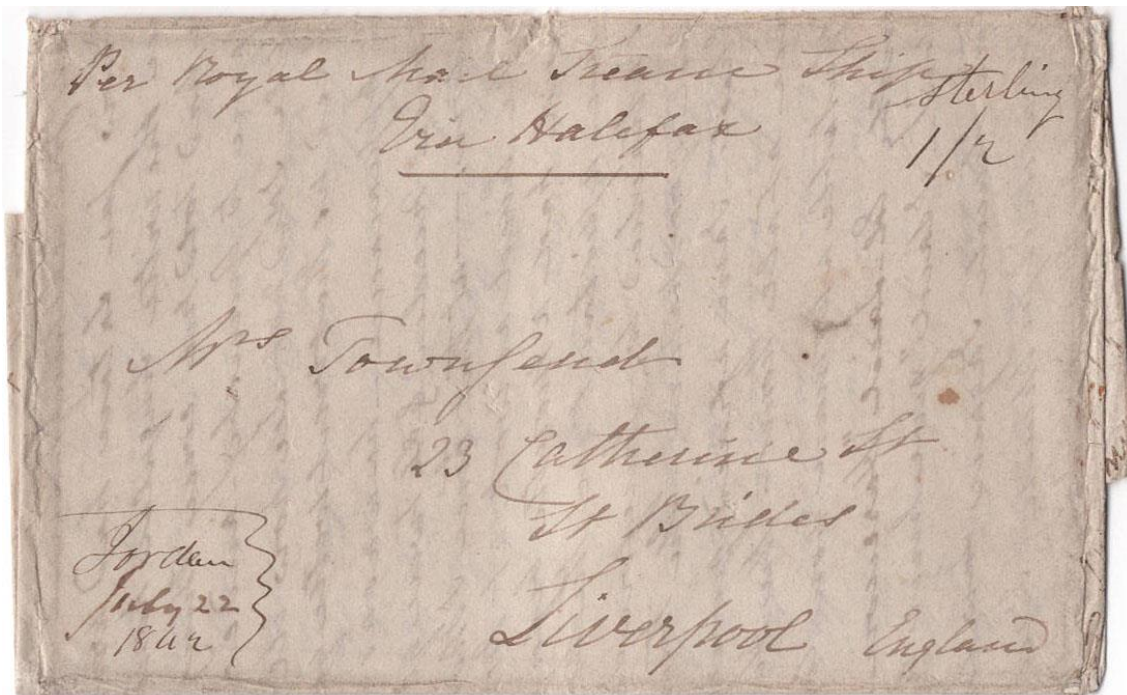




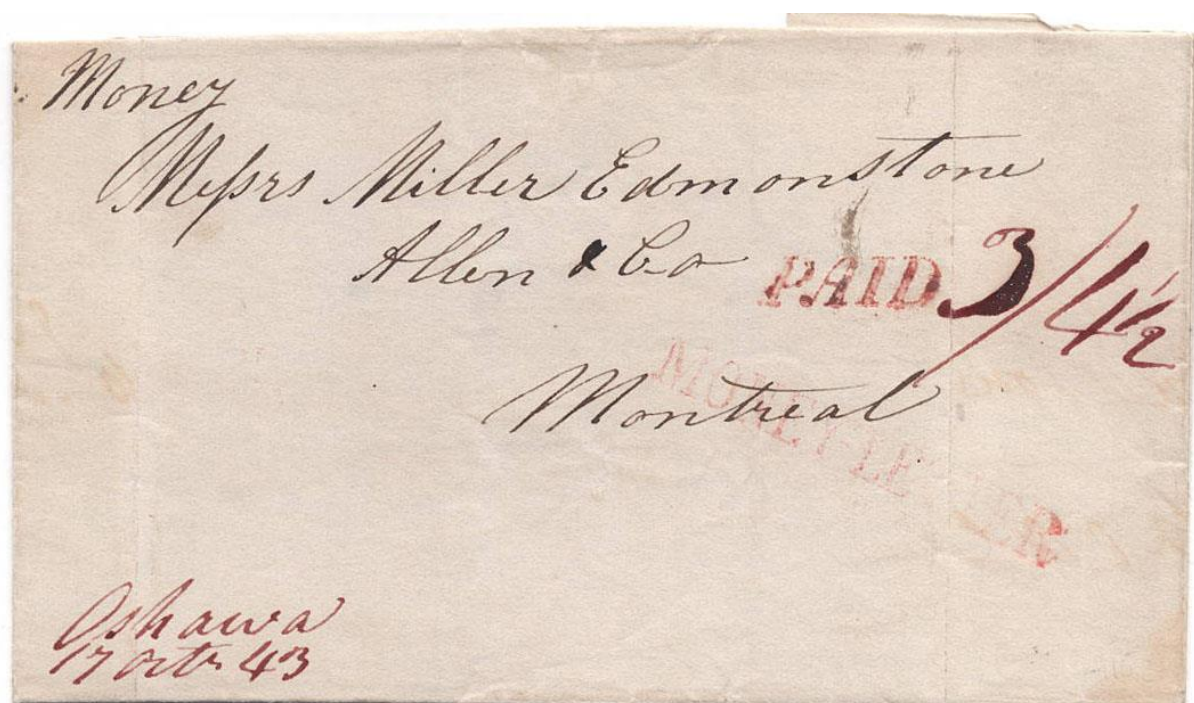
Item 590-01 – **Toronto to Belleville then to Cobourg** – 1836, folded cover from Toronto rated 9d collect to Belleville. Retailed from Belleville and marked "FORd" and charged an additional 4½d postage total due 1/1½d to Cobourg. An interesting use of the City of Toronto double circle in red along with a Belleville 1829 type. \$150.00



Item 590-02 – **Port Dalhousie UC (Lincoln)** – 1854, folded cover from Port Dalhousie UC, double circle in red, rated 3d collect to Quebec (b/s). \$300.00



Item 590-03 – **Jordan UC, the only recorded example (Lincoln)** – 1842, folded letter from Jordan UC to Liverpool. Manuscript postmark JY 22 42. Paid 1/2 Sterling and endorsed "Per Royal Mail Steamship, via Halifax". The only reported use. \$500.00



