Item  $603-01 - \underline{\text{Wakefield England to St. John NB}} - 1835$ , business folded letter from Wakefield England to St. John NB via St. Andrews. Rated 9d to forwarding agent in Liverpool, carried by the Orpheus to New York. Entered in New York as Ship letter. Rated 27¢ US converted to 1/4% plus 9d total 2/1% Currency collect. \$200.00



Item 603-02 – Wotton LC hammer 1 (Wolfe County) – 1859, stampless cover from Wotton LC paid 5 to Quebec (b/s) via Danville (b/s). A rare office!. \$150.00 SOLD






Item 603-03 – <u>St. Pie CE cross border via Rouse Point (Bagot)</u> – 1857, stampless cover from St. Pie CE paid 6 to Crown Point NY. Routed via St. Hyacinthe (*Ruggles handstamp in red*), Montreal and Rouse Point (b/s). \$125.00

Item 603-04 – <u>The Lord Montagu at Quebec</u> – 1858, letter with cover from Quebec dated DE 18 58 from Lord Montagu (Andrew Dixon) to Henry Morgan in Toronto. The letter is rambling about religious and literary matters mentioned Langevin and other Quebec politicians. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 603-05 – Quebec 1870, weather threatening another deluge – 1870, letter with cover from Quebec to Ottawa (b/s) dated JA 10 70. The letter is from Henry Morgan's sister and relates to family matters. At the end, she wrote: *The weather threatening another deluge causing pedestrians much alarm as to the safety of their footing, just enough frost to make the streets one sheet of ice.* \$50.00



Item 603-06 – <u>Boucherville LC hammer II (Chambly)</u> – 1855, stampless cover from Boucherville LC rated 3d collect to Montreal (b/s). This is the hammer 2 previously recorded from 1853 to 1854. Perhaps a new latest recorded date. Heavy staining UL. A very scarce postmark. \$100.00



Item 603-07 – <u>Jordan UC triple weight (Lincoln)</u> – 1845, stampless folded cover from Jordan UC rated triple 4½d collect to Niagara (b/s). Hammer 1 recorded from 1844 to 1849. \$100.00



Item 603-08 – <u>Court Martial at Toronto</u> – 1840, folded letter datelined Toronto MR 3 40 District General Order. Endorsed OHMS and entered the mail in Drummondville UC rated 9d collect to Hamilton. The letter is signed by the Adjutant General of the Upper Canadian Militia. It relates to a Court Martial of Militia that will be assembled at the Toronto Garrison's Orderly Room. It is the trial of a prisoner, and it involved the 1<sup>st</sup> Provincial Dragoons, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion Incorporated Militia and the Quarter Master General's Department. \$250.00 **SOLD** 

The First Battalion Incorporated Militia was established in 1838 to protect the Hamilton area (formerly known as Head-of-the-Lake), and the surrounding region. The Provincial Dragoons would later be seen as an ancestral unit of the 2nd/10th Dragoons




Item 603-09 – <u>Adam Fergusson (Farmer and Agriculturist)</u> – 1842, business folded letter signed by William Gardiner from Thorold UC paid 4½d to Woodhill, Flamboro via Hamilton. Forwarded then to Waterdown (East Flamboro). The letter is addressed to Adam Fergusson: a farmer by avocation, agriculturalist, politician, a wealthy magistrate and deputy Lt of Perthshire. Fergusson commanded a militia unit during the Rebellion of 1837. As agriculturalist, he sought to improve the conditions and quality of UC agriculture by encouraging selective livestock breeding, the dev of new feeds, crop rotation, soil analysis, and improved drainage techniques. He was one of the first to import pure-bred, short-horned cattle from Britain and donated the Fergus Cup to be awarded in annual competition for the best-grade Durham heifer. \$200.00







Item 603-10 – <u>Hecks Corners UC (Grenville – 1845-1857)</u> – 1855, folded letter from Toronto rated 3d collect to Morrisburg (b/s) via Kingston and Kemptville (b/s). Redirected to Mountain in Dundas County (1853-1860) via Hecks Corners (1845-1857). \$325.00



Item 603-11 – Waterloo Ont Fire Insurance – c1869, 1¢ Large Queen tied by concentric ring cancel on unsealed Waterloo County Mutual Fire Insurance Co. advertising cover paying 1¢ circular rate to Schomberg Ont. \$300.00




