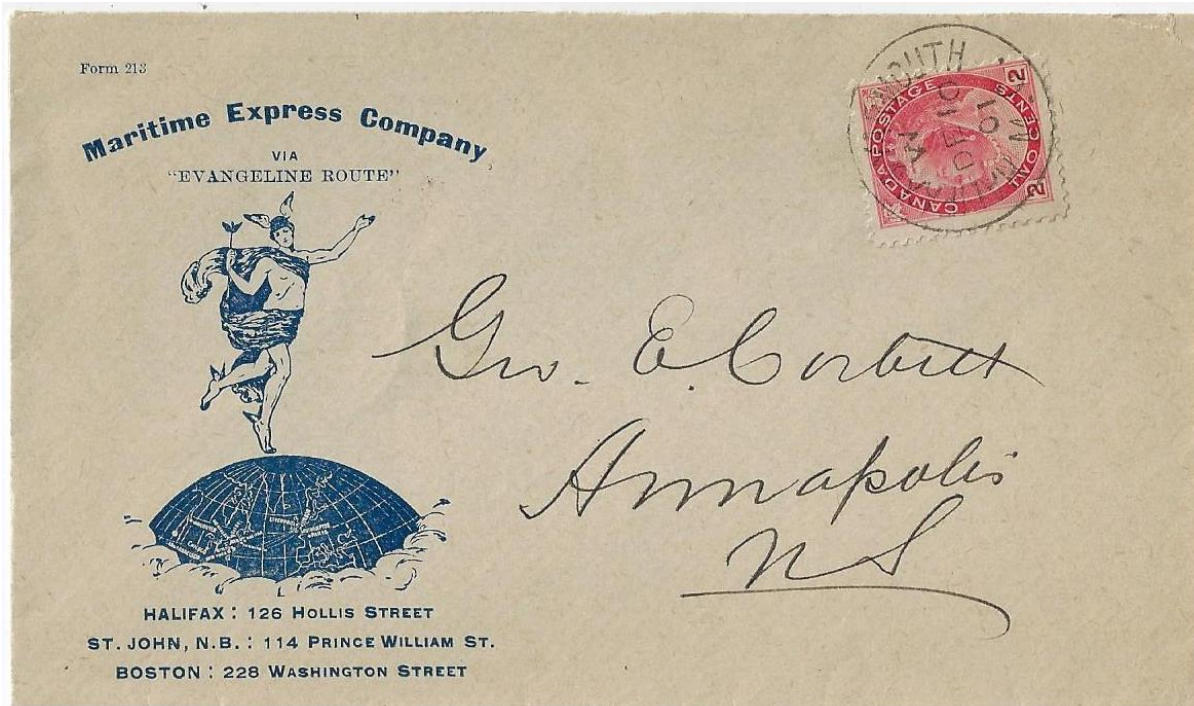
Item 579-26 – **Jubilee - 2¢ UPU postcard rate to India** – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on 1¢ Jubilee stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to India. Sea Post Office transit on front. The stamp is tied by the bottom of the hub just under the 9 of 1897. The message is about sending this card so recipient could have the Jubilee stamp, few lines on 5¢ and 10¢ Jubilee and then how to get to Toronto from Quebec City, by steamboat to Montreal and by train to Toronto etc. \$125.00



