

Item 613-01 – <u>Outgoing Quebec Ship Letter Crown</u> – 1801, business folded letter written in French from Quebec to Greenock Scotland during the Napoleonic War period. Manuscript "Per the Denault, Capt Demeale, QDC". Ship Letter Crown Quebec, entered in London JA 20 1802 (b/s). Rated 1/2 Sterling crossed out and rated 1/6 representing the incoming ship letter and postage from London to Greenock. The letter is between two merchants and amongst other things talks about the price of rum, sugar, coffee etc. Signed by Thomas Michel Simeon de Lord de Levasseur. \$750.00





Item 613-02 – Peterboro UC to Scotland – 1838, family letter datelined Harvey JUL 14 38 to Edinburgh Scotland. Mailed in Peterboro (double circle with italic lettering, 6 recorded examples) with postage fully prepaid 1/8½d Currency to New York, 9d plus 11½d the equivalent of 18¾¢. Routed via Kingston with paid 18¾ and exchanged in Cape Vincent, from New York by private trader to Liverpool. Entered as ship letter in Liverpool, rated 1/7 collect plus ½d road tax. \$350.00



Item 613-03 – Private ocean ship Atlantic - W. Matlock – 1820, business letter from Liverpool to Montreal via New York. Carried by Matlock with scalloped oval "Ship Atlantic sailed March 17, W. Matlock" in red. Entered in New York as ship letter, rated double 18½¢ plus 2¢ ship total 39¢ to border. Converted to 2/3 plus 9d to Montreal total 3N. Scotch-tape repair with staining going through the paper. Private ocean ship name handstsamps on Canadian mails are rare. \$375.00




Item 613-04 – <u>Liverpool to Montreal via Quebec rated 3/11½</u> – 1839, business letter from Liverpool to Montreal via Quebec. Carried per Benjamin Harty, entered at Quebec with Ship Letter Crown Quebec, rated 3/11½ collect representing 2½d ship letter fee and quintuple weight 9d to Montreal. In transit 68 days. \$500.00



Item 613-05 – Toronto Paid 9 & 25, By Red Swallowtail Line – 1835, Canada Company letter from Toronto to London England via Niagara and New York. Manuscript rate 9 & 25 representing 7d BNA postage, 2d ferriage plus 25¢ US postage to New York. Carried by Red Swallowtail Line American Packet "Samson" sailing New York MY 2 35, entered in Portsmouth as ship letter, rated 1/4 Stg collect representing 8d incoming ship and inland postage from Portsmouth to London. The Samson was in service from 1831 to 1841 until striking rock off Cape Sable Island, Nova Scotia. Contents are abstract of transactions in Canada. \$350.00





Item 613-06 – Toronto Paid 7 & 25 – 1837, Canada Company business letter from Toronto "Paid 7 & 25" to London England via Niagara and New York. Carried by private trader to Liverpool (b/s). This rate handstamp replaced the Paid 9 & 25 to reflect the abolition of ferriage in 1837 and was used on letters from Toronto to New York via Niagara until 1840. Ferriage was abandonned FE 22 37. Contents are abstract of transactions in Canada. \$300.00






Item 613-07 – Scotland to Montreal by Blue Swallowtail Line – 1836, business letter from Dysart Scotland to Montreal routed through Kircaldy, by Liverpool and New York. Carried by Blue Swallowtall Line packet "Napoleon" departing AP 24 36 to New York MY 28 36. Rated 1/ Stg British packet, entered in New York as ship letter, rated 2¢ plus 18¾¢ total 20¾¢ converted to 1/2½ plus 4½d from the border to Montreal total 1/7. Six-pointed star postal inspector mark in black 12mm (discussed in Allcock & Holland pp.450-462). \$250.00



Item 613-08 – London to Montreal by Blue Swallowtail "Independence" – 1836, business letter from London to Montreal, carried by Blue Swallowtail Line ship "Independence". Rated 1/ Stg British packet, entered in New York as ship letter, rated 2¢ plus 18¾¢ total 20¾¢ converted to 1/2½ plus 4½d from the lines to Montreal total 1/7. The Independence departing Liverpool SE 26 36 and arriving New York NO 2 36. \$250.00



