

Item 592-01 – <u>Deschambault LC (double circle)</u> – 1841, partial folded letter from Deschambault LC, double circle in red ms date 1 FE 41, paid 4½d to Quebec. The letter is from surveyor William Legendre to Lieutenant Colonel Bouchette, Surveyor General. The letter relates to a line between two properties. Lt.-Colonel Joseph Bouchette (1774-1841) was the Canadian Surveyor-General of British North America. During the War of 1812 he raised and commanded the Quebec Volunteers. In 1813, he was gazetted Lt. Colonel on the Staff of Governor-General Sir George Prévost. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 592-02 – <u>Isle Verte LC Postmaster free</u> – 1833, Postmaster free franked cover from Isle Verte LC, signed by Louis Bertrand P.M. to Quebec. Bertrand was also a member of the Legislative Council representing Rimouski from 1832 to 1838 and then he became the first mayor of Isle Verte in 1845. \$150.00



Item 592-03 – **Two Acton Vale LC Inter-provincial by two routes** – 1860-1861, Acton Vale LC inter-provincial stampless covers to St. George N.B. One single, one double and routed by two different postal routes. Montreal, St. John NB, St. George NB (b/s) /and/ Montreal, Quebec, Woodstock, St. John NB, St. George NB (b/s). Both lengthy family letters. Bagot County. Just wow!!! \$200.00 **SOLD** 






Item 592-04 – <u>Three Rivers LC Crown Lands Office</u> – 1863, Crown Lands stampless cover from Three Rivers LC, 13 JA 63, mailed unpaid with 7¢ collect to Quebec (b/s). \$75.00






Item 592-05 – Welland Railroad – 1868, stampless cover from Welland UC paid 5 to Fonthill (b/s) via Port Robinson (b/s). Carried by Welland Railroad, double circle dated MR 28 1868 Down (b/s). \$100.00



Item 592-06 – Toronto half penny drop - John Beverley Robinson – 1856, folded letter from Toronto, signed by John Beverley Robinson, rated ½d collect paying the drop letter rate. John Beverley Robinson (1821-1896) was a Canadian politician, lawyer and businessman. He was mayor of Toronto and a provincial and federal member of parliament. He was the fifth Lieutenant Governor of Ontario between the years. He became an alderman in Toronto at St. Patrick's Ward during the 1850s, including a term as mayor in 1856. He was also involved in the incorporation of a number of companies in the Toronto area including the Toronto and Georgian Bay Canal Company in 1856. He was elected to the 6<sup>th</sup> Parliament of the Province of Canada representing Toronto. He helped promote the Northern Railway and served as president. The one page letter dated 26 MR 56 is addressed to Thomas Hutchinson, a Toronto merchant, requesting payment with interest likely for rent for this <u>store on Wellington Street</u>. \$150.00 SOLD







Item 592-07 – Manitowaning Lake Huron – 1865, stampless cover with letter dated January 1865 from Manitowaning Lake Huron paid 5 to Clifford Ont. Routed via Penetanguishene and Elora (b/s). The letter is from Rev. J. W. Sims who was in charge of the Anglican Indigenous people mission at Sheguiandah, northwestern shore of Manitoulin Island. The letter is addressed to Rev Smithurst. Transit marks and enclosure show evidence that the letter is dated JA 25 65, the Manitowaning Lake Huron July datestamp is a dating error and would have been carried over the ice to Penetanguishene. \$500.00

Item 592-08 – <u>Samuel Macdonell (The 1<sup>st</sup> Mayor of Windsor Ont)</u> – 1850, folded letter from Sandwich UC paid 4½d to Colchester. Signed on front S.S. Macdonell as County Clerk. The letter is from Samuel Smith Macdonell 1823-1907, the first Mayor of Windsor Ont, datelined County Council Office Sandwich MR 22 50 requesting county payments. Macdonell was a lawyer and politician in Ontario. He served as the first mayor of Windsor in 1858. He was educated at Upper Canada College and King's College. He joined the North York militia in 1842, later becoming lieutenant-colonel in the Essex militia. He entered the practice of law at Amherstburg. He later was named clerk and solicitor for the council for the western district and moved to Sandwich. He then became clerk and solicitor for the united counties of Essex, Kent and Lambton. \$125.00

Item 592-09 – Moses Shaw MPP (Annapolis County) – 1860, stampless cover with letter from Halifax paid 3 to Clements Port. The letter is from Moses Shaw to his wife. Shaw (1809- 1870) was a merchant and political figure in Nova Scotia. He represented Annapolis township and Annapolis County from 1859 to 1863 as a Liberal-Conservative and then a Reformer. He was a justice of the peace for Annapolis County. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 592-10 – <u>Stanstead to Raglan CW (Ontario)</u> – 1860, 5¢ Beaver tied by Four-ring 45 on cover from Stanstead LC paying 5¢ letter rate to Raglan (b/s). Routed via Montreal, carried by Mon & Isld Pd GTR No.2, Whitby and Oshawa (b/s). A rare four colour cover on pink with the Raglan UC struck in green. <u>The 3<sup>rd</sup> Raglan UC reported use</u>. \$300.00





Item 592-11 – <u>Kagawong fancy and registered</u> – 1877, 3¢, 2¢ RLS tied by fancy grid cancel on cover from Kagawong Ont paying 5¢ letter rate to Manitowaning (b/s) via Collingwood (b/s). \$175.00





Item 592-12 – Oshawa 8¢ double wgt registered – 1884, 3¢ SQ pair, 2¢ RLS tied by Oshawa Ont cds with inner arc on cover paying 8¢ double weight registered letter rate to Richmond Hill (b/s). Via Toronto and Grand Trunk Railway. Lovely orange shades. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 592-13 – Rama Ont (Ontario County – 1868-1904) – 1872, 3¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on cover from Rama Ont, all struck in blue, paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. \$75.00




