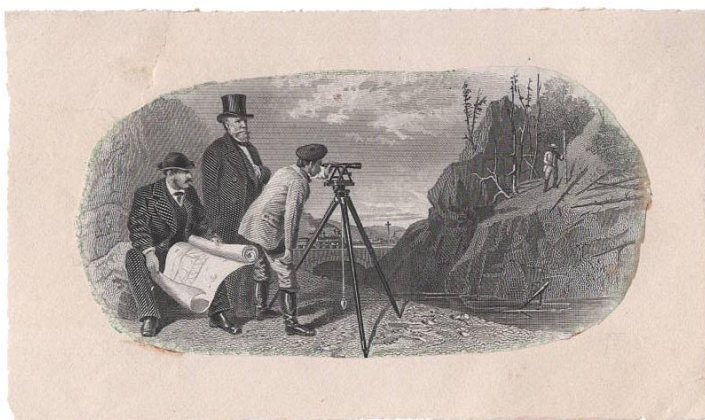
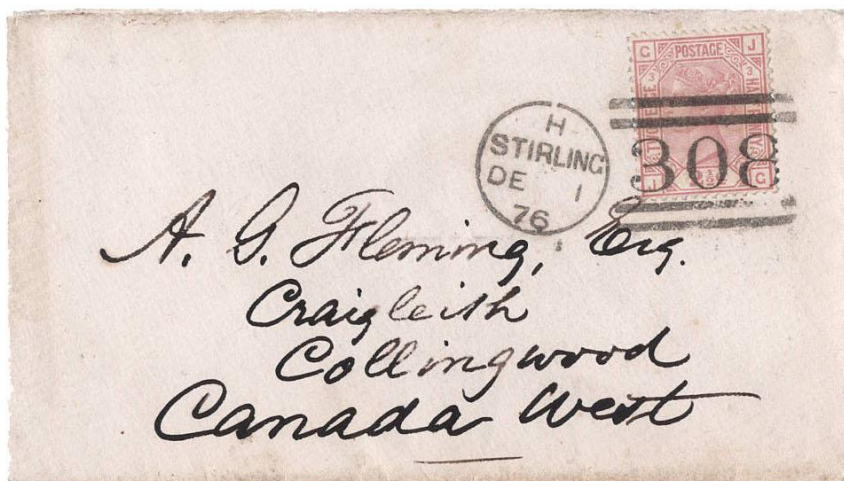

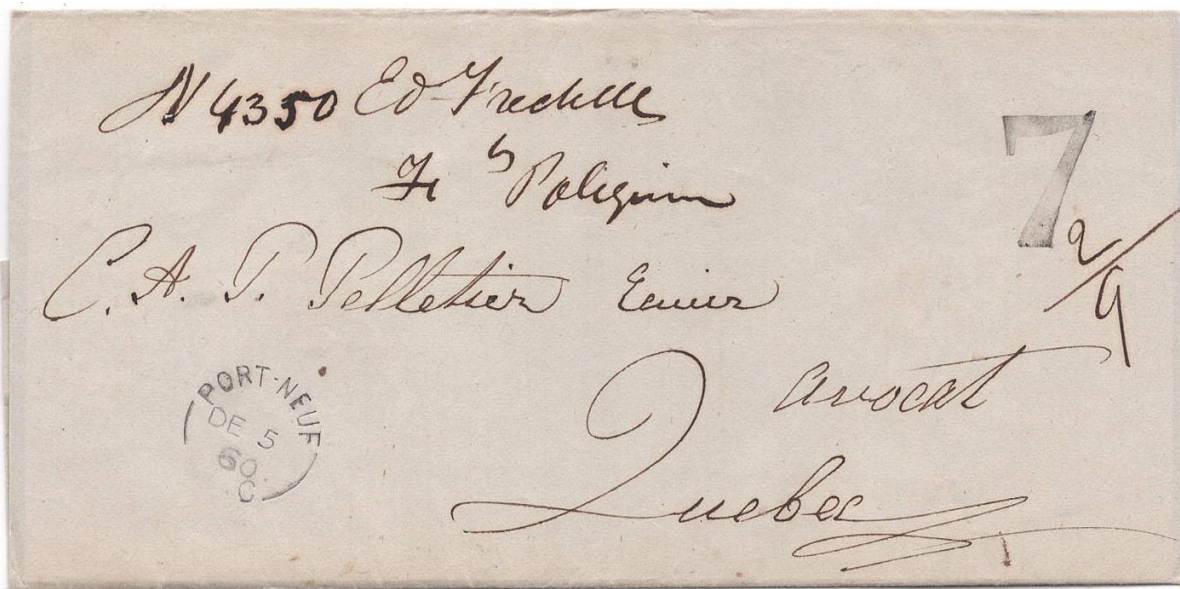




Item 607-01 – **Montreal & Island Pond GTR No.7 (The rare QC-168)** – 1859, stampless cover from Granby CE paid 6 to Boston via St. Hyacinthe (b/s). Carried by Montreal & Island Pond GTR Way No.7 (A, Down), QC-168 RF F (1858-1861). One of the toughest Montreal GTR postmark, early and exhibit quality. \$500.00



Item 607-02 – **Sandford Fleming** – 1859-1876, small lot of Sandford Fleming related: 1859, stampless cover from Craigeith UC with fancy 3D to Sandford Fleming while he was at Northern Railway in Toronto (b/s) via Collingwood. Small print showing Fleming seated with a map surveying. A St. Lawrence Steamboat Co. on account for Northern Railway White River Jct to Concord (Boston) and a cover from Stirling England to Alexander Fleming father of Sandford which was the first Postmaster of Collingwood. Throughout this time, Sandford Fleming was fully employed as a surveyor, mostly for the Grand Trunk Railway. A very elusive lot. \$400.00



