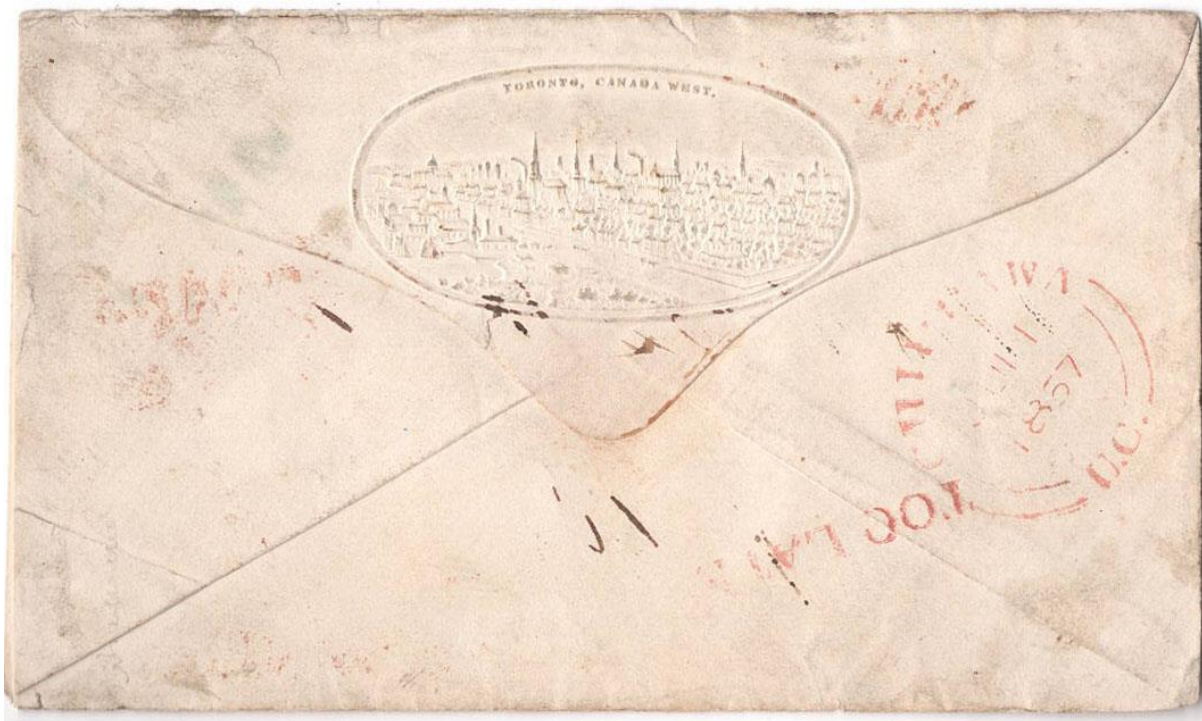




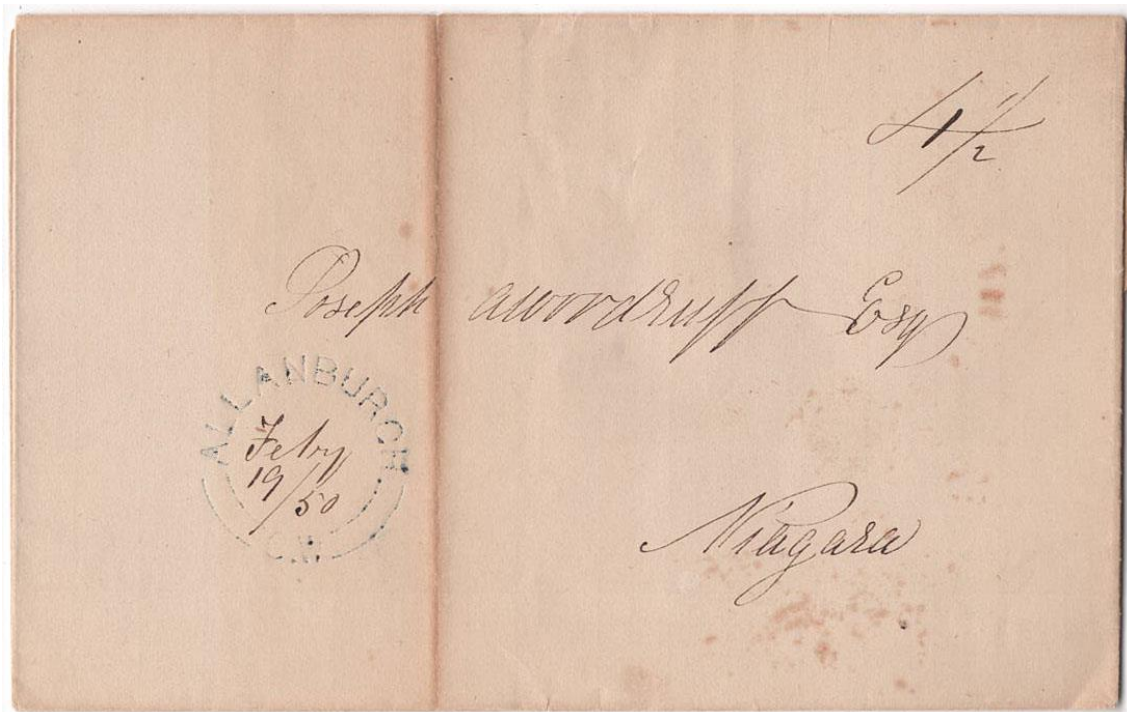
Item 612-01 – **Pelham UC money letter (Welland, closed in 1856)** – 1853, money letter from Pelham UC rated 3d collect to Guelph (b/s) via Canboro and Hamilton (b/s). The letter relates to a tax payment for two lands, signed in Port Robinson by John Wamsley. A rare one and exhibit quality!. \$275.00