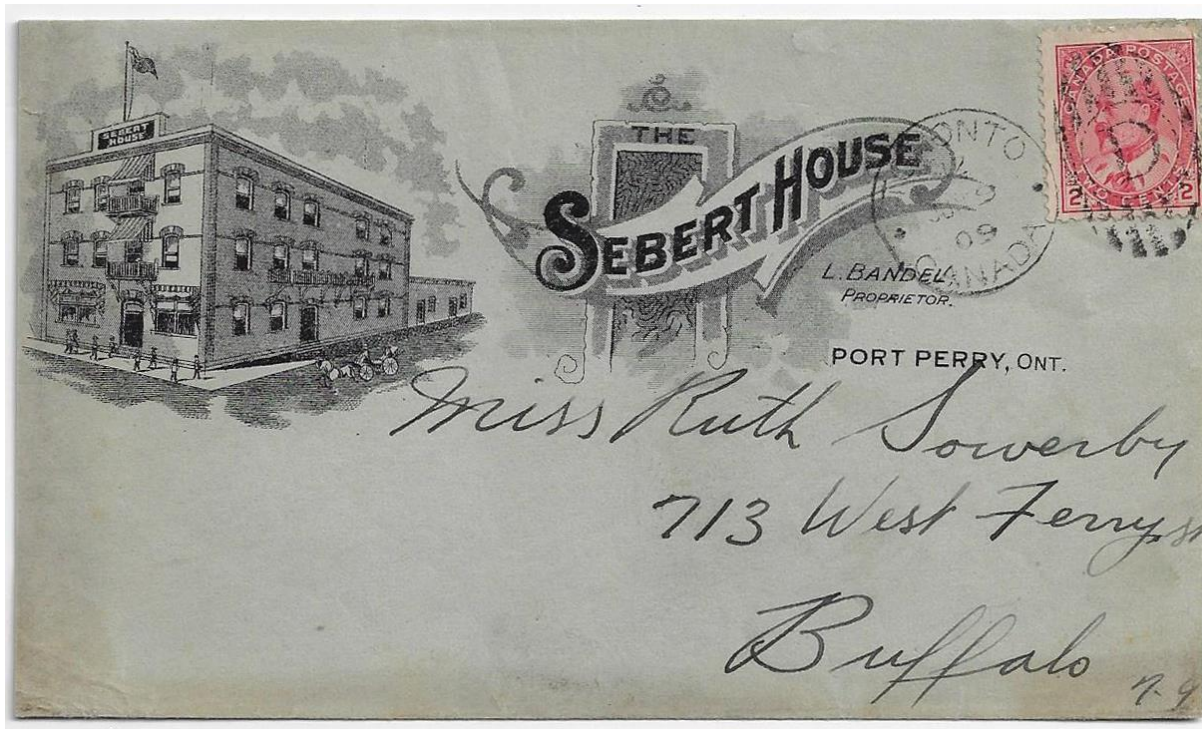
Item 579-27 – **Toronto experimental duplex** – 1901, ½¢ Numeral pair tied by the very scarce Toronto experimental duplex cancel on Mark's Stamp Co. sample envelope paying 1¢ printed matter rate to U.S. This duplex, DUN-148, is recorded from April 1901 to January 1902. Later in 1902, modified and became a 2-ring Orb with ERD record OC 6 02. \$200.00 **SOLD**



