Item 587-01 – **England to Ancaster UC via Molson forwarding company** – 1835, family cross written letter from England to Ancaster UC, endorsed “Paid via New York” but carried by Falmouth packet Renard to Halifax (Falmouth SE 5 35, Halifax OC 12 35). By Captain Dunsford. Prepaid 2/2 and then rated 2N1 to Montreal plus 11d to Ancaster total 3/. Endorsed “To the care of Messrs Molson’s & Davies Co.”, the St. Lawrence forwarding company that dominated the steam navigation from Montreal to Kingston. Montreal double circle transit with “Forwarded” straight-line. A rare letter carried by the Molson forwarding company. \$350.00



Item 587-02 – **England to Ancaster UC via New York** - 1840, family cross written letter from Ramsgate England to Ancaster UC, endorsed “Paid” and “Ship Letter”. Carried by private trader US sailing packet to New York with Ship Letter London Crown (a perfect strike!). Rated 8d Stg as a outward ship letter, rated 27¢ collect representing 2¢ ship and 25¢ US postage to the lines. Converted to 1/4½d BNA in Queenston plus 4½d to Ancaster. A beauty! \$250.00 **SOLD**

LIVERPOOL, AUGUST 30, 1842.

On Wednesday and Thursday last we had a good deal of rain, which is the first material interruption that has taken place in the harvest operations this season. Since then it has been fine, and great progress has been made in carrying the corn, full one half of which is now secured in this neighbourhood. The farmers are offering their new Wheat pretty freely, but a good deal of it is in soft condition.

In the early part of the week the Wheat trade was very active, and at Friday's Market a very large business was transacted at an advance of 2d. per bushel. Flour also sold freely at an advance of 6d. per barrel, but in Manchester on Saturday this advance was not maintained, and the holders were pressing sales of both articles at former prices. The Oat trade has been very dull, but there has been no change in their value. In Barley, Beans, and Pease there has been very little doing. There has been an increased and a more general demand for Oatmeal at full prices, and the sales effected during the week have been rather large. It appears highly probable that our stock of old Oatmeal will get into consumption before we can receive any material supply of new.

Duty has been paid this week on 14,256 qrs. foreign and 1000 qrs. of Canada Wheat, 140 qrs. Barley, 200 qrs. Beans, 786 qrs. Pease, 648 qrs. Oats, 800 brls. Oatmeal, 40 qrs. Indian Corn, 72 brls. American and 10,368 brls. of Canadian Flour.

At THIS MORNING'S market there was a moderate sale for Wheat, at the price of this day week. A few Oats were retailed at former rates. There was a steady demand for Oatmeal, and on good fresh samples an advance of 6d. per load was obtained. There was a good demand for barrel Flour, and approved qualities brought Friday's prices, being 6d. above the currency of this day week.

A little new Irish Wheat was sold at from 6s. 8d. to 7s. 4d. per 70lbs., a few new Oats at 3s. per 45lbs., and a little new Meal at 28s. per load.