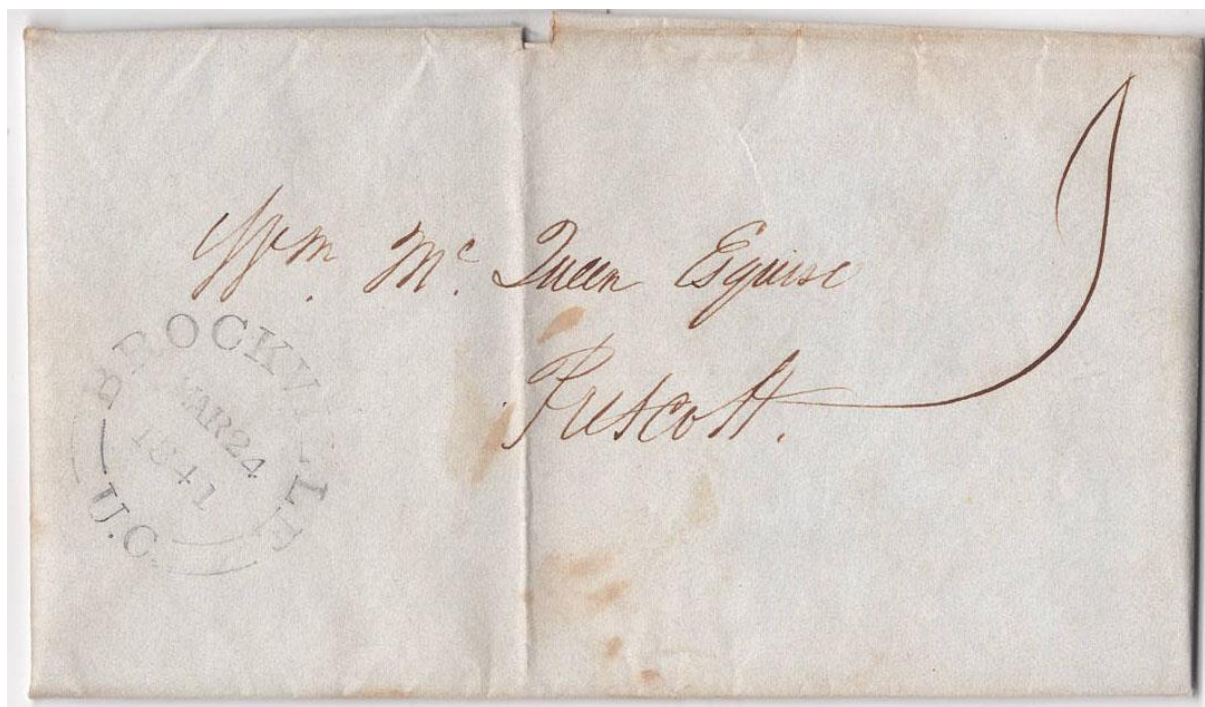
Item 590-04 – **Oshawa UC manuscript postmark (Ontario)** – 1843, Money Letter from Oshawa UC, manuscript postmark 17 OC 43, paid 3/4½ instead of 3/6 paying the triple rate for 301-400 miles to Montreal (b/s). \$350.00 **SOLD**

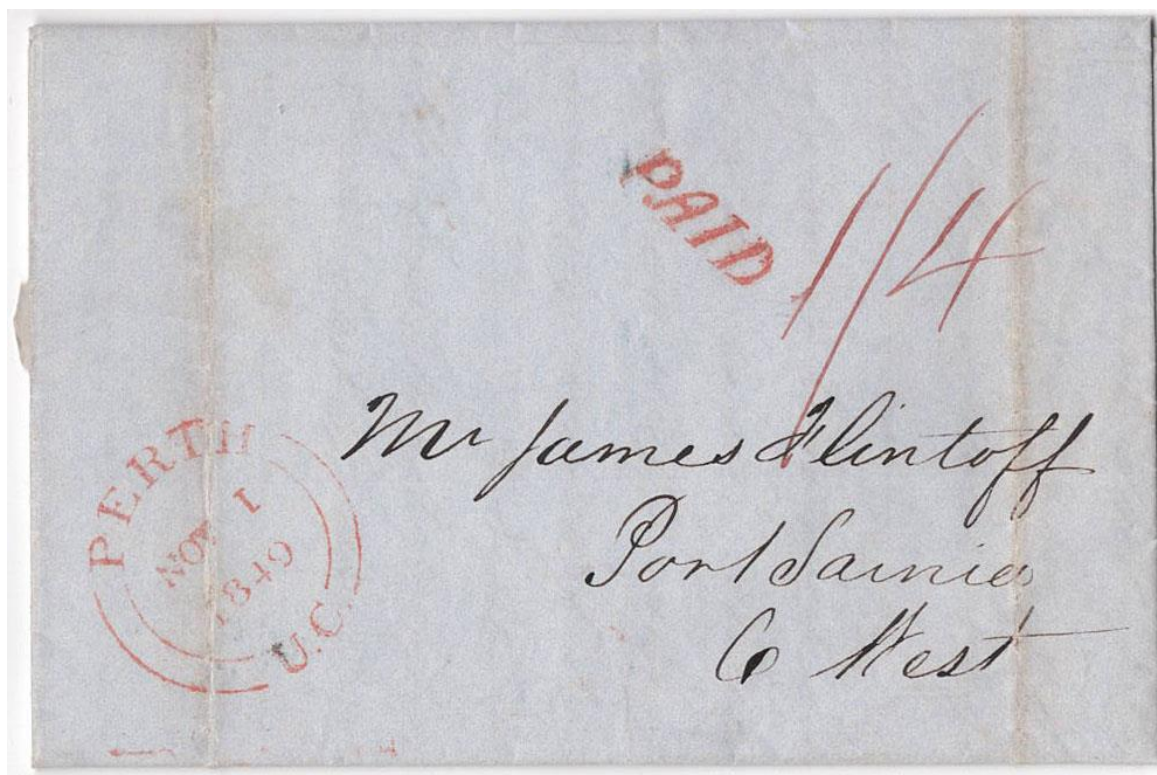

A long letter discrediting the son of the Earl of Elgin and correcting facts in Morgan's accounts. \$50.00



