




Item 615-01 – <u>Suspension Bridge NY to Halifax via Canada</u> – 1860, stampless cover from Suspension Bridge NY to Halifax (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). Carried by GWR from the Niagara Falls region to Toronto, by GTR to Montreal, then back into US via Portland Maine, to Nova Scotia. United States 6d exchange marking. A rare cross border cover. \$200.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 615-02 – <u>New York circular to Fenelon Falls CW</u> – 1866, US 1¢ Franklin tied by New York cds on cover paying 1¢ circular rate to Fenelon Falls CW (b/s). Charged 1¢ after crossing in Canada as the treaty required, postage was valid only to the lines, routed via Lindsay and Coboconk (b/s). \$150.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 615-03 – Montreal to New Hampshire by GTR – 1855, stampless cover from Montreal, endorsed "Via GTR", Tombstone paid 6 with perfect 10 paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to New Hampshire. Personal letter accompanies. \$100.00



Item 615-04 -The Barrie half penny handstamp - 1853, clerk folded letter from Barrie rated ½d collect paying the drop letter rate. This is the rare tiny Barrie half penny handstamp. Very elusive! \$200.00 SOLD






Item 615-05 – <u>Prepaid circular from the U.S. to Belleville charged 1d</u> – 1854, Robert S. Perry of Oswego NY printed circular, prepaid to Belleville CW (b/s). Charged 1d after crossing in Canada as the treaty required, rate paid only to the lines. Perry was a commission merchant in lumber, flour, grain and forwarding. \$150.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 615-07 – Toronto 1¢ drop letter rate – 1863, 1¢ Decimal tied by diamond grid cancel on cover from Toronto CW paying 1¢ drop letter rate. \$75.00




Item 615-08 – Montreal 1¢ circular to Vittoria – c1860, 1¢ Decimal tied by concentric ring cancel on William Nivin & Co. trade circular cover from Montreal paying 1¢ circular rate to Vittoria. \$100.00



Item 615-09 – Montreal 1¢ circular to Nova Scotia – c1860, 1¢ Decimal tied by large grid cancel on Thomas Fuller & Co. Market report from Montreal paying 1¢ circular rate to Halifax N.S. Separations at fold. \$150.00






Item 615-11 – <u>Diamond Jubilee related</u> – 1897, ½¢ SQ pair tied by Brockville squared circle on stamp dealer cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to U.S. The printed letter is from the Eastern Ontario stamp dealer H.S. Seaman and relates to the Diamond Jubilee stamps about to be issued. Separation at all fold, fragile, requires archivist tape. A seldom seen stamp dealer cover! \$75.00



Item 615-12 – ½¢ unofficial printed matter to Barrington – c1890, ½¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on undated cover, most likely from St. John NB, paying the unofficial ½¢ printed matter rate to Barrington NS. Unauthorized but widely used in the Maritimes. \$125.00



Item 615-13 – <u>Brockville 1¢ printed matter to U.S.</u> – 1899, ½¢ Numeral pair tied by Brockville squared circle on cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to U.S. \$25.00



Item 615-14 – <u>Fredericton ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to box holder</u> – 1899, ½¢ Numeral tied by Fredericton NB cds on Toronto Rubber Co. Tire Department unaddressed and unsealed cover paying ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to every box holder (½¢ for up to 4 oz). \$300.00



Item 615-15 – <u>Hamilton CPR ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to box holder</u> – 1899, ½¢ Numeral tied by Hamilton Bickerdike machine cancel on CPR unaddressed cover paying ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to every box holder (½¢ for up to 4 oz). Reduced both sides. Discoloration on flap but belongs. \$200.00



Item 615-16 – <u>Halifax ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to box holder</u> – 1902, ½¢ Numeral tied by Halifax Internation machine cancel on unaddressed and unsealed cover paying ½¢ 3rd class unaddressed to every box holder (½¢ for up to 4 oz). \$200.00 **SOLD**