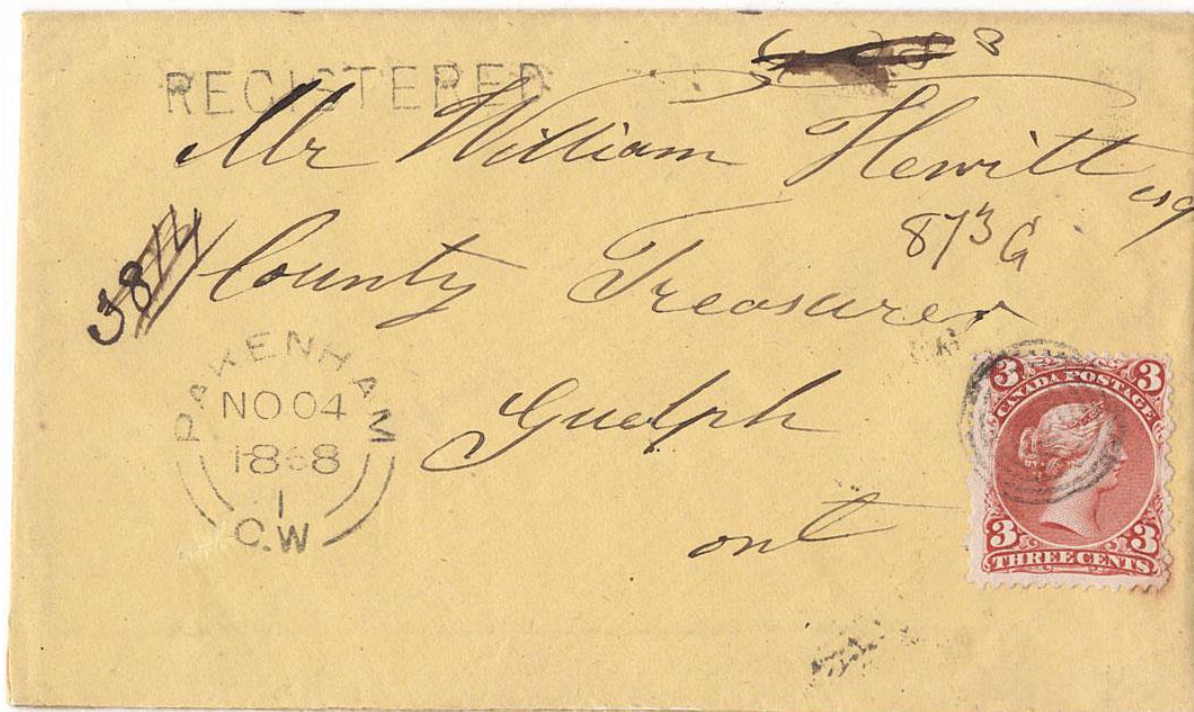

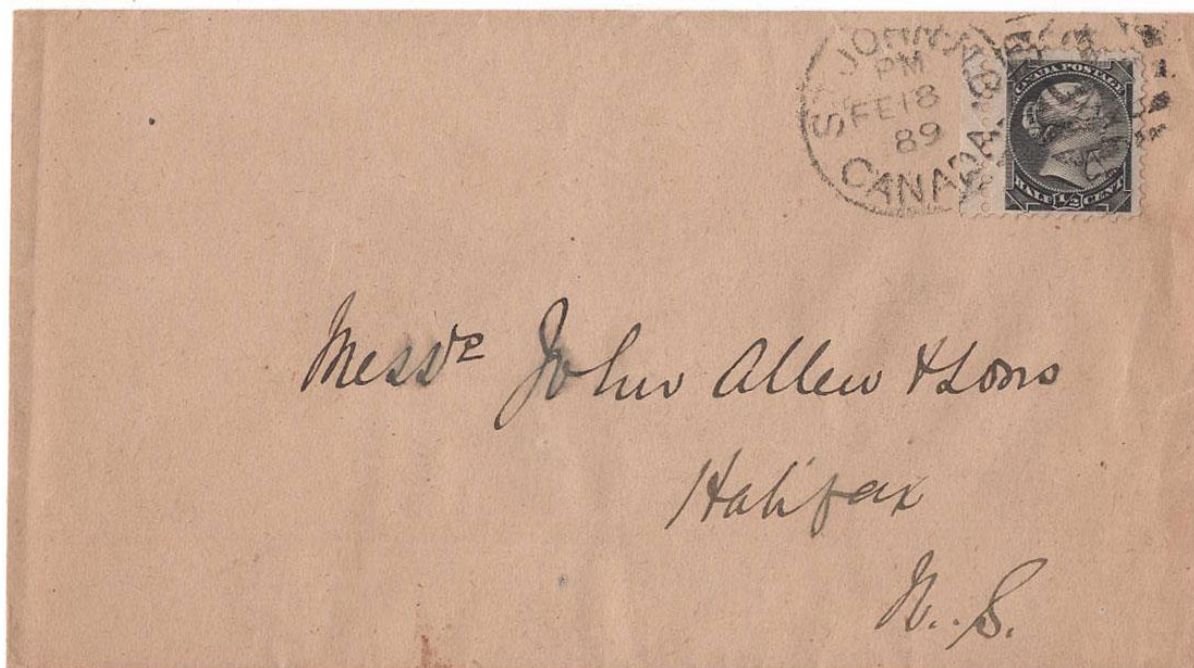

The E&NA Western Extension was built between South Bay immediately west of Saint John and St. Croix on the International Boundary with Maine. A rare track and exhibit quality. \$400.00