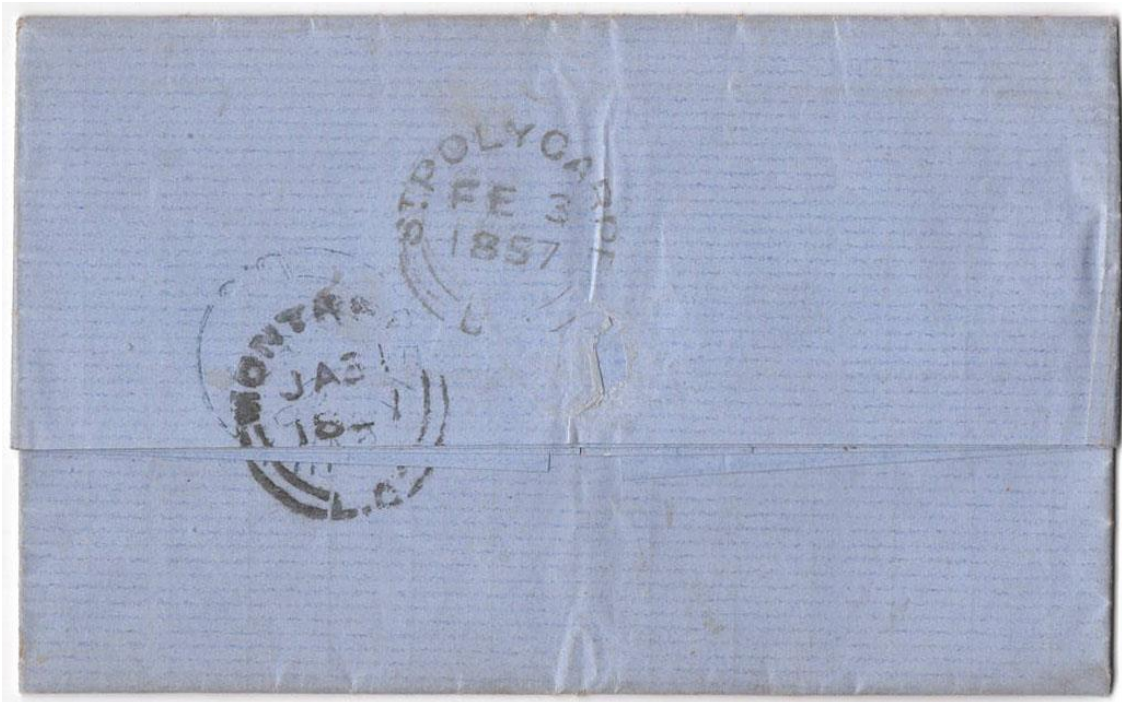

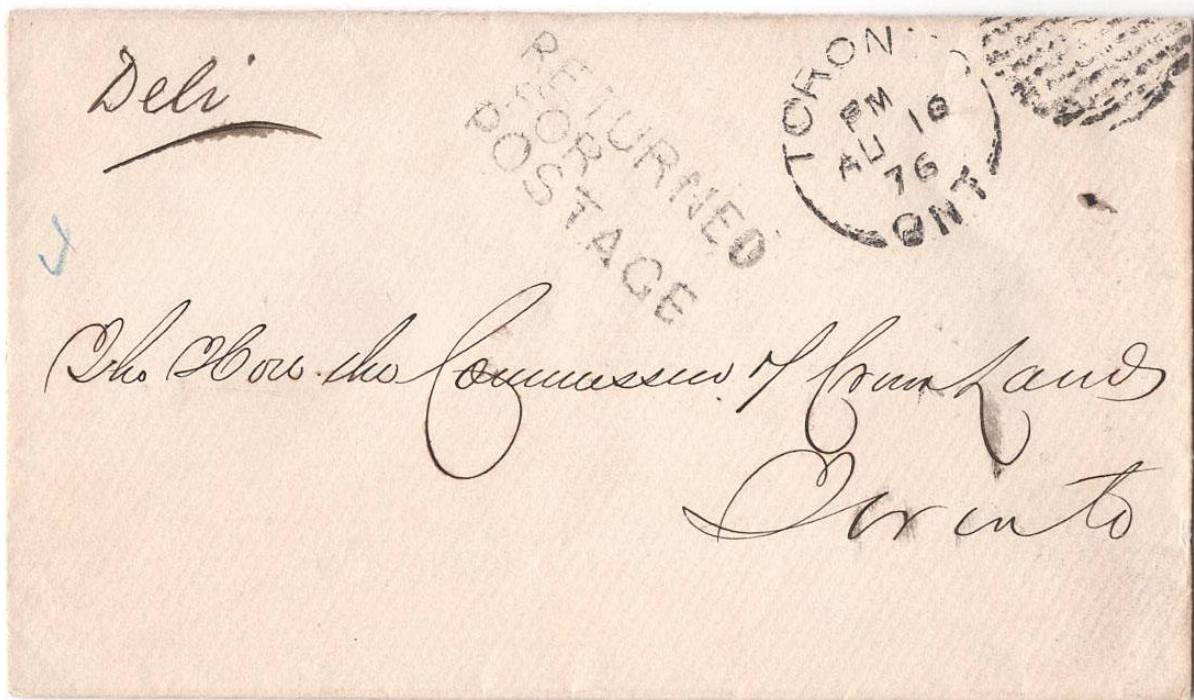
Item 590-07 – **Perth UC (Lanark)** – 1849, 2-page folded letter signed by John Hunter from Perth UC paid 1/4 to Port Sarnia (b/s) via Brockville and London (b/s). \$45.00



Item 590-08 – **The Death of General Wolfe (18<sup>th</sup> Century print)** – 1760-1790, Der General Wolf (*The Death of General Wolfe*), Wolfe supported by three grenadiers, succumbs to his fatal wounds, watched by nine other officers and a native American warrior; after West. Engraving on chine collé, print made by: Carl Guttenberg after Benjamin West. (Lettered with title: 'DER GENERAL WOLF'; production detail: 'Gemahlt von B West' and 'Gegraben von Carl Guttenberg'.), School style German. Production date between 1760-1790. Dimensions size of chine collé. 13½ x 11½ inches. Foxing. \$125.00

Manuscript postmark JA 29 57. The letter is from J. Bissonnette to Madame James Hughes and relates to money and Postmaster certificates. The only one! \$400.00



Item 590-10 – **Toronto unpaid drop letter** – 1876, Dept of Immigration of Ontario cover, mailed unpaid in Toronto (a rare Toronto duplex DON-1701) to a local address. Returned for postage via Dead Letter Office (b/s) and forwarded. The prepayment was compulsory OC 1 75. \$125.00 **SOLD**