Item 592-14 – Rama Ont registered (Ontario County – 1868-1904) – 1870, 3¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on cover from Rama Ont dated JY 13 70, all struck in blue, paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto with 2¢ registry fee paid cash. \$125.00






Item 592-15 – <u>New York to Fergus Ont, Registered G.W.R.</u> – 1874, US 1¢, 10¢ tied by fancy cancel on registered cover from New York to Fergus Ontario (Wellington County). Carried by GWR with broken circle and three boxed REGISTERED G.W.R. handstamps. Return address Long Island NY. Ex Harrison. \$275.00






Item 592-16 – **Quebec City family letter** – 1894, 3¢ SQ tied by Quebec duplex cancel on mourning cover with letter, letterhead printed *112 Grande-Allée*, paying 3¢ letter rate to Connecticut. \$40.00




Item 592-17 – <u>Uxbridge Ont registered to U.S.</u> – 1896, 3¢, 5¢ SQ tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Uxbridge Ont paying 8¢ registered letter to U.S. (b/s) via Toronto (b/s). 3¢ over the edge and rounded. \$40.00



Item 592-18 – Oshawa Coulthard, Scott & Co. (Ontario) – 1887, 3¢ SQ tied by Oshawa Ont cds on Coulthard, Scott & Co. Seeders and Drills advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Armadale. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 592-19 – Ottawa to U.S. returned via DLO, 1¢ US paid – 1891, 3¢ SQ tied by Ottawa duplex cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to New Jersey (b/s). Not picked up, advertised in compliance with regulation, unclaimed and returned to the US Dead Letter Office (likely in New York City). French UPU "Non Réclamé". Uncertain when and why the 1¢ was paid. Returned to Canada via the DLO in Ottawa, MR 14 91 shift #3 and returned to sender MR 16. \$200.00



Item 592-20 – <u>5¢ UPU to Germany</u> – 1900, ½¢ Leaf pair, 1¢ Numeral and 2¢ Map (bright gold) tied by London Orb cancel on 1¢ letter card paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Germany. The message is datelined Floraville Illinois 31 MY 00, written in German. \$150.00



Item 592-21 – <u>Head of Millstream NB registered</u> – 1899, 1¢ Numeral (3), 2¢ Provisional, 2¢ Map (orange yellow) tied by Head of Millstream NB broken circle on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Sussex (b/s). Kings County. \$100.00 **SOLD** 





Item  $592-50 - \underline{l}$  am in Petawawa with the Guelph Battalion - 1913, 1¢ Admiral tied by Petawawa Camp cds on postcard to Clyde via Ottawa. "July 1, 1913 – Dear Aunt, well I am out here at camp again Petawawa on the Ottawa River with the Guelph Battalion, I am gunner on the  $11^{th}$  Battery, sure have had good time, your nephew, Albert". \$50.00





Item 592-56 – <u>Testament of a mate on his ship</u> – 1869, Robert Guest (1844-1890) ship owner and captain. A testament for James Bailie, who served as a mate on his ship, The A.W. Singleton, one-page dated Montreal OC 22 69. An interesting collateral to a steamboat collection. \$50.00



Item 592-57 – <u>Louis St. Laurent</u> – 1965, autograph of Louis Stephen St. Laurent on card, the 12<sup>th</sup> Prime Minister of Canada. The autograph is signed "Louis S. St. Laurent" in blue pen with *"Cordial greetings and best wishes to Mr. James Watt"*, Quebec 12<sup>th</sup> October 1965. \$50.00 **SOLD**


Item 592-58 – Martin Griffin, The editor of The Mail Toronto – 1882, autograph letter signed by Martin Griffin, the editor of The Mail Toronto. Editorial Department letterhead dated JA 20 82, 3 pages to Canadian author and editor Henry Morgan. Regretting he cannot do more to promote the Annual Register (even for a friend). He writes "I get along here very well, a lot of yarns in the papers about Farrers coming back are awful nonsense. There is no idea in anyone's mind here if any such thing. The Mail people and I are on the most confidential terms. In fact, I like my work so well that I have no present ambitions out if it, an look forward to some years of useful labour in this quarter. Griffin was a Newfoundlander who attended the St. Mary's College in Halifax, called to the Bar of Nova Scotia in 1868. Served as editor of the Halifax Express and has been an unsuccessful Conservative candidate for the provincial legislature. Later the editor of the Halifax Herald and then The Mail of Toronto. \$75.00



Item 592-59 – <u>George Henry Murray (Nova Scotia Premier)</u> – 1914, typed letter signed, one page dated Provincial Secretary, Halifax 3 AU 14, sending his autograph with an additional two signatures on a single sheet to a lady in Meach Lake Quebec. George H. Murray (1861-1929) was a Nova Scotia politician who served as the province's 8<sup>th</sup> Premier for 26 years. The longest unbroken tenure for a head of government in Canadian history. He was born in Grand Narrows. \$100.00

Item 592-60 – <u>Two early Niagara barristers</u> – 1802, draft of a legal document, one page, dated 3 JU 1802 Niagara Upper Canada. A claim of judgement against Alexander Stewart, James Clark and John Ten Brook, ordering a yet to be disclosed payment to merchant Jacob Glen. Stewart and Clark were two early barristers in Niagara, and Stewart was one of the founders of the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1802. \$100.00



Item 592-61 – \$25.00 Post Office order – 1878, autograph letter signed by Henry Smith, one page, Cape Sable Island N.S. dated JA 19 78. To Mr. John Maters, sending a Post Office order in the amount of \$25.00 and requesting a receipt. Staining and paper lost at top. \$50.00
