






Item 594-01 -Brock CW (Ontario County, 1836-1869) - 1857, stampless cover from Brock CW, hammer 1 with manuscript date, paid 3d to Toronto via Stouffville (b/s). This is the latest recorded example for this hammer with ms date. Very scarce. \$250.00 SOLD



Item 594-02 – Mara UC manuscript postmark (Ontario, 1842-1863) – 1858, stampless cover from Mara UC rated 3d and then free to Toronto (b/s) via Beaverton (b/s). This postmark is recorded from 1854 to 1858, the current latest recorded date, office operation 1842 to 1863. The large 29mm hammer which was proofed in 1842 was not used and has no record. \$350.00



Item 594-03 – <u>B.P. Paige & Co. agricultural implements</u> – 1852, B.P. Paige & Co. manufacturers of patent thrashing machines cameo illustrated, showing horse driven trashing machine, on stampless cover with letter from Montreal to Warren, New Hampshire. 6d stamp off UL. Established in 1844, the factory was located on Duke and Wellington Street. Attractive and scarce! \$500.00



Item 594-04 – Colonel Anthony Van Egmond builder of the Huron Road – 1857, folded certificate of Magistrate datelined Tuckersmith UC, 14 MY 57, mailed from Egmondville rated 3d to Goderich (b/s) via Brucefield (b/s). The certificate is signed by Col Anthony Van Egmond, swearing in Joseph P. Brine. Anthony Van Egmond, builder of the Huron Road, received large amounts of land in the Huron Tract in return for his services. He was responsible for the community's beginnings (+/- 1837) but the leading light was his eldest son, Constant, who prospered through mills owned with his brothers on the Bayfield River. Egmondville was the last of the four hamlets on the Mill or Bayfield Rd, Bayfield, Varna, Brucefield and Egmondville, to receive postal service. The community declined after 1860 when the Buffalo & Lake Huron Rwy Station opened in Seaforth less than 2kms to the north. This is the earliest recorded date of all Egmondville postmark. \$200.00



Item 594-05 – <u>Tuckersmith UC manuscript postmark (Huron, 1841-1852)</u> – 1842, folded certificate of Magistrate mailed from Tuckersmith UC, manuscript postmark and the only reported use, rated 4½d to Goderich. The office and twp were named after Martin Tucker Smith, one of the first directors of the Canada Company. Its exact office location is unknown but presumably a considerable distance up the Huron Road as well as near the Yankee Reid tavern. The certificate is swearing in Jonas Gibbings as constable, one of the first settlers at the Corners which later became Clinton. A rarity! \$750.00






Item 594-06 – <u>James Cox Aikins (Manitoba)</u> – 1881, free franked cover from Ottawa (duplex cancel FREE) signed by James Cox Aikins to his son in Winnipeg. Waxseal. James Cox Aikins (1823-1904) was a Canadian politician representing Peel County, served as a cabinet minister in the government of John A. Macdonald, Secretary of State, Senator and was the 4th Lieutenant Governor of <u>Manitoba and Keewatin</u>. His son, Sir James Albert Manning Aikins, represented Brandon in the House and later was also appointed Lt-Gov of Manitoba. \$200.00



Item 594-07 – <u>Just months prior Continental Army occupying Montreal</u> – 1776, folded letter from Quebec (dated AU 19, 1776) with the earliest recorded manuscript Q (uebec) marking, paid 8d Stg to Jean Dumas St. Martin in Montreal (*to deliver to the Roussel family in Longueuil*, south shore of Montreal). The letter was sent during the American Revolutionary War, just months prior to the Continental Army occupying Montreal. The letter has some severe splitting along folds otherwise fine. \$2,500.00 **SOLD**






Item 594-08 – Newton LeGayet Mackay of Halifax – 1873, House of Commons cover with letter dated AP 16 73 signed by Member of Parliament N.L. Mackay to Henry Morgan. Addressed to Morgan at Russell House in Ottawa. House of Common CP-5 double circle with free at foot struck in red (strike usually blurred and fine examples being very rare). Newton LeGayet Mackay was born in Halifax and studied law there. He was called to the bar in 1859 and was named Queen's Counsel in 1872. He represented Cape Breton in the House of Commons from 1872 to 1878. \$275.00





Item 594-09 – <u>William Johnson & Co. agricultural implements</u> – 1858, Wm Johnson & Co. manufacturers of thrashing machines advertising cover, showing horses driven trashing machine, rated 3d to Wellington County CW. Belleville, Brighton and Wellington (b/s). Small repair at left. \$325.00




Item 594-10 – <u>Lubricant for steam engines</u> – 1869, 3¢ LQ tied by Toronto cds with inner arc on Mott's Lubricant for steam engines advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Manilla (b/s). Light reduction and back flap off. Ex VGG. \$450.00 **SOLD**





Item 594-11 – <u>Port Perry Undertakers</u> – 1879, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy circular fancel on W.J. Nott Furniture Dealer and Undertaker advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Orono. \$50.00