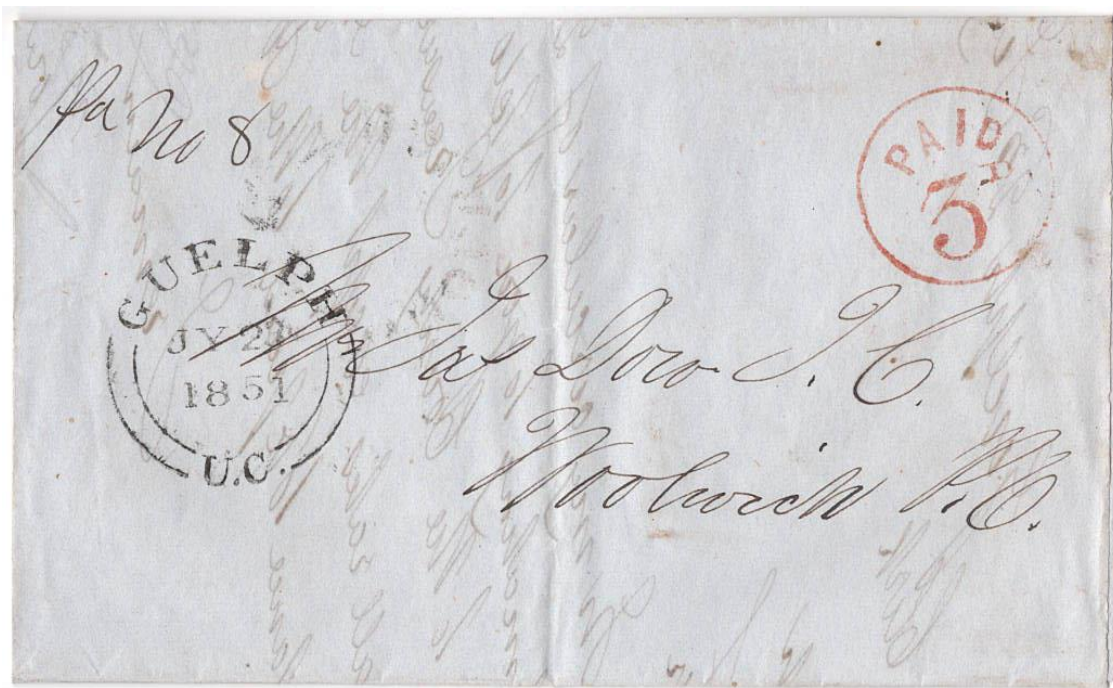

Item 590-11 – **1884 US Presidential Election letters** – 1884, three letters from John Gray (1837-1917), datelined Prescott Ont, to United States. Gray was an Ontario horticulturist and politician. He represented York West in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario as a Conservative member from 1883 to 1886. The letters relate to the 1884 US Presidential Election. The letter dated 17 JU 84 is addressed to James Blaine Republican presidential candidate for US president, the ones dated 1 and 25 JY 84 are addressed to Benjamin Franklin Jones, Chairman, National Republican Association. \$300.00



Item 590-12 – **Arthur CW 1<sup>st</sup> period and only recorded example (Wellington)** – 1851, money folded letter from Arthur CW paid 3 to Guelph. This 1<sup>st</sup> period was 1847-1851, it is the only reported postmark from the Arthur 1<sup>st</sup> period office. The same device was used at both Arthur 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> period. Named for Arthur Wellesley, Duke of Wellington. Arthur sat at the start of the Garafraxa Colonization Road to Owen Sound. Settled in 1840, the townsite was not officially surveyed until 1846. In addition to saw and grist mills, the community served as the market centre for the surrounding area. \$450.00



Item 590-13 – **Guelph to Woolwich UC** – 1851, folded letter from Guelph UC paid 3d to Woolwich (b/s). The letter relates to county rates to the county treasurers. A nice strike of the Guelph hammer III. \$60.00

Item 590-14 – **Daniel Miner Gordon, Principal of Queen's University** – 1896, autograph letter signed from Daniel Miner Gordon, three pages to Henry Morgan, dated Halifax 23 JY 96. Gordon became principal of Queen's University in Kingston (the 8<sup>th</sup> Principal 1902-1916) and the person who brought about Queen's separation from the Church after more than 70 years of union. Gordon provides biographical details about Reverend Charles M. Grant from Pictou County, the brother of George Munro Grant. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 590-15 – **Blessington UC, the only reported use (Hastings)** – 1865, stampless cover from Blessington UC rated 7c collect to Marmora (b/s) via Belleville and Shannonville (b/s). The only recorded example. 22 AU 65. \$400.00

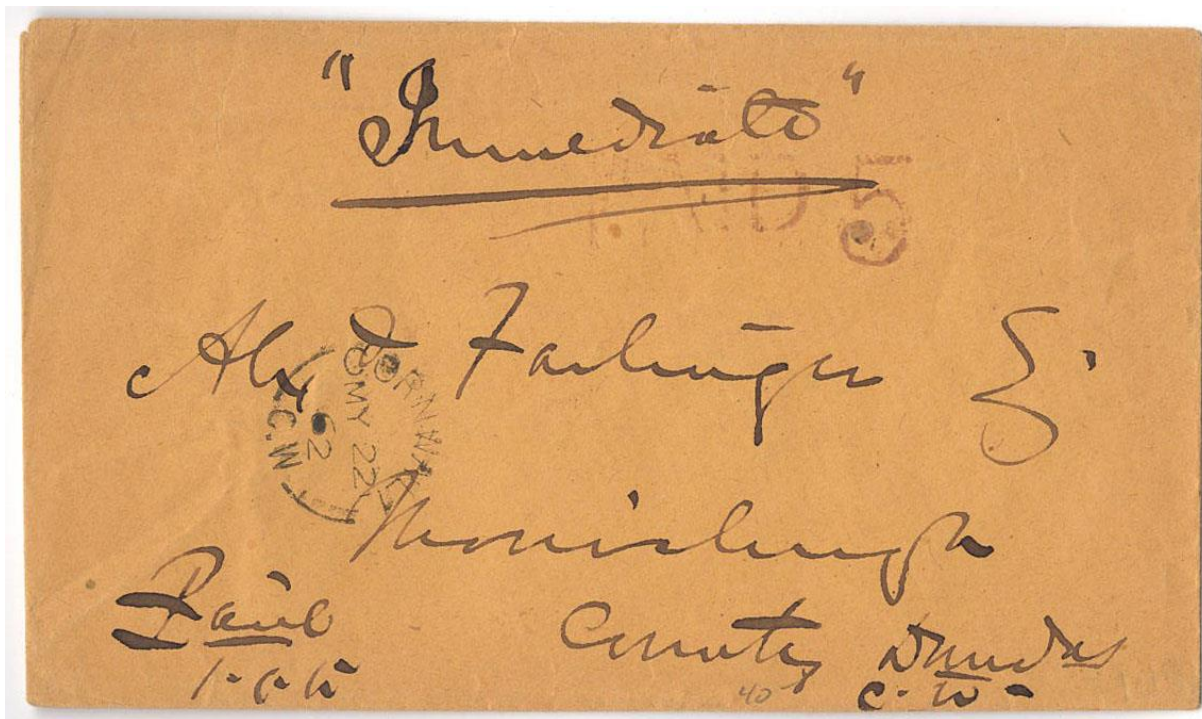

Item 590-16 – **Thomas David McConkey (Barrie Ontario)** – 1881, autograph letter signed by Thomas David McConkey, 3-page dated Sheriff's Office Barrie Ontario DE 20 81. A detailed letter regarding his son who had died in 1880. His son had been a doctor, a minor politician and a tennis player who was on the Wimbledon Team in 1879. McConkey was an Ontario businessman, politician and Sheriff of Barrie. He represented Simcoe North in the House (1867-1872). \$75.00



Item 590-17 – **Cornwall UC** – 1851, attorney folded letter from Cornwall UC paid 3d to Prescott. Signed by Goerge Macdonald, to Marcus Burritt. \$30.00



Item 590-18 – **Cornwall CW (Berri hammer)** – 1862, stampless cover from Cornwall CW (Berri hammer CW) paid 5 to Morrisburgh (b/s). The Cornwall Berri hammer 20mm is one of scarce ones for Cornwall. \$45.00

