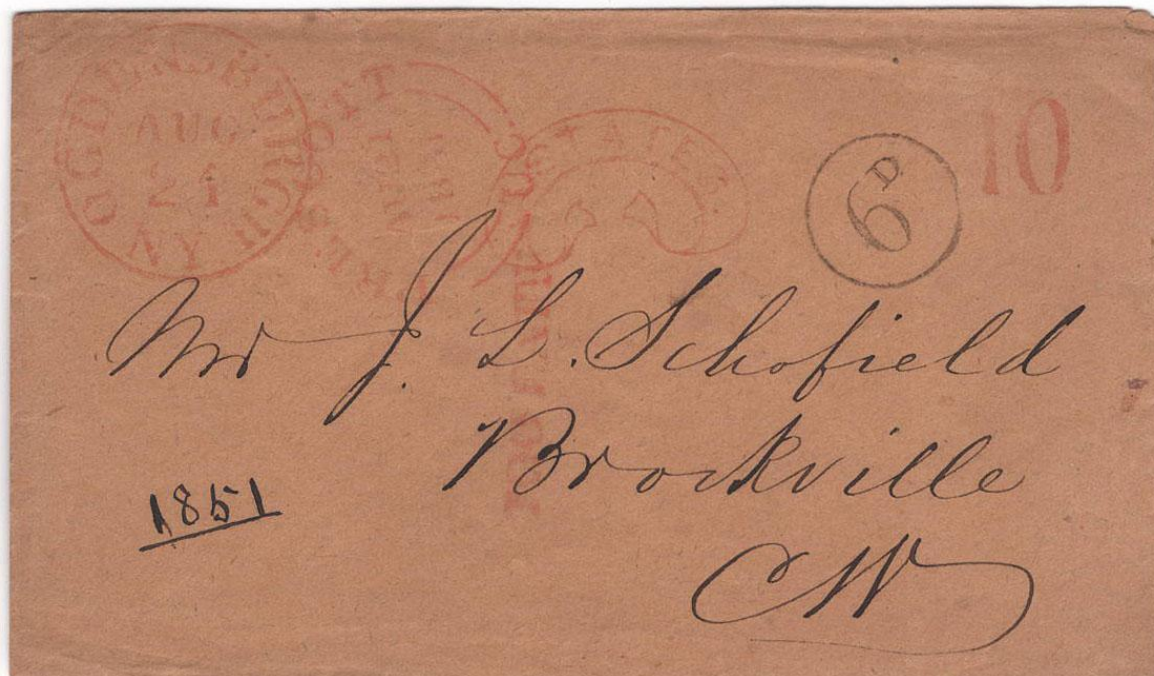

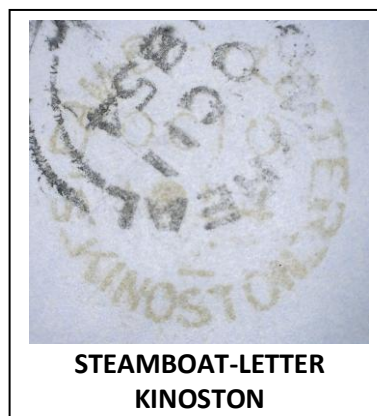




Item 620-01 – **New York to Quebec delivered April 7 1851** – 1851, family letter from New York to Quebec LC paid 10 Cts to the lines and 11½d to Quebec (b/s, AP 7). Routed via Montreal AP 4 51. On April 6, 1851, Canada adopted a uniform rate of 3d per ½ oz irrespective on distance, and the rate to or from the U.S. became 10¢ or 6d. This cover was mailed before the rate changes became effective and was delivered on April 7, the day after. The letter is between brothers and relates to trade, money and telegraph message. Interesting!. \$150.00



Item 620-02 – **Ogdensburgh NY to Brockville** – 1851, stampless cover from Ogdensburgh NY rated 10¢ to Brockville (b/s), exchanged in Prescott with U.S. ribbon in arc in red and 6d in black. Too late in Prescott and forwarded the next date. An interesting too late cross border cover. \$100.00



Item 620-03 – **Steamboat Letter Kinoston No.2 – error handstamp** – 1854, stampless cover from Port Hope UC rated 3d to Quebec (b/s). Carried by one of the Upper St. Lawrence steamboats plying between Kingston and Montreal with the error handstamp No.2 “Steamboat Letter Kingston” OC 10 54. The conductor hammer No.2 was proofed with this error in 1847 and never corrected. Routed via Montreal (b/s). Kingston had conductor hammer 1 to 6. \$500.00



Item 620-04 – **Ridgway NY to Brantford UC** – 1837, business letter datelined Rochester SE 2 37, mailed from Ridgway NY with manuscript postmark, exchanged via Lewiston and Queenston. Rated 10¢ converted to 6d plus 7d to Brantford total 1/1. \$150.00



Item 620-05 – **Toronto to Providence R.I. 3d, 6d** – 1851, family letter from Toronto, datelined Locust Park JU 28 51 (today in Markham), mailed from Toronto rated 3d struckout by concentric ring cancel and rerated 6d paying the cross border rate to Providence R.I. Canada arc exchange marking. \$75.00



Item 620-06 – England to Chatham UC, Western District – 1843, family letter dated JY 21 43 from Westlington England (Buckinghamshire) to Chatham UC. Mailed from Walmsgate York and routed via York. Outgoing black crowned Ship Letter Liverpool (b/s), carried by private trade to New York. Paid 8d, manuscript “By Ship”, entered in New York as ship letter and sent to Lewiston/Queenston exchange. Rated 18¾¢ plus 2¢ ship total due 20¾¢ converted to 1/5 plus 9d total 2/2 total collect. Received in Chatham SP 15 43. The delay in transit between Liverpool and New York by private ship cannot be explained. \$250.00



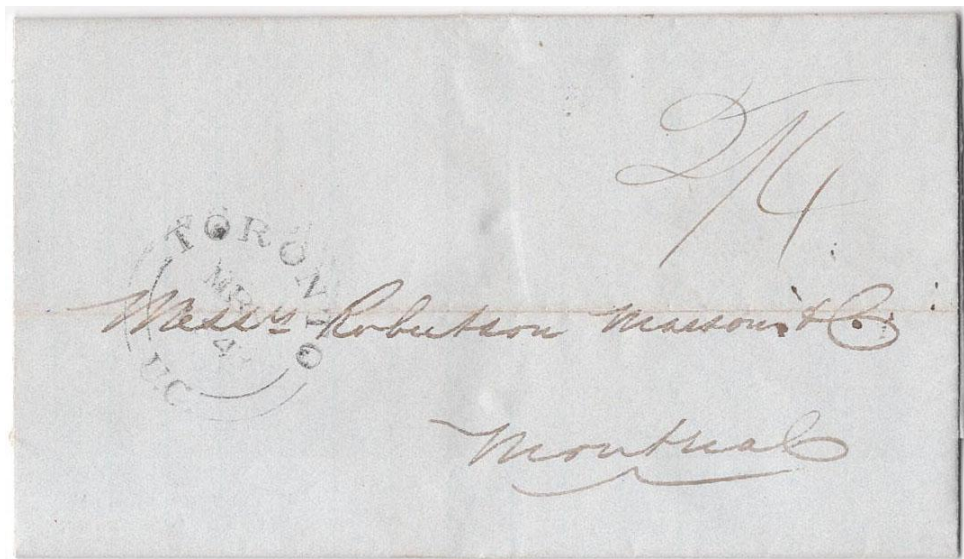
Item 620-07 – **Edmonstone & Allan Co. internal correspondence (Allan Royal Mail Line)** – 1858-9, correspondence of 21 letters and folded covers (13 with content) all from the Allan Line manager located in Portland addressed to the head office in Montreal. All rated 6d and carried by GTR to Montreal (b/s). A few lines on contents: 7 cars lost on a special train to Montreal and Quebec City, bridge issue related and problems getting shipment due to Sherbrooke caused by bridge works, paperwork issue and delayed, ship stones related, prices current on molasses and other goods, Allan Line Anglo Saxon steamship and goods, ship manifest and goods, relates to missing package sent to Toronto and Iron from the City of Hamilton, a box shipped to Toronto by the Anglo Saxon and cargo for the Allan Line Indian, a package for Mr. Allan, copper in Island Pond Vermont. A spectacular lot of Allan Line letters providing inside information on their operations etc. \$750.00