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
Item 615-22 – **2¢ UPU postcard rate to Belgium** – 1897, 1¢ SQ tied by Montreal Bickerdike machine cancel on 1¢ stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Belgium (receiver on front). \$50.00



Item 615-23 – <u>Printer's Copy Don't Seal Up</u> – 1897, 1¢ SQ tied by Harrow Ont broken circle on printer unsealed cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Amherstburg (b/s). Printed notation: "Printer's Copy / Don't Seal Up / One Cent For 2 Oz". Essex County. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 615-24 – The short line Grand Junction Railway Co. – 1881, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto duplex cancel on Grand Junction Railway Co. cover to Toronto. Perhaps a way letter entered and postmarked in Toronto on arrival. The GJR was a short-line railway between Peterborough and Belleville. Originally designed to be a loop starting near Toronto and running to Peterborough, then southeast to meet GTR on the banks of Lake Ontario. By the time it had been built other lines had run into Toronto, so the GJR instead ran from Belleville to Peterborough, and then to Omemee and met the Midland Railway of Canada. Mining related. A tough one. \$150.00



Item 615-25 – <u>European and North American Railway</u> – 1871, 3¢ SQ tied by Saint John NB datestamp on European and North American Railway c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Dorchester NB. New Brunswick's first railway operated from 1857 until 1872 from St. John to Pointe-du-Chêne (near Shediac). It had been taken over by the N.B. Government in 1857 after going bankrupt during the construction. In 1872, it was merged into the Intercolonial Railway. \$150.00






Item 615-26 – Toronto - OX1 first officially sealed issue – 1891, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto duplex cancel on cover, dated MY 5 91, paying 3¢ letter rate to Cobourg, then to Norwood and Apsley via Belleville and Peterboro (b/s). Likely forwarded to the DLO contrary to regulations as the cover had a return address. The regulations stated in part: *if a letter showing the well-known notice having the sender's name and addresesd on the outside, is sent to the DLO and there opened in error, that the officially sealed label is applied, to show that such letter has been opened and not by any unauthorized person*. While the OX1 is not tied, the cover shows the proper use examined there and returned to sender. The reverse shows 8 receiving cancels and support for the unfolded seal. Interestingly, the note has the manuscript not called for and "Opened by mistake by B.J. Hales Apsley and not the intended addresee Hugh B. Hales Jr. The OX1 stamp is faulty as customary. A proper usage of this stamp on a opened in error and then resealed cover. Rare and the second earliest of only four recorded covers bearing the 1879 OX1 stamp. Ex Lindemann, Brigham, Draves, Cooper. \$4,500.00








Routed as customary via Windsor (b/s) and San Francisco (b/s). Roughly opened at top. \$200.00





Item 615-28 – <u>Bulk mailing receipt for 24 pounds of newspaper</u> – 1897, 3¢ SQ (two blocks of 4) tied by Brantford Ont squared circle on bulk mailing receipt paying 24¢ second class rate for 24 pounds of newspaper. A page from a booklet. \$150.00





Item 615-29 – <u>Bulk mailing receipt for 1 and 5 pounds of newspaper</u> – 1894, 5¢ and 1¢ SQ tied by Toronto Ont broken circle on bulk mailing receipt paying respectively 5¢ second class rate for 5 pounds and 1¢ for 1 pound of newspaper. A page from a booklet. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 615-30 – <u>Bulk mailing receipt for newspaper in French</u> – 1896, 1¢ SQ on each side tied by Quebec Canada cds on bulk mailing receipt paying 1¢ second class rate for 1 pound of newspaper. Scarce. And interesting single use. \$100.00 SOLD