Item 590-19 – **Major-General Robert Bruce** – 1860, autograph letter signed in third person, two pages dated Boston OC 19 60, declining a request for an autograph of His Royal Highness Prince of Wales (later Edward VII), noting that he only signs for public institutions or for people he knows. Major-General The Honourable Robert Bruce (15 March 1813 – 27 June 1862) was a British Army officer who served as Governor to the young Prince of Wales and as Military secretary to Lord Elgin, his brother, and the Governor General of Canada in the 1840's and 1850's. \$125.00



Item 590-20 – In Queen Victoria's hand signed THE QUEEN – 1873, GB1d (faulty) tied by London duplex cancel on mourning cover, in Queen Victoria's hand signed "THE QUEEN" addressed to His Royal Highness Prince Leopold, at Oxford (b/s). The recipient, Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany (1853-1884) was a son of Queen Victoria. Reverse with her Majesty's seal. \$1,200.00

Item 590-21 – **British troops on the march – Canada** – 1862, chromolithograph possibly after a design by artist R.P. Leitch published by George C. Leighton; officers in irregular winter dress, Native Americans, guides conferring and resting in foreground, files of soldiers and sledges moving through mountain pass in background. Richard Leitch 1826-1882, George C. Leighton active 1858-1895. Supplement to 'Illustrated London News', 15 March 1862, page 264. Foxing. 20¾ x 15½ inches. \$125.00



Item 590-22 – **View of Quebec from Levis** - 1862, chromolithograph possibly after a design by artist R.P. Leitch published by George C. Leighton; Winter landscape with two ladies on a horse-led sledge; three hunters on the right, one of them tying his boots, a dog running in the path to intercept the horse; Quebec City and on the background. Wood-engraving, printed in colours. Richard Leitch 1826-1882, George C. Leighton active 1858-1895. Supplement to 'Illustrated London News', 15 March 1862. Item 590-23 – **Constance CW - the earliest of 2 known examples** – 1862, 5¢ Beaver with matching pen cancel on registered cover from Constance CW paying 5¢ letter rate to Goderich with 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. This is the earliest of 2 known copies. Routed via Harpurhey and B&LHR West (b/s). The village was known as Kinburn, after the Scottish parish of first settler Raphael Stephenson. As there was already a Kinburn post office in Carleton County, the Post Office Dept chose the name Constance. John Lawson was first Postmaster, operating out of his blacksmith shop. Huron County. \$200.00



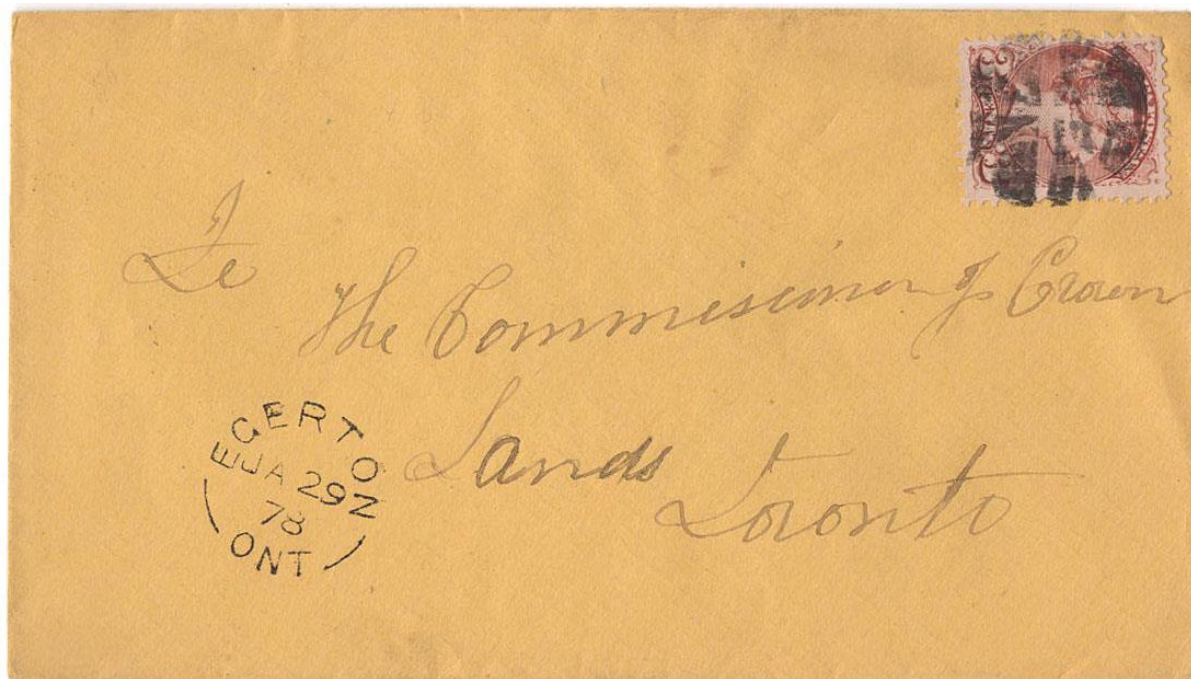
Item 590-24 – **Wingham CW (Huron)** – 1863, 10¢ Consort with pen cancel on cover from Wingham CW, Berri hammer DE 23 63, the earliest recorded date by 5 years, paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Michigan via Paris Station (b/s). \$150.00



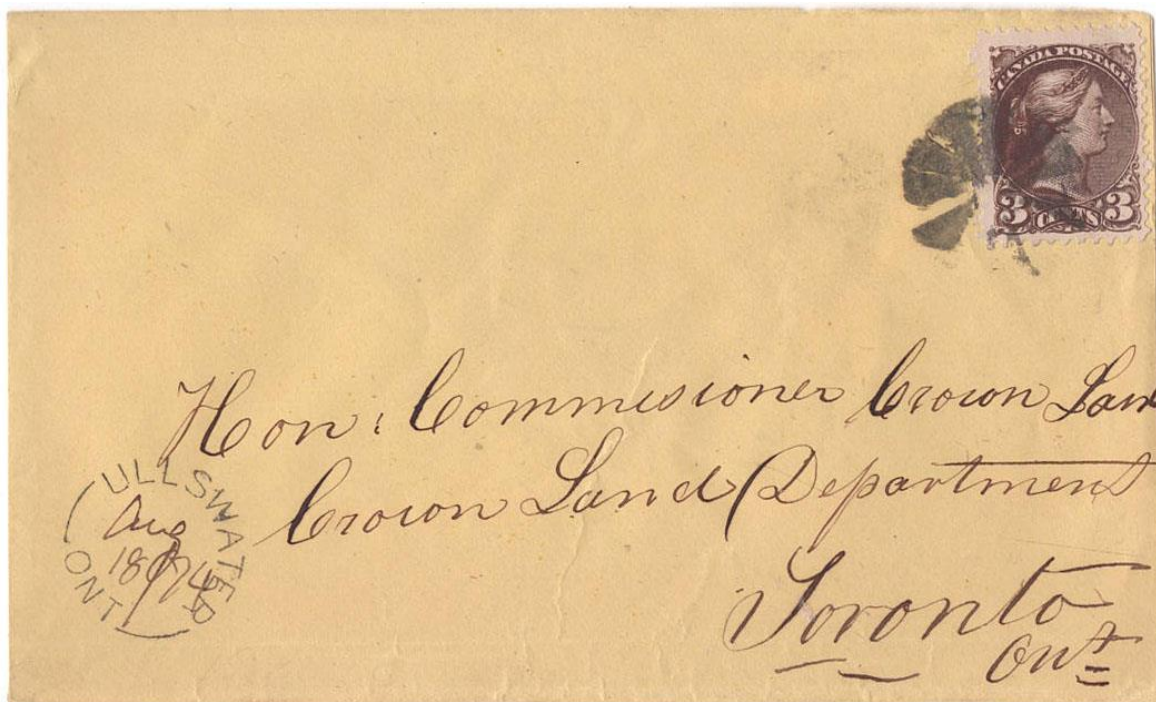
Item 590-25 – **Cannington Ont fancy cancel** – 1878, 2¢ RLS tied by *Registered* straight-line on 3¢ PSE from Cannington Ont, cancelled with bar box fancy cancel, paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Whitby (b/s). \$100.00