Item 620-08 – St. Vincent UC Money Letter to Toronto and Quebec – 1851, folded cover Money Letter from St. Vincent UC paid 6 to Toronto (b/s) via Barrie (b/s). St. Vincent, a Grey County office 1841-1865, later Meaford. Redirected to Quebec (b/s) the same day after re-rating it collect 6d in black. Interestingly, the Money Letter in black has the narrow N and the second in red has the normal N. A very scarce office. \$250.00 **SOLD**

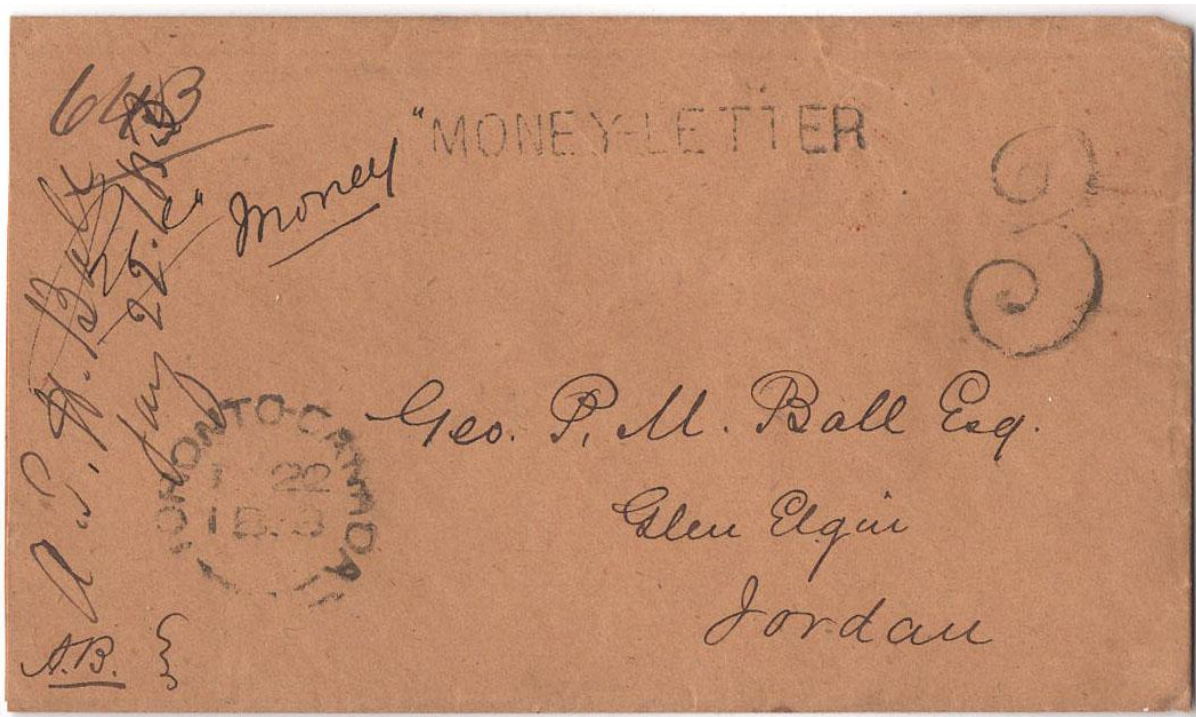


Item 620-09 – **A rare US to Canada Money Letter** – 1851, business folded letter from Niagara Falls NY paid 10¢ to Canada, exchanged via Lewiston and Queenston, rated 4½d collect to Jordan. Endorsed “Money” with Money Letter handstamp applied at the Canada exchange of Queenston. A glaring example of the disparity in rates and charged in both countries. 5 miles distance to Canada and 19 miles from the line to Jordan although being adjoining or exchange offices. If the rate from Niagara Falls NY to the border was 10¢, it must have been a double-wgt letter. The rate from Queenston to Jordan should also have been double 4½d, total 9d. Perhaps the sender was trying to prepay the whole shot for delivery in Canada and the 4½d should not have been added. An interesting and rare money letter incoming to Canada with a Canadian handstamp. A must have to exhibitor. Ex Harrison (exhibit *red dot page*) and published in 1987 PHSC 51. \$1,250.00



Item 620-10 – **Toronto huge 2/4 collect** – 1843, folded letter from the Bank of Montreal of Toronto, rated 2/4 collect to Montreal with no indication of money enclosure. The rate is representing a double 1/2 for 376 miles (consisted of 2 sheets). While the exterior of this letter bears no indication of money enclosure, the letter did contain a draft in the amount of £142. This practice was sometimes followed to deter theft or to avoid additional postage. An additional 1/2 would have been charged here (*for 3 sheets including the draft*). \$100.00

