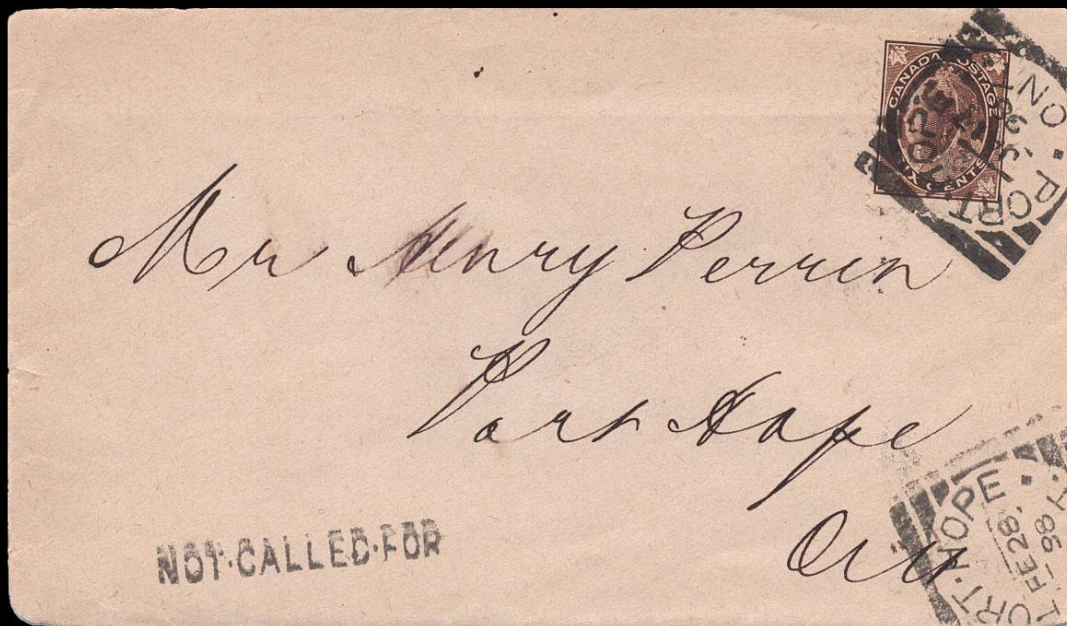

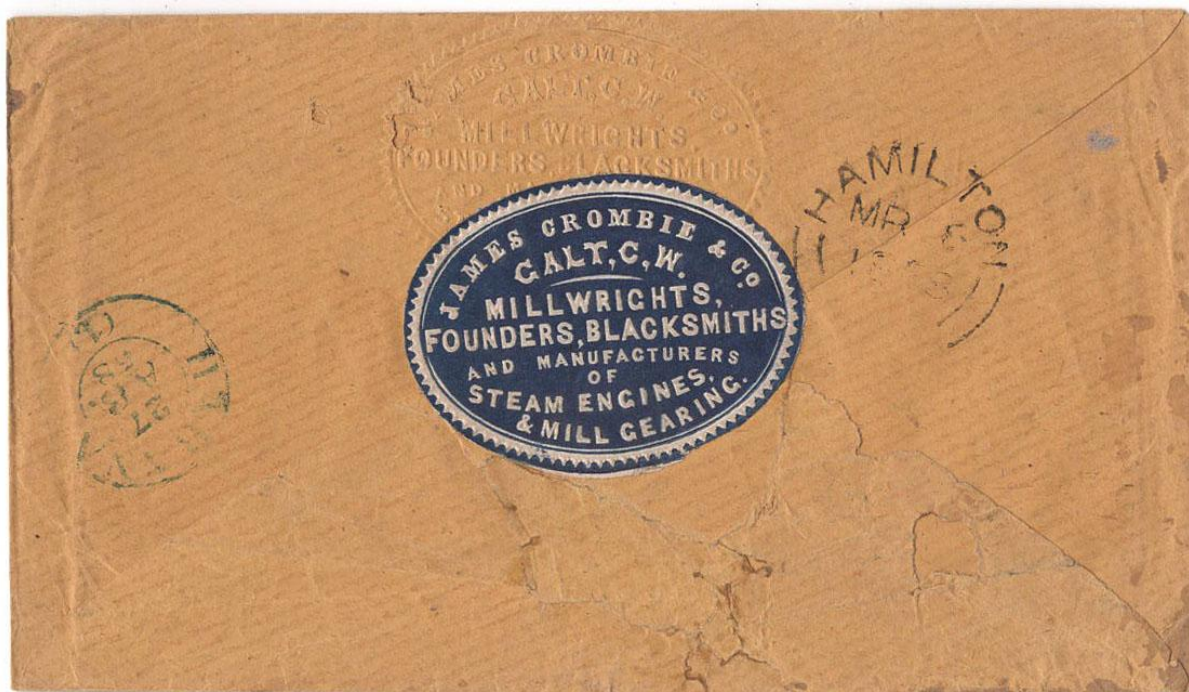




Item 619-01 – **Quebec Bishop mark** – 1788, stampless folded cover from Quebec with Quebec triangle and Bishop mark insert 18/FE (CS type 1), rated 9d collect to Montreal. A lovely example of this rare and early postmark. \$750.00



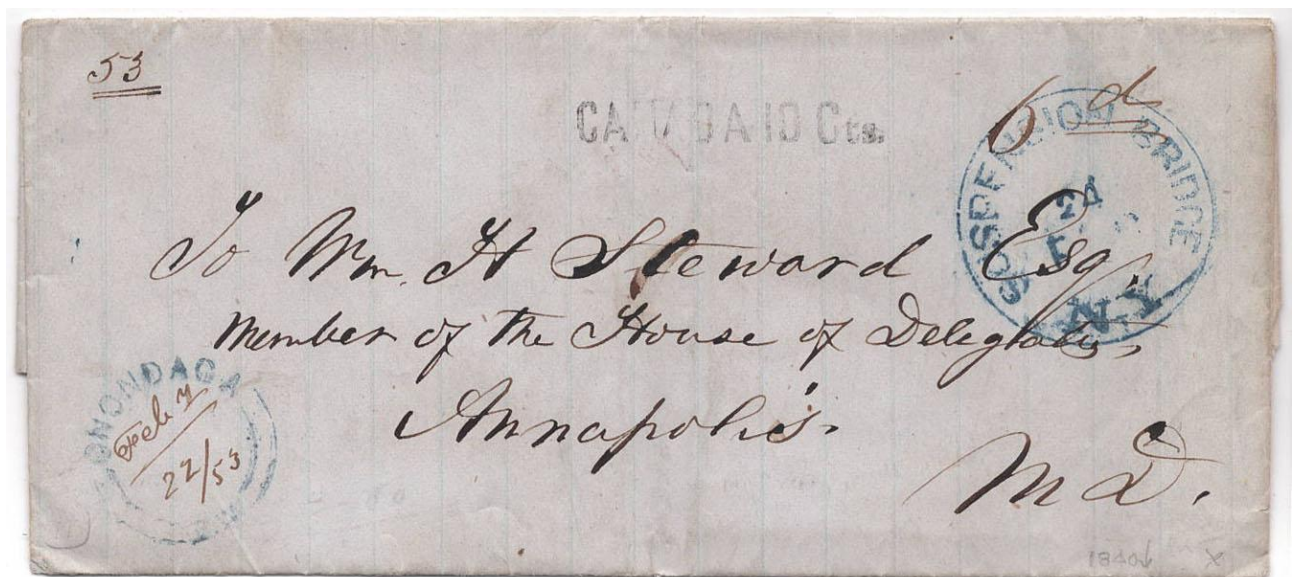
Item 619-02 – **Rome Italy to Boucherville CE. 37¢ collect (Decimal era)** – 1864, folded letter signed De Lery from Rome Italy to Boucherville CE (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). The letter is written in French on mourning paper and relates to photography, money and banking. Rated 1/, 1/5 and 37¢ collect with Anglo French accountancy marking FR 3F 76¢. VDL fig 1290. Pretty and a rare Decimal issue letter incoming to Canada. \$750.00



Item 619-03 – **Galt UC to Cuba (Blacksmith and founder cameo advertising)** – 1858, Galt UC stampless cover from James Crombie & Co to Havana Cuba via Hamilton UC, London England, St.Thomas DWI. Carried by Cunard America from Boston to Liverpool, then to St.Thomas DWI with long way having endured 2 transatlantic crossings. Paid 2/9 Sterling, 3/5 Currency (3/3 plus 2d for US transit and Cunard passage), charged to box 72. "2" in black for a Cuban charge of 2 reales. Illustrated in Arfken Leggett, Firby and Steinhart book page 342. Ex Nickle, Wilkinson. \$2,000.00