Item 612-02 – **Point Abino UC (Welland, closed in 1874)** – 1871, folded letter from Point Abino UC rated 4 ½d collect to Fonthill Pelham via Port Robinson and Port Colborne (*double circles*). The letter relates to election within the Niagara School District in Bertie Township. Very scarce and a few exist. \$200.00



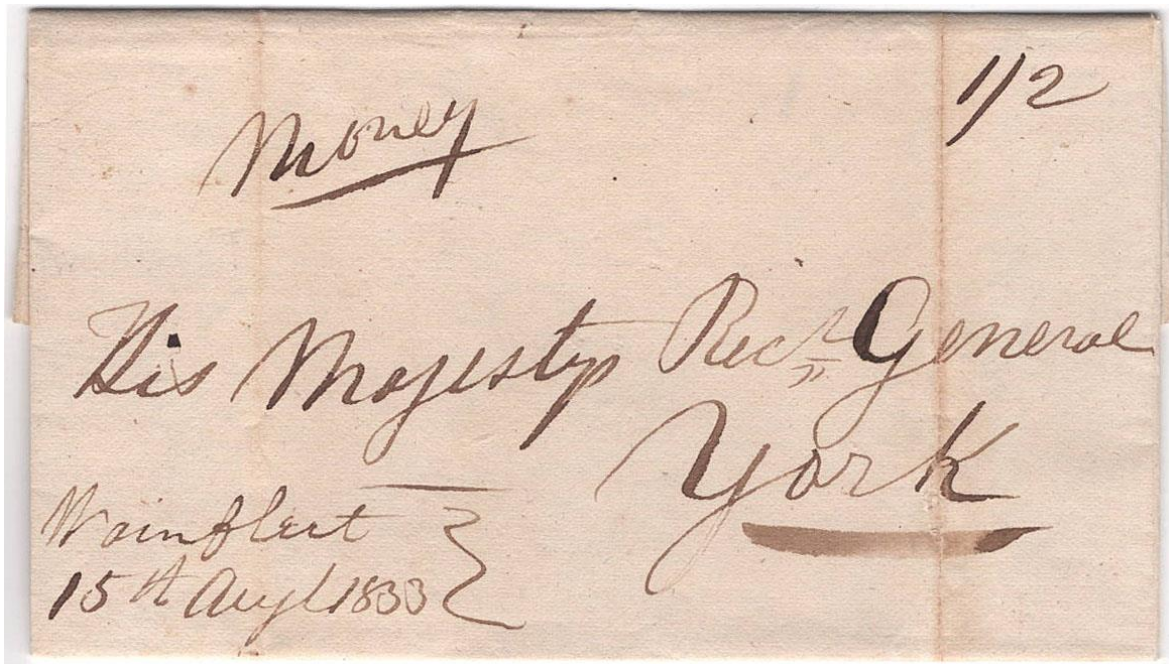
Item 612-03 – **Montrose UC – a new discovery (Welland)** – 1857, stampless cover from Montrose UC, manuscript date JU 11 57, paid 6d paying the cross border rate to Pennsylvania. Canada Paid 10 cts exchange marking. Routed via Chippawa with “too late” (b/s). An amazing use of a transit too late marking. Embossed Toronto town view illustrated. This Montrose UC hammer is a new discovery and the only reported example. \$450.00



Item 612-04 – **Allanburgh CW 1848-1850 (Welland)** – 1850, stampless cover from Allanburgh CW, struck in blue and dated FE 19 50. Rated 4½d collect to Niagara (b/s) via St. Catharines (b/s). A tough one recorded from 1848 to 1850 only, a beauty! \$200.00