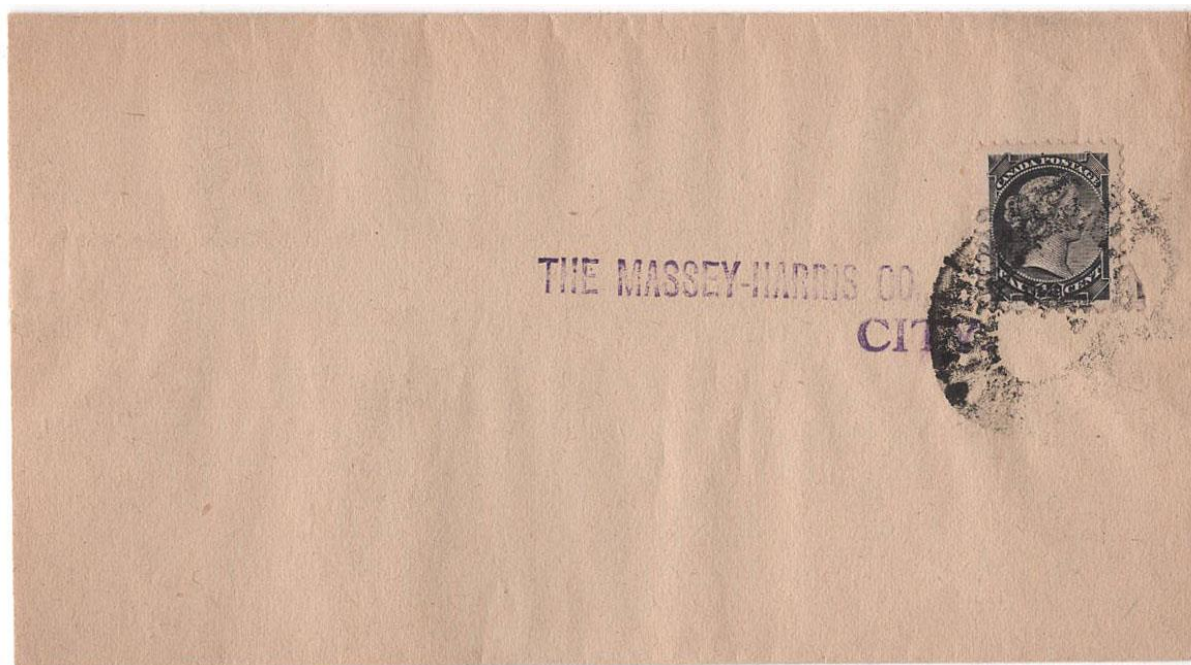

Boxed Registered handstamp. Pontiac County. \$300.00

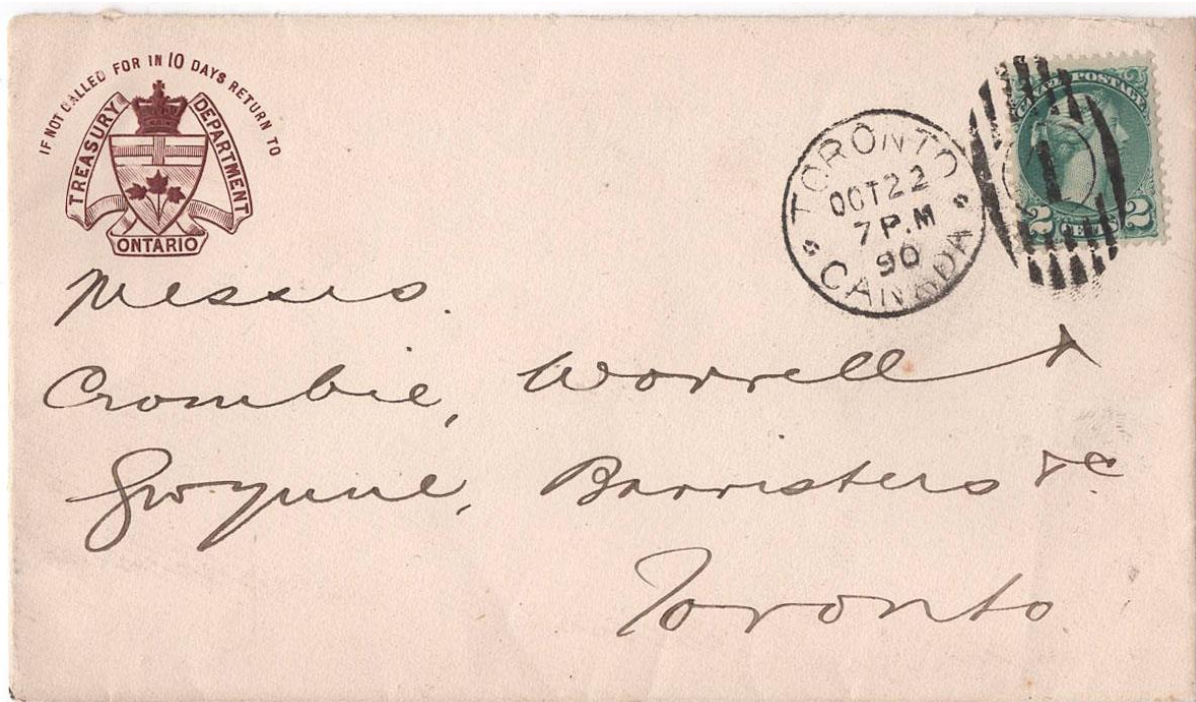

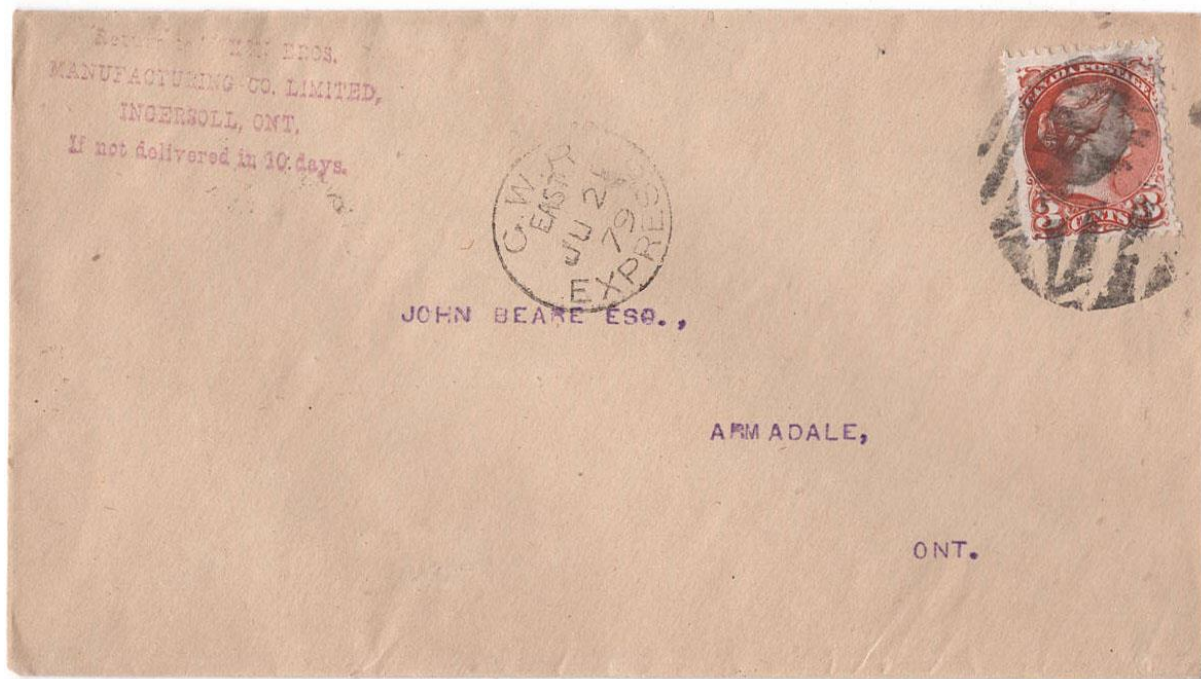

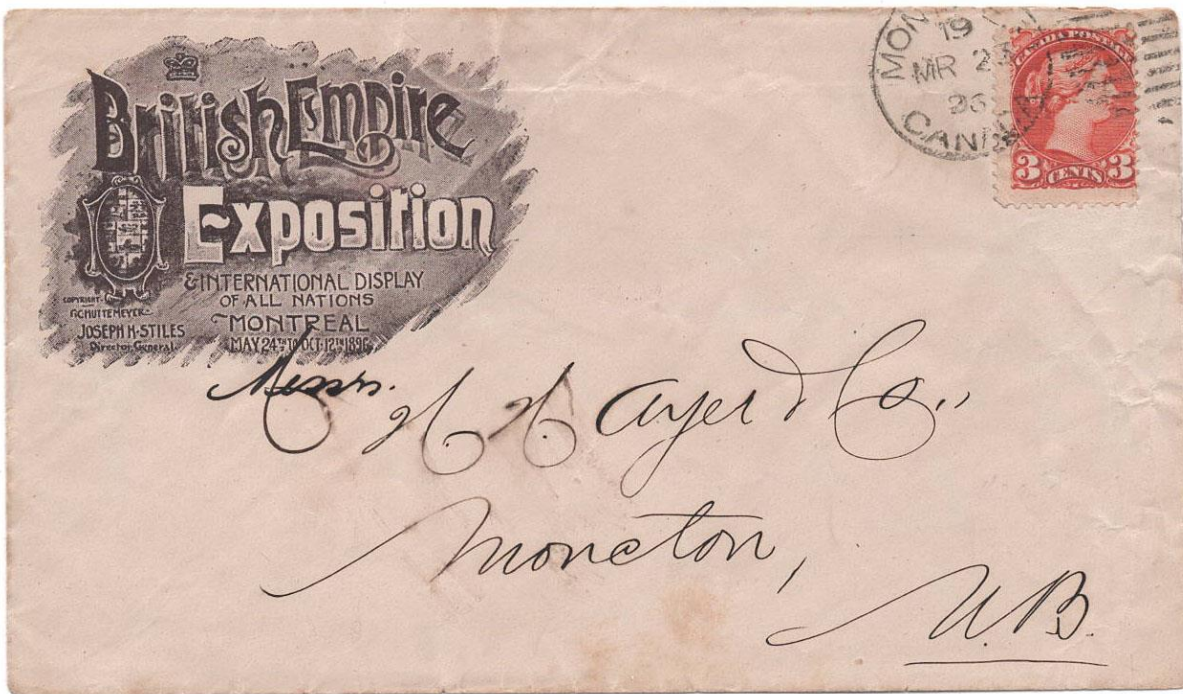
Item 607-09 – **The new 4th class matter rate** – 1900, 2¢ SQ tied by Toronto parcel cancel on Robert Simpson Co. 5th Class Matter cover paying the new 4th class matter 1¢ per oz rate to Bobcaygeon. Enclosure accompanies both dated DE 22 00. From 1888 to 1898, the 5th class matter was 1¢ per oz. This class was for miscellaneous matter and small articles of ordinary goods of all descriptions not belonging to parcel post or the other classes. The mail had to be unsealed for examination. On January 1899, the name was changed to 4th class, the old fourth class sealed parcel post was discontinued. A spectacular rate cover! \$400.00 **SOLD**



