Then, 1¢ UPU printed matter rate to Norway, some scarce Quebec markings including a Carrier Head Office No.2 type 1, advertising covers including Western Fair, GTR, Bulova cards and general postal history. 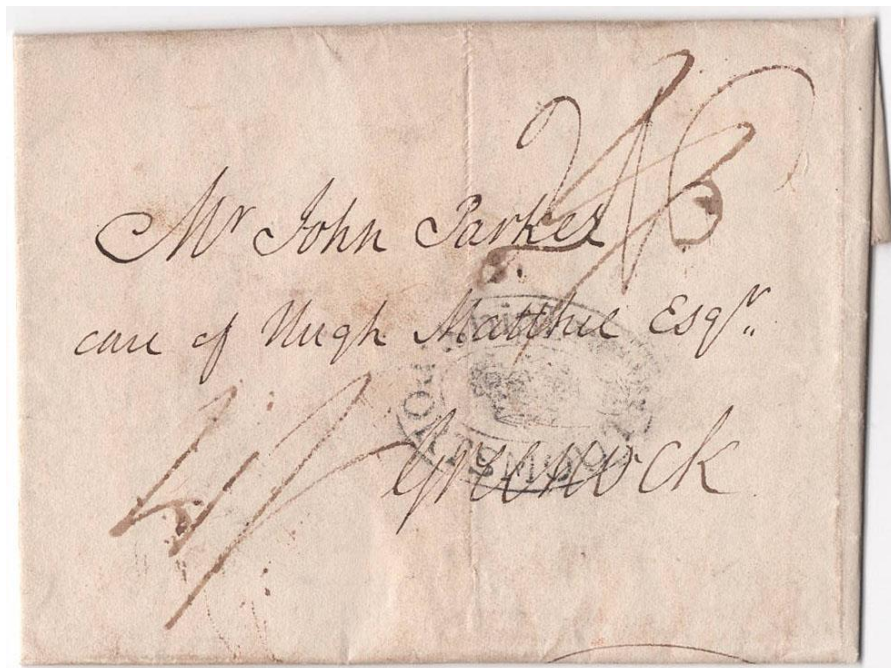




Item 610-01 – **Allan Line "Indian" By-Canadian / Packet** – 1858, business letter from Toronto to Kirkby Stephen, England. Toronto CW Paid cds and charge box account to drawer 793. Paid 6d Stg and carried by the Allan Line Indian to Liverpool. By-Canada / Packet in red applied in Liverpool to explain the lower rate. Liverpool Pkt Letter Paid on front. Very scarce and pretty!. \$400.00



Item 610-02 – **Wallaceburg UC lady cover to Scotland** – 1857, stampless lady cover from Wallaceburg UC paid 10 (8d Stg) to Ballindalloch, Scotland (b/s). Routed via Chatham and Hamilton (b/s). Carried by Cunard Niagara via Boston departing JY 15 57 and arriving JY 26 57. Liverpool Pkt letter on front. Kent County. \$300.00



Item 610-03 – **Quebec to Scotland – Ship Letter Crown Portsmouth** – 1801, business letter from Quebec to Greenock Scotland. Sent by private ship and rated at one half the prevailing packet rate plus inland postage. The letter was likely carried in a convoy under naval escort during the Napoleonic Wars, entered in England at Portsmouth with double oval Ship Letter Crown Portsmouth. Then sent from London to Greenock via Edinburgh. Initially rated 2/6 Sterling and crossed out as the distance from Quebec to Halifax, the summer packet, was over 600 miles making the rate 1/6 plus 1/ packet postage. But the letter was sent through Burlington Vermont, to New York and to London. The inland postage within GB from London to Greenock via Edinburgh is 1/. Final postage due 2/2 Sterling. The letter is from Lymburner and Crawford, leading merchants at Quebec. \$500.00