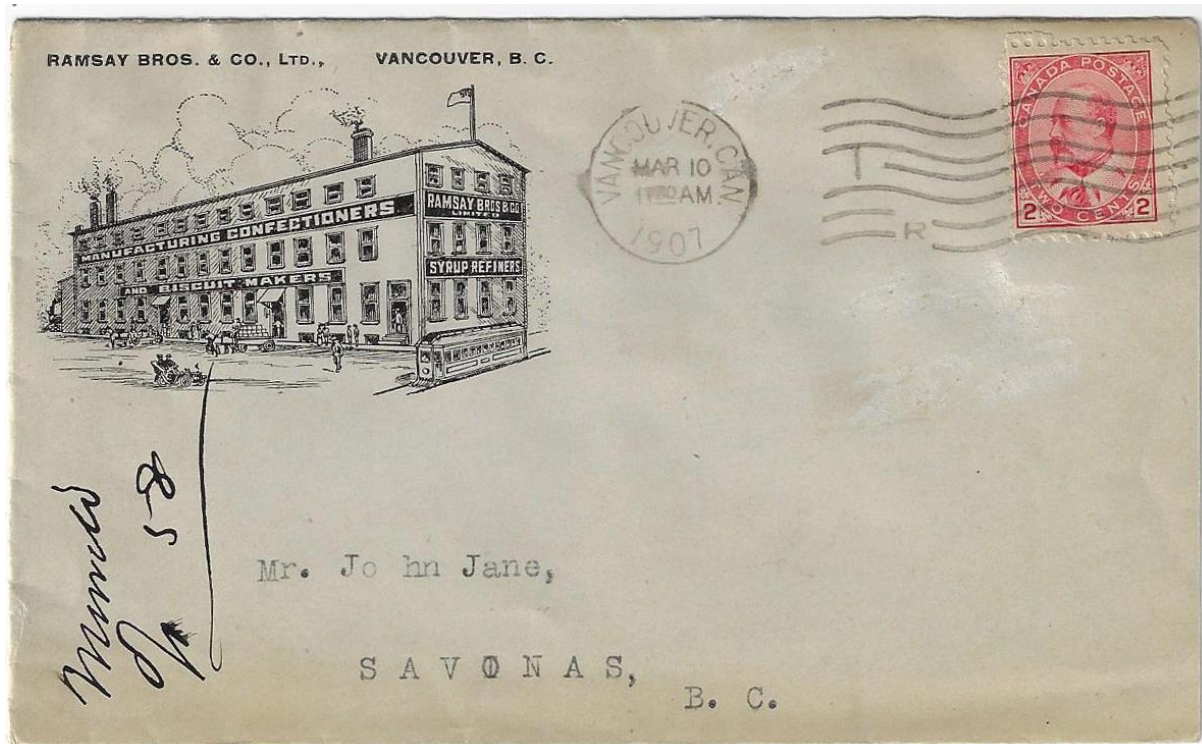

The Salonica Forces were in Serbia, Greece, Germany, Albania, the Adriatic Coast, Austria, Hungary and Bulgaria. \$150.00



Item 579-41 – **Ottawa Hintonburg Ont MOOD cancel** – 1931, 12¢ Historical tied by Ottawa Hintonburg registered marking on Bank of Nova Scotia cover, Ottawa Hintonburg MOOD cancel, paying 12¢ drop registered letter rate (Ottawa R cds b/s). A very tough Ottawa postmark. \$50.00 **SOLD**

Item 579-78 – **Y Force remailed cover to Nova Scotia** – 1943, GB 2½d tied by FPO 4 (Aldershot UK) on YMCA censored cover to a lady in Jamaica. The cover was remailed airmail from Cross Road Jamaica to Halifax Nova Scotia. Return address B46066 Pte Black BHQ, 1st Battn Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders of C. CAO. \$100.00

The first Canadian battalion serving in Jamaica were the Winnipeg Grenadiers. After their service in Jamaica, the Grenadiers were transferred to Hong Kong where they faced Japanese forces in the Battle of Hong Kong. The 1st Battn Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders replaced the Grenadiers there until May 1943 and then moved to Aldershot, UK. Perhaps Pte Black was writing to a girlfriend, and she had moved to Canada.



15 August

U.S. and Canadian forces land at Kiska to retake island; find it abandoned by the Japanese

24 August

U.S. forces declare area is secure; this marks the end of the Aleutian Campaign of World War II

