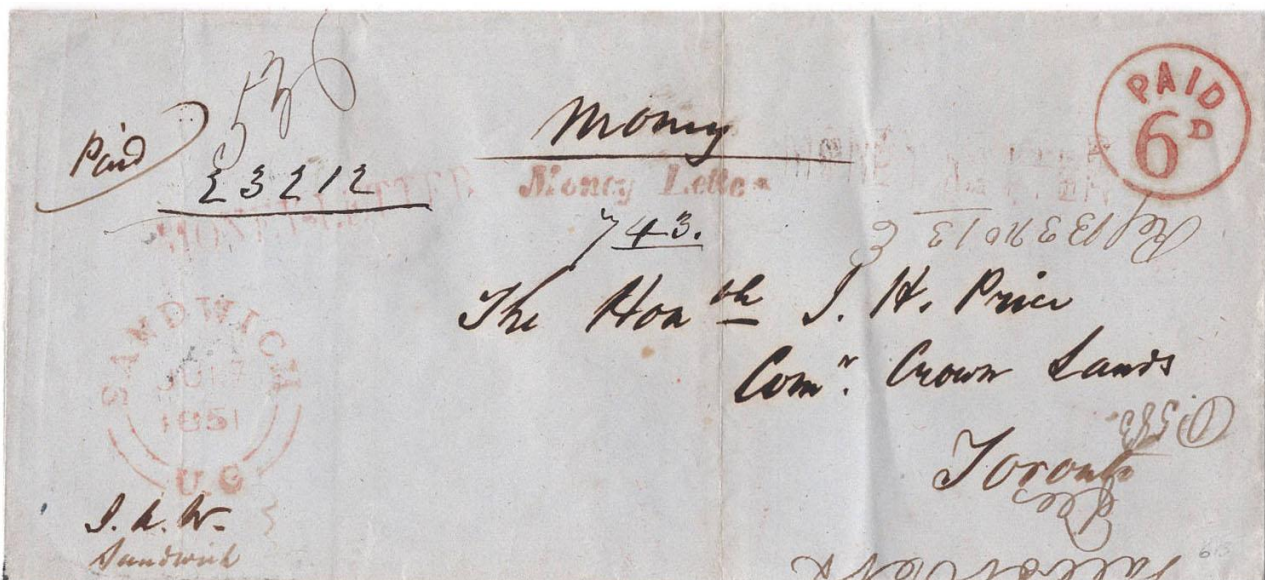




Item 618-01 – Kingston straight-line – 1817, business folded letter from Kingston UC paid 1N to Montreal. Reverse with Kingston straightline 2 AUG 17. The letter is signed by R.M. Long and relates to, among other things, the price of tea. \$275.00



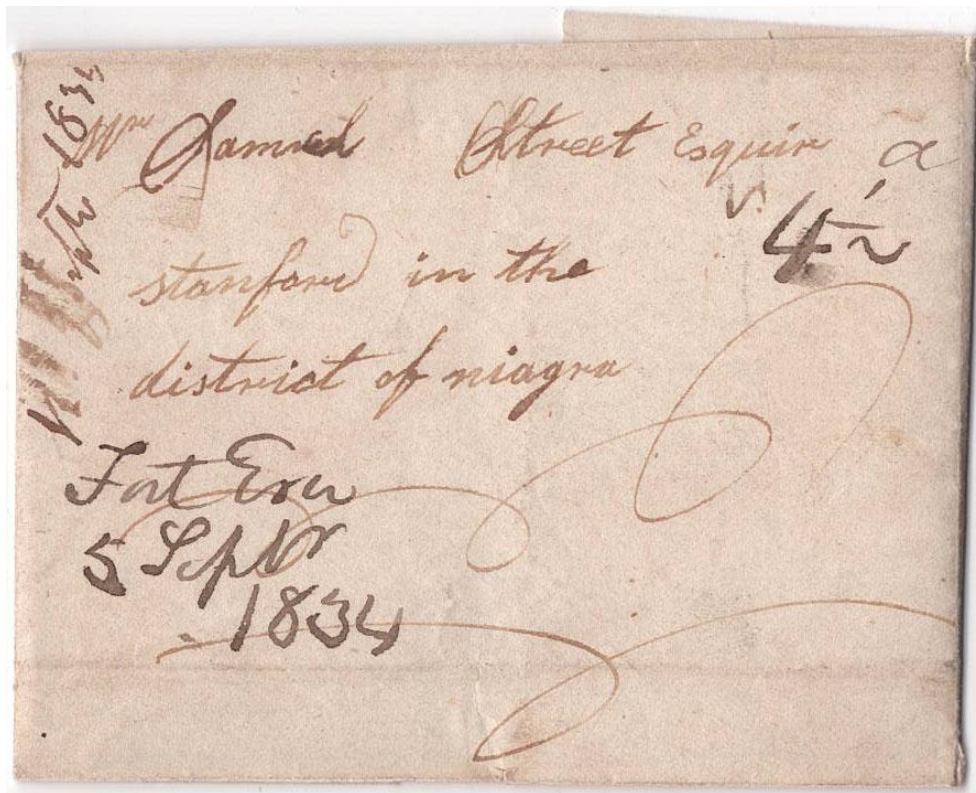
Item 618-02 – **Brantford UC novemdecuple rate prepaid** – 1843, large folded letter from Brantford UC paid 7/1½d paying 19 times the rate, 19x4½d, to Vittoria (b/s). The letter contained legal papers and money and relates to mortgage, estate and 100 acres in Windham Township, addressed to the registrar of the Norfolk County. A spectacular showpiece. \$400.00