Item 610-04 – **Ireland to Kingston UC (1/4 Cy locally made)** – 1841, family letter from Strabane Ireland to Kingston UC. Rated 1/2 Stg, 1/4 Currency collect (believed to be of local manufacture, without d, Cy, listed as Arnell A-11 1840-1). Carried by Cunard Columbia from Liverpool to Halifax (19 OC 41). The letter is addressed to *Kingstown UC North America, to the care of Phillip Brewer Sixt Consession of the Twp of Kingstown for Mathew Jackson*. A great strike of this obscure 1/4 Currency rate marking. For the specialist. \$250.00



Item 610-05 – **Quebec locally made 1/4 Currency (Arnell A-11)** – 1841, family letter from Chelsea London to Frampton LC via Quebec. Rated 1/2 Sterling and 1/4 Currency collect (*likely that this early handstamp was locally made, without d, Cy, listed as Arnell A-11, 1840-1*). Carried by Cunard Caledonia on her 4th voyage (Liverpool MY 4 41, Halifax MY 15 41). Arrived at Quebec and forwarded to Frampton. A great strike of this seldom seen 1/4 Currency rate marking. For the specialist. \$250.00



Item 610-06– **York UC – Ship Letter St. Mawes** – 1833, family folded letter from York Up Can to London England. Paid 9d to the line and 25¢ to New York. Carried by private trader from New York, entered in England as ship letter in St. Mawes rated 1/8 collect in London. Reverse with unusual wax seal showing embossed portrait. St Mawes is a village on the end of the Roseland Peninsula, in the eastern side of Falmouth Harbour, south coast of Cornwall. An exceedingly rare Ship Letter on a Canadian letter. A real wow transatlantic piece of mail. \$1,000.00



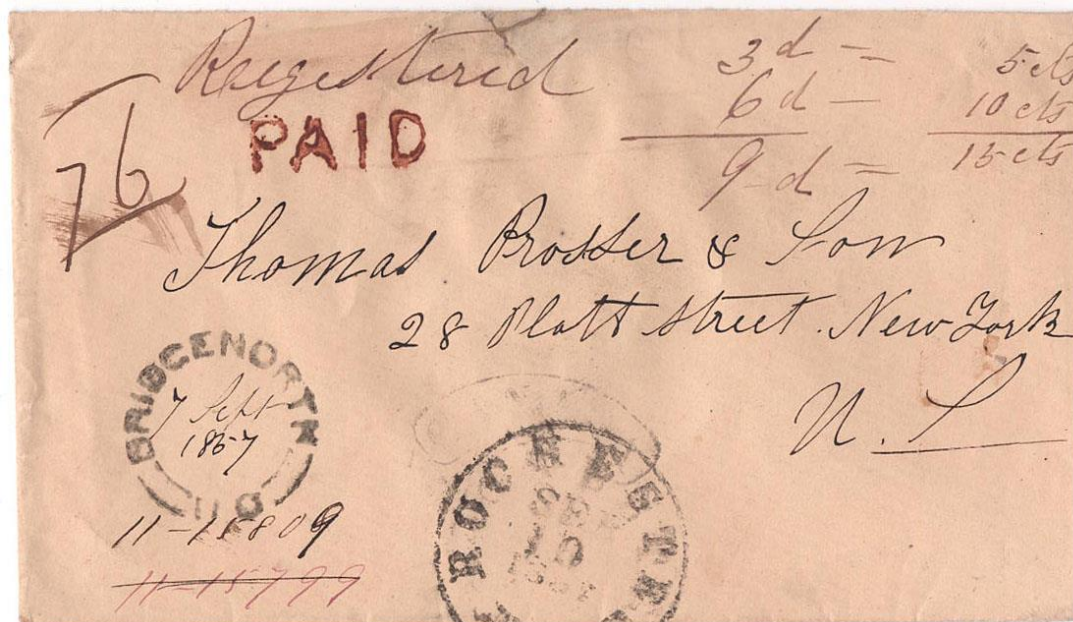
Item 610-07 – **Single-line British Postage** – 1829, family letter from Rochester NY to Vittoria UC through Niagara. Oval Rochester New York, Niagara double circle along with the rare single-line italic “British Postage”, all struck in red. Rated double 12½, plus 2d ferriage across the Niagara River, 1/6 BNA postage total 1/8. The single-line “British Postage” exchange marking was used at Niagara in 1829 to 1830 only. The letter is from Christopher Graham to his wife Ann, enclosing \$5. A rare example of this italic handstamp used to denote the Canadian postage due on a letter with prepaid US postage. \$500.00