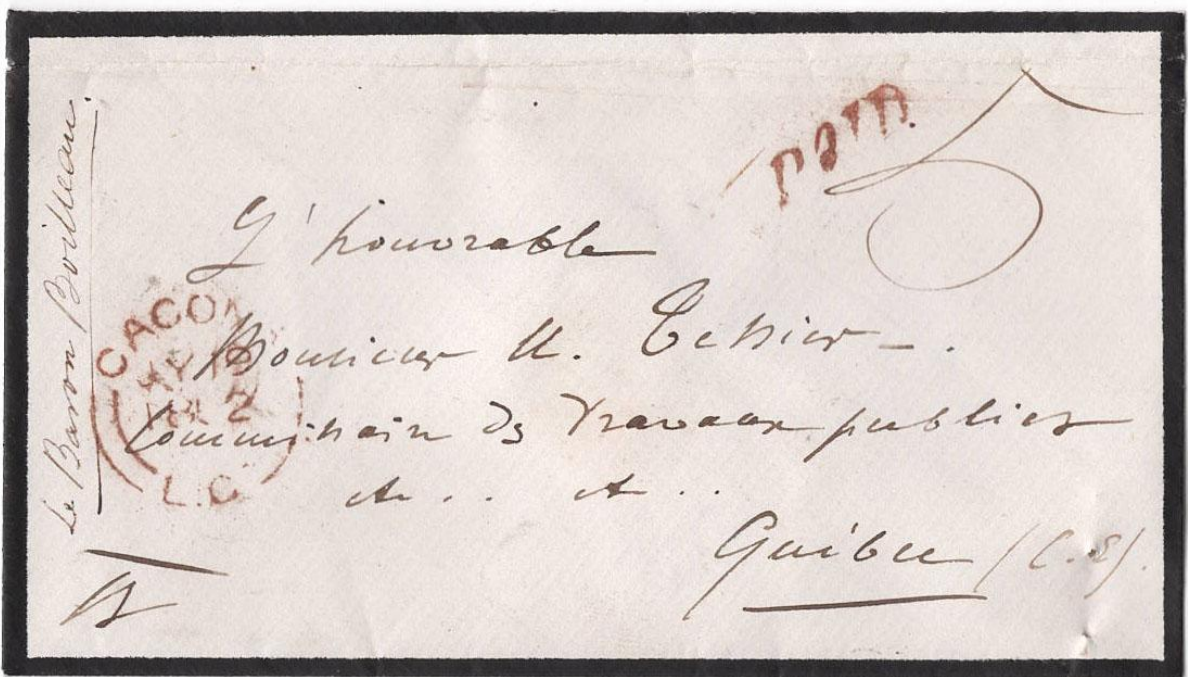




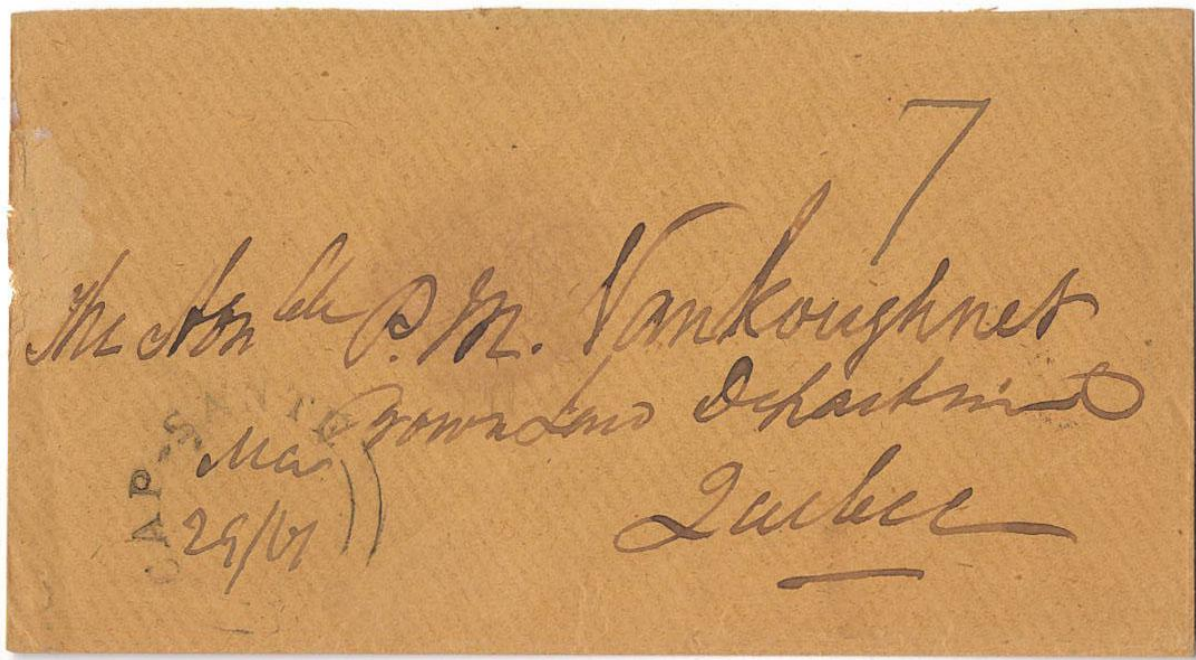
Item 620-11 – **Toronto Money Letter to Jordan (narrow N type)** – 1853, stampless cover from Toronto, Money Letter “the narrow N type”, rated 3d collect to Jordan (b/s) via Hamilton (b/s). \$100.00 **SOLD**



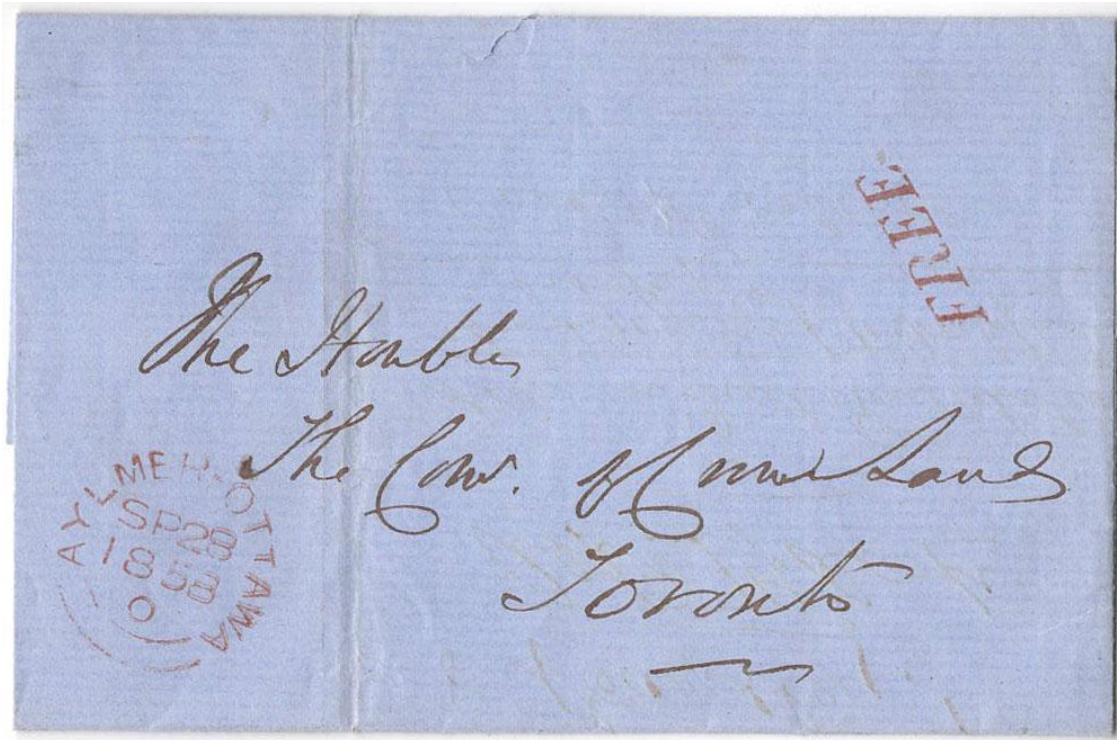
Item 620-12 – **Toronto Money Letter to Mono (narrow N type)** – 1851, stampless cover from Toronto, Money Letter “the narrow N type”, rated 3d collect to Mono. No backstamp. \$100.00



Item 620-13 – **Cacona LC (spelling error for Cacouna)** – 1862, mourning stampless cover from Cacouna LC paid 5 to Quebec (b/s). This is the Cacona hammer III with spelling error for Cacouna. A first spelling error exist Cocona recorded until 1851, then Cacona hammer II until 1851 and then Cacona III until 1865. Reverse with Baron Boilleau waxseal in black. \$125.00 **SOLD**



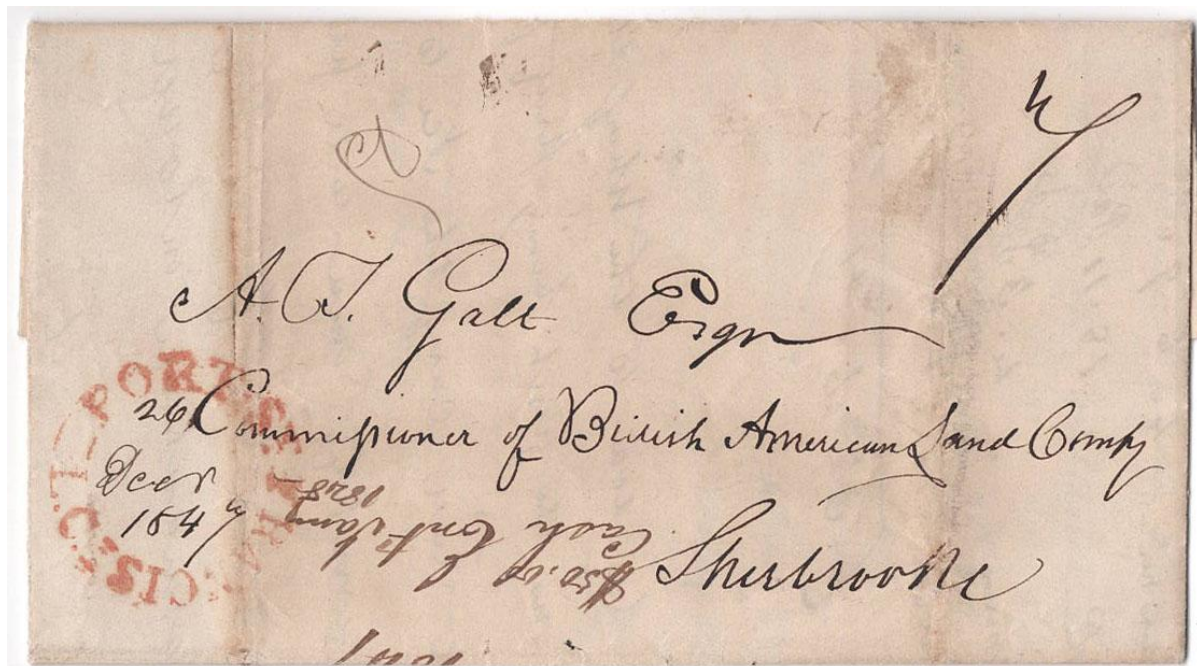
Item 620-14 – **Cap Sante LC (Portneuf)** – 1861, stampless cover from Cap Santé LC rated 7¢ collect to Quebec (b/s). A late use of the hammer I. \$60.00



Item 620-15 – **Aylmer Ottawa (Lower Canada)** – 1858, free franked folded cover from Aylmer Ottawa to Toronto (b/s) via Ottawa (b/s). Nice strike of this Gatineau County. \$40.00 **SOLD**