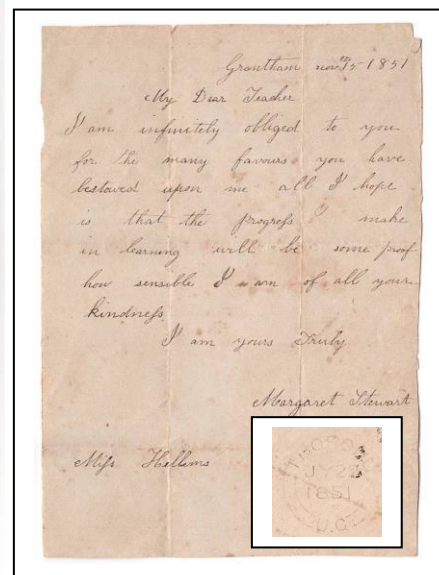
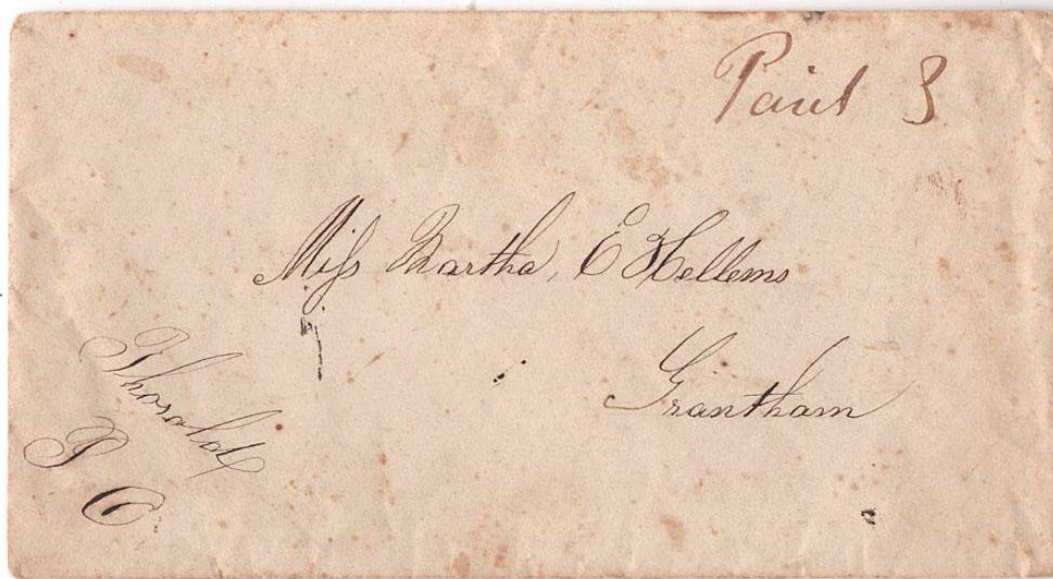
Item 618-03 – **Sandwich UC “Money Letter”** (*italic and struck in red*) – 1851, folded money letter without content from Sandwich UC paid 6 to Toronto (b/s). Money letter in italic lettering struck in red along with manuscript and straightline. A tough one! \$300.00



Item 618-04 – **Mohawk UC (Brant)** – 1844, Reverend folded money letter datelined Mount Pleasant JA 30 44, mailed from Mohawk UC, rated 4½d collect to Dundas (b/s). Relates to money for the Hamilton Presbytery Fund. An early example of the hammer II (1843-1849). Closed in 1922. Very scarce. \$150.00



Item 618-05 – **Fort Erie LC manuscript postmark** – 1834, folded letter datelined Bertie mailed from Fort Erie rated 4½ collect to Stanford. The letter relates to land, survey and signed by Abraham Brown. \$150.00



Item 618-06 – **Thorold U.C. lady letter** – 1851, stampless lady cover with letter dated JY 22 51 from Thorold UC paid 3 to Grantham. Thorold (b/s). Back flap off. The letter relates to. \$75.00

