Item 608-05 – The unique Niagara UC with a 'buckle' in middle for date – 1837, Bank of Upper Canada promissory note mailed from Niagara, dated OC 6 37, rated 4½d collect to Chippawa. This double circle with a 'buckle' in middle for date is the only recorded example. \$500.00



Item 608-06 – <u>Thorold Notary and Accountant</u> – 1861, stampless cover with Mawdesley Notary and Accountant advertising c/c from Thorold UC paid 5 to Brantford (b/s). Carried by GWR (b/s). Business letter accompanies. \$125.00



Item 608-07 – <u>December letter to Quebec via Halifax</u> – 1844, Morrison family letter mailed unpaid from Glasgow to Quebec. Endorsed "per Steamer via Halifax", rated 1/4 Currency collect. Carried by the Cunard Acadia from Liverpool (DE 5 44) to Halifax (DE 19 44). Possibly then overland to Pictou and carried by the Unicorn to Quebec. After entering service with Cunard, the Unicorn initially sailed along the Halifax-Pictou-Quebec route before switching to Liverpool-Halifax-Boston route. Pretty! \$150.00

Carried by Aeroplane Airpost service per Royal Air Force (RFC Canada), return flight from Ottawa. Reverse with black and red, Aero Club of Canada, Air Post semi-official CLP2 stamp (not tied, uncancelled as many are). Despite the tear and a faulty stamp, it is still a useful cover for an exhibit. Unitrade \$5,500, AAMC 7th Edition 8 recorded covers US\$6,000.00. Price \$850.00 SOLD

Source AAMC 7th Edition p26-27: This same day, a round-trip flight was made by Lt Edward. He departed Leaside in Toronto in the morning, refueled in Deseronto and arrived at Rockcliffe Ranges Ottawa. Then, Burton departed Ottawa on the return flight, refueled at Deseronto and arrived Leaside at dinner time. Less than 40 covers are recorded with CLP1 and CLP2. Only 8 recorded covers on this return flight.

Per ardua ad astra is a Latin phrase meaning "through adversity to the stars or through struggle to the stars that is the official motto of the Royal Air Force and other Commonwealth air forces such as the Royal Australian Air Force and Royal New Zealand Air Force, as well as the Royal Indian Air Force until 1947. The Royal Canadian Air Force used it until 1968, when it adopted the motto sic itur ad astra, a similar phrase meaning "such is the pathway to the stars". It dates from 1912, when it was adopted by the newly formed Royal Flying Corps.