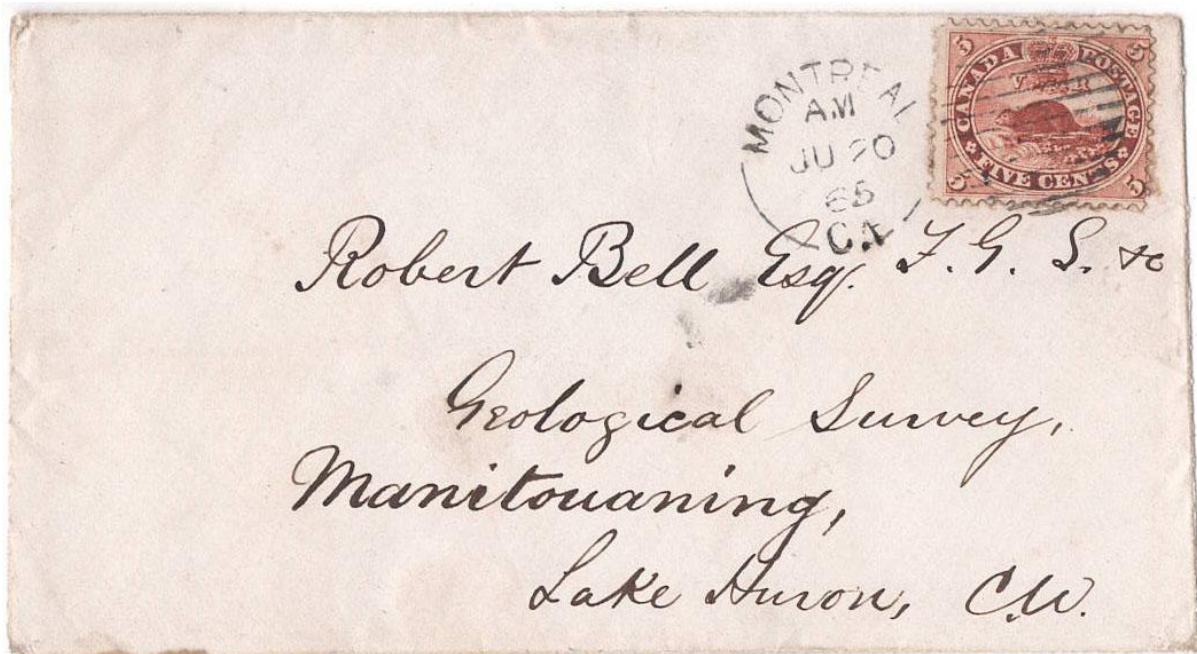
Item 620-16 – **Longueuil CE in red (South of Montreal)** – 1857, stampless cover from Longueuil CE initially rated 6d rerated 3d collect to Ste. Therese de Blainville. Montreal (b/s). A very scarce postmark. Chambly County. \$100.00



Item 620-17 – **Port St. Francis LC (letter to Alexander Galt, Sherbrooke)** – 1874, business letter from Port St. Francis LC (Nicolet County, 1839-1859) rated 7d collect to Sherbrooke (faint bs). The letter is from Smith Seith to Alexander Galt and relates to timber freight accounts etc. Sir Alexander Tilloch Galt (1817-1893) was a politician and Father of Confederation, the union of British North American colonies into Canada. Member of the Canadian Parliament for Town of Sherbrooke. \$250.00 **SOLD**

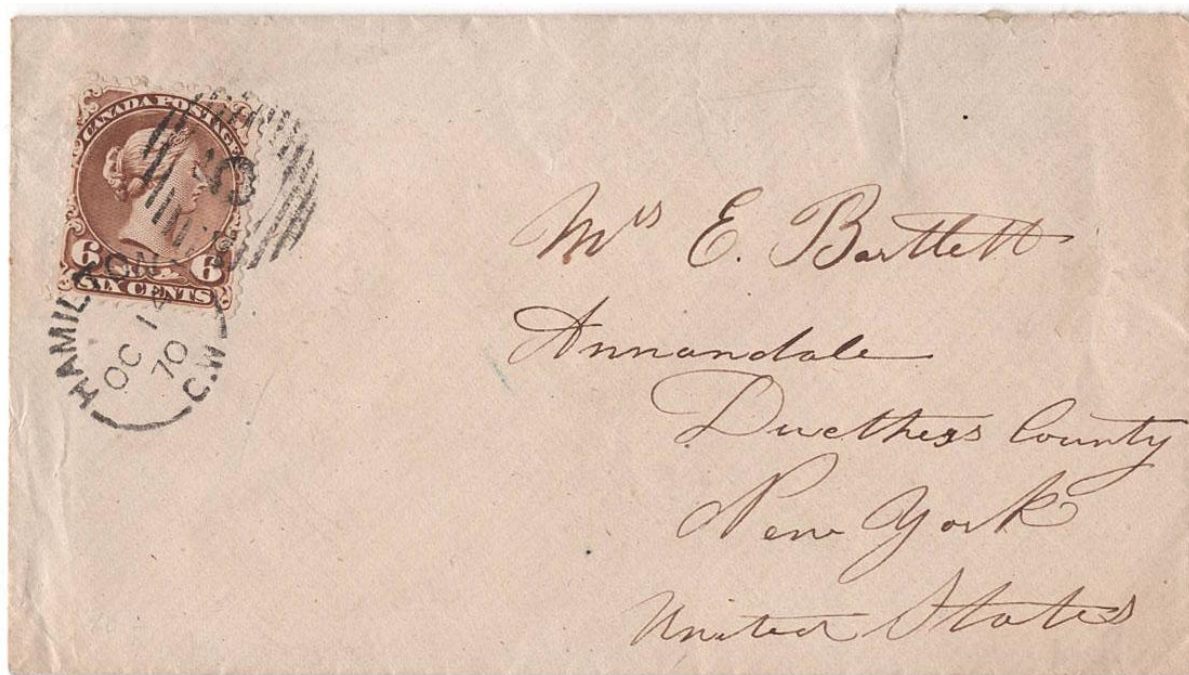


Item 620-18 – **Quebec Four-ring 37 – 12½¢ Allan Line to England** – 1861, 12½¢ Decimal tied by Four-ring 37 cancel on cover from Quebec LC paying 12½¢ Allan Line letter rate to London England. Carried by the North Briton from Portland to Liverpool. Some staining. \$300.00



Item 620-19 – **Robert Bell Surveyor - Manitowaning** – 1865, 5¢ Beaver (*position 95, state 7, re-entry 12a*) tied by Montreal CE duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ letter rate to Manitowaning, Lake Huron. Collingwood (b/s). Most likely carried by Georgian Bay summer steamboat. The cover is addressed to Robert Bell the provincial land surveyor. \$200.00

