

As good roads encourage the country people to bring their produce to market, it is certainly the interest of the citizens to make the access to town easy.

The habitans in the adjacent parishes are obliged to open a road from the ferry at St. Charles River through the Jesuits lands and the land belongin to the nuns, to join the road which leads to Palace Gate, they are now at work on it.


As it has been found impracticable (not withstanding the frequent reparis at a very heave expense to the King) to keep the lower part of the Pakace Street and from Palace Gate to the foot of the descent in tollerable repair, it is a proposed to make a good road from St. John's Gate to join the road now making by the habitants – the materials are at hand and nothing is required but cartage under the direction of an overseer, the road is now lined out and his Excellency the General has been so good as to grant miners at the request of the Grand Voyer to widen the descent which runs along the face of the hill to join the new road below. He has also had the goodness to order the necessary bridges to be make. Now as this proposed road is within the precincts of Quebec, and will contribute the ease and convenience of every person in town, it is but just reasonable that the citizens should contribute to make the road for which purpose let every person in Quebec who keeps a horse whether for pleasure or utility, give his man horse and cart for a certain number of days, if he keeps two horses, double the number of days if three let him give three days of work.

I therefore move the court that this proposal be digested in this session and make a regulation of the Police. //signed// Hugh Finlay, Quebec 8th July 1783.


Item 580-01 – <u>Letter signed by Hugh Finlay</u> – 1783, proposal for roads in the quarter session of the Legislative Assembly, signed by Hugh Finlay, datelined Quebec 8th July 1783. Finlay received the position of Deputy Postmaster General of the province of Quebec in 1784 and later became the Postmaster of British North America. The first to reside in Canada. As Deputy Postmaster General for British North America, he extended the postal service as far west as Detroit, arranged for a stopover at Halifax for the England-to-New York City transatlantic packets, and, in 1792, negotiated the first Canada-United States postal convention. \$850.00

Item 580-40 – <u>Dover Patrol letter about aerial fight with German Scout</u> – 1917, OAS letters datelined No.9 Squadron Dec 7 1917 and The Same Place Dec 10 1917, received in London from H.M.S. no Charge to be raised. No.9 Sqn censor marking signed by John Playford Hales himself (self censoring), to Winnipeg Manitoba. Hales was serving with 9 Squadron Royal Naval Air Service (RNAS). The sqns were assigned Dover Patrol censors as they were under command of Read Admiral Dover. Hales later Captain was killed in action serving with 203rd sqn RAF in August 1918. The content is great and relates to aerial fight with a Germany Scout. One sentence of the Dec 10 letter cutout, perhaps too sensitive. \$500.00






Item 580-41 – <u>Royal Flying Corps</u> – 1917, RFC censored cover from APO S.75 (*Acheux France*) to Chesterville Ontario. Signed by Flight Lieutenant Durant R.F.C. (W.E. Durant of the 29th Sqn RFC). The squadron was formed at Gosport in November of 1915 and proceeded to France in March 1916. Reverse with RFC insignia. Lt Durant was KIA in February 1918. \$300.00



Item 580-42 – RFC/RAF 11th Sqn "the first" fighter unit – 1916, OAS cover mailed from FPO H.4 dated 3 AU 16, 4th Corps Headquarter, Givenchy. Censored by No.4 875, 11th Squadron Royal Flying Corps. Signed by M.M. Sisley, Flight Lieutenant Michael Millard Sisley. Entered the Canadian mail in Toronto with 2¢ Admiral coil. The 11th Sqn was formed at Netheravon in February 1916 and the unit received Vickers FB 5s in July and took them to France. This squadron was the first all fighter unit. \$200.00 SOLD




Item 580-43 – RFC/RAF 66th Squadron – attacked enemy ballons – 1919, OAS free franked postcard from FPO FD1 dated 17 FE 19, 1st Field Depot in Italy. Censored by No.8/377, 66th Sqn RAF. Signed by A.G. Kettles 2nd Lt. The 66th was a fighter sqn equipped with Sopwith camels but later in the war bombed and strafed the Austrian Troops behind the lines. Their main task was attacking enemy observation ballons and Lt Kettles had two to his credit. The message on the card relates to expectations to be home end March 1919. \$200.00