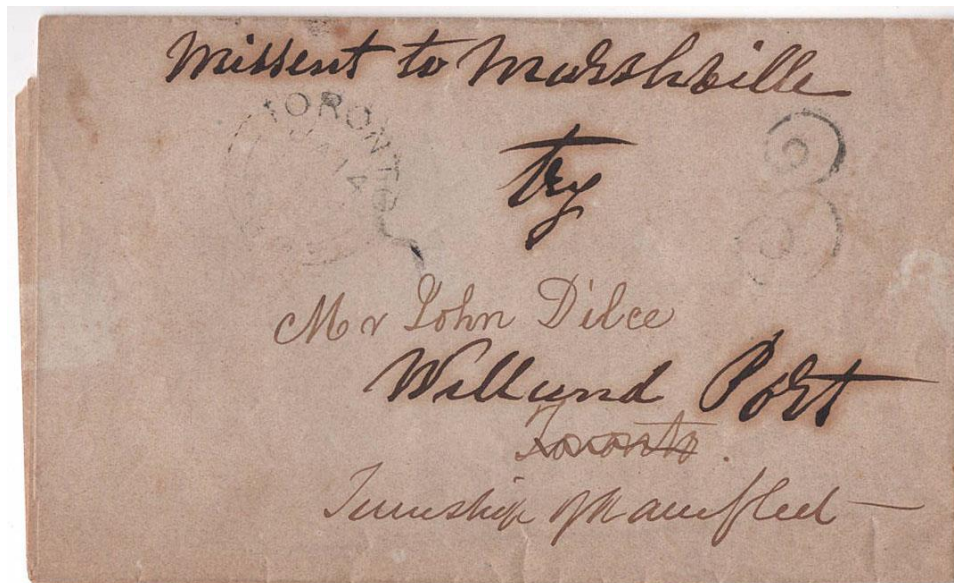
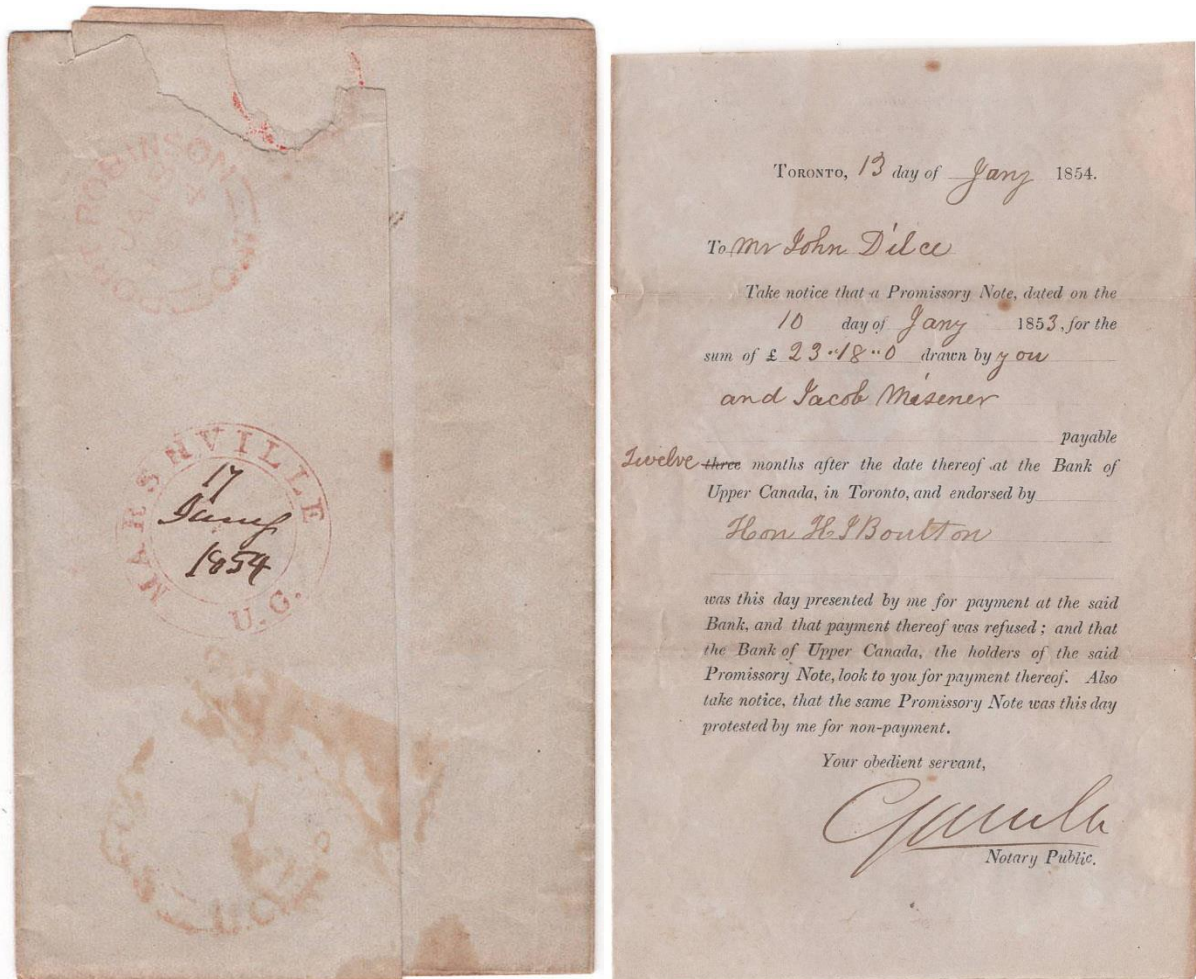
Item 612-05 – **New York to Chippawa (Welland)** – 1843, 3-page letter from New York to Falls, Chippawa via Queenston. Paid 25¢ to the lines and 4½d collect in Chippawa. The letter is addressed to Thomas Street (1814-1872), lawyer, businessman and political figure in Ontario. He was the son of Samuel Street. He served as a lieutenant-colonel in the local militia and served as president of the Niagara Falls Suspension Bridge Company and Gore Bank. \$100.00



Item 612-06 – **Wainfleet UC 1832-1833 (Welland)** - 1833, money letter from Wainfleet UC, manuscript postmark 15 AU 33, rated 1/2 collect to York (double 7d). The letter is signed by D. Thompson, Postmaster in Wainfleet. This is only the 3rd example that I have seen. \$400.00