Item 603-12 – An early Bruce Seeds registered – 1872, 2¢ Large Queen, 3¢ SQ tied by Hamilton CW broken circle on John A. Bruce & Co. Seed Merchants c/c cover paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Vittoria (b/s) via Simcoe (b/s). Endorsed "Money Letter". A very pretty combination with nice shades and a very early Bruce Seeds cover! \$500.00 SOLD








Item 603-13 – 3¢ Large Queen pair – one with cracked plate – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen (horizontal pair, some pulled perfs, right stamp showing the constant cracked plate variety in TS of CENTS and beyond, #25v, Duckworth variety C, in pair with left stamp normal) cancelled by Two-ring 6 cancel on cover from London CW paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. No backstamp as customary. McGregor New Livery NY c/c. \$1,000.00



Item 603-14 – Judge Richards letter on Garden River First Nation – 1879, 3¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on cover from Brockville paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. The letter is from Albert Elswood Richards (1848-1917) Lawyer and Judge. The two-page letter dated Brockville 8 JA 79 is about a land transaction for the Garden River Indian River (Ketegaunseebee - Garden River First Nation, near Sault Ste. Marie). \$150.00 SOLD



Item 603-15 – <u>Judge Richards letter from Brockville Ont</u> – 1876, 1¢ SQ (3) tied by cork cancel on cover from Brockville paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. The letter is from Albert Elswood Richards (1848-1917) Lawyer and Judge. The two-page letter is on a financial matter. \$50.00 **SOLD** 




Item 603-16 – <u>Civil servant and translator</u> – 1877, 3¢ SQ tied by Montreal Que duplex cancel on Court of Queens Bench cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. The letter is from Louis-Francois Wilfrid Marchand (1832-1896), French Canadian civil servant and translator. Known especially for his translation of the account Peter Kalm wrote of his travels in North America. The 2-page dated Montreal 27 OC 77 clarifying biographical details regarding his tenure as Deputy Clerk of Appeals in Lower Canada. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 603-17 – <u>Lindsay agricultural machinery</u> – 1901, 2¢ Numeral tied by Lindsay Ont squared circle on Sylvester Bros Mfg Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Vandorf (b/s) York County. Sylvester Co. was an agricultural machinery manufacturer. Fishermen and a carriage illustrated in the background. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 603-18 – McClary Stoves and Furnaces – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by London duplex cancel on McClary Manufacturing Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. CDS and a duplex. \$75.00





Item 603-19 – Remington Business College calendar postcard – 1909, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on Remington Business College calendar postcard from Arkona Ont paying 1¢ PC rate to Sutorville (Lambton). Redirected to Forest. \$125.00







Item 603-20 – <u>Tennis Court and Lawn Shediac NB</u> – 1907, 1¢ Edward tied by Moncton NB machine cancel on coin patriotic postcard, showing Weldon House Tennis Court and Lawn Shediac NB, paying 1¢ PC rate to Loggieville. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 603-21 – Quebec City P.T. Legaré (farm machinery, carriages) – 1912, 2¢ Edward tied by Quebec Que International machine cancel on P.T. Legaré advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Napierville. Legaré was in the farm machinery of various kinds, horse-drawn carriages, household goods such as furniture, wood stoves, refrigerators, washing machines, and musical instruments etc. \$50.00 SOLD





Item 603-22 – <u>Vegreville Alberta Tercentenary registered</u> – 1908, 2¢, 5¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by grid cancel on Franklin Insurance illustrated cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to U.S. Routed via Winnipeg and carried by Winnipeg & Edmonton RPO No.10 East. \$150.00 SOLD






Item 603-23 – Montmagny Que Kodak photo mailer – c1920, 2¢ Admiral pair tied by Montmagny roller cancel No.2 on J.C. Audet Artist and Photographer Kodak photo mailer paying 4¢ miscellaneous matter rate to St. Pierre. "Use the Kodak Film" advertising slogans in French are seldom seen. \$50.00




Item 603-24 – <u>Liverpool mailed at sea "Paquebot" obliterator</u> – 1927, 2¢, 3¢ Admiral (on the edge) tied by Liverpool Paquebot machine cancel on White Star cover, mailed at sea, to Winnipeg (b/s). Receiver dated JU 7 27. \$50.00