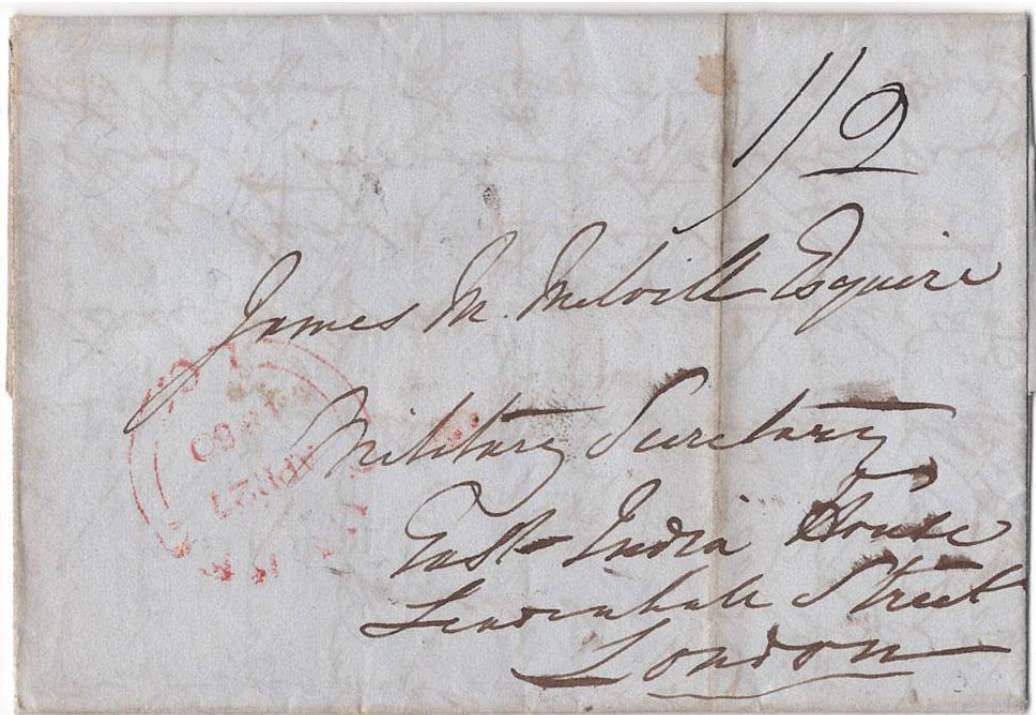
Item 619-04 – **Rawdon UC to Edinburgh (Hastings 1832-1852)** – 1836, Maclean lengthy family letter datelined Seymour AP 20 36, mailed from Rawdon UC (*double circle in black, Hastings County office, closed in 1852*). Paid 1/10 and 18¼¢, routed via Kingston to New York. Entered in Liverpool as Ship Letter, rated 1/7 Sterling collect representing the ship letter fee and postage to Edinburgh. \$500.00



Item 619-05 – **Onondaga CW (Brant, recorded 1852 only)** – 1853, 2-page business letter datelined Grand River CW FE 18 53, mailed from Onondaga CW (hammer II, previously recorded in 1852 only). The letter refers to Nanticoke people native Algonquian, Captain Brant the Mohawk Chief and his fraudulent practices. Written by a Nanticoke interpreter. Rated 10¢ with exchange marking Canada 10 Cts, routed and exchanged via Suspension Bridge NY. The new latest recorded date. A rarity. \$500.00



Item 619-06 – **London to Quebec via Cunard Cambria** – 1850, business folded letter from London England, Lombard Street Maltese Cross, 1/2 Sterling prepaid to Quebec. Carried by Cunard Cambria via New York, closed bag to Quebec. Weston Hunt & Co. was a sail-making firm and timber etc. The letter relates to timber products: shingles, pines, oak etc. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 619-07 – **Beauport (Quebec) to London via Cunard Cambria** – 1850, business folded letter datelined Beauport AP 26 50, mailed at Quebec and rated 1/2 Sterling to London England. Carried by Cunard Cambria via New York (b/s). The letter is a request to investigate a claim. Letters from Beauport are very scarce. \$75.00 **SOLD**



In 1828, Colborne was appointed Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada. In 1829 he founded Upper Canada College. In 1836 Colborne became commander-in-chief of all the armed forces in British North America, promoted lieutenant general on in July. He personally led the offensive at the Battle of Saint-Eustache in December 1837 defeating the rebel force and burnt St. Eustache and St. Benoît. The French-Canadians gave him the nickname the old fire-breather. Following Lord Gosford's resignation in February 1838, he became acting Governor General of British North America. In Lower Canada but not Upper Canada. He stepped aside until the arrival of his formal successor, Lord Durham. Durham remained in Canada only for a few months, resigning and Colborne became acting Governor General again. Colborne put down a second revolt in November 1838 and was confirmed as Governor General of British North America in December.

Item 619-08 – Lgen Sir John Colborne Governor General – 1839, letter from Lieut Col Charles Steevens, datelined Clarence Square Pittville Chethendam, addressed to Lgen Sir J. Colborne, The Governor General. The letter is rated 1/ packet to North America, entered in Halifax rated 1N8 to Quebec. Fwd from Quebec probably to Montreal rated 5d total 2N1 collect. The letter passed to London thence to Falmouth for the packet Reindeer sailing AU 10 39 arriving Halifax SE 11 39. Steevens was the commanding officer of the 20th Regiment of Foot. The letter is about his anxiety to commission his son of 18 year of age etc. Then, Steevens says that he was badly wounded and suffered since his commanding appointment in Egypt and having commanded his regiment in the Peninsula War. Colborne and Steevens were certainly friend. \$400.00 **SOLD**



