

Item 587-01 – <u>England to Ancaster UC via Molson forwarding company</u> – 1835, family cross written letter from England to Ancaster UC, endorsed "*Paid via New York*" but carried by Falmouth packet Renard to Halifax (Falmouth SE 5 35, Halifax OC 12 35). By Captain Dunsford. Prepaid 2/2 and then rated 2N1 to Montreal plus 11d to Ancaster total 3/. Endorsed "*To the care of Messrs Molson's & Davies Co.*", the St. Lawrence forwarding company that dominated the steam navigation from Montreal to Kingston. Montreal double circle transit with "*Forwarded*" straight-line. A rare letter carried by the Molson forwarding company. \$350.00

Item 587-02 – <u>England to Ancaster UC via New York</u> - 1840, family cross written letter from Ramsgate England to Ancaster UC, endorsed "*Paid*" and "*Ship Letter*". Carried by private trader US sailing packet to New York with Ship Letter London Crown (a perfect strike!). Rated 8d Stg as a outward ship letter, rated 27¢ collect representing 2¢ ship and 25¢ US postage to the lines. Converted to 1/4½ d BNA in Queenston plus 4½ d to Ancaster. A beauty! \$250.00 SOLD



Item 587-03 – Liverpool wheat and corn prices current – 1842, Ridyard and Leicester Liverpool wheat and corn merchants prices current, with p.1 hand written, from Liverpool to William H. Merritt Postmaster and merchant in St. Catharines UC. Carried by the paddle-wheel steamship Great Western to New York with Ship Letter Liverpool Crown and New York Ship. Rated 27¢ collect representing 2¢ ship and 25¢ US postage to the lines. Converted to 1/4½d BNA in Queenston plus 4½d to St. Catharines total 1/9. All rates scrathed out when redirected to Kingston, rated 11d collect. \$250.00 SOLD

Item 587-06 – <u>An early John A. Macdonald cover</u> – 1843, stampless cover from Kingston paid 11½ d to Wellington Square. Reverse with a perfect strike of the 1829 type in black. The cover is signed by John A. Macdonald while serving as councillor on the Kingston municipal council. This a very early Macdonald signature as a Canadian official at the beginning of his parliamentary advancement. \$350.00

Item 587-07 – <u>Toronto Pearson's American Hotel</u> – 1855, stampless cover with Pearson's American Hotel cameo advertising, Toronto Paid and Paid 3 to Wellington Square (b/s). Roughly opened. \$400.00 SOLD

Item 587-10 – Duncan C. Napier, money letter Indian Office – 1853, money letter folded cover from Montreal rated 6d to Cornwall (b/s). The cover is signed by Duncan Campbell Napier, British army officer from the time of the War of 1812. He was in charge of army transport for the Montreal district, the resident Indian agent for the area, and secretary at Montreal of the Indian Department, responsible for all correspondence regarding the Indian population of Lower Canada. Reverse with Indian Office waxseal. A pretty money letter. \$150.00 SOLD

New Brunswick Paid 10 cents in red, Shediac (b/s) and neat St. John transit (b/s). A couple light file folds away from stamp. Greene cert accompanies. Unitrade No.2, cv\$2,000.00. Ex Brassler (1996). \$1,200.00



Item 587-12 – <u>3d Way Office Shemogue NB to Dorchester</u> – 1853, New Brunswick 3d red (into at one side, showing two adjacent stamps) tied by grid cancel on folded letter from Shemogue NB paying 3d letter rate to Dorchester. Endrosed via Shediac. The letter is signed by William Bouttenhouse and addressed to Albert James Smith Member of Provincial Parliament. Backstamps inventory: W.O. Shemogue, Shediac, Bend of Petitcodiac and Dorchester (b/s). \$500.00

Sir Albert James Smith 1822-1883 was a New Brunswick politician and opponent of Canadian confederation. Smith's grandfather was a United Empire Loyalist who left Massachusetts to settle in New Brunswick after the American Revolution.



Item 587-16 – <u>6¢ SQ diagonal bisect use</u> – 1872, 6¢ SQ bisect tied by grid cancel on Ruggles cover from Wilmot NS paying 3¢ letter rate to Bridgetown (partial bs). Expertization Brandon 1996 (*Stanley Gibbons 66a genuine*) and Greene 2001 (*Scott 39a genuine*). Edge stain at left. Documented that only a handful are recorded. Ex Simpson. \$3,000.00



Item 587-17 – <u>4¢ printed matter registered</u> – 1887, 2¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS (pre-affixing fault LL) tied by Waterford Ont cds on Clerk of the Peace notice form to Sherrif etc paying 4¢ printed matter registered rate to Simcoe. A piece of paper, most likely a notice, was attached to the form, no longer present. Despite the RLS corner fault, an seldom encountered SQ piece!. \$150.00

Item 587-18 – **10¢ UPU registered to England (York County)** – 1895, 1¢ (2), 3¢, 5¢ SQ (perfs gum toned) tied by grid cancel on cover from Ringwood Ont paying 10¢ UPU registered letter rate to England. Toronto and Stouffville transit and Liverpool and London oval registered markings. A pretty York cover!. \$400.00



Item 587-24 – **Barclay Ont Canada registered (1879-1883, Victoria)** – 1882, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Barclay Ont (3-part dater with Canada at base) paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Orono (b/s) via Toronto (b/s) and Mid Rwy North (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date for this office. The <u>first period</u> of operation for Barclay was 1879 to 1883 (only 4 years). Reopened later in 1891. Letter accompanies. A great Victoria County rarity!. \$275.00



Item 587-25 – <u>Bloor Street Toronto registered</u> – 1896, 8¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on cover from Bloor Street Toronto paying 8¢ registered letter rate to U.S. (b/s). \$100.00