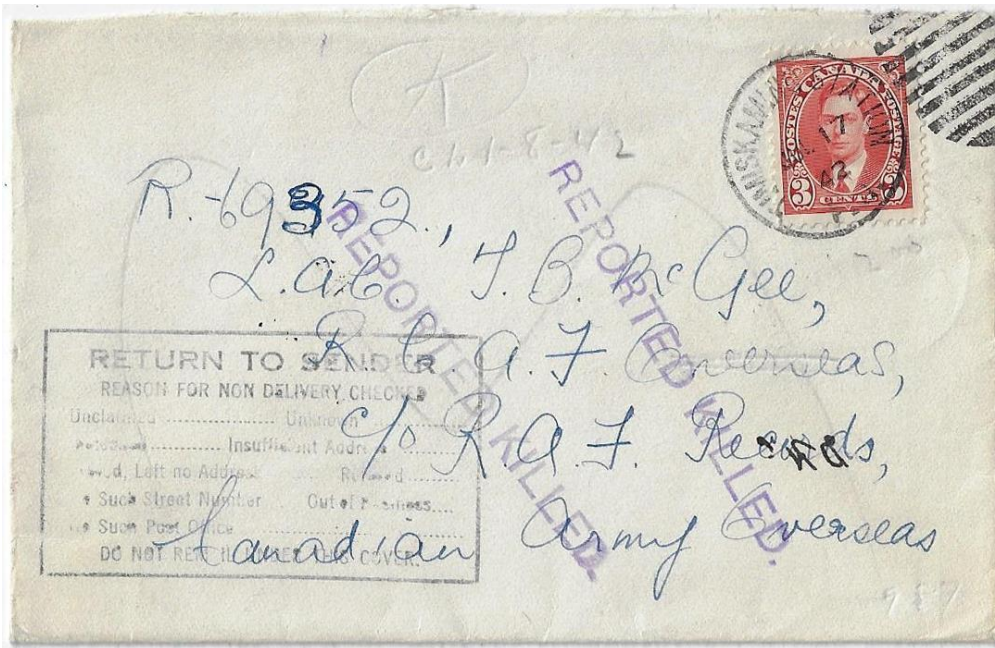

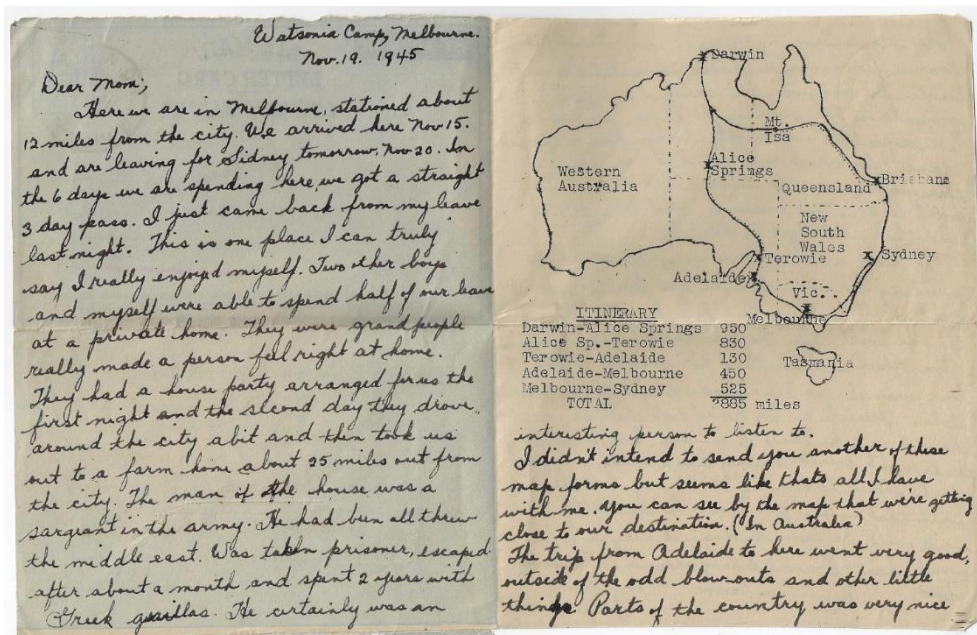

No.1 Special Wireless Group, RCCS (con't)
Pte Egilson RCCS, Major listening post against the
Japanese, 1945



This unit was formed and began its training at Gorden Head Camp Victoria BC during July 1944. In January 1945, the 1st Special Wireless Group with 13 officers and 277 other ranks under the command of Lcol H.D.W. Wethey, embarked on the CPR Princess Charlotte to Seattle and then by rail to SF where they boarded USAT Monterey and sailed that evening JA 20 45.

They put in at Finschafen, New Guinea on FE 4 45, for two days, to take on supplies and off-load mail, and then continued on to Hollandia, where they switched to USAT Shawnee. They then sailed on FE 10 45 for Brisbane Queensland, Australia. and arrived FE 16 45, after stopped at Oro Bay and Milne Bay, New Guinea for American passengers and oil.