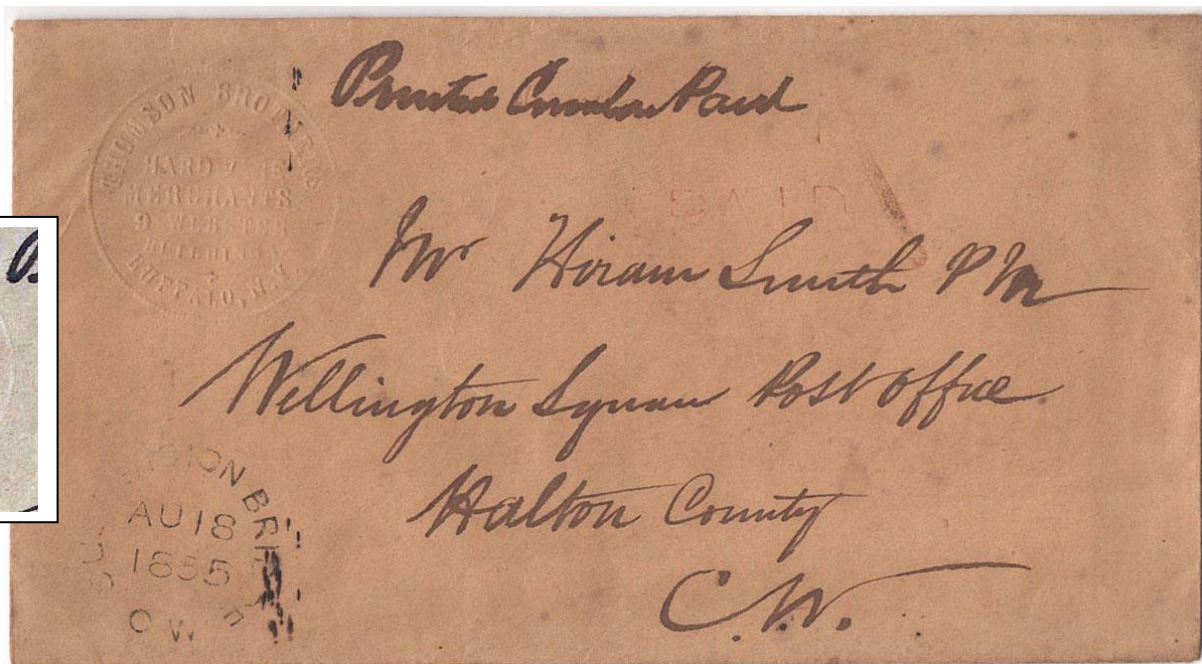

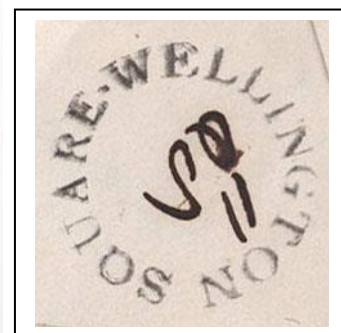
Item 587-03 – Liverpool wheat and corn prices current – 1842, Ridyard and Leicester Liverpool wheat and corn merchants prices current, with p.1 hand written, from Liverpool to William H. Merritt Postmaster and merchant in St. Catharines UC. Carried by the paddle-wheel steamship Great Western to New York with Ship Letter Liverpool Crown and New York Ship. Rated 27c collect representing 2c ship and 25c US postage to the lines. Converted to 1/4½d BNA in Queenston plus 4½d to St. Catharines total 1/9. All rates scratched out when redirected to Kingston, rated 11d collect. \$250.00 **SOLD**



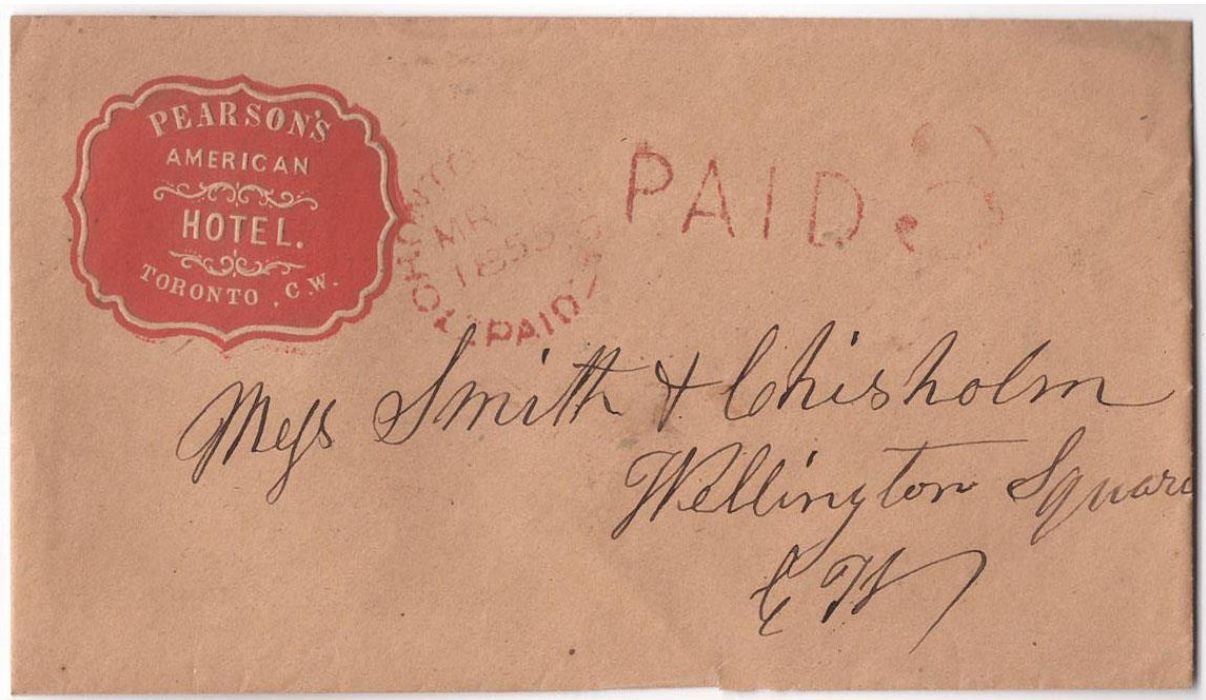
Item 587-04 – **Buffalo paid in scroll to Belleville** – 1845, family letter from Buffalo NY to Belleville UC, paid 5¢ with paid in scroll handstamp, exchanged in Queenston, rated 9d to Belleville (b/s). \$100.00