Item 610-08 – **Philadelphia to Montreal (William Molson)** – 1844, written statement and oath letter from Philadelphia to Montreal, paid 25¢ to the line and 4½d collect to Montreal. The letter is addressed to William Molson, son of John Molson. \$100.00



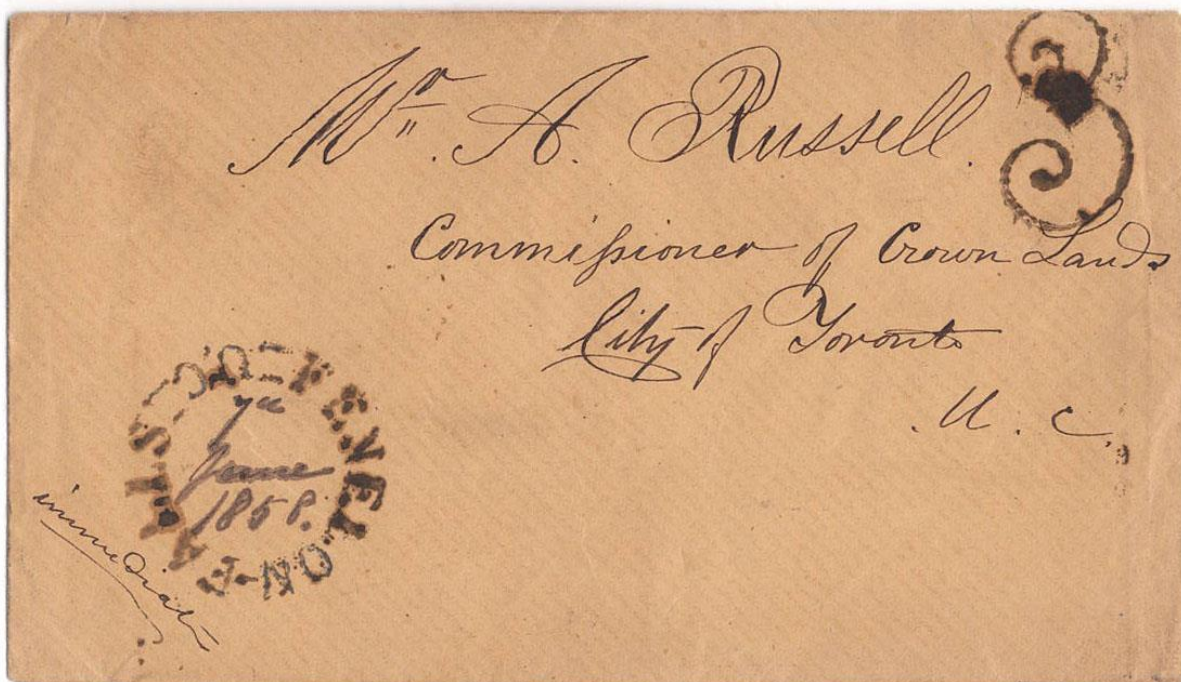
Item 610-09 – **Discovery Preston UC manuscript postmark to Ohio, U.States** – 1839, folded letter written in German from Preston UC, manuscript postmark dated 17 AP 39, discovery copy and the only recorded example, paid 7d to the lines and 25¢ collect to Ohio (400 miles +). In the 1800's a group of German speaking Mennonites from Pennsylvania arrived in the Waterloo County area and purchased land. What eventually became Preston stated as a large settlement on the north side of the Speed River. There were only 250 inhabitants in 1836. The City of Canton Ohio lies on the edge of Ohio's extensive Amish Country. It appears likely the writer and recipient were part of the initial German Amish/Mennonite settlers. \$750.00