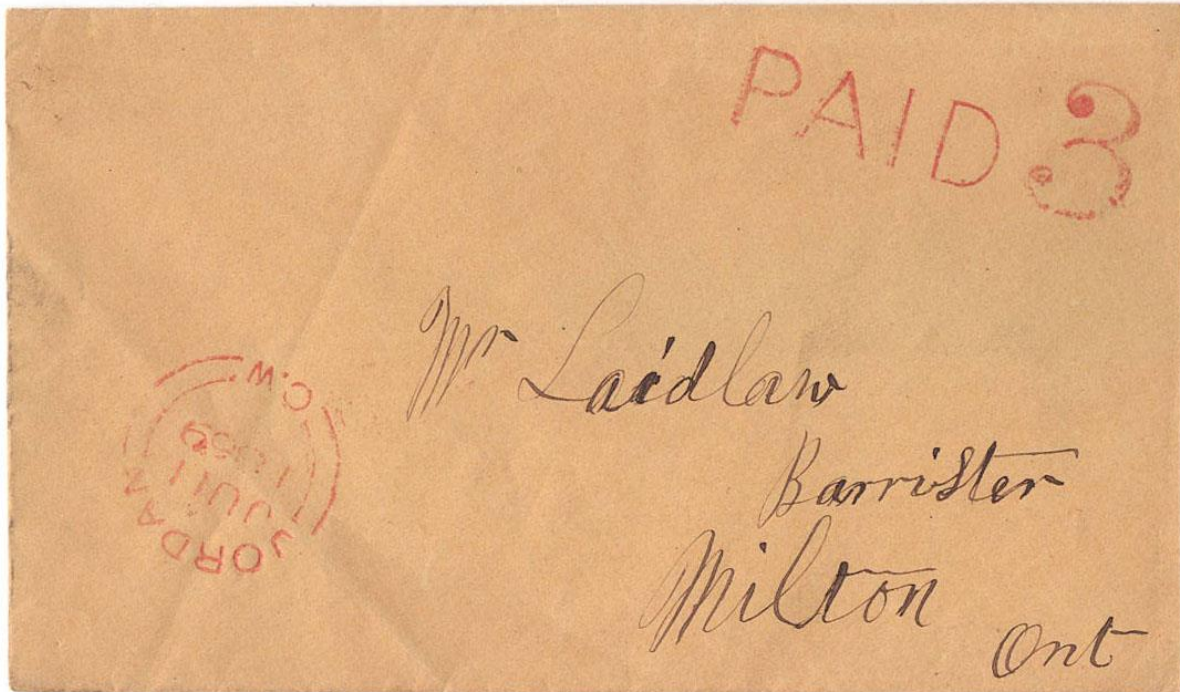
Item 612-07 – **Port Colborne UC (Welland)** – 1856, stampless cover from Port Colborne UC dated DE 15 56, paid 3, to Trinity College in Toronto (b/s) via St. Catharines (b/s). This is the earliest recorded date by 4 years for this hammer. Campbell reports 1855. Exhibit quality! \$100.00 **SOLD**



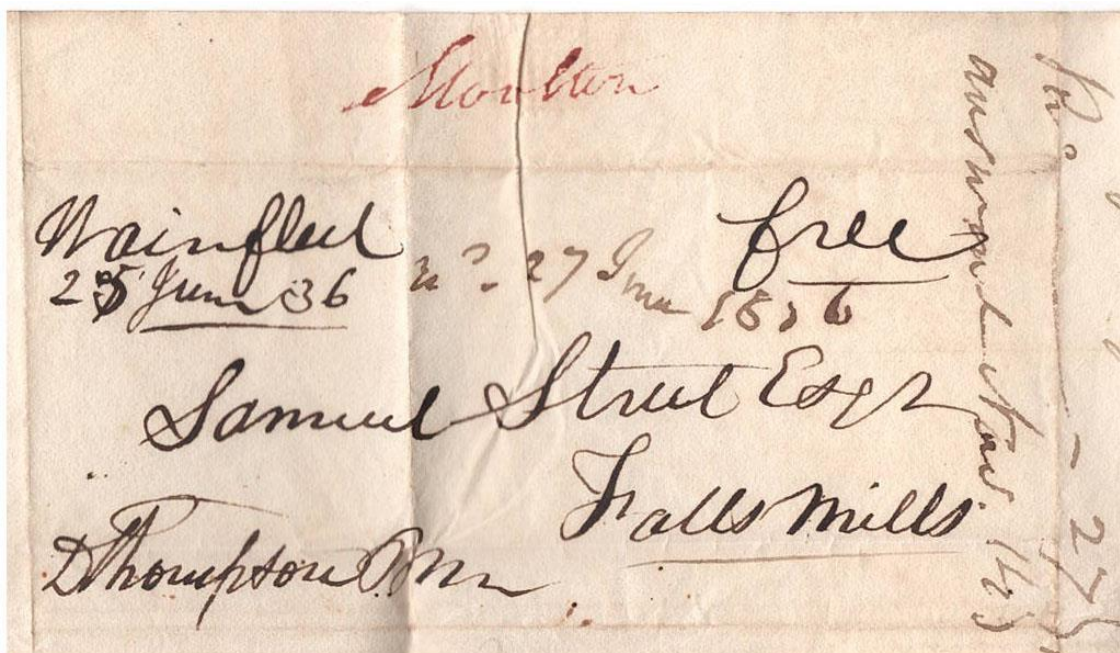
Item 612-08 – Toronto missent to Marshville – 1854, Notary Public printed notice from Toronto rated 3d collect to Wainfleet, missent to Marshville (b/s) via St. Catharines and then to Welland Port via Port Robinson (b/s). The note is about a refused promissory note. \$150.00 **SOLD**