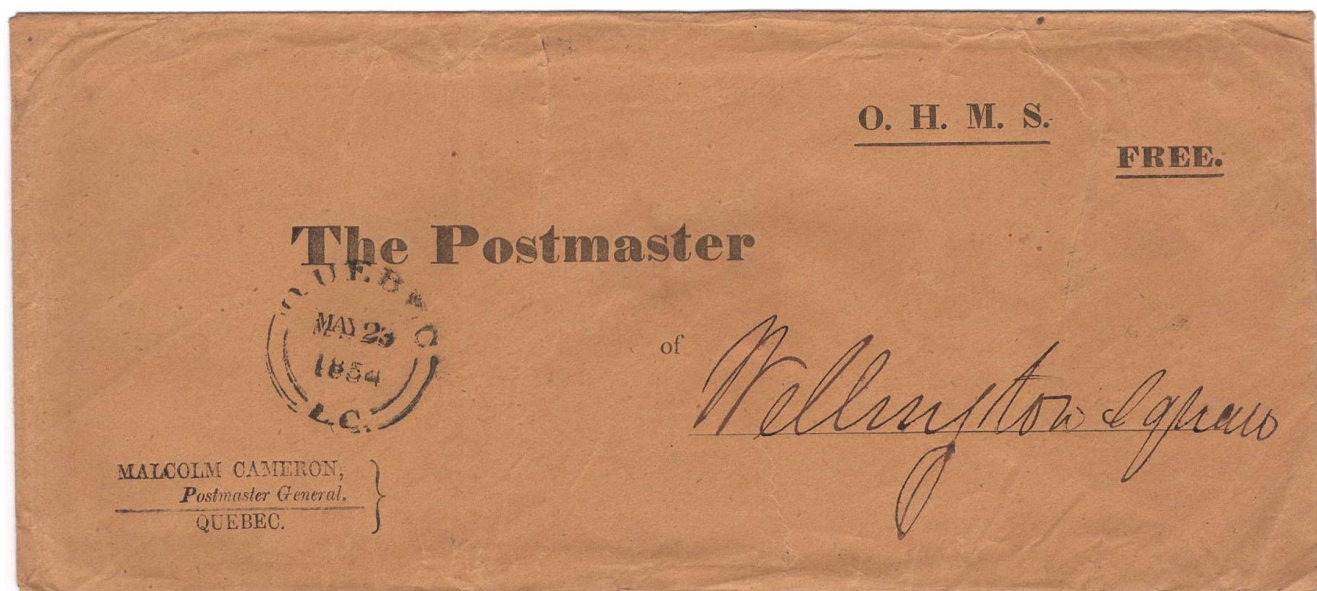
Item 587-05 – **Suspension Bridge CW (1852-1857)** – 1855, stampless cover from Suspension Bridge CW, Thomson Brothers Buffalo hardware merchant embossed c/c, printed circular paid paying 1d circular rate to Wellington Square. A Welland County rarity. \$450.00