Item 607-10 – **Toronto 2¢ drop letter rate** – 1890, 2¢ SQ bleu green tied by Toronto duplex 1 cancel on Ontario Treasury Department c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate (with free carrier service). Ex Lindemann. \$35.00 **SOLD**



Item 607-11 – **An early GWR Express and fancy cancel** – 1879, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Ingersoll Ont, mailed on GWR Express East, paying 3¢ letter rate to Armadale (Unionville b/s). In 1879, GWR declared Express Train services. This RPO postmark is recorded from MY 5 79 to DE 1 88. A very early example. \$100.00



Item 607-12 – **British Empire Exposition in Montreal** – 1896, 3c SQ tied by Montreal duplex cancel on British Empire Exposition of all Nations advertising cover paying 3c letter rate to Moncton (b/s). Reverse with J.L. Cassidy & Co. c/c. An outstanding and rare exposition cover. \$250.00 **SOLD**



Item 607-13 – **GNW Telegraph Company - 10c SQ to England** – 1884, 10c SQ bright rose lilac (Montreal p12) tied by Toronto duplex cancel on Great North Western Telegraph Company advertising cover paying 10c double UPU letter rate to London, England (b/s). Light reduction at right. \$500.00



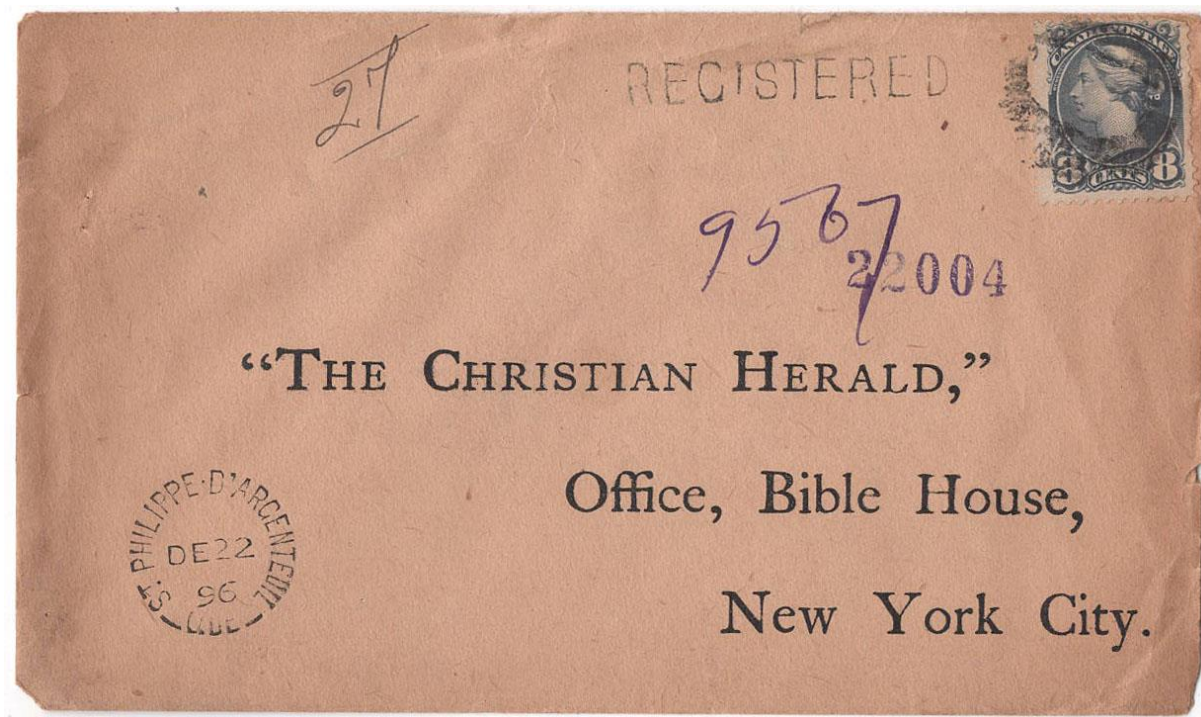