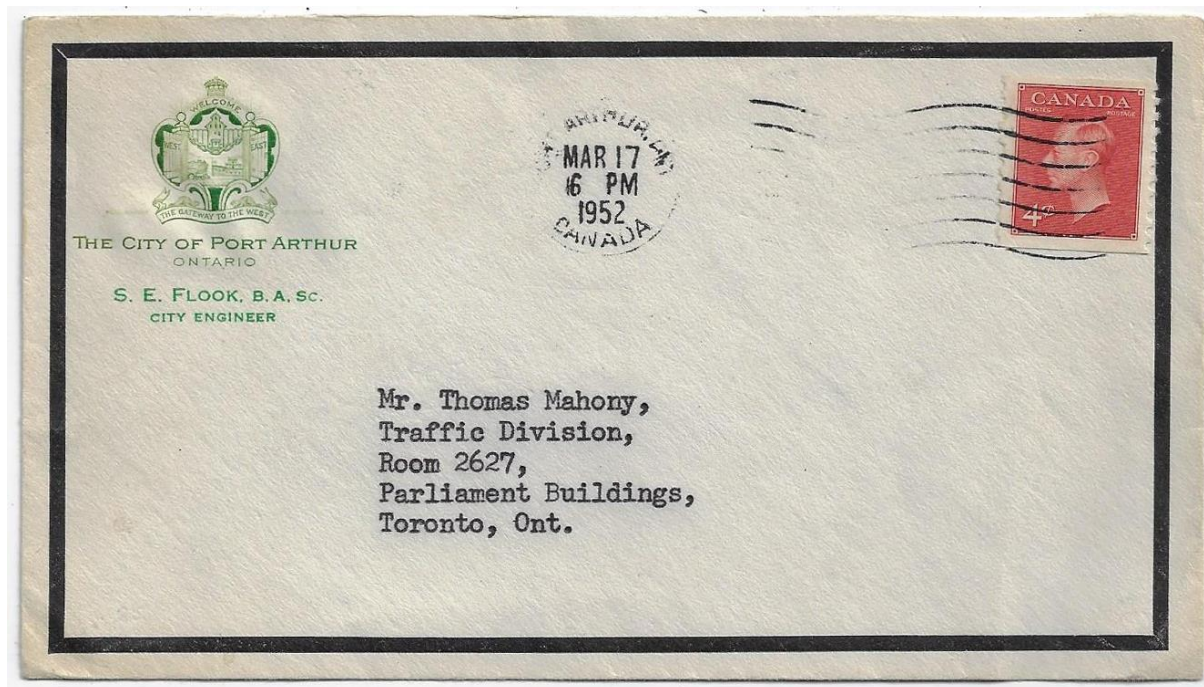
The unit was directed to Chermiside Camp, where they had classes in operational procedures with No.1 Australian Special Wireless Group, until AP 4 45. The unit then proceeded by train to Mont Isa Queensland, arriving there after a three day journey. After a two and a half day stop, they travelled by motor convoy to McMillan's Camp, Darwin N.T. arriving at there final destination on AP 18 45. The unit commenced operations on AP 30 45, and they did not leave Darwin until OC 24 45, via M.T. convor for Alice Springs M.T. - - Again to Adelaide, Melbourne, Victoria (Watsonia Camp, NO 15-20) and finally Sydney NSW (Ingleburn Camp NO 24 45). Here they had to suffer the consequences of a transportation strike, no Christmas 45 at home. It wasn't until FE 26 45 after a 21 day voyage that they arrived back in Vancouver BC.

Although the work of No.1 CSWG is still classified, it is known that they were a major listening post against the Japanese in South East Asia. After V Day, they facilitated messages between liberated C Force POW's and Canada.

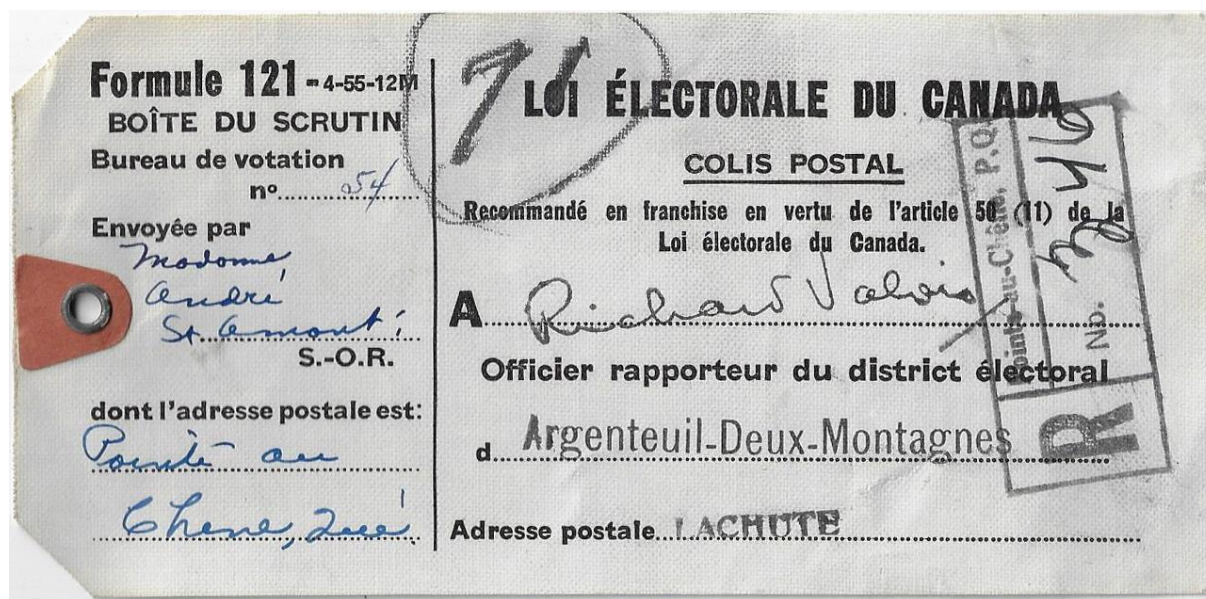
Pte Egilson was promoted to L/Cpl on DE 10 45. His name can be found in both the nominal roll and the sketch of the I section in the history of No.1 CSWG.