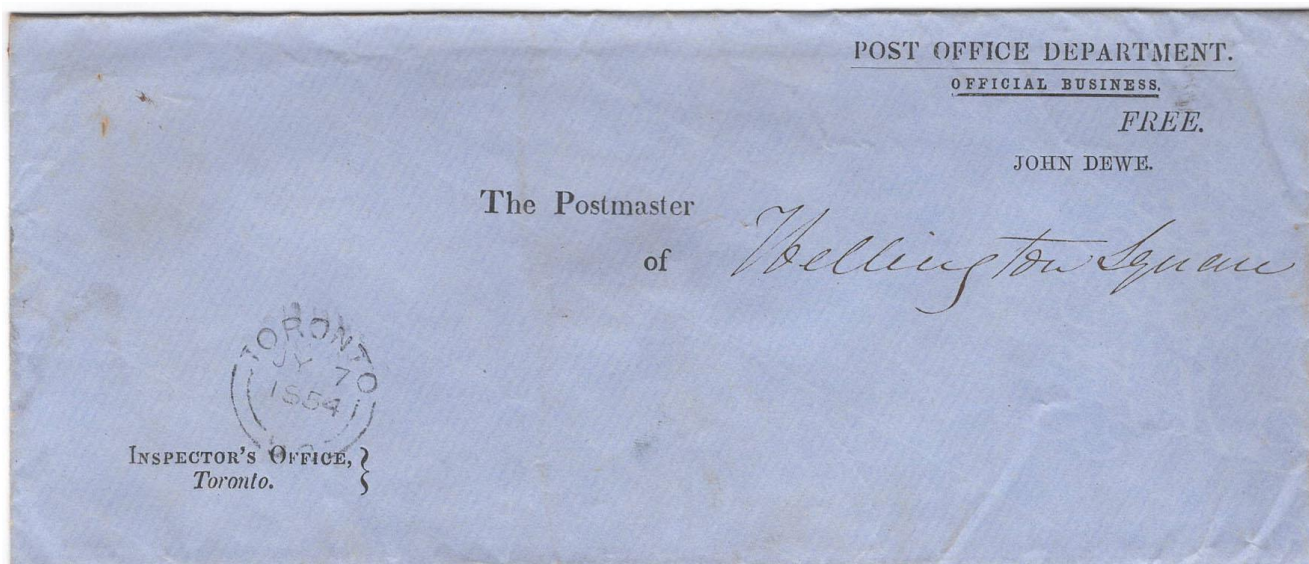
Item 587-06 – **An early John A. Macdonald cover** – 1843, stampless cover from Kingston paid 11½d to Wellington Square. Reverse with a perfect strike of the 1829 type in black. The cover is signed by John A. Macdonald while serving as councillor on the Kingston municipal council. This a very early Macdonald signature as a Canadian official at the beginning of his parliamentary advancement. \$350.00