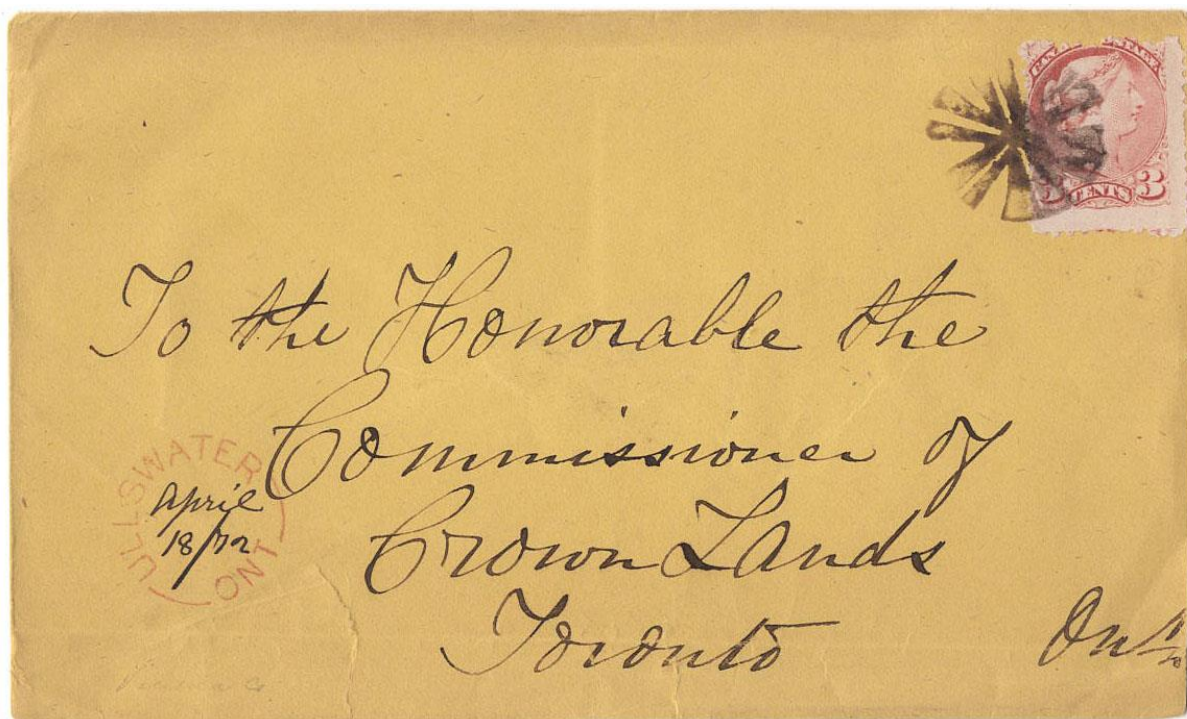
Item 590-26 – **Taunton Ont fancy intaglio "T"** – 1881, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy intaglio "T" cancel on cover from Taunton Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Brooklyn (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date for this Ontario office postmark. JU 27 81. The "T" is Lacelle 816. \$275.00



Item 590-27 – **Egerton Ont (Wellington)** – 1878, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Egerton Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Pretty! \$75.00