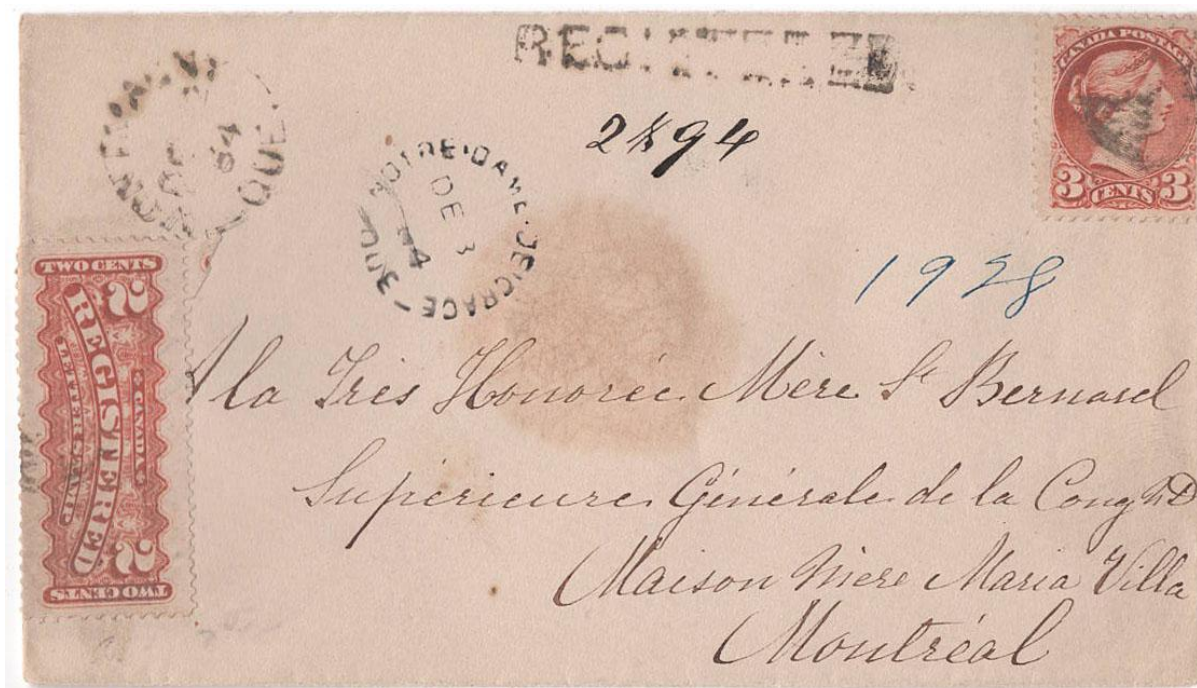

Item 620-20 – **Unofficial/Berri duplex ties 6¢ LQ** – 1870, 6¢ Large Queen tied by Hamilton CW unofficial duplex 5 cancel on cover, DUN-16 (*Berri duplex DBE-40, 1870-1873*), paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to New York. A very pretty strike. \$200.00



Item 620-21 – **1¢ SQ deep orange franking** – 1870, 1¢ SQ deep orange (6) tied by multiple Quebec CE duplex cancels on cover paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to England. Carried by the Scandinavian. Manchester and Wakefield (b/s). Some stamp over the edge affecting perfs. \$400.00



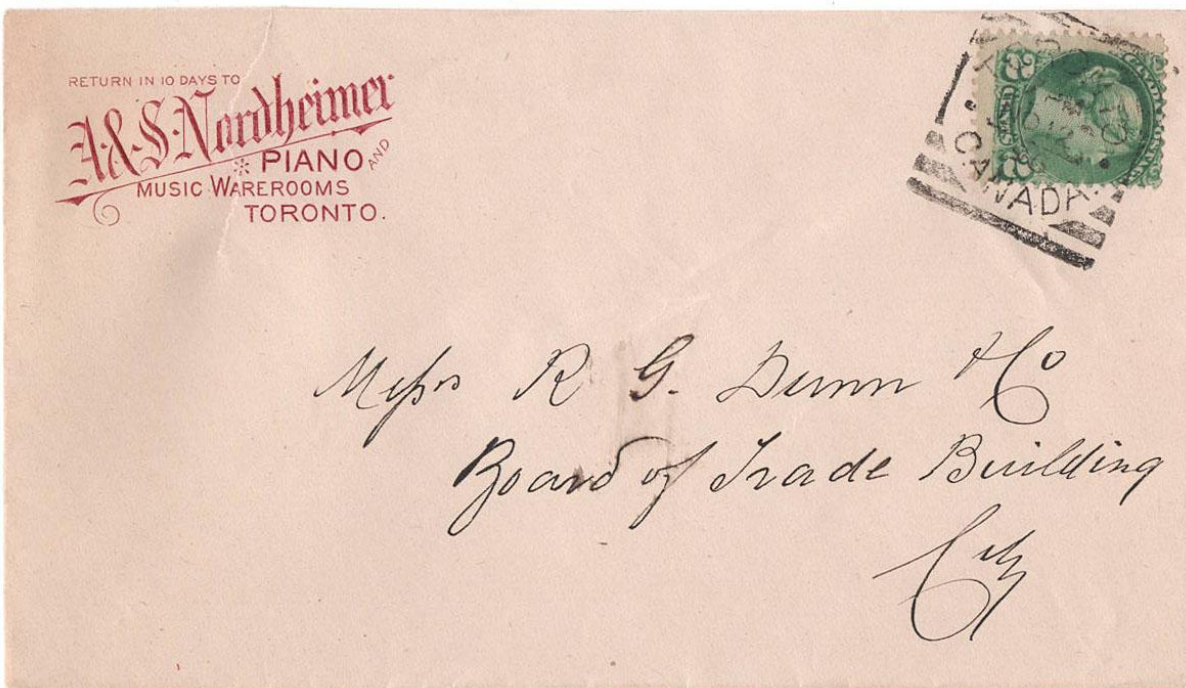
Item 620-22 – **Montmagny Que registered** – 1884, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from Montmagny Que paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Villa Maria Couvent in Notre-Dame de Grace Montreal (NDG, receiver on face). The location was the home of the Governor General of Canada from 1844 to 1849. It is a National Historic Site of Canada. Interesting. Ex Averbeck. \$60.00



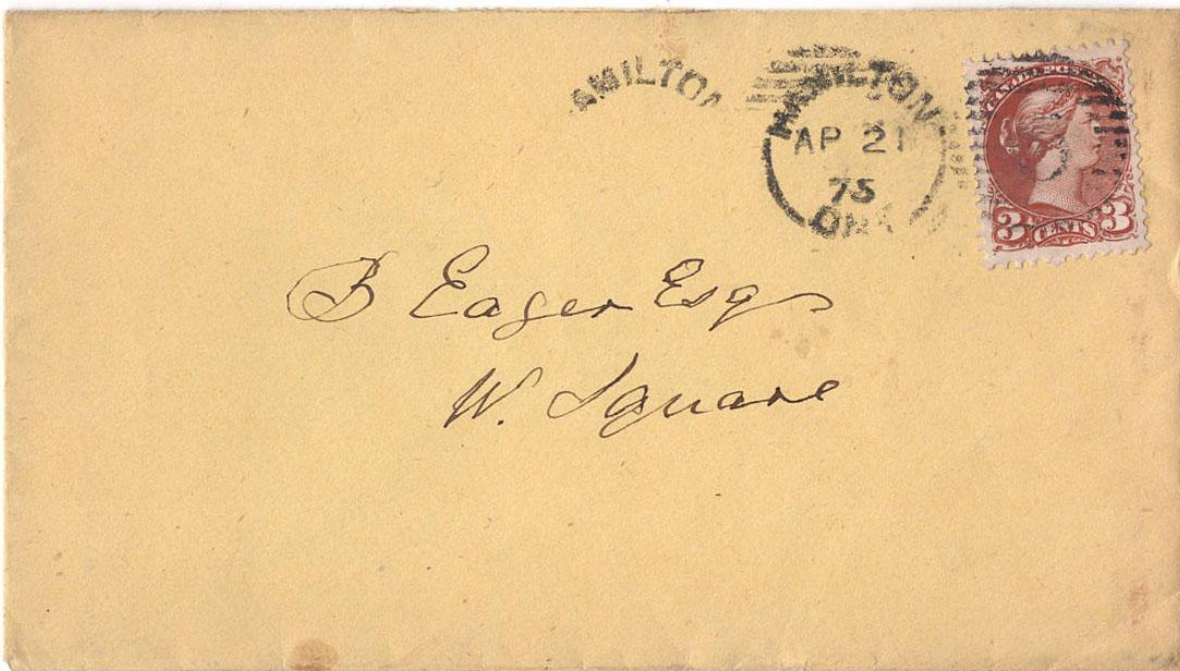
Item 620-23 – **Nicolet Que (crossed the St. Lawrence twice)** – 1885, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by target cancel on Eastern Twps Mutual Fire Insurance reply cover paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Beebe Plain. Three Rivers transit (b/s). Nicolet (South Shore), Three Rivers transit (North Shore), Beebe Plain (South Shore). \$60.00



Item 620-24 – **Woodstock Ont unofficial duplex (DUN-165)** – 1887, 3¢ SQ tied by Woodstock Ont unofficial duplex cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Montreal. 1<sup>st</sup> period of use showing Month, Day, Year. Listed as DUN-165 and recorded from April 1887 to October 1887 only. The characteristics are: full circle dater 24.5mm with 7-bar oval killer enclosing '10' in circle, 3-line dater, 10 shown clearly exactly as recorded on early examples. A scarce postmark. \$100.00