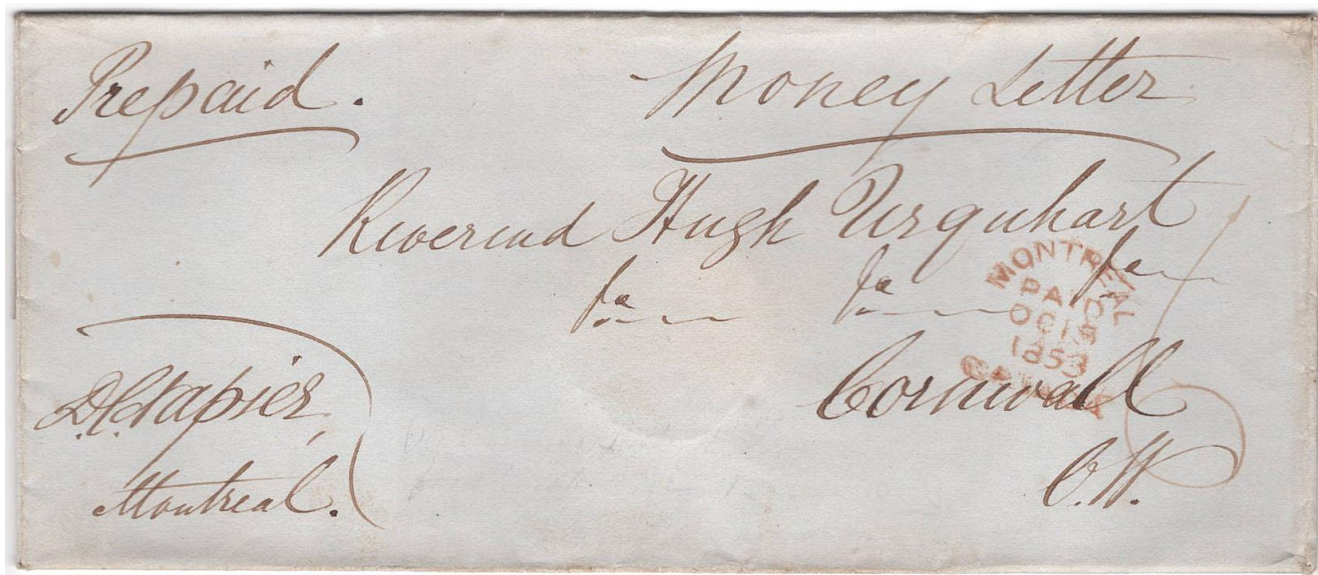

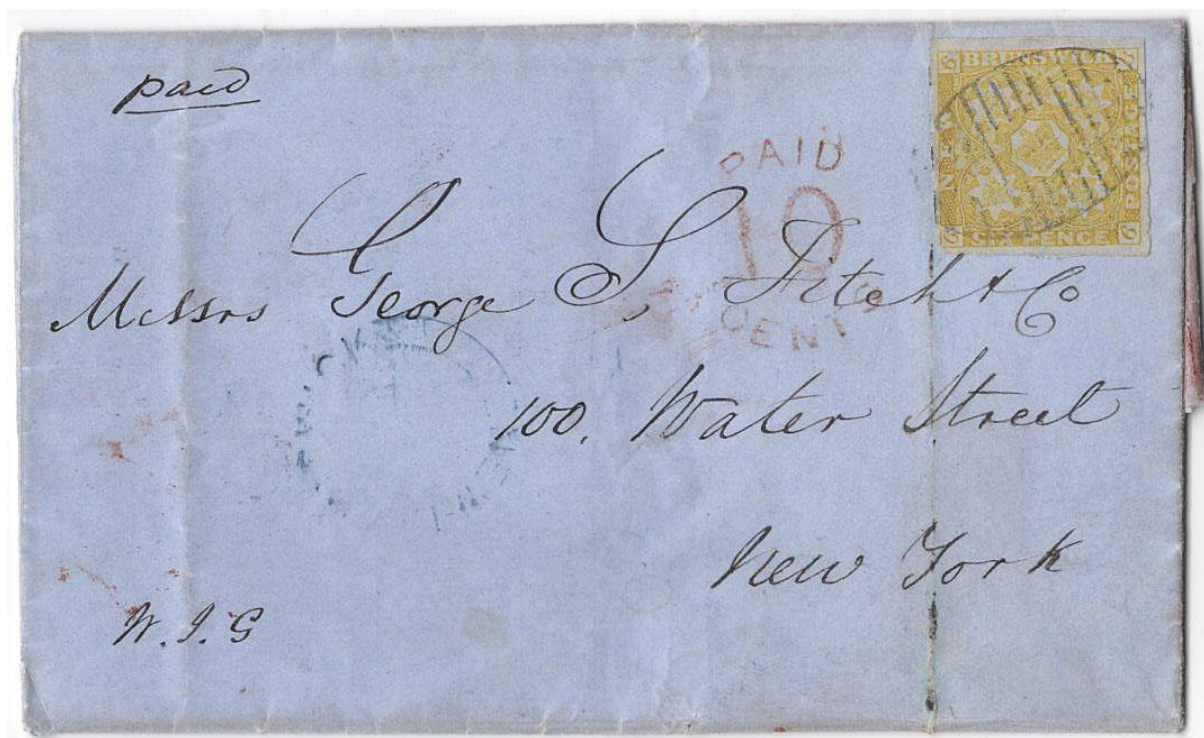
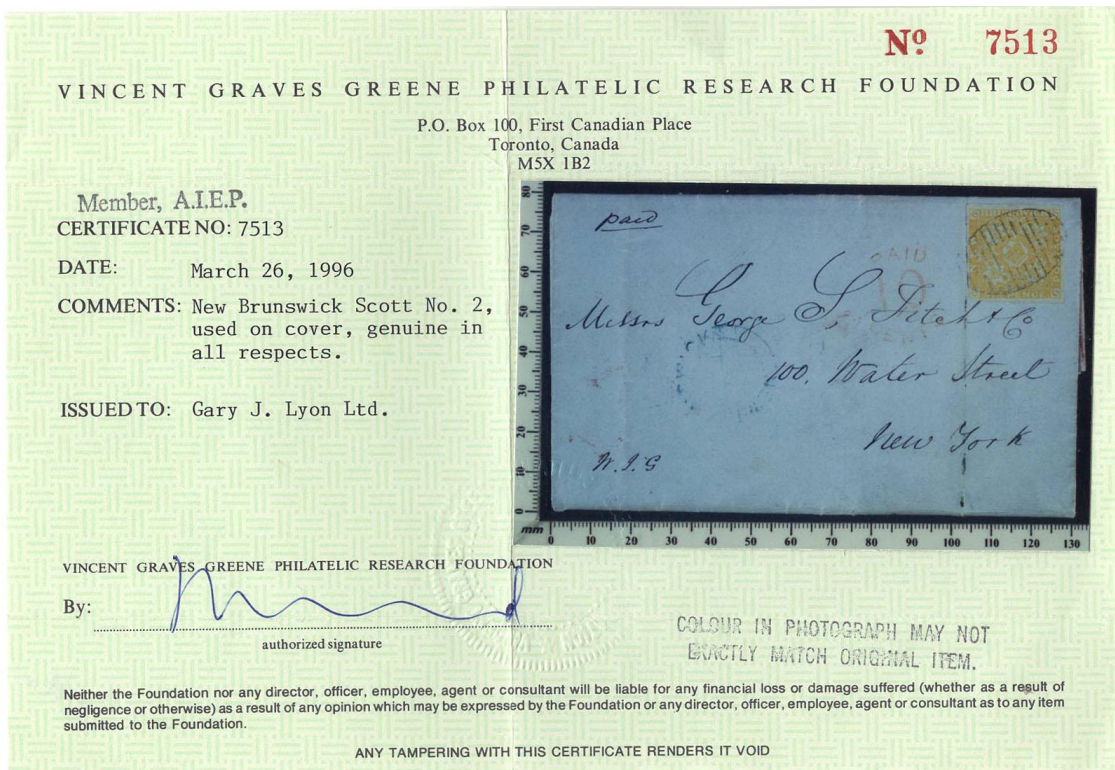
Item 587-08 – Quebec – Malcolm Cameron Postmaster General – 1854, Post Office Dept Official Business Free envelope, Malcolm Cameron Postmaster General Quebec, from Quebec dated MY 23 54 to Wellington Square (b/s). \$125.00