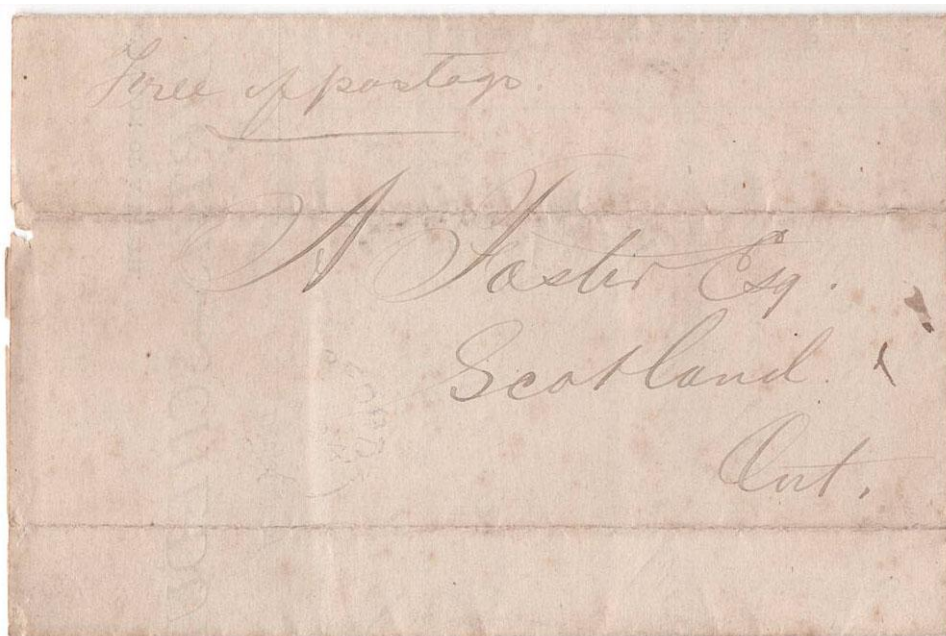

Item 618-11 – **GWR Sarnia Branch 10¢ rate to U.S.** – 1862, 5¢ Beaver (2, upper stamp with re-entries UL, flaws in shading beside "5") tied by GWR Sarnia Branch broken circle paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to U.S. East DE 2 62. A beauty! \$250.00

The Canadians and British troops were there to protect the Suez Canal and Egypt from Turkish aggression over the period of 1915-1917. \$250.00

Reverse with an interesting note: The postman used quite strong language concerning the stamps, ... not do it again... \$200.00 **SOLD**



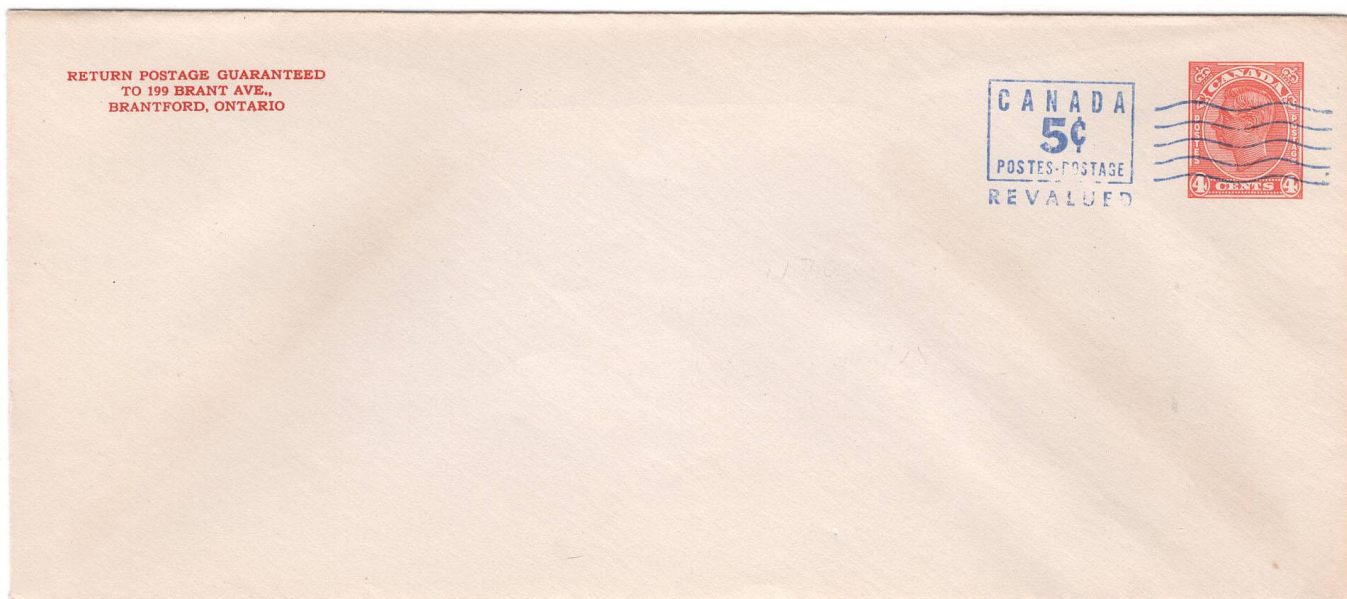