Item 594-12 – Optometrist to Dead Letter Office – 1891, 3¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on optometrist advertising cover from Janetville Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Burketon (*Burketon Station and Bownmanville b/s*). Not called for and sent to the Dead Letter Office (hammer 3, JY 2 91). Toned. Durham County. \$200.00






Item 594-13 – Oshawa Fanning Mill, W.T. Dingle – 1886-8, 3¢ SQ tied by Oshawa Ont cds on W.T. Dingle Works Fanning Mill advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Armadale. W.T. Dingle Works was a thriving implement industry of the 1880s, located on King Street in Oshawa. W.T.'s business produced seeders as well. In 1879, he purchased the Honey Fanning Mill business from Charles Honey. Above, another cover with "Estate W.T. Dingle" c/c. Pair. \$100.00 SOLD




Item 594-14 – <u>Uxbridge Ont registered to The Oleograph Co. Toronto</u> – 1898, 8¢ SQ tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Uxbridge Ont paying 8¢ registered letter erate to Toronto (b/s). The Oleograph Co. \$50.00



Item 594-15 – Octagonal Not Called For – Montreal – 1882, 1¢ stationery envelope with American Forestry Congress advertising mailed in Montreal paying 1¢ drop letter rate. Delivered by letter carrier 1 SEP (b/s), redirected, removed then not called for SP 29 82. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 594-16 – <u>December 24, 1898</u> – 1898, 1¢ Numeral, 2¢ Map tied by grid cancel on T.T. Coleman c/c cover from Seaforth Ont, dated December 24 1898, paying 3¢ letter rate to Clinton (b/s DE 24). \$200.00




Item 594-17 – <u>Branch Dead Letter Office Regina Sask</u> – 1916, 1¢ Washington tied by Albright Alberta cds on bird's eye view of Des Moines U.S. to Murray, Iowa. Not allowed and caught. Returned for postage via the Branch DLO in Regina. Paid and forwarded to destination. Regina DLO is very scarce. \$150.00

Item 594-18 – Montreal registered postcard – 1913, ½¢ Numeral (2), 2¢, 5¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on 1¢ Edward stationery card from Montreal Sub No.20 overpaying 6¢ registered postcard rate to local addressee. Keyhole precursor with matching Montreal dotted cds (b/s). Reverse with electrical engineer related message. \$125.00





Item 594-19 – **2¢ Empire to England redirected to France** – 1905, 2¢ Edward tied by Halifax machine cancel on cover paying 2¢ Empire letter rate to the American Express Company in London. Redirected to Paris France with forwarding label. 15 centimes postage due and paid. \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 594-20 – <u>Chatham Plumber</u> – 1910, 1¢ Edward (2, one faulty) tied by Chatham Ont machine cancel on C.R. Bowers Plumber advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Kansas. A pretty illustration depicting a lady in ladies' room with lavatories, mirror etc \$125.00




Item 594-21 – Alberta - registered money packet with \$1 Parliament – 1935, \$1.00 Scroll, 5¢, 20¢ Pictorial tied by oval "Castor Alta Registered" handstamp on Bank of Montreal cover, unsealed and attached to packet, paying \$1.25 registered money packet for 23 ounces (15¢ first oz including registered, 5¢ each add oz). A scarce \$1.00 Parliament cover. \$300.00





Item 594-22 – RCAF Cormorant Lake – 1930, 2¢ Scroll booklet stamps (4) tied by Lac du Bonnet Man cds on cover paying 8¢ quadruple letter rate to RCAF Sub Station, Cormorant Lake, Mile 42, Hudson Bay Railway via Winnipeg (duplex b/s). An incredible RCAF cover. Condition shows the thickness of a quadruple rate. \$125.00






Item 594-23 – Three country franking CAN-US-GB – 1931, 2¢ Washington tied by Brandon Vermont machine cancel on cover paying 2¢ letter rate to England. Redirected to Westmount Que with GB 1½d and then redirected with Canada 2¢ arch to Toronto. \$125.00





Item 594-24 – The Battle of Damascus and Occupation of Syria – 1941, 6¢ Airmail C6 tied by Victoria machine cancel on censored shortpaid cover to Lt St. Clair serving with the East Surrey Regiment in Damascus. Beirut (b/s). T40 centimes postage due. The Allied troops captured Damascus on 21 June 1941 which was invaded by the Vichy Forces. With the defeat of France in August 1940, Syria became part of the French Army of the Levant, aligned itself with the new Vichy Government. An exceedingly rare WW2 cover. \$350.00





Item 594-25 – **5¢ UPU to Teheran, Persia** – 1943, 5¢ UPU Ottawa tied by Quebec Bkaclout machine cancel on double censored cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Teheran, Iran. Numerous censored markings and tapes, insufficiently addressed and returned to sender. \$200.00





Item 594-26 – **\$6.62 registered money packet with \$1 Fishermans** – 1952, 50¢ Oil Wells, \$1 Fisherman (6), 12¢ meter tied by Toronto roller cancel on Bank of Toronto mailing tag, with boxed "Registered No.", paying \$6.62 registered money packet to Sarnia (b/s). Mailing for 130 ounces of gold or money etc. T.L.&S RPO (b/s). \$200.00