Item 615-33 – A very early use of Canada's first postcard – June 6 – 1871, 1¢ stationery card from Fergus CW dated JU 6 71 to Dundas. Message relates to lot numbers in Elora and other properties in Wellington County The emission of this card took place officially on June 1, 1871. At the time of Allan's postcard handbook of 1979, June 10 was considered very early if not the earliest recorded. Then in 1986 in his larger publication published by Hennok, June 8 was back then the earliest one. In 2004, George Arfken published a last minute update to his book with a June 5 example - courtesy of VW. \$500.00



Item 615-34 – Windsor Ontario Steamboat Agent – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Windsor Ont cds on Odette & Wherry Steamboat Agent advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Amherstburg (b/s). Also dealers in coal, cement, plaster and drain tile. \$100.00



Item 615-35 – <u>Toronto Paints, Oils, Window Glass</u> – 1898, 2¢ Maple Leaf tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on James Paton Paints Oils and Window Glass cameo advertising paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 615-36 – St. John's Paid All handstamp during shortage – 1897, stampless reply cover mailed locally in St. John's, dated OC 15 97, circular "Paid All" handstamp to Le Messurier. By the end of September 1897, the 1¢ Cabot that had been used on newspaper and on circulars was totally depleted and suppliers of earlier issues were so low that pending the surcharging of the 1890 3¢ grey, a Paid All handstamp was used during October. A very pretty usage before the issue of the 1¢ surcharge on the 3¢ grey. \$100.00



Item 615-37 – <u>St. John's Paid All handstamp during shortage</u> – 1897, stampless cover mailed locally in St. John's, dated OC 14 97, circular "Paid All" handstamp to T. Healey & Co. A lovely mate to the above cover, also dated before the issue of the 1¢ surcharge on the 3¢ grey. \$100.00




Item 615-38 – <u>European military cabinet card photograph lot</u> - Albrecht Theodor Emil Graf von Roon Prussian soldier and Minister of War from 1859 to 1873, Eduard Ernst Friedrich Hannibal Vogel von a Prussian Infantry General and more German Empire cards, French General Charles Denis Sauter Bourbaki of the East Army, French General Louis-Jules Trochu military leader and politician. He served as President of the Government of National Defense. French General François Achille Bazaine served under Louis-Philippe and then Napoleon III, to Marshal of France. Others are troop etc. Some developped in Montreal, some in London, other unknown. Total 15 cards. \$200.00



Item 615-39 – <u>The Halifax Herald</u> – 1909, 1¢ Edward tied by Halifax International machine cancel on The Halifax Herald advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to South Side of Basin, River Dennis. \$100.00



Item 615-40 – <u>Toronto exterminators</u> – 1910, 1¢ Edward with an International machine cancel on Common Sense Manufacturing Company advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Athens. Exterminator of rats, mice, roaches and bed bugs. \$50.00






Item 615-41 – Toronto - OX3 third officially sealed issue – 1908, Toronto back cover with three OX3 tied by Ottawa DLO and oval Registered London marking, registered and dated NO 30 08 to Ashford England via London. Clearly, there was some deficiency in the address as the cover was forwarded to the DLO Toronto Branch DE 1 08. It is unfortunate that this cover is just the back of the envelope, but it still tells an interesting story. The cover was then forwarded to the DLO in Ottawa in early February 1909 where it was opened and resealed with three copies of OX3. The addressee was found as the cover was forwarded to England where it arrived in London FE 22 09 and then to its destinatio the same dayn. Still a useful OX3 Edwardian era cover. \$2,500.00







Item 615-48 – Ottawa Free International machine – 1919, Dept of Railways and Canals free franked cover from Ottawa, signed Major Graham Airdrie Bell handstamp, JU 4 19, to Toronto. Major Graham Airdrie Bell (Order of St Michael and St George, 1874-1929) was a Canadian civil servant and Deputy Minister of Railways and Canals from 1919 until his death. Coutts free marking: SSM-55b. \$50.00



An incredible Silver Jubilee cover and interestingly during the Anglo-Egyptian Treaty of 1936 talks. \$100.00