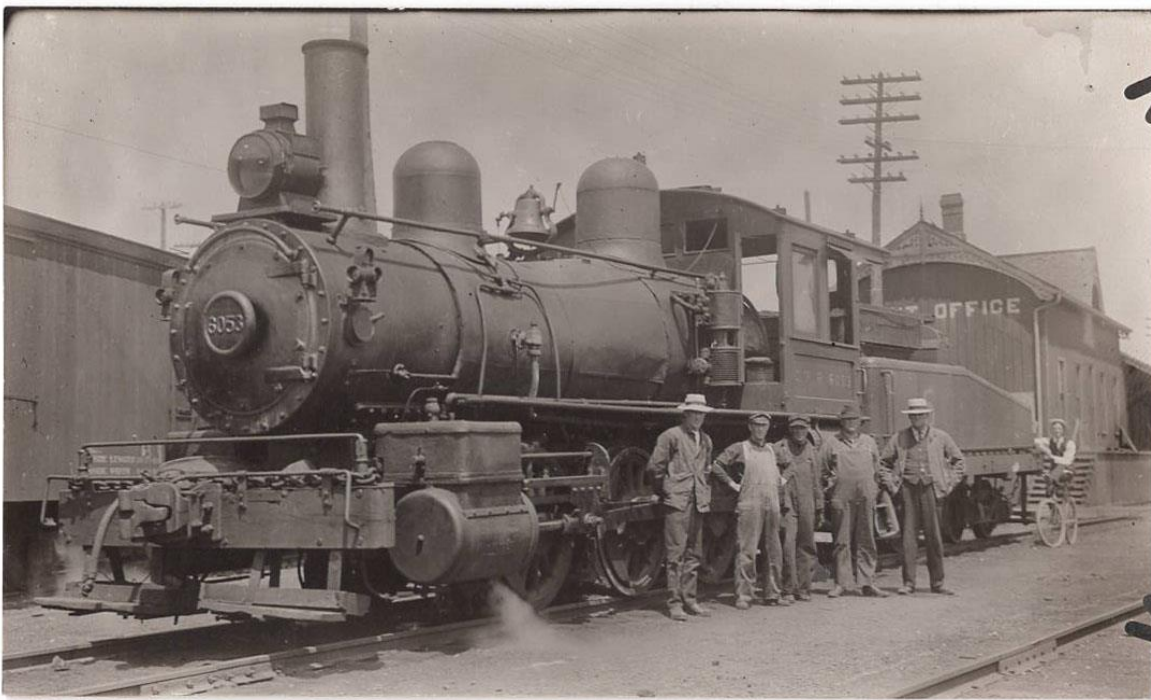
Item 607-28 – **John Bruce Seeds sample covers** – 1907, two John Bruce Seeds sample post return covers both from Tottenham Ont paying 2¢ sample post rate to Hamilton. These are interesting because they show the other side of the seed and bulb business story. Presumably from a Tottenham seed grower or a small specialize nursery offering species to Bruce. This pair of covers are the only two that I have seen for Bruce and decided to keep them together. A rare rate for seeds and required to any seed or sample rate collection. \$150.00 **SOLD**



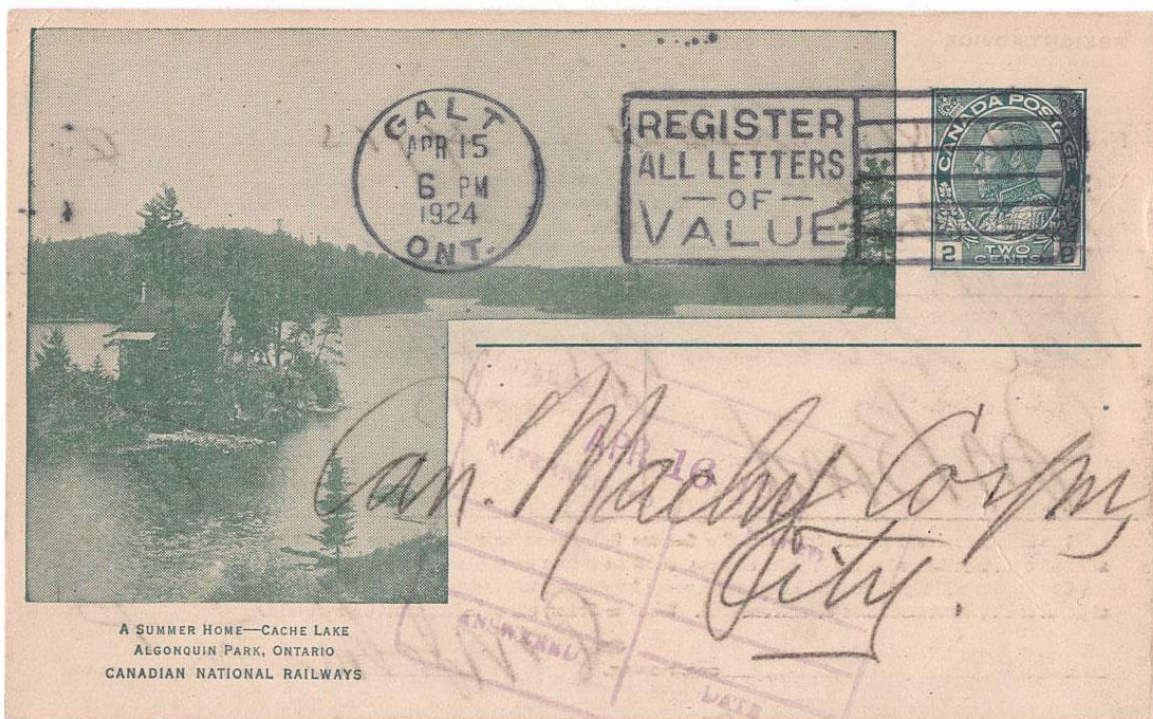
Item 607-29 – **Edward VII 1¢ on 2¢ wrapper postally used** – 1908-1910, 1¢ on 2¢ Carmine Edward VII wrapper cancelled by grid cancel paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Syracuse NY, U.States. Produced by American Bank Note Co. Ottawa, these wrappers were for publisher's newspaper for US mailings. When the 1¢/lb rate was increased to 1¢ / 4 ounces on 7 May 1907, the 2¢ and 3¢ wrappers were required. The newspaper lobby was strong enough to have the increase rescinded in February 1908, accordingly the 2¢ and 3¢ values were surcharged to 1¢. Webb \$40. Price \$75.00 **SOLD**