Item 610-10 – **Fully prepaid Bridgenorth UC registered to U.S.** – 1857, stampless registered cover from Bridgenorth UC fully prepaid registered letter rate to New York via Rochester. 6d letter rate plus 3d registration total 9d converted to 15¢ US. Canada arc exchange marking. Peterboro and Cobourg transit (b/s). A very early and elusive registered cover to U.S. \$500.00



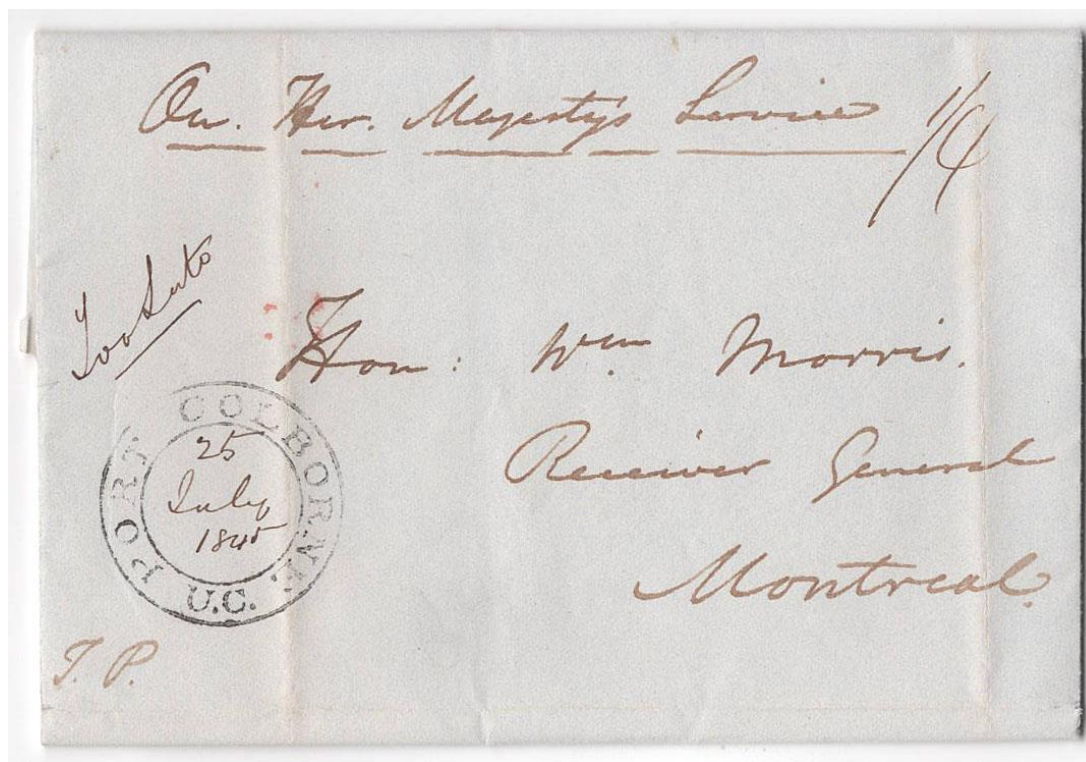
Item 610-11 – **West Williamsbug UC money letter** – 1844, business money letter datelined Martintown AU 3 44 mailed from West Williamsburg UC (double circle, Dundas office, closed in 1851), paid 2/3 triple 9d to Montreal (b/s). Likely the letter went to Kingston and then went by steamer to Montreal. Ex Harrison. \$200.00



Item 610-12 – **Fenelon Falls UC (Victoria County)** – 1858, stampless cover from Fenelon Falls UC, one of two 30.5mm hammers, rated 3d collect to Toronto (b/s) via Lindsay (b/s). \$75.00