Item 613-09 – <u>U.S.P. Paid 25</u> – 1833, folded letter from Stamford Park (Niagara Falls) to stock exchange in London, England. Paid 25¢, no internal BNA postage shown, exchanged through Queenston with U.S.P. Paid 25 applied in Lewiston reaffirming the prepayment of US postage to New York. Carried to England by private trader to Liverpool (b/s). \$750.00



Item 613-10 – <u>Toronto - per Steamboat Lady of the Lake</u> – 1849, business folded letter from Toronto to Oswego NY, went across the Lake and carried privately by the American Company *Ontario and St. Lawrence Steamboat Company*. This Toronto Oswego steamboat route was: Oswego, Lewiston, Toronto, Hamilton, Sackets, Kingston, Ogdensburgh and intermediate ports and return. Ex Parson p.213. In 1854, the ship was sold to M.W. Brown of Hamilton and renamed Queen City. In 1855, the ship caught fire and burned to the water's edge at the Queen's Wharf in Toronto. \$400.00 SOLD



Item 613-11 – <u>Saint John NB Two-ring 7</u> – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen pair tied by Two-ring 7 cancel on cover from St. John NB paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. A nice pair on cover! \$100.00



Item 613-12 – <u>Ingersoll Ont Two-ring 27</u> – 1869, 1869, 3¢ Large Queen pair (by scissor at right however no perfs missing) tied by Two-ring 27 cancel on cover from Ingersoll Ont paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. The Two-ring 27 was used in 1869 and 1870, disappeared and revived in 1875. \$150.00




Item 613-13 – <u>London CW Two-ring 6</u> – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen pair tied by Two-ring 6 cancel on cover from London CW paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. (b/s). Common cancel but a very pretty LQ cover! \$125.00




Item 613-14 – <u>Belleville Ont Two-ring 13</u> – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen pair tied by Two-ring 13 cancel on cover from Belleville Ont paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. Not scarce at all but a nice cover! \$125.00 **SOLD** 



Item 613-15 – Fredericton NB Two-ring 11 – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen pair tied by Two-ring 11 cancel on cover from Fredericton NBt paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. Reduced on both sides. \$75.00



Item 613-16 – Quebec, Montmorency & Charlevoix Railway – 1897, ½¢ SQ pair tied by Quebec duplex cancel on Quebec, Montmorency & Charlevoix Railway c/c cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to St. John NB (b/s). \$75.00




Item 613-17 – <u>Toronto - 1¢ SQ deep orange on report</u> – 1871, 1¢ SQ deep orange tied by fancy cancel on Freehold Permanent Building and Savings Society report (later: *Freehold Loan and Savings Company*) paying 1¢ partly written partly printed matter rate to local. Separation at all folds. Still looking nice! \$100.00.



Item 613-22 – <u>Sherbrooke Dry Goods collar advertising</u> – 1895, 1¢ SQ (3) tied by Sherbrooke Que cds on H. Samuel, Importer of Dry Goods "stamp collar" advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Montreal (b/s + carrier). \$175.00






Item 613-23 – 10¢ double wgt UPU to Austria – 1893, ½¢ (2), 1¢, 2¢, 6¢ SQ tied by Montreal duplex cancel on Windsor Hotel advertising cover paying 10¢ double weight UPU letter rate to Berlin, Germany (b/s) via London England (b/s). Redirected to Großtabarz (b/s). \$750.00




Item 613-24 – <u>Toronto 2¢ postcard rate to U.S.</u> – 1874, 1¢ SQ tied by Toronto fancy cancel, pumpkin style, on 1¢ stationery card paying 2¢ postcard rate to New York. Until JU 30 73, postcard to the U.S. were charged at the letter rate but effective JUL 1 73 postcards could be sent at 2¢ rate, by adding 1¢ adhesive to a domestic card. On JU 30 74, it was agreed that all correspondence between the two countries was to be at the domestic rate if fully prepaid, with effect from JA 1 75. \$125.00





Col O'Malley, 25<sup>th</sup> Battalion in Wardsville. The letter is from the Taylor Brothers regarding pop beverages at the mess, noting they are brewing ginger ale etc. \$85.00 <u>SOLD</u>

Transit and receiver (b/s). SCADTA: Sociedad Colombo Alemana de Transportes Aéreos. The first airline in South America, operating from 1919 until World War II. A rare cover. \$1,000.00