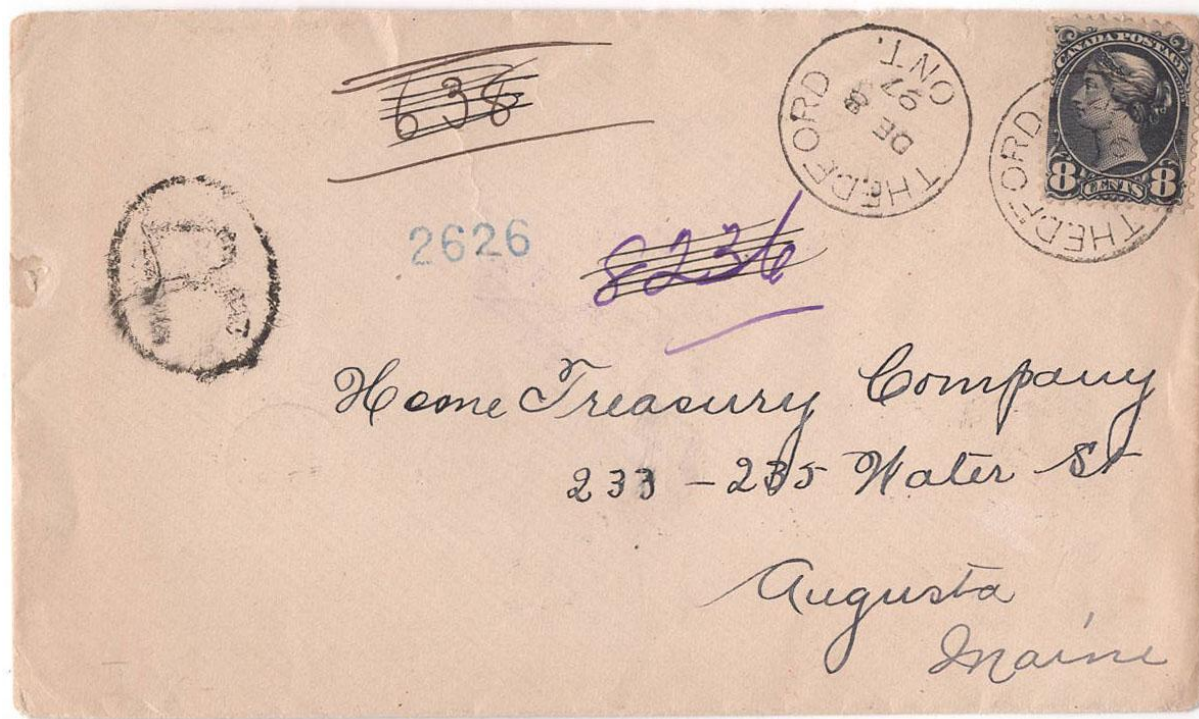


Item 620-25 – **A. & S. Nordheimer Co. Piano** – 1896, 2¢ SQ tied by Toronto squared circle on Nordheimer Piano c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. The Nordheimer brothers were music dealers and publishers, piano dealers and later manufacturers. \$40.00



Item 620-26 – **Hamilton unofficial duplex 5** – 1875, 3¢ SQ tied by Hamilton Ont unofficial duplex 5 cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Wellington Square (b/s). This is the hammer DUN-17 state 1 recorded from 1873 to 1875. \$30.00





Item 620-27 – **Theford Ont 8¢ registered (Lambton)** – 1897, 8¢ SQ (UR corner fault) tied by Theford Ont cds on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Maine (b/s) via Montreal and Portland (b/s). Carried by Tor & Sar MC No.6. \$40.00

## An Act to prevent the spread of Noxious Weeds, and Diseases affecting Fruit Trees.

HER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

1. Chapter 188 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, entitled "An Act to prevent the spreading of Canada Thistles," Chapter 33 of the Acts passed in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to protect Plum and Cherry Trees," and Chapter 28 of the Acts passed in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to prevent the spread of the Yellows among Peach Nectarine and other Trees," are hereby repealed.

2. It shall be the duty of every owner of land, or the occupant thereof if the owner is not resident within the local municipality wherein the same is situate (1) to cut down or destroy all the Canada Thistles, ox-eye daisy, wild oats, rag-weed and burdock growing on his land, and all other noxious weeds growing on his land to which this Act may be extended by by-law of the municipality, so often each and every year as is sufficient to prevent the ripening of their seed; (2) To cut out and burn all the black-knot found on plum or cherry trees on his land, so often each and every year as it shall appear on such trees; and (3) To cut down and burn any peach, nectarine or other trees on his land infected with the disease known as the yellows, and to destroy all the fruit of trees so infected.

3. (1) The Council of any city, town, township, or incorporated village may by by-law extend the operation of this Act to any other weed or weeds or to any other disease of fruit trees or fruit which they declare to be noxious to husbandry or gardening in the municipality; and all the provisions of this Act shall apply to such noxious weeds and diseases as if the same were herein enumerated.

(2) Any such Council may, and upon a petition of fifty or more ratepayers, shall appoint at least one Inspector to enforce the provisions of this Act in the municipality, and fix the amount of remuneration, fees or charges he is to receive for the performance of his duties; and in case a vacancy shall occur in the office of Inspector, it shall be the duty of the council to fill the same forthwith.

(3) The council of any township in which there are any large tracts or blocks of waste or unoccupied land, may upon the petition of not less than thirty ratepayers, by by-law suspend the operation of this Act in respect of such waste or unoccupied lands; the by-law to define with sufficient clearness the tracts or blocks of land so exempted; such by-law to remain in force until repealed by such council; and until repealed the lands therein described shall be exempt from the operation of this Act.

4. (1) It shall be the duty of such Inspector to give or cause to be given notice in writing to the owner or occupant of any land within the municipality whereon the said noxious weeds are growing and in danger of going to seed (and in the case of property of a railway company, such notice shall be given to any station master of such company resident in or nearest to the municipality), requiring him to cause the same to be cut down or destroyed within ten days from the service of such notice; and it shall be the duty of the Inspector to give or cause to be given such notice for the first time not later than the tenth of July in each year, or such other earlier date as may be fixed by by-law of the municipality.

(2) In case such owner or occupant of land (or, if it be railway property, then the station master upon whom notice has been served) refuses or neglects to cut down or destroy all or any of the said noxious weeds within the period aforesaid, the said Inspector shall enter upon the land and cause such weeds to be cut down or destroyed with as little damage to growing crops as may be, and he shall not be liable to be sued in action of trespass therefor; or the Inspector, instead of entering upon the land and causing such weeds to be cut down or destroyed, may lay information before any Justice of the Peace as to such refusal or neglect, and such owner or occupant shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalties imposed by section 10 of this Act.

(3) But no such Inspector shall have power to cut down or destroy noxious weeds on any land sown with grain; and where such noxious weeds are growing upon non-resident lands it shall not be necessary to give any notice before proceeding to cut down or destroy the same.

5. (1) The said Inspector shall keep an accurate account of the expense incurred by him in carrying out the provisions of the preceding sections of this Act with respect to each parcel of land entered upon therefor, and shall deliver a statement of such expenses, describing the land entered upon, and verified by oath, to the owner or occupant of resident lands, requiring him to pay the amount.

(2) If any owner or occupant of land amenable under the provisions of this Act deems such expense excessive, an appeal may be laid to the said Council (if made within thirty days after the delivery of such statement), and the said Council shall determine the matter in dispute.

(3) In case the owner or occupant of resident lands refuses or neglects to pay the same within thirty days after such request for payment, the said claim shall be presented to the Council of the municipality in which such expense was incurred, and the said Council is hereby authorized and required to audit and allow such claim, and order the same to be paid from the fund for general purposes of the said municipality.

6. The said Inspector shall also present to the said Council a similar statement, verified by oath, of the expenses incurred by him in carrying out the provisions of this Act upon any non-resident lands; and the said Council is hereby authorized and required to audit and allow the same, or so much thereof as to said Council may seem just, and to pay so much thereof as has been so allowed.

7. The Council of the municipality shall cause all such sums as have been so allowed and paid by the Council under the provisions of this Act to be by the Clerk severally placed upon the collector's roll of the municipality against the lands described in the statement of the Inspector, and to be collected in the same manner as other taxes imposed by by-laws of the municipality.