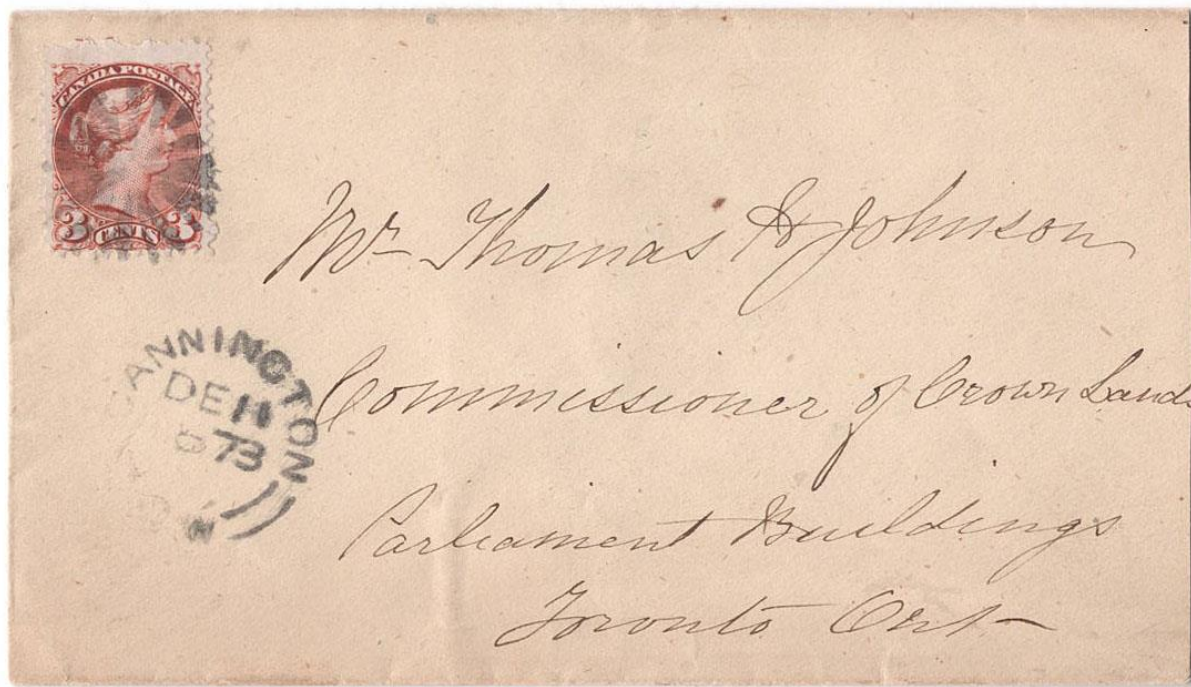

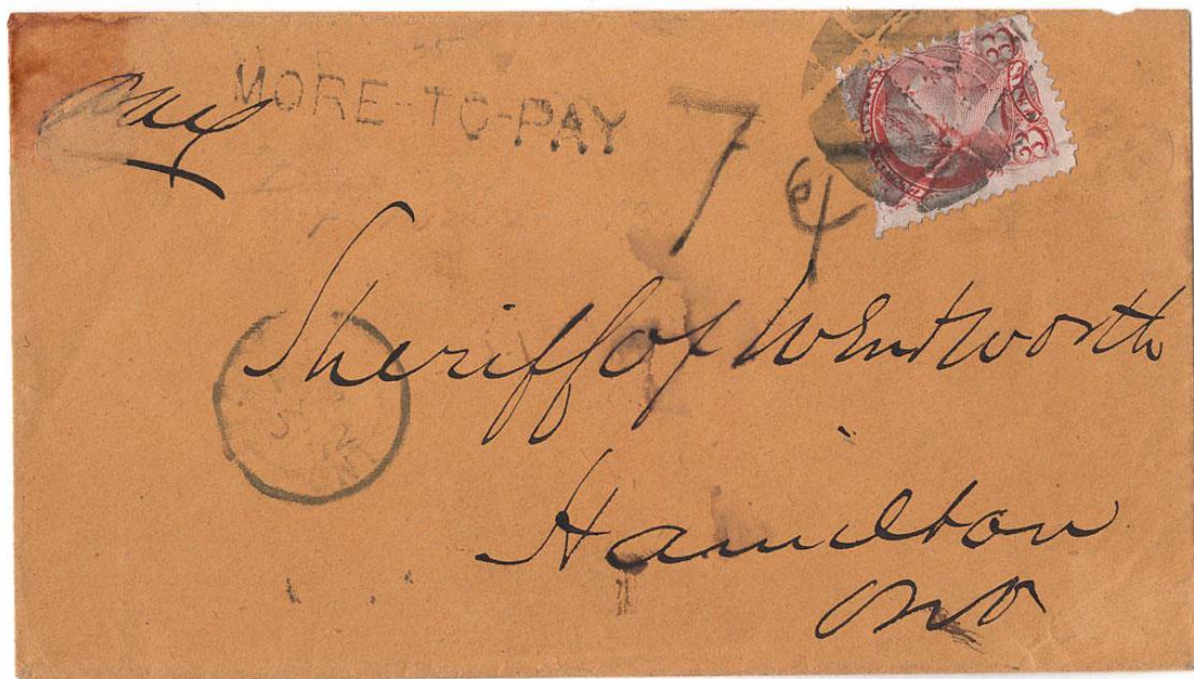

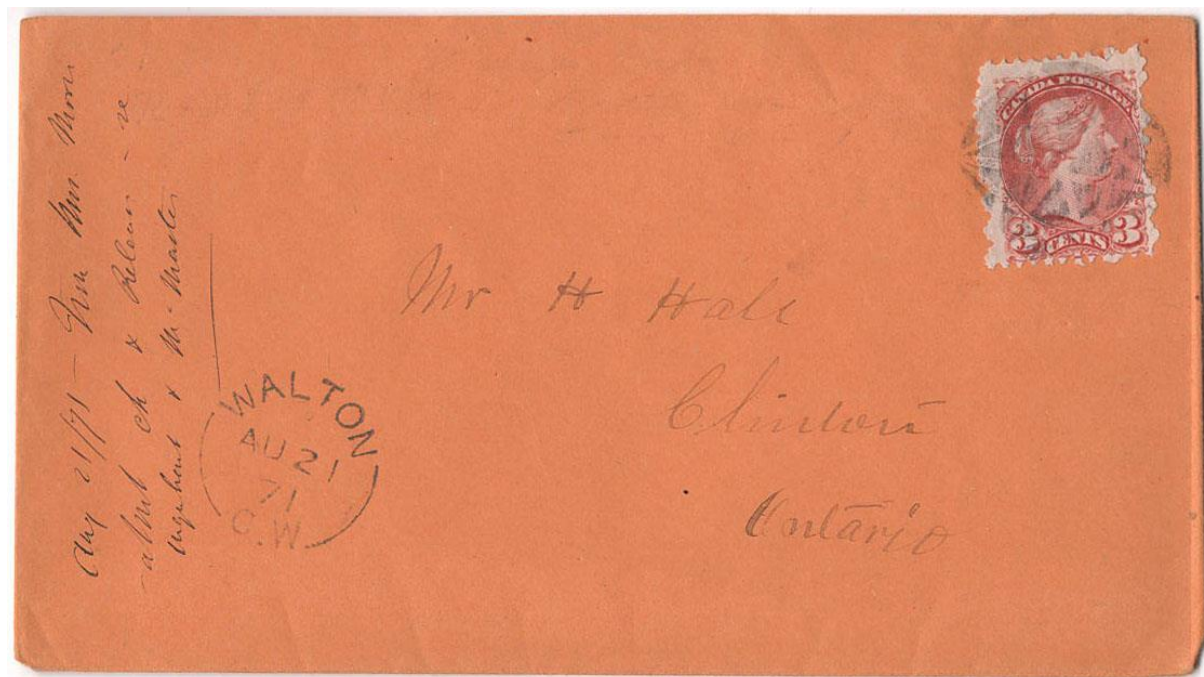

Item 590-31 – **Cannington CW fancy cancel** – 1873, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Cannington CW paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$75.00



Item 590-32 – **Toronto fancy cancel on underpaid cover** – 1872, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Toronto underpaying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Hamilton. Rated 10¢ double unpaid with penalty less 3¢ credit for prepayment and more to pay 7¢. \$125.00



Item 590-33 – **Walton CW fancy cancel (Huron)** – 1871, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Walton CW paying 3¢ letter rate to Clinton (b/s) via Seaforth (b/s). The cover is addressed to Horatio Emmons Hale, prominent lawyer and pioneering ethnologist with the Iroquois peoples on the Grand River. A scarce Berri, a lovely fancy and an early SQ. \$100.00