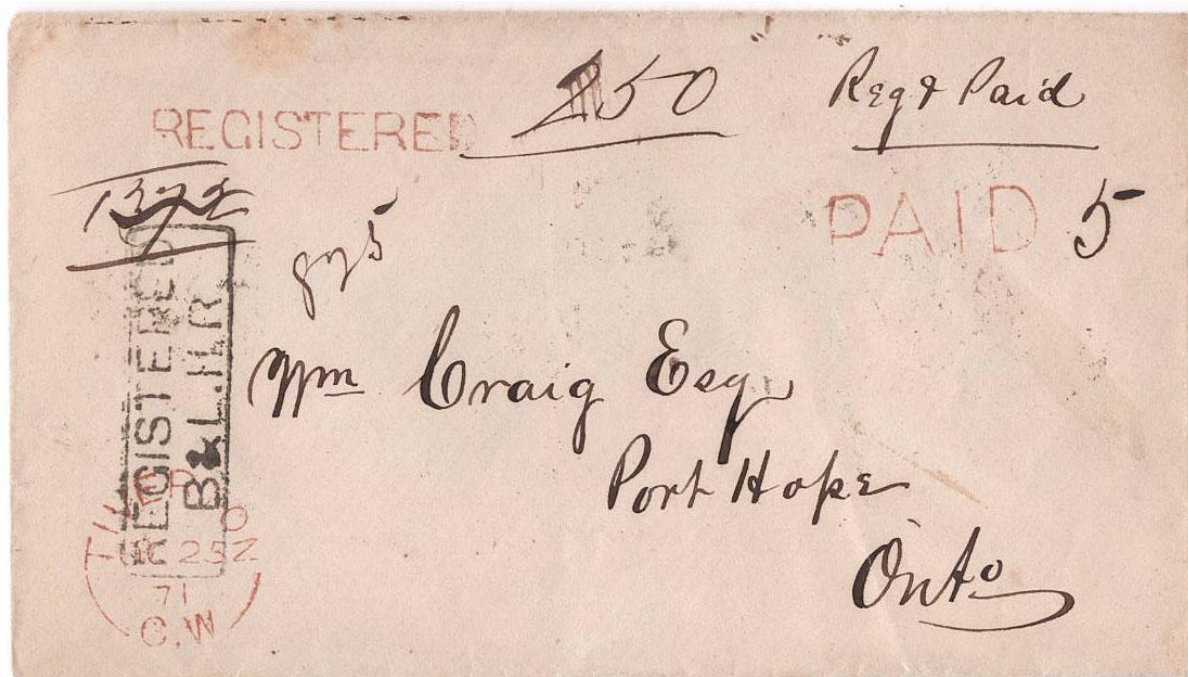
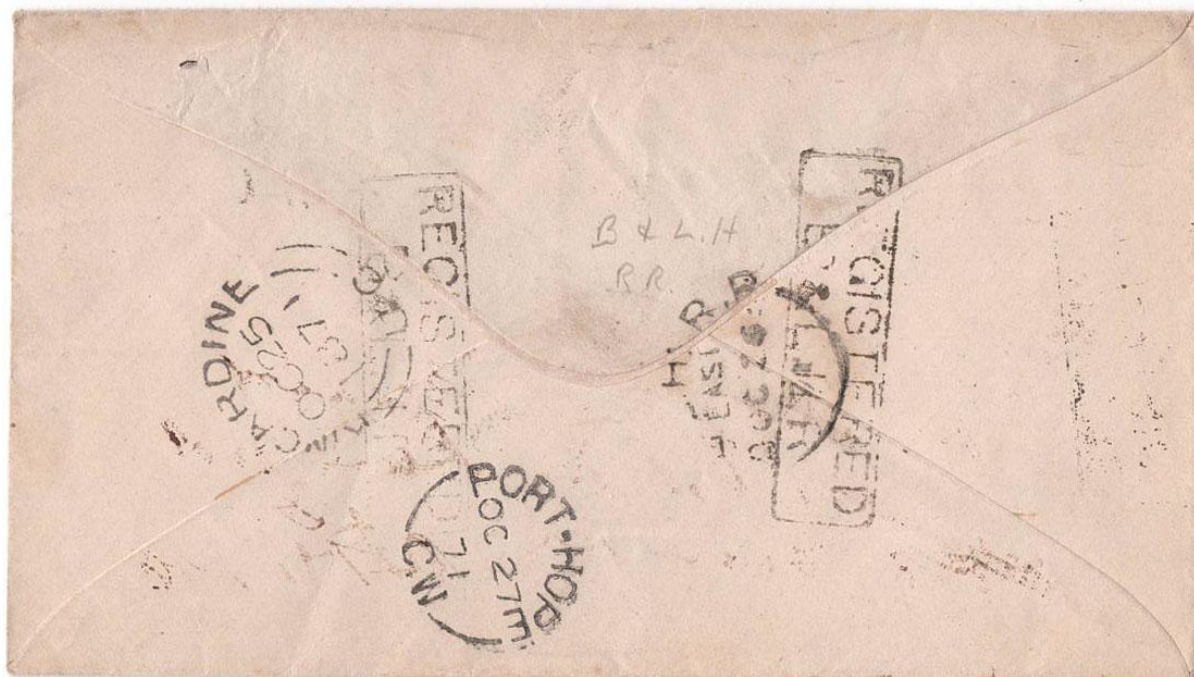
Item 619-09 – Kingston UC to Vermont, Roman numeral "X" – 1849, folded letter from Kingston UC to Vermont via Cape Vincent NY exchange. Roman numeral "X" U.S. postage due, no BNA postage required as posted at an exchange office, 10¢ US collect for a distance under 300 miles. The letter is of legal nature and relates to R.R. & Co. settlement and debt litigation. Staining. \$50.00 **SOLD**



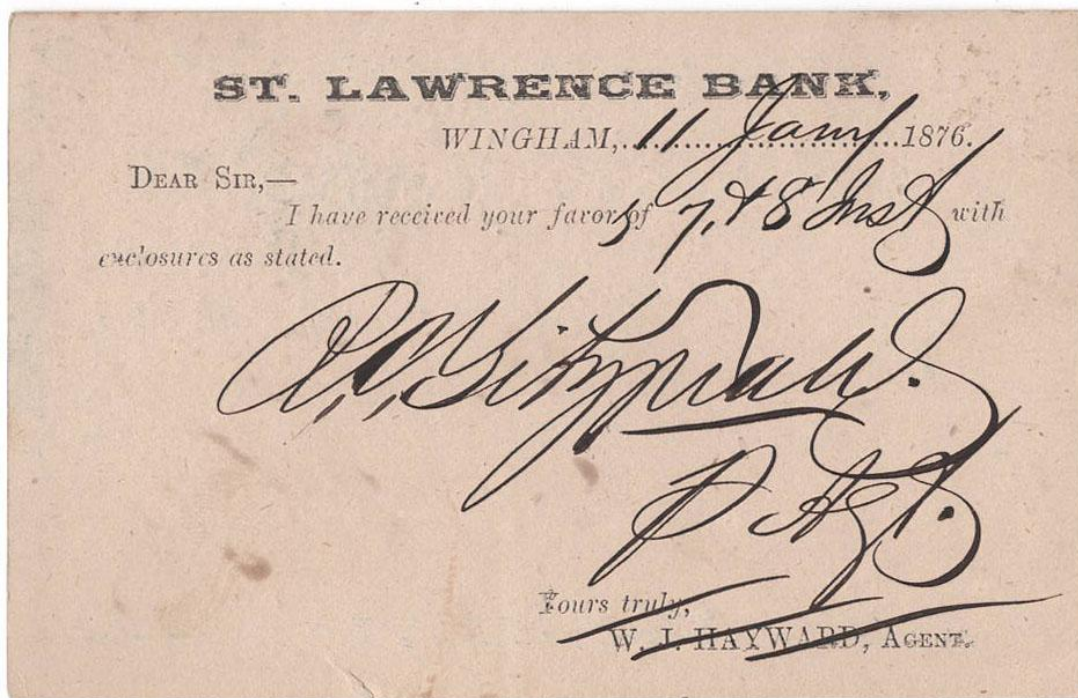
Item 619-10 – **House of Commons Consort cover** – 1867, 10¢ Consort (a late printing order, 23C, claret) tied by Ottawa CW Berri duplex cancel on House of Commons cover paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Maine. Routed via Montreal (b/s). The cover is signed by John Bolton (MP for New Brunswick). \$600.00



Item 619-11 – **Eden Grove Ont ERD (Bruce)** – 1886, 3¢ SQ tied by matching Eden Grove Ont broken circle, 2¢ RLS with Registered straightline on cover paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Walkerton (b/s). This Eden Grove hammer 1 is the earliest recorded date by an impressive 5 years. \$100.00 **SOLD**



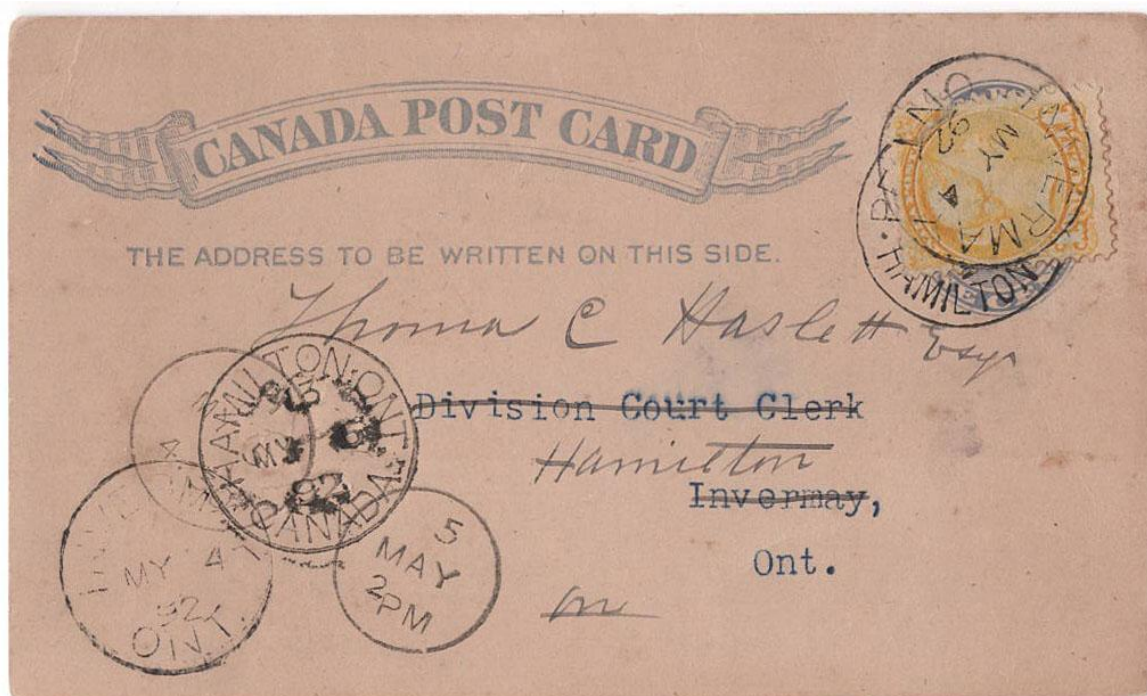
Item 619-12 – Tiverton CW via B&LHR – 1871, stampless registered cover from Tiverton CW paid 5 to Port Hope (b/s). Fully prepaid and routed via Kincardine (b/s). Then, carried by B&LHR Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway. RY-6 (1869-1875), RY-7 (1870-1875). The wow and rare part on this cover is the boxed *Registered B&LHR* applied on front of cover. A solid cover for exhibition. \$375.00 **SOLD**