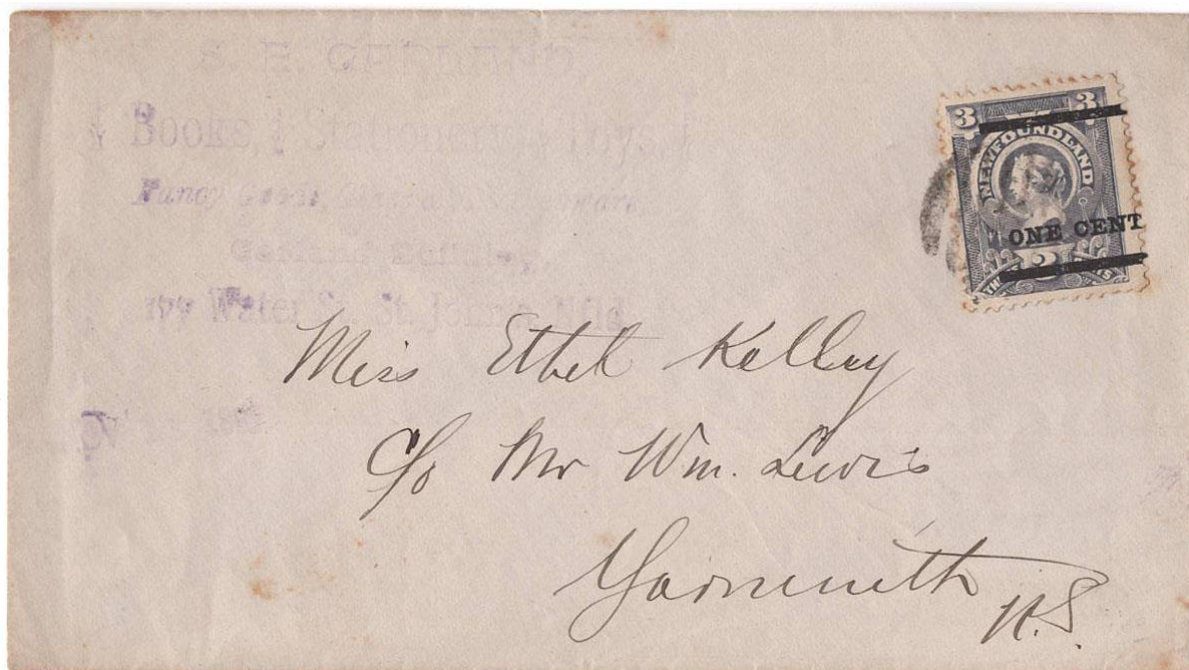
Item 612-09 – **Canboro UC to New York** – 1847, folded letter datelined Dunnville Niagara District 16 SE 47, signed by Rev. William Freeman. Mailed from Canboro (double circle in red), paid 4½d to border via Chippawa. Then through Lewiston exchange, rated 10¢ US collect to New York. \$200.00



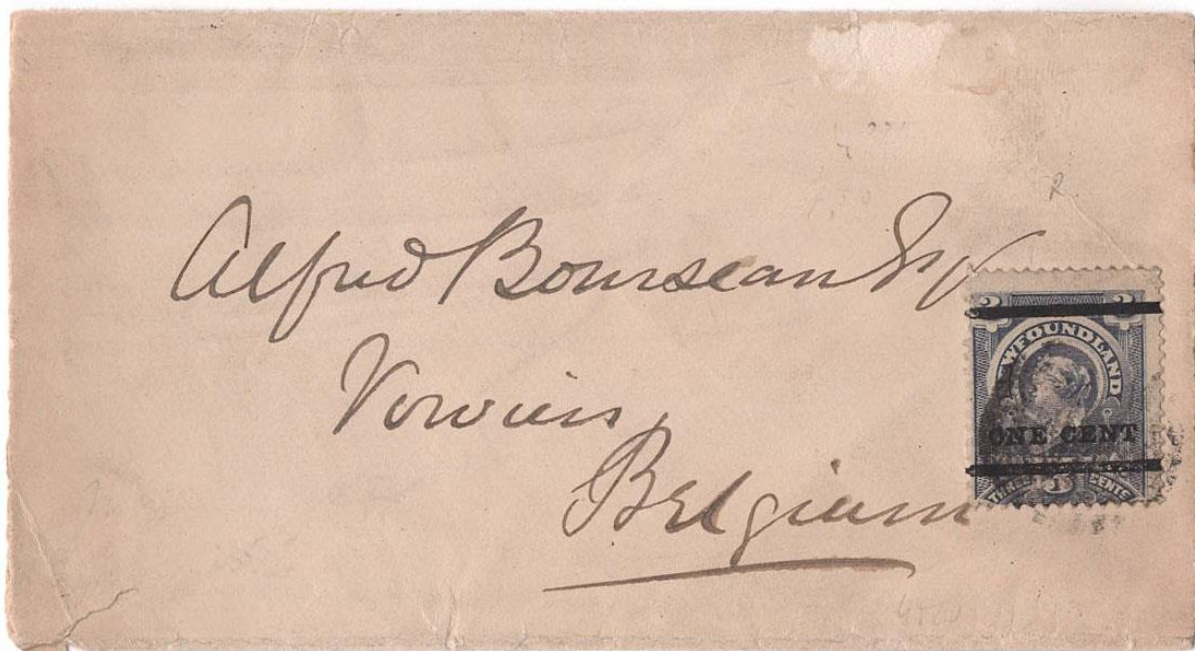
Item 612-10 – **Jordan CW (Lincoln)** - 1869, stampless cover from Jordan CW, dated JU 11 69, paid 3 to Milton (Milton West b/s). \$75.00