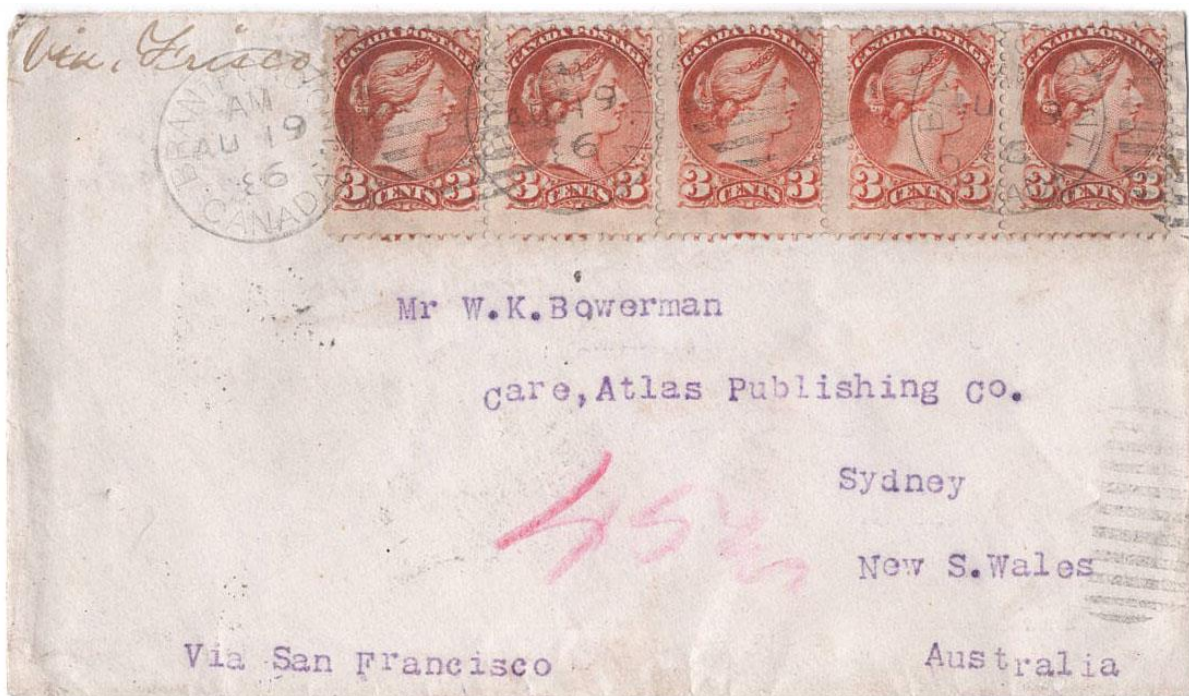
Item 590-37 – **Brechin Water, The Cures** – 1889, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on Brechin Water Cures advertising cover from Brechin Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Goderich. Cures for dyspepsia, indigestion, headache etc etc. \$75.00



Item 590-38 – **Horses and Cattle** – 1881, 1¢, 2¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on Arthur Johnson advertising cover from Greenwood Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Wardsville. Importer and Breeder of Clyde Horses, Short-Horn Cattle, Berkshire Pigs, Cotswold Sheep. This Greenwood postmark measures 22mm with 9.0mm arcs. Unreported and considered as a new discovery. \$85.00



Item 590-39 – **10¢ UPU surtax rate to Afghanistan** – 1880, 5¢ SQ pair (dark olive grey, perf 12) tied by fancy cancel on cover from Kingston Ont paying 10¢ UPU surtax rate to Landi Kotal, Afghanistan. A tribal area in Northwestern Pakistan. The cover is addressed to Captain Sandbach, Royal Artillery, during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Anglo-Afghan War. Routed via London and India. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> earliest SQ cover of 4 recorded examples to Afghanistan. \$9,000.00



Item 590-40 – **15¢ non-UPU rate to NSW, Australia** – 1886, 3¢ SQ (orange vermilion strip of 5) tied by Brantford Ont duplex cancel on cover paying 15¢ non-UPU letter rate to New South Wales, Australia (b/s). Windsor and San Francisco transit (b/s). Lovely! - Ex Nixon. A real wow cover! \$1,200.00



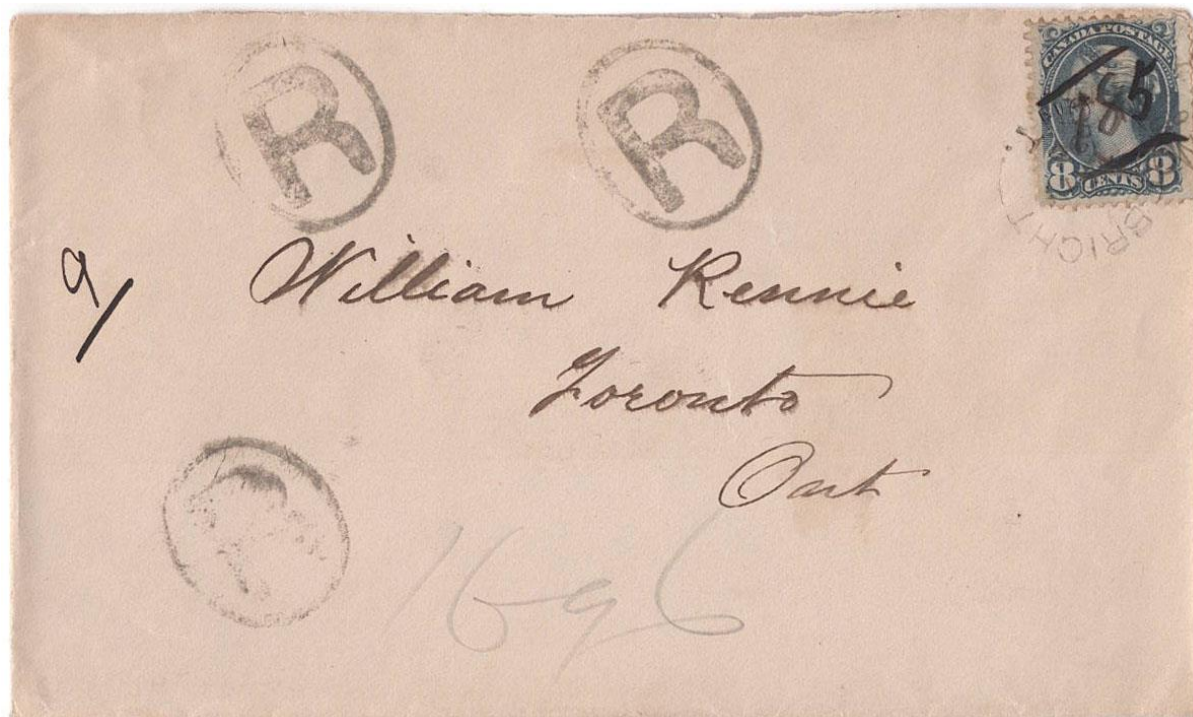

Item 590-58 – **Left at wicket no stamp** – **DLO** – 1906, postcard with message datelined Quebec 6 MY 06 with "Left at wicket no stamp", entered the mail at St. Roch de Quebec P.O., sent to Montreal and handled by the Montreal Dead Letter Office. 1c Edward added and returned to Quebec City for delivery.