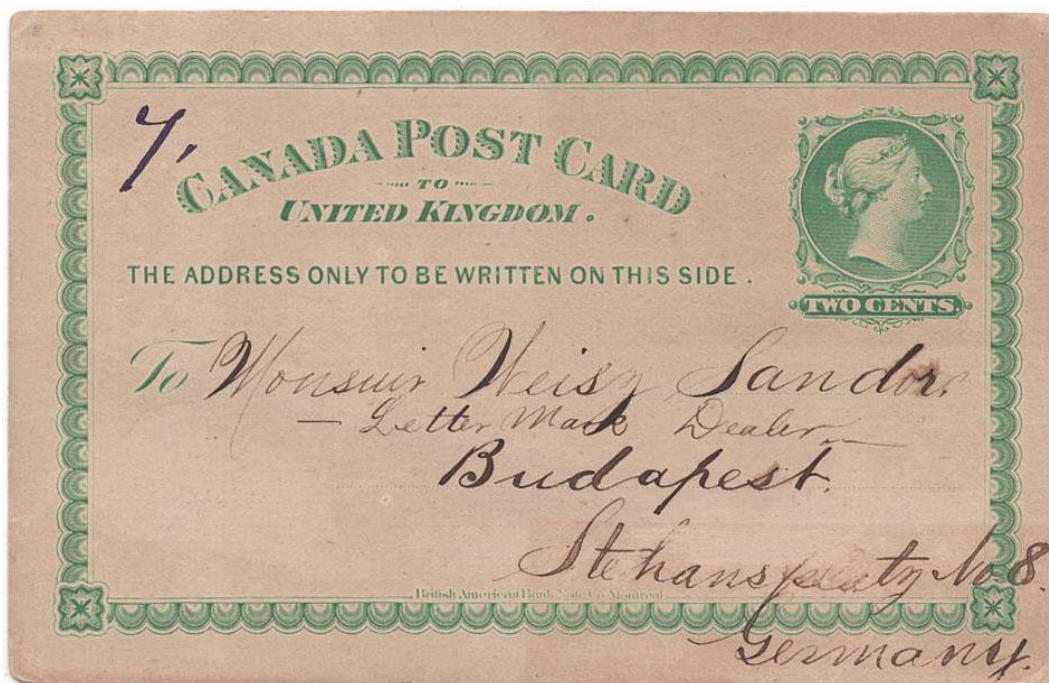
Item 619-13 – **Wingham Ont fancy cross (Lacelle 1163)** – 1876, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Wingham Ont, fancy cancel Lacelle 1163, to Kingston. St. Lawrence Bank on reverse. \$75.00



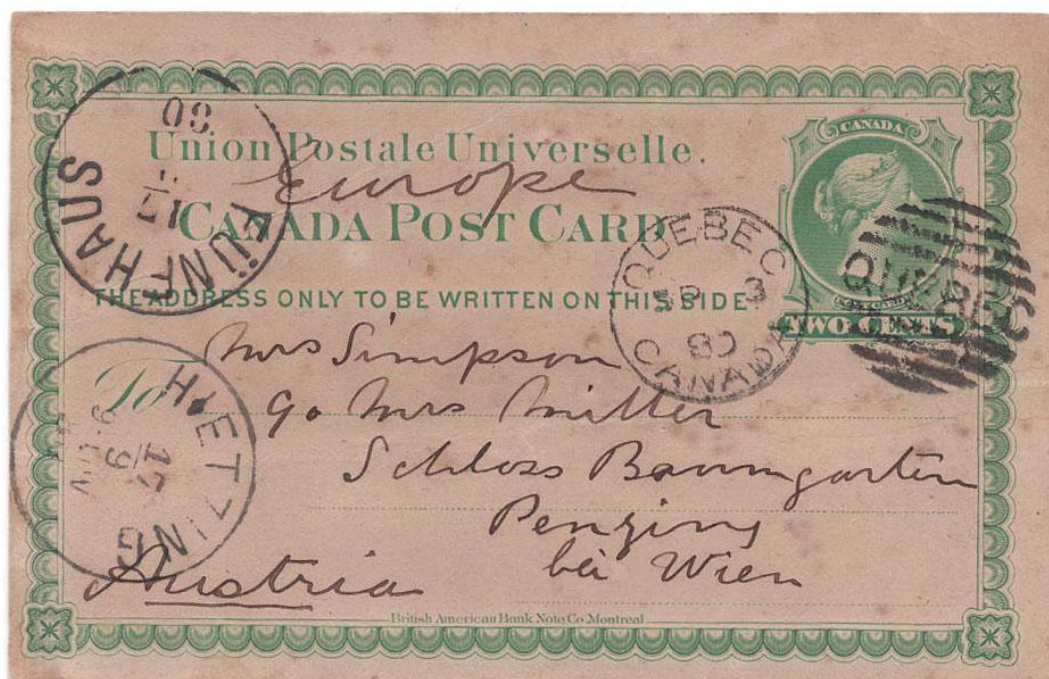
Item 619-14 – Kincardine Ont registered with fancy – 1891, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Kincardine Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Clinton (b/s). RPO (b/s). \$75.00



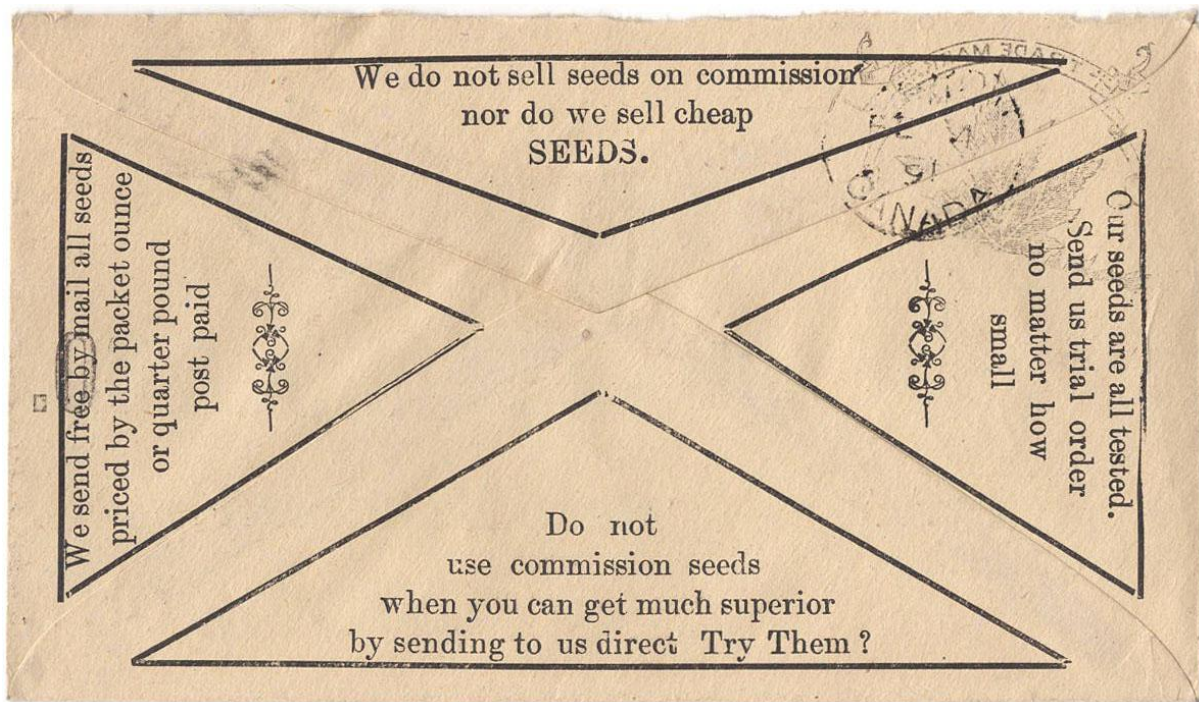
Item 619-15 – Pearl Street Hamilton remailed from Invermay Ont – 1892, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Pearl Street Hamilton to Invermay. Rемаiled from Invermay with 1¢ SQ paying the postcard rate to Hamilton. Then, delivered by letter carrier (2 attempts). The Postal Guide states that mail is not subject to any additional charge when redirected from one Post Office to another Post Office in Canada. Reposting mail in this way was also unauthorized, but I agree, since I have seen a few, that it was tolerated. Very scarce. \$200.00 **SOLD**