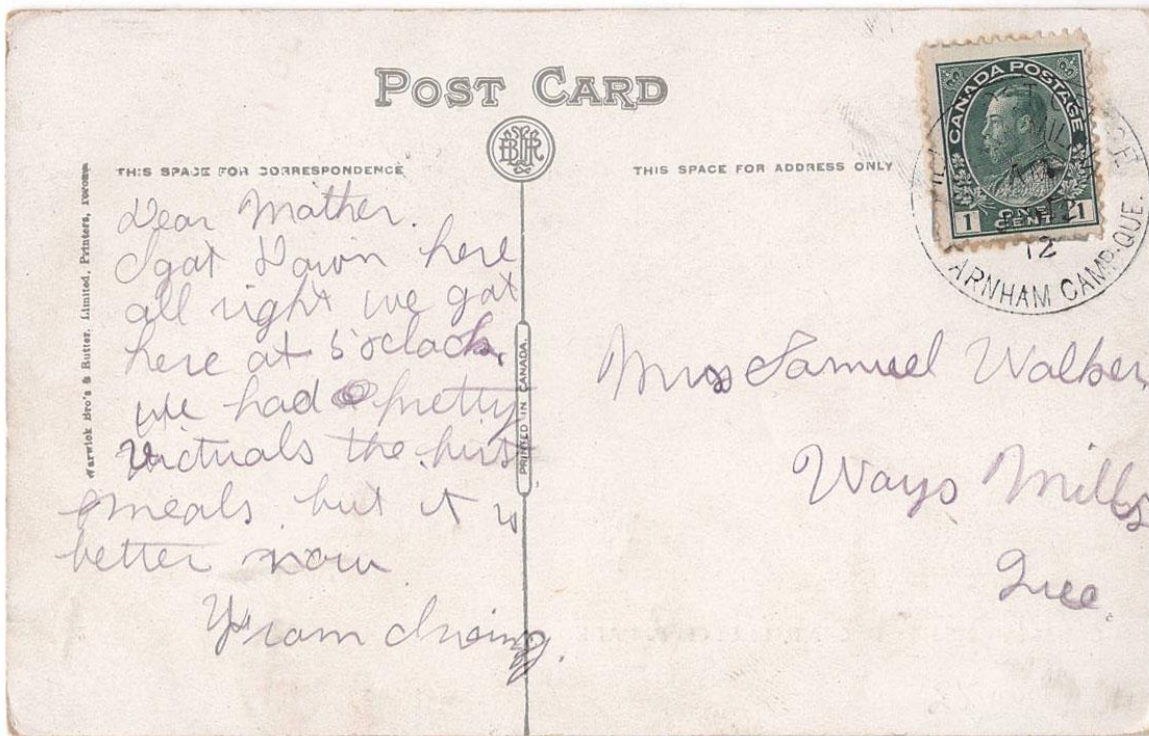

After sailing to England in November 1916, the battn was absorbed into the 23rd Reserve Battn. The 133rd was disbanded on July 17, 1917. \$100.00



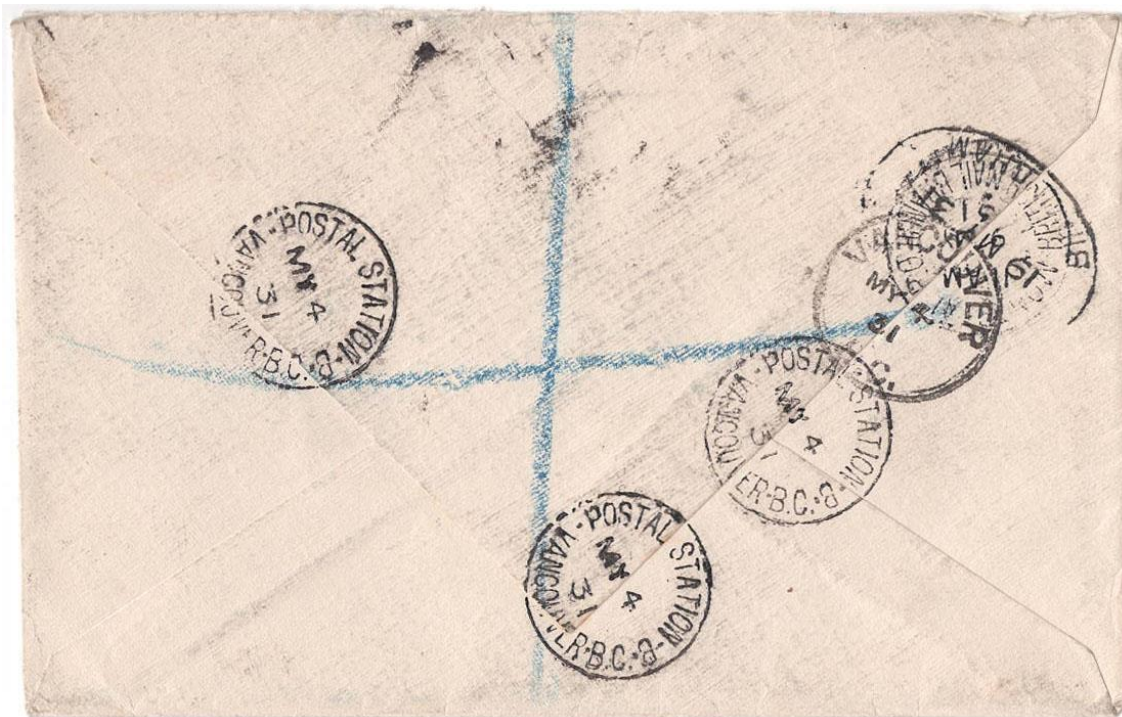

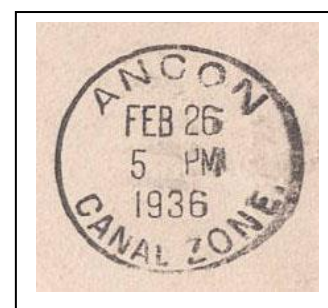

The 3¢ Scroll was issued on DE 12 28 and its purpose was to pay the 3¢ per ounce first class rate to Empire countries. On DE 25 28, the rate to Empire countries returned to 2¢ per ounce as the War tax was removed so the last date of the rate the stamp was issued to pay is DE 24 28. These blocks that we see on covers once in a while are Post Office left over, they had nothing else to do with them than using them in blocks. \$75.00 **SOLD**