Item 610-13 – **Toronto registered to St. Jacobs** – 1868, stampless registered cover from Toronto to St. Jacob's, fancy and seldom encountered "Paid 5", registered straightline, paying 5¢ letter rate plus 2¢ registry fee. Berlin transit (b/s), St. Jacob's in blue (b/s). A late Decimal era cover. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 610-14 – **Port Colborne UC (Welland)** – 1845, OHMS Customs House folded letter from Port Colborne UC, mailed too late, double circle in black 25 JY 45, rated 1/4 collect to Montreal. \$100.00



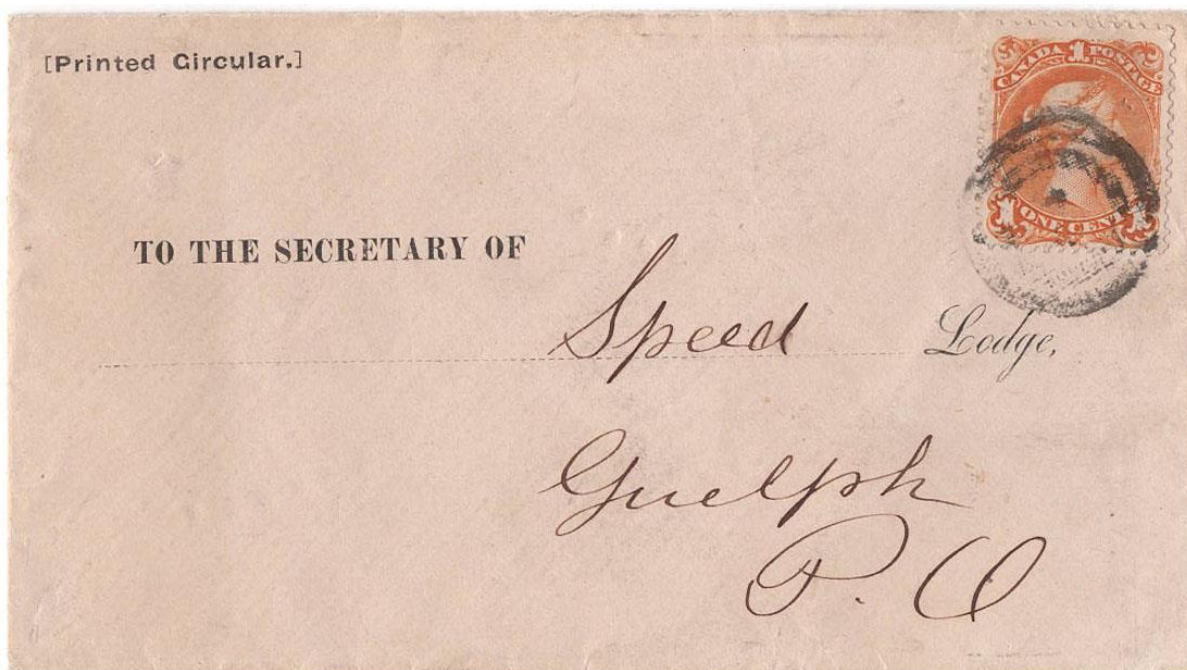

Great markings including Canada arc exchange, all in red. VGG cert dated 2016, genuine. Exhibit quality. \$1,500.00



Cracked plate with line in C of Cent called "The apostrophe" variety. Crack noticeable through D in Canada and through design as well.

BREADSTUFFS FOR 1870.

From Daily Morning News, March 15th.