Item 587-09 – **Toronto – Post Office Dept Official Business** – 1854, Post Office Dept Official Business Free envelope, John Dewe Inspector's Office imprint, from Toronto dated JU 7 54, to Wellington Square (b/s). \$100.00



Item 587-10 – **Duncan C. Napier, money letter Indian Office** – 1853, money letter folded cover from Montreal rated 6d to Cornwall (b/s). The cover is signed by Duncan Campbell Napier, British army officer from the time of the War of 1812. He was in charge of army transport for the Montreal district, the resident Indian agent for the area, and secretary at Montreal of the Indian Department, responsible for all correspondence regarding the Indian population of Lower Canada. Reverse with Indian Office waxseal. A pretty money letter. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 587-11 – **6d Shediac to New York** – 1852, New Brunswick 6d olive yellow (*ample to large margin*) tied by oval grid cancel on 2-page business folded letter from Shediac, dated OC 5 52, paying 6d cross border letter rate to New York. New Brunswick Paid 10 cents in red, Shediac (b/s) and neat St. John transit (b/s). A couple light file folds away from stamp. Greene cert accompanies. Unitrade No.2, cv\$2,000.00. Ex Brassler (1996). \$1,200.00



Item 587-12 – **3d Way Office Shemogue NB to Dorchester** – 1853, New Brunswick 3d red (into at one side, showing two adjacent stamps) tied by grid cancel on folded letter from Shemogue NB paying 3d letter rate to Dorchester. Endorsed via Shediac. The letter is signed by William Bouttenhouse and addressed to Albert James Smith Member of Provincial Parliament. Backstamps inventory: W.O. Shemogue, Shediac, Bend of Petitcodiac and Dorchester (b/s). \$500.00

Sir Albert James Smith 1822-1883 was a New Brunswick politician and opponent of Canadian confederation. Smith's grandfather was a United Empire Loyalist who left Massachusetts to settle in New Brunswick after the American Revolution.






This is the earliest recorded date for this office. The first period of operation for Barclay was 1879 to 1883 (only 4 years). Reopened later in 1891. Letter accompanies.