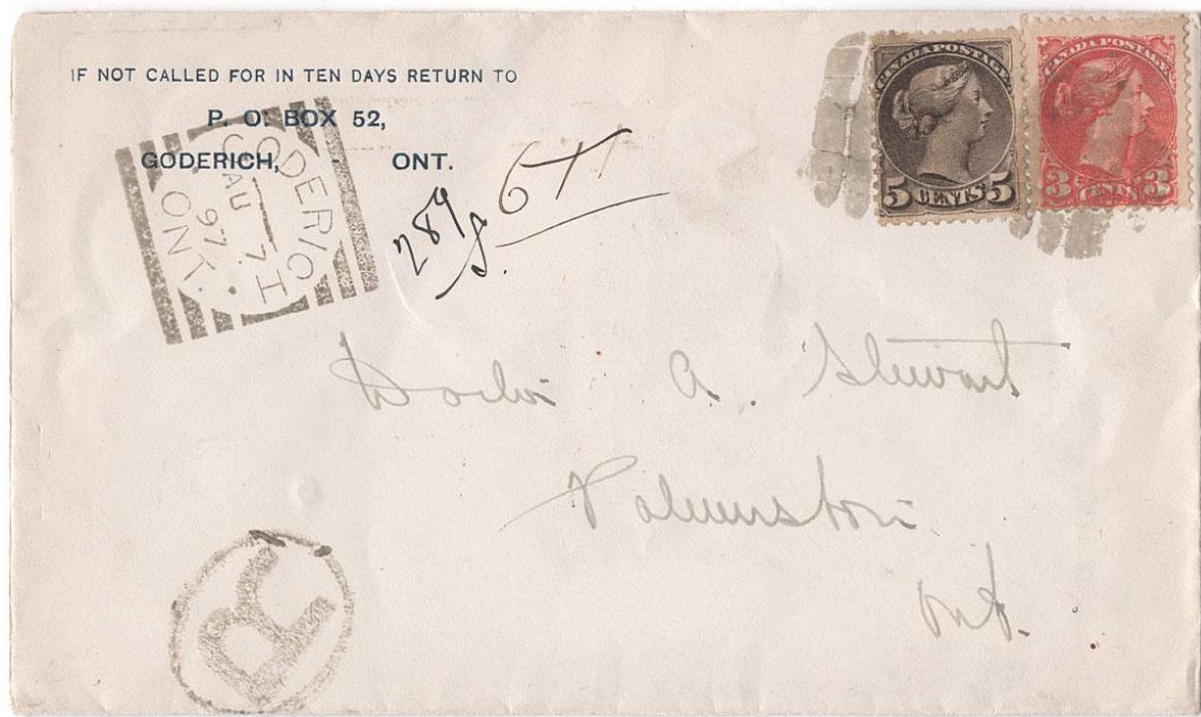
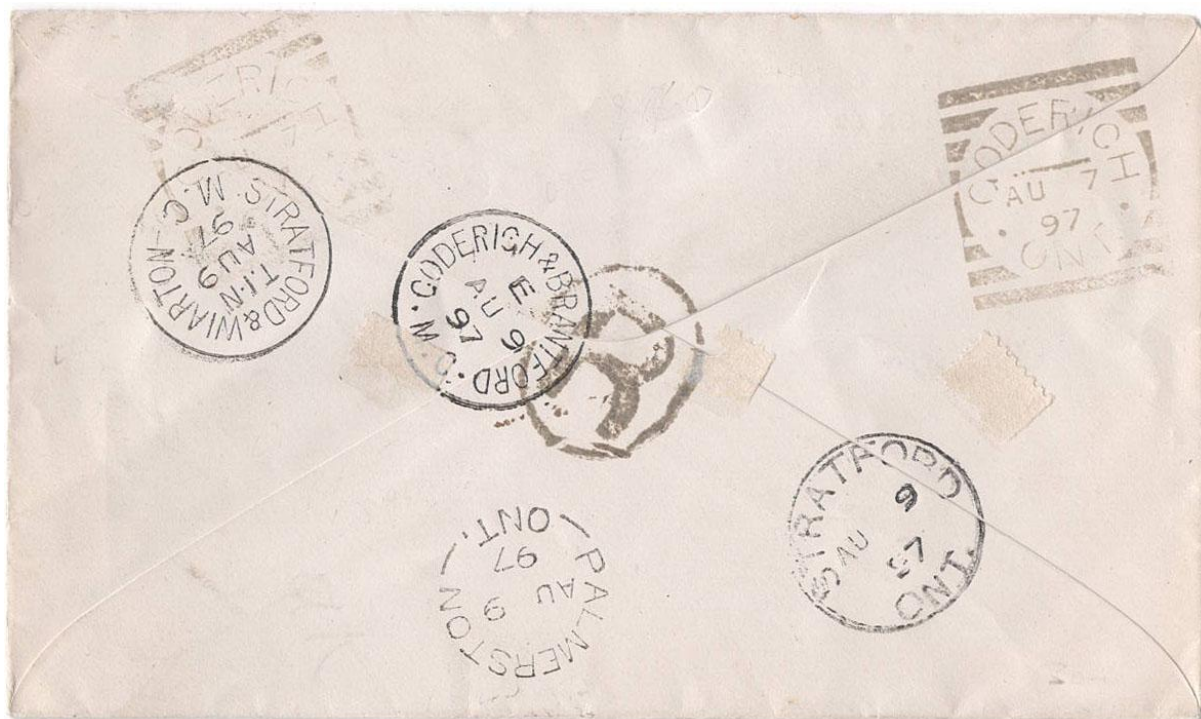
Item 619-16 – **Whitby Ont - UK card P3 to Budapest** – 1882, 2¢ UK stationery card mailed from Whitby Ont paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Budapest, Hungary via London England (b/s). When Hungary was part of Germany. These cards were to be used for transmission to the United Kingdom. In 1882, they were not forbidden. The message is stamp related. \$100.00



Item 619-17 – **Quebec unofficial duplex - 2¢ UPU to Vienna** – 1880, 2¢ UPU stationery card mailed from Quebec Que paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Vienna, Austria via London, England (b/s). Very pretty unofficial duplex cancel, Cloutier DUN-82 recorded from June 1880 to April 1881 only. Full circle dater in combination with 8-bar obliterator enclosing 'QUEBEC'. An early example, P4 was issued August 1879. \$100.00



Item 619-18 – **John Pearce & Co Seeds** – 1891, 3¢ SQ tied by Sarnia Ont duplex cancel on J.S. Pearce & Co. Seed Merchants reply cover paying 3¢ letter rate to London (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 619-19 – **Goderich squared circle registered cover** – 1897, 3c, 5c SQ tied by fancy cancel on cover from Goderich, squared circle AU 7 97, paying 8c registered letter rate to Palmerston (b/s) via Stratford (b/s). Goderich & Brantford MC, Stratford & Warton MC T1N (b/s). \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 619-20 – **Harrow Ont (Essex County office, hammer III)** – 1896, 8¢ SQ tied by Harrow Ont broken circle on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Carried by Walkerville & Leamington MC West. This is the hammer III for Harrow with a period after ont (1893-1897). \$60.00 **SOLD**

