

Item 601-01 – <u>Port Maitland CW (Haldimand)</u> – 1848, folded letter from Port Maitland CW paid 4½d to Niagara. Recorded 1848-1854. A perfect strike! \$125.00



Item 601-02 – <u>Moose Creek CW (Stormont)</u> – 1873, stampless cover from Moose Creek CW paid 3 to Toronto via Mille-Roche (b/s). A very scarce and perfect strike of this Stormont office. \$125.00



Item 601-03 – Moulinette UC, Stormont (1st period, closed in 1859) – 1858, stampless cover from Moulinette UC paid 3 to Matilda via Iroquois (b/s). This is Moulinette in the 1st period, hammer 1, recorded from September to November 1858 only. Closed in 1859 with a reopening in 1874. An Eastern Ontario rarity. \$550.00



Item 601-04 – <u>Patent wrapper rated double 1/1½</u> - 1848, large wrapper from Montreal, endorsed C.L.O. Crown Land Office and "One Patent", rated 2/3 collect, the double 1/1½d to Toronto (b/s). Unusual. \$50.00

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Item 601-05 – <u>Dorchester CW (Middlesex – 1847-1867)</u> – 1861, stampless cover with letter from Dorchester CW rated 7¢ collect to Fish Creek (b/s) via St. Mary's Blanchard and Ingersoll (b/s). This Fish Creek hammer II is a very scarce Perth County postmark and Dorchester a rare Middlesex office, closed in 1867. \$250.00



Item 601-06 – <u>Two On His Majesty Service covers to Indian Affairs</u> – 1825, two folded covers from Niagara both with the very scarce tiny "Paid" marking, top cover paying a huge 7N4 and bottom cover paying 2N9. Both addressed to George Ironside, Superintendent of Indian Affairs and Indian Department. Niagara double circle with typeset. No content. Pair. \$300.00 SOLD

IRONSIDE, GEORGE, Indian Department official and merchant; born in Scotland; married to Isabella Vocemassussia in Sandwich UC, Isabelle a relative of the Chief Tenskwatawa (a Native American religious and political leader of the Shawnee tribe); died 31 May 1831 in Amherstburg.










Item 601-09 – York River CW (Hastings 1861-1879) – 1863, 5¢ Beaver tied by York River CW broken circle (ms date) on Ottawa City Harris, Bronson & Co. Merchants of Pine Lumber advertising cover paying 5¢ letter rate to Madoc (b/s). \$350.00



Item 601-10 – 6¢ SQ chocolate jumbo – 1891, 6¢ SQ chocolate (jumbo margins, very fine centering) tied by fancy cancel on cover from Parry Sound Ont paying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Toronto. A large cover reduced to letter-size with a pretty stamp! \$150.00








Cornwall transit (b/s). A light reduction at right. A rare 1876 2¢ RLS usage. \$300.00



Item 601-14 – **Pont Rouge Que with manuscript date** – 1877, 1¢ stationery card with printed Dominion Telegraph Co. order mailed from Pont Rouge Que (hammer 1, manuscript date JA 25 77) to Toronto via Quebec Point-aux-Trembles (b/s). Both very scarce Portneuf County postmarks! \$100.00





Item 601-15 -Show Case Company -c1890, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Montreal to Moncton reverse with Montreal Show Case Company advertising. \$60.00

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Item 601-16 – "H" fancy cancel (Postmaster E.J. Hoyt) – 1883, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Weymouth Bridge NS to Yarmouth with "H" fancy cancel Lacelle 481. Looks taller and narrower making perhaps a second version of the "H" fancy. Used by Postmaster E.J. Hoyt. Digby County (1865-1907). \$75.00



Item 601-17 – Moulinette Ont registered (Stormont) – 1877, 3¢, SQ, 2¢ RLS (an early use) tied by fancy cork cancel on cover from Moulinette Ont, dated JU 20 77, paying 5¢ letter registered letter rate to Dickinson's Landing (b/s). Interestingly, two Ontario's lost village postmarks on the same cover. Both were permanently flooded by the creation of the St. Lawrence Seaway. Item 601-19 – Registered Ottawa FREE – 1891, Customs Department free franked registered cover from Ottawa to Montreal (b/s), initialed J.F.G., boxed Registered Ottawa FREE MR 14 91. No evidence that the required 5¢ registry fee had been paid. The Registered FREE handstamp seems to mean that there was no registration fee for free franked mail, but the *Postal Guide* quite clearly requires that such was to be paid, no matter who free franked the letter. \$150.00 SOLD





Caledonia Springs was once the site of a large mineral springs luxury health spa and resort. The hotel carried a number of different names becoming the Grand Hotel and later Caledonia Springs Hotel. The Caledonia Springs Post Office was Icoated in the hotel. A pretty Maple Leaf Issue regsitered cover. \$175.00

This Stormont office was in operation from 1877 to 1906. The postmark is the actuel latest recorded date of the hammer 1. Redirected to Granville Ferry, charged 1¢ redirectional fee, paid with a bisect 2¢ postage due J16 tied by Granville Ferry NS cds. Most likely due to a lack of 1¢ J15. \$150.00 **SOLD**









Item 601-51 – <u>RCAF internee in Ireland</u> – 1943, 10¢, 20¢ War tied by Owen Sound Ont machine cancel on double censored cover paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Ireland. Canadian, Irish and Irish military censors. The cover is addressed to Jack Calder, one of the nine RCAF interned at Curragh. Only 9. Source: book written about Calder & Keefer "Grounded in Eire: The Story of Two RAF Fliers Interned in Ireland during World War II". A WW2 rarity! \$400.00





Item 601-52 — <u>Battle of Britain, co-operation to fighter (To Toronto)</u> — 1940, postcard mailed FPO 465 (CA Mil HQ London) with RCAF oval and straight-line marking to Toronto. Message: *Today is my happy day, I hear as now I am being transferred from Army Co-operation to fighter. Spent a couple of months near this working with out troops and playing around the channel"*. German operations in Poland and France in 1939 and 1940 had demonstrated how effectively air forces could work with ground troops. Two of the first three RCAF Sqns sent to the UK were identified as Army Co-Operation No.110 and 112. Scarce with such a message. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 601-53 – <u>British Servicemen POW in Poland</u> – 1944, POW free censored cover from Fort Erie North Ontario to Cpl Henry Glynn, British POW, Stalag VIII near Gorlitz. Undelivered with Swiss "This letter formed part of undelivered mails which fell into the hands of the allied forces in Germany, it is undeliverable as addressed and is therefore returned to you". Returned to Canada via Ottawa and Toronto Dead Letter Offices. \$150.00



Item 601-54 – <u>HMCS Avalon airmail cover</u> – c1941, triangle Postage Paid GPO with censor DB/N 178 on cover with "Airmail" in red crayon to Hamilton Ontario. DB/N 178 is listed as the HMCS Avalon. This is the first airmail unfranked RCN cover that I have seen. \$75.00