Item 612-11 – **Postmasters Sandwich Wainfleet turned letter** – 1836, Postmaster free franked letter from Sandwich UC to the Postmaster in Wainfleet, turned and re-mailed 10 days later as Postmaster free franked letter as well from Wainfleet UC, properly signed by D. Thompson Postmaster (not listed at Library and Archives Canada) to Falls Mills, present day Niagara Falls. A very elusive showpiece double Postmaster letter. \$500.00



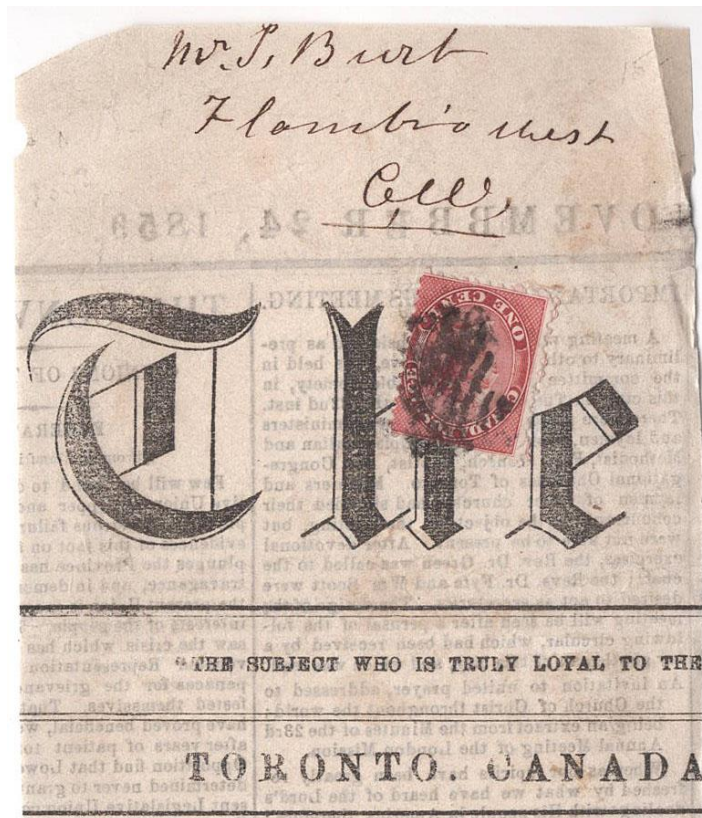
Item 612-12 – **Newfoundland 1¢ printed matter rate to N.S.** – 1897, NFLD 1¢ on 3¢ (*surcharge type A, serifed lettering, perf gum toned, Scott 75*) tied by grid cancel on S.E. Garland cover from St. John's paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Yarmouth NS (17 NO 97). Garland was in books, maps, charts, pamphlets, toys, periodicals, sheet music and stationery. Unsealed. \$150.00



Item 612-13 – **Newfoundland 1¢ printed matter rate to Belgium** – c1897, NFLD 1¢ on 3¢ (*surcharge type A, serifed lettering, Scott 75*) tied by smudge grid cancel on wrapper from St. John's paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Belgium. Not a one-of-kind item but fabulous. \$400.00



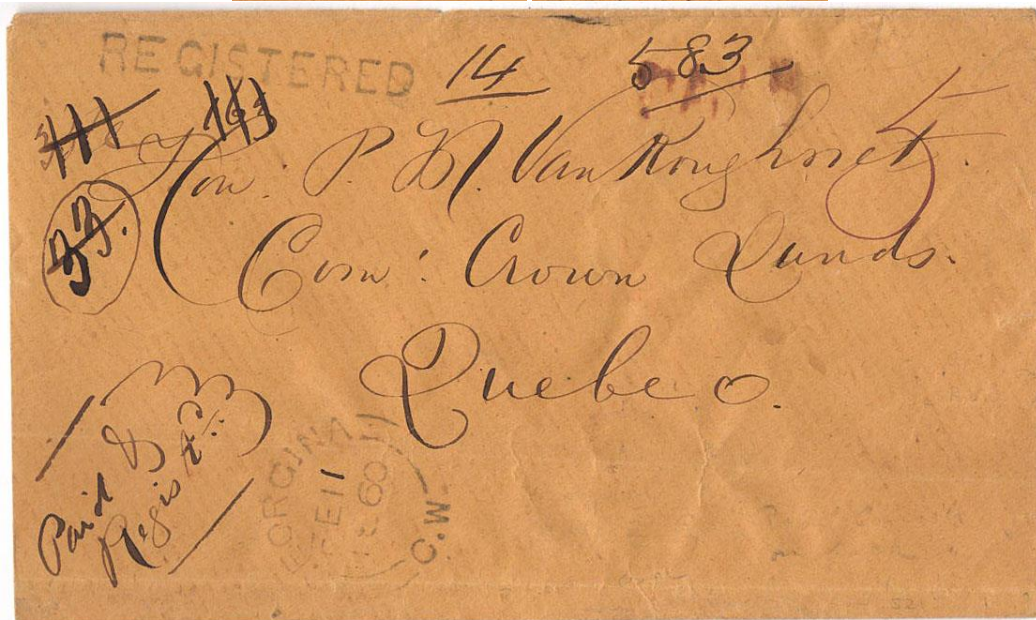
Item 612-14 – 1¢ transient newspaper rate – 1862, 1¢ Decimal tied by Four-ring 13 cancel on Toronto The Globe complete newspaper dated NO 24 62 paying 1¢ transient newspaper rate from Galt to Dundas. Fold and tears. \$750.00