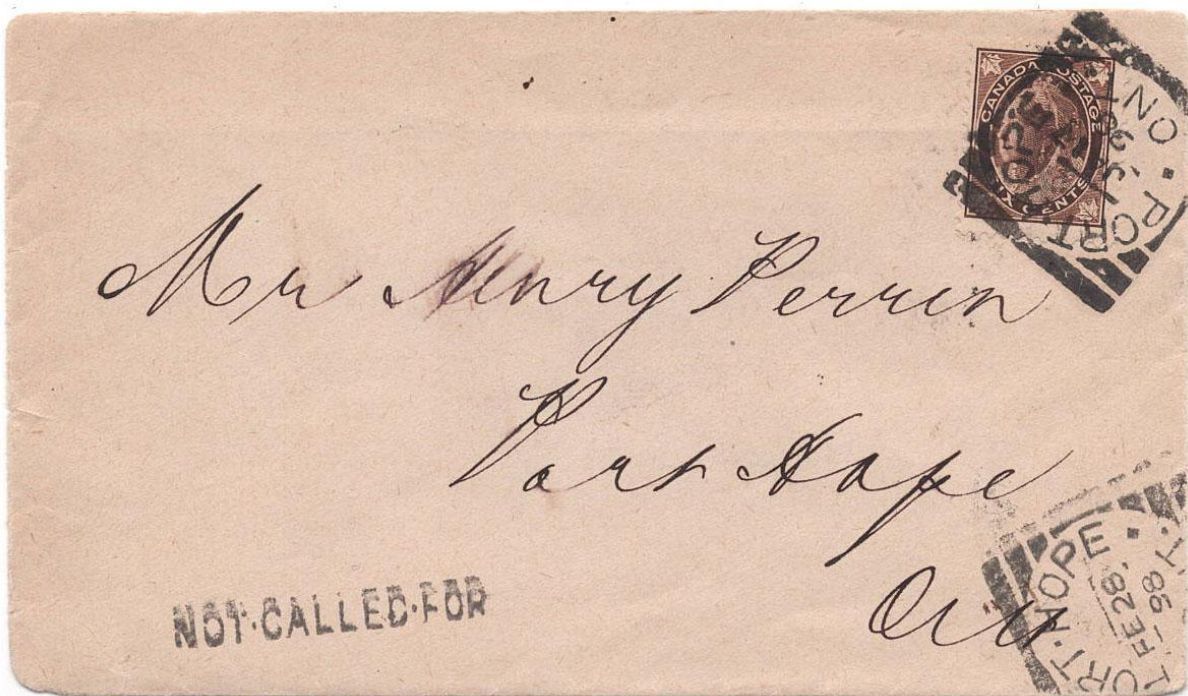

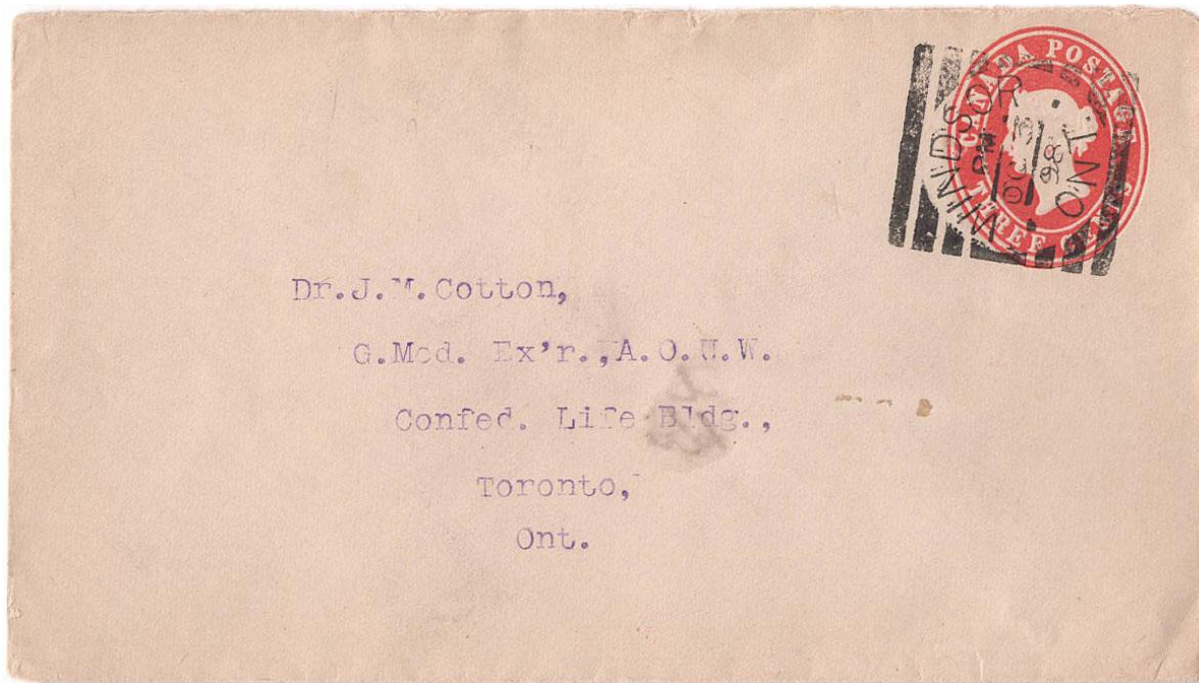

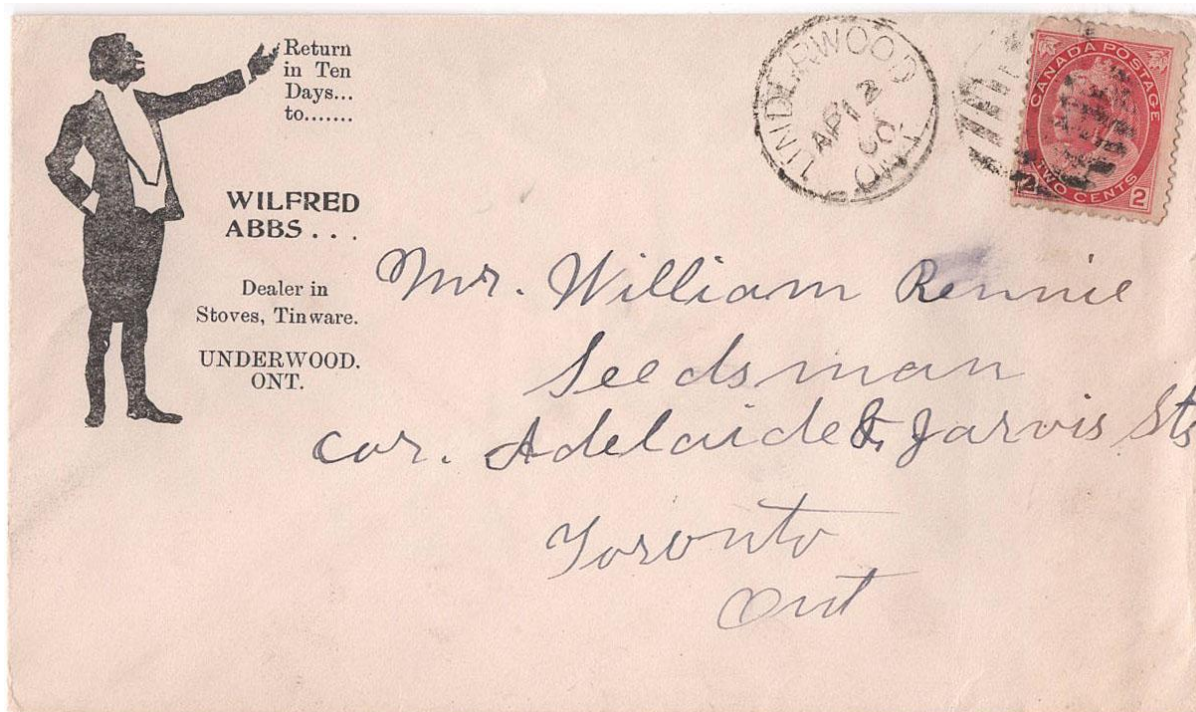
Item 619-23 – **Maritime Nail Co. Jubilee advertising** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by St. John North NB cds on Maritime Nail Co. advertising cover, wire nails and tacks, paying 3¢ letter rate to Dartmouth (b/s). Rare. \$200.00



Item 619-24 – Port Hope 6¢ registered drop - Dead Letter Office – 1898, 6¢ Maple Leaf tied by Port Hope Ont squared circle on Midland Trust Company cover, dated JA 17 98, paying 6¢ registered drop letter rate (b/s). Not called for and forwarded on FE 28 98 to the Dead Letter Office (b/s). A real wow cover! \$700.00



