




Item 604-01 – <u>Lachute CE (Argenteuil)</u> – 1865, stampless cover from Lachute CE paid 5 to Hazledean CW (today Kanata) via Montreal, Prescott, Ottawa, Bell's Corner manuscript date. \$75.00



Item 604-02 – <u>Bic CE (Rimouski)</u> – 1855, stampless folded letter from Bic CE rated 3d collect to Toronto (b/s) via Quebec (b/s). The note indicates the letter was from Joseph Garon for a land in Rimouski. Bic is a scarce office. \$125.00



Item 604-03 – <u>Sherbrooke LC banking letter</u> – 1858, stampless cover with letter from Sherbrooke LC rated 3d collect to Shefford via Waterloo (b/s) and St. Hyacinthe (Ruggles struck in red). The letter is from counsellor at law George Robertson and relates to banking. \$50.00



Item 604-04 – <u>St. Martin Isle Jesus CE (Laval)</u> – 1861, stampless cover from St. Martin Isle Jesus CE paid 5 to Quebec (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). Rare. \$150.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 604-05 – <u>Oneida UC (Haldimand)</u> – 1872, stampless cover from Oneida UC dated MR 30 72 paid 3 to Seneca (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date for the Oneida Post Office. 1855-1913. \$100.00



Item 604-06 – Niagara UC cross border – 1855, stampless cover with letter mailed in Niagara UC paid 6d to New York State. Canada Paid 10 Cts and Canada arc exchange markings. A boring letter about nothing and everything accompanies. \$100.00

Item 604-07 – A drunken soldier in Marshville UC (1<sup>st</sup> Incorporated Battalion) – 1843, OHMS folded letter from Marshville UC rated 4½d to Hamilton. The letter is addressed to the Adjutant of the 1<sup>st</sup> Incorporated Battalion and reads in part: "I'm afraid the Colonel will think that Fury's name appears rather too often on the defaulters list but the fact is it is the only method I have of keeping him sober, for immediately I release him from drill, he makes a point of getting drunk, he is the only man on the detachment that gives me any trouble". An interesting 19<sup>th</sup> century disciplinary related letter. \$200.00



Item 604-08 – Adam Fergusson - Nelson UC (Halton) – 1836, folded letter datelined Woodhill MY 14 36, mailed in Nelson UC Halton County, rated 7d collect to Chippawa. The letter is signed by Adam Fergusson (farmer, agriculturist, politician, a wealthy magistrate). Fergusson commanded a militia unit a year later during the Rebellion of 1837. The letter is addressed to Samuel Street and relates to business. Very pretty! \$300.00



Item 604-09 – Fredericton oval grid "13" – 1868, 3¢ Large Queen (very fine centering) tied by oval grid 13 on Crown Land Dept cover from Fredericton NB paying 3¢ letter rate to Grand Lake via Gagetown (b/s) and Sheffield. Ex Hargreaves \$200.00

In Dec 1943, 3 camps acquired meter machines (Lethbridge 133, Medicine Hat 132 and Monteith 23). They are very scarce to very rare. A lovely example! \$300.00