To his mom, the letter reads in part: *then took us out to a farm home...the man of the house was a Sergeant in the Army, he had been all thru the Middle East. Was taken prisoner, escaped and after about a month and spent 2 years with the GREEK GUERILLAS. He certainly was an interesting person to listen to...* \$250.00 **SOLD**

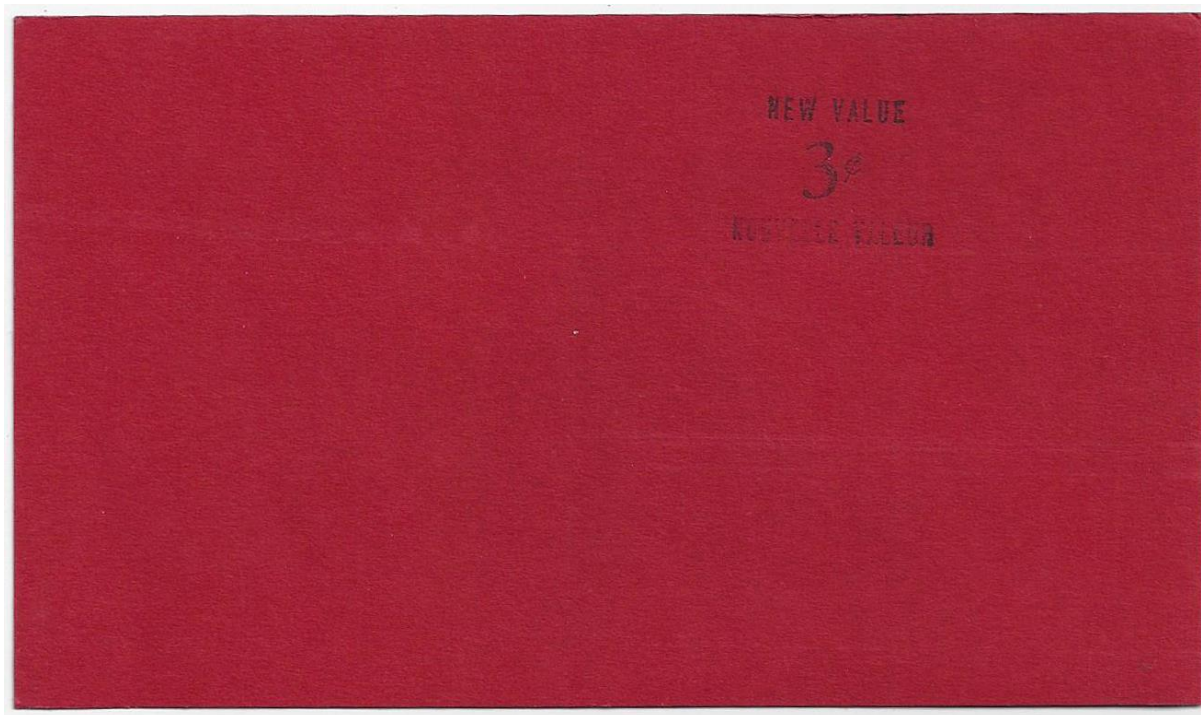