8. It shall be the duty of the Overseer of highways in any municipality to see that the provisions of this Act relating to noxious weeds are carried out within their respective highway divisions by cutting down or destroying or causing to be cut down or destroyed at the proper times to prevent the ripening of their seed, all the noxious weeds growing on the highways or road allowances within their respective divisions; such work to be performed as part of the ordinary statute labour or to be paid for at a reasonable rate by the Treasurer of the municipality, as the Council of the municipality may direct.

9. If written complaint be made to the Inspector that yellows or black-knot exist within the municipality, in any locality described in such complaint with reasonable certainty, he shall proceed to examine the fruit trees in such locality, and if satisfied of the presence of either disease he shall immediately give notice in writing to the owner or occupant of the land whereon the affected trees are growing, requiring him within five days from the receipt of said notice to deal with such trees in the manner provided by section 2 of this Act.

10. (1) Any owner or occupant of land who refuses or neglects to cut down or destroy any of the said noxious weeds, after notice given by the Inspector, as provided by section 4, or who knowingly suffers any of the said noxious weeds to grow thereon, and the seed to ripen so as to cause or endanger the spread thereof, or who suffers any black-knot to remain on plum or cherry trees, or

keeps any or the fruit of such trees, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars.

(2) Any dog, cat, or wild animal, or any other animal, which is found on any land to which this Act applies, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars.

(3) Any person who sells or gives away any such animal, or who is convicted of having done so, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars.

(4) Every person who refuses to give any notice as required by this Act, or who is convicted of having done so, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars.

11. Every person who is convicted of an offence under this Act shall be liable to be punished with imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or with a fine of not more than ten dollars, or with both such imprisonment and such fine.

12. The provisions of this Act shall not apply to any land which is used for the purpose of agriculture.

13. Where any person is convicted of an offence under this Act, the court may, in its discretion, order that the person be liable to pay the costs of the proceedings.

Item 620-29 – **Seaford Barred Circle** – 1892, 1¢ stationery card from Seaford, squared circle precursor or barred circle dated JU 9 92, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Preston (b/s). The message relates to an order and is signed by Thomas Coventry. Very scarce postmark. \$200.00



Item 620-30 – **Burford Ont squared circle** – 1896, 3¢ SQ tied by Burford Ont squared circle, a perfect strike, paying 3¢ letter rate to U.S. (b/s) via Brantford (b/s). \$75.00