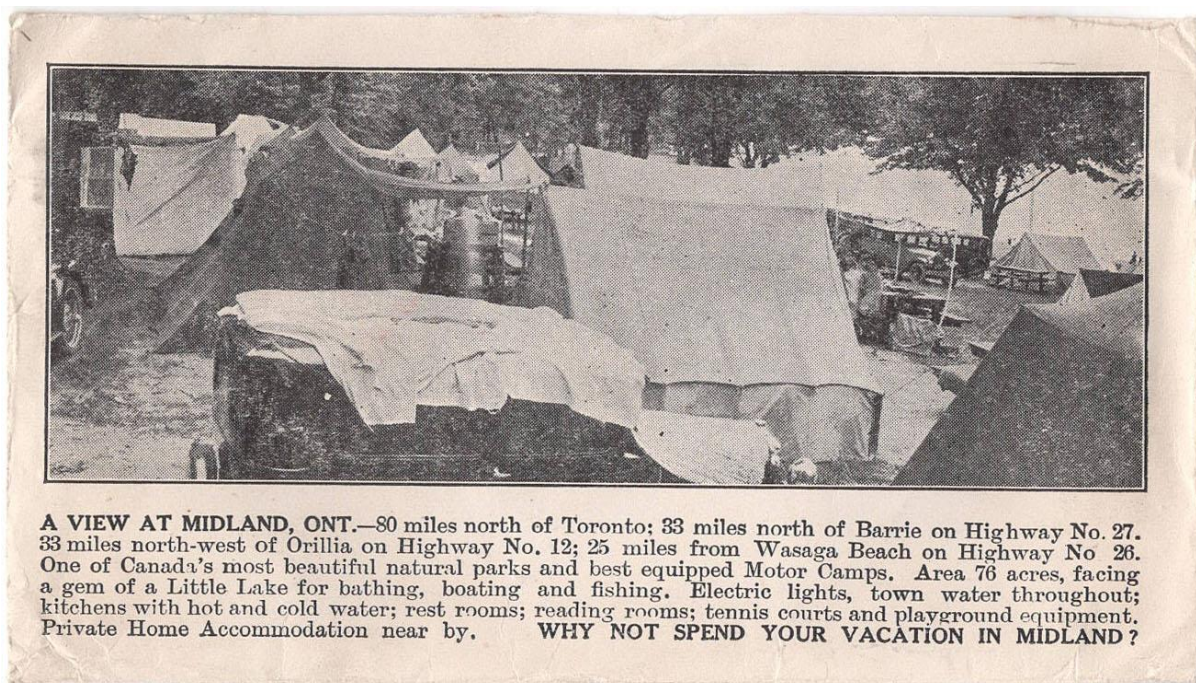
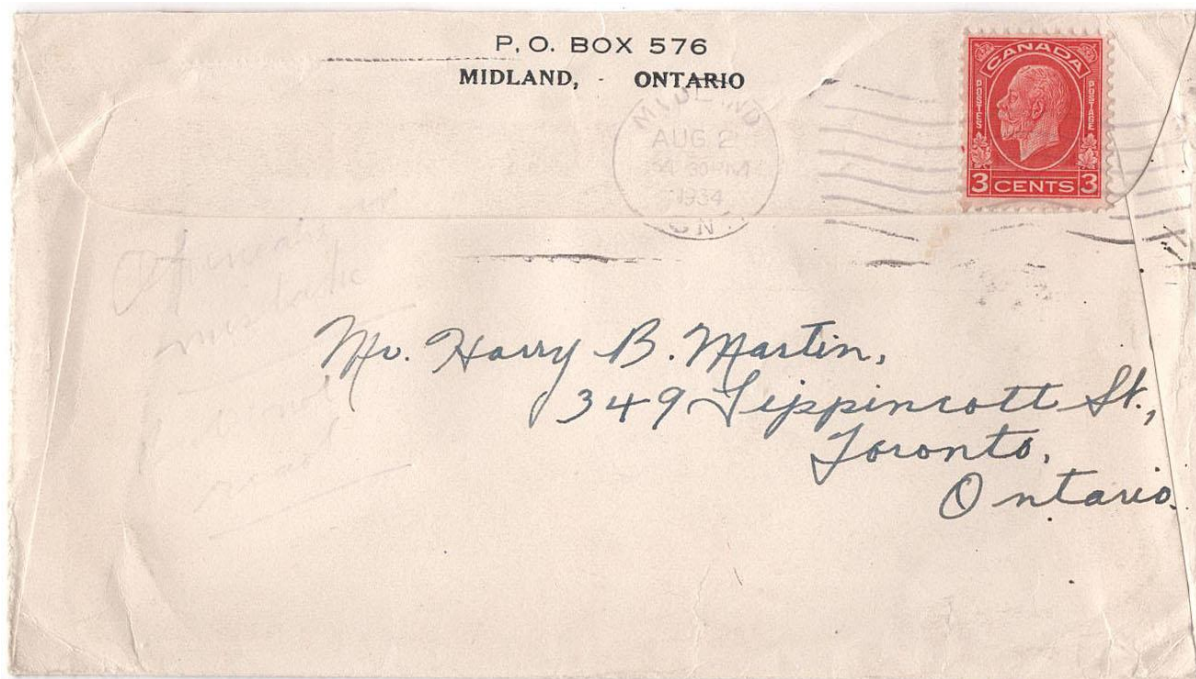