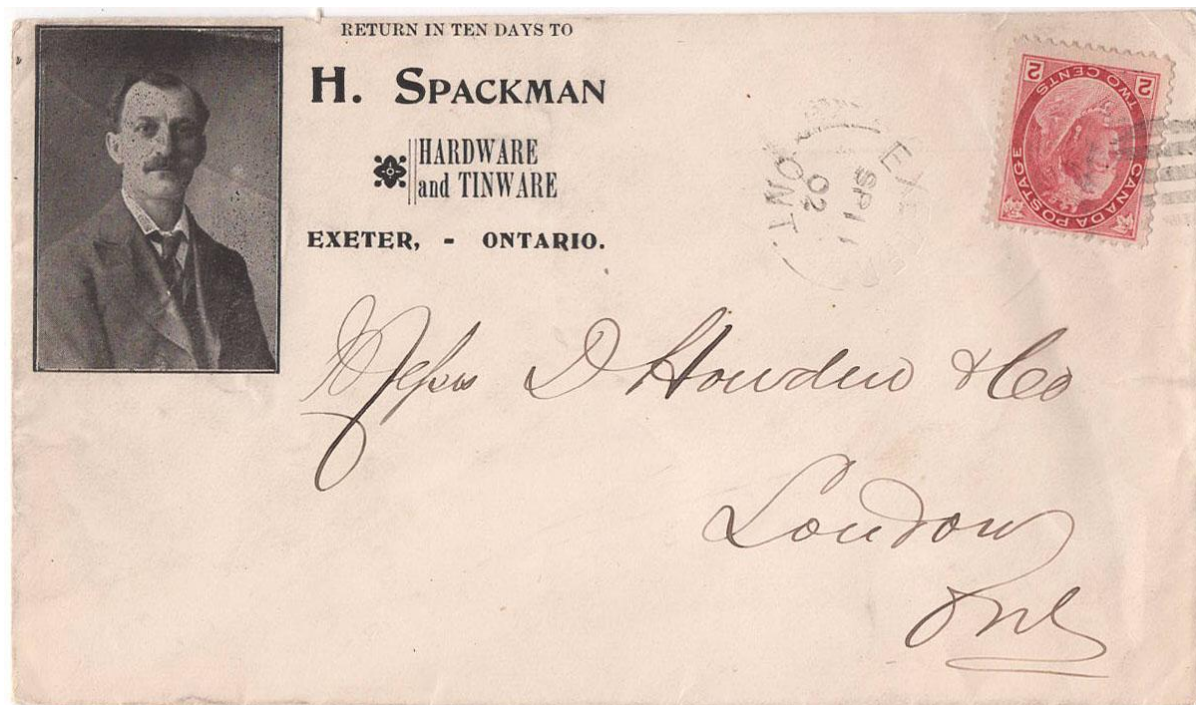

Item 619-28 – **Spackman Hardware – Exeter Ontario** – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on H. Spackman Hardware & Tinware advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to London (b/s). Huron County. \$125.00




Item 619-29 – **5¢ third class matter rate to Goderich** – c1900, 2¢ Numeral pair tied by lovely fancy cancels on 1¢ postband paying 5¢ third class matter rate to Goderich. The third class matter section of the Postal Guide states that this rate shall be used for newspapers and periodicals not entitled to any special statutory privilege of the 2nd class matter. Including unsold copies of newspapers, sample merchandise, deeds and mortgages. The wrapper is addressed to an Attorney at Law (Esq). \$100.00 **SOLD**



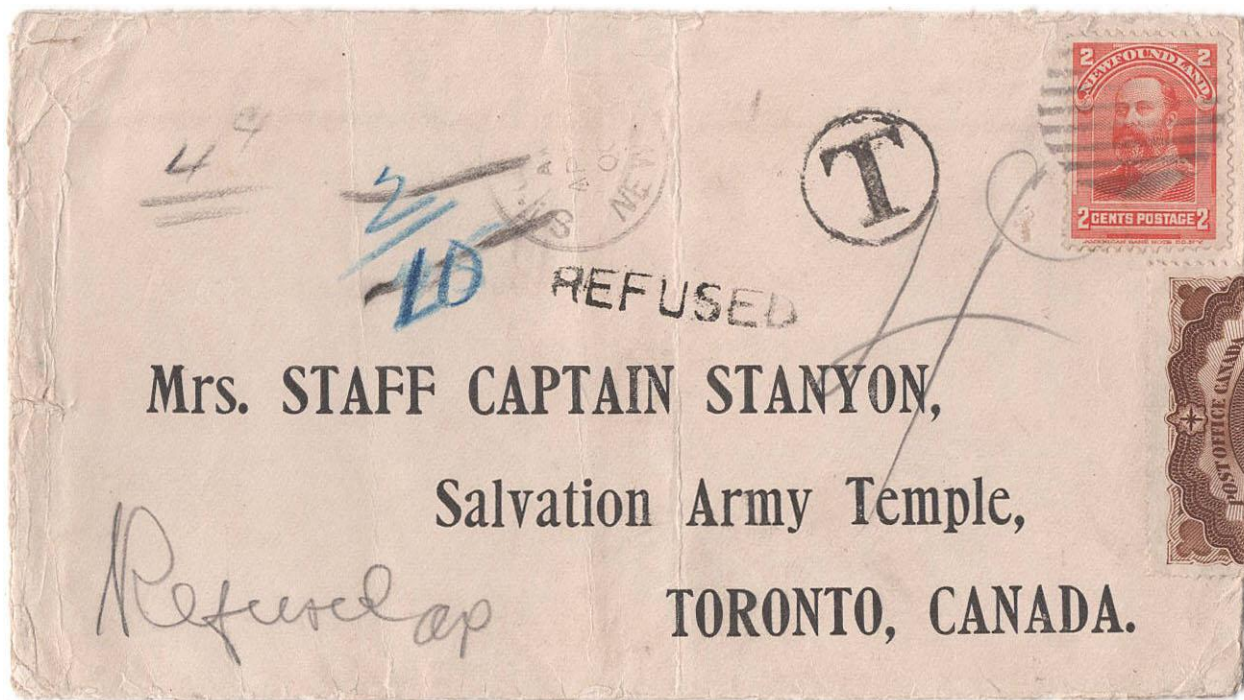

Refused and opened at Toronto AP 28 00. The letter was rated 4¢ seemingly a 2¢ double wgt letter deficiency. As there was no return address, the cover was forwarded to the Dead Letter Office MY 18 00. It was opened and resealed JU 6 00 and sealed and tied with a single example of Canada OX1. VGG cert 23972 genuine in all respect. Ex Stan Lum. \$4,500.00

Censored with civil censorship handstamp. \$60.00 **SOLD**



Item 619-41 – **Royal Muskoka Dock – Way Letter** – 1927, Lake Rouseau postcard endorsed "Royal Muskoka Dock" franked with 2¢ Confederation, sent as a Way Letter, entered in Toronto, to Detroit Michigan. \$60.00 **SOLD**



Item 619-42 – **Chatham McCorvie Store** – 1934, 3¢ Medaillon tied by Chatham Ont machine cancel on McCorvie Store advertising cover (John McCorvie & Son) paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. Very scarce. \$50.00



Item 619-43 – **2¢ brown "Specimen Only" private order ENX33-6** – c1933, 2¢ brown Medaillon private order stationery envelope, Public Utilities Commission Brockville c/c, Dominion Envelopes Ltd oval "Special Only" handstamp with initials. \$75.00



Item 619-44 – **Ambulance cover from Halifax** – 1936, Returned Dead Letter ambulance cover, form 5D 200,000 11-9-35 mailed from Halifax to Port Elgin. Charged 3¢ and properly paid at destination. \$100.00



Item 619-45 – **12¢ registered postcard rate with coil** – 1941, 1¢ Mufti coils (2), 10¢ Special Delivery E7 tied by grid cancel on postcard from Kearney Ont paying 12¢ special delivery postcard rate to Toronto. A rare E7 use on postcard along with coils, just wow!. \$175.00



Item 619-46 – **London 9¢ 3rd class matter rate** – 1939, 1¢, 8¢ Mufti tied by London Canada cds on unaddressed mailing tag paying 9¢ 3rd class matter rate fo 36 to Crediton. London & Wingham RPO train 603 (b/s). It is not a parcel post mailing tag because 9¢ represents a 4th class matter matter rate for 3 pounds within Ontario, for a 20 miles radius or less destination. London to Crediton is 31 miles. An exceedingly scarce Mufti franking. \$100.00



