



Item 621-01 – <u>Bath UC money letter</u> – 1834, money folded letter from Bath UC (a perfect 1829 type strike in red with typeset) rated 3N collect to Toronto. According to message, the letter contained the sum of £50 representing funds collected by Colin Mackenzie for Hawkers, Peddlers and Beer licences at the Port of Bath. A spectacular Bath marking! \$250.00



Item 621-02 – **9d double rate across Lake Ontario** – 1848, Bank of Montreal letter from Toronto paid 9d to the lines paying the double 4½d across Lake Ontario rate. Then, exchanged in Queenston and Lewiston with fancy "20" representing 20¢ US collect to New York. BNA postage paid through charge box 228. The rate overland around the lake was 7d or 1/2 for a double. The letter relates to numerous bank drafts. \$400.00



Item 621-03 – Partially underpaid England to Dundas UC (2½d) – 1843, family folded letter from Lostwithiel England to Dundas UC (b/s). Although endorsed via New York, carried by Cunard Caledonia from Liverpool to Halifax (and Boston) with Liverpool oval (b/s). Rated 1/ Sterling packet postage prepaid, "more to pay" along with 2d Stg accountancy converted to 2½d BNA postage to be paid for the BNA inland (Arnell type B2). Closed mails via the U.S. were not established until December 1844. It is a family letter from John Philip to Revd William Coad Philip. Detailed transcript accompanies. \$200.00




Item 621-04 – <u>Prepaid money letter to U.S.</u> – 1844, business money letter from Kingston UC paid 37½¢ to New York (double 18¾¢). No BNA postage was assessed as Kingston acted as an American exchange office. The letter enclosed a bank draft payable to D.S. Kennedy, well known merchant banker. \$200.00



Item 621-05 – <u>Haldimand UC (Northumberland 1832-1858)</u> – 1840, partial folded letter from Haldimand UC paid 7d to Kingston. Perfect double circle in black with blue manuscript date. The letter is signed by Jeremy Drinkwatter. A very scarce NHD County office, in operation from 1832 to 1858 only. Exhibit quality. \$350.00



Item 621-06 – Newburg CW embossed all-over village scene (L&A) – 1855, embossed all-over village scene on stampless cover paid 3d to Toronto (b/s) via Millcreek (b/s). The scene is depicting 4 buildings, a mill, water wheel, trees, birdhouse and a person pulling a cart. A very decorative and seldom seen cover from Lennox and Addington County. \$250.00



Item 621-07 – Ryder family letter from Burford UC to Michigan – 1852, Ryder family letter from Burford CW rated 6d and 10 with Canada in arc exchange marking to Michigan State. The letter is about everything and nothing, family members etc. Staining. \$60.00



Item 621-08 – <u>Double rate in Canada triple rate in the U.S.</u> – 1844, printed Bank of Montreal letterhead from Montreal paid 9d to the lines (double 4½) and rated 56¼¢ US collect in New York (triple 18¾¢). The letter was rated as a triple letter in the U.S. due to enclosure and relates to bills and quotation of Illinois stocks. \$100.00



Item 621-09 – <u>Guelph UC to New Hampshire</u> – 1843, folded letter from Guelph UC paid 7d to the lines and 25¢ US collect for a distance of over 400 miles to New Hampshire. Exchange in Queenston and Lewiston. Letter signed by J.T. Green. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>

Item 621-10 – <u>Galt business letter to a New York merchant</u> – 1853, business letter from Galt UC rated 6d to New York via Suspension Bridge with Canada 10¢ exchange marking. Suspension Bridge NY 31 mm in blue, a Post Office opened in 1852 which exchanged mail with its sister city Suspension Bridge UC. Gillespie Dean and Co. Merchants. \$100.00



Item 621-11 – Three Rivers to St. Antoine – 1823, folded letter from Three Rivers paid 7d to St. Antoine with straight-line 11 MAY 23 (b/s). Endorsed "Immediate to Pierre Langlois Esq, Merchant Lower Town of Quebec". The letter written in French, to Jean-Baptiste-Isaïe Noël de Tilly, relates to business, inventory and contracts etc. Noël was born in Saint-Antoine-de-Tilly, son of seigneur Jean-Baptiste Noël de Tilly, he inherited the seigneuries of Tilly and Bonsecours and acquired the seigneury of Duquet. He studied medicine. \$150.00



Item 621-12 – <u>Halifax to Saint Lewis Missouri through NB and Maine</u> – 1840, folded cover from Halifax to St. Louis Missouri via St. Andrews NB and Robbinston Maine. NS and NB 1/6 postage paid to the line representing 1/4 to St. Andrews and 2d to Robbinston. Then, 25¢ US collect for over 400 miles to St. Louis Missouri. A very scarce cover from the far East BNA to Missouri. \$250.00



Item 621-13 – <u>Montreal – Lancashire Insurance Co.</u> – 1867, Lancashire Insurance Company Montreal Branch all-over advertising cover used locally. No postmark or rate, two Lancashire Ins. Co. private handstamps. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>





The hotel was built on the site of the former Garner Hotel, which burned to the ground following a grease fire in Dec 1929. The owner John Garner rebuilt the hotel which opened in 1931 under the new name. A scarce 4¢ Arch advertising cover! \$50.00




Item 621-56 – <u>Service Suspended</u> – 1941, 6¢ Airmail C6, 1¢ Mufti (4) tied by Vancouver cds on cover paying 10¢ airmail letter rate to Philippines. Once arrived in San Francisco, returned as Pacific mail service suspended with "RETURNED TO SENDER / SERVICE SUSPENDED", S-F pointing finger and returned. \$300.00





Item 621-61 – The rare Windsor AMF (air mail facility) – 1942, 10¢ Pictorial tied by Windsor AMF cds on censored Armed Forces letter sheet paying 10¢ airmail rate to RAF in England (*Sgt Gwynne Edwards, Sgts Mess, Compton Bassett*). Mailed from the Windsor air mail facility with the rare Windsor A.M.F. Ont cds (SP 25 42). The letter reads in part: we see the RAF and RCAF are really going to town these nights and making a name for themselves. We have been brought a little closed to all since the Dieppe Raid as about 500 of our Windsor Regiment is missing. Some have already been reported prisoners. Then a few words on the Prince George Duke of Kent (died in the Dunbeath air crash on 25 AU 42, in which fourteen of the fifteen crew and passengers were killed), few words on bomber returning, movie Mrs. Miniver etc. \$150.00 SOLD





Undelivered, not known and returned to Canada via Ottawa Inspection Div DLO (b/s). Blue return to sender pointing finger. A rare Horn of Africa destination. \$250.00





Item 621-63 – **5¢ UPU rate to Angola, redirected** – 1943, 1¢, 4¢ War tied by Toronto machine cancel on censored cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Angola, Africa (b/s). Endorsed via Cape Town and Elizabethville Congo (b/s). Redirected to Cape Town (b/s) and censored again. An interesting African journey cover. \$200.00