On a subject of such vital importance to the people of this Province as the supply of breadstuffs, we need offer no apology for transcribing to our columns some extracts from the *Toronto Globe's* annual report upon the grain trade of the past year. And first, as to the productiveness of the crop of 1869, this authority says:—

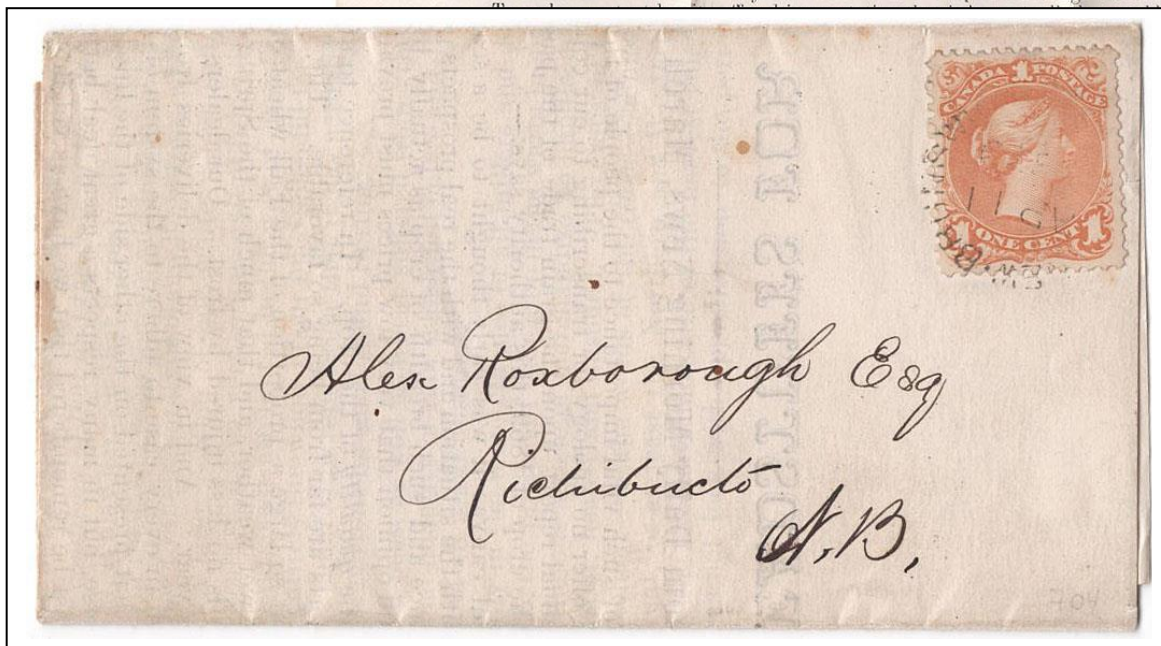
From a careful canvas it was early thought to be a season of fine promise, and further acquaintance with the situation and with the real prospects of the cereal year revealed such universal abundance and such breadth of crop as actually to astonish the world, and confirm every one in the opinion that very low prices must prevail.

So much for the *quantity* of the crop. In reference to an equally important item—the *quality*—the reports are far from being so favorable. The *Toronto Globe* says:—

We regret that so large a proportion of the Fall wheat of the North and west has suffered from rust, and wet weather, and that much of the Spring wheat in the poorer, and more inland townships is no less injured by frost. Our dealers will have to look sharply after their samples this year. And in view of the deliveries from the remote interior, we would recommend them in every case to adhere to the system of inspection. In contrasting the situation with that presented on the other side of the line, we may congratulate ourselves that it is not worse, but in many respects a great deal better than we there see. *

* * * * * It must be remembered that we have as yet manufactured only a portion, and that the best portion of last year's crop, and as there could hardly be a more striking contrast than between the condition of that and the crop of the preceding year, which was almost as good as kilndried, it may happen that if great care is not observed in future grinding we may have a repetition of the losses from souring and heating which we had in former years—and much worse, a blow to the reputation of our flour from which it may take long to recover. * * * * * A large portion of our white wheat suffered from the plague of smut, which, in former years, had to a very serious extent injured its reputation. It is surprising that so little has yet been attempted in the way of arresting the spread of this evil which threatens to ruin entirely the whole of our once splendid foreign trade in white wheat.