Item 603-25 – <u>Vancouver Golden Jubilee 1886-1936</u> – 1936, 2¢ Arch strip of 3 tied by Vancouver machine cancel on Golden Jubilee of Vancouver cover paying 6¢ airmail letter rate to Ontario. \$30.00





Item 603-26 – **Grads Cigarettes** – 1935, 2¢ Medallion tied by Toronto machine cancel on L.O. Grothe advertising cover, Grads Cigarettes back advertising, paying 2¢ drop letter rate. Grads cigarettes were originally produced by LO Grothe, a tobacco company located in Quebec City which was taken over by Imperial Tobacco Canada in 1942. Small opening tear UR. \$35.00 **SOLD** 






Item 603-27 – <u>Amherstburg registered</u> – 1938, 13¢ Pictorial of 1935 tied by Amherstburg Ont duplex cancel on cover with <u>oval</u> registered and <u>boxed</u> registered markings paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Windsor transit (b/s). \$35.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 603-28 – <u>Hawkshaw NB Keyhole</u> – 1939, 13¢ Pictorial of 1935 cancelled by grid cancel on cover from Hawkshaw NB, Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Woodstock (b/s). Fredericton transit (b/s). \$25.00 **SOLD** 



Item 603-29 – <u>RCN censored airmail cover</u> – c1940, 2¢ Mufti (3) tied by grid cancel on cover likely from Halifax, blue boxed Navy censorship "Passed by Censor", paying 6¢ airmail letter rate to Montreal. Very scarce! \$45.00



Item 603-30 – <u>Sudbury to Copper Cliff money packet</u> – 1940, 2¢, 5¢ Mufti, 10¢ (2), 20¢ (3) Pictorial of 1938 tied by Sudbury Ont cds on Bank of Toronto cover paying 87¢ money packet rate to Copper Cliff. \$125.00




Item 603-31 – <u>Dartmouth NS double censored Red Cross</u> – 1943, 10¢, 20¢ War tied by the peculiar Dartmouth Blackout cds on Red Cross cover, censored by Canadians (DB/248) and censored by the enemy in Paris (A.x.), paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Switzerland. A very peculiar and scarce Dartmouth Blackout circular datestamp. \$40.00 SOLD









Item 603-32 – **Guelph Ont to Radio Officer in Merchant Navy** – 1942, 3¢ Mufti tied by Guelph machine cancel on cover dated NO 7 42, to a Radio Officer onboard S.S. Fort Alexandria located at Sandsend, Eastern England. Enclosure datelined YMCA Guelph. Undelivered with "Left Ship" in red crayon. Returned via Cape Town by the "*Release by Censor*" and then returned to Canada with receiver dated NO 19 43. 375 days in transit and not delivered. \$75.00






Item 603-33 – <u>Halifax - Lt Arthur Godefrey</u> – 1945, free franked POW letter from family in Halifax to Lt Arthur Godfrey to Oflag 9 A/Z in Germany. DB/594. Oflag 9 A/Z was a German WW2 POW camp for Allied officers situated on the outskirts of the small town of Rotenburg in the Hesse region. Reverse with Swiss "this letter has been returned". A very scarce postally used form. I have had only a handful of this Kriegsgefangenenpost type. \$150.00

Item 603-34 – **POW parcel card from Hotel Westend to Guelph Ontario** – 1943, (undated), free franked parcel form card from Internee at Ilag located at Westend Hotel in Bad Neuenahr to Canada. Berlin censor and Canadian DB 235. There was an unnumbered Ilag established in Military District 12 at Bad Neuenahr, now a suburb of Bad Neuenahr-Ahrweiler, about ten miles south of Bonn. The Ilag operated for <u>only a few days at the Hotel Westend</u>. It opened on OC 23 43 and closed by the end of the month. \$200.00







Item 603-36 – Quebec City to France and to Ghana – 1965, 15¢ Canada Geese tied by Quebec Que machine cancel on cover paying 15¢ airmail letter rate to Marseille, France (b/s). Redirected to a ship in Accra Ghana, unfortunately to a disembarked passenger. Then returned to Quebec. \$25.00 SOLD





Item 603-37 -Request for redirection of mail - 1980, 10¢ Red Dues (30) tied by Quebec Dorchester Sub Office cancel on request for redirection of mail card. \$25.00 SOLD