Item 612-15 – **1¢ transient newspaper rate** – c1862, 1¢ Decimal tied by grid cancel on Toronto The Globe partial masthead newspaper paying 1¢ transient newspaper rate to Flamboro West CW. \$125.00



Item 612-16 – **5¢ Beaver position 100 state 6, re-entries** – 1866, 5¢ Beaver (*position 100 state 6, re-entries plus dot in LR corner*) tied by Simcoe CW broken circle on registered cover paying 5¢ letter rate plus 2¢ registry fee paid cash to Vittoria (b/s). \$175.00



Item 612-17 – York - Ontario Simcoe & Huron RR, Mon & Kings GTR – 1860, stampless registered cover from Georgina CW paid 5¢ plus 2¢ registry fee paid cash to Quebec (b/s). Routed via Holland Landing (b/s) and carried by Ontario Simcoe & Huron Railroad (RY-131, 1855-1861, RF F) and Mon & Kings Gd Trk RW Post Office C Down No.2 (QC-190, 1859-1862, RF F). Georgina, which is a York County office, was closed in 1884. A real wow registered cover! \$500.00

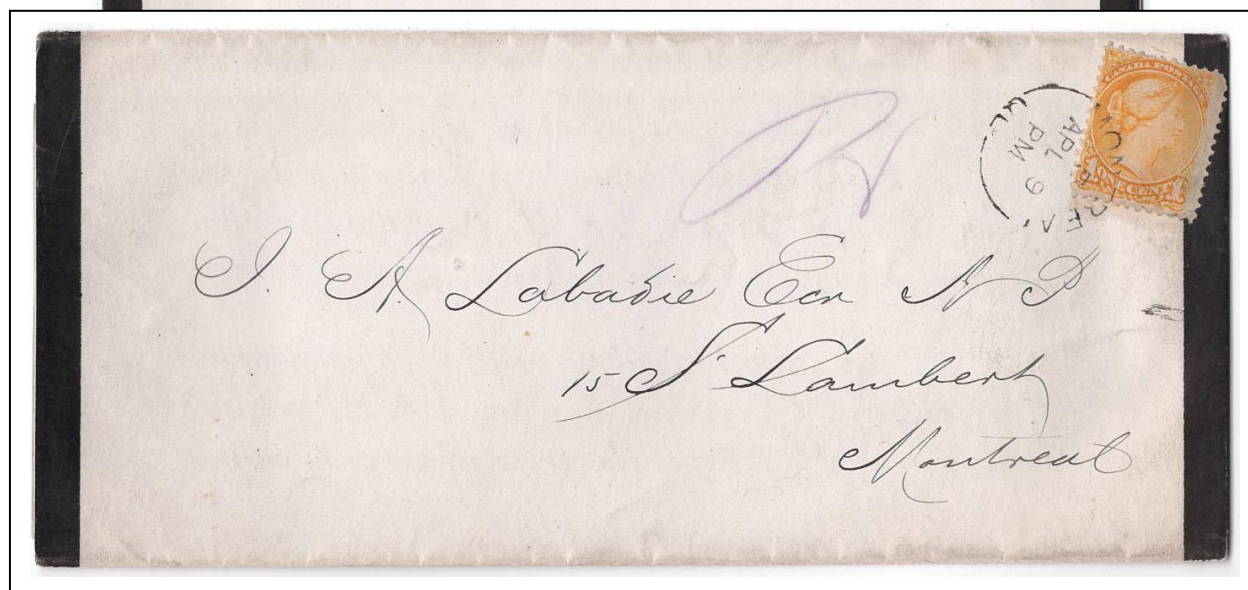
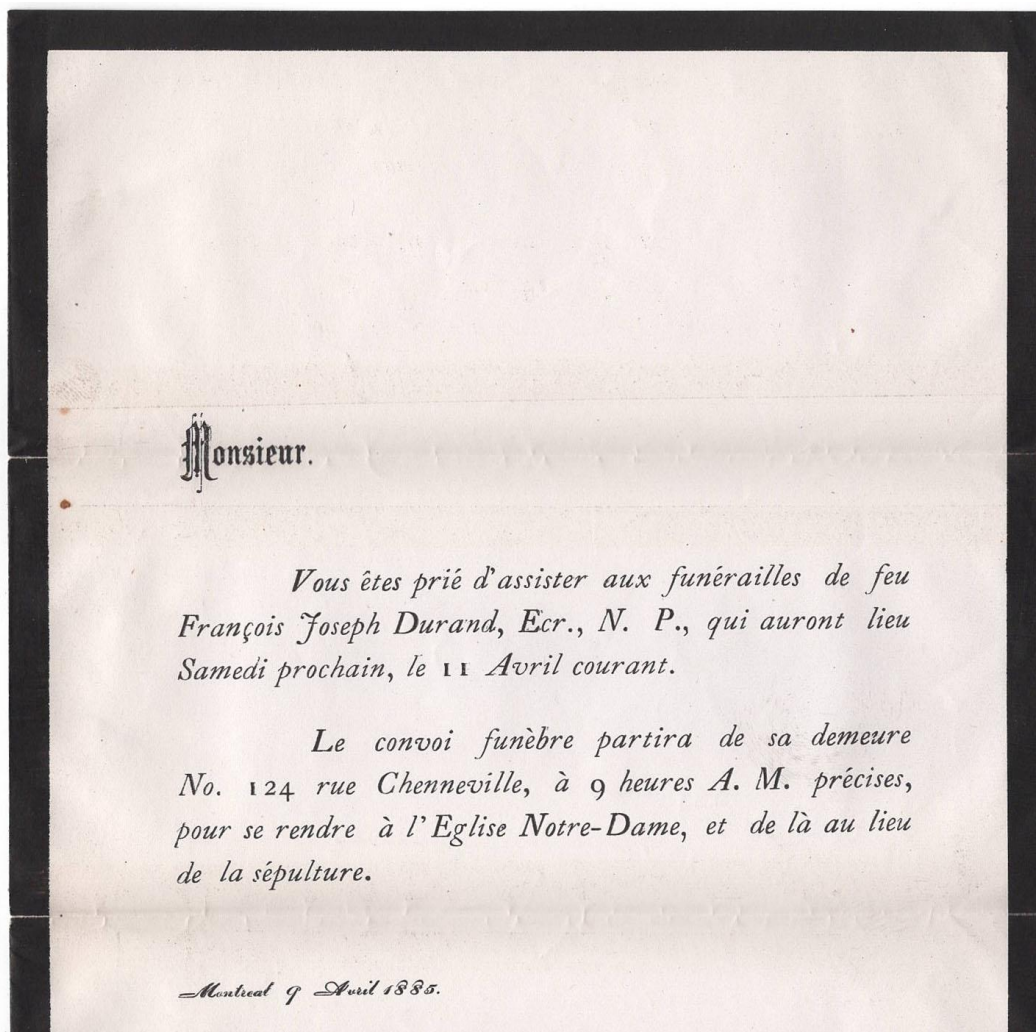
Londoner John Walter Scott's career as a stamp dealer reportedly began in his hometown around 1860. He departed for New York City in 1863, however, Scott chose to move briefly to California as a Gold Rush prospector. But by 1867, Scott returned to his stamp business in New York City, where he would ultimately gain fame and fortune as "the Father of American Philately" and publisher of the definitive stamp periodical *American Journal of Philately*. He is known for created the first Scott catalog; conducted the first stamp auction; America's first major stamp dealer.