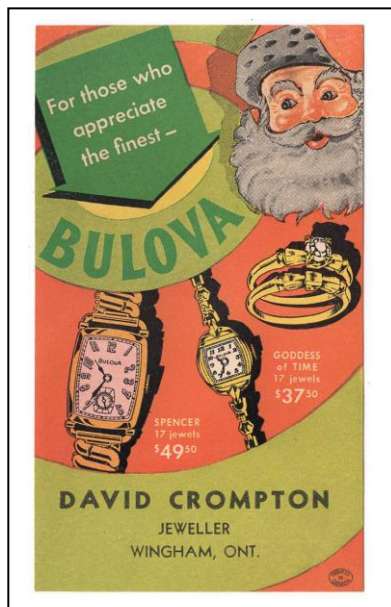
Item 619-47 – **Y Force (No.6) - Jamaica to Niagara Falls** - 1942, Jamaica 2d tied by Kingston Jamaica machine cancel on cover paying the reduced 2d surface letter rate to Niagara Falls. Military censor "Y" Force handstamp No.6. The cover is from Pte J.D. Cook, B46258 HQ Company. In 1940, British forces in Jamaica were withdrawn and Canadian troops known as the "Y" force were sent to replace them and took over the British bases. Canadians did not have their own postal facilities, mail posted by troops was taken to the Jamaican P.O. and required Jamaican postage stamps. Slightly reduced at left. \$75.00



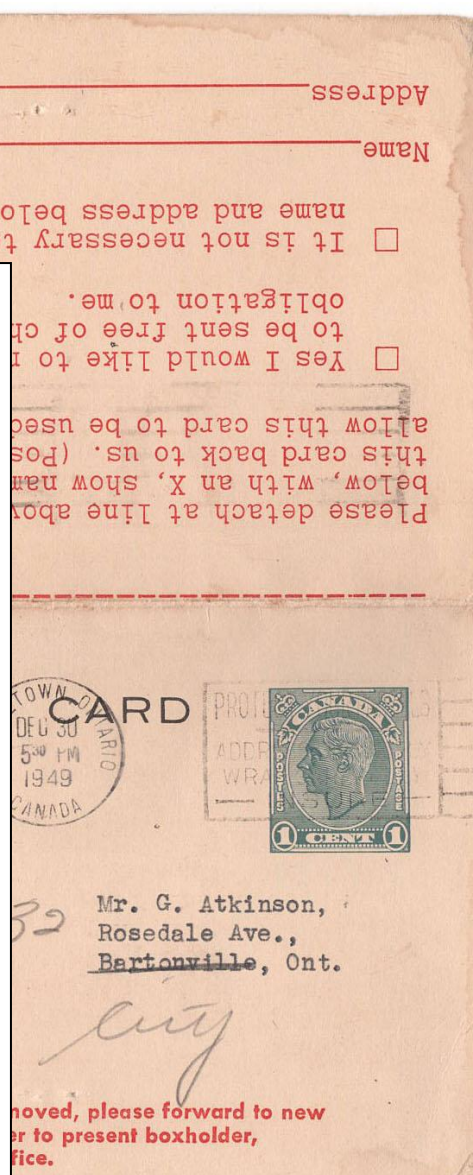
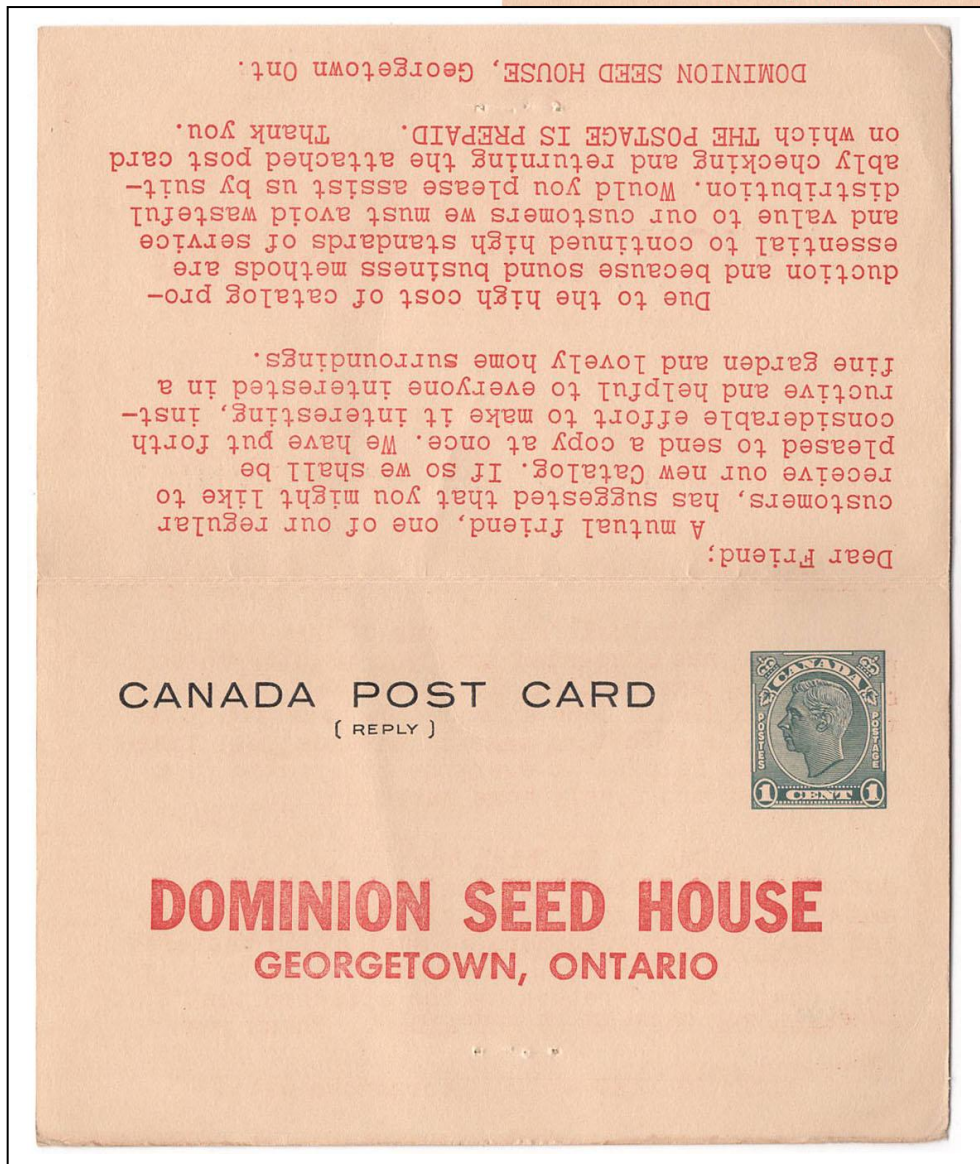
Item 619-48 – **Y Force (No.1) Jamaica to Hamilton** – 1941, Jamaica 1/4 tied by Kingston Jamaica machine cancel on cover paying 1/4 airmail letter rate for 1oz to Hamilton. Military censor "Y" Force handstamp No.1. The cover is from F.J.M. McLean. In May 1942, the airmail rate to Canada was reduced to 6d per 1 oz. A lovely mate to the above cover. \$75.00



Item 619-49 – **Mildmay Ont special delivery (Bruce County)** – 1944, 4¢ War, 10¢ Special Delivery E10 tied by Mildway Ont cds on cover paying 14¢ special delivery letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). \$30.00



Item 619-50 – **Bulova Santa Claus card to boxholder** – 1945, 1¢ GEOVI unaddressed stationery card, reverse with Bulova and Crompton Jeweller advertising, mailed from Wingham to every boxholders/householders. \$100.00



Item 619-51 – **Dominion Seed House stationery with reply attached** – 1949, 1¢ GEOVI stationery card with printed Dominion Seed House, typewritten message, mailed from Georgetown paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Bartonville. Redirected to within the city. Reply card still attached, it reads in part: due to the high cost of catalog production ... we must avoid wasteful distribution, please fill the card etc etc... A very scarce seed company card. \$50.00



Item 619-52 – **Middle East Air Force in Cyprus** – 1951, 1¢, 3¢ War tied by Kincardine Ont machine cancel on cover to Abyad military forces in Cyprus. Nicosia transit and Field Post Office 164 receiver (b/s). \$75.00