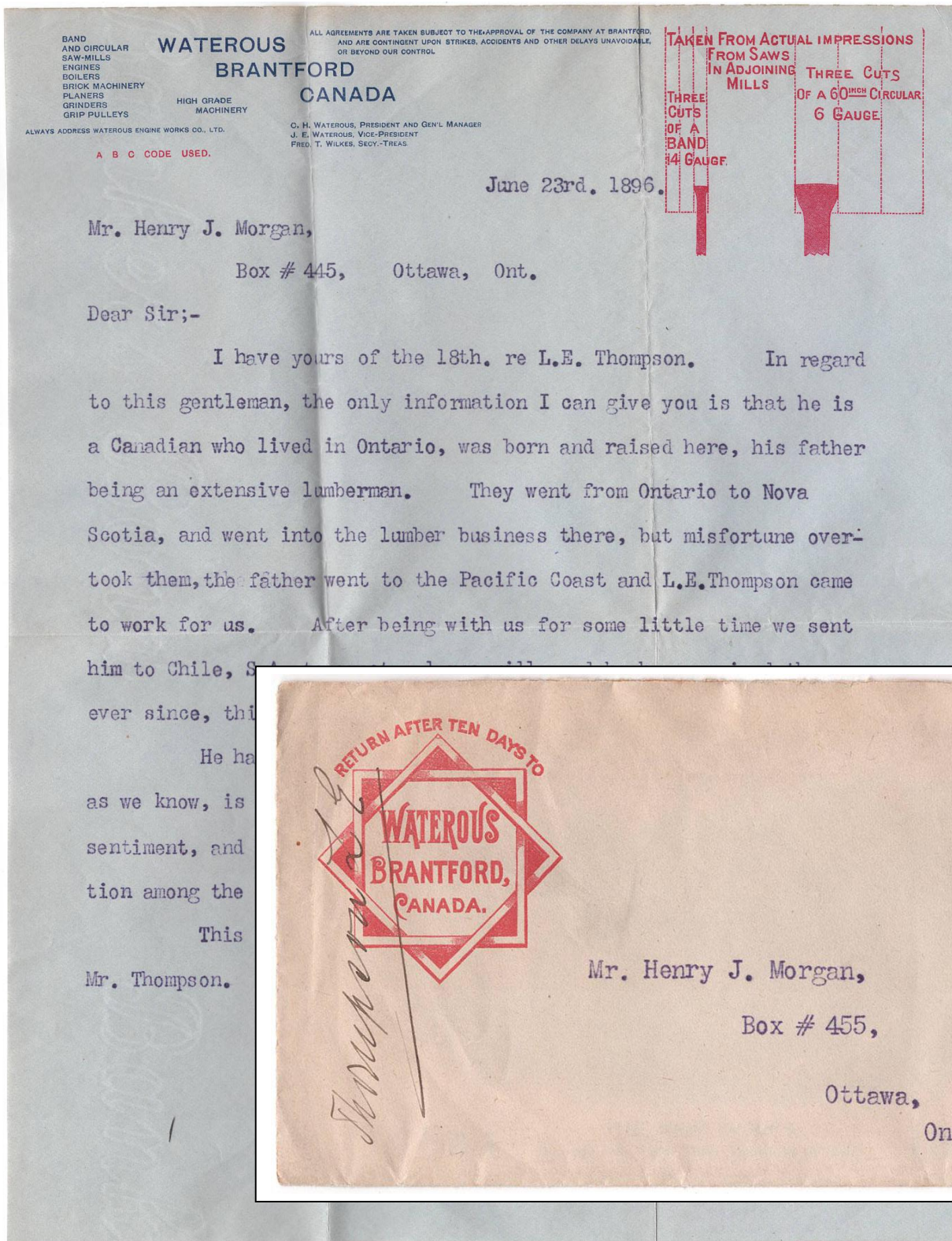

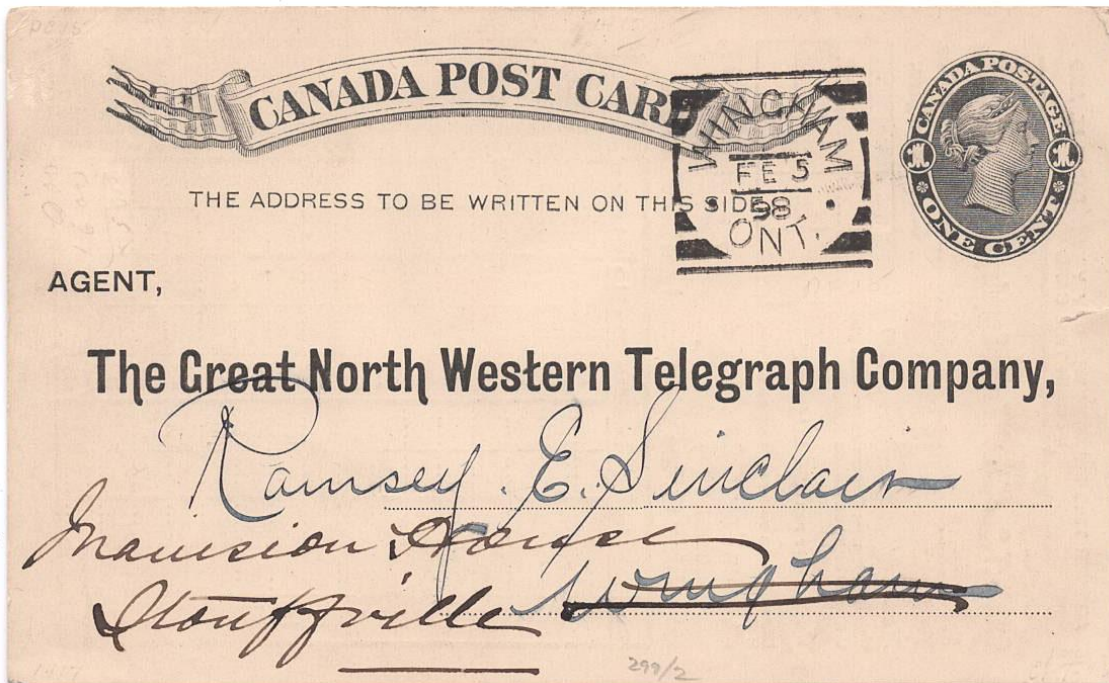

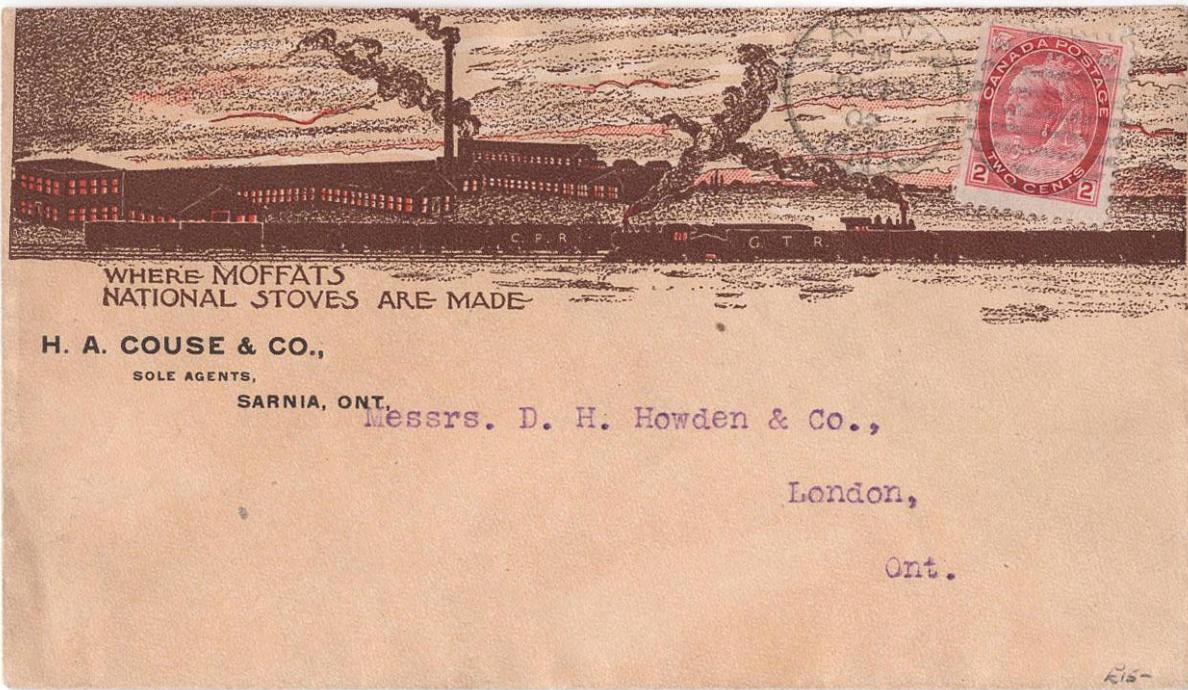

Item 620-37 – **1¢ Maple Leaf franked registered cover (Carleton)** – 1898, 1¢ Maple Leaf (8) tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Munster Ont (Carleton County, closed in 1913, the ERD by 4 years) paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Ashton and carried by G.T.R. Ott & Brock M.C. P.M. (b/s). \$200.00

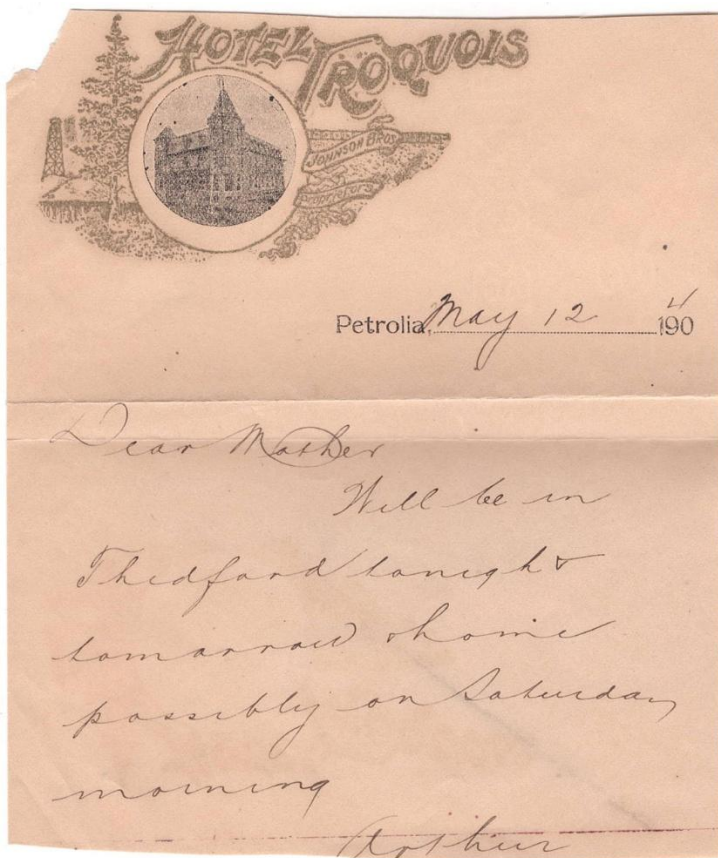




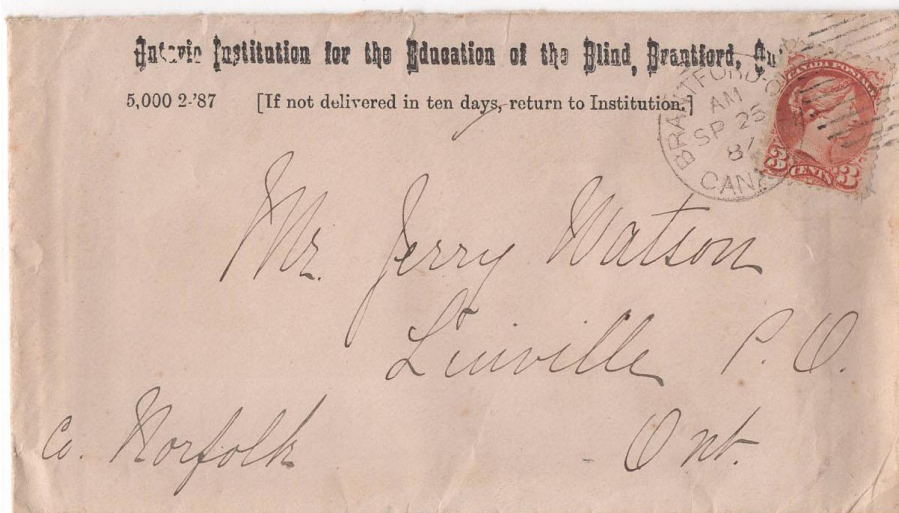
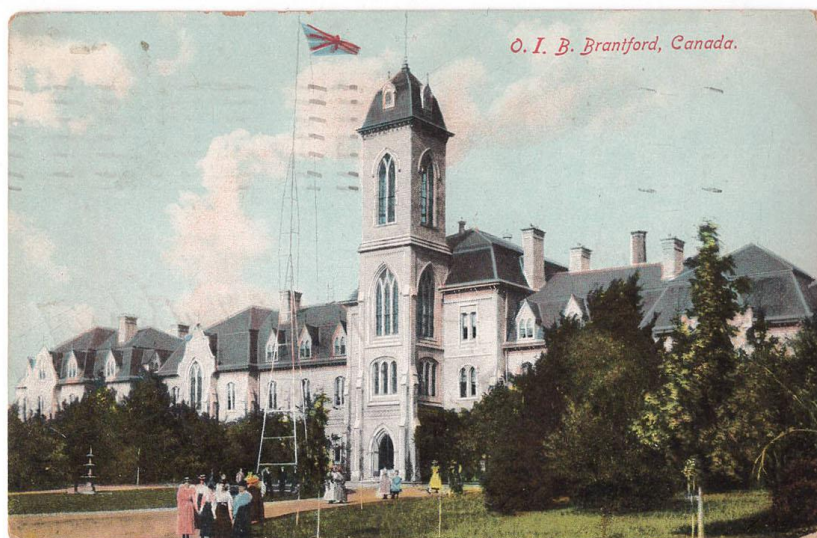