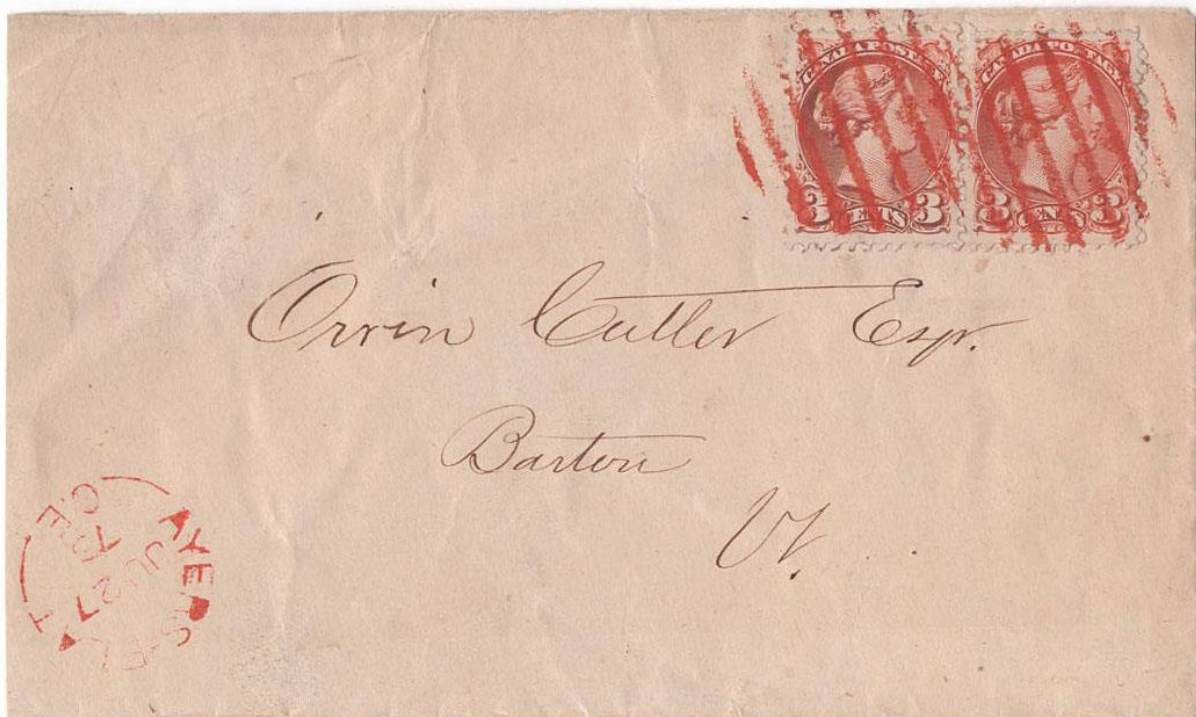
